



Business booming on North Coast says survey

Some negative myths regarding business growth on the north coast have been dispelled by the findings of a new survey by accountancy firm WHK Rutherfords.

'This is the first survey of its kind to look at how business in the Northern Rivers and the North Coast is faring, both according to itself and in comparison to business nationally,' said Graham Correy, Management Consultant with Rutherfords.

Despite claims by business people in recent times that trade has slumped, the study shows that the opposite is true and over half of those surveyed say they have experienced sales increases in the past year.

The survey reveals that 56% of businesses have increased sales by more than 10% in the last 12 months and 75% of businesses are confident about their prospects for the forthcoming 12 months.

'This is well above the national average and also above results from similar studies conducted in the metropolitan areas. The Byron Shire showed the highest results in terms of sales growth for any region within the Coffs Harbour to Tweed Heads area,' said Mr Correy.

A more pessimistic picture had been painted by businesses on the North Coast and particularly in Byron Bay, said Mr Correy. 'You always get a vocal minority who will say things are bad' he said, 'but the study cuts across all business sectors giving a much broader view of the business community.'

Explaining why the North Coast should be trading better than metropolitan areas he points to the housing market which has not suffered as severe a downturn as it has in Sydney therefore having less of a detrimental effect on consumer confidence.

'Interest rates also are a factor. Metropolitan business and consumers are more highly geared than regional ones. Mortgages are also higher in Sydney. A third reason concerns skilled staff shortages which are being experienced in metropolitan areas. Up here unemployment is higher, so there are more people around to fill staff vacancies.'

Undertaken by the Management Consultancy Division of WHK Rutherfords, the survey was distributed with the cooperation of the Chambers of Commerce between Tweed Heads and Coffs Harbour. Approximately 300 responses were received, encompassing 440 business locations.

'The findings show who is faring well and why, who is not faring well and why and perhaps most importantly,' says Correy, 'it looks to the future, analysing strategies that businesses are going to be employing.'

'We wanted to listen to the market and understand what they say are their major issues.'

Greg Owens, President of the Byron Bay Chamber of Commerce, says 'The survey has been well received by members of the Byron Chamber and we are looking forward to Rutherfords presenting the findings.'

Another recent survey on the economy of the Northern Rivers area has confirmed that our economy is strongly tied to tourism, with an industry trade surplus of approximately \$33 million in 2002-2003.

'Byron's reputation as one of New South Wales' most popular holiday destinations

Teenagers out of control in Lennox Head

Many locals were shocked to hear about a teenage rampage in Lennox Head last Tuesday night, when up to 150 youngsters were reported to be behaving in a drunk and disorderly manner, causing a disturbance and vandalizing property.

When the first police officers responded to a distress call, they were verbally abused by the kids, and had things thrown at them. They were forced to call for three lots of backup before the situation was brought under control.

What is most disturbing is that this is apparently not an isolated incident. According

to Mick Marrs, caretaker manager for the Lennox Head Beachfront Apartments, this kind of behaviour is the norm for Friday and Saturday nights.

'What made Tuesday night different was the large number of kids involved and that it was a week night,' said Mr Marr. 'Otherwise, any Friday or Saturday night in Lennox you will see groups of 30 or 40 youngsters in the main street, usually drunk, creating a disturbance and causing damage to people's property.'

Mr Marrs claims that the situation has steadily worsened over the past five years, with the numbers of people

and intensity of the violence on the increase.

'The kids are coming to Lennox from all over the place. They get dropped off on a Friday afternoon and left for the night unsupervised. They seem to come in from Ballina, Lismore, Alstonville and Byron Bay as well as locally. They're aged anywhere from eight to twenty years old, but the majority are young teenagers, and they are drinking,' said Mr Marrs.

A Sydney resident who has been visiting her elderly father in Lennox Head several times a year since 2000 has noticed an escalation in

Thoughts on the practicalities of life inspires budding poet

Finding the confidence to enter writing competitions is all linked with 'being the excellent age of 60' says Brunswick resident Joan Mott who has recently won a swag of literary awards.

Five years ago, at the excellent age of 60 and having just learned to drive, Joan won her first prize, second in essay writing in the CWA statewide competition. This year, Joan has done even better, winning first prize in the poetry competition as well as a second prize and a highly commended in the essay writing competition.

Joan didn't intend to enter the poetry writing competition as she has never felt comfortable as a poet. Despite her misgivings, last minute inspiration saw her penning her poem and submitting it for judging. Given the title of 'Where Did I Put It?' (something with which we are all familiar) and lim-

ited to 24 lines, much to Joan's surprise and delight her eleventh hour entry won the competition.

The essay subject of 'Change marches on - is this good or bad?' inspired her to take two different approaches, one focusing on the inevitability of change, and the other reflecting on the old days, hence her two entries. She won second prize for the former which was described by the judges as 'refreshingly matter of fact'.

'I've really enjoyed the challenge of entering the competitions. Being happy enough with the final result and knowing you've done your best is the greatest achievement of all,' said Joan.

Joan cites peer support from Brunswick/Byron U3A as well as the support of her family as the driving forces behind her taking the challenge of entering the compe-

titions. She also praised the CWA for the range of activities it offers to women from country areas, many of whom are quite isolated.

'Women statewide can become involved in all sorts

of things through the CWA including singing, cooking, photography, all sorts of arts and crafts, said Joan.

'The CWA really helps country women realise their potential.'

From front page provides challenges and opportunities for the region.

'The largest exporting industries are retail trade and accommodation, cafes and restaurants which reflect the strong tourism base of the economy,' said Tom Senti, Executive Director of the Tweed Economic Development Corporation Ltd (TEDC) who commissioned the survey.

