Debby Cook lives with the daily grief of being separated from her children.

The Uki mum has not seen two of her three children for six years after being locked in a bitter custody fight with her former partner.

A long-time volunteer for the Parental Alienation Awareness Organisation, Debby now campaigns for parental rights and provides support to others affected by Family Court decisions.

In a bid to highlight the issue, Debby has organised a public bubble-blowing event at Murwillumbah campaign.

The event, which coincides with International Parental Alienation Awareness Day on April 25, aims to raise awareness about the damaging emotional and psychological effects of parental alienation.

Family Court failure

Debby says the problem is often compounded by failures in the Family Court system, which is open to manipulation and interference.

And with divorce rates on the rise, as part of the global Bubbles of Love Debby says more and more people are now heading to court to resolve child custody issues.

'That's where it gets ugly and the issue gets muddied,' she said.

'It does in the end become angry, vengeful behaviour and the system is set up as such that it can be used to Debby is asking others to join her keep one parent away from another.' Monday, April 25, from noon.

Her children have also been cut off from their youngest sister who lives with Debby.

Despite the long separation, Debby says she still holds out hope that she will have a relationship with her children in the future.

Council rushes to ban coal gas

Tweed Shire Council has demanded a moratorium on all coal-seam gas exploration in the shire and is rushing to head off an exploration licence that is expected to be determined in the next few days.

In a rare show of solidarity this week, a motion brought by Cr Warren Polglase seeking a moratorium got unanimous support and sparked a standing ovation from a crowded gallery and cries of 'Polglase for president'.

But Greens councillor Katie Milne warned that time was of the essence as petroleum exploration licence (PEL) 134 is expected to be determined by the Department of Primary Industry within days.

PEL 134 sought by Macquarie Energy covers a broad swathe of the upper Tweed west of Mount Warning and taking in the village of Tyalgum.

She moved that the council resolution, together with a report on coalseam gas prepared by council director of community resources David Oxenham, be immediately forwarded to the department.

Cr Polglase said he had been working with irrigation for 40 years and there was nothing more precious than

'As a landholder it has the same rights as other landholders over whose property a PEL is granted.

'As a water supply authority it appears the council has no additional rights regarding CSG work.

'Also it doesn't have the internal expertise to fully assess the technology and its impacts.'

Mr Oxenham said all petroleum on or below the surface is the property of the Crown, not the landowner.


'Royalties are generally required to be paid to the Crown for extraction of these resources.'

Mr Oxenham said in NSW a PEL does not entitle the licence holder to enter any lands covered by the licence without prior arrangement with the landowner.

'The onus is on the licence holder to attempt to negotiate access arrangements with the landholder.

'If access can't be negotiated access conditions will be determined by an arbitrator or the Land and Environment Court.

'In Queensland an authority to prospect (ATP) gives the licence holder the right to access any property in the area covered by the ATP.

Coal-seam gas unites lobby groups

Tweed environmentalists and farmers have gone from locking horns over the controversial Byrrill Creek dam proposal to locking the gate on gas companies planning to explore or drill for coal-seam gas.

The Northern Rivers Guardians (NRG), evolved from the former No Rally Group which successfully fought against the running of the world rally through Tweed and Kyogle shires, and the Tweed Combined Rural Industries Association (TCRIA) this week announced a united front in a campaign to stop any planned coal-seam gas mining in the Tweed, of which around half is covered by exploration licences.

The two groups have declared the community 'should be entitled to have a say in the types of industry developed in the local region.

NRG spokesperson Michael McNamara said the united surprise to anyone because 'at groups.

NRG recently joined the Lock the Gate Alliance (see lockthegate.org.au) a national grouping of around 80 community, industry and environmental groups fighting the issue around Australia, especially in areas such as southeast Queensland where drilling has already started in earnest.

Mr McNamara said both groups had put aside their differences to work together on the coal-seam gas issue which said a lot about its importance in the

Farmers' group spokesman Farmers Federation (NFF) and Col Brooks said the two groups Friends of the Earth (FOE) are had to 'stand together as a community or we have no hope of developing as we should.

