Protest planned against councillors' rock wall

Two community groups, which have joined forces in a campaign to halt construction of a rock wall at Belongil, plan to organise a protest at this Thursday's Byron Shire Council meeting.

Majority councillors Wanchap, Ibrahim, Hunter, Cubis and Woods are pushing ahead to build an Interim Beach Access Stabilisation (IBAS), aka rock wall, and have requested staff time be diverted to expedite that and associated management programs.

The issue will go into a confidential session at Council on Thursday.

The council recently voted to

overturn the almost 30-year policy of 'planned retreat' and are set to go ahead with the controversial rock wall, despite concerns from local residents, the NSW Coastal Panel, the Office of Environment and Heritage, expert engineers and the scientific community.

And the normal process of putting the work out to tender has been over-ruled, despite hundreds of thousands of ratepayer dollars being diverted from other operating budgets.

Karl Goodsell, the CEO of Positive Change for Marine Life, said, 'We've seen the impacts that walls

such as these have had on coastal areas around Australia and overseas.

'The science is there for all to see and when coastal management experts and even the NSW government are ignored, you have to ask yourself who the rogue five members of the Byron Shire Council are acting for?' Mr Goodsell asked.

Cate Coorey of Byron Residents' Group said, 'Our beaches are our major aesthetic, recreational and economic assets, yet the community is deliberately being shut out of the process.' The group is calling on the public to come to the Mullum Council Chambers this Thursday, from 9am.

Broken Head DA heads to court

A proposed housing development at the old Broken Head quarry, Suffolk Park, is causing headaches for Byron Council and the local Arakwal Bundjalung mob.

Despite a decision by Council last year to refuse the development application (DA), the unsuccessful applicant EMGA Mitchell McLennan Pty Ltd are taking their proposed 45-lot subdivision on Broken Head Road to court.

Greens MLC and former mayor, Jan Barham, has made a submission to see the development stopped.

'The site is part of the significant biodiversity of the Broken Head area and the quarry has had a negative impact on the ecological values of the area.' Ms Barham says that the area is part of a wildlife corridor and contains endangered flora and fauna.

'The proposal for the extension of the quarry always identified an end point to the destruction of the site and required rehabilitation at the finalisation of the quarry approval.

Byron Shire Council's co-ordinator of legal services, Ralph James, said the Broken Head Community Title DA was refused for various reasons.

'[Primarily it didn't fit within] the 1988 LEP, planning strategies and environmental concerns.'

But the Arakwal Bundjalung People native title claim group say the area is located within the boundaries of their ongoing native title claim, which was lodged in 1994.

The group say they are currently preparing a formal management plan with all stakeholders.

The Echo contacted EMGA Mitchell McLennan but at the time of publication had received no response.

Promises, platitudes...

After the election come the grand visions.

It's called the inaugural address, and those lucky enough to have been voted in last election just gave their maiden one, while those returning reaffirm and set out their aspirations for the coming four- or eight-year term.

The Echo profiles here the speeches of the state reps who live locally.

Ms Smith MLA

As the first Greens MP to hold a regional seat, Tamara Smith is also the first woman to hold the seat of Ballina and the first Greens MP for the seat; previously it had been an ironclad safe Nationals seat since the electorate's inception.

In her inaugural speech, she said a politician's job is to be 'responsive to our constituents and their values and priorities and to put the collective interest ahead of vested interests'.

'If I don't live up to that ideal, I don't deserve to be back here in four years' time.'

Ms Smith acknowledged the role community activism played in her election and sees the result as a reflection on the health of democracy in NSW.

She commended the diversity of the community movement that 'united against the industrialisation of our hinterland and [stood] up against the threat to our food and water security from unconventional gas mining.'

Ms Smith also acknowledged the service of her fellow Greens campaigners as well as long-term serving Ballina MP, Don Page.

Mr Franklin MLC

There's been an injection of fresh political talent to Byron Shire! Welcome, Ben Franklin, to a region of proud social misfits.

Not to be confused with the renowned author, politician, scientist, inventor, activist, statesman, and diplomat from the 1700s, this Ben is just 43, unmarried, and the former Nationals state director.

And while he has yet to reach the dizzying achievments of a US founding father, he's very very high up on the political food chain, having been a background powerbroker for the party.

It will be interesting to see if he will be an effective and formidable opponent against the region's entrenched Greens ideology.

Mr Franklin parachuted into the local electorate after his recent win as senator in the upper house.

He told *The Echo* he decided to relocate from Sydney because, 'My views on community representation and sustainability are aligned with people of the north coast and I thought it would be a good fit for me.' NSW parliament, he named public education, high-speed rail, reducing the size of western NSW seats and cultural equity as his main focus areas.

On coal seam gas, Mr Franklin says that a legal framework eliminating exploration licences on the north coast must be found by government, owing to 'prevalent' community concerns.

