### **Key environment role** downgraded by council

Byron Shire Council's environment team leader position has been downgraded, resulting in the redundancy of the former staff member and a vacant position.

And while former mayor and Greens MLC Jan Barham described as a 'shocking and sad and a betrayal of the community', Council's general manager Ken Gainger said the move was part of normal council processes. He added that Council had restructured 'its entire workforce' over the past two years.

As part of the restructure, the bush regeneration team has been moved to the parks and open space department and now reports to a new team leader, Mr Gainger told The Echo. 'As a consequence, the former team leader natural environment position was reduced in grade because of the loss of staff management responsibilities,' he said.

'The incumbent was offered the new position but chose to apply for a redundancy which is an award entitlement in such circumstances.

'Council is strongly committed to continuing and growing its extensive environmental programs and will shortly advertise the vacant position,' Mr Gainger said.

But former Greens mayor Jan Barham, during whose term the council's biodiversity strategy was drawn up, has attacked the move.

Ms Barham has urged the community to 'question elected representatives and the general manager about any move to downgrade or eliminate the role of professional

staff who implement our commitment and responsibility to being leaders in biodiversity protection'.

### Outraged

'Please don't let this happen, don't let this be done without the outrage that it deserves and then wonder why we continue to see the shire destroyed - it's too important,' she implored.

'Perhaps [councillors] don't get that you need professional staff to undertake such a vital role, that the years of study and experience that are required to fulfil such a significant position to enable the implementation of a community priority are crucial, Ms Barham told The Echo.

In 2004, during her time in office, Byron Shire Council adopted an award-winning biodiversity conservation strategy that 'identified the long-term plans for implementation of the commitment to be leaders in the biodiversity management,' Ms Barham said.

'To do this, it was recognised that professional staff were essential to guide this process and provide support to community to be partners in making it a reality.

'Staff also have the professional role of informing all other plans and developments within the shire.

'To downgrade and/or eliminate the crucial role of environment team leader and the priority objective of biodiversity protection will undermine a defined community priority,' Ms Barham said.

Ms Barham added there did not appear to have been any community consultation around the move.

### **Xenophon speaks out against Coles and Woolies**

Senator Nick Xenophon didn't hold back at a recent forum that considered food retailing trends and the impact of the food duopoly of Coles and Woolies.

'The lobbyists have won,' he told an audience of growers, manufacturers, restaurateurs, retailers and distributors at Coorabell Hall last Thursday,

Hosted by Northern Rivers Food, the event also featured a panel including MC Donna Harper, Brad Hopper, Robert Hayes and Pam Brook.

Though it wasn't all gloom; Xenophon suggested legislation that could enable producers to take court action against the retail giants. He added that even ASIC have little powers against them.

### **NSW Forestry 'stacked' expert EPA panel**

A freedom of information request by a north coast environment group has revealed that an 'independent' panel of the Environment Protection Authority (EPA) advising on threatened species is dominated by serving and former NSW Forestry Corporation staff.

A spokesperson for the group has described the move as 'state sanctioned environmental destruction'.

The North Coast Environment Council (NCEC) made the GIPA (Government Information Public Access)

application after the authority failed to make public the make-up of the panel.

The Threatened Species Expert Panel is advising the EPA on the re-writing of the logging rules for public forests.

According to NCEC, the documents show that far from being 'independent experts' they are government employees, dominated by current and former employees of Forestry Corp.

#### EPA refusal

The EPA have refused to release any of the panel's recommendations on the grounds that they 'reveal or tend to reveal the position that a particular minister has taken, is taking or will take on a matter in cabinet'.

North Coast Environment Council spokesperson Susie Russell described the refusal as 'an abuse of the exemption for cabinet documents in freedom of information law.

'It is difficult to see how the notes made by someone at a workshop could reveal a minister's position, unless of course there was political interference in the process and someone said that the minister had a particular view, or wanted a particular outcome,' Ms Russell said.

'This confirms our impression that the EPA's re-writing of the rules covering logging in State Forests is an overtly political process being run by the Forestry Corporation. It is no wonder they are resisting our attempts to find out what the panel's recommendations were,' she said.

'We know now that the Expert Panel includes 13 people, not the 20 claimed by the EPA on their website.

'The claimed independent experts are ex-Forestry Corporation employees. The EPA's representative even worked for the Forestry Corporation until recently.

### **Crowdfunder successful for Byron Trails**

After 45 days, a crowdfunder effort for a new walking guidebook ended successfully at midday on November 18.

Spearheaded by Mairead Cleary, Byron Trails aims to chronicle walking trails in Byron and beyond.

She said, 'While the target was \$19,750, the final pledge amount came to \$22,525.'

'It's been successful solely

because of the help and support of so many people in the community,' said Ms Cleary. 'This was not a solo effort.'

She said that the project had captured the imagination and the interest of many and took on a life of its own.

'People reached out to me with ideas and offers of help. We were all in it together, which was amazing to experience.' She says four local and national businesses - BLK Superwater, The Bay Retreats, Crystal Castle and Santos Organics - got on board to sponsor the project and will be rewarded by having their logos on the book.

'The crowd funding model is an impressive one. It can produce incredible results as we saw with the Flow Hive in Nimbin. It's an enormous amount of work but very worthwhile. I wanted to make sure that people got something valuable for their contribution and I'm confident that they will?

### **Grants announced**

Grant allocations from the region's only philanthropic foundation rolled out last week, with a record \$130,000 going to 23 community organisations.

According to Christopher Hughes from The Northern Rivers Community Foundation (NRCF), this year saw an increase of \$30,000.

He said, 'Over the 11 years it has been operating, the NRCF has distributed more

than \$905,000 to over 135 organisations throughout the northern rivers community. Locally, the organisations

that will benefit include the S.H.I.F.T. Kitchen educational program, Byron Youth Service, BUDDI Program and Byron Youth Theatre, Byron Harmony Group, Australia Indonesia Arts Alliance, The Buttery's Family Counselling Program and Byron Shire Early Intervention Association.

### ATM skimming scam busted

Three men have been charged with running the elaborate ATM skimming scam that targeted Byron Bay residents and visitors from 2009 to 2015. The syndicate also skimmed cards at ATMs in Brisbane, the Gold Coast and Melbourne. After a sevenmonth investigation, police say they have charged a 49-year-old Gold Coast man,

believed to be the syndicate's head, with Commonwealth money-laundering offences on Thursday.

They allege he set up a Bulgarian scuba diving business in early 2009 and sent more than \$540,000 to the country. Two other men, a 46-year-old from Brisbane and 30-year-old from Tweed Heads, were also charged. Further arrests are expected, say police.

