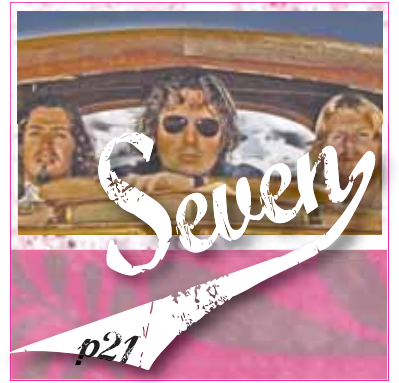

## Residents oppose Mullum Ck quarry plans

Last Wednesday night residents of the Mullumbimby Creek valley expressed their opposition to a development application (DA) for extensive extraction from the Bower quarry near the corner of Left Bank Road and Frasers Road.

The meeting called on Byron Shire Council to extend the submission time on the DA by two weeks, and to investigate the legal status of its advertising of the DA and the status of the quarry's existing use rights. Residents also voted to form a committee to contest the DA.

Council's planning director Ray Darney later told *The*

*Echo* that Council believed it had advertised the DA correctly and would provide a better property description to notify residents.

He also said the DA would not be determined until August – after the Councilors' winter break – and residents would be given more time to make submissions.

About 80 residents turned up to the meeting at Shearwater Steiner School and heard from Mr Darney, Council's planning consultant Paddy Dawson and independent ecologist Mark Fitzgerald.

Brendan Healey, president of the Mullumbimby Creek

Progress Association, chaired the meeting. Deputy Mayor Peter Westheimer was the only councillor present. Mr Healey said the applicant Max Bower was invited to attend but chose not to.

Mr Darney told the meeting that Mr Dawson had been hired to clear up a backlog of old DAs including those for three quarries and the Byron Bay bypass. The Bower quarry DA was 11 years old, Mr Darney said, and 'should have been determined six or seven years ago'.

Mr Dawson confirmed that, should the DA be approved, extraction from

## Public meeting on Sunnybrand future

Byron Shire Council has called a community meeting for Thursday June 15 to discuss the progress being made to eliminate odours from the Sunnybrand Chicken processing plant. It is almost exactly one year ago that Freedom From Fowl Odour Org (FFFOO) convened the first public meeting about the smells and Ray Darney, Director of Planning and Environment Services at Council feels that it is time to review the situation.

'Sunnybrand was sent a notice by Council requiring

them to conduct an odour audit and provide a detailed plan on how they would reduce the odours,' said Mr Darney. 'What they have done is to remove the chickens altogether for the next three months, which of course has eliminated the odours. However, should the chickens return in summer, the the odours are likely to return and it may be necessary for Council to order another audit.'

In a press release from Sunnybrand, General Manager Andrew Young confirmed that the sheds are

now empty and will remain so until mid Spring.

'We have agreed to close down two sheds by December 31, 2006 subject to the availability of alternate shedding,' said Mr Young. 'We will attempt to leave the sheds empty over winter 2007 then will close down the remaining four sheds by December 31, 2007.'

Mr Young goes on to explain that the cost of relocation and closure of the shedding will be recouped through a reduction in staffing levels and estimates that

the quarry would be raised to 25,000 cubic metres a year compared to its current unused state and increase by two and a half per cent a year over 20 years.

He said the main issues raised around the quarry's operation were noise impact; truck movements; water discharge and sediment control; impact on flora and fauna; and impact on visual amenity.

The meeting became heated at times after an address by invited Palmwoods resident Anton Vanderbyl, who has had a long history of dispute with Council over the Archibald quarry, which effectively won approval in the Supreme Court for increased rock crushing capacity because of an existing use right.

Mr Vanderbyl accused Council of taking a month to respond to his latest noise complaint, having an incorrectly calibrated noise meter and then failing to take action after his complaint to the Ombudsman.

'It comes down to how Council manages noise,' Mr Vanderbyl said.

'Council is not able to

deal with it, Council doesn't want to deal with it.