Wait, is this really a Nationals guy?

'I grew up in Barham on the Murray River,' he told *The Echo*. 'Both my parents are school teachers and I completed an Arts degree.'

After a decade-long stint with the Young Liberals, he left around 2007 to become the communications officer for Unicef. 'I loved it, but missed politics. When I was offered the directorship for the Nationals I jumped at it.'

He also says he gravitated towards the Nationals as his parents were country born and bred.

From his inaugural speech, he says the Nationals 'value decency and loyalty and integrity.'

He cites his personal friendship with former local MP Don Page (Nationals) as another reason to move here.

Byron Shire Council has released its 2016 budget, claiming roads and public spaces remain the key focus for it in the coming year.

And mayor Simon Richardson says the coming 12 months will see Council 'firmly tasked with getting on with fixing roads, public spaces and completing the coastal zone management plan' (CZMP). The main item in the \$27.3 million budget will be the controversial Byron Bay Bypass,

with the other main contender for a long-awaited upgrade being Broken Head Road. Other items in the capital works program include the Shara Boulevard sports fields at Ocean Shores, the construction of a much-needed roundabout at Massinger Street, Byron Bay, and a new causeway for Main Arm. The 2015/16 budget has \$5 million allocated for roads and drainage maintenance, \$3.6 million on parks and sport field maintenance, \$1.4 million on libraries, \$7 million on water, \$10.9 million on sewer and \$5.4 million on waste. General manager Ken Gainger says another focus was not asking ratepayers for more than the 2.4per cent increase allowed under rate pegging. 'With a forecast balanced budget and an accumulated surplus (working funds) sitting at \$1.95 million, the budget's stronger bottom line was a result of a detailed review of council's operations.'

Ms Barham MLC



Longtime locals will know Jan Barham's politics well, and as the former Greens mayor she has been just as active locally as she has been as an MLC in Sydney.

Her speech to bring in the new government focused on wellbeing and the challenges that will shape 'the lives of generations to come'.

'The first challenge is the relationship and treatment of the First Peoples of this country,' she says.

'The disparity in health, wellbeing and incarceration rates between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people should cause us all to be sorry.

The second challenge for Ms Barham is climate change.

'All levels of government must act to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, plan the transition to a net zero emissions society within several decades and put in place strategies for adapting to the impacts of a warming world on all aspects of life, including our biodiversity, coastlines, farms and health and safety.

The third challenge is the failure of our society to ensure the wellbeing of all people and communities.

'Anyone claiming that our economy is in great shape needs to confront the appalling fact that nearly 900,000 - more than one person in every seven in NSW - is living in poverty.

She concluded by saying that her 'greenprint' for the next four years is a commitment to the First Peoples, climate change, social and economic equality and the right to housing.

Ms Cusack MLC



Catherine Cusack is an upper house Liberal senator who lives in Lennox Head with her family, and is married to Chris Crawford, the NNSW Local Health District chief executive

In her inaugural address, she welcomed a new generation of politicians to both chambers of parliament.

She also paid her respect to the 'legislative council as a chamber that has been transformed from the least democratic in Australia to the most democratic because it is now genuinely pluralistic.'

'I have listened with great interest and admiration to their inaugural speeches and heard the diversity in their life stories and their ideas, which have ranged from electoral reform to bold new social and economic initiatives.

There were more platitudes,

with a special tribute to fellow Liberal Shane Mallard, among others.

'He gave a great Liberal speech and demonstrated so much of the strength, diversity, intelligence, courage and optimism that the Liberal Party continues to bring to Australian politics.'

'I must draw the attention of the House to the vital role that the Young Liberal Movement can play in modernising the party. All four former female Young Liberal Movement presidents are now members of Parliament.

State govt rundown

State politics is similar to federal in that there are upper and lower houses, or chambers (except in QLD, where there is only a lower house). The support of both chambers is needed to make legislation, or laws.

The lower house, or the Legislative Assembly, is made up of 93 politicans from electoral seats throughout the state.

They serve four-year terms. In the local Ballina electorate, which roughly covers both Byron and Ballina council areas, newly elected Tamara Smith (Greens) has replaced retiring Don Page (Nationals).

The upper house, or the Legislative Council, is made up 42 senators who represent the entire state. As such, they live in any part of the state. They serve eight-year terms; half of the members are elected every four years.

Local senators inlcude former mayor Jan Barham (Greens), Catherine Cusack (Liberal) and the newly relocated Ben Franklin (Nationals)

Diesel train opposition gains momentum

Opposition has grown from Shirley Street residents to now include businesses that may be affected by plans to run an antiquated diesel-powered railcar between Bayshore Drive and the Byron Bay township by this summer.