### Fed funding for councils still underfunded: Labor

Quarterly federal grants worth more than \$1.5 million were handed out to both Byron and Tweed councils last week.

Called the Financial Assistance Grant Program (FAG), Byron Shire Council's third quarterly payment totals \$369,124 while Tweed recieved \$1.2 million.

According to Local MP Justine Elliot (Labor), 'This funding will assist councils in delivering local projects, but I am extremely disappointed with the Liberal-Nationals government's decision to freeze indexation of these Financial Assistance Grants.'

'The fact is National Party

### Fears continue over new hospital staff cuts

Nurses and midwives have slammed a proposed workplace plan for the Byron Central Hospital that requires them to re-apply for their jobs.

Both the Byron and Mullumbimby District Hospital branches of the NSW Nurses and Midwives' Association (NSWNMA) held extraordinary branch meetings last week, with resolutions passed to seek immediate improvements to the workforce plan and consultation process.

They say the plan leaves them with little job security, with a proposal to abolish eight full-time-equivalent jobs. District (NNSW LHD), Chris Crawford, denies.

NSW Nurses and Midwives' Association assistant general secretary Judith Kiejda, said, 'Our members have been waiting for this workforce plan to be released since August.'

'Now, six weeks out from Christmas and the busy holiday season, they've been told they'll need to follow a process of applying for their current positions, Ms Kiejda said.

# Who are the people in your **Neighbourhood Centre?**

Vital Mullum services strong despite federal cuts and Byron's drop-in closure

The Mullumbimby Neighbourhood Centre (MNC) is one of our region's quietest achievers.

Providing ongoing programs and support to local people in need, the centre lost a significant amount of funding earlier this year when the federal government withdrew funds for their emergency relief programs.

Undeterred, the passionate crew at the MNC push on as challenges are nothing new - they've been creatively weaving funding and resources since the early 90s. Centre manager Julie Williams spoke with The Echo about the important work done on a shoestring.

Julie has been with the Centre since 1992, maintaining her passion for community development and her enthusiasm about the positive work culture even under financial duress.

'Every day is different here,' she says, 'and the diversity, where can you go to get this level of diversity? Human beings are amazing.

'They are resilient, this is the happiest place to work, I never wake up and say I don't want to go to work.

'While the work is by its nature challenging, it's also very rewarding.

'When you see someone who is homeless with a little baby and they find housing and you see them smile when people tell you that you have just made a difference that is what the work is about.

Many in the region are unaware of how far reaching the services and commitment of the Neighbourhood staff are. Julie laughs, 'We're great at the work but a bit crap at

programs. Workers provided by Julie's clever management strategy and her ability to knit together services from pools of funds from state and Commonwealth governments, social enterprises, networking alliances, donations and oneoff non-recurrent grants.

'There is often a big gap between what is funded to be delivered and what is delivered', she says. 'We over-service and the consequence is an expectation then from government is to run an expanded service on a minimal budget.

'It's a rock and a hard place - if you can imagine someone turns up in need, how can you put a cap on your numbers? How do you manage a waiting list for domestic violence? Even if you triage it and assess someone in the first intake as not needing an intake at that time, it can escalate into a crisis situation in an hour.'

### Fed funding cuts

The loss of Commonwealth funding has hit the

There are nine staff at the Neighborhood Centre.

No-one is full time. Volunteers number up to 30, sometimes more, and donations come from Santos, Perlos, Eden's Landing and other community businesses.

'We lost roughly \$22,000 from our budget - we lost that in March. That was the emergency relief, now it's down to \$12,000. We had Woolies Cards, IGA cards, petrol vouchers?

Now when people access Emergency Relief, they get a food parcel and a mix of what has been donated. There is no toilet paper, no nappies. Julie believes the cards offer greater choice and dignity for people in need.

### Available services

Yet despite the cuts, the range of services available are extensive. Brighter Futures is a targeted early intervention family program, where Mullum works with a consortium of seven other neighbourhood centres. There is a mental health practitioner on appointment, a financial counsellor and the Women's Resource Centre, which provides support for family violence. Additionally the centre provides showers for up to 17 people each day.

hygiene and the dignity that goes with it,' says Julie.

'I would estimate at the moment there are at least 20 people sleeping rough in Mullumbimby in various locations. 'What do we know though?'

### Cafe style drop in

The Neighbourhood Centre is committed to community development and the cafe-style drop-in program More Than A Meal is engaging socially isolated people to make and serve food.

'We are in partnership with the Anglican Church with Work for the Dole. The food is the by-product; the goal is to engage people who are isolated and hungry'.

'We work with all of the people no-one else wants to work with, and I find it frustrating when people say what is the primary issue?

'Someone might present for financial relief. In the consultation you might find out about mental health issues or DV, or literacy or homelessness. Nothing happens in isolation. The Mullumbimby Neighbourhood Centre welcomes donations, volunteers, and invites community to the 'Courage to Care: Putting Hope Into Action' fundraiser at the Mullum Ex Services this Saturday. Entry is \$10, but larger donations are certainly welcome. All proceeds will go to the More Than A Meal program. The Echo sought comment from federal senator John Williams (Nationals) on the funding cuts but received no reply by deadline.

'A social work student said to me one day, "I am amazed by what happens here. There is not a single person who leaves with nothing."

'If we can't do it we will do our damnedest to find someone who can. It is a brilliant staff and volunteer team here. They walk the talk.

It's difficult to comprehend the complex funding arrangements that go into staffing the Neighbourhood Centre and the shirewide and Mullumbimby-based

Neighbourhood Centre hard. 'At the moment, there is no funding for community builders, for the early intervention programs.' They have also lost funding for their Emergency Relief, she says. 'Emergency Relief was federally funded - we received \$12,000 per annum – which paid the case co-ordinator, and the balance of hours comes out of generated income as well. I have been trying to do a whole lot of juggling to keep the staff we have?

### Byron's closure

'When Fletcher Street closed in Byron [in March], the spill-over here really caned us. In Byron, there is nowhere like that now where you can maintain your



### **Community farewells Tony Llord 1959–2015**

Tony Llord, also known as Anthony Cocks, lived out many different chapters in his life.

He served in various capacities in the Royal Australian Navy and also studied his greater passion acting and theatre, in Prahran in his twenties. Moving to Byron Bay in 1987, within a few years Tony was collaborating with a few local actors and friends Daniel Roberts, Lindsay Neil-Baikie and Mandy Nolan.

He played various production and acting roles under the canopies of both the Australian Theatre Company and the locally established Tin Shed Theatre. 'Like the character Horatio, Tony was loyal, true and generous with a great aptitude for fun and friendship,' said Lindsay.