'[Quarry noise] destroys your life. Any councillor who thinks it's a good idea has contempt for your amenity.'

In his address ecologist Mark Fitzgerald said there had been important changes since the quarry DA had been lodged in June 1995. He cited an increase in residences, extensive revegetation and fewer banana and cattle operations in the valley.

Mr Fitzgerald described the fauna survey submitted with the DA as 'demonstrably inadequate' and lacking in scientific rigour.

Mr Darney later told the meeting that Council would consider the advice of its own ecological consultant rather than go back to the applicant for more environmental impact information.

Asked from the floor why the DA hadn't lapsed, Mr Darney said the only statute which applied was a 40 day 'deemed refusal' by Council. Hence the DA was still valid.

Neither Mr Darney nor Mr Dawson was around in the early days of the DA's life so could not say why it was not determined earlier. Mr Dawson agreed it was 'outrageous the DA was left to hang around'.

Mr Darney said staff would take on board old submissions from residents as well as new ones in considering the DA.

her service to Australian Red Cross which covers an extraordinary 55 years.

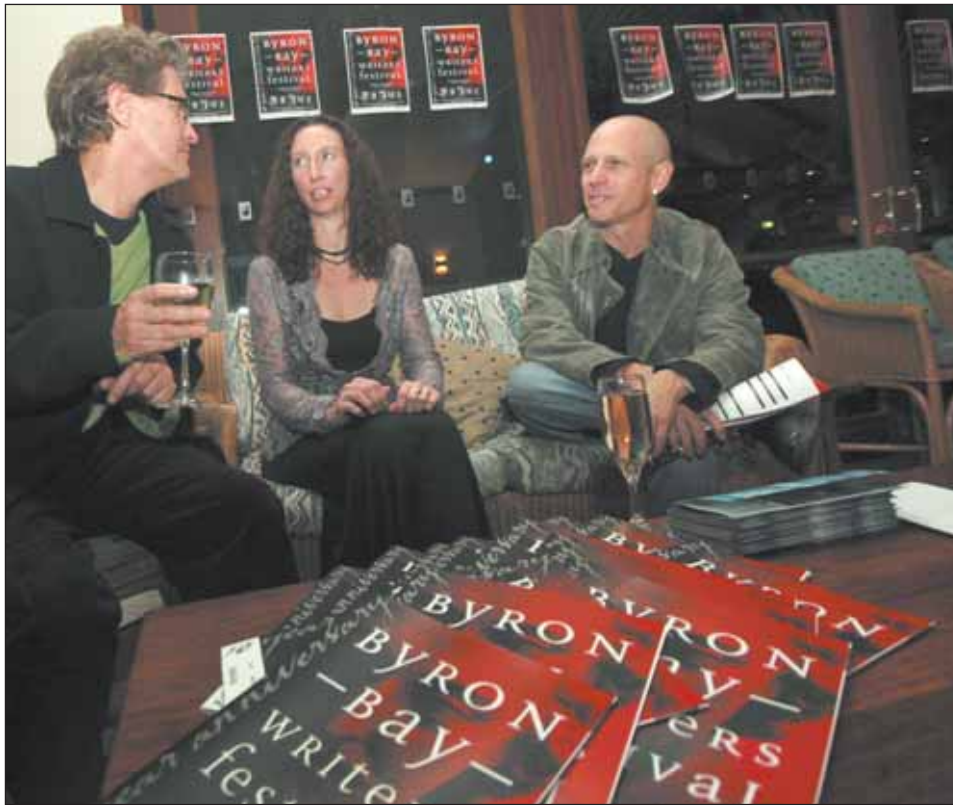

While Di Roberts from FFFOO describes the short term shed closure as 'wonderful news', she remains unimpressed by the prospect of the chickens returning in Spring.

'Summer, winter, whatever, we still have a pong,' she said.

Andrew Young is more optimistic about finding a resolution and would like the

plant to remain in its Ewingsdale location.