'Retail trade accounts for about \$65 million into the local economy, followed closely by accommodation, cafes and restaurants about \$63 million.

'Following a distant third is food manufacturing at \$38 million. Manufacturing, of which food processing is the largest at 2%, contributes 7% to the region's Gross Regional Product, while primary industries only contribute 5%.

'What this model does is

allow the Byron Shire Council and business people to identify potential growth opportunities,' explained Mr Senti.

'For the Council it may mean fostering a particular industry sector that has strong export potential, for business it gives solid information on industry sectors where there may be investment opportunities.'

'The Tweed and Northern Rivers area of NSW is experiencing enormous change with substantial increases in population and a fundamental shift in its economic base,' said Mr Senti.

'Population growth alone does not deliver a sustainable economy. Regional sustainability will only be achieved by developing a diverse, broad-based economy which encourages job creation through investment growth. Fundamental to this process is the need to establish a robust, factually-based understanding of the local economy.'

From front page the violence to the point where her father is afraid for his safety.

'It's like a game for these kids who know that there is no police presence in Lennox Head,' she said. 'They keep on coming into town and behaving like this because they think they can get away with it.'

'Unfortunately for the police, by the time they respond to a call, the kids have dispersed, and once they turn around and head back to Ballina, the kids just come back into the main street and pick up where they left off,' explained Mr Marrs.

Another regular visitor to

Lennox Head who has been holidaying in the town with his family for the past eight years is also concerned about the 'pack mentality' of the kids in the streets.

'It's got to the point where it's unsafe to confront them; I wouldn't feel safe asking them to quieten down or go away,' he said.

'It would appear that there is a culture developing with the younger kids following in the older kids' footsteps.'

The sad reality is that, according to Mr Marr, the situation is turning people away from this once peaceful seaside town.

'I've had families staying here who've left at the end of their holiday saying they will never come back to Lennox Head again,' he said.

New rehab service in Bruns



Dr David Graham, general manager of CRS Australia, came from Canberra to open the new Brunswick Heads CRS office last Friday. Also on hand were Rod Hawkins, the regional manager, and local case manager Jenny Bush.

CRS Australia opened its new rehabilitation unit in Brunswick Heads last Friday to give people living in the Byron Shire better access to vocational rehabilitation services.

CRS Australia has been working with people in the Northern Rivers for over 21 years and now has 26 staff across three locations (offices also in Lismore and Ballina). The Brunswick Heads unit has four staff – an occupational therapist, a rehabilitation counsellor, an exercise physiologist and an administrative officer.

'In the past 12 months we helped 126 people get a job through Australian government funded rehabilitation

programs,' Northern Rivers Regional Manager Rod Hawkins said. 'If we add those people assisted through WorkCover and other compensation systems we've helped well over 200 people back to employment.'

Australian Government funding enables CRS Australia to provide vocational rehabilitation services to people with a disability or health condition who receive income support through Centrelink. These programs are usually provided free to the client. CRS Australia helps people with a broad range of disabilities including physical as well as neurological, psychological and sensory conditions.

CRS Australia also provides services to injured workers and their employers through the WorkCover system (or other compensation systems) and these services are paid for by the relevant insurer. CRS Australia is the only WorkCover accredited rehabilitation provider located in the Byron Shire.

Farewell to Martin Wallwork


The Pocket has lost one of its oldest residents with the death of 89-year-old Martin Wallwork last week from emphysema. For over 80 years the Wallwork family have lived in The Pocket, moving from Durrumbul in the early 1900s to take over one of the local dairy farms.

Martin was born in Mulumimbimby on May 20, 1916

and has lived in the Pocket most of his life except for the five year period he spent in the army during the Second World War. Married to Betty LeClere in 1953 they produced nine children. Tragically a car accident took the life of Betty and their youngest daughter in 1980.

During the war Martin was posted to Malaya and after the surrender of the Allies found himself in Changi jail. Narrowly escaping being sent to work on the Burma railway, Martin was shipped by freighter to Japan along with some of the other prisoners. Based in Kobe he describes how he survived on a bowl of rice and two bowls of soup a day with some occasional green vegetables and dried fish. As part of one of the many work parties he laboured at Toya Steel, in a graphite factory then unloading soybeans at the docks. An accident at the docks led to abscesses in his shoulder and leg followed by pneumonia and beri beri.

At this stage he weighed only 32 kilos and thought his time was up, but Martin said his Japanese guards took sympathy on him after he appeared to return from the dead, posting him to the comparatively



easy cook house duty until the war finished.

Despite predictions during the war by a doctor who thought he wouldn't survive, Martin Wallwork returned to

his home in The Pocket to live a further 60 odd years surrounded by his family. He is survived by three sisters Mavis, June and Margaret, his brother Bill and six of his children.

Group looks at secession

'Eventually Australia could become a Commonwealth of Regions with the dissolution of the current large state enti-

ties and replacement by bio-regional grass roots democracy,' the group suggests.

'This proposition supports the idea of decentralisation, in developing effective local networks and infrastructure, each bio-region seeking optimum levels of self-sufficiency in food and renewable energy production...'

Also presented at this month's open forum will be 'Drumming from the Soul' by Rosco and additional comments about secession from Jasper T Cornocob.

Local artists under critical gaze of curators

On Friday July 1 at the Byron at Byron Resort, Arts Northern Rivers launched the first of its Visual Arts Network initiatives – a curatorial advisory clinic to critically assess the work of local visual artists.

A panel of five internationally recognised curators and gallery directors flew in to participate in these one-on-three private clinics engaging artists in a dialogue about their work and giving them practical advice and feedback.

