

New Byron plaza given green light

A large-scale 'green star' redevelopment of the southern end of the Byron Woolies plaza has been approved by Council.

And despite it breaking height restrictions for the town by around 10 per cent, Greens mayor Simon Richardson gave it a glowing endorsement throughout Thursday's Council debate (seven votes to two).

The existing cinema, carpark and shopping centre will be redeveloped to create a 3,400 square metre mall called Mercato on Byron, and will include a ground-floor supermarket, first-floor retail shops, restaurants, a bowling ally, an art gallery, a sevencinema complex, two-level basement car parking and a terrace over the Jonson Street road reserve.

A centrally located roof feature will provide natural light and ventilation, contributing to the greenstar rating but placing the building above the set height limit.

Cr Richardson told *The Echo* that 'No-one will see it from the street, and the height means a natural air vent will be in place instead of just air-conditioning.'

QLD-based developer Robert Badalotti previously put forward plans that were criticised by the public and the mayor as not befitting the town's character. But the current design has gained the mayor's complete support.

'We are lucky the proponents agreed to consider community concerns,' he said. 'It's a great position for a developer to start with. Council

and the proponents worked together to get a five-star green-star building, the only one in regional Australia: a building with an art gallery and public spaces, Cr Richardson said.

'I think it is the best we can get within the parameters; it's a great testament to [planning director] Ray Darney and planning staff.

'It's a great template for future developments and says to developers, "If you're content with maybe a bit less and give us something the community wants, Council is prepared to be flexible".

'As a council and staff, we are reshaping how we deal with community opportunities in our town,' the mayor said. He added he thought he would never find himself spruiking a shopping plaza redevelopment.

Possible toxic soils


With the building being situated on potentially radioactive tailings, *The Echo* asked Council's planning director Ray Darney what remediation works would be undertaken to mitigate the result of decades of sand mining in the town.

He told *The Echo* that part of the consent approval conditions required soil monitoring throughout the construction process. 'If toxicity issues arise, the developer will be required to remediate the site to limit any further contamination.'

Fast food clause

And as part of the consent conditions, Council has sought to prevent major multinational fast food chains

Tallowood moves to protect forested areas

In an effort to protect the ridgeline overlooking Tallowood residential development in Mullumbimby, reduced lots and residential sizes for stage 3C have been announced.

One of the estate's developers, Eric Freeman, told *The Echo* that he met with Council staff Friday to come to the revised plan that 'considerably reduces the size of the three lots proposed in Stage 3C and places the parts of the land in stage 3C that are forested to now be incorporated into the shelter belt along the ridgeline.'

The amendment comes after resi-

dents voiced concerns about new blocks that had been released for sale on the ridgeline. They feared the area, which is known as a wildlife corridor, would be reduced in size owing to the block sizes being proposed.

Adding to residents' concerns is a NSW bill aimed at reducing fire hazards. It sparked fears of habitat loss with large-scale clearing near homes in the Sydney suburb of Hornsby, among others.

Minister Brad Hazzard's comment on The Rural Fires Amendment (Vegetation

Clearing) Bill 2014 at the time was, 'people before trees is the priority.'

Meanwhile Mr Freeman said, 'Council officers present at the meeting welcomed the amendment, as it removes the issue of "potential damage to trees on the ridgeline".

'Council will now consider the new plan in detail and will refer the proposed design to the NSW Rural Fire Service. Once the comments of the Rural Fire Service are received, a final determination will be made.'

Mr Freeman added the new blocks will be 'pegged as soon as continued on page 2 ➤

A clause reads, 'prior to issue of an occupation certificate, both council and proponents develop a formal agreement based on a section 88E Conveyancing Act 1991 restriction, that is supported by both parties'.

Cr Sol Ibrahim agreed with the mayor that the final plan was a good outcome, however told The Echo he was initially frustrated at being not included in initial earlier discussions. Those frustrations were also shared by Cr Basil Cameron.

Cr Ibrahim said, 'In relation to the leases and tenancies, I think we now have a workable compromise?

'In landscaping, there was a lot already set and there's now an opportunity to make a beautiful open space for the community. Early on I had concerns about the height but I found the argument from the architect compelling.'

But Cr Di Woods strongly opposed the attempts to keep out multinational food chains, which she described as a restriction of trade.

'My understanding is the proponents have given verbal undertaking and I think this

is a slap in the face. I think it's probably anticompetitive,' she said. Cr Rose Wanchap also queried whether such measures would exclude multinationals that source local produce and offer healthier food.

Cr Cameron remained opposed to the development on the grounds that it could come back to bite Council in future.

'Councillors are feeling the weight of commercial and legal pressures and they simply aren't prepared to stand up for what's important, he said.

'Height is arguably the most important provision - no other more clearly reflects the nature of Byron Bay - yet we're prepared to roll over on it.'

Handful of replies

A media spokesperson for the developer told The Echo that they received 'only a handful of community responses to the plans, which we interpret as the community being comfortable with the design."

They added there are no current plans for the existing Woolies building, should the supermarket take the new premises. The development was approved, with the unlikely duo of councillors Woods and Cameron voting against.

Byron Central Hospital works begin

Those heading into Byron on Labor as spending 'almost Ewingsdale Road will have seen that work is now underway on the site of the new Byron Central Hospital.

To mark the occassion, the office of health minister Jillian Skinner sent a press release last week name-calling two decades delivering nothing but empty promises to the Byron Shire community.'

The berating by Ms Skinner continued with, 'Sadly, Labor continues its scare campaign about the services provided by the new Byron Central Hospital. This is rich considering they did not invest a single cent to build the new facility.

The comment was in reference to claims that day surgery would be outsourced.

Ms Skinner said, 'I want to assure the community the new Byron Central Hospital

will be a public hospital which provides free public health care for public patients.'

The Echo has asked the Northern NSW Local Health District to explain its plans for both hospitals once the hospital opens in mid-2016. A reply is expected this coming week.

Community meets over development push

Around 200 residents attended last Thursday's public meeting regarding the state government's push to develop West Byron, just outside the town's CBD.