'Our desire is to remain a part of the Bay community. As a first step we need to negotiate a fair and commercial cost to connect to sewage or treat our effluent on site. We believe this is achievable,' said Mr Young.

'There have been many complaints about the odour from Sunnybrand; we have listened and acted.

'The flip side to this is that we don't hear many

voices in support of our business - we have donated over \$300,000 to schools, charities and community groups over the past few years and will continue to do so whilst we remain a viable part of this community.'

## Bridge maintenance

Planned maintenance on the Federation Bridge over the Brunswick River at Mullumbimby is due to start on June 13. The \$255,000 project is fully funded by the state government.

The bridge will be repainted and the concrete deck repaired, helping to strengthen the bridge, and the barrier rail along the pedestrian walkway will be replaced. The work on the bridge will also include cleaning and the removal of dirt and bird droppings from bridge deck and beams to help prevent corrosion.

The bridge was constructed in 1930. The work is expected to be completed by the end of June, weather permitting.

## Mullum boys get enterprising on the internet

Eight students from Mullumbimby High School have been learning how to start a business using eBay – and are busy photographing and listing their wares as part of Byron Youth Service's Enterprise Program.

Under the guidance of trained mentor Saul Goodwin, the boys brought some things along from home that they no longer needed and used them to learn about setting up an item for sale on eBay.

'eBay is the fastest growing internet-based sales system for small business operators,' said Saul. 'It's great to share my knowledge of eBay with the boys from Mullumbimby and I can already see that

they will benefit greatly by knowing how to access the opportunities provided to individuals using eBay.'

The boys attend The Cottage in Mullumbimby once a week as part of the Special Education project between Byron Youth Service and Mullumbimby High School.

Deborah Pearse, coordinator of the Cottage, said, 'The program aims to support schooled young people aged 14-16 who are experiencing difficulties in the school system. The program is educational and developmental and assists participants in the process of making responsible decisions, which will reflect in all areas of their lives.



'Informal group work focuses on developing skills in effective communication, managing emotions, team building, conflict resolution, relationship building, targeting adolescent issues and the

adult world and options for the future either in school, alternative education or work. Skills based activities provide an opportunity to have fun and learn new skills and the boys have so far participated in a surf clinic, discussion groups, a hip hop music group and for this term are working at becoming young entrepreneurs.'

The Department of Family & Community Services funds Byron Youth Service to provide both the Enterprise Awareness in Schools and Special Education with the local high school.

## New electricity substation at Lennox Head

Last week's state budget provided \$5.5 million for the construction of a new electricity substation at Lennox Head. Manager of Ballina Shire Council's Regulatory Services Group Rod Willis explained that Council gave its approval for the

substation in June last year.

'The proposed site for the substation is Newrybar Swamp Road, which Council felt is a rural area reasonably separated from housing and so forth,' said Mr Willis. 'Country Energy applied for consent for the new substa-

tion to enable smooth operation and supply of electricity to the north coast where there is pressure on all infrastructure.'

The substation will cater for future loads in Lennox Head, Cumbalum, and West Ballina.

## Film reveals how Cuba survived Peak Oil

When Cuba lost access to Soviet oil in the early 1990s, the country faced an immediate crisis - feeding the population - and an on-going challenge: how to create a new low-energy society.

# Mural brightens Byron Bay youth house

Recent graduate Michelle Quaine last week unveiled a mural she has painted on a wall of the Byron Bay Youth House to thank the service for helping her get her life together.

While she sympathises with the plight of local youth who've been caught up in recent riots on the streets of Byron Bay, teenager Michelle Quaine admits that she has better things to do – such as getting her own life back on track.

However, if it wasn't for the Byron Bay Youth House, which provides short term accommodation for youth at risk of homelessness, she could have gone down a very different path.

'Local youths under the age of 18 living in difficult situations have nowhere else to go,' says Youth House coordinator Jakki Williams. 'We step in before they become homeless and teach them basic living skills that will help

keep these kids off the streets.'