Tony's Bangalow/Mullumbimby chapter steered him into a long-lasting, loving friendship with Jodi Kym MacKenzie, blooming further into their love incarnate, daughter Aria. Jodi and Tony collaborated in the pieces *God's Hotel* and  $\mathcal{A}$  *Day in the Life of Byron Shire* doco with Nick Jeanes and Rachel Zinnman, held at the Great

During this time he also worked in transport logistics at Byron Bay Taxis and presented a show on Bay FM.

Tony loved many things: music, reading, acting, meditation and his guru Maharaji, connecting – from D&M conversations to light and cheeky banter with anyone and everyone. But no love was greater than the love for his daughter Aria.

In 1995 Tony began his chapter with the Byron Bay Bluesfest as a volunteer but became highly esteemed and well-known as the long-serving Artist Transport Logistics Manager. He was guardian to a fleet of more than 50 drivers.



This year marked Tony's 19th anniversary with the festival, having missed only one year with the birth of Aria.

'Queen B' administrator Kat Kellett said, 'Tony had a super-power for retaining vast amounts of complex data in his head and it was this mastery that made the 'magic' happen co-ordinating all the multi-dimensions that is Artist Transport logistics'.

Festival director Peter Noble added that Tony will be greatly missed within the Bluesfest team.

Originally from Albury, Tony found his true and final home in Brunswick Heads, where he regularly indulged in the local cafes, river and beach bathing and the renowned Fancy Dress Tennis Matches.

In the last year he facilitated the course Releasing the Inner Drama Queen and was in the throes of creating a festival for Bruns called The Peaceful Place.

## A brief moment of how things should have been

Something very odd happened in the Council Chambers last Thursday - the lefty socialist councillors held the balance of power!

Key votes were missing from the absent Cr Rose Wanchap and Chris Cubis, which meant the hard right wing develop-anything faction didn't have their usual numbers.

In a parallel universe, the chamber's dynamic would be this way - the soft fuzzy lefties won a slim majority at the last election; however, they were robbed of ruling after Cr Rose Wanchap quit the Greens and aligned herself with an entirely opposite ideology.

And ever since, a fivecouncillor majority have presided happily over our future.

This includes largely reactive and ill-informed responses to major planning decisions which lack staff and expert support.

Known as the Belongil Five, they are councillors Sol Ibrahim, Di Woods, Chris Cubis, Alan Hunter and Rose Wanchap.

As Cr Duncan Dev (Greens) explained to The Echo later, any decisions made last week that the Belongil Five don't like will be probably reversed in the next meeting.

And thus, the batshit crazy

with no clear outcome other than erratic ill-defined overdevelopment.

But let's drink this moment in, even if it was just fleeting. This appeared to be the closest we have recently had to sanity in that room.

There were no awkward overhead projections or pleas from Cr Wanchap to adopt another of her thought-bubble traffic suggestions.

There were no complaints from Cr Cubis that there are too many policies.

### Mullum tree saved

Anyway, on with the show, and there's great news for tree huggers and supporters of community housing, even if it has a whiff of 'deals behind closed doors?

An almost unanimous vote (Cr Woods against) has reversed the decision to axe an old tree on Station Street in Mullum and direct the land it sits on towards community housing.

Saving the majestic fig was the subject of a petition of over 1,600 signatures, and it sits just metres away from Council HQ on land slated for sale.

The mayoral minute attempts to save the tree and also delegates authority to general manager Ken Gainger to discuss 'with the North Coast Community ideas will stumble onwards Housing Company regard-

ing the potential development of a range of affordable housing (80 per cent of market rental) and community housing (including aged, disability, and low income).'

During debate, it was made clear that negotiations had already begun between Mayor Richardson, deputy mayor Paul Spooner and North Coast Community Housing. The general manager was present at the meeting, the chamber was reassured.

Regardless, Cr Ibrahim and Cr Woods didn't appear all that reassured, and were well, a little put out.

Cr Woods told the chamber she was uncomfortable that there was no tender or expressions of interest (EOI) with the process.

'I'm not sure we should delegate [to the GM] given what happened with the [Ocean Shores] Roundhouse, she said. 'I understand one person bought two blocks and now they are back on the market with an increase in price of \$200,000. It's almost corrupt to do this [project].

'Why haven't you discussed this with others to get a better outcome? I want to see it happen with due process.'

### Grenade lobbed


As those words were spoken, you could almost hear the room brace itself as a metaphorical grenade was lobbed wildly into the air.

Due process. In a perfect world, senior staff or the general manager should always be present when councillors meet with developers.

It helps to avoid accusations of corruption and maintains the illusion of trust.

But this is an imperfect world, and even the Greens mayor Simon Richardson was recently accused of a conflict of interest by residents who will be potentially affected by the Belongil train proposal.

A number of residents claimed he met the proponent in a public place without a Council staffer in sight. And who is the proponent? The \$100 million dollar Elements of Byron resort. And then there was the time when Cr Ibrahim was asked in the chamber why he called a potential tender specialising in building rock walls on the Gold Coast. He replied that he didn't know and was after technical advice. Regardless, normal procedure is to ask staff to deal with such matters. So, The Echo asked Cr Woods to confirm that – at all

She replied, 'I have done this for 12 years and I have never been a party to deals behind closed doors?

However Cr Dey (Greens) pointed out that Cr Woods pushed a successful motion for a specific consultant to look over the recently tabled koala plan of management (KPoM). It was a move that appeared highly politicised.

She told The Echo that she was concerned about the KPoM's legal implications.

'...the proposed KPoM may have led us into years of lengthy and expensive court battles,' she said. Yet this remark comes without public information being available that supports the lack of legal clarity surrounding the KPoM.

The Echo asked Cr Woods why she continues to vote against clear advice from the state government, specifically the sand nourishment request and cost benefit analysis (CBA) aspects.

The Echo understands that the OEH have offered to do the CBA free of charge, yet the Belongil Five insist on using ratepayer money to fund it.

Cr Woods said, 'I am very much in favour of protecting the Belongil Spit simply because of the massive costs that Council would incur if we didn't. I am against any further development on the immediate coastline, but am very happy to support protecting what we currently have.'

She said, 'OEH have been obstructionist in their handling of the whole process and every time we are close to a decision, they come up at the 11th hour with another excuse why we cannot move forward.

'At the end of the day, it will be the minister who will decide?

stretch of 100-odd metres of rock to complement other structures that are of inferior engineering standards along a world-renowned beach. This new wall has cost ratepayers nearly \$1 million, and aims to protect one piece of Council-owned land. Beside that land, it directly benefits neighbouring properties. Anyway the project has been long, expensive, painful and arduous, with coastal experts unhappy about potential public amenity loss.