According to Byron Residents Group's Cate Coorey, the group mobilised into six working groups.

'The groups are made up of those who are either specialists or have an interest in that field. There's an ecology group and even a youth group,' she said.

She says residents have, vowed to fight and throw everything they have into reversing the decision.'

'Community action has worked before in Byron,' she added.

Residents claim that the large-scale proposal is flawed with planning inconsistencies, and community requests were ignored.

After ten years of failing to get Council approval, the West Byron developers applied instead to the NSW government and were recently sucessful in gaining a rezoning for the 108 hectares.

Returning planning to communities

But the decision and the NSW coalition's election promise of 'returning planning to communities' came under fire from Labor and The Greens.

Despite the coalition abolishing the Part3A legislation that allowed developers to bypass councils, there appears to be now the same provision to do so under the newly established state significant development application, which falls under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

When The Echo asked local NSW MP Don Page (Nationals) for clarity on his party's election promise and why developers can still bypass councils, he replied: 'The hypocrisy of Labor is breathtaking! It was Labor that brought the rezoning in under the state significant state environmental planning

policies (SEPP) in 2009.'

'The then-Green majority Byron Council had advised the then-Labor government they didn't have the resources to deal with the rezoning application. The rezoning has never been subject to Part3A, which we abolished on coming to government in 2011. It's always been dealt with under the SEPP.

Two minute Bob...

What journo would refuse an opportunity to interview former NSW Labor premier and foreign minister Bob Carr?

Mr Carr, along with celebrated author Thomas Keneally, will be in Lennox Head as part of a book tour, and thus a phone interview was arranged.

The call came through, and there were obligatory niceties. Then I asked the softest, squishiest question on how his young impressionable life was affected by Saint Gough Whitlam. 'I was a teenage-Whitlamite,' Bob enthused, 'and joined the party at 15. It became rapidly clear in my view that he was the only the person who could articulate a modern vision. He was also capable of catching the swinging voter...'

But it soon became rapidly apparent too that Bob didn't want to answer any questions unrelated to the golden Whitlam years. It was like boxing a glacier. 'Do you think ICAC has overstepped its charter by investigating barrister Margaret Cunneen?' He stopped me mid-sentence and said flatly he knew nothing of the case.



Okay. Then I asked, 'Do we need a federal ICAC?', to which he said No. 'You would need a strong case for that, and you would have to think long and hard about it,' he replied.

Okay – back to wonderful Gough. 'Wow, Gough sounded like a great man,' I said.

How tedious. Attempting to salvage the conversation, I asked if he thought Gough's dismissal was in part owing to a US intelligence hit job.

Whitlam is said to have pushed the US over its spy base at Pine Gap near Alice Springs, which is off limits to Australians. And the US are well known to overthrow leaders of other nations if they suspect it conflicts with their interests.

Journalist John Pilger even claims that the CIA officer who helped set up Pine Gap, Victor Marchetti, told him, 'This threat to close Pine Gap caused apoplexy in the White House... a kind of Chile [coup] was set in motion.'

Anyway, back to Bob: 'I have never seen evidence of CIA involvement, and Whitlam himself said he didn't think it was to do with the US.'

Mr Carr did go on to say that then-governor-general, John Kerr, was solely responsible for Gough's demise and then expanded on other elements that caused him to topple: 'The government was broken by the economic crisis in the mid 70s; the oil crisis, unemployment and inflation...'

'He had pushed the limits of government spending, something he admitted in his memoirs.

'There were rising prices, a wages boom. An absence of a wages policy was another.'

Alas, further attempts to tease out comment over matters of foreign or domestic policy were rebuffed.

Mr Carr and Keneally will be in conversation with Candice Baker from 5pm at the Lennox Cultural and Community Centre on Saturday, November 29.

Overcoming unimaginable tragedy

How the mother of a US school shooting victim sought forgiveness and love

Almost two years ago at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, Connecticut, a lone gunman murdered 20 children, many of them first-graders, and six adults. When the police turned up, Adam Lanza turned the gun on himself.

For many of us this kind of tragedy is unimaginable, and how a surviving parent or sibling manages to make sense of life, or even start to heal, is unfathomable. Scarlett Lewis is an inspiration.

On the morning of December 14, 2012, Scarlett said good bye to her first-grader son Jesse. Six-year-old Jesse never returned.

'Right after the tragedy, I asked myself the same two questions: how could something like this happen and what could I personally do to make sure it doesn't happen again?' Scarlett said.

Since the loss of her son, she established the Jesse Lewis Choose Love Foundation to teach the simple message of choosing love over anger.

'My personal thought was the tragedy started with an angry thought in the shooter's head. I pictured him as a little boy having an angry thought without the tools from a nurturing environment to handle

'Anger can snowball if left unchecked. It can lead to rage, and it can negatively impact us on a cellular level; it can change our biology.

'I believe that rage leads to acts of violence. I believe that is what led to the act of violence. The amazing thing is a thought can be changed; at any point in Adam's life, his anger could have been changed.

'I wanted to start a move-



ment to help people and children understand they are not their angry thoughts and they can change?

And so began Scarlett Lewis's healing journey to forgive her son's killer.

'Three days after Jesse was murdered, I got up at the memorial service and told them my theory. I told them I believed it had started as one angry thought in Adam Lanza's head. Everyone has asked what can we do for you?

'I asked that people consciously change one angry thought into a loving thought every day. It will make you happier and make it a peaceful world.

Change thoughts

'People left the memorial service and I got feedback a week later that people took that message to heart.'

Scarlett believes we are not given the necessary tools to manage complex emotions like anger.

'For children, it's not just academic learning that is important - it's the social and emotional learning. It's understanding our feelings and why we have them and what we do with them.

'It's moral awareness, mindfulness, character value and understanding how our brain works. When we have our angry thoughts, we can understand how they hijack

our brain and how we can self-regulate.

'Our education system has never addressed these questions, and in the end it's more important than academics.'

As part of her family's healing, Scarlett and her son JT become involved with Rwandan genocide survivors.