Having just graduated from the Youth House and enrolled in a hospitality course, Michelle decided to paint a mural for residents and youth workers to express her gratitude.

'I was in a bad situation before, and the Youth House gave me the space to sort myself out and prepare for the future,' says Michelle.

'To be able to come here free of judgement and learn how to be your own person,

you just can't put a price on that.'

With the theme 'a new beginning', the mural covers an entire wall on the outside of the house and depicts a butterfly emerging from its cocoon.

# Byron pressured over fluoridation

Representatives from the Department of Health met with Byron Shire Council last Thursday to push the case for fluoridation of the local water supply.

Of the four councils supplied by Rous Water, Ballina and Richmond Valley have been won over to the pro fluoridation case, Lismore is due to make a decision this week and Byron Shire Council has voted against the plan.

The Department of Health's case for fluoridation centres on the poor dental health of certain sectors of the community and the results of a survey in which the majority of respondents in the Rous Water catchment supported fluoridation.

The simplest method of fluoridating the water supply is to add the chemical at the central treatment plant, Rous

Water's general manager Paul Muldoon told *The Echo*. However if one or more councils veto the plan, then fluoride can be added at each of the area's reservoirs by council staff he explained.

'Equally Rous Water is an autonomous authority and could go ahead and fluoridate of its own accord. It has the right to do that,' said Mr Muldoon. 'From discussions held to date it is unlikely that Rous would do that,' he said.

'Technically even if Rous Water did do that and Byron Shire Council didn't want it then Byron Shire Council could remove the fluoride from its water supply,' Mr Muldoon said.

Byron Shire Councillors voted 7-3 against fluoridation when the issue was last considered.

Councillors Barham, Kestle, Lazarus, Mangleson, Staples, Tabart and Westheimer

were those who took a stance against fluoridation.

Last week nothing much seemed to have changed, with Cr Kestle saying he had not changed his position and Cr Westheimer confirming he was still vehemently against fluoridation.

'There is increasing medical evidence, reputable scientific evidence, saying the side effects can be significant from fluoride. I am not into medicating people through the water supply,' said Cr Westheimer, who is also a doctor.

'If dental health is an issue then the Department should be thinking about a public information campaign,' Byron Shire Mayor Jan Barham. 'By fluoridating they are taking away people's choice.'

Cr Ross Tucker who has long supported fluoridation because he believes it will improve dental health said this week, 'If we were clever

we would reconsider the matter in light of the community survey.'

Lismore Council is due to consider the issue at this week's Council meeting, however Cr Ros Irwin said that the staff recommendation is to support fluoridation.

'The community survey [conducted by the Department of Health] leaves a lot to be desired,' Cr Irwin explained. 'Well over 30% of those surveyed didn't support it,' she said.

Cr Irwin will be asking Lismore councillors to defer the issue until a referendum can be conducted in conjunction with the 2008 local government elections.

Cr Barham believes that if Lismore Council joins Ballina and Richmond Valley Councils in supporting fluoridation then Byron Shire could well be asked to reconsider its position by Rous Water.

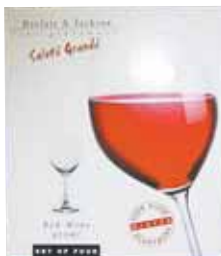

## Too late for a quarry

It is a scandal that a development application (DA) of the scale and importance of the Bower quarry on Left Bank Road at Mullumbimby Creek has been left to float around in Byron Shire Council for 11 years without determination, doubly so because it raised so much controversy in the early 1990s and residents deserve some resolution of the issue. Of course those responsible for the scandal have moved on and it is to the credit of current planning director Ray Darney that he has moved to clear up a contentious backlog of DAs.

There are obvious benefits from quarrying in general. It provides the material for the roads we drive on and provides employment for those who do the quarrying.

