

'When we launched the Smoking in Movies campaign in March we were taken aback by the number of vouth who said they were angry when they realised they were prey to this form of tobacco marketing,' said Diana Fisher from the Cancer Council's Far North Coast regional office.

'More than 1500 young people from around NSW voted in the campaign's survey, naming Catherine Zeta-Jones and Bridget Jones' Diary as the worst offenders for promoting smoking in movies. Around 160 young people also indicated they were keen to work with the Cancer Council to reduce the impact of tobacco on

In March, the Cancer Council launched a cinema ad to be shown immediately before movies that have inappropriate levels of smoking. According to the Cancer Council, studies have found that screening an ad in this way encourages young people to question and challenge the smoking they see in the following movie. Byron Cinemas screened the advertisement and have supported awareness raising campaigns by the Cancer Council.

'There is a large body of evidence showing that movies are a key influencer for young people's decision to start smoking. That's why in the past tobacco companies have paid so much for product placement,' said Diana.







Density intensity

Anyone with a good memory or an interest in local planning matters will know that Byron Shire Council has been wrestling to update Byron Bay's development regulations for at least the past five years.

After a marathon Council meeting, or two, Councillors finally agreed last week on a new development formula for the town which will go on public exhibition in the near future. The draft Local Environment Plan (LEP) clears the way for a new residential subdivision at Belongil Fields, seeks to protect the town's older houses through Heritage Conservation Areas, and aims to increase the stock of affordable housing by allowing garden flats in all urban residential zones.

During the many phases of this tortuous process when the community was consulted, a desire for the town to remain relatively low density emerged as a popular and recurring theme. High-rises are not on the drawing board for Byron Bay, indeed the three storey limit in the town centre and two storeys in residential areas remains. Medium density developments or units have been discouraged (by increasing the required lot size) in most residential areas, but are still allowed in the Shelley Drive and Cooper Street precincts, close to the beach and in the centre of town. The rules concerning dual occupancies remain unchanged.

All trace of that thorniest of issues, holiday letting, was erased from the new LEP, but for more on that see the news pages.

One of the most significant changes is the identification of 40 hectares centreing on Belongil Fields as a future urban development site. While much of the land is environmentally constrained and parts will be dedicated for public open space, the LEP lists manufactured home estates, Department of Housing accommodation, residential units, and shops among the permitted development options.

The significance of Byron Bay's older houses has been recognised through three Heritage Conservation Areas which will require homeowners to seek Council assessment of their property before development or demolition. Preservation of the character of Carlyle, Kingsley and Ruskin Streets, Burns and Wentworth Streets and parts of Shirley Street should be the result of this new planning initiative, which started as an idea from several heritage-minded individuals in the community.

An admirable but ambitious plan to require all new developments larger than five lots to dedicate 20% of the homes to affordable housing fell at the finishing post. Councillors asked for more research on a move which, while providing cheaper accommodation for lower paid residents, would undoubtedly attract an outcry from many developers. A consolation for affordable housing lobbyists was the introduction of small (60 square metres) garden flats, which will be permitted throughout the town's residential areas, regardless of

While Council steered away from any Gold Coast style scenarios, the cumulative effect of the future development model are likely to provide a recipe for greater road congestion and put car parking spaces on the endangered species list.







Pubs and clubs start to kick the smoking habit

The recent introduction of compulsory smoke free areas in pubs and clubs across mixed response. State government legislation has limited smoking in pubs and clubs to part of a progressive move to areas of licensed venues by July 2007.

NSW is not alone in taking steps to ban smoking in licensed venues. Since March 2004, Ireland, Norway, New Zealand, Sweden, Scotland and Italy have all passed smoke-free legislation.

According to Anne Jones, club. chief executive of Action on Smoking and Health Australia (ASH), the move is a positive one, especially for employees working in bars high levels of passive smoke.

Safety legislation is clear in its duty of care for workplaces to be safe for employees,' said Ms Jones. 'It is well docu-



A STRONGER AUSTRALIA

Australians working together have helped to build a stronger economy and we have all benefited as a community.

Since 1996 real wages have increased by 14.7% and well over 1,600,000 new jobs have been created as the economy has grown and businesses - small, medium and large - have employed more staff.

That's why we can't stand still. If we want Australian workers and their families to continue to enjoy the benefits of low unemployment, jobs growth, higher wages, low inflation and low interest rates - more needs to be done to keep the benefits flowing.

SENSIBLE AND FAIR CHANGES

It is important that you know what is, and isn't, being proposed and why.

