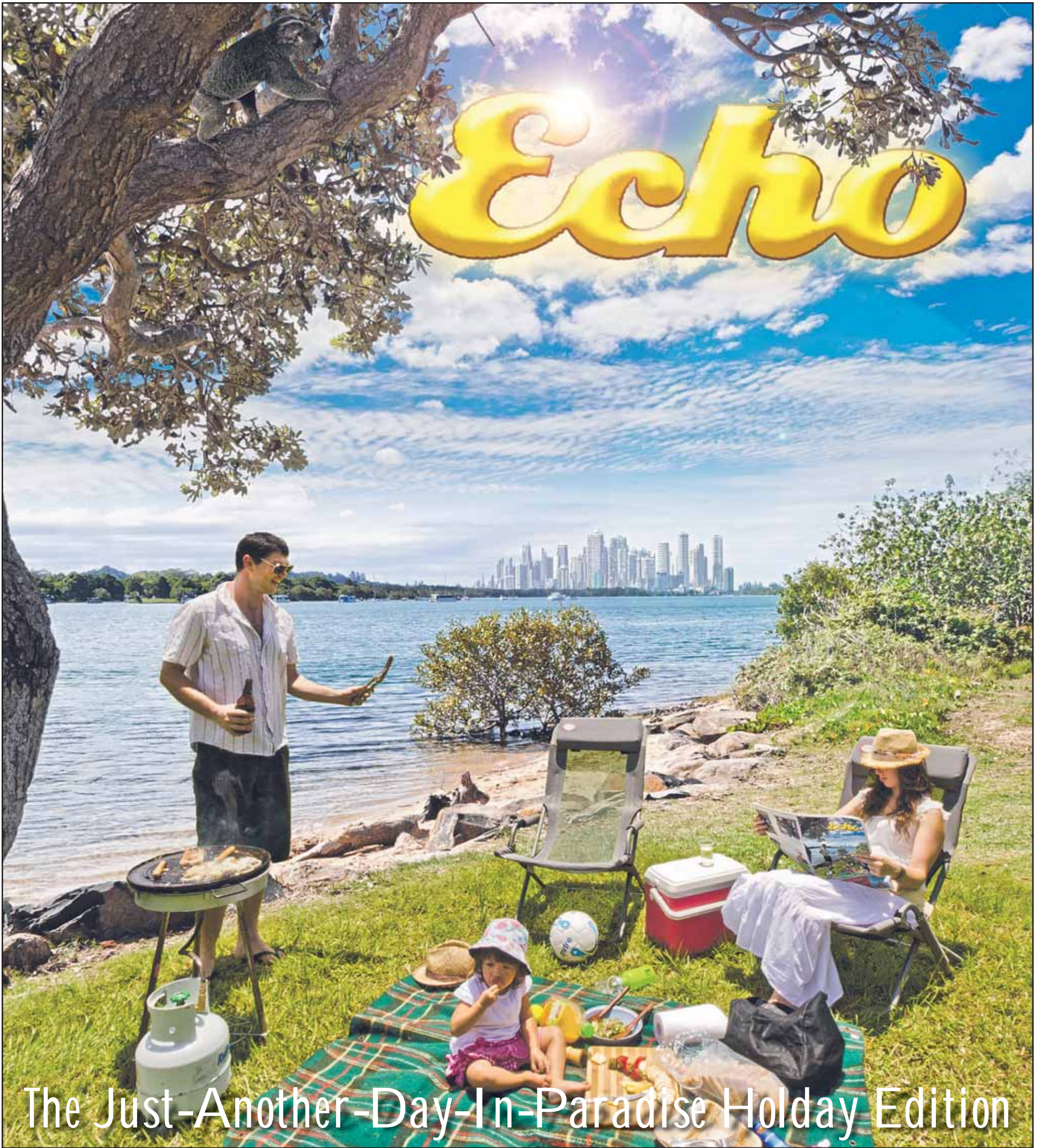

Bid to stop police HQ 'way too late'

The \$15 million upgrade of the Kingscliff police station into a local command centre looks set to go ahead after Tweed Shire Council failed to agree on an alternative site or a further push to stop it being built at Marine Parade.

An extraordinary meeting of council on Monday to stop the bid by police to build their new headquarters in Kingscliff followed a protest days earlier outside the Marine Parade station.

But the meeting, aimed at continuing the push for the NSW police minister to reverse the Joint Regional Planning Panel's (JRPP) recent approval, turned into a fiasco with no clear decision on what to do next, and one councillor saying the bid was all too late.

After nearly two hours of debate, councillors rejected five proposed alternative sites, eventually deciding simply to accept a staff report and hold a workshop in February to try to find a suitable site for an integrated emergency services centre.

Cr Dot Holdom told her colleagues they were 'months too late' to stop the new HQ going ahead in Kingscliff and that 'the horse has bolted'.