## Q&A over West Byron development concerns


With the December 4 looming deadline for public submissions on the West Byron development control plan (DCP), a public meeting was recently held and a press release sent by the Byron Residents' Group, which raised what they say are inconsistencies with the DCP.

*The Echo* asked Council's director of sustainable environment and economy, Shannon Burt, to respond to the claims.

West Byron is a large mixed housing/commercial estate proposed just west of Byron CBD and opposite the Arts and Industry Estate. It was approved by the state government last year despite very strong resident opposition.

Ms Burt started by saying that a DCP is a guideline that outlines the requirements needed for inclusion at the Development Application (DA) stage. 'Therefore, more detailing will be required when the DAs are submitted.'

The group claims that management plans that were



promised – but not included – cover acid sulfate soil, biodiversity conservation and the koala plan of management.

Ms Burt replied, 'These matters are raised in the DCP as issues to be addressed as part of the development assessment process.'

The group also claimed that roads are planned to go through endangered koala habitat, to which Ms Burt replied, 'Roads are based on the concept layout and are generally planned to avoid koala habitat. Final road layout will be subject to detailed design and assessment at the development application stage.'

The group claimed that there is no provision for dealing with acid sulfate soils, but Ms Burt said that provisions are included in the 'Byron LEP 1988 [Clause 97] and Section E8.10.8.3 of the draft DCP.

The group claimed that a staged development is not tied to timeframe or triggers, such as capacity for utilities or roads. Ms Burt replied, 'The DCP

does not specify exact time frames but it breaks the development up into two broad stages. Stage one is aimed at ensuring all necessary infrastructure is provided across the site to all properties. This will then continue in stage two. In terms of the capacity of infrastructure and utilities, the Byron LEP 1988 [clause 100] requires infrastructure to be adequate for development prior to approval.


And finally, the group asked whether the Byron Sewage Treatment Plant will be able to handle West Byron and the new hospital without requiring an upgrade. Ms Burt replied, 'Yes, it has adequate capacity.'

### **Renewables to rule?**

For an obviously bright man Malcolm Turnbull is not behaving like one in his ongoing support of more coal mining, especially the ghastly spectre of Adani's proposed Carmichael mine in Queensland.

A friendship – complicity? – with big old-school business and outdated xenophobia has squashed the common sense needed to face the new century in most of the members of the Libs/Nats/Labs as they insist on believing coal is good and that refugees should be detained in overseas hellholes.

They run close to the lunatic American Republicans in their denial of reality.

Fortunately the Greens have thrown down the gauntlet by declaring in a new policy that our nation could be powered by 90 per cent renewables by 2030, only 15 years away. Given the 'ordinary' Australians' enthusiastic uptake of solar and other renewables, the Greens run the risk of getting a lot of votes at the next federal election.

You can check out the Greens' Clean Energy Roadmap at http://greens.org.au/clean-energy-roadmap. Long-term commentator on clean energy, Giles Parkinson, notes on his Reneweconomy website that 'even the conservative The International Energy Agency has said that renewable energy and energy efficiency – the two fundamental planks of the Greens policy - can account for nearly three-quarters of required emissions reductions'.

However, Parkinson is pessimistic about the change coming about: 'The reason it won't happen is that the Greens would not get into power fast enough to effect that change. Even a power sharing arrangement with Labor couldn't achieve its policy goals, because Labor - despite its proposed 50 per cent renewable energy target by 2030 - remains too wedded to the fossil fuel industry.

It's a likely scenario but one that I wish Parkinson has got wrong. It requires the full force of an energy-enlightened public - and some fierce input from El Niño this summer - to steer the major parties on a new course. Part of that will be in people abandoning the major energy providers in favour of standalone systems or in supporting new green enterprises like the Enova Energy project (enovaenergy.com.au) proposed for the northern rivers.

A last-ditch, people-powered initiative to make world leaders see sense at the Paris climate summit from November 30 on is the global Peoples' Climate March peoplesclimate.org. au. Obviously the large-scale adoption of renewable energy is crucial to the cause of keeping the planet at a human-habitable temperature.

Byron Shire will be participating in the march this coming Sunday November 29 at 10am in Railway Park, Byron Bay, with music and (hopefully short) speeches, followed by a march to the beach at 11.15am, where a photo of a 'human sign' will become part of a submission by lobby group Avaaz. ### **Turnbull defies the hotheads on Syria**

Of course, there will be a few unfortunate consequences, such as massive collateral damage, but hey, them's the breaks. If ISIS doesn't worry about civilian deaths, why should we? Fair's fair. It's just a kind of moral equivalence.

But the rather more concerning consequence is, what happens next? When the blood has dried and the dust has settled, just what is left? Well, presumably the person Malcolm Turnbull has called a murderous tyrant, Bashar al-Assad. If there are any rebels left in Syria, the Russians and Iranians can do the mopping up for him, and if they have had enough, he will be quite would be near impossible in

And he went further: 'The critical thing is the outcome of what you do and plainly a political settlement is the objective; it is enormously difficult, you know the enmities run very deep. But plainly when you look at Daesh or ISIL, its base is a Sunni population that has felt disenfranchised or oppressed in Syria – and with good reason - and has also felt left out of the new government in Iraq.'

The hotheads immediately interpreted the voice of reason as a suggestion that Turnbull would be willing to negotiate with ISIS – to collaborate with terrorism. Shades of the Grand Mufti Ibrahim Abu Mohammed, who had talked of 'racism, Islamophobia, curtailing freedoms through securitisation, duplicitous foreign policies and military intervention'. Both men were forced to reiterate that the Paris murders - any murders - could not be condoned, excused or justified in any way. But surely it can be worthwhile to try to explain just how and why such unforgiving and unforgivable acts could be planned.

The simplistic line is that it is all a matter of history – genetics, even: the Muslims have hated us for centuries, not for what we do but for what we are: they always have and they always will.

But this is just not true: since the sixth century there have been many conflicts between Islam and the West, but for far longer there have been periods of peace - at the very least mutual coexistence.

And of course the ISIS leaders themselves have constantly referred to the invasion of Muslim lands as their motive for revenge. It would follow logically from Turnbull's analysis that not only is the presence of foreign armies counterproductive: the fact that they are intervening at all is part of the problem not part of the solution.

In the wake of the Paris killings the idea of withdrawal is unthinkable, and the escalation will presumably continue.

But in the end the very deep enmities in the region that Turnbull talked about will have to be confronted, and if the West cannot devise a political solution, then those who have survived within the warravaged countries will have to work it out for themselves.