In 1996 when changes were made to workplace relations some people expressed concern. Others tried to exploit those concerns. But the results speak for themselves. Australians clearly benefited with more jobs, higher wages and a stronger economy.

OUR PLAN TO SAFEGUARD WAGES AND CONDITIONS

• The Australian Government will protect the rights and conditions of Australian workers by legislation. Protected conditions include: 4 weeks annual leave, personal/carers leave, parental leave (including maternity leave), and a maximum number of 38 ordinary working hours per week.

KEY POINTS OF OUR PLAN

We are committed to continuing Australia's prosperity; to keep the strong economic benefits flowing to workers and their families; and to secure Australia's future.

- ✓ New safeguards for wages and conditions guaranteed by Federal legislation.
- ✓ Encourage a cooperative approach in the workplace.
- ✓ Simpler, fairer and more flexible workplace agreements.
- ✓ Safeguard workers with a modern award system.
- ✔ Protect workers against unlawful dismissal.
- ✔ Preserve the right of workers to have a union negotiate a collective agreement if they wish.
- ✓ One set of national laws to cover workplace relations.

WHAT WE WON'T DO

- **★ WE WON'T** cut 4 weeks annual leave **★ WE WON'T** remove the right to join a union
- **★ WE WON'T** cut award wages
- **★ WE WON'T** take away the right to strike
- **★ WE WON'T** abolish awards
- **★** WE WON'T outlaw union agreements
- Wage rates previously contained within awards will be set by the Australian Fair Pay Commission. These will not fall below the 2005 Safety Net Review decision and can be increased by the independent Commission. Awards will not be abolished.
- The Australian Government will continue to protect workers with a fair and sustainable safety net of wages and conditions. A new body - the Australian Fair Pay Commission - will set a single adult minimum wage on a periodic basis. It will also adjust minimum junior, training and disability wages, wage rates previously contained within awards and casual loadings.

OUR PLAN TO SAFEGUARD WORKERS WITH A MODERN AWARD SYSTEM

Awards will not be abolished. They will be updated so they continue to provide modern terms and conditions for those workers who choose not to have a workplace agreement.

OUR PLAN TO PROTECT AGAINST UNLAWFUL DISMISSAL

Workers will continue to be protected from unlawful termination, including dismissal on discriminatory grounds such as:

- family responsibilities,
- · pregnancy,
- · race and gender,
- · union membership,
- political affiliations.

It will also remain unlawful for workers to be forced to sign an Australian Workplace Agreement (AWA) or be sacked for refusing to sign an AWA.

Government's plan includes assistance to workers who have been unlawfully dismissed.

Laws introduced in 1993 which govern some aspects of unfair dismissal have not worked. They have cost jobs and continue to make employers reluctant to take on more workers. For this reason, businesses in the federal system with up to 100 employees will be exempted from those provisions to generate more jobs in small and medium businesses, the engine room of the Australian economy.

OUR PLAN FOR A SIMPLER AND EASIER PROCESS

The Government's plan is designed to make it simpler and easier for workers and employers to agree on working conditions.

Workers on AWAs currently earn 13% more than workers on certified agreements, and 100% more than workers on award rates.

All agreements will be required by law to meet the new test set out by the Australian Fair Pay and Conditions Standard.

THE AUSTRALIAN FAIR PAY AND CONDITIONS STANDARD

This new Standard will be the test for all agreements.

- It will safeguard workers rights and conditions.
- It will be based on minimum and award wages, as set by the Australian Fair Pay Commission, and the guaranteed minimum conditions of employment as set out in legislation.
- Workers and employers will be able to compare any proposed agreement against this new Standard.

THE AUSTRALIAN **INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS COMMISSION**

To keep pace with our modern economy, the Australian Industrial Relations Commission will focus on dispute resolution and further simplification of awards.

A NATIONAL SYSTEM

Australia currently has six different workplace relations systems. Forcing employees and employers to work with this complexity is something we can no longer afford to do. Australia only needs one set of national laws to cover workplace relations.

OUR PLAN FOR SECURING AUSTRALIA'S FUTURE

By working together we will create more jobs, with higher wages in a stronger economy and secure the future for Australian workers and their families.