'This is like a dog chasing its tail, it is a fait accompli, it's done. If they don't want an integrated

site [with the fire bridge ambulance and SES] we can't make them want one,' Cr Holdom said.

A bid by Cr Warren Polglase and deputy mayor Phil Youngblutt to resurrect the police service's originally preferred site on prime agricultural land at Cudgen, previously knocked back by the former state government, failed by three votes to four, despite gaining support from Cr Kevin Skinner, who vowed he would 'vote for anything that would keep the command centre away from the Kingscliff beachfront'.

Only Cudgen 'ticked all the boxes'

Cr Polglase repeatedly told councillors that any approach to the state government needed to include just one preferred alternative site. He claimed that only the Cudgen site 'ticked all the boxes'.

The Cudgen site was acquired by the Kingscliff Land Company (KLC) in 2004 from former Nationals state MP Don Beck's wife Lynne, a former Tweed mayor, and her sisters for \$4-5 million. The company, whose directors now include Mr Beck, also offered a further \$5 million if it could be rezoned for urban purposes.

Cr Youngblutt said despite

the Cudgen site's status as 'state significant agricultural land', it had not been farmed for 15 years and was 'too small to be viable'.

But Cr Joan van Lieshout, who last week said the push for the Cudgen site appeared to be 'another backdoor bid' by local National Party figures to rezone the state significant farmland, said the future of Tweed agriculture was in small organic farming and the property could soon be viable farmland again.

'The future is locally grown food and that means the survival of our best farmland; all we can hope for is to encourage the minister to think in the long term,' Cr van Lieshout said.

She suggested a council delegation visit the police minister to discuss alternative sites but that strategy was also rejected by four votes to three.

Five potential sites were selected by councillors earlier this month: the Cudgen site, a second site at Cudgen near the Rural Fire Brigade, the Pacific Highway interchange at Cudgera Creek Road, the Clothiers Creek Road interchange and RTA land at Chinderah.

Cr Skinner also proposed a sixth site on RTA land on Sexton Hill at Banora Point during Monday's meeting. He said the flood-prone RTA land at Chin-

derah could be built up along with the roadway to provide an evacuation route for 2,500 people in case of flood. Councillors also voted against that 5-2.

Cr Katie Milne said the police department was unlikely to fund an expensive road-raising scheme to solve Chinderah's flood problem. She urged councillors to look for more potential sites as all five current options were 'less than ideal'.

Mayor Barry Longland's motion that 'council seeks urgent representation through Tweed MP Geoff Provest and directly with the minister for police to discuss alternative sites for the police command headquarters' also failed 5-2.

Marathon debate

After the marathon debate, Cr Holdom's motion to note the staff report and discuss the issue again in February managed to get unanimous support.

Last Saturday's protest meeting was attended by around 50 people.

Tweed Heads Chamber of Commerce president Rory Curtis said Kingscliff's residents enjoyed an idyllic amenity but this would be destroyed by a 24-hour, seven-day-a-week police command centre housing around 108 staff. The centre also was at risk of being cut off from by flooding.

Artspace a first for Kingscliff

Kingscliff artists Lorraine Abernethy and Ian Tremewen are chuffed at achieving one of their longtime dreams to open a new artspace/gallery in their coastal village, the only such one in town.

The couple have called their new 'pop up' venture in the Azure building, opposite the cinema, Artspace K.

The award winning artists and teachers will run small classes and workshops, in a garden setting, in the new studio which doubles as a venue for their artwork as well as their studio space.

'This is becoming the cultural hub of Kingscliff,' Lorraine said.

Both artists are represented

in museums and public galleries in Australia and overseas.

Next year they have been invited to hold a joint exhibition in Hawaii. Ian has just been commissioned to provide the

artwork for the Victoria Maui International Yacht Race, a 2,683 nautical mile race.

'All the artwork is being produced in Kingscliff at our studios and exported to the

United States,' she said.

The gallery is also selling the Tweed River Art Gallery's new t-shirt, which the couple designed, with proceeds going to the Murwillumbah gallery.

Six-year-old girl dies in car accident near Uki

A six-year-old girl died and her grandmother was seriously injured after their car ran off the road near Uki on Monday afternoon.

Police say the 63-year-old Uki woman and her granddaughter were travelling west on the Kyoyle Road at Dum Dum when their vehicle lost control as it approached a left-hand bend and crashed into a tree.

Two cyclists who were riding past stopped to help and managed to free the young girl from the car.

Soon after police and an off-duty nurse arrived on the scene and began CPR on the child.

She was rushed to Tweed Heads Hospital but died. Her grandmother, who had also been trapped in the car, was

airlifted to hospital suffering serious leg injuries.

The woman, well known in the local community, was reported to be in a stable condition yesterday.

Police are appealing for the two cyclists who stopped to help, or anyone who could help the investigation, to contact the Murwillumbah station on 02 6672 9499.