The newly-formed 'Shirley Street Collective' includes affected landowners, residents and businesses along Byron's renowned 'Accommodation Strip, whose properties/premises back directly on to or are near the long-defunct track.

The group claims the World War II era diesel locomotive, now in its final stages of restoration by new resort group Elements Byron Bay, is not 'light rail' and is not

in keeping with Byron Bay's 'environmentally-progressive' reputation or direction'.

The group's key concerns centre around safety and environmental impacts, noise and privacy invasions, diminished amenity for existing accommodation providers, proposed increase of service from when the railway was last in use, lack of engagement and meaningful discussion with impacted stakeholders and fairness and precedent.

Public submissions closed May 19 for a development application (DA) that would see platforms and a shed at the Bayshore Drive and Byron Town terminals.

The Shirley Street Collective further believes Byron Shire Council should not be seen to be supporting the 'use of public infrastructure by a sole private operator for individual, commercial gain' without proven/tested public benefits. They say tourism is a large part of Byron Bay economy and welcome and support the Elements Of Byron development, but not at the expense of other operators.

Solar conversion

Meanwhile, development director at North Byron Beach Resort, Jeremy Holmes, told The Echo, 'While getting the rail motor restored and on the track is our first priority, we have also been looking at solar conversion since day one.

'Along with our railway engineers in Lithgow we have been in discussion with multiple solar technology companies with the intent to one day convert our train to solar power. The outcome of our initial investigations was that this is possible and with the advancement in battery and solar panel technology it's becoming more realistic.

'We will continue to develop this concept, but our first priority is to get the train service on the line?

Renewable energy deal will cost jobs

Federal Labor has come under attack for stitching up a deal with the coalition government to reduce the Renewable Energy Target (RET) from 41,000 to 33,000 gigawatt hours per annum by 2020.

The Greens say the deal will mean fewer jobs and less clean energy on the north coast, which continues to set the standard in the uptake of renewable energy.

And the North Coast Environment Council Inc and North East Forest Alliance have jointly condemned the failure to exclude native forests from being fed into

power stations.

Greens spokesperson, Dawn Walker accused Labor of 'caving in' to both Tony Abbott and the fossil fuel industry. She says the deal means more coal, more pollution and less investment in clean energy.

'The north coast region continues to set the standard in renewable energy with some of the highest up-take rates for solar power in NSW.

Solar projects


'Several large scale solar projects are in the pipeline, like the 99kW Lismore Community Solar Farm to be constructed at Goonellabah Sports & Aquatic Centre and East Lismore Sewage Treatment Plant, Ms Walker said.

Who wants change? It's happenening May 27

Almost every person in the Byron Shire unwittingly owns part of Australia's fossil fuel infrastructure. And while it's an uncomfortable truth, change is possible.

That's the message from young and dynamic entrepreneur Simon Sheikh, who'll be joining fellow climate change campaigner and national Earth Hour manager Anna Rose, at the Byron Community Centre on Wednesday May 27 from 6.30pm.

Simon was national director of Australia's activist-online headquarters GetUp!

He was also within a few votes of being elected as a federal Greens senator at the last election, and is now the founder of Future Super, Australia's first fossil-fuel-free ethical superannuation fund, which has attracted almost \$50 million from more than 2,000 customers.

Anna Rose founded the Australian Youth Climate Coalition (AYCC) and toured the world with climate sceptic and former finance minister Nick Minchin, to educate him on the science of climate change. The trip spawned an ABC

Simon says he'll be proposing a campaign for Byron residents to collectively divest themselves from fossil fuels and businesses that support them.

He promises to explain exactly how Byron Shire residents can circumvent sceptical politicians and take action into their own hands.

Simon will also report on

Will this Thursday's meeting be a fight or a fizzer?

In the past, councillors have met, discussed, voted, then had lunch. They have asked questions of staff and had the odd squabble.

So given past experience, this week could be a mud fight.

Stakes are high – ratepayer money and extensive staff resources will either destroy the natural environment or save the homes of few Belongil beach residents, or both.

No fewer than four related items on this topic are up for discussion, which indicates what a drain this project is.

Or perhaps it's just really, really important to get done ASAP before anyone realises what happened.

It's the stuff that makes a great news copy but disastrous reality: secret governance, overblown budgets and complicated and very questionable planning directives from majority councillors Ibrahim, Wanchap, Hunter, Cubis and Woods.

For convenience sake, let's call them the Adhoc Five.

In the other corner are crs Dey, Richardson, Spooner and Cameron. They could be the Sausage Factory Four, given their commitment to the slow grind of transparent and best practice governance.

How terribly dull. One peculiar item up for

voting is rezoning Councilmanaged Belongil Beach frontage land that appears to have a private home on it. Want to know why the Adhoc Five councillors are possibly keen on, 'regularising the existing building encroachment'? Sorry you can't, because it's all contained in a confidential attachment.