However in this case the disadvantages to the residents and the natural environment of the Mullum Creek valley far outweigh any perceived benefits. Times and conditions have changed since the DA was lodged in June 1995 and it is curious the applicant has not sought to update at least the report on environmental effects to support his application. It appears also that little or no work has been done at the quarry over the least ten years, so there must be no sense of urgency in the applicant's mind over the commercial benefits nor protection of existing use rights.

The quarry is no longer an appropriate pursuit in a once isolated valley among cattle farmers and banana growers. The valley has become a burgeoning residential area and social amenity is at stake. In addition the quarry area itself has revegetated and is regarded as of high conservation value under Council's biodiversity map.

The greatest threat to amenity is truck movements and the noise and safety issues that entails. On a narrow road the trucks, estimated at 9,000 movements per year during peak production, will pass some 65 residences, the Shearwater school and the hospital, and emerge at Mullum High to cause further impact on the town's streets or the rural amenity of Myocum Road, depending on the quarry material's final destination.

The obvious choice for Council is to refuse the DA on a number of strong environmental and social grounds. The applicant may then challenge the determination in the Land and Environment Court on the grounds he has existing use rights but, given the vociferous opposition to the proposal to date, residents won't easily kowtow to any judgement unfavourable to their amenity. It is hard to see how any court could impose conditions of consent which would be workable – or enforceable, given Council's record of preventing bad behaviour.

## Howard's gay time may backfire

**T**heoretically, John Howard has the nuclear power inquiry under total control.

Like everyone else he can predict exactly what will come out of it: a determination that (a) Australia should go for broke in mining and exporting uranium while the price is still good and high (subtext: the Labor Party's three mines policy is logically untenable, economically stupid and should be abandoned forthwith) and (b) sooner or later, nuclear power will probably become an economic option for Australia (subtext: we know Howard doesn't want to rule it out altogether, but for the moment it's just a mushroom-shaped pie in the sky).

The problem for Howard is in the second bit: if he is at all serious he will have to pursue it, and doing this will involve looking at the cost not only of nuclear power but of the alternatives. And if this is to have any real credibility it will have to take in not just the existing fossil fuel industry but solar, wind and wave as well, thus bringing the dreaded greens back into the argument – they are boycotting the current inquiry on the justifiable ground that it is purely about the cost of nukes.

But fossil fuels alone could, as it were, blow up in the Prime Minister's face. There are already rumblings that the present inquiry will re-open arguments about a carbon tax, already ruled out by the government. If it goes further into the real cost of coal and oil – environmental as well as just company balance sheets – it may become a real embarrassment, given the government's commitment to fossil fuels for the foreseeable future.

Howard already has his problems holding down the

yet to be concluded inquiry by his old mate Judge Cole into the AWB; the last thing he needs is another unwelcome drag-it-out exercise from his old mate Ziggy Switowski. The way it's going he needs to find distractions from distractions from distractions....

**W**hich brings us to the pseudo furore over gay marriage. While the antics of the politicians have hauled the gay marriage debate back into the headlines, there is not much sign of widespread public excitement over the

irrelevant. An increasing number of marriages are, by choice or biology, childless (and the same religious conservatives are deeply suspicious of allowing them to procure children by artificial means) and in any case birth outside marriage is no longer seen as a social stigma. The word bastard long ago lost any force as an insult in Australia; the characteristic of bastardry has now gone the same way.

Marriage itself is not far behind: the law now accepts the idea of partnership – what

the New South Wales and Victorian premiers over the Snowy backflip, continued in totalitarian mode by thundering that he would override the ACT no matter what form of words it used as it continued its efforts to undermine the sacred institution.

But precisely the reason for the lack of public outrage is that gay marriage does no such thing.

Whether or not the couple next door can brandish a certificate about their relationship is of no importance or interest at all to most people, and it makes no difference whether the couple is straight or gay: what the real homophobes object to is the fact of gayness, not the profession of marriage. In real terms the so-called debate is a non-event.