Leda implicated in illegal clearing

Authorities have implicated Bob Ell's Leda Developments Pty Ltd in an alleged case of illegal vegetation clearing within the Cudgen Nature Reserve.

But the billionaire property player claims workmen bulldozed trees and other vegetation along a 300-metre stretch of creek inside the protected area by accident.

NSW environment minister Robyn Parker this week shed light on the ongoing investigation into the unauthorised dredging of Blacks Creek and removal of vegetation along both banks in a letter leaked to *The Echo*.

Ms Parker reveals the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) only learnt about the environmental destruction in a remote part of the reserve after Leda dobed itself in.

She says that Leda 'had contacted the NPWS in July this year to report that accidental vegetation clearing had occurred on the adjoining nature reserve' next to its Kings Forest development.

The agency launched an immediate investigation following an on-site meeting with Mr Ell's right-hand man, Reg van Rij, to inspect the clearing.

Ms Parker says she is concerned by what occurred inside the reserve and both the NPWS and the Department of Public Works were conducting 'extensive investigations', which included 'interviews with various people.'

Hosing down fears

The letter, which attempts to hose down fears that the five-month-old investigation may have stalled, says steps are being taken to rehabilitate the cleared area.

It's the first official confirmation that Leda is the focus of investigations, although Upper House MP, Cate Faehrmann, told Parliament last month the company was under suspicion over what she described as a 'shocking case' of illegal vegetation clearing.

councillor Henry James says the work would improve drainage in the southeast corner of Kings Forest and facilitate development in low-lying areas of the 1100-hectare estate.

He has called for a freeze on further approvals for the 5,000-lot development until the case is finalised, saying that assumptions about drainage and flooding and future maintenance of waterways are critical to the number of lots that can be developed.

Mr James says the letter indicates Leda may rely on a defence mounted by another Queensland developer, Godfrey Mantle, who escaped conviction after denying he ordered a contractor to chop and poison 1,200 trees on his Bilambil Heights estate. (The contractor received a \$135,000 fine and 200 hours of community service.)

But he claims that if the government handles the case competently, the Mantle defence should not work because of provisions of the NPW Act

which did not apply at Bilambil Heights.

He said aerial photographs by nearmap.com indicate the banks of the creek between the estate boundary and its junction with Cudgen Creek were cleared, with work starting in May 2010, 14 months before it was reported.

'Amazing coincidence'

It was 'an amazing coincidence' that Leda dobed itself in just as the work was completed, said Mr James, who was hit with a defamation writ from Leda after raising concerns about the removal of vegetation and the drainage of wetlands on the estate itself five years ago.

The inquiry which led to the council's sacking in 2005 also raised concerns about the council's failure to take steps to stop 'illegal clearing' at Kings Forest, but Leda dismissed the claim as being 'at odds with the facts' in a controversial dossier two months ago.

The NPWS has been silent

over the investigation since media first learnt of it. Leda's regional manager Mr van Rij told *The Echo* it was 'regrettable' the probe has taken so long, but also declined to comment.

In her scathing attack in parliament, Ms Faehrmann said that if guilty, the property mogul should be hit with 'the most severe penalty available' to act as a serious deterrent.

She said Mr Ell and his Leda group had a past history of illegal clearing and used intimidation and bullying tactics against people to get their way.

The MP said a dossier which Leda selectively leaked to the media recently named people it considered hurdles to their two satellite cities planned for Kings Forest and Cobaki Lakes.

The document was given to councillors and government MPs last month following a public outcry after *The Echo* revealed details about the extent of the clearing in one of the shire's few remaining koala sanctuaries.

Sam mourned and celebrated

Hundreds of people packed Lindisfarne Anglican Grammar School at Terranora yesterday (Wednesday) to celebrate the life of 16-year-old Kenyan student Samuel Mwangi Macharia who drowned off Cabarita Beach earlier this month.

Members of Sam's Kenyan family joined his Australian family, the Zietlows, their friends and the local community for the service.

Sam's coach and coordinator of Tweed Council's Kenya Mentoring Program, Olita Ogonjo, also made the special trip to join Sam's Aussie 'dad and mum' Bernie and Sandra Zietlow, and their three sons Ricky, Kurt and Ryan to lay Sam to rest.

Most, if not all, mourners were moved to tears as Bernie, flanked by his family, read the eulogy for 'our Sam, our son and brother, who gave us much more than we could have ever hoped to have given him'.

'When Sam was doing something he loved like swimming, dancing or playing football he just radiated pure joy like a force field around him,' Bernie said.

'Sam had something that is missing in most Australian teenagers today and that is a quiet respect for all adults. This was evident in his politeness and gentle patience, and explains his close relationships with his grandparents, coaches, teachers and mentors.'

He concluded by saying 'We all knew a little boy from Kenya who changed our lives forever and made us better people. Thank you Sammy. We love you.'