Moving on, a motion by Crs Woods, Cubis and Wanchap seeks support to rescind

part of a previous resolution, which was for Council to establish 'a community advisory/reference panel to provide ongoing feedback during the preparation of the coast zone management program (CZMP) containing key stakeholders and councillors.'

As previously reported, this panel idea appeared a vain attempt to claim that the community will have input with the CZMP formulation.

This motion would kill off the idea of public transparency completely, except for public exhibition.

Confidential

Similarly, a confidential session looks set to be called over where staff are up to in its 'Proposed Belongil Interim Beach Access Stabilisation Works' on Manfred Street, Belongil.

The Adhoc Five councillors committed \$907,000 of ratepayer funding for the project last year and quotations have been sought from contractors Water Research Laboratory (WRL). An unclear amount of this money was raided from shire-wide Open Space and Recreation funding; however, ratepayers have been promised an additional \$300,000 will come from landowners. Yippee. What's yet to be explained is why the project is inexplicably being pushed ahead of a CZMP that would address all of the Shire's coastline.

You know, responsible and open governance and stuff.

Roundhouse saga

Reclassifying perhaps the best patch of dirt in Ocean Shores with 360-degree views – The Roundhouse site – will be again voted on.

Fast rewind to recent history: ever since residents kicked up a fuss over plans to flog it to pay for Council's debt and possible new infrastructure, the land has remained partially developed owing to a legal challenge.

A business model by the Ocean Shores Community Association (OSCA) for a community centre/museum/ cafe was rejected by a majority of councillors.

After rezoning plans were put on public exhibition and submissions were tabled, Council noted six favourable and 155 pro-forma objections.

While staff replies to each submission make riveting reading in this week's agenda attachments, the result of a recent public hearing was also reported by Urbanesque Planning consultants. It concluded, 'The majority of submissions did not support the proposed reclassification and request Council to retain the land for community purposes.'

And if you found that on the agenda attachments, congratulations. You made it to the end of its 265 pages.

Market policy

Other items worth being aware of include the Draft Sustainable Community Market Policy.

Councillor Paul Spooner, who also manages the Byron Community Centre, is generally pleased with the outcome and says it's workable.

'This draft allows licenses across all types of markets and the sets critera,' he told *The Echo*. 'We haven't had certainty for years, and the licenses were alwyas being extended.

He says the draft is a result of a thourough process, which included a reference group of market managers, stall holders and council.

Tony channels Yabba to gee up the punters

any years ago there was a cricket fan in Sydney or thereabouts who was known as Yabba. Yabba was permanently en-

sconced on what was then the Paddington Hill at the Sydney Cricket Ground, and possessed of a foghorn voice, whose invariable exhortation was 'Ave a go ya mug!'

Tony Abbott is far too young to remember Yabba, but has apparently chosen to channel him as his chosen conduit for the 2015 budget. Of course, he would never call a voter a mug - at least not in public. But the barracking is at least as persistent, and, it must be said, very possibly be just as futile.

As the batsmen stoically ignored Yabba, it may well be that the punters fail equally to respond to the somewhat desperate prime minister. Certainly the stock market has bounce, in the expectation that small business voters will stock up on the tax-free gadgets on offer; after all, the family can always use a new laptop.

It may well be a bonanza for the tax-shifting multinational floggers of Chinese-made goodies.

But to suggest that this will somehow translate to a demand for new jobs and investment is quite a stretch. \$20,000 a pop is certainly welcome, but even for the smallest of small business is hardly serious money.

And the same applies to the tax cuts; well worth trousering, but not enough incentive to turn around a sluggish and reluctant economy.

But then, they are not intended to. The aim of the budget is not to make changes, but to produce enough of a warm and fuzzy feeling in the opinion polls so that the beleaguered government can catch its electoral breath. Real reform, any serious kind of budget repair, is out of the question: too hard and too risky. And in fact, all the necessary tools have already been ruled out.

There is to be no damage done to the family household budget, which means no broad-ranging changes to welfare, health or education - the big-ticket items. True, there is a bit of trimming at the top of the pension entitlements of the very rich, and some very vague commitments to cuts in the overall health budget some-

time in the future, but nothing to scare the horses.

And as for any attacks on the lurks and perks of the superrich - family trusts, negative gearing and superannuation concessions - they remain untouched and untouchable. There is an idea to try to do something about some of the legalised tax evasion practised by some of the multinationals, but in the absence of even the most hypothetical figures, it is little more than wishful thinking.

In the end the budget is mainly white noise - no budget reform and certainly no vision. It is just another big-spending, big-taxing manifesto of the kind one would expect of a pre-election platform. Abbott, of course, indignantly rejects this, in spite of the fact that the numbers in his own budget statements confirm it: he simply refuses to accept either the present or the future.