Rwandan story

'They reached out via Skype through an interpreter and told JT and me their story. At this point I hadn't gone back to work and JT hadn't gone back to school.

'Our friends kept trying to tell us we we would be okay but we knew they hadn't experienced a devastating loss.

'But here were young people with a legitimacy. People who had experienced something far worse than us in their life.

'They told JT they were sorry to hear about his brother and shared their personal stories. One girl, Chantall, had witnessed her entire family being murdered at eight.

'She then had her throat slit and was buried alive in a shallow grave with her family.

'She had to hide for days, she dug her way out and found her way to an orphanage. After her physical wounds had healed, she felt incredible gratitude for the walls, the food and made the conscious choice to forgive the people

who had murdered her family, otherwise she would go down the same path as the perpetrators. She told us that her healing was the act of forgiving.'

The conscious choice to forgive

'That night JT and I sat down and talked about things we had that we were grateful for. We both made the conscious choice to forgive so we wouldn't stay in the pit of anger and despair.'

Her son JT then went on to set up a non-profit organisation to help young Rwandans attend college.

Scarlett believes that being in the service of others is where we heal. 'It's the most healing thing we can do - to be in the service of others.

Jesse Lewis may have died on 14 December 2012, but short six years have inspired many to live a better life.

'The mission of the foundation started when I saw a message Jesse had written on our kitchen chalkboard just days before he died, says Lewis.

'He had written "nurturing healing love". I found it after he died. I knew immediately that he had a spiritual knowing that he wasn't going to be here much longer and that he wanted to leave a message of comfort. And that message was meant for the world because it is what we need to move towards.

'Jesse was a force to be reckoned with... and in the end it's not the length of your life, it's what you do with it.'

Council gathers to plot its next move to improve the community

It's never a dull moment in the house of pain, which occurred at Council's meeting last Thursday.

Early in the day, mayor Simon Richardson launched a blistering assault on the lack of community engagement or interest by Byron Woolies, 'Who in three years that I know of, have given only a \$100 shop voucher to Schoolies.'

'It's a corporate disgrace,' he said. The outburst was in relation to the impending Schoolies onslaught, which the mayor says needs more business support. Council managed to

Camping

Moving on, a 12-month trial of a Freedom Camping site/s will be explored after Cr Spooner's motion gained support.

Aimed at addressing camper vans that are part of the tourist mix, staff have been asked to identify appropriate partner/s to undertake such a trial through an expression-of-interest process.'

Meanwhile deputy mayor Alan Hunter managed to gain unanimous councillor support to amend the conditions on operating his storage business at the end of a quiet street in Myocum. Cr Hunter, who previously managed to get a 'change of use for a farm building to road transport terminal, will now will be allowed, 'a maximum number of 10 truck movements per week'.

No doubt it's another blow to his long-suffering neighbours, who claim the commercial operation is better suited to industrial areas and is not directly farm-related.

West Byron clarity

And West Byron got yet another run before Council with a mayoral urgency motion.

It sought to request 'immediate discussions' between the NSW Planning Department and Council regarding West Byron's Development Control Plan (DCP).

The motion reads that 'The purpose of these discussions is to clarify the department's response to the issues raised in Council's submission regarding the West Byron Urban Release Area State

Significant Site Report.'

Specifically, Council want the acknowledgment from the NSW Planning Department that Council, 'is the responsible Local Government Authority for the preparation of the urban release area DCP.

Council will also enquire with the planning department 'as to whether the [zoning] gazettal prevents the lodgement of DAs prior to adoption of a DCP.






Latest book on Mullum's history launched

A new book chronicling the area's history was launched by councillor Basil Cameron recently at the Brunswick Valley Historical Society's 30th celebration.

It's the fourth in a series by Peter Tsicalas, and is titled Mullumbimby: Growth & Grief 1948-1968.

Cr Cameron said, 'Peter's work is a lively and entertaining recounting of our recent past, filled with familiar names, faces and events that will challenge much of our understanding of ourselves. An understanding that is often



clouded in current folklore?

The book explores how, as once the region's fastest growing town, Mullum peaked with building approvals falling from the late 1940s. Heroically, townsfolk fought to provide for and maintain their own; the organisation and fight by farmers to sustain rural industries and the early signs of an emerging tourism industry had in fact masked a slow decline.

By 1971, the population had declined by six per cent and the town appeared to be on course to meet the fate of so many country towns facing a collapse in rural activity. For more visit www.mullumbimbymuseum.org.au.

Utility privatisation transparent: MP

Suggestions that privatisation of some of the state's electricity grid - or the poles and wires will impact on the public purse have been hosed down by local Nationals MP Don Page.

NSW Labor candidate for Ballina Paul Spooner 'challenged' the MP to take the issue to a referendum.

Mr Spooner claims the coalition's plans to privatise the publicly owned infrastructure – if it wins government next year - 'will increase electricity prices for families and rob the state of over a billion dollars each year that funds infrastructure, hospitals and schools.

He said, 'The electricity network represents decades of public investment in infrastructure that returns over a billion dollars each year to pay for building and maintaining schools, hospitals, roads and pays the wages of teachers, nurses and police.'

One billion dollar returns for govt

The Echo asked Mr Page why his government would try to unload an asset returning a billion dollars a year, as claimed by Labor.

He replied, 'The government's policy on poles and wires is that we intend to lease 49 per cent of the metropolitan poles and wires.

'This will raise around \$20 billion to invest in muchneeded infrastructure; \$6 billion of this will be spent in the regions like the north coast.

'All the regional poles and wires will remain 100 per cent

in public ownership. 'The government has no plans to change the current water assets situation.

No referendum

'There is no need for a referendum. Our government is putting our policy out there in the public domain in a totally transparent way prior to the election so people can make a judgment on the issue then.

'The Nationals did a very good job negotiating to get \$6 billion spent in the regions even though there will be no lease or sale of any regional poles and wires.'

Self-cleaning toilets for Apex Park

New toilets are expected to be delivered at Apex Park on Byron's beachfront by the end of the week, say Council.