What is clear is that Abbott's bellicose approach has already been tried - in Vietnam, in Afghanistan, and in Iraq - and has failed. So rather than calling for boots on the ground, he would do better to put a sock in it. And Malcolm Turnbull, for one, would certainly agree.





#### Our elder trees

Next time you walk down McGoughans Lane in Mullum, take a look at the row of three mango trees that are around 100 years old, bursting ready for what looks to be a bumper mango season. Take a look, as I do each day, because they are all soon to be destroyed, along with four

Bangalow Palms, to make way for a duplex.

For 27 years my family has watched the wildlife in these trees. It's a big list but our favourites: Pacific Bazas, flying foxes, possums, and sugar gliders if we're lucky.

As a child I gorged on these particularly juicy mangoes hanging over the lane as I see successive generations of children still doing today.

The trees were planted at the same time as the heritage house they stand next to on 93 Station Street, but while the property is protected, the trees with it are not. I've tried every avenue to save these - there aren't many - and now it seems there is nothing more for me to do other than wait for the day I hear chainsaws.

When I looked down on the town from the water tower recently, I was hit by the view of a town with only a handful of elderly trees left. As I sat in the Council meeting on Thursday and



ment concerning the problems holiday-lets owners have in obtaining landlord insurance and the current illegality of holiday letting (Letters, November 18).

Several precedent court cases have shown this illegality in NSW residential areas. The most recent was Dobrohotoff v Bennic in the Land and Environment Court (May 2013). This prompted a number of coastal councils to develop policies and change their LEP to allow holiday letting.

Gosford, Wyong, Kiama and Eurobodalla have already had their policies gazetted in the NSW parliament. Byron's policy is on public exhibition until December 4. Compared with other councils the policy is comprehensive, but still does not satisfactorily protect residential amenity and requires amendment. Provision of public liability insurance to protect tenants of holiday lets is more important than landlords' continued on page 14 >

## The Legacy of the Hippies

When the new settlers started arriving in Mullumbimby and surrounds in the early 70s it was something of a culture shock. They were mostly young, had long hair and were not overly fond of wearing clothes.

Now they are old, some disappearing in puffs of green smoke, so it became important to record their stories. So we have the local historical society's film Mullumbimby's Madness: the Legacy of the Hippies, by Sharon Shostak, herself a local child of the hippy generation and creator of The Echo Doco and the award-winning drama Tish Ho.

According to Brunswick Valley Historical Society's treasurer Susan Tsicalas, the group had been discussing for several years the importance of recording the era of the new settlers, 'particularly as so many of the characters are passing on. Sarah Newsome, our collections manager, had been wanting to stage an exhibition and over that time had been collecting articles and photos.

'I was at the launch of Frank Mills's chair at Brunswick Heads last year and approached Sharon [who was filming for the local chamber of commerce] and asked if she was interested in making a doco on the hippies for the society.

'The result has been beyond our wildest dreams. Many of those original settlers have gladly shared their photos, films and stories and the museum's collection will be the richer for it.

For her part Sharon said she was thrilled to have the opportunity to make the film.

'Having the BVHS behind the film is a dream come true,' she said. 'I've been pretty much a solo operator as a filmmaker and this was like having a whole production company behind me.

'They have feelers that reach out into all areas of the community - for example, having Liz Walton from TAFE being able to offer her graphic arts students the project of designing the posters and DVD covers.

The final artwork chosen is by Lars Funke.

Although most of the people Sharon interviewed had known her since she was a child, 'I came to realise I actually didn't know their stories - why and how they came to be here and what their experience was and it was fascinating, she said.

As to the actual legacy of the hippies, Sharon said, 'Before I made the film I would've said "giving Mullumbimby its heart 'n' soul, which continues to this day", but after making it I've pretty much learnt that Mullum probably had it already.

'This town has a history of being "different" and it's one of the really interesting things that the film delves into. So ultimately the legacy of the hippies is perhaps simply their story.

And what was it like for Sharon growing up in that maelstrom of change?

'That's the topic for the next film that BVHS hopes to commission me to make: The Children of the Hippies!'

Mullumbimby's Madness treats the new settler phenomenon by centring the interviews around different topics: Dropping out/Finding

Mullumbimby, Buildings/Handmade homes, Money/Survival, Society/Community, Love/Sex and, ultimately, The Madness. Both the new and old settlers discuss the topics with remarkable candour and clarity.

It was fortunate for Sharon and the BVHS that renowned Australian journalist Kerry O'Brien was up here in 1976 with an ABC crew for *This Day Tonight* and made a doco called New Settlers of the Island that aired in 1977. It coincided with the first Channon Market, which they filmed.

O'Brien now lives locally and agreed to be interviewed.

'I sat him in front of my laptop to show him the old doco and filmed his reaction,' said Sharon. 'He was struck by the "softness"



of the story compared to the more hard-hitting style of today. And glad he wasn't too embarrassed by it?

The DVD of the film will be available for purchase at the screenings, and it will include Frank Mills reciting his poem about the hippies and the Echonetdaily clip of the first 'hippy reunion' that happened earlier in the year.

Frank Mills was the first farmer to sell land to Colin Scattergood in the early 1970s for the first Main Arm community settlement and Noel James from James Hardware, now Mitre 10, speaks on behalf of the town's shop owners.

BVHS have been able to make the doco through the very generous donations of three of the alterna-

tive settlers and the Mullumbimby Chamber of Commerce, as well as being assisted by funds allocated to the Royal Australian Historical Society through the Heritage Branch of the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage.

The world premiere of Mullumbimby's Madness is at the Mullumbimby Civic Centre on Thursday December 3 at 7.30pm. Broadfoot will be be playing live. Further screenings are at the Drill Hall on Friday December 4 at 5.30pm and 8pm. Tickets cost \$15/\$10 conc and are available from The Bookshop, Mullumbimby.

### Back to the Garden

The historical society is also launching its exhibition 'Back to the Garden' at the museum on Saturday December 19 at 10am. It is described as 'a very comprehensive look at the alternative settlers and the changes they have wrought on our region'. insurance. If a holidaylet tenant is injured in the property, it is possible that the owner could be sued if there was no public liability insurance. Any responsible holiday-let owner would already have this insurance. If they pay tax then it is a deduction.

It will become mandatory for all holiday-let owners to follow the Holiday Rental Code of Conduct. On page 14 in this code the following regulation 2.3 states: 'Insurance: Owners and managers should hold appropriate insurance including comprehensive landlords' and public liability insurance (as appropriate).' Therefore, it will become mandatory for holiday-let owners to hold this insurance. Many would be willing to take a risk and Council would not be aware

It also means low-acuity patients will no longer have to travel to other shires to access services. Sadly high-acuity and non-voluntary patients will need to use other shires' health facilities.