Or, for that matter, the recent past: he also said that Joe Hockey and Scott Morrison had never referred to fraud and rort around what he, and they, called the double-dipping of parental leave entitlements, which embarrassingly included two of his own ministers.

Tony Abbott falls back on denial as his default option. He tried to retrieve the situation, or at least some of it, by drawing a distinction between the private and public sectors - it was only the shiny bums of Canberra who were really double-dipping. Presumably they can be bashed



with impunity. The problem there is that public servants also include nurses, police, firemen and other frontline workers as well as pen-pushers, so it didn't help much.

And of course the parental leave scheme depends on budget cuts to other welfare measures previously marked for savings to the budget, which are vigorously opposed by a majority of senators, so they could well not happen at all.

And the much-trumpeted childcare handouts (workforce participation, not welfare) are not even due to cut in for another two years, so not a lot of the immediate gratification the voters crave there.

Which leaves us with the perennial promise to develop the north – if only someone can tell us how.

The only targeted funding is to pave a couple of hundred kilometres of dirt roads, not exactly a prospect to fire the imagination of the millions.

The best that can be said for what is a pretty vacuous budget is that it may at least give a general boost to confidence, which is very badly needed - but when the applause subsides, what comes next?

Tony's tradies and the like may whip out their credit cards as soon as possible - that is the idea - and will then, presumably, put them firmly away for the next couple of years.

And the general malaise will then return, just in time for the next budget, which is why the next budget probably won't happen: there is no money left.

Whatever the rose-coloured predictions for the good times ahead, they certainly won't happen before the next election, in fact things will probably get worse, and another spendathon would simply not be credible.

So the likelihood – perhaps even an inevitability - is for Abbott to go to the polls early, at least as soon as next year, and hope like hell the post-budget boost holds up till then. The excuse may be more senate resistance over the welfare cuts, giving him a reason to reprise the promises of parental leave and child care. It might work, but it might not; he would need a lot of luck, not to mention rather more good management than his gaffe-prone government would so far suggest is likely.

But in the end, it is hard to see an alternative.

There is nothing much left to do but follow Yabba's advice: Ave a go ya mug!

But please, this time, even if you are planning to take the voters for mugs, try not to call them mugs. At least not until the election is won and lost then, of course, all bets are off.





continued from page 9 unpopulated areas in small country towns up and down the east coast. To help address this the NSW government has released a new flying fox colony management policy.

A colony of 300 flying foxes arrived in Mullum in 2010 and now numbers well over 5,000 and growing. Mullumbimby families are living with months on end of broken sleep and noise levels day and night that are measuring at 75 Db. To put this into perspective, BluesFest can make noise of 50 Db.

Add to this a smell amplified by weeks of summer heat, rain and humidity. It is tortuous to be close neighbours with our pollinating friends. As the colony expands through our town more and more people will be affected.

Flying foxes are incredibly important to our ecosystem. They pollinate more trees than bees do. We need them. We need to look after them.

Mullumbimby Bat Action Group is asking for vegetation management to create a buffer zone for residents and build up designated sites or site to attract the flying foxes away from homes. This would be a long-term commitment of considered appropriate


Horizon blotting

How to spice up a chilly Billi night

On a recent autumn night we were looking for a bit of spice. It was chilly out and a feast

of aromatic, slow-cooked Indian food was in order – the perfect panacea to warm the bones.

We decided on Billi Indian restaurant in downtown Billinudgel, having heard about the recent renovations and new menu. Stepping inside, the freshly stoked fireplace along with the smell of fragrant spice blends and gently charred naan quickly thawed the chill and warmed our appetites.

Chef and owner of Billi Indian, Rohit Sherma, is proud of his new additions. The indoor and outdoor dining areas have new furnishings and artwork, plus outdoor heating and, of course, the delicious indoor fireplace.


The new menu still has its foundations in Rohit's North Indian origins. He migrated to Australia seven years ago to work behind the burners in an Indian restaurant on the Gold Coast. With dreams of opening his own place serving food in an authentic homemade style, Rohit decided there was too much competition north of the border, and purchased the current restaurant in Billinudgel (formerly Billi's Thai).

A must-try on the Billi Indian menu, and a staple of North Indian cuisine, is the bread: roti and naan style served piping hot from the tandoor oven. The tandoor is actually a very healthy way

of cooking and Rohit also uses it to roast meats such as Tandoori Chicken and Sheek Kebabs served with salad and raita.

'Any meat that comes out of the tandoor is 98 per cent fat free,' he proudly claims.

The rest of the menu includes chicken, beef, lamb, prawn, fish and vegetarian curries. Regulars need not worry; favourite dishes such as the Butter Chicken and Paneer Tikka Masala have made the new menu. One new addition is the Chef's Special Goat Curry, with meat pieces on the bone braised in a balanced, spiced tomato sauce. It's rich and unctuous and perfect for scooping up with bread.