Howard presumably sees some political advantage in using his numbers in the federal parliament to overrule the ACT legislation, but in the process he may well have wedged himself. This is an issue on which the government would normally allow a conscience vote; but if Howard does so, he risks the defection of an embarrassing number of his own party. Depending on how Labor reacts. He could even be defeated. But if he insists on a disciplined party room vote, there will be serious resentment from some of his backbenchers.

The whole thing has become more trouble than it was ever worth.

I suspect even the majority of the gay community is looking on with bemusement: like Groucho Marx, do they really want to become members of the sort of club which is the subject of so much overblown kerfuffle?

issue. This is for an excellent reason: the issue doesn't actually affect very many people, one way or the other. And the same applies to marriage in general.

These days marriage is much more a matter of convenience than some kind of sacred lifetime institution: it is usually little more than the formalisation of an already existing arrangement, a formalisation understood to be liable to abrupt termination if it ceases to suit either of the participants. This may be a matter of regret and even outrage to some conservatives, especially religious ones, but it remains the statistical truth.

Even the argument that regular – i.e. heterosexual – marriage is unique in that it involves the propagation and rearing of children is largely

used to be rather clumsily called de facto relationships – as being equal in every significant respect to marriage itself, with much the same benefits and disadvantages. And the law applies to gay partnerships as well as to straight ones: so what's all the political fuss about?

Well, as the fusspots are making clear, it's a matter of principle. For Jon Stanhope, the chief minister of the ACT, the principle is the simple one of equity: sexuality should have nothing to do with access to social entitlements, regardless of their worth.

Nonetheless, he chose to describe his version of homosexual marriage as a civil union, in the hope that avoiding the actual m-word might placate his critics.

No way. John Howard, fresh from his humiliation of

not recorded and is totally ignored.

Similarly, the submission concerning growing volumes of Lismore/Casino traffic continuing to use the unsafe Highway and the streets of Bangalow is totally ignored. My opinion that the RTA's Pacific Highway traffic growth rates are improbably low is not recorded or addressed. The issue of why other alternative inland routes were not considered when the study area was expanded is airily dismissed with the statement that alternative routes were not part of the scope of the study (Response 104).

We have heard about the multi-stage program of chaos produced in Sydney by the RTA's technical don't-know-how, and their wishful-thinking traffic forecasts. This latest report provides us with some clues as to how such things have happened. It is not too late to tell the roads minister that at the northern end of the state we would prefer commonsense road planning procedures, that urgent does mean urgent, and that we'd like to be listened to.

Each week, your journal poses legitimate questions by correspondents, left unanswered by Councillors or staff. The hidden anger throughout the Shire is palpable.