Acts of terrorism invite inappropriate media induced gawking. It just seems entirely distasteful. The ticker continues under the program updating number of deaths, attempting to communicate that this is up to the minute information. I watched some coverage this morning and had to check that it wasn't a CNNNN send up. They were interviewing some bloke from the Melbourne Train Union about the possibility of it happening here. Next, they

tried to get Peter Beattie on the line about some incident at Roma Street's Police Headquarters. We crossed back to London where some poor chap with a bandage around his head was harangued about his grisly experience. Attacked first by terrorists, and then the media. It was such a beat up. An obvious media ploy to fill the time slot and up the ratings. Next we cross to the airport where journalists are waiting for the first flight from London to touch down. Brilliant questions to jet lagged tourists like: 'So when did you find out... how did you react?' What are they supposed to say? 'I was shocked but the lebbo guy up the back of the plane smoking blonde hash seemed pretty chuffed'. In this so called 'War against Terror' the media might as well enlist themselves as Al Qaeda operatives because their sensationalist coverage fosters a culture of fear more damaging than any bomb blast. How about a War against Media instead?

→'It's been a massive task to change La La Land from a restaurant into a club,' explained Luke, a founding partner. 'This was always the direction we wanted to go in, but it's taken five years... four and a half years longer than we thought it would!' Luke's known partners Keri and Peter Raff for nearly 20 years, since meeting on a dancefloor in Melbourne. They now combine their club interests, talents and friendship. Luke and Keri opened La La Land five years ago, but Keri's been splitting his time with La La Land in Melbourne and Baja in Kerra. Peter Raff had helped establish Baja and brings his Kiss FM credentials, OneLove connections and years of Melbourne club-running to join the party of partners. 'We're each good at different things,' admitted Keri. 'My thing is more behind the scenes, Luke's into the legal-side and Peter does the entertainment... and this place is now definitely entertainment driven.

→ Peter's plan is 'lots of house music...
rock-house'. He's aiming for a mix of rock,
electro and deep edged house, with possibly

some midweek funky breaks from DJs who happen to be in town. At this stage, the mix of Byron and Gold Coast residents include Rock Hardson and Willjay, Tone Broker, Movin Marty and Giv... and Peter predicts regular visits from Melbourne OneLove DJs. Asked to compare OneLove with Byron's La La Land, Peter reckoned that although OneLove plays a similar style of house music, it's quite a different space. 'This is more bar-club than pure-club. It has a warm, comfy feel and a relaxed environment. OneLove is fifteen hundred people each Saturday. It's quiet different, but a lot of the music crosses over.

→ 'He believes there's an audience crossover too. 'La La Land has always been popular with visitors from Melbourne. We're bringing a touch of city to Byron... and people who've moved here in the last few years have probably been looking for a place to hang out, especially after midnight, that's more mature. I think people here are into their music and they appreciate quality.'

→ Luke adds that La La Land has enjoyed a strong Byron following for five years; he'd like to thank locals and he hopes that the next five will be even better. 'Hopefully as an intimate lounge bar-club, we'll attract a respectful crowd.' The guests at last week's opening may not appreciate the incredible amount of work involved in creating the new club in Byron, but they certainly seemed to relish the results.

Khyentse Norbu's first feature, The Cup, was a rough diamond. This is more polished and ambitious, but with a similar theme. Dondup, a government official in a village in Bhutan, is a cool dude who can't wait to migrate to America. A monk whom he meets on the road tells him the tale, more Zola than Siddhartha, of Tashi, a ne'er-do-well farmer's son who is lost in the woods and comes upon the house of an old man and his beautiful young wife, Deki. The narrative flows from the real to the allegorical, with gentle humour, simmering tension, and a scene of breathless eroticism, before Tashi and Deki fall victim to their crippling desire. A film that celebrates the natural world through the magnificent landscape of Bhutan and the myriad sounds of water, wind, birdsong and all manner of bangings, clangings and rustlings. Unhurried, enriching and a welcome respite from super-heroes and the Hollywood blueprint.

In it, and unbeknown to the TV producers, the new Samantha would be a real witch who falls in love with the leading man. But the script is undeveloped and the result is disjointed. Nicole Kidman, inexplicably, plays Samantha as a pre-feminism dill and, as the actor who will be the new Darren, Will Ferrell monsters the movie with an awful performance as an unlikeable character. Michael Caine swans in and out for his bagful of easy money and Shirley Maclaine looks every bit the superannuated mother witch in off-therack coven-wear. There are some laughs along the way (three from memory) and effective inserts from the likes of Talking Heads, The Who and REM, but the spell does not work. And, in any case, Jeannie was always sexier and funnier.

