## Tractors turn out to resist RTA



Nearly 20 tractors, scores of trucks, cars, a semi trailer and a prime mover joined the protest rally on Friday along the Pacific Highway from Ewingsdale to Ballina. Locals farmers organised the rally to object to the loss of around 1,000 acres of farmland needed to upgrade the highway. 18,500 submissions were presented to the RTA in Ballina asking for heavy trucks to be returned to the New England Highway and the road upgrade to be limited to four lanes. The Echo understands that some deep sea fishermen are concerned that they will have to travel further out to sea to safe in smaller boats cur-Recreational fishermen rently used by some fishers.

> Ken Thurlow, chairman of recreational fishers group, the Northern Rivers Fishing Conference, described the plan as the 'height of hypocrisy'.

> 'Fifty percent of the park is still open to high impact commercial fishing such as prawn trawlers. What they've given us is unrelated to protecting biodiversity.'

> Buyouts of commercial fishing licences are still being 'worked through' according to Lisa Miller from the office of Primary Industries Minister Ian Macdonald. Over 200 applications have been received by the department, including some from beach haulers and prawn trawlers operating in the Bay.

'We will be trying to obtain a balance between the different types of fisheries and fleets and are still inviting fishers to apply,' Ms Miller said.

## \$20,000 fine for tree destruction

Byron Shire Council has successfully prosecuted a Mullumbimby landholder for illegal tree clearing. The spokesperson for Council. NSW Land and Environment court fined Mr Fletcher \$20,000 and ordered him to pay Council's costs of guilty of development without consent.

'This is a significant step forward, though the NSW Government still has a long way to go to provide full protection for the 20-50% of our marine waters identified by the scientists as being required if we want to reverse the alarming decline in our fisheries and marine habitats,' Mr Pugh said.

'The Friends still have many concerns with the proposed zoning, the most significant being the State Government's refusal to provide full protection for the critical habitat of the endangered Grev Nurse Shark around Julian Rocks. Only 56% of the Julian Rocks reef system is to be fully protected in a sanctuary zone, with 33% in a habitat protection zone seasonally available for fishing, and 11% available for fishing all year around.



## **New Issue of Resident Parking Coupon**

Byron Shire Council is currently issuing the 'New Resident Parking Coupon' for use in the designated paid parking areas of Byron Bay. All residents who currently have

the old "CP" parking coupon are required to re-apply for the new red parking coupon. The old "CP" coupon will remain valid during this change over period when affixed to the vehicle it was issued. The Old "CP" coupon will be phased out early 2006.

In accordance with Council's resolution, a resident parking coupon will be issued to each vehicle that is registered in New South Wales to a residential address in the Byron Shire. Residents wishing to apply for a parking coupon will be required to supply a copy of their current New South Wales vehicle registration certificate, displaying a residential address to Council for processing.

Residents who operate a business vehicle are required to submit all of the following:-

· copy of the current vehicle certificate registration showing the vehicle is registered as business / commercial use,

## A local man at war in Iraq

Most Australians have a strong position on the presence of Australian troops in Iraq; many people, especially in the Byron Shire, are opposed to it. 



## **Reclaiming New Years Eve**

This New Years Eve will be a watershed for Byron Bay. After years of following strategies aimed at entertaining the arriving hordes in the hope of keeping them happy, Council has taken the brave stance of trying to dissuade them from coming at all.

The \$64 million guestion is whether the change in strategy will work. If the New Years Eve Safety Committee can pull it off, they will have found a way to deliver what many residents have been praying for for years, the confidence to celebrate in their home town in a safe environment.

Sending out a message that Byron Bay is not party central this New Years Eve is the mainstay of Council's plan. The other key message is zero tolerance on drinking in the streets.

Can a town's image be changed that quickly? Byron Bay offers a plethora of drinking and entertainment venues, presumably all of which will be open and ready for business on December 31. Our appeal as a mecca for young people has not yet lost its lustre so it would be naive to think that most of the normal watering holes will not be full to bursting point. Last year around 30,000 people packed into Byron and noone knows how many were drawn by the appeal of a late night dance party and free street entertainment.