The Visual Arts Network's coordinator Melitta Firth said, 'We will be running a series of these curatorial panels which are an opportunity for some of the region's most exciting artists to receive valuable feedback and be brought to the attention of some of the most prominent and influential curators in Australia.'

The curatorial panel unanimously agreed that the quality of the work presented on the day was extremely impressive. The curators participating were Julie Ewington, Head of Australian Art, Queensland Art Gallery; Russell Storer, Curator, Museum of Contemporary Art, Sydney; David Broker, Deputy Direc-



tor, Institute of Modern Art, Brisbane; Jan Murphy, Director of Jan Murphy Gallery, Brisbane; and Steven Alderton, Director, Lismore Regional Gallery.

The 12 local artists selected each had 45 minutes to discuss their work with the panel. Artists participating were Ainé (Nimbin), Dave Funnell (Grafton), Lyndall Adams (Wooloweyah), Garth Lena (Fingal Head), Daniel Brinsmead (Fingal Head), Christine Willcocks (Mulumbimby), Melissa Hirsch (Byron Bay), Cornelius Del-

aney (Lismore), Liz Deckers (Ocean Shores), Lae Oldmeadow (Tweed), and Karla Dickens (Bangalow).

The VAN project has been developed by Arts Northern Rivers in partnership with the NSW Department of State and Regional Development (DSRD) and is supported by the NSW Ministry for the Arts and the Federal Department of Transport and Regional Services.

State body applauds Byron's developer levy

Social welfare pressure group, the New South Wales Council of Social Services (NCOSS), has applauded moves by Byron Shire Council to introduce a developer levy to pay for low cost housing.

Under the proposal new housing developments would have to allocate 20% of their accommodation to affordable housing tenants or pay a levy totalling 20% of their project cost to Byron Shire Council for an affordable housing fund. While the idea sounds quite radical, a similar scheme has already been used in Sydney and developer levies are common practice in the UK.

According to Warren Gardiner from NCOSS around 20,000 affordable dwellings

a year are built in the UK using developer levies, accounting for around 10% of all new housing stock.

Byron Shire's Councillors were reluctant to approve a local scheme without further information and have asked Council planning staff to provide more details of how the levy would work.

In Sydney's Better Cities Project, developers at Green Square were levied 3% of project costs to fund the purchase of affordable housing stock, which is managed by not for profit housing associations such as CityWest Housing. A similar scheme was also undertaken for new residential housing projects at Ultimo. Warren Gardiner says

that Paramatta City Council has lodged a proposal with the State Government for a 3% developer levy.

Outside of the major cities councils have been slow to act says Chris Wilson from the Northern Rivers Social Development Council, who describes Byron Shire Council at the forefront of affordable housing reform in regional and rural NSW.

'All local government areas should be tackling it. It's becoming clear that all along the eastern seaboard there is increasing pressure from Seachangers which is forcing property prices up. People on very low incomes are finding it difficult to find housing,' Mr Wilson explained.



The latest social trends released by the Australian Bureau of Statistics – explorable online at www.abs.gov.au – show increased deviation from the traditional notion of the 'nuclear family'.

ABS projections show that the number of people living alone will increase from 1.8 million in 2001 to between 2.8 million and 3.7 million in 2026 – an increase of between 57% and 105%. Whatever the method of calculation, the percentage increase is dramatic. Will we become a nation of loners, and will those loners be lonely?

'Now and into the future, living arrangements throughout a lifecycle may also include living alone or in a group household before perhaps forming a long-term partnership, or living as a lone parent or alone after divorce or separation,' notes the ABS. 'These changes in living arrangements and family characteristics are the outcome of various demographic and social trends, such as declining fertility, increased rates of divorce and longer life expectancy.'

One parent families are definitely on the up. Between 1986 and 2001, Australians living as part of a two parent family decreased from 60% to 52% while single parent families increased from 9% to 12%.

More significantly, in 2001, 16% of people in their 20s were partners in a couple with children, compared with at least 40% of people in this age group in 1976. Part of this could be attributed to people starting families later in life. Does it also indicate a disillusionment with the notion of the nuclear family and/or a greater emphasis on concentrating on a career?

'There was a shift in the religious affiliations of people in their 20s over the 25-year period between 1976 and 2001, consistent with both the secularisation of our society generally and our increasingly multicultural community,' the ABS also points out. 'The proportion of people aged 20-29 years with no religious affiliation in 2001 (23%) was higher than in 1976 (14%), with people in this age group being the least likely of all age groups to report a religious affiliation.'

'That said, in 2001, the majority of people in this age group regarded themselves as Christian (67%). This compared with 84% of people aged 20-29 years in 1976. Conversely, higher proportions of people in their 20s in 2001 reported an affiliation with Buddhism, Hindu, and Islam than in 1976.'

We have become a multicultural society which doesn't seem to accord with the PM's whitebread version of reality.

Perhaps it's time, especially for the benefit of loners, for the idea of family to be redefined, to be enlarged to encompass the tribal aspects of interest groups such as computer clubs and tennis buddies. Maybe even American author Kurt Vonnegut had it right in his novel *Cat's Cradle* when he introduced the 'karass', a group of people linked in a cosmically significant manner even when superficial linkages are not evident.

Ministers sidestep immigration shambles

Every cloud has a silver lining, even the permanently grey and threatening one that lowers over the Howard government.

As the blustering Immigration Minister Amanda Vanstone thrashed desperately around trying to salvage something – anything – from the wreckage of her portfolio in the wake of former police commissioner Mick Palmer's devastating report into the Cornelia Rau case, her bulging eye fell on Australia's longest serving detainee, Peter Qasim.

