Bentley on knife edge

Final solution by Sir Brandis revealed

News just to hand: federal attorneygeneral and minister for the arts, Sir George Brandis, is planning to herd all artists into 'special re-training camps' on Manus island to help them overcome their 'undesirable social attitudes', and 'become bigots like the rest of us'.

Sources say Sir Brandis would like them to suffer emotional hardships, so that they can 'produce real art.'

It's been hailed as a masterstroke in distraction from selling the nation's land and fossil fuels to global corporations for peanuts.

Up to 2,000 protectors, many of whom are Byron Shire residents, were on red alert first thing Monday morning after intelligence suggested that gas company Metgasco and a large police presence would attempt to access the Bentley site, located just 15km west of Lismore.

'Metgasco is trying to paint this as an action by crazy ferals, but it's not' says Reverend Jim Nightingale, of the Anglican Church in Kyogle, who has deemed the protest a 'righteous cause' for his parishioners. 'We have been given dominion over the Earth. That is not a right to plunder, it is an obligation of stewardship.'

The solidarity extends to adjacent landholders who also oppose the drilling, including premium cattle farmers. One farmer has allowed protectors to set up a campground within earshot of the drilling site.

Bentley resident Liz Stops said, 'The property owner where the drilling is scheduled to occur does not even live here.' While organisers expected the riot squad on Monday, they believe the large public presence is holding them back.

Organisers say a larger public presence is needed immediately.

Divers find 'pyramidal structures' off Julian Rocks

In an exciting moment for local scientists, the Southern Cross University Marine Research Unit (SCUMRU) has announced it has uncovered 'pyramidal structures' in a deep gully to the northeast of Julian Rocks.

The structures were found last Thursday during a routine dive measuring biodiversity in the area.

SCUMRU's director, Professor Lillian Dagon, told *The Echo*, 'We're totally flabbergasted by the find.

'It's not unusual to find underwater structures near the edges of the Mediterranean and in some parts of the Gulf of Mexico, but I don't believe anything like this has ever been seen before in this part of the Pacific.'

'Temples'

Prof Dagon said the three pyramids found are stepped in structure, 'like those in Chichen Itza in Mexico', and form roughly a 30m by 30m square at the base.

'Two of them have what look like small houses or temples at the top.

'It is entirely accidental we found them,' said Prof Dagon. 'One of our students saw the gully in a rather murky patch of water and decided to investigate.'

Prof Dagon declined to give an exact location for the pyramids, fearing treasure hunters might damage them before the federal government's archeological team arrived to investigate.

Mayan travellers

During a video linkup with the SCUMRU team, Dr Henry Asenath of Miskatonic University in Massachusetts, an expert on central American architecture, told *The Echo* that, though the find was 'astonishing', it was 'in the realms of possibility' the skilled Mayan pyramid builders could have travelled this far westward.

'Thor Heyerdahl pretty much proved that in 1947 in his epic raft trip from South America to the Tuamotu Islands,' he said.

The Echo was later contacted by Brad Innsmouth of the Byron Shire Cthulhu Society, who had found out about the discovery from an SCU student. Mr Innsmouth claimed the

Grays Lane residents claim state of emergency

Residents of East Tyagarah are urging Byron Council and the state government to take action on the deteriorating condition of Grays Lane.

Citing frequent flooding and numerous accidents over the years, the 46 residents want action immediately, 'to prevent a tragic accident or death occurring in the near future.'

The group referred to at 'least three serious vehicle accidents, and at least three personal injuries within the last two years.'

And while the road is the only access to the highway and emergency services, 'School buses, freight companies, mini-buses and taxis all refuse to deliver to Grays Lane because of its dangerous condition.'

A letter to Council and state government reads, 'We have paid all our council fees for subdividing, DAs and

Shark girl returns from the WA carnage

Byron Bay's 'Sharkgirl' Madison Stewart has been swimming with and studying sharks since she was 12 years old.

Now 20, Madi has dived all around the world photographing and filming them in the hope of showing that they are not as the terrifying as the response the iconic two-note bass ostinato *Jaws* scenario evokes in us.

Madi was recently commissioned by Sea Shepherd to travel to WA to film the devastation on our western seaboard. 'The Western Australian fisheries implemented a shark cull because of a few attacks that occurred over a short amount of time', she said.

'They have placed baited drum lines just offshore of Perth and around the Dunsborough area and caught more than one hundred sharks.

'Most of those are tiger sharks.' Madi said she has

filmed both live and dead specimens on the hook from between two and four metres.

Govt negligence

'They are targeting great whites but all they have caught are tigers because they are scavengers.

'It's really graphic – we have seen sharks with hooks

sticking out the side of their head then they have been released alive by fisheries and there is a trail of blood. The negligence from that government is astounding.'

Madi says the carnage needs to stop and the only way that can happen is if people are educated about behaving around sharks when we

are in their territory.

'The biggest misconception on the planet is that sharks are these mindless blood thirsty killers'.



Woman dies in Thursday's big storm

The body of a 65-year-old woman whose car was swept off Main Arm Road near Mullumbimby after Thursday night's flood rains was found on Saturday morning.

About 11.30am on Saturday, police and SES volunteers located the body near the Brunswick River.

Family members raised the alarm on Saturday after the woman had not come home when expected.

Police are continuing with their inquiries into the circumstances surrounding her death.

Car winched

The Main Arm Road was closed for around four hours as rescue crews extracted the vehicle from the river.

Police are urging anyone with information about this incident to call Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 or use the Crime Stoppers online reporting page: www1.police. nsw.gov.au/.

The storm on Thursday and Friday caused isolated flooding across the north coast. The areas of heaviest rainfall, according to the Bureau of Meteorology, were mostly in the upper catch-

ments but Boat Harbour in the lower Tweed recorded the largest downpour of 317mm in the 24 hours.

There was minor flooding along the Brunswick River at Mullumbimby (Federation Bridge) where the river

peaked at 2.8 metres around 11am. Marshalls Creek at Billinudgel reached 2.4 metres.