Hopefully the lack of these attractions this year will reduce the crowd substantially and the promise of no alcohol on the streets persuade many that the trip east is not worth it.

Designing the entertainment to appeal to a family crowd and the conscious decision not to lay on rock bands or loud music should also act to lessen the appeal for revellers bent on a wild night out.

The success of the night will also come down to the support of the local population. A large turnout of residents, particularly families and the older

generation, should help to create a different feel to the night and in turn change the image to one that is safe, while also being enjoyable. It is unlikely that the organisers will get the change in strategy right on their first go, there are bound to be some hiccups. Reclaiming the night can only be a good thing for Byron Bay and its residents and let's hope that this year we get it right.

If not, the losers will be not only the residents but also the businesses which depend on a safe and uplifting environment for tourists to visit and spend their money. The golden goose will not lay any more of those golden eggs if its feathers are unduly ruffled by drunken hordes.

## Volunteer for ibis count

People all over NSW are being asked to become birdwatchers for a day, and take part in the statewide annual ibis census conducted by the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS). Families, picnickers, joggers and dog walkers are being asked to call in ibis numbers seen in their local parks and streets during the count on Sunday December 11.

Officer Geoff Ross said the count was part of ongoing research into the species to improve knowledge of the habits and preferred locales of these quirky birds.


'Ibises are native to NSW and they're one of the state's key wetland species. They're constantly on the move in the state's ever-changing inland waterways,' Mr Ross said.

Mr Ross said the count would help researchers assess the number of ibises in NSW and where they nest and breed. He said teams of volunteers would also be out from the Tweed to the Murray and parts of western NSW counting nests and birds in wetlands and parks.

Local refugee supporters are celebrating the end of a 4 year campaign to free a young Iranian family from mandatory detention. All four members of the family have finally received permanent protection visas.

The local media have reported about this family and their local advocates.

Saeed is a dentist, his wife Leila a pharmacist. Their first born, a lively little girl called Ghazal spent the first vear of her life in detention, the younger child, a boy called Melad was born in Adelaide.

For 18 months, the family has lived in the Adelaide community on a 'circle of friends' arrangement. This means that they had no gov-



ernment assistance and the circle of over 50 people have paid for all their needs. Many local people have contributed with monthly payments or have made one-off donations.




## Artisan keeps Suffolk firies cool





When Australia broke However, Lane also had no away from Asia in 1998 to form Oceania, the world's weakest zone, consisting of only Australia, New Zealand, Fiji and New Guinea, an option was given to rescind the decision after four years. At the time Asian sentiment was strongly in favour of cutting Australia adrift, and most Australian Olympic players, some hoping for easy International Master titles and a less demanding path to World Championship events, also

seemed to favour the split. prominent voices in Asia say the Oceania experiment should be abandoned, enabling Australia to compete again with its southeast Asian neighbours in World Championship qualifiers. The change of heart may be due to the increased number of top Australian players of Asian origin - the latest being George Xie, who scored his final IM result at the World U/20 Championship in Turkey last month. A change is likely to be opposed by Oceania officials who would lose power once Oceania was abolished, but player sentiment is harder to judge. Those hoping to retain the status quo will point to Gary Lane's result at the ongoingWorld Cup, the Sydney IM earning a payday of more than \$10,000 after reaching





#### Mandy Nolan hitches a lift with Transport's Kier Nuttall

Brisbane trio Transport are busy celebrating the fact that their timely track 'Shallow' has hit number one on the JJJ net 50. And it couldn't have come at a better time. The song is a sleepy wake up call to a populace low on hope and high on apathy.

'Shallow is our anti-John Howard song. We made the clip in the UK when I was on holidays. Phil (the Director) is a mate of mine and is a bit of a science fiction nerd, so rather than being obviously anti-Howard, it's a 70's type spy film. I suppose its a bit of a parallel narrative.