Qasim has been trapped in a kind of Franz Kafka nightmare for seven years: in its infinite wisdom the department decided he was not a genuine refugee, but he cannot be deported because no other country will accept him. A decent society would have made the best of it and accepted him into the community. The Howard way was to lock him behind razor wire and throw away the key.

Over the years a cross party movement in favour of his release has developed, but until last weekend Vanstone insisted that there were reasons why he had to remain incarcerated – reasons so profound and secret that they could not even be revealed to Qasim and his lawyers, let alone to the public at large.

But with the list of failures and brutalities documented by Palmer clogging up the media, a glimpse of humanity was called for. Hence Qasim, unsurprisingly a psychiatric case as a result of his ordeal, is to be allowed to walk free – well, unless and until we can find somewhere to deport him to.

And that's the extent of the good news. Apart from that, it's business as usual.

There has been a sort of

token reshuffle at the top of the department, but those now in charge have been part of the culture Palmer has condemned. For years the measure of success has been not integrity or even efficiency, but simply toughness: when in doubt, throw them out. The higher the body count, the better the result.

Junior officers, under-trained and under-supervised, were encouraged to be ruthless and uncompromising: better, far better, that the innocent should suffer than the guilty should escape. And if a few Australians like Cor-

bles they oversaw from the comfort of the cabinet room.

And, according to their glorious leader, that model of parliamentary rectitude John Winston Howard, nor should they: in his brave new Westminster system the only crime that can lead to a ministerial sacking is conduct which is damaging to the government. As far as he is concerned there are no limits to incompetence, deception, even outright criminality: his ministers can be serial axe murderers as long as it doesn't show up in the opinion polls.

nelia Rau and Vivian Solon get caught in the process, well, that's just tough titty, to be covered up as fast as possible. It was only by accident (and it would seem in spite of the department's best efforts) that the Rau and Solon cases came to light; we have no idea how many others haven't, and there is to be no real attempt to find out.

The regime has been many years in the making, and as far as the government is concerned it has covered itself in glory. Palmer was scathing about the bureaucracy, but he was specifically barred from scrutinising the politicians who devised and nurtured the failures he uncovered.

Thus Vanstone and her sinister predecessor Phillip Ruddock take absolutely no responsibility for the sham-

And the same applies to the public service: the long time Howard loyalist who presided over the totally dysfunctional department, Bill Farmer, has been rewarded with Ambassadorship to Indonesia, one of the most sensitive and important jobs in the foreign service. This is partly to send a signal to the rest of the shiny bums: the only performance indicator that matters is sticking to the government. Follow our politics and you'll be looked after.

But it also has the advantage of putting Farmer out of the reach of both the opposition and the media. Not unnaturally, some Indonesian politicians are a little miffed at having their country used as a dumping ground for Howard's failures. The more excitable are even making noises about rejecting

Farmer's appointment out of hand. Unfortunately they won't: realpolitik will prevail.

But once again, Australia's standing has been diminished to suit Howard's domestic political convenience. And as for good government, forget it. Howard certainly has.

The death of former high Court Judge Sir Ronald Wilson at the weekend enables John Howard to cross another victim off his list.

Wilson was a modest enough figure at the Court, but rose to prominence in his later role as Commissioner for Human Rights when, to Howard's consternation, he produced the groundbreaking report into the Aboriginal Stolen Generation. It was a searing document which for the first time brought to public attention the crimes committed against indigenous Australians and gave the reconciliation movement a huge boost. Clearly it had to be discredited at once.

Howard's minders launched both overt and covert attacks on both Wilson and his report. Publicly they questioned its accuracy and methodology, but privately they got personal. Wilson, they hinted was past it; a bit ga ga. He had become emotionally involved, perhaps though a sense of guilt about his role of the church in its dealings with aborigines (Wilson was a part time Methodist minister). Even by Howard's standards it was a pretty grubby campaign. Wilson was appalled by it, and became something of a recluse as a result.

But in spite of Howard's worst efforts, 'Bringing Them Home' remains a political and social landmark. Wilson's memorial will outlast not only Howard's libels, but his government as well.

Moving on the homeless of Byron Bay

There has been recent media attention to breaches of International Human Rights in relation to the evictions of squatters in Zimbabwe and China. My understanding of the human rights agreements that Australia is signatory to is that it is not legal to move people on without making other appropriate provision for them.

But this is happening in Byron Bay. As this once alternative mecca becomes a developers delight, the people camping in the Sandhills, a small area of bush near the CBD, are being forced by the Lands Department to break camp. Yes, the camps are, like the dwellings in Harare, illegal.

A written notice of eviction from the Dept of Crown Lands was delivered to their camp sites. There were eight alternatives for accommodation suggested including: the Byron Emergency Accommodation Program, Youth House and the Housing Department if they needed assistance to relocate. Unfortunately, none of the agencies had been forewarned, and only the Department of Housing was in any position to assist. The Department does not however have any accommodation in Byron

Bay. For people with so few resources, having a supportive community is a significant part of their social capital. Forcibly breaking this up is taking something of great importance from people with very little.

Moving these people from Byron Bay also means cutting them off from a source of income in many cases. They can busk for money in Byron, but not if relocated to Casino or Brunswick Heads, as well intentioned as that might be. One would have thought that the privilege for indigenous people of being able to camp out in their own country, close to conveniences would be the least we could provide as a community. A toilet, a shower, a locker and an occasional skip is not a big ask of a rich community.

In this instance, there has been some success in finding alternative accommodation for some individuals, following a concerted effort by a number of volunteers, agencies and Councillor John Lazarus working in close coordination with the homeless. But the basic problem remains: we know the homeless are there, but prefer to either deny it or complain about the impact on tourism or neighbourhood amenity.