Called Exeloos, a block of three self-cleaning, unisex toilets will take two weeks to install, says Council's infrastructure services director Phil Holloway.

'In listening to feedback from residents and visitors, the beachfront toilet amenities have been long overdue for an upgrade.

'The new toilet block will be in place for the peak season and will include a baby change table.

'In the meantime, the old amenities will be gutted and change rooms and storage lockers put in place. While an interim measure, the new toilets are far superior to the existing facilities and will be able to accommodate a higher number of usages owing to their self-cleaning capability.

Mr Holloway says the

block of three self-cleaning toilets is being located next to the existing toilet facilities at the Surf Club to help provide connection to existing water and sewerage services.

An additional six portaloos have also been brought in to help service the additional needs during schoolies, New Years Eve and the school holiday period.

Public toilets near Fishheads will also continue to be available 24 hours.







Get tough on illegal holiday-lets

■ Illegal holiday letting cannot be resolved. It is a crime. Under the Environmental Planning and Assesment Act 1979, Sections 76A and B. Recent judgment? Dobrohotoff v Bennic [2013] NSWLEC 61. It is very, very clear. Google, read, understand.

Dwelling house means dwelling as in home. Not commercial letting. End of story.

Penalties? Section 126:

offence against this Act shall, for every such offence, be liable to the penalty expressly imposed and if no penalty is so imposed to a penalty not exceeding 10,000 penalty units and to a further daily penalty not exceeding 1,000 penalty units.

(2) A person guilty of an offence against the regulations is, for every such offence, liable to:

(a) the penalty (not exceeding 1,000 penalty units) expressly imposed by the regulations, or

(b) if no such penalty is imposed, to a penalty not exceeding 1,000 penalty units.'

And what that translates to is \$1.1 million, plus \$110,000 per night. This is on top of on-the-spot fines that may be issued. If they don't pay up, they go to jail.

When the corruption stops, this game is going to end, bitterly.

The moment this short-term renting is made legal, there will be absolutely no way it can be controlled and this is what residents really need to understand.

> Council has been almost completely negligent in enforcing the rules under the current LEP which is still in operation but at least with a

workable policy and determined implementation, they still could and surely this should be focus of any new DCP, not the extraordinarily complicated and unrealistic policy on exhibition - and if anyone thinks I'm exaggerating, please try to read the policy on Council's website.

Perhaps it's time victims of holiday letting – and there are many - should consider a class action against Council, which has certainly not carried out its duty of care towards them.

I'd suggest returning to what we had before, amended to suit our changed conditions. Traditionally, some people let their homes during some of the school holidays and Council turned a blind eye – unless there were complaints when action was taken. I'd think this not unreasonable and what needs to be spelt out in policy is holiday letting during school holidays only, with fines - I'd make them heavy - for any initial upset to residents and termination of letting if a second complaint is upheld.

No short-term letting at any other time of year, no ridiculous 'categories' which Council staff could hardly be expected to actually police (or even administer); in other words keep it simple, manageable and fair. I intend to submit along these lines to Council and, as opposed to last week's letter writers, ask that others do also but not in support of making holiday letting legal; give the illegal operators a 'sunset clause' – a year or two at most to shut down their illegal operations and warn of action to follow against any non-compliance - and mean it. The illegals are easily found on the net.

waterways (and it's also common courtesy not to abuse waterway areas that are obviously maintained for private use). Private does mean private, and someone else's home-space is equally, if not more so, sacred as yours.

National Parks and Byron Shire Council have indicated a lack of resources to create and facilitate rural public walkways in adherence to strict public liability insurance guidelines; should rural private landowners be expected by the community and visitors to the shire to provide what both a national and local body seem so far incapable of? Could Abbott's green army be deployed to construct waterside walkways to public liability standards?

There remains an apparent misconception within the community that the privately maintained pathway right beside our home on our large rural property is gazetted for public right-of-way and insured for public use. This is

Numerous daily intrusions of our peace and privacy greatly detract from the enjoyment of our home and are a violation of the Privacy Act. Until such time that the community acts with a positive and unified voice and works for a legally maintained public access (which is obviously what many people want), private landowners have little recourse but to employ secure fencing, lock the gate, prosecute trespassers, cease pathway maintenance and allow nature to return in impenetrable chaos.

Please direct your concerns to either a national body (National Parks), your local representative body (Council), or legal counsel (your choice).

Most rural landowners and

residents guard and care for the land and hold little regard for those who disregard respect and due process.

Support small birds

Recently on the ABC there was a report on the decline of songbirds and other small birds supposedly owing to 'loss of habitat'. These small birds rely on shrubs and low bushes to give them protection against big birds and especially noisy miners. This is where the problem lies.

Most gardens have lawns and these lawns are mowed with ride-on mowers. Very efficient, but there is a problem. Ride-ons do not like low branches. They make it hard to mow around bushes, so once a ride-on comes into a garden, the garden is tidied up and all the protective lowhanging branches are cut off,

so the little birds go elsewhere for a place to live.

If you want small birds in your garden, leave the low branches, and plenty of shrubs. Let your garden get a little bit untidy and maybe even leave a small clump of lantana for birds to live and hide in.

Government opposes Ballina sports centre

The Greens NSW sports spokesperson Jeremy Buckingham last week condemned the Baird government for opposing a motion in favour of building a multi-purpose sports centre for Ballina, saying that the National Party are failing to deliver for the people and particularly the children of Ballina.

'The Greens moved this motion in parliament to put the issue of a multi-purpose sports centre for Ballina on the political agenda,' said Buckingham. 'It is disappointing that the government opposed the motion and continues to drag its feet on this issue.

'Why do other major centres enjoy this kind of facility, but a growing Ballina misses out? It is not fair and the Greens will continue to campaign to have funds and land committed to a new sports centre.'