'The Goat Curry is cooked traditionally like I would make at home in India,' says Rohit.

There are plenty of vegetarian and gluten-free options. I can recommend the Palak Paneer with pieces of soft paneer cheese gently nestled in a fragrant spinach puree seasoned with masala homemade with imported Indian spices.

Billi Indian has been in Billinudgel for the past three years. I have to admit that I was ignorant of its existence until I went searching. On the night we were in house, the

restaurant was a bustling local crowd, including popular regulars Peter and Mia from New Brighton.

'We come here every week. The staff are so warm and friendly and the food is delicious,' they said.

Billi Indian is open from 5pm till late six nights a week from Tuesday to Sunday. Reservations are recommended. Rohit serves complimentary pappadums to tables with reservations.

Takeaway orders are welcome with a 10 per cent discount on Tuesday nights. Senior citizens receive a 10 per cent discount every night.

Kitchen in confidence

In 1991 I was 20 years old, in my third year at The Feathers Hotel, Woodstock, outside Oxford, a year away from venturing to London to do a tour of Michelin-starred restaurants. I was among a brigade of seven serving breakfast, lunch, afternoon tea and dinner in this grand 23-bedroom boutique hotel. We'd take it in turns to do the breakfast shift, starting at 6am. One chef and one waiter would do breakfast. Breakfast orders would come in slowly, with the bulk around the time when the other four chefs arrived at 8am. I started the stoves and casually set up the buffet, then set up my corner of the large 10 by 10 metre kitchen for cooked breakfasts.

About 6.30am it was total darkness outside. Cory, a young chef about my age, turned up in casual clothes. He beckoned me to the back door of the kitchen. 'Can you stash this?' he whispered frantically, thrusting a twisted carrier bag towards me. He ran off before I had time to reply, so I put the carrier bag in the chef's office and continued setting up.

As the morning light brightened over the tiny town and the kitchen was set, curiosity got the better of me and I opened Cory's mystery carrier bag. Inside were half a dozen mobile phones, individually far too expensive for a chef to afford back then, and a large semi-automatic pistol. We were all so tired all the time that nothing fazed us, and in years to come I would become all too familiar with chefs rubbing shoulders with the criminal underworld, working solitary unsociable hours.

I heard my thoughts in the dry monotone typical of my demographic: 'Oh ... that's unusual'. He hadn't worked there for very long but clearly he had ambitions in another career. I lifted the gun out of the bag and examined it closely, the waitress Lucy buzzing in and out in the background, waiting for guests to slowly emerge from their slumber.

I read BERETTA 9.0 down the side with a good understanding of what I was holding. I pressed a button on the handle and the magazine popped out, full of large brass bullets with strange crimped heads.

Slightly confused I looked at the writing on the side again and spied REPLICA. Ah, it was full of blanks; at least he hadn't shot anyone. I stepped into the small courtyard outside the kitchen back door, surrounded by cool rooms, sheds and bins. I cocked the pistol, pointed it straight up to the sky and stupidly pulled the trigger.

I think it was the loudest thing I'd ever heard

I instantly panicked and rushed back into the chef's office. With ringing ears I hurriedly concealed the gun and phones then raced back to my section.

Lucy emerged from the restaurant. 'Did you hear that noise?' she asked. 'What noise?' I replied, unnecessarily beginning to chop some chives. She disappeared back through the door to the restaurant and emerged a few minutes later with two breakfast orders in her hand. 'Cheque on!' she said. I started cooking but a few minutes later she burst through the

door with more orders. Seemingly short of breath Lucy declared, 'I don't know what's going on but everyone's coming in for breakfast at once'.

Breakfast orders were coming in way too fast for 7.30am and things were starting to become overwhelming. Tom Lewis, the portly red-nosed middle-aged hotel manager, emerged in a pinstriped suit. Racing around cooking, I saw him running in and out of the restaurant helping Lucy. He appeared at the pass, frowning, with a bead of sweat on his forehead: 'Did you hear a loud bang this morning?'. I calmly shook my head, turning to lay out another half dozen plates.

Suddenly more staff arrived to help on the floor and before I knew it the head chef, David, turned up. 'What the f*** is going on?' he asked, throwing on his chef's jacket to help out. Cooking and plating rapidly I replied, 'No idea, Dave, but all the rooms came down together'. As things got even busier the gossip between customers and staff about 'the loud bang' spread right through the hotel. At eight o'clock chefs began to arrive and started preparing for the day.