I don't believe either response is acceptable. We need to recognise that the issue is chronic and requires a better understanding of the underlying causes and solutions.

To this end, we need also to involve the homeless as well as the larger community in seeking solutions. For a start, we might ask our councillors to propose long term solutions that are based on respect for the basic human right to shelter and involves input from those most seriously affected, ie, the homeless. Encouraging the Council to take a leading role should be our first step as a responsible and caring community.

The resident homeless of Byron Bay have now been 'moved on' by the Crown Lands Dept who have plans to develop the Sandhills Estate behind the YAC.

To call them homeless is not quite accurate as the tarpaulin shelters with bedding a place to store personal gear and shelter from the wind and rain have been their home in that area for many years.

Being moved out of their camping space and supportive environment they share

has been very traumatic.

If it was not for the generosity of a local businessman in Byron who allows the less fortunate to doss on his verandah at night without hassles and store their gear in the daytime there would be many pushing Woolies trolleys with their belongings and sleeping in shop doorways at night. A sight I'm sure our now increasing tourist population would not like to have to encounter.

Our government authorities have a duty of care and are required to provide alternatives when moving people on. They were given eight alternatives along with their eviction notice. All pretty useless.

Can you imagine 35 homeless people fronting up to Clarkes Beach Caravan Park with all their gear and being welcomed? Well, that was one suggestion. The Department of Housing has tried its best to accommodate people but having to provide references from your last three landlords and 100 points of ID to real estate agents is a mind boggling experience for people who have lived in the open for years.

Recently I heard an interview with our Mayor, Jan Barham, who described

Byron Bay as being the leading edge in Australia for social change.

Well, Byron Bay, if we are that leading edge and we do have a heart what can we come up with? Our resident homeless need a place where they can shelter from the rain, have storage space for their few personal belongings, a shower and toilet.

Many of these people have been here for years and are colourful personalities on our streets. Our social system does not provide for those who fall through the cracks and then lose their way, their ID and their ability to cope with our bureaucratic system. An alternative is needed to avoid an increasing crisis.

Note that the Japanese whaling industry always mentions their plans to hunt whales in the Southern Pacific but no mention is made of the Northern Pacific. There is a very good reason for this and it concerns the

fact that whales are not just the minds of the ocean, they form an essential part of the oceanic ecosystem.

The Japanese and the other whaling nations of the time successfully hunted most of the Northern Pacific whale species into extinction and this had catastrophic consequences on one of the greatest ecosystems on the planet. With little of their natural prey in existence the north-

ern killer whales focused their attention on the next largest prey species that they had the ability to capture, the northern sea lions. After these had been almost exterminated the killer whales began hunting the smaller seals and eventually the sea otters until these also had been almost exterminated.

Sea otters feed primarily on sea urchins and without



RoundUp is OK

disadvantaged and marginalised in our society, all of which will tear at the heart of the social fabric of our society.

This government did not flag this legislation before going to the last election and for this needs to be held accountable.

Do we choose to allow this government to take us further down the road of unbridled individualism and avaricious selfishness and witness continuing social decay?

This proposed draconian legislation needs to be exposed and defeated now!

Too late to draw the line under Iraq

Frantically and feverishly last April, Tony Blair asked Britain to 'draw a line under the Iraq war, so we can all move on'. But now the Iraq war has invaded his home turf, and England's first homegrown suicide bombers (apart from, perhaps, the Dam Busters) have reminded the world that actions, oh yes, have consequences.

An official report soon out, moreover, will show Blair to be the UK's foremost recruiter of terrorists. He himself, and his deeds in particular, are what makes the Arab world want to kill the English, burn down Westminster Abbey, pull down Big Ben, defecate on the King James Bible and the rest of it.

Can this grinning ninny long survive this catastrophe, this ruin of British tourism, this military pratfall, this diplomatic bungee jump, this economic debacle that he, and his particular decisions, have caused? I don't think so. Every Home Counties commuter leaves his house each morning with a fist-sized knot of fear beneath his weskit and, kissing his wife goodbye at the station, wonders if he'll ever see her again.


Who now says the Iraq war made the world a safer place? Who now says no Iraqi would want the rule of Saddam back?

Cancer care nurses get postgrad training

As part of the NSW Strengthening Support For Rural Women With Breast Cancer strategy, Breast Care Nurse, Nancy Jaeger, and Cancer Liaison Nurse, Suzanne Hutton, have been offered funded positions to undertake a Graduate Certificate in Breast Cancer Nursing through the College Of Nursing.

Describing their selection as 'a fantastic opportunity, both personally and professionally,' Ms Jaeger explained that eligible applicants had to be currently registered in NSW, be employed in a rural area supporting NSW residents who are being treated for breast cancer or having their follow up, and have a minimum of one year's post-graduate experience. The course will be conducted by distance education over 12 months and commence on August 1.

In 2002, Ms Jaeger received a NSW Cancer Council Award - Highly Commended for Public Advocacy - for her involvement in cancer in the Northern Rivers and promoting cancer clinical trials in a rural area.

She was active in the intro-

duction of the after-breast cancer program, YWCA ENCORE, to Lismore two years ago, and has many related involvements, including the Lismore breast cancer support group and the advisory panel for the College of Nursing's Breast Cancer Care Workshop that will tour rural NSW.

Both nurses support the Rainbow Dragons Abreast dragonboat team in Byron Bay and the Young Women's Support group that commenced in May. The group recently released an important DVD, 'Empowering Young Women with Early Breast Cancer'.