Mr Buckingham plans to move a motion that calls on the NSW government to fund the construction of an indoor multi-purpose sports and events centre for Ballina, recognises that Ballina is the only town of its size in New South Wales that does not have a multicourt indoor sporting facility, recognise the potential for a modern, world-class indoor sports facility in Ballina to support the 2018 Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast, and boost the regional economy, recognise the work of the

Ballina community and in particular the Ballina Basketball Association, Ballina Regional Indoor Sporting Association, Southern Cross School, Basketball NSW, and Ballina Shire Council in supporting this project, and condemn The Nationals for failing to gain funding for this important project, despite its being over five years since the indoor sport and events centre was approved by Ballina Council.





The long and winding road

Take a drive through a mix of Lismore's distractions, places along the way and attractions worth spruiking.

travel to Lismore when there are things to do and places to go, maybe a friend needs a specialist and I've offered my car and chauffeuring, or I'm hunting a few things at once, a Bunnings here, an Officeworks there, and a little of the 'hipto-be-Square'. This isn't an ad for these places, it's the reality when Lismore calls. So, when I speak of going out to Lismore from the Byron Shire, it's about the drive, that long and winding road... that leads to Lismore's door.

Before you even step foot in the city, there's the obvious country distractions. I've spoken in a fashion of the towns dotted throughout the undulating hills of the region but I'll recap: Clunes Store and the Old Romantic Shack for some bric-a-brac; a little to the right is Dunoon, known as the Macadamia Capital of Australia and also as the gateway to Rocky Creek Dam; the major source of the region's drinking water and a fine picnic and barbecue spot. Take the kids or your friends on one or all of the four walks that you can do from the picnic area at Rocky Creek Dam. With each walk you'll see different aspects of the Rainforest Reserve and get a little bit more exhausted. Off the Lismore to Bangalow Road, between Clunes and Bexhill, is the historic railway village of Eltham, a worthwhile diversion for all with The Pantry and the Eltham Pub (I've personally eaten at both and highly recommend a visit).

Then Bexhill with its Open Air Cathedral ('bless me Father'... or Farther, dependent on how naughty you've been) and before we go too far there's The Channon, home to the original north coast craft market and over 30 years on their 'make it, bake it or grow it' philosophy still exists. Nimbin too is a place not to be ignored, although it's a trek from Byron; if you're already in Lismore it's 30km north and you'll be kneedeep in quirky township, with a unique mural streetscape of indigenous, rainforest and psychedelic facades and local characters. Cullen Street has an array of cafes, craft shops, galleries and retail outlets. Some of the go-to places include the Nimbin Candle Factory, The Rainbow Power Company and the Djanbung Permaculture Gardens. Back again to Rosebank and last, but not least, Wyrallah, once a bustling river port - it's downstream from Lismore on the Wilsons River.

Lismore CBD

The town of Lismore has retained its older more interesting buildings, unlike other overdeveloped towns. The activities do abound here: CBD walks, trailing the art galleries and studios and the Mother of Galleries of course being the Lismore Regional Art Gallery. Naturally, like all regional areas, if you're serious, the local Tourist Information Centres are the first place to

visit, or take a squiz at their websites if you're time poor (www.visitlismore.com.au). If they're good at the job they'll tell you where to go and at the same time flog the many locally made products they retail in house (perhaps a gift to take home for those guests up for the week).

The art of walking

The Back Alley Gallery is a walk through the laneways of the city centre with local and national artists graffiti and stencil artworks on show. This walk will immerse you in the street-art culture of Lismore.

Train your tots

If you're in town with the kids on board, get some peace for a minute with the Heritage Park children's playground. The first thing I noticed here was the ample shade, something nearly every play area ever built seems to have forgotten. There's an assortment of play structures and a good spread of them to keep the interest. The second thing I noticed was the tiny train station and a miniature train track around the grounds - whoopee! I have a trainobsessed toddler. This minitrain costs \$2 and could be the ticket to a big smile and a quick calm coffee. Runs Sat and Sun 10am-4pm, Thurs and pub hols 10am-2pm. School hols every day 10am-4pm – confirm on 6629 8186

Word of mouth

The first thing I do when I'm in unfamiliar territory, in an eating sense, is get the locals lowdown on places. A mean-average of recommendations will narrow the online onslaught to a fine point and generally get you in a good eatery quickly avoiding the shonky. Here's what I gleaned from a number of kind locals. This is in no particular order.

Light my fire

Though I've given a full account of the Black Sombrero's food in these pages, it may just be a coincidence that Fire in the Belly was started by these same folk. What is

evident is that all who spoke to me of this award-winning modern wood-fired pizza couldn't praise it enough. It's as well known as the dragon Smaug is in The Hobbit. This isn't a metaphor, it relates to the colourful and uniquely sculptured smouldering dragon that drapes over the wood fire oven at this eatery. I haven't as yet eaten here, though the walls are adorned with Restaurant and Catering Assoc' awards including one for the 'Best pizza in Australia. I'm told the pizza bases are made fresh daily in-house using ingredients the likes of stone-ground organic flours. I guess the consistent local recommendation (without trip adviser to assist me) compels me to state this recommendation blind. You be the judge when next you're in Lismore. 109 Dawson Street Lismore. Eat these shorts

The following are a bunch of eateries with dining cred given a big tick by local Lis-



The service is all the talk 'snappy and efficient' along with the range of dishes, most people equated the food with local, fresh quality produce 'it's beautifully presented and expertly cooked'. The Pie Cart has to be on this list: as I stood taking photos, I was greeted by two friends from distant places in the space of three minutes. It's an icon of course and who doesn't like sloppy peas and gravy? I had a duck and

mushroom pie and enjoyed it thoroughly; 11 Magellan St, Lismore, 6622 2946.

Goanna Bakery is the place where your crust is in good hands. Organic healthy and wholesome goods baked daily here and I do love their wholemeal pie cases. 171 Keen St, Lismore: 6622 2629. **Dragonfly Cafe.** Again this place I've yet to try, but it has the locals' approval: 'Always packed and the coffee is made by one of the best baristas I have ever known, 'great honest food'. 36 Carrington St, Lismore, 6622 6556.

20,000 Cows is an easy and a hard recommendation at the same time. People who are vegetarians and vegans rave about this place, I'm neither veg or vegan and I love the food that comes forth. 