Considering the clip was made some time before the proposed

new venue in the heart of mullum

anti-terrorist bill, I suggested that the use of 70's spy film styling was very clever, and perhaps made a bigger comment about ASIO hunting up those assumed to be harbouring seditious thoughts. Kier hadn't thought of it like that, but now you mention it.... all the pieces are falling into place. Thank god there's no clause for retrospective sedition.

I left Brisbane back in the 80's, a hot desolate place that a friend of mine refers to as 'ghosts in thongs.' For some reason, for a city that has always felt a bit culturally vacuous, it has produced some world class music. Chris Bailey and the Saints came out of Brizzy, The Go-Betweens emerged and didn't bother with Sydney, they just jetted straight off to the UK, Powderfinger put their finger on the American pulse after years of back bar

gigging... and now Transport join the queue of talent, making their way out into the bigger musical pool.

For Transport, the secret to maintaining their rage in Brisbane is to have bigger gigs, less often. 'We space our gigs out, we do one big show once or twice a month... you don't want people getting too familiar with you, going I can see them next week... We usually play at the Rev (in the Valley).

Like any band starting out, there are always those gigs that have you wondering what the hell you are doing there in the first place.

'We just came back from Melbourne. The first couple of gigs went really well. But there was one that was a really flat crowd... they were looking at us like we were in a specimen jar. It's something

that tends to happen when you are starting out, so it can catch you by surprise.

As a performer, that is something I can completely relate to. I call it 'cracking the cool crowd'. Give me a room full of yobbos anyday! Well, maybe not...

After three years together, the hard work is starting to pay off.

'For us it's been very slow. But it's still been a case of reaching more people all the time. There has to be some point when you break even. Look at Powderfinger, they were around for years, it was an endurance thing for them."

Finding their way into high rotation at JJJ has been a big part of getting Transport off the footpath and onto the road

'We hired a publicist, and she got a CD into the hands of Robbie Buck and it was pretty much him who was responsible for getting us added to the medium rotation, and then we got voted up to high rotation.'

2006 is looking good for Transport.

'We just got on the bill for the local Big Day Out at Parklands...'

So what's Transport's secret weapon?

'For some reason when you add distorted guitar it brings a weird element. We do funk, rock and hip hop, it's really a bit of a cross section... it's all high energy!'




# god bless the inappropriate

## THE BIG BLUE

From its humble beginnings at the Piggery, the East Coast Blues and Roots Festival is now in its seventeenth year and has just been nominated for another Pollster Award for Best Festival. According to Sally McPherson, General Manager of the Festival:

The nomination came through on Monday and the winner of the category will be awarded in Las Vegas on 15 February. This is the second year we've been nominated, and last year was the first time an Australian festival had been nominated. This is the second time and what I like about it is that we are

a regional event up against major city events.

The tickets for this year's Blues Fest have been selling faster than ever, with ticket sales in one day equalling what was previously sold in 5 weeks. Sally credited the festival's popularity to its longstanding quality reputation among punters and the artistic community.

'I think it is really down to the quality of the festival and the quality of the acts - and it permeates through the international touring community. Acts always want to come here - and Peter Noble is really good at booking the festival.

Waiting for the Bluesfest Artist Release is a bit like a striptease - the crowd gets excited even before anything's taken off. As far as what the vision for the Festival is this year, Sally says:

'It's all in Peter's head - he's the Artistic Director - he thinks about how he wants the Festival to sound and feel (but always based in blues and roots), and what acts he really wants to appear. Acts like Amadou and Mariam, (a married blind couple who perform French folk, reggae) son of the legendary Bob Marley, Damian Marley - Bob Geldof, Los Lobos and The Scatallites who've been around since the 50's and have been identified with pioneering ska music.


The next artist announcement is due within the week. But you had better get in quick.

'The early bird tickets are gone, but Byron locals can still get them at some of the local outlets, but it's the only place, we did a particularly big allocation for the locals this year.'

So here we have an internationally acclaimed festival on a footy field...The inevitable question must be asked, when will the Blues Festival find its own purpose built site?