> Coal-seam gas mining involves 'fracking', or hydraulic fracturing, where a mixture of water, sand and toxic chemicals are injected at high pressure underground in order to fracture rock formations and release the coal-seam gas. Underground drinking water sources are at risk from the use of the contaminants and leakage of gas.

Mr Brooks said there were many concerns about the impact of the process on rural and tourism industries as well as public health.

'Rural enterprises needed to be assured of good quality water or they are doomed, he said.

NEC spokesperson Lisa Green said 'we've never seen people so stirred up over an issue as they are over coal-seam gas exploration and mining in our area; it really hit the fan after the Border Ranges World Heritage area was opened to mining exploration without any consultation with landowners'.

Too special to mine

'Some areas are so special that they should be permanently excluded from mining and this area, which is of true world significance and has some of the best agricultural soils in Australia, must be excluded.

'The new NSW coal and gas strategy proposes full transparency and consultation prior to granting mining exploration licences but that's a joke; now with the Border Ranges sold off, all the coal seam gas areas in NSW are already under Petroleum Exploration Licences to different mining companies without any transparency or consultation, there's just nothing left to license.'

Tweed movement sees health benefits of going raw

A burgeoning raw food movement is starting to catch on in the Tweed.

Menkit Prince first began hosting raw vegan potluck parties at her Uki home a year ago and the concept quickly

A potluck event is now held monthly at different locations.

Ms Prince (pictured, right) said many people didn't realise that cooking or over-processing food destroyed many of its vital nutrients.

She says the event is about introducing people to the concept of a raw vegan diet and how they can implement it in their own lives.

'Many people have this idea that raw food is somehow boring. It's not a diet of desperation. Even for busy people it's manageable,' she said.

Ms Prince, who has been a vegetarian for the past 30 years and switched to a raw food diet 16 months ago, says she energised and my immune syshas never felt better.



'One of the benefits of becoming raw for me is that I have never enjoyed eating so much in my whole life,' she

'It's a great way to cleanse the body. I feel more alive, more raw has benefits for the envitem is stronger.

The worldwide initiative is being held ahead of the International Confederation of Midwives' (ICM) triennial congress, also taking place in Durban.

Terranora estate an eyesore say planners

A contentious subdivision at Terranora has been hammered by council planners who have branded it as haphazard planning and a potential eyesore.

The 321-lot Altitude Aspire project has roused fierce opposition from nearby residents who particularly object to plans to build a 700-metre-long acoustic wall along Fraser Drive 2.4 metres high.

A report tabled by council planning director Vince Connell said the development could be a blight on one of Australia's seven designated iconic landscapes.

'The application is grossly deficient by any acceptable level of assessment on the scenic impact locally and on the shire,' he said.

and retaining walls, particularly when combined with the relatively small lots and limited opportunity for scenic and landscape protection, will adversely impact on the Tweed's scenic value and undermine the shire's significance as one of Australia's National Iconic Landscapes.'

Plans filed under 3a

Altitude Aspire developer Newland Development has filed its application directly to the state government under the notorious Part 3a legislation, which leaves the Tweed Shire Council as the assessing authority but not the consent authority.

Mr Connell described the project as 'piecemeal' and not part of a coherent overall plan for the part of Terranora that 'The design of the proposed falls under the Area E strategy.

on significant bulk earthworks dential scheme introduced in 2008 taking in a broad sweep of Terranora from Lindisfarne school to Fraser Dive.

> Mr Connell said it was essential that Area E was underpinned by robust planning and infrastructure principles.

> Other concerns about Altitude Aspire included the level of earthworks required on each site, and issues with access, water, sewerage and environmental protection.

> 'Much of the land is steeply sloping' said Mr Connell.

Difficulties with the water infrastructure means a service reservoir would have to be built.

The sewerage system would also need a significant upgrade to cope with the development.

Meanwhile, the site is home to a number of threatened bird and plant species which would require a significant buffer zone.

Tweed high-rise caryard approved

Tweed Heads is cementing itself as the caryard capital of the southern Gold Coast with a BMW dealership winning approval to build a six-storey office block and showroom on the site of the old Scott's Fruit Barn.