Taco-meter

ike the Aztec emperor, Montezuma in his last days as a captive of the Spanish conquistadors, typical versions of Mexican food seize my tastebuds, hold them hostage and mortally wound them. Of course, I'm referring to the ever-popular 'Tex-Mex' cuisine. Hey don't get me wrong, I'm the first to have a cheese meltdown with good corn chips guac' and the kids - at home though. Personally, I think, traditional pubs and the house-made (your own house) should be the only places you find the token beans and sour cream. When I'm out dining, don't taunt my tum with lashings of gas-producing dishes, glued together with yellow cheese

and formalised with a spoon of avo and a dollop of sour

I think this phobia of mine came from watching too many spaghetti Westerns as a teen; heavily-bearded outlaws mopping up great frying pans of beans just before ending the cantina owner. I imagine quite a few eateries were built on this paradigm. It seemed to inspire a number of restaurateurs into a frenzy of overpriced eateries. Whole chains opened based on the profit margin of a nachos alone - they became the outlaws, the ignorant were robbed like marks in a wild west country fair.

This sort of Tex-Mex banditry still goes on, it's the scared tastebud that continues to order the only thing it knows. I went out looking for my old adversary ready to

draw my pen in a stand-off, but I was pleasantly surprised by the authentic Mexican food I found at Lismore's Black

Lismore's latest drawcard

Sombrero.

On first inspection of the deserted street, Black Sombrero Mexican Taquería and Tequileria seemed to be in a part of town that, frankly you'd rather not be seen in after dark (much like the cliché towns in cowboy westerns at sundown), but according to the owners council applauds their stand in opening after 5.30pm, and to me this smart Mexican Cantina seems just the way to revitalise the CBD in the evening.

The night was as muggy as Mexico - thick with the day's heatwave still cooking the streets. With some appropriate aficionados for witness and company, we left the balmy night outside and found the joint was jumping inside. The mood was lively, festive and colourful and pulled us into the atmosphere without a problem. As a result, we were in the mood for margaritas and food. My guests were not just 'ordinaire' types, having travelled widely throughout Mexico, they were my token experts: Senor Costa, Senorita Juana and I entered and were seated in what we agreed was a bit of a 'Bermuda Triangle'; an area of an eatery that isn't covered by any one waitperson, the folk on such tables (us) are often overlooked even if there are copious staff on.

Fishing for complements not compliments

We needed drinks and were served reasonably quickly, then we were after the food to complement our liquid. It was a bit like fishing, once you hooked yourself a waiter, they were great, fully engaged, friendly and attentive. But it was busy, so every time we had a need, we had to go fishing for that service. I decided to get my camera out to gather curiosity (it was a desperate measure but worked).

James (our first waitperson) started with, 'We have a great nachos... ', but when he was interrupted with a clear and unequivocal

'no Tex Mex please!', he sighed with relief: 'That's great! It's been a slow and steady process getting people to try authentic Mexican dish-

es', he said. We ordered the 'Sombrero tasting plate': an inclusion of three unadulterated signature meats. Meats here don't just appear, they're lining up all skewered and flaming behind a windowed rotisserie char grill – a perfect addition to an already jumping Mexicana atmosphere. These came fresh and tender. Pulled pork, shredded beef and chicken placed alongside fresh fried tostadas (small corn chip style addendums). As with the range of house made taco's we tried, it was thumbs up from the travellers 'just like the Mexicans do em', they chirped.

When it came to the margarita menu, tequila and the art of drinking - a la Mexican, there were certainly no disappointments here. When Costa mentioned top shelf tequila I gave him a new pseudonym: Costa Lota. A three times filtered tequila, came still in the


bottle with its very own chaperon carrying it – Rob from the bar appeared an authority on alcohol, an encyclopaedia of tequila. We had a verbal tour of the gestalt of this smooth agave FOC with the expensive tipple sided with fresh slivered green apple to boot.

This place prepares and cooks tacos like a Mexican Eat Street - fresh, house-made and soft with filling flamed and fabulous. I'm happy I overcame my Tex-Mex induced preconceptions about entering this humble comida; it was a full house and we sat on its edge and were served really good and authentic energetic Mexican food. If you have the urge to be festive and you're out in Lismore, then Black Sombrero clocked high on my taco-meter and will have your tastebuds dancing a quebradita - buenos noches nachos!



George, how do you approach playing music these days? Has it changed much since you were a lad?

Well I just try to make the music sound nice and swinging. Every time. Most times I feel I succeed. Yes, after having played now since I was nine years old. Started classical training. Played in the Canberra Youth Orchestra. Things took a turn when I went to the guitar and played the blues and rock'n'roll for many years. Around age 25 my ears turned to jazzier things, though I still pull out all my old vinyl and get into the classic rock stuff: Cream, Johnny Winter, Beatles, The Stones,

A large part of my diet is jazz, but I'm listening to a lot of classical as well.

You're loved for your eccentricity. What are some of the more bizarre things you've had a crack at over your career?

I did a striptease in France a few years ago. Just to make sure the crowd was awake.

Are you a believer in mentoring new musicians? What advice would you have for new players coming into jazz today?

Absolutely. If people are interested in the music I'm always keen to give them a go and tell them my philosophy on music. At the Wangaratta Festival a couple of weeks ago I held a great workshop, and had them all playing - violin, didgeridoo, saxophone, trombone – had them all playing together and making music.

What do you think of this emerging new Jazz Party scene happening among the groovers in Melbourne? Why do you think all the inner-city hipsters are being turned back onto jazz?

Inner city groovers. Great. There's plenty of young folk being turned onto jazz at the moment. My sons play jazz guitar with me and various other players around Sydney, but are also involved in hip-hop and street art. Fantastic. Just go for it. There's so much to learn from jazz going back 100 years or so. I could go on forever about the next generation.

What attracted you to the genre when you were a happening young hipster?