I suggest Cr Spooner looks into the model of care being implemented in the mental health unit. He may just find it is not about giving a pill or two. Just maybe it will provide a service that is needed for the community and will aid local non-government organisations which are clearly stretched with the high demand.

I would love our elected

Shores Community Association (OSCA) and other organisations, and not 'just for a community centre', one of which is already in Rajah Road opposite the shopping centre.

This community centre is not a 'town centre' or open space, which was stated in the Gateway Planning Proposal compiled by Byron Shire Council with the state government.

Council's Community Strategic Plans are practised in all towns but denied to Ocean Shores, even with it being the largest town in Byron Shire. It does not have a town centre with open space that would be catering for all neighbouring areas.

Ninety-seven per cent of residents in a survey stipulated their desire for the Roundhouse land to be used for the community for cultural activities, conferences, historical information, archives, children's playground, etc – all to the advantage of the community. The historic well built by Mr Bower, owner of the original farm, was to be a feature.

Ratepayers, read the full Byron Council Special Investigation Report April 1994 Roundhouse, issued by senior investigations officer M Brophy. It shows a very different situation from that portrayed in W B Crompton's letter. This is a must to read – for the truth to be known. Jillian Spring Billinudgel

scheme' that Council intends to implement on December 21 have been ignored, I am obliged to file legal proceedings against Council at the NSW Civil and Administrative Tribunal (Sydney).

This is to prevent the implementation of a parking scheme that includes citizens being obliged to provide personal information to a nongovernment third party in order to obtain the government service of a resident parking permit (or other exemption) and/or input a licence plate number (thus enabling surveillance of drivers within Byron Bay) in order to exercise legal right to park on Crown land (road or reserve car park).

I have repeatedly requested that Council (staff and elected) retain the privacy principles of the current system, ie resident parking permits (and other exemptions) be issued by Council and not shared with any non-government 'third party'; and no requirement to input licence plate number (anonymous), purchase a ticket and display on dashboard parking rather than surveillance parking - with data collated by private enterprise third party and shared with only the gods know' who. Unfortunately Council (Ralph James acting on behalf of Council) insist that the scheme is legal – which it is not. I will try to limit costs to ratepayers via lodging a formal request that NCAT permit at least the preliminary processes to be conducted via telephone conferencing (keeping Council staff in their offices at Mullumbimby - rather than scoring a ratepayer-funded holiday in Sydney). 

# The Syrian nightmare – how it got to this

Syria is bordered by Lebanon, Israel, Turkey, Iraq, and Jordan - meaning it's in the middle of the 'middle east'.

After WWI, various European conquerors drew lines on maps to divide their 'colonies' into areas and populations they could control, including Syria (in 1946).

By the mid 1900s, locals took over governing these countries but the Europeans and the increasingly aggressive Americans kept control of many of the natural assets, primarily oil. The populations, fractured along lines of culture, class, language, and religion, were held together by state violence and corruption.

### Iraq invaded

Then came the 2000s and the US (aided by Britain and sub-lackey Australia) invaded Iraq on the false grounds that it was behind 9/11 and had weapons of mass destruction.

This deadly farce was managed by a group of politicians and academics based in Washington who believe that USA & Partners Inc should control every inch of the world that's accessible and profitable.

That Washington group, known as 'neo-conservatives', ran the Bush Junior foreign policy (ie wars), led by their own Dick Cheney as vicepresident, Donald Rumsfeld as secretary of defense (ie

war), and his deputy Paul Wolfowitz.

Under Obama, neo-cons are still pursuing their divide-and-conquer strategy in the region as outlined in their 'Project for the New American Century (PNAC)'.

They have muscled their way back into top posts in Defense, State, and CIA - and these believers in the 'pre-eminent power' of 'military strength and moral clarity' expect to reign more supreme in a Hillary Clinton administration.

The 'junior partners' in the Iraq-Syria invasion and disintegration are Saudi Arabia and Israel, both shooting for more fragmented and therefore weaker neighbours. They were united in the desire to oust the thuggish but independent Saddam Hussein in Iraq, and Hafez Al Assad and son Basher in Syria.

### 'Rogue' outfits

What's gone wrong is that the weakened state governments have been supplanted by strong nonstate outfits like Hezbollah and Hamas in Lebanon and Palestine and now 'Isil', or 'ISIS' - essentially the Salafist-takfiris - in Iraq/Syria.

These guys have filled an area not just government-free but also now without real borders. They are inspired by a form of Islam invented by a fundamentalist preacher named Al Wahhab in 1745 to beat back the Turks, which so impressed the House of Saud that today Saudi Arabia is Isil's biggest backer. Saudi oil money also supports schools to spread Wahhabism worldwide.

So while this unholy alliance pulverises Syria, Assad hangs on with support from remnants of his multi-ethnic middle- and working-class citizens, plus Iran, Russia, and a growing number of global players who accept that he's an essential piece for the peacemaking puzzle.

Unfortunately Turkey, which could shut down supply lines to Isil, won't - because the forces most likely to destroy the fundamentalists are the Kurds - who are President Erdoğan's strongest political challengers inside Turkey.

So - what's behind the slogans dominating our TV news this week? What is, really, 'the barbarianism of this war'?

According to the tele, it's a frenzy of rape and murder by 20-year-old outcasts in stolen Toyotas with automatic weapons and black robes.

On the bigger screen of life, it looks like air raids by billion-dollar bombers, missiles, drones, and jet fighters - usually American but now also Russian - and the resultant displacement and immiseration of millions of families from Libya, Iraq, and Syria alone.

### Barbarism

The guys in Toyotas get all the air time.

Most foreign recruits in this black-flag militia are not Aussie teenagers on steroids, but Muslims from Chechnya and other former Soviet Muslim communities, attracted by a nuance-free ideology and a free Kalishnikov plus \$100 a week.

The billion-dollar barbarism gets the whole-hearted approval of world elites, including our PMs Gillard, Abbott, and Turnbull, and so far as one can tell, also Bill Shorten.

And who are the 'secret funders'?

Millions of our tax dollars are going to help our intelligence forces ASIO and ASIS, the Australian Federal Police, and our new catch-the-

terrorist-dollars outfit AUS-TRAC, stop terrorist funders. So far they have identified 170 people in Australia sending enough to buy, maybe, a few Toyotas.

Meanwhile, Russian president Vladimir Putin just told the world that (1) he has lists of donors from 40 countries, including many among the G20 elite, which he's handed to those governments (but not to us the people, because he's Putin not Assange) and (2) that Russian planes and satellites are tracking 'a motorcade of refueling vehicles ... that from a height of 4,000 to 5,000 metres stretch beyond the horizon'.