In the Tweed Valley, heavy falls were experienced over Clarrie Hall Dam (264mm in the last 24 hours), Crouchy Creek (298mm), Eungella (252mm), Burringbar and Doon Doon (237mm).

In the Brunswick Valley, Upper Main Arm topped the list (276mm), followed by Chincogan (240mm), Upper Crabbes Creek (224mm) and Middle Pocket (215mm).

In the Wilsons River catchment, Huonbrook received 274mm, followed by Goonengerry (260mm) and Repentance Creek (212mm).

Bangalow 'waterfront' concept plan launched

Efforts to revitalise the Bangalow Parklands along Byron Creek took a step forward on Sunday March 23 with encouraging news on the progress of the campaign.

A capacity crowd of around 80 filled Bangalow's Heritage House Museum to hear a range of speakers, including mayor Simon Richardson, outline the project

and explain its importance to the local community.

The meeting launched a community appeal to fund a master plan to update the parkland surrounding the old Bangalow Creek weir.

The aim is to revamp the entire waterfront precinct with resources ranging from rainforest walks to facilities such as new playground

equipment, benches and even a bandstand.

The community fundraising campaign centres on the plan to let people 'Buy a bit of Bangalow' by donating to the cost of the restoration.

The entire 30,000 sq m parkland area has been mapped out and gridded, and is being 'sold off' in lots of one square metre.

Don Page petitioned on West Byron by residents' group

A petition of more than 2,000 signatures against the rezoning of land at West Byron has been presented to NSW local member Don Page by The Byron Residents' Group (BRG).

The Residents' Group also discussed their concerns about the proposed major mixed residential/industrial development. Meeting with Mr Page were Cate Coorey, president of BRG, along with other members Donald Maughan, Suzie Deyris and Wayne Amytage.

Ms Coorey Told *The Echo*, 'With over 2,170 signatures – more than half of them from local postcodes – this petition is a true reflection of the community's wishes.

'Along with the petition we presented Mr Page with the more than 500 comments that people wrote on the petition; again almost all local people.

'People are articulating very clearly that this is not what they want for their town.'

Character lost

'Business people tell us they are really worried that Byron would lose its unique character; the reason tourists come here.

'If the traffic was so bad they couldn't get into town, the tourism industry, our largest employer, would suffer. Mr Page acknowledged such outcomes were possible.'

'We explained how the West Byron site's designation as "state significant" took it out of Council's and the community's control and how ordinary people felt excluded from the process. But Mr Page told *The Echo* regarding the 'state significance' of the site that 'The previous Labor government made the West Byron proposal one of state significance in 2009. Even if the proposal was approved, all DAs etcetera would be han-

dled by Byron Shire Council.'

Mr Maughan said, 'Mr Page was interested to learn that the site was an acid sulphate soils hotspot. We also informed him that when the West Byron proposal was originally on exhibition, the report on Acid Sulfate Soils (ASS) was not included in the exhibition documents.

'That report identifies over 75 per cent of the land as Acid Sulfate affected. Mr Page has asked us to provide him with more information on this serious issue.'

Koala concerns

Wayne Armytage, a Wiradjuri man who has lived in Arakwal country for over 40 years and worked in various support roles in Bundjalung and Arakwal affairs, pointed out his strong concerns for the burabi (koala). He also noted the inevitable impact of this development on the health of the Belongil estuary.

Mr Page insisted that he was very committed to protecting koalas and that he was proud of his role in supporting State Environmental Planning Policy 44 (Koala Habitat Protection). 'The state government will not be abolishing SEPP 44,' he told *The Echo*, despite Mr Army-

tage's claim it may happen.

'It will be retained under any new planning laws.'

As for the Byron bypass, Mr Page told *The Echo*, 'It needs to be built regardless of the West Byron proposal and if it is not built, then the West Byron development should not go ahead because it will exacerbate existing traffic congestion.'

Stalemate

'Also the West Byron landowners had indicated that they don't want to make any S94 contributions up front.

'They say contributions would have to be made as the land was released, so we have something of a stalemate there. However, the Council and the state government are still looking for options for funding the Byron bypass as a standalone project, regardless of the outcome of the West Byron rezoning process.'

The concerns of the group will be passed on to minister for planning, Brad Hazzard, and Mr Page says he will seek to arrange a meeting between members of Byron Residents' Group and Mr Hazzard and with the minister for the environment, Robyn Parker.

One of the panelists for the event is adolescent psychologist Peter Chown, who shared some of his insights about how to best support young people and their emerging sexuality.

ents still put sexuality in the too-hard basket. 'They haven't always had good models themselves and teenagers do go through a massive change from puberty to adolescence.

'A lot of time parents are playing catch up and trying to connect with their kids, and very often the teenager is in the very natural phase of disconnecting. Parents can feel out of their depth and uncomfortable so they don't bring up the topic of sex and tend to assume that the kid are getting the information from school.

Good comms

Good communication needs to be established early in the relationship, says Peter, so that you are not trying to forge new relationship inroads when young people hit puberty.

'As a parent, you need to be proactive, says Peter.

'Often boys prefer to talk to a man in those early teen years because they are going through the process of separating from their mums and establishing their own separate identity.

'You have to be prepared to bring up the topic and then to realise you won't have all the answers. Every young person will respond and react differently. The approach may need to be different for each - but the content will basically need to be the same.

Lack of sex ed

Although we now live in a world that is more comfortable with conversations around sex, and more open social attitudes, Peter believes that young people are still not getting all the information and the guidance that they need.

'I see an alarming lack of knowledge in young people around the consequences of unprotected sex. I even have people attend my practice in their early 20s who will tell me they had unprotected sex and had a discharge but it

Legal naivety

'I think it is important that we address the naivety around the legal side of things. I have had clients who have ended up in court as they turned 18 and their girlfriends were under 16 and they have ended up on the Child Sex Offenders Register.'