Suzanne Hutton is based at the Cancer Care & Haematology Unit at Lismore Base Hospital where she works with many cancer patients, including those being treated for breast cancer. Ms Hutton is the coordinator of the early-morning meetings that bring together a multi-disciplinary team of surgeons, doctors and nurses to discuss breast cancer treatment and issues.

Ms Hutton sits on a range of committees, including the Cancer Council Steering Committee.

Kites return to the skies of Brunswick Heads





Puss Interview

MANDY NOLAN GETS SMOOTH WITH PUSS'S RUFF DIMOND

Every year the Splendour In the Grass organisers choose a local band for their cult festival. It's a coveted spot, a stepping stone to reaching a wider audience and a chance to realise your musical potential! After only 5 months together, local electronic outfit Puss slipped in the cat flap and found themselves with a big bowl of cream.

On landing the gig, Kol, (Ruff's day moniker) muses:

'...we knew they wanted an electronic act this year so we rang Darcy and said we were up for grabs... it was a tossup between us and another band. Darcy came to the Northern just as I was doing my shape shifting bit and we had it in the bag!'

It was just their third gig. The evolution of Puss marks an interesting development in

live music, where live musicians and DJ's collaborate to produce a new era of sound. Puss members hail from the dance scene, but all have live music backgrounds.

'We've all been in bands. The age of the DJ appeared - and suddenly everyone was a DJ, including people who previously had been in bands...but we were all muso's first. You realise that the just DJing has it's shortcomings. I just kept hassling everyone I knew to play live with me...somewhere to ply my grass roots DIY punk ethic.'

For Kol and Puss playing music is very much about being on the same page politically.

'I'm a political activist first and foremost. It governs everything I do. If the gig isn't community oriented or has some political base then I'm not interested. It was the same when I was DJing - when the scene became club based I lost interest. Puss

is very much left of centre Byron style.'

So how do these new age new wave groovers get their licks together?

'We get a few loops, a few ideas, a set of lyrics - the lyrics and the loops come together, then we get the drum kit, electronic drum kit and Scoota on guitar, and turntable, and then we start adding and subtracting. When we play live we have a structural idea, but an improvised reality. We don't structure our songs, we pretty much let each other

play whatever we want - no one really interferes. It's a bit like jazz impro techniques, except we do ours with loops: creating songs collectively. Everything is live, although we are recording a demo to have ready for sale at Splendour.'

'Triple J are recording Puss for Mix Up for future broadcast. I think we're one of few acts that have been chosen.'

Thursday

Krafty Kuts hits c-moog for his annual breaks and funky hip hop showcase. Since last year the Finger Lickin DJ and Tricka Technology co-producer's been focusing on his own breakbeat album for Against the Grain. Expect some new Krafty beats plus tunes from his mates Rennie Pilgrim, the Plumps, Stanton Warriors and Freq Nasty. Should be more of a mixup than straight-up party breaks.

Friday

OneLove rocks into Byron's La La Land with Melbourne residents **Derek K** and **Bing Bong**. The backroom bandit warms up for Derek K's deep house and pumping electro. → **DJ Strut** of Sydney's Bump parties heads back to the North Coast for a c-moog set. House and breaks from the ex-Bellingen boy plus **Noodles** and **Tone Broker** mixing hip hop to funk.

Saturday

Groove Terminator returns to the Great Northern for his final gig before he heads to LA to work on movie-music. As Australia's best-known touring DJ, GT delivers consistent sets of rocking beats, hardhouse anthems and party breaks. His high energy performance has local support from **Del Larkin**, **Slinky** plus **Sean Candy** with **Whit** from Spiderbait on guitar.

→ **The Bang Gang** roll into town for Splendour weekend touching down at La La Land for a party night of cool trash. The six Sydney guys are listed in the current Sunday Telegraph top 100 hot list (Dangerous Dan also got a rating under Tsubi). Mixing it up on decks and effects, Bang Gang is a wacky, and sometimes weird, mix of 'electro-house-acid-pop' – but always a 'super-fun-happy-party'.

→ **What Da Funk** is happening again at the venue in the Arts & Industry Estate. The clubhouse has been decked out in splendid decor and the local line-up runs **Pip**, **Pob**, **Phil Smart**, **Scoota** and (after sunrise) **Strawberry Syme**. New tunes from Pob, just back from six weeks in the UK and Berlin, plus Phil Smart's new music (see interview).

→ The Buddha Bar has DJ's taking over all areas, from the terrace to the backstage room till midnight – but it's closed Sunday.

Sunday

Rock Hardson heads to Elsewhere to join **Giv** for the Sunday session in Surfers Paradise taking it through till 5am. Fresh(ish) from Splendour, Rock Hardson could be bringing **Whit** (from Spiderbait) and his guitar to add a rock n roll after-party vibe to the post Splendour session.

INTERVIEW

PHIL SMART

→ As a Byron resident for well over a year now, Phil Smart splits his time between the Junkbeats home studio, surfing and frequently travelling for gigs. Before he heads to the States and Burning Man next month (and just back from a quick tour of Sydney, Melbourne and New Zealand) he's home in Byron to play Splendour in the Grass and the Saturday night What Da Funk.


→ 'At Splendour I'm definitely checking out Queens of the Stone Ages, Bloc Party, Interpol and the local Tipi area,' Phil predicted. 'As far as I know, at Splendour I'm playing a sunset set, so it'll crossover as the light changes... whereas the later gig'll be deep in darkness and more crazy... but it's always hard to tell what I'll play till the night.'