Cory was among them over in the larder section. As things began to die down a bit I passed him and he grabbed my arm. 'Where'd you stash that bag?' he asked quietly. 'It's in the office under the desk,' I whispered, and continued to the coolroom. Cory appeared at the door: 'Did you look in the bag?' 'No, I was too busy,' I replied, then turned away and continued looking for the turned carrots.

I never told anyone that worked there what I'd done. The moral of the story: don't fire a gun outside a hotel at dawn if you're cooking breakfast.

Dominic Russell spoke with The Echo about the fundraiser.

What's your personal connection with Nepal?

I lived in Nepal for a little over three years from 2010 to 2013 and was studying there. So I had time to learn a little of the language and get to know many local people as well as longtime expats etc. As anyone who has visited will attest, it's a hard place not to be moved by!

Have you spoken to people over there? What are they identifying as being the crucial needs?

Yes I have, I'm involved in a few different groups online of both former expats as well as those on the ground, and I've talked on the phone to a few close friends. As well as the immediate need for food and clean water, temporary accommodation seems to be of critical importance. The monsoon is fast approaching and many people are still sleeping outside for fear of houses collapsing from aftershocks. Especially after Tuesday's second big quake, most of the country is camping out!

Is the government obstructive to incoming assistance? How are the nuns and monks helping in the recovery process?

Yes, unfortunately it seems they are. The government has a long history of corruption and inefficiency, but somehow it is still surprising that at this most urgent moment they are doing things like redirecting all funds sent to new Nepali accounts through their own banks. I've heard that they have barley mobilised assistance and when they have it has been too little too late! This is why it is so important to know where the money we send goes and to direct it into the hands of those providing immediate and direct help. To that end many of the monasteries that I am familiar with have been praised highly at this time for really putting their compassion into action, sending teams into areas that haven't received any assistance, setting up makeshift clinics and providing food and shelter to those in need.

Where will the money be going from the fundraiser?

The money we raise will be sent to a group called Karuna-Shechen

(karuna-shechen.org). This is a non-profit humanitarian organisation that works with a network of local partners in the greater Himalayan region to provide education, healthcare, and social services to those in need, and who have established a special earthquake-relief effort. Karuna-Shechen was co-founded by Matthieu Ricard and Rabiam Rinpoche in 2000 and has since then provided education and aid to many thousands of people. The people who run this organisation have worked among very challenging political situations both in Tibet and Nepal and managed with incredible skill to accomplish amazing work. On top of this, a generous benefactor covers all of their operating costs, meaning 100 per cent of donations go directly to their projects! This is so important; so much aid money when channelled through the big NGOs is lost to bureaucracy, inefficiency and greed.

How will weather affect recovery efforts?

It is already raining there a lot and this will only make things harder! Already many places are inaccessible owing to the huge number of landslides the quake brought on. One example of this is the landslide that buried Langtang village, a town of around 500 people, with around 350 assumed dead! So access is a major concern. On top of this, as I mentioned, most of the country is currently sleeping outside, which means further health concerns are arising.

How do you think the Nepalese will manage the more long-term recovery?

As a friend said to me on the phone yesterday, the monasteries are doing such incredible work with their projects, but what had really surprised and inspired her was the incredible efforts made by those young Nepalese who are determined to help their villages, friends and families. The Nepalese are a very resilient and strong people, within whom you can get a sense of what is developed by a tradition that has a little more to offer than our bleak culture!

The political nightmare will not go away quickly and it will be a slow recovery, so institutionally speaking it's hard to say. However the people have become accustomed to non-governance, so I think the recovery will really be led by those brave people on the ground involved in

grassroots work. It must be said that among the tragedy there are already inspiring stories coming out of real forward planning and initiatives that might see long-term progress made, we have to hope!

How can we help Nepal rebuild from over here?

By channelling funds towards those groups who are really making a difference! Unless you have a specialised knowledge of earthquake relief or medical training, this is the best thing to do by all accounts. As part of our fundraising efforts we will be holding a raffle, so local businesses can support us by donating prizes or vouchers towards this. Otherwise if any individuals or businesses want to make direct financial contributions to this cause they can! I would be happy to help put people in contact with any other specific relief efforts. Two other wonderful groups worth mentioning are Shedrub Development Fund and Chokgyur Lingpa Foundation.

They were talking of opening the Everest Trek again - do you think this is a reasonable or sensible approach?

This is a difficult one! In a country that is so dependent on tourism, it's hard to criticise the motivation behind trying to open up their most lucrative asset as soon as possible. Unfortunately long-term strategic thinking is often a luxury those in dire need don't have. That said, this is a crucial time for deciding how the country will approach the future, and to rush too quickly towards the same old unsafe and unsustainable practices might not be ideal!

Does Nepal need extra support not just to rebuild but financially for damage to its tourist economy?