Southport-based BMW and Land Rover dealers Bruce Lynton Pty Ltd were given the green light by the Northern Joint Regional Planning Panel last week for their \$20 million project.

The strategically placed development will occupy the entire corner block bounded by Recreation Street, Wharf Street and Boyd Street and will provide uninterrupted million dollar views of the Terranora inlet.

The approval comes some 15 years after Markwell's Fisheries' bid to build a high-rise devel-



Botulism now suspected in duck deaths

Bird flu has been ruled out and botulism now suspected as the cause of death for scores of black ducks in a suburban lake at Banora Point over a fortnight

Mystery has surrounded the death and sickness of 24 Pacific Black Ducks, a swan and some moorhens which frequented the manmade Lake Kimberley. An earlier analysis of a bird carcass ruled out pesticide as a cause and further tests were carried out.

The dead birds were collected last month who were alerted by a number of residents around the lake.

mary Industries' (DPI) regional veterinary officer Paul Freeman told *The Echo* that avian manmade. influenza (bird flu) had been ruled out, but there had not been enough fresh samples of analysis.

Mr Freeman said the DPI analysis at a Sydney laboratory showed no exotic disease and as pesticides had already been ruled out, botulism from bacterial toxins was the most likely particularly healthy environ-

He said botulism occurred when there was a low-oxygen environment, especially in enthe dead birds for a definitive closed areas such as lakes and dams, as a result of decaying vegetable or organic matter.

'When there is no renewed flushing occurring and there's lots of rotting organic matter, that's when the water is not a

'We see a few of these outbreaks from time to time in wet seasons with lots of plant growth drying and rotting... and we've had lots of rain and one of the wettest summers in years,' he said.

The Roads and Traffic Authority (RTA) which is oversseeing the construction of the new bypass of the Pacific Highway on the edge of the lake, conducts routine water sampling in the lake and has built temporary culverts there for drainage during roadworks, but results had showed no problems.



Old Murwillumbah toilet block reeks of history

Murwillumbah's distinctive Queen Street public toilets have been ruled to have modest heritage significance and as a result may be saved from the demolisher's hammer.

The Tweed Shire Council called in consultants to run a rule over the conveniences whose access steps mean they fail to come up to scratch under disability discrimination legislation.

Consultants Ainsworth Heritage carried out an exhaustive probe and declared the edifice, which has been round for as long as most can remember, had limited local historic and aesthetic significance and was a reasonably rare example of its type.

No one can pinpoint exactly when the toilets were built but information from former council employees suggest it was around 1954-56 - about the time when a sewerage system was installed in Murwillumbah.

The design elements were described as late inter-war or post-war and, though considered modern at the time of building, were subtle enough to complement the adjacent heritage-listed streetscape.

The toilet block architect was identified as Doug Board



over the road and the Main most prominent architects in Street Medical Centre.

'All these buildings display a similar architectural style with rounded facades and detailing, such as the glass bricks, that echoed Doug Board's famous father, F J Board, who was noted for using decorative brickwork.

There is conjecture the toilet block might have been built as the same time as the Rotary Club's clock tower in 1952.

On its own, the consultants said, the toilet block was not historically significant, but as part of the integrated sewerage system, which helped drive the development of the town, the block had some local significance.

Trying it on

It's so refreshing to see our chief planner showing no fear or favour in calling a bad development exactly that. The controversial 321-lot Altitude Aspire development proposed for Terranora, with its over-the-top acoustic wall along Fraser Drive, has also rightly been condemned by neighbouring residents, who were not told about the wall in the first place.

In a nutshell, council's chief planner says the developer, who should know better, must go back to the drawing board as the overall design, which involves small lots surrounded by bulky earthworks and retaining walls, is an eyesore and will not blend in with the surrounding landscape.

Calling the plan 'grossly deficient' is the worst sort of indictment for any development application, but when it comes from a professional developer, it makes you wonder just what did they think they were up to. Perhaps they thought the pro-development majority faction on council would give it their blessing anyway, with or without the chief planner's endorsement, and so would the state government, seen by many who object to political donations as the puppets of big developers. Indeed, the developer in this case used the contentious Part 3A of the state planning laws to appeal directly to the planning minister to let it go ahead, and council only has an assessment rather than consent role in this case.