→ His sets have won him the award for best Australian DJ in 2000 and two listings in DJ Mags top 100, but it'll be Phil's first local appearances since SuperFreakyKinky on New Years Day. Is it the lack of venues or is it his sound? 'Both!' reckoned Phil. 'I don't play commercial music. I play more... not experimental, not underground... but I like pushing or presenting new music. It's always been the focus of my sets. Most venues here want more accessible music.'

→ Phil believes Byron doesn't need heaps more clubs, but maybe an increase in diversity and definitely an allnight venue. 'If there was a venue in Byron that caters to the local dance scene and was allowed to go after 3am. That would make a huge impact. It's not just me and the Junkbeats crew, but a lot of people feel the same way and there's loads of talent here.'

→ Splendour helps the local scene by shining awareness on the local talent at the Tipi Circle (and Phil lists many other ways the festival is positive for Byron)... but he thinks this year is especially significant as the community group DANCE Inc was asked to organise the local DJ area. Phil (when he's not travelling) attends the members meetings to campaign for allnight dance venues in Byron and approved outdoor party sites.

→ 'DANCE Inc's getting support from Council and the community... it's a really positive time to be in Byron. There's lots of great producers and people here. There's a strong sense of community in Byron. If people care, we can maintain the scene and the sounds that develop in Byron. We need a venue where we can dance allnight and local promoters can put on electronic arts events. It would make a great difference to the scene... and I could stay home more!'

'The single Kickflip I did with Pocket is out soon on EQ Breaks... there's an EP I did in the States with a friend that'll come out on Sydney label Risky Disko... the Junkbeats 20for7 new track Friday is out now on Fred Everything's Lazy Days label with a killer Trentemoller remix; and the next single Ripple Effect is coming soon on French imprint Chocoflash... Junkbeats just got a distribution deal for the next compilation album, a followup to Lighthouse called Sea Level, it'll be out towards the end of the year... by then we'll have a live act for Headland and plan a bit of a tour around the country!'

DOWNFALL

There is a bit of the voyeur in us all. It is what makes us linger over surveillance photos of Australian heroin smugglers being arrested by Indonesian Police at Denpasar Airport. Downfall provides that chilling fly-on-the-wall experience by putting us in the bunker with Adolf Hitler in the last days of the Third Reich, a convincingly recreated Berlin in rubble outside. It is a big ask of director Oliver Hirschbiegel to come up with an objective depiction of the twentieth century's most reviled leader, but he does it with even-handedness and without re-writing history. No attempt is made to elicit sympathy for an unworthy man, but tragedy on a grand scale is a pitiable thing, regardless, and never just about one person. Nobody could not be distressed by the death of the Goebells children. Swiss Bruno Granz is exceptional as the self-absorbed, deluded Fuhrer, but, because we know the ending, the film seems too long in getting there.

MR & MRS SMITH


There is enough sizzling chemistry between stars Angelina Jolie and Brad Pitt to blow up a small building. He shows he is equally adept in comedy and action, and she manages to set new screen standards of screen sexiness. It's impossible to dislike this pair, or a movie that makes being married seem like such insane fun. Pitt and Jolie play extremely skilled professional assassins who have managed to stay married for five years without ever realizing each other's profession? (because they work for rival agencies and the work is top secret of course). When their paths eventually cross on a high-level hit, one of the most lethal battles of the sexes in the history of cinema is officially on. Thanks to a witty script, the issue isn't who will win, but whether the couple will realize they are meant for each other before it's too late. Director Doug Liman was obviously the right choice for the material, having proved his ability to fuse engaging romance with knuckle-biting action in 2002's The Bourne Identity. The comedy is sophisticated and witty, the action is visceral and intense, and there is plenty of satisfying eye candy. Another plus is Vince Vaughn as a fast-talking fellow hit man who lives with his mother. The cinematography imbues each environment, whether it's the Smith's house, or the urban streets - with its own evocative color scheme and feel.



SIN CITY

Director Robert Rodriguez is the new Alpha-male hipster in Hollywood. Here he has transferred to the screen, literally, stories from Frank Miller's 'graphic novels,' (ie, comics). They are sado-sexist fantasies for teenage auto-eroticists, set in a dark, rainy, seedy metropolis and peopled by cool vile gangsters, tough cops, hookers and a corrupt senator. Shot frame for frame according to Miller's original drawings, the B/W cinematography and lighting is a brilliant achievement. The words, verbatim from the page, are fine in the lengthy voice-overs but as dialogue they are stilted and only underline how vacuous and juvenile the whole escapade is. The novelty wears off about halfway through, at which point the cardinal sin of cinema is broken; it gets boring. Rodriguez will be a great filmmaker when he finds something to say, until then his work can be categorised along with what the scurrilous Tom Wolfe irreverently refers to as 'ars anorexia.' No meat on the horribly bloody bone.






No trifling with truffle oil

Margie has brought me back from Sydney a bottle of truffle oil: French black truffles infused in extra virgin olive oil. For about a week I am thoughtful, considering where to begin. Because truffle oil is one of those utterly luxurious gourmet items one can never justify buying for oneself, it is not a likely thing to have casually on hand. I suppress the urge to throw a glamorous dinner party in order to show off, and content myself with research and cautious experiments.

Truffle oil became ludicrously overused and abused in restaurants and cafés some ten years back – and even now crops up as an ostentation or in a dish entirely inappropriate. Many chefs will slosh it through mashed root vegetables to liven them up without properly considering its compatibility with the other flavours on the plate. What exactly is the flavour? It has a taste both delicate and earthy, difficult to define, a subtle form of the truffle itself. Truffles are highly prized fungi whose most famous examples, both black and white, are found in France and Italy. Anna del Conte in her 'Gastronomy of Italy' describes the aroma as a 'perfect marriage between a clove of garlic and a piece of the best parmesan', while Marcella Hazan suggests it as similar to 'garlic laid over a penetrating earthiness and combined with a pungent sensation that is like a whiff of strong wine.' Having eaten fresh truffles in Italy I have always found description elusive, with words like feral, primeval and sensuous being inadequate evocations but the best I can manage.