Sam, a promising football player, came to Australia as an orphan five years ago under the mentoring program and was billeted by the Zietlows, who were in the process of adopting him when he drowned on Sunday, December 4. He would have turned 17 two days later and was just days

short of his year-10 graduation at Lindisfarne School.

The families have asked people wanting to send flowers to make a donation instead to Sam's legacy. Donations can be made at any Commonwealth Bank or online BSB: 062 580, Account Number: 10231433.

Last Sunday afternoon, around 200 locals held a 'paddle out' in respect for Sam and his foster family.

Paddlers and floaters, helped along by two inflatable rescue boats, formed a circle about 500 metres off the main beach. The stirring ceremony finished with cheering in and out of the water.

Regent Cinema reeling in the years

Murwillumbah's historic Regent Cinema, according to owner Sandra Flannery, has been dragged kicking and screaming into the 21st century, with a new digital projection system replacing its old 35mm projector 'and sadly the projectionist'.

Mrs Flannery, who runs the cinema with daughters Deborah and Erin, told *The Echo* the move into the digital age was necessary 'otherwise the doors would be closed'.

This week the old projector, which had been operating since the cinema opened in the building over 60 years ago, was replaced by the computerised system which allows new movies to be downloaded from distributor companies at the click of a button.

Mrs Flannery said the new system meant the projectionist, who operated the old reels and monitored them during screening, was no longer needed as the cinema's box office ticket sellers could now run the film from a laptop.

'Eventually, films will be downloaded straight from satellite,' she said.

From 2013, film distributors will no longer provide the 35mm reel films.

'It's very simple system to operate and allows easier access to a wider choice of films, especially art-house and special-interest movies as well as mainstream ones. It will also allow live streaming of special events and international film festivals,' Mrs Flannery said.

'It makes for a better, clearer picture and improved, digital sound.'

'We also want to encourage local filmmakers to use the venue to show local movies and for

fundraising events,' she said.

Many towns have lost their iconic cinemas, replaced by large multiplex cinemas, but the Regent has survived through thick and thin and the remnants of the theatre's glory days still remain: interior decorations, wooden floors and art deco façade. The historic building is identified as a significant building in Tweed Shire Council's community-based heritage study.

Iconic fig a shadow of its former self

Chinderah's historic white fig tree in the local tavern carpark has finally been heavily pruned despite a last-minute protest.

The giant fig tree had been under threat since one of its limbs collapsed during bad weather last year.

Last Thursday a chainsaw gang, supervised by the arborist who recommend pruning two-thirds of the tree, got to work and were confronted by Greens Cr Katie Milne, who had led several protests against the pruning in the past six months.

'Safety hazard'

Chinderah Tavern management claimed the tree posed a public safety hazard but Cr Milne and other arborists said the tree was not diseased but burdened by the weight of climbing cactus plants, which put extra strain on the limb, causing it to split and crash down.

Cr Milne confronted Brisbane horticulturalist Marian Hammond during the pruning work last Thursday.

She complained about excessive cutting and alleged improper work health and

safety precautions.

But Ms Hammond dismissed Ms Milne's protests and continued to supervise the removal of what management called 'dangerous' tree limbs on the iconic tree which needed a 'hair cut'.

Local arborist Luke McVeigh said the presence during the work of Cr Milne,

concerned locals and media representatives kept workers from removing an even larger part of the tree's canopy.

President of the Chinderah District Residents Association, Felicia Cecil, said the infestation of cactus and umbrella plants would have been completely removed 'if they were fair-dinkum'.

'Our association applied for the tree to be heritage listed by the Tweed Shire Council in the late 80s or early 90s. We know that it was listed but is no longer heritage listed. We don't know why the listing was removed,' Ms Cecil said.

Cr Milne last week failed to get any support from fellow councillors for an interim heritage protection order for the tree.

Dam spillway to be widened

Councillors have given the green light to the upgrade of the spillway on the Clarrie Hall Dam in order to prevent life and property being lost in a major flood.

The upgrade of the wall, which is now 27 years old, was ordered by the state government following the tightening of safety standards earlier this year.

The spillway will be widened from 22 metres to 35 metres so it can cope better with extreme flood events. There will be no increase in the dam's capacity from the upgrade.

Councillors recently voted against raising the dam wall, leading to the future of the

Tweed water supply potentially becoming the major issue at next year's council election.

There is a danger the work could cause water restrictions across the shire because the dam level may need to be lowered during construction. Tweed residents have not had to endure water restrictions since March 2003, when level-3 restrictions were in force for just one month.

An environmental impact study will not be carried out before the work, which is expected to start during 2013 and take six months. A council report said the reconstruction was not expected to 'impact on the environment, habitat or threatened species' in the Doon Doon Valley to an 'unacceptable level'.

The report warns there will be noise and dust during construction and about 60 light vehicle movements per day and a total of 340 heavy vehicle journeys.

The nearby picnic ground will be closed to the public during construction. There may also be a reduction in water quality for some distance downstream at times.