While the state government spewed its usual rhetoric this week, there was one issue that spun at a higher pitch: the rising unpopularity of fossil fuel expansion, especially in regional areas.

A temporary suspension on the issuing of new coal seam gas exploration licences was announced by the O'Farrell coalition government, while the NSW Labor opposition called on the premier 'to go further and halt all CSG operations across NSW.

It's a turnaround for NSW Labor; when in government previously - for 16 hard long years - they were responsibble for the unfettered expansion of the industry, including \$1,000 mining licences and royaltyfree periods.

Agreement

Meanwhile two major gas mining companies, Santos and AGL, have sought to address public discontent with a nonbinding agreement with NSW Farmers, Cotton Australia and NSW Irrigators Council.

It accepts the right of land-

holders to refuse miners access to their land for gas development. Notably it poo-poos any neighbour who may disagree, with the agreement stating, The parties condemn bullying, harassment and intimidation by third-party groups and individuals in relation to agreed operations.'

It comes only weeks after a Greens bill to give landowners a say on land access was not only rejected by the major parties, but not even debated.

While welcoming the announcement, Lock the Gate's national co-ordinator Phil Laird said the commitment, 'is no comfort to our Queensland members or to communities in the northern rivers facing off against gas company Metgasco, and cannot be relied upon unless it is enshrined in law in NSW.

'Our message to the government is this: extend rights and protections not just to landholders, but to the communities that rely on the health of the land and the water. Otherwise a gas company can still undermine the safety and security of landholders by buying high-value farming land for coal seam gas extraction, as AGL has done in the Hunter.'

Crown Lands gets a makeover

Management of Crown lands by the state government will be overhauled in what has been described as 'the most significant in a generation, by deputy premier Andrew Stoner.

The reason, according to Mr Stoner, is that 'management of Crown land has become overly complex, which makes it difficult for the community to manage their reserves and facilities operating on Crown land such as CWA halls, men's sheds, scout halls, surf clubs, kiosks, cafes and market gardens.

'Crown land accounts for more than 40 per cent of the State, with tens of thousands of community groups, local businesses and farmers depending on Crown reserves across NSW.

Mr Stoner said the government's response to the Crown Lands Management Review would include slashing the amount of legislation stifling Crown land management by repealing eight pieces of outdated and overlapping legislation and introducing a new single Act. 'With legislation dating as far back as 1890, now is the time to introduce clearer, simpler and more contemporary legislation to better manage Crown land.

Economics of Happiness: Byron to Bangalore

The impact of globalisation on our everyday lives and the urgency of a shift to localisation brought about a thousand people from all over the world together at the third Economics of Happiness Conference in Bangalore, India, from March 14 to 17.

The message coming from over 20 international delegates made it clear that the control of governments by corporations is a common problem and that political and economic decentralisation is a common goal.

'Through trade treaties such as the Trans Pacific Partnership (TPP), companies pressure politicians to give them cheap labour, subsidies and tax breaks as well as the most modern infrastructure, director of ISEC and producer of the documentary Economics of Happiness, Helena Norberg-Hodge, said in her keynote address.

'And they threaten to leave the country if their demands are not met. I don't know any government that is not falling for it.'

Greenwash

Camila Moreno, who has been working with social movements in Latin America for the past 15 years, reported that 'In Brazil, political parties are embracing a new "green" economy, which is nothing more than corporate greenwash.

However, the mood of the conference was that this situation is beginning to change. One of the delegates was Carlo Sibilia, a member of the Italian parliament.

He represents the Five Star Movement, which started with two people in 2006 and achieved nine million votes

in the last election. Sibilia plans to present the conference ideas to his fellow MPs.

It became clear during the course of the conference that the consequences of globalisation are the same everywhere: increasing competition for scarce jobs, the lowering of wages and benefits, the destruction of cultural diversity and biodiversity, the death of local knowledge systems that have worked for millennia, and the transformation of citizens into consumers.

Dedicated to their slavery

The former prime minister of Tibet, Ven Samdhong Rinpoche, said, 'Localisation is absolutely necessary.'

He pointed to imbalances caused by this economic system, such as forgetting the need for community and paying too much attention to the individual, as well as putting spirituality and morality aside while focusing on materialism.

As a provocative example of the results of development at any cost, the Indian scholar and environmentalist Claude Alvares mentioned Bangalore itself. 'This used to be a garden city. Now it's a slave camp. People don't smile. They go around in metal boxes. Everyone is rushing to do I don't know what, but very dedicated to their slavery.'

The one single No to corporate globalisation was accompanied by many Yeses.

A diversity of inspiring initiatives was highlighted - in local food, sustainable farming, community-managed forests and water, decentralised energy, traditional knowledge systems, alternative education and villagelevel direct democracy.

Global alliance

There were two main purposes of the conference: to link up all these initiatives within India and to connect them to an emerging worldwide movement. 'I see an urgent need to create an international alliance for localisation, to resist corporate power and rebuild more human-scale and ecological economies,' Helena Norberg-Hodge said. 'The wonderful thing is that as people come together to localise their economies, they reconnect with each other and the natural world, and this reconnection is fundamental to genuine wellbeing. This is the essence of what I call the economics of happiness.'

Last year's gathering was held in Byron Bay, where Helena lives.

And Byron Shire was mentioned many times in Bangalore as an inspiring example of strong community and a strong local economy.

The next Economics of Happiness Conference will take place in October of this year in Portland, Oregon (USA). The event was organised by the Byron-based International Society for Ecology and Culture (ISEC), with the support of the Indian educational institutions Bhoomi College and Shikshantar.

Gas mining could pollute tap water: Rous

Rous Water has called on the serious concerns among investigation until such time uranium at 20 times acceptplanning to explore for underground water sources.

The county council, which supplies Lismore, Ballina, Richmond Valley and Byron LGAs, has identified subterranean water in its future water strategy as the best and most cost-effective source to meet its increased needs in the coming decades.