### Oil money

This massive operation of oil extraction is being run by Isil, and Iraqi intelligence and US officials estimate they're hauling in \$50 million a month from selling this crude from captured oilfields 'on the black market'.

Since Putin's exposé, US jets are bombing these convoys, which they previously declined to do because of 'the risk of civilian casualties'. Really?

None of the combatants likely gives two seconds' thought to the monstrous pollution this is all causing. Yet war is the worst assault of all on any and every environment.

None of us in our lifetime has seen such atrocious public assassinations as carried out by IS.

It is the latest stage of the tragedy in Syria, with Islamic State's publicised killings carried out to terrify the rest of the world. ## **Rise in the months of housing supply**

As the spring selling season progresses we are seeing a rise in the number of newly listed properties being added to the market; however, we aren't seeing a commensurate lift in transactions resulting in a rise in the months of housing supply.

The months of supply calculation is simply a function of the trend number of property sales and the amount of properties listed for sale. For example, if there were 100 homes for sale and we typically see twenty sales each month, there would be five months of supply in the market. Or, in other words, it would take five months to absorb all the stock available for sale. Although there is a lag in receiving sales, other data such as valuation activity, clearance rates and mortgage commitments point to a minimal increase in transaction activity so far this spring. As a result we are starting to see the months of housing supply trending higher. Across the combined capital cities, there are currently 3.4 months of supply on the market. This figure has increased from a recent low of 2.9 months in March. You will note on the first chart that the months of supply figure spikes each Christmas/New Year period. This is due to the fact that sales volumes fall sharply at that time of the year

while there is also a moderate fall in total listings. As the number of newly advertised listings continues to grow we anticipate that the months of supply figure is likely to trend higher. Although the months of supply is rising, it remains low on an historical basis. This is of course reflected by a fairly rapid rate of sale however, much like headline value growth figures this is largely being fuelled by the very strong conditions across the Sydney and Melbourne housing markets.



# **Bali's volcanic flight risk**

With the holidays just around the corner, Bali's surf beaches promise a well-deserved break. What might prove the best holiday decision, however, is to give yourself peace of mind in case of flight cancellations.

Mt Rinjani's eruption grounded planes and closed Bali's Denpasar airport as recently as a week ago. Eruptions of Mt Raung in July and August had the same effect. Tourists left in droves when they could, leaving destinations empty, restaurants and beaches bare.

Meteorologists have since given aviation the thumbs up; there are clear skies and volcanic activity is calming down. Travel bookings are open again, but no-one can predict with certainty when either Mt Rinjani or Mt Raung will erupt again.

Traveller Sam Litt from Sydney was caught in Bali recently. He said, 'We were delayed a week when our flights to leave Bali on Sunday were cancelled... We were tired of waiting; flying out via Singapore was easiest.'

What could be essential to ensure your holiday is memorable is to have adequate travel insurance with alternative flights planned.

Travel insurance agencies issue a product disclosure statement (PDS) with inclusions/exclusions you may overlook. In general, once an event starts, policies purchased don't cover it, so buying your insurance early is good practice.

For example NRMA's current advice to travellers says, 'There is no cover for amendment or cancellation costs for policies issued on or after 03/11/2015 as the events in Bali [the eruption of Mt Rinjani] are no longer deemed an unforeseen event'

Without insurance, you will need extra resources to cover your out-of-pocket expenses in the event your flights are cancelled, such as finding extra accommodation or another route home.

'It became a daily event for us, waiting to get out. We didn't take out travel insurance. We ran out of money and couldn't go anywhere really, just wait, said Marion from Melbourne.

Many travellers from the northern rivers travel to Bali on the cheap, and save on travel insurance as well as other costs. If that's you, be prepared to be flexible if your schedule changes and have a Plan B to ensure your trip to paradise is as fun as you planned.

ETHERIDGE'S CALLTO CHANGE

ROCK SINGER, SONGWRITER, GUITARIST AND ACTIVIST – MELISSA ETHERIDGE HAS BEEN SPEAKING HER TRUTH SINCE HER SELF-TITLED DEBUT RELEASE IN 1988.

Passionate about the need to embrace global change, Etheridge was personally asked by Al Gore to write the title track for *An Inconvenient Truth*. She penned *I need to Wake Up* – a song that embodies the underlying ethos of not just the film, but of Etheridge herself.

'I think our generation is really handling change at such a huge rate and probably more so than any generation ever has. To really handle it we need to have connection, we need to understand the spiritual part, not just as religious but the spirt in each of us and we have to understand that and how to bring it into each other's life.

'Personal changes are the key. I need to wake up and I need to move. The one little change I make is a drop in the ocean, one little change in the household changes me – it changes my neighbourhood – it changes the community – that's how we create change on that level. To create change on that level makes it better for everyone. It's about eating healthily, living well, living consciously.'

Etheridge acknowledges that change is never easy, but believes it's a personal responsibility we all have. In a world where terror is becoming normalised she believes it's important to resist the urge to fear or judge.

'We can't sit back waiting for the world to change. It's challenging – if I go back into my house and am afraid of everyone, then they win, those who operate from that belief system win. It challenges us to say no. I still believe that good wins; I still believe there are more good people who want to live a productive healthy life and not to take life, and I believe there are more of those people than not, and if I choose, then I am not going to be afraid of someone of another colour or another socioeconomic situation: I refuse to fear them. I will judge a person on their character, I will be colourblind and everything else blind!'

A few years ago Melissa Etheridge married her best friend Linda Wallem. Ironically Wallem was consoling Etheridge after a relationship failure, when she pointed out that perhaps the two of them were in fact romantic soulmates.

'She came to it first, after I went through a breakup and she was helping me, and I said No No, and two months later I said YES. I did a list out of what I wanted, and that's LInda, that's her. I didn't think it would look like Linda, and she said, "who are you waiting for?""

The two married in 2013 just two days after they both turned 53. Etheridge believes the marriage has been an important step forward for gay and lesbian community in the US.

'What happens is when you get the supreme court, the highest body of legislation we have, say it's a

human right, it's a civil right. To have that gives that person who might have been afraid to come out a legal right; it gives you that foot to stand on you can't take that away.

'I was always very out to my family, and out to whom I worked with. People who knew me knew I was discovered in lesbian bars, yet it was sort of a don't ask don't tell; everyone was waiting for me to step over that line. I decided I didn't want to have a fear of this anymore. I decided I was going to come out. If anyone was going to not listen to my music any more because I was a lesbian...!