I'm sure they will. This is something that will only be known with time, but presumably the tourism trade will be dealt a major blow because of the earthquake. So many of the people in Nepal rely one way or another on tourism and related industries, therefore long-term support and attention towards the country will be vital in ensuring the people have a means to rebuild their lives.

Oz'ill-equipped' to stop new invasive species

it comes to protecting its borders from a multitude of devand invasive animals, a federal Senate inquiry has found.

'A nine-month Senate inquiry has revealed that Australia is failing dismally to keep new invasive species out of the country, Invasive Species Council CEO Andrew Cox said last week.

'This was exemplified in the inquiry's case studies of the deadly plant pathogen myrtle rust, which has spread throughout Australia's eastern seaboard, and tramp ants such as the highly invasive red fire ants and yellow crazy ants that have repeatedly arrived through our ports.

Delays

'The report, which received bipartisan support, reveals that our response efforts are commonly hampered by delays in initial detections, delays in obtaining and maintaining credible, compelling and exfunding, and incomplete implementation of threat abatement plans.

'Claims by the federal departments of agriculture and environment to the inquiry that environmental biosecurity is "well managed" have been exposed as a fantasy.

environment, the agricultural department was unable to list more than six, and yet a Senate committee found that 'incurthe potential to harm Australia's natural environment are a regular occurrence'.

It also found that 'pathway and risk analyses undertaken by the Department of Agri-

Australia is ill-prepared, ill- culture have not adequately equipped and neglectful when addressed species of environmental concern'.

The inquiry also expressed astating new weeds, diseases concerns over declining numbers of biosecurity staff, especially in northern Australia, and deteriorating research capacity.

> 'Missing from the consensus report was support for a body to coordinate efforts for environmental biosecurity preparedness - similar to that for the agricultural sector. No credible alternative was proposed to address this serious gap, except in the minority report of the Greens,' Mr Cox said.

'The report identified major quarantine failings, including biofouling of marine vessels, illegal seeds making it into Australia through the postal system, tramp ants arriving in the country on cargo, exotic bird and ornamental fish imports.

'Worrying'

'This bipartisan report is tremely worrying.


The Invasive Species Council has now called on agricultural and environment ministers as well as state and territory biosecurity ministers to immediately address the report's recommendations.

'We commend the mem-When asked to list priority bers of the committee for their biosecurity threats facing the unanimous report and its 26 recommendations, which, if implemented, will greatly improve Australia's capacity to protect its unique wildlife and sions by exotic organisms with ecosystems from invasive species,' Mr Cox said.

'This report will help move environmental biosecurity towards the more focused approach of agricultural biosecurity.

Ballina prevail, but Giants unbowed at Les Donnelly Field

Trailing the Ballina Seagulls by 28-10 in Sunday's NRRRL clash at Les Donnelly Field, with fifteen minutes left on the clock, the Mullumbimby Giants had a scrum feed on halfway.

Instead of standing a prop at five-eighth and having him make a mindless barge for a three-metre gain, as is so common now in the professional ranks, the Giants' number six, Louie Earl, reefed the pill downfield for his full-back, Rhys Carruth, to chase. Carruth beat his opposite number in a thrilling race to the line, only to have the ref determine that he had lost control of the greasy ball in diving for the try.

It was a bold and brilliantly executed play, deserving of a four-pointer, and the boys were rewarded shortly after when club stalwart Jake 'Gyl-

Giants were always in it, but never quite in it to the degree that you could be confident that they would win. The final score of 40-16, however, was a crude injustice.

Neither side made a particularly impressive start. Both were guilty of poor ball control and shonky last tackle options but, with a little help from the whistleblower, it was Ballina who gained the ascendency in the battle for field position. Mullum's defence was committed and well-organised - time and again they managed to turn up at the point of attack - but eventually, after a long run by the Seagulls' hooker, weight of possession told and the visitors grabbed the lead. The Giants, so willing until this moment, then clocked-off mentally to let in three more tries in quick succession. Retiring to the sheds trailing 22-0 didn't seem right, but that's the price you pay for dropping your guard against a battle-hardened opponent.

Diehards fled the bleachers as wicked weather lashed the ground, but the resumption of play brought a welter of activity and a sunnier outlook for Mullum. Hooker Aaron Walker's try, converted by Mister Darcy, made it 22-6, Ballina scored again for 28-6 and then Josh 'il Duce' Castellano smashed his way through Ballina's frontline defence to rack up a try that was, if nothing else, justice done for the effort that the big bloke put in all afternoon. Coach Simon 'Roger' Moore has an unstinting ally in his fellow prop, who was a standout in a pack of forwards that refused to take a backward step against their more lauded adversaries.

The Giants have a tendency to give away penalties at critical times and they are unable to remain calm when calmness is called for, but they're full of what you like to see in a footy team - spirit. With it, and a bit more attention to detail, the play-offs are not beyond them.