Cr Clough, who is also a member of Lock the Gate, said, 'I am deeply concerned about recent coal seam gas activities in the Pilliga area, which have seen Santos fined for polluting an aquifer with

'There are also numerous reports of significant groundwater drawdown and contamination of groundwater by methane gas and other pollutants, especially in southeast Queensland,' he

NSW govcorp report card

The NSW Coalition celebrates its third year in office this week, but as usual there is a muddled message emanating from govcorp's Macquarie Street HQ.

Predictably both the coalition and Labor claim opposite results with essential services, education and health. It's either being reduced or restored, just like the environment and business.

But we do know that with three coalition MPs facing ICAC probes, neither side can claim much integrity. Former Liberal energy minister Chris Hartcher, along with fellow central coast MPs Chris Spence and Darren Webber, are now swimming with Labor's Eddie Obeid, Ian Macdonald and Tony Kelly in the same festering soup.

Banning lobbyists and corporate funding has always been the simple solution for turning around a toxic system that rewards greed over public service. But who's game to make that change? Of course the (mostly) boys' club won't allow it; it's the only way they know how to generate prosperity.

However, the nuanced art of politics is about bending the truth for personal gain, not snapping it in two. At a local level, political discourse continued at sub-sonic depths this week with three north coast Nationals MPs claiming that federal Labor MP Justine Elliot and the Greens voted against road funding in the lower house.

What? Voted against spending on roads?

Coalition MPs Geoff Provest (Tweed), Don Page (Ballina) and Thomas George (Lismore) were 'alarmed' the Roads to Recovery program could be scrapped. Mr Page said it would represent 'a \$2.9 million cut which local councils had no way of making up,' and that part of the amendment was a key element of 'continuing the road to recovery program post 30 June 2014.'

Interestingly, Mr Page was the only MP who made a comment with figures attached; the other MPs just frothed rhetoric.

But the amendment in question, the Land Transport Infrastructure Amendment Bill 2014, clearly says 'There is no net impact to the Australian government budget from this bill.'

When handballed back to Labor, federal Labor MP Anthony Albanese told The Echo that the press release was 'bullshit,' and that it was sent as a bulk press release by regional Nationals MPs.

He vigorously defended Labor's roads budget and blasted the inaction of the coalition over infrastructure. As for any financial implications from the bill, Mr Albanese said that the Roads to Recovery funding is covered by the forward estimates and, as it was not an appropriations bill, there were no financial implications. (There are two types of bills, and non appropriation bills have no financial consequence.)

Do such vague and complicated shenanigans do the community any favours? I think I've just been bored to tears by Geoff, Don and Thomas.

A tradition of irrelevant pomposity

n using the idea of knighthoods as a grand distraction, the finely honed 11th century mind of Tony Abbott is simply following the lead given by the inventor of the concept, William of Normandy.

After invading Saxon England in 1066, William the Bastard, as he was known (an appellation some have also applied to his Australia imitator) needed something to do with his victorious army commanders, so he invented the concept of chivalry, which merely meant that those rich enough to own and maintain horses were entitled to be regarded as a kind of junior nobility - not, of course, ranking with the big landowners, but in class above the peasantry.

This was supposed to confer upon them responsibilities as well as rights, but of course it did not work out that way; untrammelled power seldom does. Most of those who failed to grab some land of their own became effectively men of the road - highwaymen above the law, who lived by rape and pillage. Over time the knights, like the rest of society, became gradually civilised since the title, unlike that of the real nobility, was not hereditary, and it could be, and was, bestowed at will to loyal followers of the king as a reward and bribe for services. Its advantage was that it gave the recipient kudos and precedence, standing him out from the mob. Its value was one of pure snobbery, and so it remains pretty much up to now in present day England.

Inevitably, as England gained an empire, it spread

to the colonies; English aristocrats were seen as natural leaders, both as administrators and also as military commanders, often with predictably disastrous results. In Australia, with few aberrations, the colonial and later state governors were drawn from their junior ranks for some half a century after Australia became nominally independent.

The idea caught on in the so-called classless society. Not only did Australian politicians gratefully accept knighthoods ancestor William Charles Wentworth, who gloried in the name 'The Native Son,' put such a proposal to the New South Wales Legislative Council. It was laughed down by the radical Daniel Deniehy, who, after proposing that Wentworth's friend John Macarthur should be dubbed Earl of Camden with a rum keg emblazoned on a field of vert as his coat of arms, concluded that he found it was difficult to classify the mushroom order of nobility proposed by Wentworth.

Even my eccentric ancestor William Charles Wentworth proposed an Australian peerage.

conferred by the mother country; with increasing independence, they began to recommend their own supporters and followers for a similar honour – conferred by the palace, of course. Conservatives loved the idea; Labor premiers and prime ministers were more cautious, but they were not above using the system when it suited them.

Billy Hughes even insisted that an old political enemy, John Forrest, already a knight, should be elevated to the peerage as Lord Forrest of Bunbury in order to get him out of the country - perhaps tragically, perhaps ironically, Forrest in fact died at sea on his way to Westminster to take his seat in the House of Lords.

There was even an attempt to set up a particularly Australian peerage; in 1853 my own illustrious but eccentric

stored in all their irrelevant pomposity.

And it provided Abbott not only with a distraction, but a useful wedge; one of the first recipients is to be the mother-in-law of the leader of the opposition Bill Shorten, who joined the general chorus of derision emanating not only from the left, but from some of Abbott's own team. The retiring Governor-General Quentin Bryce, fresh from proclaiming her republican sympathies, is to become a Dame, and her incoming successor Peter Cosgrove a knight; according to Abbott, the ennoblement is to go with the job from now on.

Previous G-Gs, along with all the other recipients of the Companionship of the Order of Australia, for a generation the country's highest honour, are thus effectively downgraded, as are all officers and members of the order. But hey, it's a great wedge.

Abbott would probably not like to be reminded of it, but here again he is following the lead of predecessor. In 1976 Malcolm Fraser persuaded the Queensland Labor power broker Jack Egerton to accept a knighthood, causing ructions throughout the party.