Council's water manager David Oxenham said a study had found there would be no cost saving by combining the spillway project with construction of a higher dam wall.

'It's more cost effective to do the spillway upgrade now,' said Mr Oxenham.

'There would be no saving at all by combining these projects.'

Poultry farm ordered to shut down

An unauthorised 2,000-hen poultry farm which sparked numerous complaints from neighbouring landowners at Cudgen has been ordered to shut down by the NSW Land and Environment Court.

In August, Tweed Shire Council voted to shut down egg farmer Dean Sikiric's operation after he constructed two huge sheds on his property without lodging a development application. Mr Sikiric

had plans to increase his flock of fowl to 12,000, just before council mounted the court action.

The court has ordered Mr Sikiric to remove the birds by the end of this month and sheds by the end of next month and pay council's legal and court costs.

Neighbours had complained about continuous pollution, noise and foul odours. They also said the operation was polluting nearby waterways, with dead birds reportedly scattered

around the property and red sludge found in a nearby dam.

A council report at the time said the Mr Sikiric did not live on the property and 'does not have to endure the daily impacts' of the pollution which neighbours must endure 'all day, every day'.

Council staff said they warned Mr Sikiric face to face and over the phone that council approval would be needed to set up the poultry farm, but he ignored them and built the two large sheds.

Team Julia squares up to the new year

Commentary on Julia Gillard's ministerial reshuffle has tended to concentrate on the negatives - not just from the Nomadic Noman, Tony Abbott, but from more serious pundits as well.

And it is true that in the short term - from here to the next Newspoll, which is the attention span of most media these days - there is not too much to commend it.

Gillard's apparent inability to sack or demote senior ministers has meant that her cabinet has now increased to an unwieldy 22; even in his misguided democratic heyday Gough Whitlam only had five more, and that was clearly unmanageable.

Gillard will be faced with a similar problem and will inevitably have to break another pre-election promise by setting up her own version of Kevin Rudd's kitchen cabinet, an inner group which will make the key decisions and then take them to the full cabinet (or not, as the circumstances dictate) before submitting them to the wider ministry and finally to caucus for endorsement. This can only exacerbate the bitterness the reshuffle has already set festering.

Robert McClelland and Peter Garrett have both remained in cabinet and therefore taken the loss of their effective demotions with good grace, at least so far, as has Chris Evans who could not be pushed out because he remains the elected leader of the government in the senate.

However Kim Carr, who was banished to the outer ministry, now reduced to a mere eight against the inner's 22, has made his unhappiness public.

He has a case; from the public point of view he has done very well, restraining his own protectionist instincts and treading a clever and effective line through the maze of Australia's mendicant manufacturers. The

spin from Gillard's camp is that he was suspected of leaking from Cabinet to boost his case with caucus and was also guilty of cosying up to Kevin Rudd; but even if these charges were true, they could have been dealt with by less drastic measures.

His demotion looks especially bad when contrasted with the survival of Joe Ludwig, a clear failure in his portfolio but apparently a protected species because of his factional warlord

man who knifed the leader he helped to install for personal advantage and crippled his party in the process. Making him assistant treasurer is, to put it mildly, not a good look.

Okay, that is the less than celebratory atmosphere in which Julia Gillard retires to enjoy her Christmas break.

But looking and moving forward, something of which she has always been fond, there are quite a few positives - or at least

father. Much has also been written about the promotion of Gillard's own supporters, but this is hardly an unusual move; there is no prime minister in history who has not given his (now her) own team a bit of a leg up.

Certainly it is hard to argue that Bill Shorten's rise is not based at least as much on talent as on loyalty; it would have been both unjust and foolish not to have promoted him.

And two of Gillard's so-called faceless men, David Feeney and Don Farrell, continue to languish unnoticed and unmourned in the pool of parliamentary secretaries.

But Mark Arbib, the minister for sport who has retained that portfolio (according to the prime minister, because he wants to go to the London Olympics next year - is she serious?) is another matter.

Graham Richardson claims Arbib is actually a serious and skilful administrator, and for all I know he is right. But to the voters, Arbib remains anathema: the archetypal sleazebag of the New South Wales Right, a ruthless and cynical numbers

man who knifed the leader he helped to install for personal advantage and crippled his party in the process. Making him assistant treasurer is, to put it mildly, not a good look.

there might be, if only the government can find some way to avoid stuffing them up. Gillard has, at last, got the beginnings of a program of her own, and potentially the team she wants to put it into play.

Probably the single unequivocally successful initiative of the last term was a universal disabilities scheme. Bill Shorten, who had the initial carriage of it, is now in cabinet with another portfolio but the experienced and reliable Jenny Macklin, a Gillard loyalist, has taken over the responsibility.

Gillard herself has retained overall control of mental health reform, but has drafted another useful newcomer to cabinet, Mark Butler, as her assistant. Tanya Plibersek, yet another success story in the making, takes charge of the vital health scheme in place, a long-overdue reform which would be a huge vote winner.