Energy and a lot of sweat and joy to be



DRIVING US OVER THE EDGE

Here's a riddle for you: How many cars can you fit on Ewingsdale Road? Maybe the state government can answer it for us. They seem to have got all approval crazy on greenlighting development in Byron. In fact, I'm finding it hard to keep up with just how much new housing is coming our way. Last count I guestimated around 3,000 new dwellings in the Ewingsdale/Sunrise/ Chicken Farm region.

I'm all for it. I mean, the one thing missing around here is a ghetto. I mean, why not put more cars on the road? It's not like there's a problem with global warming and we need to make more sustainable communities. Yeah, it's an excellent idea to approve massive increase to developments without any plans for public transport.

Traffic jams are why people come here now. We should be marketing them. It's Bikram Yoga in the car. We've got some of the biggest traffic jams outside of Sydney. Traffic jams can be spiritual; I think they are an excellent place to practise mindfulness. You have to be in the moment when you're trapped.

I have another riddle for the state government. Surely the number of cars a seaside village can take is finite? Particularly as there's been no major improvements to existing infrastructure since white settlement. Something like 17,000 cars already use Ewingsdale Road daily. Most dwellings have a minimum of two cars each. So that should be at least another 6,000 vehicles. If vehicles are around 4.5 metres in length, and we stacked them end to end, that's 27 kilometres of cars Surely at some point at least 3,000 of the vehicles are going to want to nip into Byron to go to the luxurious new mall? I don't think we've got 13.5 kilometres of street to park 3,000 cars on. The state government forgot to install parking! Cars are going to be a major problem. In Future Byron, if you want to go to the plan your trip and leave a few

days before you need to get there. 'I'm just nipping down the shops for milk' would happen on Tuesday, and you'd be back Thursday. Meanwhile the kids are foaming at the mouth from two days of dry Weet-Bix.

When it comes to cars we have to start thinking outside the box. Koalas have survived in that area for years without hassle and do you know why? Koalas don't use cars. I think it's time we started to live more like koalas. If I were on Council I'd introduce a radical new plan. Byron is going to have to do a car cull. It's the only way. It would have been good to have some sort of light rail, but clearly no government is going to commit valuable resources to reliable, energyefficient, sustainable transport that will last centuries. It's just not feasible. And if we start saying who can have a car and who can't it just gets messy. It will create a black-market in counterfeit resident stickers.

Nah, I reckon no-one gets a car. Byron goes 'Car Free'. Cyclists give everyone the shits too and I think 23,000 bikes on the road may be tricky. Especially when there're only about four bike racks in town. When it comes to transport we're going to have to get really creative. I am thinking we could engage our local tourism industry, and get WWOOFers. People want somewhere to stay they could live with locals at the Stinking Dead Chicken Carcass Estate and they could piggyback local residents into town. The great thing about getting rid of cars is that we won't need any parking - we can mall the entire town. Make it a big shopping centre. With air-conditioning to protect us from global warming. Our menopausal tourism numbers would go through the bloody

DOUBLIN' NO TROUBLE FOR YOUTH FEST!

For the past three years Byron's **Yackrockcafe** has been putting youth music on the world map. This **Saturday** and **Sunday** will see many of the bands who have played on the YAC stage play two massive shows, the Metal United Down Under – Byron Bay event and the Which Way Festival.

Metal United Down Under is a national event happening in 16 locations across Australia, all on the same day, that aims to celebrate the diversity of metal bands and genres that Australia has to offer. The Byron show is a special one, being that it will be an all-ages event, mainly showcasing young metal bands.

The Which Way Festival is set to become an annual event. This is the second Which Way Festival, the first having happened in January 2013. 



WHAT HAPPENS IN WASHINGTON

On *There There*, Megan Washington's second full-length album and the followup to her ARIA-award-winning platinum debut *I Believe You Liar* (2010) Washington flexes her songwriter muscle, diving headfirst into themes centred on anxiety, bad sex, being unfaithful, being reckless and selfish, losing a best friend, and of course heart-cracking sadness.

It was producer Sam Dixon whom Washington credits with helping to crack her songwriting wide open.

'The writing and recording process was about four months long. If you can imagine spending eight hours a day every day in a room the size of your bathroom speaking about ideas and emotions, very quickly your measure of normal and the culture of that space rapidly becomes a safe haven where anything can be shared. All I did for four months was confide in Sam. We did so much talking. So by the time he got around to saying you have these habits I can identify, like when he said, 'You don't write about things that are really important to you. You just [write about] things that affect you moderately. You will never write a hit song because, let's face it, if it's bullshit then why would anyone care about it. It made perfect sense, although the process of breaking those habits was extremely painful."

At one stage, Sam gave Megan homework. 'He told me, "Go home and think about something in your life something that's actually happened, but you've never written about. Something you believe to be songworthy. Tomorrow we're going to write about that." Megan remembered she had once been engaged. 'I'd never really written about it, because I always had held the belief that it was too complex a situation to be contained in three and a half minutes.' That evening though, between glasses of wine and bed, she wrote about having her engagement ring resized. The song became a key track titled Marry Me.

'I always cringe when creative people talk about breakthrough moments,' she says. 'There's something so clichéd about pretending 'eureka moments' happen all the time. In my experience, they don't. But something about this song – about being connected to the subject, and the terror you'll get it wrong – was a breakthrough.

'Part of the difficulty of writing that song was the process of identifying what sort of song it should be. Is it a "we were together and broke up and I hate you"

or "I regret it" or "fuck you"?

'What actually was it? It took me a while and I reached a point where I could find something reasonable. In the end I went for "I can't believe you would have done that because I'm so fucked up". Which is the truth... so I was comfortable with that.'

Washington has a disarming honesty, something she laughingly refers to as a bit of a setback in the world of celebrity, which often calls for a more duplicitous approach.

'I am a terrible celebrity. I do that celebrity thing really badly because I just want to feel connected – I am a bit of a sucker'

Anxiety is also a constant companion for this talented singer/songwriter.

'When it's really active I just wake up with this impending sense of doom and that's something I have experienced on and off since I was a teenager. I've come to find some easy safeguards against that; for example I am a vegan now and that is extremely effective, my levels of anxiety almost halved when I stopped eating meat. I think it's like an energetic transfer; when you eat meat you are eating little slabs of fear... I don't know any creative person or any slightly intelligent person who doesn't have some sort of anxiety about something - they say ignorance is bliss - I feel like anxiety is really really normal.