Its leader, Gough Whitlam, commented: 'This is the most inappropriate conferral of the title since Queen Elizabeth I knighted Sir Toby Belch.' Bill Shorten is unlikely to say anything as unkind about his mother-in-law. But Abbott must be hoping.

■ Many of us Byron residents have the privilege of koalas living in and moving through our backyards and suburbs. These are the remnants of an estimated 240 surviving coastal koalas in our Shire. However, if the mega-development proposed for West

Byron goes ahead it is likely to lead to local koala extinction.

Koalas known to inhabit the West Byron site cannot survive the congestion of people/houses and traffic. (Over 1,100 new homes housing a potential population the size of Mullumbimby, together with a commercial/ industrial estate generating a minimum 6,000 extra car movements.)

Not only will koalas on this core koala habitat be affected but the development will sever a major koala corridor, isolating koalas throughout the Shire. This is likely to increase koala deaths from vehicle collisions/dog attacks and trigger a collapse in numbers from disease and inbreeding. Particularly affected will be koalas south of Ewingsdale Road (in Skinners Shoot, Lilli Pilli, Tallow Beach, Mahogany Drive, Suffolk Park, and Broken Head) which could face extinction.

There are a number of local developers making up the consortium pushing for this mega-development. Are our local koalas that expendable?





Andrew Hall, in a letter to *The Echo* last week, expresses his dislike of wooden bodysurfing handboards and his preference for plastic ones. His reasons are the higher cost of wood, the absence of a safety strap, the increased weight, and the word 'organic' in marketing.

As bodysurfing handboard makers, we find his comments ridiculous.

How can someone who loves the ocean want to put more plastic in it? Wood is biodegradable, so if a wooden board gets lost, it will disintegrate; a plastic board is likely to end up killing a sea creature. And safety straps are cheap if your timber board doesn't have one.

Handboards, like ours, are generally made from recycled or paulownia timber, which is soft and light. Our

most popular board weighs under 240g.

Of course, there is a price difference. Most timber boards are hand-crafted in Australia, while most plastic ones are mass-produced overseas. Both do the job superficially, but you can't compare a beautiful, locally made timber product - whether a table or a handboard - with a cheap plastic

Finally, while we don't market our boards as 'organic', the word means 'relating to or derived from living matter', ie wood.

The success of constructing and maintaining a road, a highway, a hospital or a school (the list goes on) is not measured by the direct return of the money spent. They are firstly judged by their overall benefits, which they contribute to the region they are in, be it indirectly adding to the financial wealth of the region (creating, jobs, attracting people who spend money, which they otherwise would not). Even for-profit businesses make strategic decisions which do not benefit them directly in the short term but pay in other

Secondly, such investments in the region will be judged by the social, environmental and other benefits they create, the quality of life they enhence in the long term. This is the yardstick by which rail has to be measured. Around the world regional railways and city rails are not run to make direct profits but they bring substantial benefits to the region or to the city.

We need and deserve good governance, which is open and transparent, something missing in the rail and trail debate to date.

Removing the tracks will not prevent trains in the future if the government decides to return the trains to that particular corridor.

Complicated sex life of the Banksia

Taking only a photograph of this Banksia, I still 'nip it in the bud'. Looking closely, only the bottom flowers are blooming. The dab of yellow is the tip of the female part of each flower. The curly bits are the male parts. Eventually, each of the many flowers will open.

Blossoming slowly now, these trees are also marking the swing from one season to another. Ever so slowly, so I can get used to cooler days and longer nights. More darkness means these nectar producers have more time for bats, who are some of the plants' favourite pollinators. The idea of trees depending on animals brings together botanists and zoologists, as well as you and me, to consider the ecology of sex.

For Banksia, breeding is a drawn-out affair. None of the hurly-burly of the usual vegetables, in the ground one month and producing seeds the next. Birds, bats and other mammals visit the sequence of blossoms again and again, eating nectar, spreading pollen. In the end, most of the showy flowers will not 'set'



seeds. After three to ten years, there will only be some follicles ripe on each 'cone'. Some species of Banksia will release whatever seeds that are ripe whenever they please. Others wait for the heat of a fire.

The sex life gets more complicated. For example, in some places, people have planted different species of Banksia. They all happen to

flower at the same time. Besotted bats, sugar gliders and honeyeaters cross the pollen of one with the other. Again only some seeds set, but they create new hybrid ones. These novel plants may just suit the conditions of the next swing in the total landscape. Or meet the changing preferences of another generation of pollinators. Or tickle the faddish tastes of the next bevy of people.

Aboriginal people using fire and harvesting cones first influenced the spread of what they here called wallum. In 1770, Joseph Banks took some over to the new Kew Gardens in London. As isolated exotics, these overseas plants may only ever know pollination by human hands.

Banks was being honoured having his name attached to these plants. But since 1918, Australian colloquialisms include 'bad Banksia men'. These are the villains worrying the gumnut babies Snugglepot and Cuddlepie, created by May Gibbs.

Gibbs herself played a part in an even wider ecology of sex. As a young artist visiting England, she was active in the suffragette movement. She studied and contributed cartoons for newspapers. Returning to Sydney, she horrified family and convention because she lived with a female flatmate and paid her own way as illustrator and writer. She married when she was forty and had no children.

Social satire was part of Gibb's cheeky cartoons. One

was about 'the modern woman'. The fashionable character ages gracefully, spending her first three decades refusing various lovers until finally in her fourth, she marries one. Hurrah for the children's authoress defying labels of 'spinster' or 'background talent'

Only as recently as 2005, England legislated that the term 'single' instead of 'spinster' could be used on marriage registration forms. In 2012, Sarah Ensor uses the term 'spinster ecology' to describe a certain caring for and influencing of future generations without necessarily having children. Ensor cites American authors such as Rachel Carson, Sarah Orne Jewett and Henry David Thoreau as singles who made the world their family. Why, she asks, are so many ecological stories 'heterosexist'?