'That is the key to people coming out, because people see just a normal person and she is talented and what am I afraid of? Facing fear is what changes the world.'

At no time in history have we had so many people on the planet. We've all had to squeeze in to make a little more room for each other. The quarter-acre block has shrunk down to 400 square metres. The middle suburbs of cities such as Sydney that used to provide 4-bedroom family homes are now providing the same amenity but as units, stacking us like people in an architect-designed Tupperware set, one little family neatly perched on top of the other.

The world has never been so full of people. We're living shoulder to shoulder, back to back, hip to hip, yet we've never been so removed from each other. The buzzword on the human front is connection. We yearn for connection. Yet we make so little effort to meet the people

sitting next to us

Why? Is it like romantic love where we only desire connection with a particular type of person? Do we secretly audit the rest of the human race for being 'too different'? Too Muslim. Too Christian. Too Fat. Too Ugly. Too Beautiful. Too Smart. Too Dumb? It seems the more of us there are the more disconnected we become. How ironic - the closer we become physically, the more likely it is for our stranger legs to touch on the bus, the more frightened we become! The more we retreat into our social cocoon where we pretend the other person isn't actually there. The iPhone, the tool that purports to 'connect' us with our communities, to keep us up to date on everything in the world, to

make us kings and queens of the virtual world, is also the very tool that allows us to isolate and shut out the real visceral world.

Next time you are on a bus or a tram or a train have a look around. How many people are on their phones? Listening to music, texting, talking, checking in on Facebook, updating Instagram posts? Every single person in rapturous connection with their technology. Not a single person in simple communication with each other.

Is it a coincidence that anxiety also seems to be on the increase? Is anxiety trying to buffer our entry into an overpopulated world by keeping us at home, or sending us out into the fray shut down, suspicious and frightened? Terrorism seems like a natural consequence in a world completely terrified of itself. I can't stop terrorism. But I can work on my own personal terror. 



# cinema Reviews

### **GAMES: MOCKINGJAY – PART 2** THE HUNGER

You know that an epic is running out of steam when the director resorts to a cheap thrill that is as superfluous as it is irrelevant. Well into the last stage of Katniss Everdeen's heroic opus (and anyone who seriously thinks that Hollywood has not taken to empowering women has either not seen many movies of late or is just not paying attention - I suspect the latter), her band of rebels are attacked in the subterranean tunnels of Panem by naked humanoid creatures with jaws of ferocious savagery. It's scary, for sure, and it provides an opportunity for the screenwriters to whittle down the number in Katniss's team (you can nearly always tell which soldiers will be killed, can't you), but other than that the sequence adds nothing to the story. The series in general has been good if patchy, with none of the three sequels able to match the first episode's balance of muscle and wit. Most notable, and dispiriting, is the darkness that has engulfed what is meant ostensibly to be a struggle for liberation

by the downtrodden from their Orwellian rulers (Donald Sutherland is fantastic as Snow, the cruel President with no conscience). There are even moments when Katniss (Jennifer Lawrence) herself seems bewildered, especially when the realisation that she is being cynically used as a PR tool by her own equally manipulative side leaves her with only revenge as a spur. It is, undeniably, horribly relevant. Casting a grievous shadow over the movie, though, was the carnage in Paris a week earlier. The fighting depicted in Hunger Games and its ilk (which is to say, most mainstream action flicks), accompanied by big music and fabulous CGI, is not so entertaining in real life. I winced a couple of times and felt sick at heart to think that punters flock to watch enactments of carnage. Surely violence, pretend or otherwise, begets violence? If for no other reason than out of respect for grieving humanity, the distributors - the industry - might have at least delayed the opening of their latest mega-death blockbuster.







# SECRET IN THEIR EYES

At the end of To Kill A Mockingbird, Atticus and Judge Taylor decide between themselves that Boo Radley need not face the court after killing Bob Ewell. That we all agreed suggests that our hunger for summary justice remains a driving force under the thinnest veneer of civil proprieties. Billy Ray's re-working of Juan José Campanella's El Secreto De Sus Ojos (Oscar's best foreign-language film of 2010) explores the emotional and psychological crannies from which our actions might never be freed. It also asks a confronting question: should a blind eye be turned on one crime if it jeopardises the prevention of another? The story starts in the present day. After working as an investigator in New York, Ray (Chiwetel Ejiofor), returns to the LAPD where, after thirteen years, he is reunited with Jess (Julia Roberts), a detective, and Claire (Nicole Kidman), who is now a DA. The ghastly crime that haunts them still is the 2002 rape and murder of Jess's daughter. At the time, Ray had identified the killer

but was unable to nail him because the suspect was protected as a snitch working undercover at a mosque thought to harbour potential terrorists. Ray believes that he has relocated his man and enlists the other two in his pursuit of him. Cinephiles are usually hard-wired to tell you that any American cover of a European (or in this case Argentinian) movie is never as good, but it's not always so. Billy Ray has taken liberties with the plot and cast of characters but remains faithful to the original, even replicating a scene of essential light relief when Ray and his buddy are chased by a little dog down a witness's hallway. He is, however, unable to recreate the smouldering passion of the two leads - Ejiofor and Kidman are a mismatch - but the context of 9/11 is a smart twist and the conclusion, harking back as it does to Atticus and the Judge's discussion, can be seen as unacceptable or entirely appropriate, depending on how high the horse is that you want to get onto.





# **Girls like playing soccer best**

More girls now playing soccer than netball says sport survey.

Over the last 12 months, soccer has overtaken swimming as the most popular sporting activity among Australian kids, with one in two children aged 6-13 now playing the Beautiful Game.

Furthermore, the latest findings from the Roy Morgan Research Young Australians Survey reveal that, for the first time, more girls are now playing soccer than netball.

Back in June 2014, 50 per cent of Aussie kids (or 1,213,000 children) reported going swimming, ahead of 47 per cent (1,136,000) who said they played soccer.

Since then, soccer has gained an extra 108,000 young players, to hit a 50 per cent participation rate (1,244,000); while swimming participation has fallen by 32,000 kids and now sits at


are also taking part in athletics, cricket, netball and Australian Rules football than they were 12 months ago, the increases for these sports are negligible when compared with the boom in soccer participation.

But soccer's rise is not simply the result of more boys playing it: it is becoming increasingly popular with girls as well. So much so, in fact, that a higher proportion of Australian girls (39%) now play soccer than netball (37%), a sport traditionally associated with girls

Hugh Amoyal, deputy CEO of Roy Morgan Research, said that despite the fact that the average time spent by Australian children playing sport each week has declined as they spend more time on the internet, it is encouraging to see that soccer participation has increased so substantially year on year for boys and girls.