The phrases used to describe the plan, such as piecemeal, not coherent or having an adverse impact, are probably not what the developers wanted to hear, but the Terranora area in question has to be developed sensibly and sensitively if it's to blend in with surrounding built environment. A new development control plan to reflect the values the community wants for the area should be the planning instrument underpinning development for this steeply sloping area, of which almost 20 per cent will require more than five-metre-deep cutting and infill earthworks to accommodate the development.

Some years ago, a landslip caused considerable damage to homes in a similarly steep area not far from this site. As a result all manner of insurance issues arose and ratepayers could face a hefty bill in a similar situation. That sort of steep subdivision should never have been allowed and that's why we need not just strong words from our planners but matching actions from state regulators.

The state government should listen closely to what our planners are saying about this and reject it out of hand.

So what happens to the rest of the profits from the not-for-profit clubs? Well, a great deal of it goes on salaries – some chief executives (they are no longer mere club managers) drag in half a million a year. And a lot more goes on self-promotion: last year the Penrith Panthers spent more than \$7 million on advertising its benefits, compared with less than \$3 million donated to the community.

And to put that in perspective, the club's total revenue was more than \$154 million, with nearly

And speaking of insults and its pokies. It is estimated by the Productivity Commission that some 40 per cent of this sum was taken from problem gamblers who make up about 15 per cent of all punters with another 15 percent at risk of going the same way.

The financial and social damage to the community from this one club was therefore immense, far outweighing the amount it returned. So clearly something needs to be done, and the states which, with the honourable exception of Western Australia, now gain a significant proportion of their own revenue from pokie taxes - are not about to do it.

Andrew Wilkie has forced the feds into action, and while his idea of pre-commitment punters having to nominate how much they are prepared to lose and the machines rejecting their ID cards when that amount is reached - is both clumsy and expensive, no-one has come up with a better one.

The ideal would be to follow Tim Freedman's advice and just blow up the pokies; but this is unlikely to happen. An alternative would be to make them less voracious - limits on how much money they would accept in a given period – and also less glamorous and seductive, as is proposed for cigarette packets.

But the clubs will not compromise, or even negotiate. If restrictions are imposed, there will be no more clubs, no more sport, no more kiddies' playgrounds, no more communities. It should be remembered that they said exactly the same things when pokies were allowed in hotels: the clubs were doomed. Last year just 11 NSW clubs took \$438,953,965 from their pokies and returned just \$11,678,358 to the community.



ORGANIC GROWERS PONDER THE FRACKING ISSUE

Contamination from fracking chemicals used during coal-seam gas (CSG) extraction is a major 'A number of Australian Certified Organic [ACO] clients have already been affected by these concern to organic farmers, says Greg Paynter, consultant to Biological Farmers of Australia.

Following the revelations of the recent ABC Four Corners program into the current CSG practices, BFA supports the call for a moratorium on CSG mining until a full investigation has been undertaken.

With the environmental impacts of some mining activities under question, the risks being revealed to primary producers make it an uncertain future for many; however, for organic producers, meeting domestic and international standards brings with it further challenges.

Across Australia mining companies are exploring, drilling, fracking and extracting CSG, and the environmental repercussions of this form of mining are yet to be fully recognised and understood, which makes it particularly difficult in terms of managing risks to organic

'Organic management systems are based upon avoiding use of synthetic chemicals in farming and managing the risk of potential contamination from on and off farm. Mining brings with it many new questions around risk management with the concern that chemicals used in mining have the potential for pollution of land and water,' Mr Paynter said.

types of coal mining operations. Others are currently under threat due to proximity, or the activities have yet to start in their region.

'Concerns held by ACO clients are in relation to the continuance of their organic certification; health of their families and workers; loss of potential markets domestically and also in export markets; and interruption to farming processes due to changes of the farm landscape caused by mining infrastructure."