Attempts are being made in Tasmania to grow truffles, but for most of us in Australia the closest we may hope to come is in a bottle of truffle oil. With restraint, I am now discovering all the ways in which this ingredient may elevate an ordinary dish to an extraordinary height. A browse on the website tells me that fats work perfectly with truffles and help to bring the full flavour out; that bland foods such as pasta, potatoes and rice are also ideal means of highlighting the taste; that most tubers and vegetables like leeks and celery root contrast brilliantly with the intensely pungent

essence of truffles; and that any ingredient high in acidity will cause the truffle flavour to subside. The most important point seems to be that other foods with overwhelming or even simply strong flavours should not be combined with the truffle, which cannot compete.

So: bland foods, root vegetables, butter, cheese and cream. And other fungi, and eggs. Eggs scrambled and finished with a little truffle oil; eggs poached then served on a bed of tagliatelle tossed through butter, truffle oil and parmesan. Celeriac sweated in butter, simmered in chicken stock then blended and enriched with parmesan, cream and truffle oil for a heavenly soup; or creamy pea soup with a slick of truffle oil over the top. I am especially drawn to a recipe for blanched asparagus tossed in a vinaigrette of extra virgin olive oil, white wine vinegar, a little lemon juice and two tablespoons of truffle oil. Suddenly, the possibilities for my bottle of truffle oil appear endless.




REACHING THE CHILD AS FRINGE DWELLER

REVIEW OF MANDY SAYER'S VELOCITY BY MANDY NOLAN

I have to admit, I'm generally not a fan of autobiographies. As a reader, I always feel a little cheated – rather than the writer taking the creative path of original composition, they settle on a rambling narrative which recounts their personal story. For a writer, the autobiography gives as much as it takes. While the skeleton story exists, with a definite beginning and characters instantly taking shape in the subconscious shadows, it is difficult for a writer to maintain the necessary tension to drive the pages, and often there is little sense of conclusion, particularly if the writer is still living. Our continually changing life experiences tend to reframe our interpretation of childhood, giving long forgotten experiences merit, and adversely there can sometimes be a loss of clarity on what we once thought were defining moments.

It was therefore with some personal bias that I started reading Mandy Sayer's memoir *Velocity*. Feeling slightly non-plussed about the prospect of ploughing through someone else's childhood (I have enough trauma recounting my own) I started reading. By the second chapter where Sayer recounts her first day at a new school where she remarks: 'I am scared and I need to wee' I was completely hooked. So much so that although I needed to wee, I read on. Definitely a rubber sheet read. I couldn't put it down and that wasn't just because I'd spilt superglue on the cover. Sayer's novel is gripping. As a reader I was completely surprised that she had managed to convey her complex and traumatic story in such an effortless and literary way. I left the book

feeling that I had somehow lived it too, her authorial voice touching something ancient and trapped within this thirty something reader: The Child.

Sayer has the remarkable ability of weaving tension into her narrative as she boy-cotts adult reflection on infant experience and settles into the voice of the child. I was struck with the same sense of emotional recognition as when I watched the film 'My Life as a Dog'. It's very unusual for adult storytellers to make the journey back to the child's voice without contriving, patronising or attempting to interpret and analyse behaviour or situations. This always tends to disempower the narrative, and I realised that this was exactly what I usually found distasteful about most other memoirs: their inability to return to place. Refreshingly, Mandy Sayer's authorial tone is fresh and authentic. She doesn't over sentimentalise or judge a childhood that would have most of us in therapy for the rest of our adult lives.

Mandy Sayer tells the story of a child who grew up knowing all the beergardens in Sydney by the time she was eight. Sayer was very much the fringe dweller, in her family, her schools and until the conclusion of her memoir, in her self as well. Sayer's father was a jazz musician, her mother loving but desperate as she battles depression and alcoholism through all of Mandy's young life. If you ever felt guilty for your kids moving a school or two, *Velocity* will leave you feeling like Parent of the Year. In a childhood that was spent on the run from poverty, suicide and violence, Mandy's schooling reads like an almanac of educational options for the socio-economically disadvantaged. I found myself empathising for this exceptional child who

level-headedly rescued her Mum from overdose, wrote poetry and loved learning. I think I lost count, but she attended something like 16 schools, sometimes up to 4 in a year, and still managed to come out of the experience a success.

It's a childhood lived in one bedroom apartments in King's Cross, in hotels, and then finally on the run from domestic violence in a series of women's refuges, from Sydney to Melbourne and Adelaide. The book's dust cover remarked that the text was 'often hilarious'. I beg to differ, I found little opportunity to laugh, not because Sayer's narrative was bleak or glib, in fact it was the opposite. It was her incredible ability to relate her story without judgement that was profoundly moving. More than a memoir, *Velocity* reads as a chronicle of survival and courage reminding one of the positive power of re-framing life experiences and the permanence of familial love, regardless of circumstance. In *Velocity* Sayer maps the story of self, an unconventional and accidental discovery. A deeply compassionate read: truly uplifting.





The club finished seventh in the final point score out of 69 country clubs with two new country records set by Gemma Johnson in 15 years 100m freestyle and 15 years 100m butterfly. Needless to say, head coach Peter Charlton is delighted with all the swimmers and their excellent results.


Newton juniors tee off at Mullumbimby