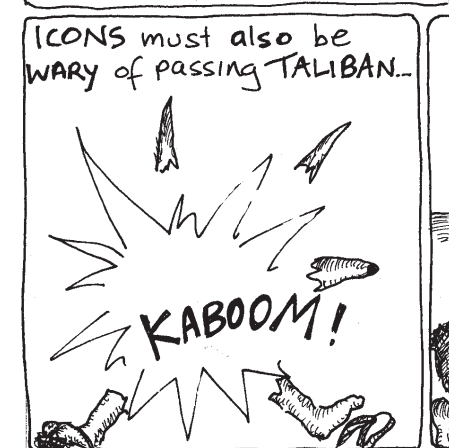
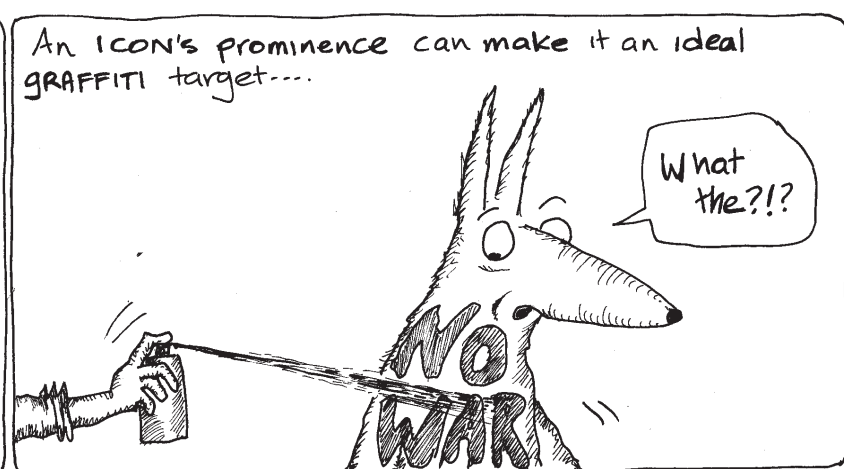
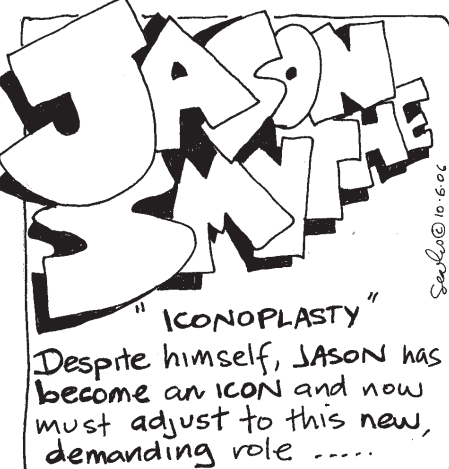

## Mullumbimby High school student studies Pathways to Manhood

Mullumbimby High year 12 student Noah Kaufman is undertaking a Personal Interest Project for his HSC on Pathways to Manhood programs and how they work as contemporary rites of passage for adolescent males in Australia.

Noah attended a Pathways to Manhood program in 2003 when he was 15 and as part of his HSC project research has become involved as a 'Returning Young Man'. This is the term used at Pathways for young men who have previously been through the program and who return to help out with the practicalities of running the camps as well as being someone who can answer questions for both the boys and fathers.

Pathways programs involve a five or six day bush camp experience for teenage boys and their father or supportive man, with involvement in the larger process by the mother and rest of the family. They are a journey for the whole family to support boys to become healthy young men.

Noah said, 'My initial program gave a great sense of community and enabled me to see how all boys my age were going through the exact same changes I was. Pathways provided a really warm and safe environment in which I could express feelings and deal with these changes comfortably.'

'It gave me the chance to spend time and share things with really good quality men other than my father which was quite an uncommon experience for me, but a very valuable one in that I was able to see things from many different perspectives. It has given me a

much broader understanding of issues that face men throughout their lives and I know that if I ever need anything there are people out there who can help me.

'It's a fantastic opportunity to get away from our predictable and sometimes boring lives and discover things about ourselves and the ones we love. Every boy should have the opportunity to experience it.'

'It was a totally different experience going on the camp as a Returning Young Man and I feel that I benefited from this time even more than I did when I attended the camp as a boy. It gave me the chance to reflect on my past and my first camp while giving me the opportunity to help other boys who were going through the same stuff I was and still am, I guess. It was very rewarding.'

According to Noah's father Mark Kaufman, 'Annelies and I attended an introductory evening at Mullumbimby High School about seven years ago facilitated by Dr Arne Rubenstein which we found interesting, informative and stimulating. It resonated with many of the issues we felt important in relation to the raising of our own boys and with our daughter as well. We decided that we were going to participate in the process with our eldest son Karim.'

Then in 2003 the family went through the process again with their younger son Noah.

Mark said, 'It was a unique opportunity to acknowledge, embrace and honour my sons' passages into manhood in the presence of other boys and men doing likewise.'

'I feel the main benefit to our family has been in the shared experience... of Karim and Noah on the camp with me and equally the process of being farewelled by their mother and eventually being welcomed back by her and their sister. It has definitely been an important experience in the enhancement of our bonding together as a family.'