According to Akiko Nicholls, ACO managing director, if the land is contaminated from the result of CSG, organic certification status may be suspended.

'Producers could face loss of all markets for their produce for three years and even longer if there are ongoing problems with managing the risk and level of contamination,' she said.

Greg Paynter says the BFA is working for the best outcome for organic primary producers.

'We are communicating with growers, grower groups and government to gain an accurate understanding about the extent mining activities are affecting or may affect producers' organic



BUSH FUTURES – URBAN

BUSHLAND RESTORATION

The Tweed Byron Bush Futures Project, funded by a NSW Environmental Trust Urban Sustainability Grant, aims to achieve, through on-ground works and extension, the sustainable management of a number of state and regionally significant urban bushland areas within Tweed and Byron shires.

An audit of 985 ha of urban bushland in Tweed and Byron shires revealed that while many sites are in good condition, all sites are affected by environmental weeds and more than half by dumping and other human incursions

Twenty-three site action plans have been prepared and extensive on-ground restoration works including weed control, rubbish removal, nest box installation, feral animal control and interpretive signage installation are being implemented at 52 sites covering 225 ha. Works are occurring within seven endangered ecological communities, state significant littoral rainforest and wetlands and the habitat for

numerous threatened flora and fauna species.

Community, council staff and councillor engagement programs, awareness-raising events and workshops are being delivered and educational resources developed including a volunteer support training package.

Bluesfest 2011 is here. This year brings a swag of international acts for their debut performance, including Grace Jones, Bob Dylan and Elvis Costello. Everyone has been saying it, but I'll say it again. It's quite possibly the best Bluesfest line up to date, possibly the best festival line up in the country this year. In a climate of music festivals, Bluesfest still retains significant points of difference. This is a festival for a broader demographic. It's not just starry-eyed 20-somethings, it's grandmas, and grandpas, babies, teenagers, the middle-aged, the prematurely aged and the ageing well. It's a festival for serious music lovers who get this rare opportunity once a year to hear the best music from every corner of the planet. Be prepared for a life-changing experience in your collapsible chair and your wellies. Ladies and Gentlemen, open your ears, your eyes and your hearts!

BOB DYLAN

He's the man that everyone is coming to see. Undoubtedly he is the most influential musical figure in contemporary music with a career that spans over half a century. Pultizer prize winning for his profound impact on popular music and American culture, for compositions of extraordinary poetic power. He has toured since the late 1980s on what has been dubbed The Never Ending Tour. Much of his most celebrated work dates from the 1960s when he was an informal chronicler, and an apparently reluctant figurehead, of social unrest, though he is well known for revolutionising perceptions of the limits of popular music in 1965 with the six-minute single Like a Rolling Stone. He's been inducted into the Nashville Hall of Fame. Has a playlist of songs that would possibly take the entire Bluesfest to play and is incidentally one of the most popular trivial pursuit questions: Who is Robert Zimmerman? In his autobiography, Dylan acknowledged that he had been influenced by the poetry of Dylan Thomas. Explaining his change of name in a 2004 interview, Dylan remarked: 'You're born, you know, the wrong names, wrong parents. I mean, that happens. You call yourself what you want to call yourself. This is the land of the free.' Bob Dylan, the early champion of Counterculture finally comes to the town of Byron Bay to perform for the shape-changing namechanging people he first inspired.

















BEN HARPER & RELENTLESS7


ASH GRUNWALD

ever and is responsible for recording some of the finest-ever soul music in the history of New Orelans music, including *Time Is On My Side* which was later recorded by the Rolling Stones and Otis Redding! Celebrating over 50 years as a recording artiste, Irma Thomas has many a story to tell. Those 50 years have not been an easy ride. By the age of 19 she had been married twice and had three children; she endured recording contracts where, frustratingly for fans and Irma alike, her recordings were

Contemporary Blues Album for After The Rain (as well as a Blues Music Award for Soul-Blues Album Of The Year and many other accolades). She has performed with Stevie Wonder, collaborated with Bluesfest favourites Galactic and, in 2009, was inducted into the Louisiana Blues Hall of Fame.