And Garrett, while retaining control of schools, will have the cool-headed Brendan O'Connor looking over his

shoulder when the vital question of a new funding system comes up for consideration.

This is an agenda which concentrates on Labor's traditional strengths in health and education and puts many of its best and brightest to work on implementing popular and saleable reforms.

In other more troublesome areas Stephen Conroy in Communications, Chris Bowen in Immigration, Anthony Albanese in Transport and Infrastructure, Tony Burke in Water and Sustainability, Craig Emerson in Trade, Greg Combet in Climate Change, Martin Ferguson in Resources and Energy and Simon Crean in Regional Australia are joined by Shorten in Industrial Relations and Superannuation. Person for person it's not a bad team; certainly it's a clear class or two above Tony Abbott's ragtag mob of zealots, ratbags, has-beens and never-will-bes.

But: it also has Kevin Rudd, probably the smartest of them all and certainly potentially the most dangerous.

If he can be kept in check and Abbott remains leader of the opposition, there is still some chance of a comeback. If not ... well, according to the Mayan calendar, the world is going to end next year anyway.

Indeed, it might well end sooner than the prediction; if the arse really falls out of Europe there won't be much for Gillard's ministers to do except cling to the wreckage, and they'll be the lucky ones.

As for the rest of us ... no, that's not a thought to nurse through the festive season.

And on that note, good wishes and good luck. And, of course, bah humbug.

At the last council meeting no other councillor was willing make a request to the NSW planning department for a two-month extension or improved consultation for the community for Stage 1 of Kings Forest. This is the stage when much of the damage will be done with earthworks approvals across the whole site, and with these first subdivisions being in the sensitive areas of the eastern edges, previously deemed by numerous independent ecologists and even Tweed councillors as the minimum areas required to maintain biodiversity and koala habitat, along with Cudgen paddock to the south.

No other councillor supported an Interim Heritage Protection Order for the Chinderah fig tree, despite a new peer review again seriously disputing the findings of the Chinderah Tavern's new report on the tree that recommended a reduction by at least two thirds.

The Community Heritage Study was also on the agenda to go out on exhibition but councillors refused to include the Chinderah fig in this process either, despite clear heritage significance established last year. Councillors also refused to give consideration for a call out for the community to nominate any other veteran trees in this heritage process.

Call to keep Tweed accessible to all

Two Tweed residents with a disability have called for an urgent access and inclusion strategy to cope with an increasing population.

Ben Dierikx, a Pottsville resident with impaired vision, and student Kristian Keogh, who can often be seen driving around Murwillumbah in his motorised wheelchair, believe Tweed Shire is relatively easy to get around, compared to other places they have experienced.

But they say it might not stay that way with the continuing rapid boost in the shire's population.

The two locals have welcomed Tweed Shire Council's initiative to create an access and inclusion strategy and are urging others to provide feedback.

'It's vital that people with a disability, their family members and carers provide input to the creation of this strategy,' Ben said.

'These people have to deal with issues of access and inclusion every day and often give a lot of thought to ways to overcome any difficulties.'

Council is running a com-

munity engagement campaign until mid February, encouraging public input through online forums and a questionnaire on its consultation website at www.yoursaytweed.com.au/disabilityaccess.

Kristian, who recently completed year 10 at Murwillumbah High School, said the online op-

tions were an great way to encourage input from the public 'particularly for people who had difficulty getting around.'

Ben has progressively suffered vision loss after contracting a parasite while working as a tour guide in Asia nearly 20 years ago.

He said his biggest access

problems since returning to the Tweed included getting his assistance dog, Kane, into public transport, cafes and restaurants.

Extra help for teenage school-goers

Richmond MP Justine Elliot has announced around 5,500 local families may benefit, if their teenager stays in school, from an increase in family payments.

From January 1, Family Tax Benefit Part A will increase for families with teenagers aged 16 to 19 years who are still in full-time secondary school or equivalent vocational training - this means families may receive a total up to \$214 a fortnight for each teenager still in full-time secondary study.

'All the evidence shows that young people who finish their education or get a trade are better off,' said Mrs Elliot.

'We want to encourage local teenagers to return to school next year, or get school-based apprenticeships if that's what they want to do, because we know it will open doors and give them a big leg up in life.'

'This will be a big help to those families under financial pressure, who are finding it hard to support older teenagers to stay at school or in training.'

Families receiving Family Tax Benefit Part A for children aged 16 to 19 years in full-time secondary study will have their entitlements automatically adjusted from January 1 if they are entitled to the higher rate.