Batman Begins explores the origins of the myth. Christian Bale stars as millionaire orphan Bruce Wayne. Styling himself as "something elemental, something terrifying" Wayne uses his company's cutting edge technology to fashion a fearsome masked vigilante. Fear is the film's theme: confronting it, conquering it and using it. It is Batman's greatest weapon. Memento director Christopher Nolan has smartly stocked his picture with excellent, established actors: Michael Caine as Wavne's wise butler Alfred, Morgan Freeman as his business ally Lucius Fox and Gary Oldman as Batman's weary friend Detective Gordon. Director Nolan takes the material seriously, nailing the emotion in the story of a damaged child who grows up to work out his demons through violent retribution. Bale plays Wayne as a wounded, determined human and Batman as a raging, relentless beast. This is easily the most engrossing and faithful screen adaptation of the Batman story. It is also the most intelligent and entertaining.











The unbearable sadness of bananas


There is something about bananas which inspires within me pity - I feel sorry for them, and I'm not quite sure why. Is it their shape, their rich source of material for jokes or slapstick, their lack of glamour? Peaches, strawberries and melons possess distinct sex appeal but a banana even sounds funny.

Yet there it is, a tropical fruit in its own protective sheath to peel away and expose a flesh both creamy and subtly sweet, an excellent provider of Vitamin B6 and potassium, a portable source of immediate energy. Nothing sad about any of that. And while it may be one of my least favourite fruits, its resources are many. Bananas, like carrots and potatoes, are cheap all the year round: basic, earthy staples, filling and faintly stodgy. Yet metamorphosed into other forms they have their chance to shine. Bananas folded into sweet batters ensure a beautiful moistness for days: this is probably best illustrated with Banana Bread. A popular breakfast item in cafes, the best I ever ate was made by Swell Cafe at Bronte Beach in Sydney where I sat facing a wild and wintry ocean, soothed and warmed by mouthfuls of eggy, light and Iuscious Banana Bread. My own recipe is gorgeous too for its inclusion of cinnamon and sultanas and a crunchy almost-streusel topping of almonds and brown sugar. Banana cakes could be the backbone of CWA bake-a-thons and community stalls, and because bananas couple so handsomely with many other fruits they are ideal for muffins. Their ease of preparation further endears me to them: all you need to do is mash. I love mashing up a large ripe banana into a basic lemon cheesecake mixture, then adorning the baked result with a glaze of sliced kiwifruit. There used to be a pizzeria in south Sydney called The Tower of Pizza whose most popular type contained banana : amazingly it worked with the cheese, the green capsicum and the tomato sauce. Banana and bacon pair successfully. There is a fairly famous tart called a Banoffee Pie, a decadent creation consisting of a creamy condensed milk toffee-style filling in a pastry crust and a topping of concentrically arranged banana slices and whipped cream; the fact that this is an American invention should come as no surprise

Below is the recipe for my Banana & Almond Bread, a lovely way to ease into winter mornings with a mug of good coffee. I like to slice the bread quite thickly once it has cooled then freeze it in lots of two - once thawed, it toasts like a dream.

BANANA & ALMOND BREAD

Mix together 375 mls sour cream and 1 tspn bicarb soda and set aside for 5 minutes. Melt 125 gr. butter and add it to the sour cream together with 250 gr. sugar and 2 eggs. Mix thoroughly, then whisk in 220 gr. plain flour, 1 tspn baking powder and 2 tspns cinnamon. Mash 2 bananas and fold them into the mixture with 60 gr. sultanas. Pour the mixture into a lined loaf tin and sprinkle over the top 30 gr. chopped almond kernels and 55 gr. brown sugar. Bake at 180°C for

CHESS by Ian Rogers

After going within half a point of a grandmaster result representing Australia at the 2004 Chess Olympiad in Mallorca, Zhao Zong Yuan (pictured right) appeared to go into hibernation.

The Coffs Harbour teenager was working so hard on his university studies in Sydney that he missed the Australian Open, the Oceania Zonal and the Doeberl Cup. Zhao continued to enjoy success at his local club in Sydney, St George, but it was only this week, during the university holidays, that he began playing seriously again.

International Master Zhao was top seed at the just concluded Australian Young Masters tournament in Sydnev but he dominated the event to such an extent that he is likely to be ranked third in Australia when the next FIDE world ratings are published.

Zhao was in stunning form, as the finish from his first round game shows. From the diagrammed position, Zhao, playing White against Kevin O'Chee, launched an unexpected mating attack on the queen's wing with:

19-year-old Zhao attributes his success in Australia's premier round-robin junior tournament to his lay-off from the game. 'I feel quite enthusiastic now and I am not so worried about the result. I haven't played this well for quite a long time.'

As soon as the Young ters concluded Zhao travelled to Adelaide for the University Open - www.unichess.org. If Zhao's current run of form continues, another tournament victory - as well as a place in the Australian team for the 2006 Turin Chess Olympiad – seem assured.