Don't we all wonder why the biological definition of 'success' is only 'passing on genes'? Does nature seriously abide by Victorian systems of titles, inheritances, morals and values?

Regardless, lavish and beyond censure, the Banksia flowering riots on.

Useless delay

In response to the Roundhouse opposition regarding the sale of 11 blocks of council-owned land in Ocean Shores: The Roundhouse land sale was opposed by Ocean Shores Community Association (OSCA), which managed to stop the sale of these blocks three days before they were about to go to auction earlier this month. They demand that the land

should be given over to the local community.

Having read the OSCA website proposal I have to say that they really should rethink their ideas and consider the cost to everyone in the shire of this legal delay.

The suggested proposal by OSCA is to create a cultural centre with accommodation for tourism: 'There is a need for tourist accommodation in Ocean Shores with only one motel at present to service the needs of the town. Research indicates a very high occupancy rate for the short-stay units can be achieved. Promotion of the site and Ocean Shores would benefit all tourist accommodation businesses in the area.'

Tourism may be the shire's economic driver but we residents have had enough of being driven out of house and home, losing our heritage buildings to modern tourist development. Losing our cute, arty shops and local restaurants to the commercial big companies.

I love Byron Bay but can no longer afford to live there. I moved to Ocean Shores to get away from traffic congestion and tourist operators who rule the town, seven years ago, having lived in Byron since 1986. We do not want that kind of impact here in a quiet residential area such as Ocean Shores.

To propose parking for 88 cars is ludicrous. How would the nearby residents like to deal with that amount of traffic all day and night? The exit from the Roundhouse site is quite small and would not support that impact.

Has anyone asked the neighbours if they want a large commercial 'Artist Cultural Centre' next door with 22–30 apartments, a restaurant, a kids' playground and a gallery/museum, because that is what they are proposing. Certainly creative arts centres have a place in the shire but this plan is unrealistic and would go better in an open, rural setting, such as the Tweed Gallery has.

This delay to the council, should it go to court soon, will be at a huge cost to all residents in the shire, unlike OSCA who have been offered free legal help from a Sydney team! We don't need a lengthy court case which the council can ill afford; we need funds for infrastructure in our shire, which the sale of the blocks can help to provide.





Tell me about your songwriting process this time - sharing it among the five of you, line by line how did that change what you ended up with? We pretty much spent a week on the loungeroom floor of a little holiday house on the Mornington Peninsula surrounded by paper, clutching pens and pencils, scribbling furiously. A lot of the time we were sitting in a circle with about six or seven songsheets going at a time – each person grabbing a sheet, adding a line, chucking it back into the centre of the circle. The process really freed up our creativity and also showed us how easy it was to collaborate. Being such close family, there was of course no room for tactfulness when it came to creative disagreements, and within the first five minutes everyone had been grilled mercilessly over the writing of at least one woeful line which meant that from then on that fear was gone and our writing could flow freely.

It's a very imaginative album, almost surreal. What was the inspiration for such flights of fantasy? Drugs. Just kidding! A lot of the songs we love have very enigmatic lyrics and we really wanted to deviate from the tyranny of the excessively literal lyric, which can create lifeless songs and stifle creativity.

Tell me about *Mother of my Mother.* It started with the line 'Mother of my mother, won't you see what I've done,' and from there we just kept writing lyrics until we were happy. It's a kind of warped story of a guy who might have done some bad stuff and is stealing away from it all. Stylistically, we were perhaps inspired by The Quarry Mountain Dead Rats, who we've toured with a lot with and who have a knack for playing at breakneck speeds.

The music and the songwriting has matured, there is a certain sophistication. Are you careful

to keep that unique voice of yours as you evolve as musicians? I wouldn't say we are careful to keep our unique voice because we don't feel that there is any danger of losing it, but we are aware that it's an asset.

How has life been on the road? What have been your most fantastic adventures? Life on the road is always fun and often tough. Fantastic adventures usually involve monumental blunders on our part, but thankfully there haven't been too many of them lately.

Tell me about recording this album: who was your producer? – what ideas did you have before you went into the studio? Our producer was, uh, us. We did the tracking in a few different places with a few different engineers, but the bulk of the stuff was recorded in a friend's farmhouse in Lake Mokoan, Victoria, over the course of five or six days of eating, sleeping and recording (not in order), which was nice and chilled. Most of the songs had been road tested first, but there were still a few surprises as well as room for creativity.

Did Jumping on the Highwire turn out as you expected? Were there surprises along the way? The biggest surprise was *Where You Been*. The song


BLAME IT ON THE BOOG!

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES

Three of a Kind is an exhibition of the works of three longtime friends: **Soren Carlbergg, Graham Mackie** and **James** Willebrant. Soren, Graham and James became friends as schoolboys growing up in the northern suburbs of Sydney against the backdrop of the social evolution and revolution of the late 60s and early 70s. From very early in their years, all engaged in exploring the visual arts, although the making of music and performing was also very high on the agenda as well. The work of Soren Carlbergg has always favoured abstraction, with his work developing over time to incorporate mark-making, narrative threads subjugated or hidden in his sometimes complex line-work and the incorporation of figurative elements. Graham Mackie works in a number of media, including photography. His arts practice has come to focus on the life and landscape of his rural home in the Clarence Valley, where has lived for a number of years. James Willebrant established a successful professional career as an artist in Sydney within a few years of completing his formal tertiary studies. James's paintings demonstrate highly ordered and crisp compositions of urban or rural landscapes with a twist. The show opens at **The Channon Gallery** on **Saturday** at 3pm, and runs for four weeks.

Can you tell me about why you have such a deep belief in community? Because where we live is important to me and I hope that our kids have a chance to grow up in an open and loving community like I did.

How do you feel we could enrich our communities? We need more community events that bring people out, bit of music, kids jamming or dancing would be fun! And to celebrate our young talent.