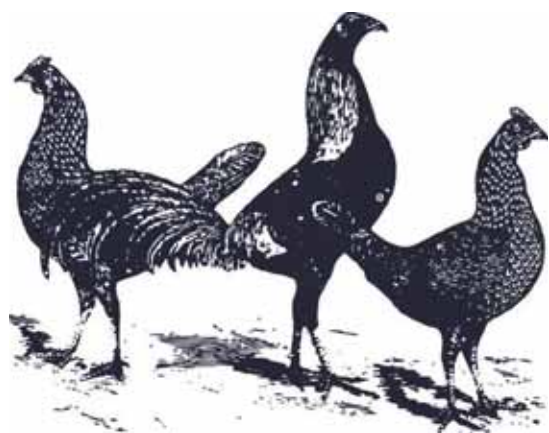

The Band Of Frequencies

Australian touring band **The Band Of Frequencies** have been making waves in America and are set to return to Australia in December to launch their EP *All I've Found*.

Band Of Frequencies recently joined the non-profit organisation Surfers for Cetaceans in USA on an ocean awareness campaign called *Transparentsea Voyage* travelling from Santa Barbara to San Diego in ocean kayaks to raise awareness about dozens of local coastal environmental issues on the Californian Coast. The Voyage and music was a huge success. Band Of Frequencies were the backbone of a new concept in music publishing by creating the *song a day* idea and releasing 23 new songs in 23 days with dozens of music collaborations with such artists as Angus Stone, Will Conner and Catherine Clark. Those songs were recorded each night and inspired by the environmental issues of the local area they were in, or the events surrounding that day at sea. After a brief visit to New York City to meet up with co-producers and musicians as well as take part in and see firsthand the *Occupy Wall Street (OWS)* protests the bands final stop was Hawaii. Performing several surfing-related events as part of the

Surfing and the Band Of Frequencies is a familiar connection. I FART IN YOUR GENERAL DIRECTION

The average human being farts 16 times a day, releasing an amazing half a litre of fart gas over a 24-hour period. 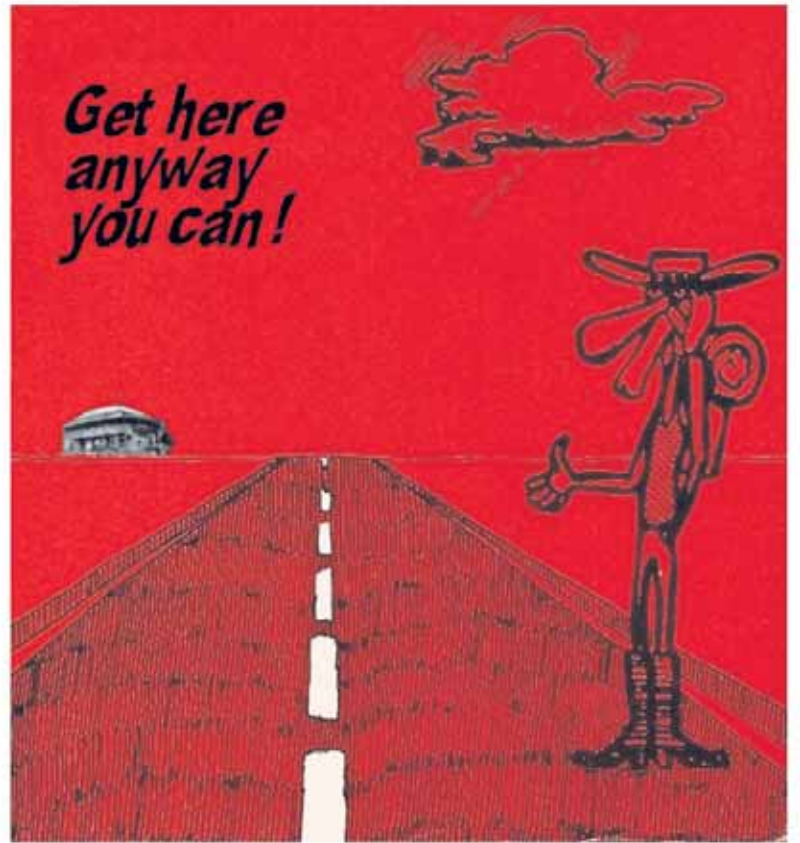