Refreshingly frank, it's perhaps Washington's penchant for critical selfexamination that is the most charming.

As for the new album, Washington's creative thirst is sated, at least for now.

'I wrote all the songs I was afraid to write... I told the truth, as best I remember'

LET'S BE COPS

It's as though some movies just don't know when they are onto a good thing. That was my initial reaction to this - it might have been worthwhile but it quickly degenerated into yet another piece of boofhead rubbish.

I suppose I should not have been surprised, given that the American buddy genre is almost exclusively aimed at catering to the boy-man's sandpit sensibilities. Ryan and Justin (Jake Johnson and Damon Wayans Jr) have come from Ohio to make it big in LA. Both have promise, but the dream has not eventuated for either of them and they find themselves disillusioned and going nowhere. They arrive at a masquerade party foolishly dressed as police officers and after leaving with their tails between their legs they are identified on the streets as the real deal.

Adventures ensue and the fake coppers, whose self-esteem had previously been at rock bottom, are intoxicated by the respect and high regard that they are shown. Mistaken identity is an old trope - Shakespeare regularly called on it (not that Luke Greenfield's movie is remotely Shakespearean) – and it can be employed to create life-changing circumstances for those characters allowed to escape themselves. The problem here is that Greenfield, in opting for the easy sight gag, clichéd mobsters (Russians - what else?), and 'what the fuck' dialogue, has presented us with not just another gross-out comedy but a crass-out dud. You could see it coming when the guys are called to trouble at a raunchy hens' night and again when a squealing Sumo wrestler with no clothes on (just like the naked Chinaman in The Hangover) falls on top of Justin.

The shame of it is that there was a story of some depth needing to be explored. Alienation and a sense of personal failure are endemic in the shark pool that is our celeb-besotted market society - Ryan (Johnson is impressive) and Justin's everyday plight deserved a better treatment than low-brow goofiness.



THE HUNGER GAMES: MOCKINGJAY PART 1

After a decidedly inferior sequel to Hunger Games 1, Katniss Everdeen (Jennifer Lawrence) has made a mighty return to the screen. It's not absolutely essential to be au fait with what has happened previously; the preamble will only briefly confound those not familiar with the conflict.

Soon enough it is apparent that we are in a dystopian society that is ruthlessly controlled by a central power. Katniss and her followers represent the great unwashed of the outer districts, but in her case she was once a figurehead for the oligarchy. She is no longer a babe in the woods and, with the insights offered by the minders who have joined her side, including Haymitch (Woody Harrelson), Effie (Elizabeth Banks) and Plutarch (Phillip Seymour Hoffman), she has become acutely aware of the value of image, propaganda and role-playing.

Haymitch has one of the best lines when, to Katniss's 'what if I get killed?', he replies, 'Make sure the cameras are rolling'. Katniss also understands that power can corrupt the leader of any cause as the rebel forces' President Coin (Julianne Moore) strives to overthrow the wicked President Snow (Donald Sutherland).

The subterranean problem inherent in this and similar 'liberation' blockbusters lies in the movie's struggle to free itself from the straightjacket of its own double standard. How dare an industry that awards itself grotesque salaries and presents its stars as demigods pose as the champion of the downtrodden when it is comfortably ensconced as a down-treader? Or as the iconoclast that would shake the ground on which its Beverly Hills palaces are built? It's bogus, of course the people who profit from these movies don't want the world to change one bit... but, nevertheless, the fire might catch on.

Lawrence, Sutherland and Harrelson are great, and the CGI, now overdone to the point where it is merely repetitive eye-candy for boneheads, is used to brilliant effect when Katniss brings down a jet-fighter with her bow-and-arrow. The message is urgent, but not so urgent that we can't wait for a Part 2.





BYRON BAY CHRISTMAS – NEW YEAR Road Closure and Special Event Parking Area

New Year's Eve (NYE) road closure

Jonson Street, Byron Bay between Lawson Street through to the car park entry at Railway Park (north of Marvell Street) will be closed from 1pm on 31 December 2014 and reopen by 7am 1 January 2015. Detours will be in place and delays can be expected. The closure is provided for the 'Soul Street' event. See Council's website for more details.

Special Event Parking Area (SEPA)

Unless signed otherwise (e.g. 1P, 4P), a 2-hour (2P) time limit will apply within the Special Event Parking Area (SEPA) for the 7 days inclusive of 29 December 2014 to 4 January 2015. The 2P SEPA limit will apply to on-street parking in Byron Bay that is between and:

- east of the Belongil Creek Bridge on Ewingsdale Road;
- · north of Seaview Street, Byron Bay; and
- · north of Paterson Street and Browning Street intersection.

This area covers Belongil and Wategos and the streets west, east and within the town centre and south to and including Browning Street. For a list of the streets and map see Council's website. Most streets in the SEPA are residential where no time limit is signed, however during SEPA a 2P time limit will apply for each 24-hour period.

Permit Holders – eligibility and collection

Those who reside or work within the SEPA are eligible for a SEPA Permit. The permit will be available for collection weekdays from Council's Mullumbimby office 1-24 December and BRSSC 15-23 December. When correctly displayed, the SEPA permit provides an exemption from the 2P SEPA time limit only, noting that other parking laws and signs still apply and must be obeyed.

Obey all signs

For example if you park where 1P or 4P is signed, which is typical in the town centre, then that time limit applies as per the signage. Similarly No Parking, No Stopping and other such parking laws remain in place.

Penalties apply

Not obeying parking signage or laws where they apply will result in an offence being committed and penalty issued. Where and when SEPA applies, vehicles staying beyond the 2P limit will need to leave the SEPA in order to avoid committing an offence. Moving the vehicle from one location to another location within the SEPA will not avoid the commission of an offence. The maximum penalty for the offence is 20 penalty units (\$2,200). The on the spot fine is \$236.