How do you give back to your community? And what do they give back to you in return? I try to send what I can or show up when I can when a charity or person who is in need; and it's not for publicity – I prefer to keep most activities like this to myself because the satisfaction is gained through helping others, not heaping praise on yourself.

I also take great pride in being a role model.

Do you think governments place enough value on the role community plays in keeping people feeling connected and well? I guess they try but the cycles that we are trying to break are ones that are generations old now so we have a task ahead of us, that's for sure. I think we need to look at and address issues such as lateral violence within our communities first before seeking answers from the government.

What have been your finest personal triumphs? My marriage and family.

You have a deep connection to your land and your people what is your feeling over what has been happening at a federal level where the protections that have been there for native title are being taken away? These laws to me are smoke screens. When things like these are taken away it highlights the reasons the Indigenous peoples of this land are

political person? Are you careful to make decisions about what you speak out about? I am not political, really, but I am interested in everyone in this country that I love having equal basic human rights. We are not a third world country.

What are the issues that you are most passionate about? Kids staying on at school and getting a great education. This gives our kids many keys to many doors for their future.

How do your songs find you? Where do you get your stories? Some people share their stories; some I remember from my childhood; and some are put together from experiences.

What are the experiences that have transformed you? Do you always turn these into song? Yes. Meeting people is a great experience in itself. Sometimes I choose to be a little in the guiet side to take in what someone is trying to impart to

What should we expect for your Bluesfest shows? When you find an old cupboard at a secondhand shop, you can see many people have changed its colour to suit the era or their personal taste. You take back the paint layer by layer until you find the original timber. I want to show the folks at Bluesfest what my songs are like in raw form – like they have just been written, before the layers of paint have been applied to make them more pretty and embellished with different textures. We are going all the way back to find the beauty in the timber. It's a great thing for me to see again and can't wait to share it with everyone.

Vibing Up with J azz

This Sunday sees Australian jazz luminaries gather in Lismore for a very special concert and workshop. Playing the music of Ken Stubbs, fellow musicians Paul Grabowsky, Simon Barker and Brett Hirst step forward to share their talents.

According to Paul Grabowsky, jazz musicians 'share a language; although there will be a rehearsal of some kind, we generally don't need to. With music like this it's about the personality of the players and when you play you just adjust to work in with them."

Grabowsky has been at the forefront of music and performance since he began his career. As he admits, 'I have been lucky. I have been a festival director, and I've done this and that, and it's enabled me to not have to do gigs that I may not want to do. Like I don't do weddings. A lot of my colleagues do because they have to. I feel lucky that I don't have to:

Grabowsky has always had a fairly multidisciplinary approach.

'I am based at Monash University in Melbourne, and I am the director of the Academy of Performing Arts. I run Monash Art ensemble. It's a collaboration between the students and

As a player, Grabowsky is an advocate of collaborative works. 'I love collaborating and working with people who challenge my way of thinking. I have to have my brain challenged. And to be made to do things that are outside of my comfort zone. Anybody who is half my age is bound to have ideas that I haven't thought of so I always look forward to playing with young musicians. When I was young I learnt a lot from older players. I would like to think that part of the wonderful music that we play is the ability to refresh yourself by playing with young people.

'I encourage young musicians to listen widely and deeply, to explore traditions in current practice, to be very self-critical and to work very hard.

Being self-critical is extremely important if you are going to evolve as a player.

'I think that being self-critical is essential – I listen back to my playing, I am aware of what I am doing, and I try to be aware of that. I look at these things as evolutionary – I arrived at a certain way of doing things quite a long time ago. I don't wish to change the way I sound – I am happy with that – but I do want to get better at it.'






Cinema Review

The movie had only been running for about fifteen minutes when it struck me, with head-banging certainty - 'this is a crock'. It then went from bad to worse. The story of Noah's Ark, an 'end of days' morality saga about what happens if you anger a vengeful master, is told in three short chapters of Genesis. Other than the flood and the animals, there is not a lot of material with which a filmmaker might construct a blockbuster but, with \$125 million burning a

hole in his pocket, director Darren Aronofsky has gone troppo and come up with a standard hero (Russell Crowe) versus thousands of bad guys (led by Ray Winston) action flick. What is strange is that, despite his script's being lifted straight out of the Bible, the word god is never uttered -'the Creator' being Aronofsky's weak-kneed alternative. In screen adaptations of ancient documents it's always interesting to see what is taken from the source and what is cut – the raven

sent forth by Noah rarely gets a mention in popular re-telling, but is included here, as is the touching and identifiably human episode in which Noah's sons cover their father's body after he'd fallen down in a drunken stupor. Otherwise, it is endless rubbish, veering hysterically from bizarre sci-fi, as fallen angels stumble about the landscape in the form of giant figures made out of stone, to dysfunctional family histrionics. There aren't a lot of laughs to be had in

the Old Testament, but the sight of Anthony Hopkins as Methuselah scrabbling around in the undergrowth looking for berries to eat as the deluge engulfs him is enough to tickle anybody's funnybone, atheist or believer. Otherwise, the palette is crushingly black and brown and, sadly, the story's most eloquent and heartening image – the one painted by countless artists - of the dove returning with an olive shoot in its beak, is an example of CGI at its most jarringly fake.