'We need another home and there's no secret about that. and the rapidity with which the tickets have sold certainly indicates the popularity of the festival. We haven't found a site yet but when we do we have to get through local, state and federal regulatory and compliance issues as well as community consultation.

## **HARRY POTTER AND** THE GOBLET OF FIRE

The fourth Harry Potter film is rated M, though probably not for its violence, for there is nothing that kids will be unfamiliar with. What's new is the more adult mood. Mike Newell (Four Weddings and a Funeral) explores the relationships between the three central characters, and the movie is better for it. Readers of the books, or antecedents like The Famous Five, will know that it is the people we care about, not the hoopla. An emotional depth is added. Harry feels the pressure of celebrity, Ron gets narked with him, Hermione is on the verge of sexual blooming - they are more real, their lives more interesting. The story rattles along, with no shortage of monsters, mystery and marvellous magic, but the bubble of fantasy is ultimately burst - and there lies the rub. Somebody at Hogwarts is killed and, as Hermione reflects at close of term, everything's different now. Valdemort is resurrected, evil is at large on the Earth. Growing up is more confrontational than dealing with flying dragons. Fans will be satisfied, but it is impossible to be unaffected by the sadness of its conclusion. John Campbell







## In the red Horatio Bitemark

On a Sunday morning, deadline looming, it is sometimes difficult for the aging roué to slip loose the bonds of languor. ## Plundering the paella platter

Spanish food is enjoying a surge of popularity thanks largely to tapas bars and menus springing up ubiquitously. To be sure it has been around for decades – memories still stir gently of suckling pig at Don Quixote; faded glamour and dusty velvet curtains at The Spanish Club; foaming jugs of sangria and garlic prawns at Capitan Torres, all in Sydney – though generally regarded as a rougher, cheaper alternative to the inexplicably ongoing fashionability of Italian food. It is refreshing to witness this change, and to experience chefs like Luke Southwood at Byron Bay's dish restaurant create truly inspired interpretations of it.

Possibly Spain's most famous dish is Paella. Believed to have originated in Valencia, this rice-based specialty can be made with various ingredients but the most authentic, Valencia version will always include chicken, pork and seafood. The pan in which it is cooked is called a 'paellera', a wide round dish with sides high enough to enable to rice to double in size. Moorish influence resulted in its being traditionally eaten in the Arab fashion, with diners sitting around the paellera and with a wooden spoon picking out what they want, in the same way that North Africans eat couscous.

This communal, essentially social way of eating is not, of course, confined to Spain and Morocca – most cultures have their own version. Enjoying food in this manner seems to unite people in a way not possible when everyone is intent on their own different meals. And for entertaining purposes it is ideal: the one great central platter from which everyone may plunder.

Two men have set up a catering company in order to provide precisely that experience with paella, and to coincide with the impending season of heightened social life and festivities their timing could not be better. Julio Garcia della Rossa and Gary Boomer started offering paella to the charter boats they worked on at Sydney's Rushcutters Bay marina, more as a game than a serious business. Julio the chef hails from Seville and the paella he makes is a family recipe (and according to him, an authentic paella will not mix meat with seafood.) The game turned into a serious enough business when they found that they were having to provide paella for 40-50 people at a time. This was six years ago - now relocated with their respective families to the far north coast they have established El Toro – Spanish Cuisine Catering, whose distinguishing feature is paella. Vegetarian Paella, Seafood Paella, Meat Paella and a luxury Seafood Paella are offered, made in two enormous paelleras capable of serving up to fifty people from each. How perfect a party idea is this? To top it all off, they will come to your home, set up a little gazebo, throw in crockery, glasses and Spanish music, toss in a few tapas to carry on with, and cook the paella on the spot. One and a half hours later a hundred people may feast on this glorious saffron-spiked dish, leaving Gary and Julio to clean up, pack up and move on. The most expensive type is \$35 a head, which must make it one of the best catering deals around, and the most fun. Further enquiries may be made on 6687 7117.