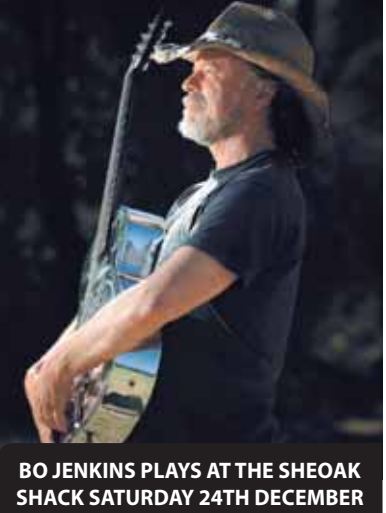

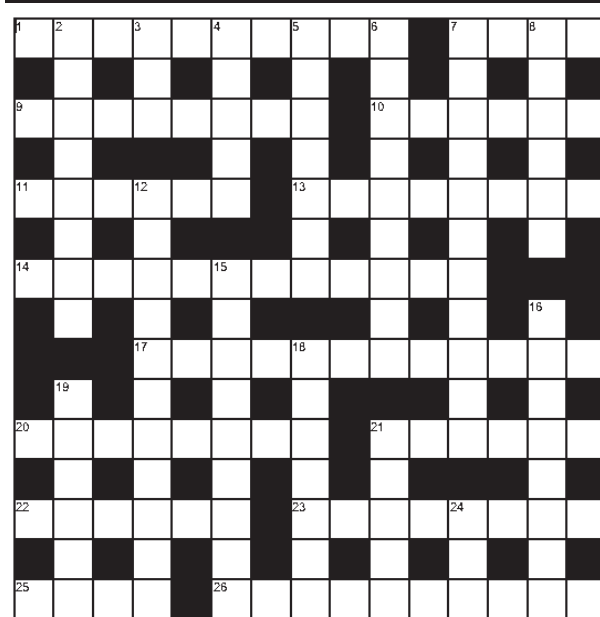

When Yi Liu won the 2010 Queensland Championship at the age of 13 there was little fanfare. The youngster had topped a modest field, and in 2011 Liu could only manage third place.

However, this week's win by Liu of the Australian Junior Masters tournament in Adelaide shows that the 14-year-old has improved dramatically over the past 12 months.

Seeded sixth in an exclusive field of 10 of Australia's best players aged under 20 (including top seed IM Andrew Brown of Canberra), Liu completed the nine round tournament undefeated, winning four of his five games with the black pieces.

Liu's never-say-die attitude saw him save one or two games that could safely have been resigned.

For example, in the top diagram Liu (White) is in desperate trouble against local hope Fedja Zulfic in a crucial seventh round game. Zulfic played 42...g4? but after 43.hxg4 fxg4 44.Kf2 Kd3 45.Kf1 Ke4 46.Ke2 Kf4 47.Kf2 Black could make no progress. The game finished 47...g3+ 48.Kg1 Kg4 49.Kh1 h3 50.Kg1! Kh4 51.Kh1 Kg4 52.Kg1 h2+ 53.Kh1 Kf5 Draw. However, had Zulfic played 42...f4! 43.Kf2 f3!

44.gxf3+ Kf4 45.Kg2 Ke3 then Black would have won the game and most likely the tournament.

Coincidentally, one day earlier, World Champion Viswanathan Anand had won a game with exactly this technique at the London Classic; had Zulfic known about this game he could have won without effort. In the bottom diagram, Anand is Black against Nigel Short and he finished the game by playing 60...f3+! 61.gxf3+ Kf4 62.Kf2 f6! and Short resigned.

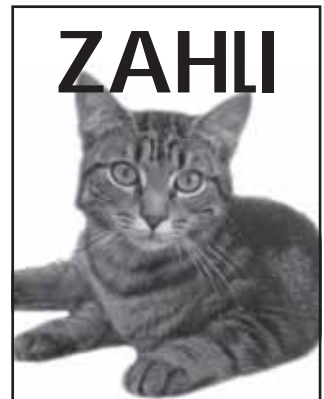

Have your say on strata and community title laws

The NSW minister for fair trading Anthony Roberts has announced a three-month online consultation project on strata and community title scheme issues to be hosted by public policy thinktank Global Access Partners (GAP).

Mr Roberts said the NSW government welcomed the GAP initiative, which will provide a valuable source of information for the government's planned review of strata and community title laws in 2012.

'2011 marks the 50th anniversary of the world's first strata title law, which commenced right here in NSW on 1 July 1961,' Minister Roberts said. 'In 1989, NSW was again a world leader when it introduced laws enabling the development of community schemes, which allow for multiple dwellings on one piece of land.'

Minister Roberts said original strata and community title laws had been copied and improved

around Australia and the world. 'Regrettably, NSW laws have not kept pace with the issues facing strata and community scheme residents,' he said.

'The laws are outdated and no longer effectively support owners in the day to day management of their scheme or address the issues associated with ageing buildings, changing demographics and accountability for annual budgets that can amount to millions of dollars.'

'Since the first strata scheme was registered, strata has developed into the fastest growing form of residential property ownership.'

'More than two million people now live in over 70,000 strata and 1500 community schemes in NSW. Within 20 years, half the state's population is expected to be living in strata and community schemes.'

Mr Roberts said the current laws were designed primarily



for small, self-managed blocks of flats.

'Strata and community schemes now include city high rises, townhouses, dual occupancies, offices, retirement villages and mixed-use, recreational and Tourism-focused developments,' he said.

'There is a general view in the community and it is one accepted by the government that the laws need to be reformed to more effectively meet the diverse needs of today's owners and residents.'

'The GAP consultation will

give all strata and community scheme stakeholders an opportunity to share their experiences, raise specific issues or concerns and suggest possible solutions in advance of the formal review of the legislation next year.'

The online consultation period will run until 29 February 2012.