In its favour, Noah at least delivered some overdue

decent rain to the shire. Hallelujah. ~ John Campbell

that so much these days is done with the book and movie in mind. Popular media will never be able to satisfy the mob's thirst for thrills and titillation and vicarious achievement (you can buy the T-shirt for \$20). Like when that girl sailed around the world to become the youngest person to do it – there has to be a better reason, surely? None of which is meant to denigrate Robyn Davidson's epic feat.

dog Dig and four camels, she walked 1,700 kilometres to the Western Australia coast, wrote about it for National Geographic, expanded that piece into a best-selling book and, inevitably, we now have John Curran's excellent screen adaptation of it. There is a wickedly un-PC joke at the outset when, as Davidson, Mia Wasikowska is not permitted to take her camels through Uluru National Park because it is sacred ground, but the targets of wrathful humour are not atypically the fat tourists she encounters (who,

in all likelihood, forked out the money to put her book at the top of the charts) and the paparazzi who converged on her (and without whom nobody would know who she was). Curmudgeonly gripes aside, this is beautifully filmed, paced so as never to drag and richly atmospheric. I was also surprised by incidents of intense emotion – Davidson's response to an aggressive approach by feral camels is heart-stopping, and Wasikowska's reading of the moment doubly so. In hindsight, it was at

this point that the film got 'real' for me. Wasikowska is wonderful. Physical beauty, by encouraging the viewer to gaze dotingly on it, can often be a hindrance to deeper rapport, but Wasikowska subtly but firmly draws you into her world. She's great with the animals, too, behaving towards them with unforced familiarity. Adam Driver, channeling Jeff Goldblum, provides pleasing romantic relief, but it's all about the journey - and we're all on one of them.

BYRON FRESH CAFÉ MUST HAVE ONE of the best locations for a restaurant in Byron. On one side its tables stretch down a lane, behind the Beach Hotel, that is crowded with smaller restaurants; the other side looks onto possibly the busiest part of Jonson Street. In fact Fresh have just added a sidewalk bench to their footpath dining options, so that you can sit right in the footpath if you really want

Whether you are on the small tables on the footpath, or up in the slightly elevated interior that opens onto the street, Fresh is ideal for people-watching, and must be

one restaurant that everyone visiting Byron sees almost straight away. There's always been a pretty relaxed vibe about the restaurant; when The Echo had an office opposite, I was surprised to see a woman strip off her bikini and start to dine topless, but I guess the drugs were better in those days.

to be part of the action.

Restaurant manager Holly Leckie seems to thrive on the excitement of interacting with the throngs of visitors passing daily. 'We aim to provide a relaxed experience where all walks of life are made to feel welcome, she says. 'We love our live music, happy hour,

and hearing about our guests' travels and adventures. We especially love hearing about surfing adventures and reports.'

To add to the vibe of the place, there always seems to be some live music playing outside the restaurant. Although the website policy is 'no reservations', it is worth ringing to see if it is possible to reserve a table; on the evening we visited, dinner was just getting started, some good music was playing out the front, and the restaurant was almost full.

To go with the live music, there's a happy hour when selected wines and beers from the menu are discounted. We chose a table up the back because I'm the kind of middleaged person who likes to talk over dinner,

and ordered from a wine list where no bottles are over \$50 and almost every wine is available by the glass.

Holly says that the menu is 'mostly aimed at a healthy eating lifestyle, with organic ingredients and a range of freshly squeezed juices, but Fresh do offer a number of naughty menu items as well to keep everyone happy. We use all local suppliers and make our own food; no sauces are bought in bottles or jars and all of our sweets, cakes and muffins are baked on the premises. We cater for gluten- and dairy free,

and vegetarians'.

The breakfast menu includes Bircher muesli, green apples, yoghurt and mixed berry compote (\$11.50); spicy caramelised mushrooms on sourdough with ricotta and roasted organic tomatoes (\$16.50); and of course the 'big brekkie' (\$22). A sample from the lunch menu: the fresh deli board of sliced prosciutto, sopressa, olives, hummus, Danish feta, roast peppers, eggplant and warm bread (\$22); pan-seared scallops with cauliflower puree, cherry tomatoes, mustard seed and crispy pancetta (\$21); and there's a range of burgers that can be eaten gluten-free if you wish, including one that is surely uniquely named – the 'snity snity bang bang', comprising free-range chicken schnitzel, tomato, capsicum relish, aioli

and a panini bun (\$14.50).

Popular dinner options include the confit Bangalow pork belly with spicy chorizo, caramelised apples, jus and apple puree (\$31), fish cakes with potato, parsley and capers topped with smoked salmon (\$24.50), and the seafood platter, which varies by the







UDIA land supply report finds new block

sizes continue to shrink

The traditional suburban quarter acre block is nothing but a distant memory, according to the findings of a new report on land supply released last week by the Urban Development Institute of Australia.

The 2014 UDIA State of the Land Report, launched at the opening of the UDIA National Congress in Brisbane, has found that the average size of new residential lots is now a mere 1/10th of an acre (423m2), after falling 29 per cent in size over the last decade.

'Governments around the country are failing to take action to address the key barriers holding up the supply of land for residential development, and the collapse in new lot sizes is the result of developers trying to maintain the supply of affordable land to the market,' said UDIA national president Cameron Shephard.

'Inadequate investment in urban infrastructure, slow planning and approvals systems, and high taxes and charges are strangling the supply of land for new housing, severely damaging housing affordability. Unfortunately this means that for new home buyers, the good old days of tossing the footy around with the kids or having a game of backyard cricket are well and truly over.'

Sydney and Brisbane saw the greatest declines in median lot size over 2012/2013, with lot sizes plummeting by 16 per cent and 12 per cent respectively.

'UDIA strongly supports a diversity of product to the market as some people want a lock-and-leave lifestyle,' Mr Shephard said.

'What concerns us is that a family can no longer afford a backyard where a family can play and grow.'

In addition to new lot size, the 2014 State of the Land Report also evaluates each city against key performance criteria, such as affordability, lot supply, infill performance, taxes and charges, infrastructure provision, and planning system performance.

Over the year, Adelaide and Brisbane saw performance improve on measures such as the provision of infrastructure, and lowering barriers to infill development. However decade-low levels of lot production in both Adelaide and Brisbane are an ongoing problem.

Comparatively, Sydney, Melbourne and Perth performed less favourably, particularly in regard to their planning and approvals systems, and the level of taxes and charges levied on new development.

'UDIA is concerned that housing has fallen off the agenda for governments around the country,' Mr Shephard said.

'The 2014 UDIA State of the Land Report shows that there are still major problems with land supply and housing affordability across our largest cities, and that governments need to take urgent action.'