According to Annelies Kaufman, 'The Pathways program was very helpful in looking at ways I could support my sons through this period of change and how I could improve my relationships with them. I loved taking time out to share with other mums about what it is like to have a teenage son.'

'I feel that the programs brought us closer together as a family, it opened up the lines of communication more between myself and my sons and it also increased the level of respect and understanding between myself and my ex-partner.'

Pathways to Manhood camps are run all around Australia by the Pathways Foundation an independent, not for profit, harm prevention charity whose mission is to improve the health and wellbeing of boys and young men in Australia.

Programs are being held on the north coast from July 3 to 8 (with the first night June 21, five spaces available) and August 7-12 (first night July 19, nine spaces available). 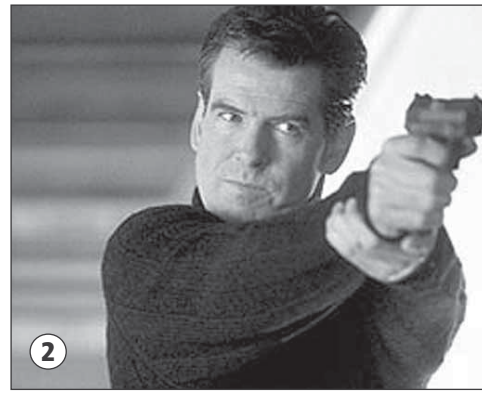

## India seen as a truthful lover

Alan Close reviews *Inhaling The Mahatma* (HarperCollins, \$35) by Christopher Kremmer.

*Inhaling The Mahatma* is a love song to India. But it is not some easy tune of saccharine platitudes about ancient wisdom and modern stupidity. A self-described doubting Thomas – it is his middle name – Christopher Kremmer is a former ABC and *Sydney Morning Herald* correspondent in Delhi. His subsequent acclaimed books – *Bamboo Palace* and *The Carpet Wars*, about Laos and Afghanistan respectively – were written, he says, to ‘better understand the more complex truths’ about these countries which don’t get into the papers.

To better understand the more complex truths – and his own responses – to this great conundrum of a country, in 2004 Kremmer went on a six months yatra or pilgrimage, returning to people and places which had formed his early impressions of India.



Kremmer is first and foremost a journalist and his eye for detail feeds ravenously on this subcontinent of sprawling colour and mind-bending contradictions. One in every six people on the planet is an Indian. It is the world’s largest democracy. With annual growth at 8% it is already the world’s tenth largest economy and it is predicted, when China exhausts its unsustainable manufacturing frenzy, India will leapfrog to global prominence as the IT powerhouse of the multinational economy.

This is a country where goatherders in the Rajastani desert (‘a dream in sand and saltbush’) squat in their hot pink turbans chatting away on their mobile phones. Where Photoshopped ‘wheatish’ – white-skinned – Indian models selling modern appliances (‘Life just got a whole lot better!’) smile down from huge billboards on suppurating lepers begging in the gutter. Where corruption is so endemic and bureaucracy so stagnant legal cases centuries old are still before the courts.

But as one reads into the book, beneath Kremmer’s layering of evocative detail what draws us in is his infectious, almost boyish fascination for the mystery that is India. (Why is India such a frustrating, fascinating and fabulously eccentric place? Because the Hindi words for yesterday and tomorrow are identical. Suddenly it all becomes clear!)

Only as his journey progresses, it seems, does Kremmer himself become aware how deeply India has insinuated itself into his heart. ‘India is contagiously spiritual.’ You start off doubting and before long find that ‘India’s spiritual promiscuity has seduced you’. After dabbing a splash of the holy Ganges on his forehead at the 2001 Hindu festival of Kumbh Mela, where over thirty million pilgrims formed a congregation large enough to be

visible from outer space, he writes, ‘Strange things seemed to happen... mystical things that challenged both professional objectivity and spiritual scepticism.’

While Kremmer’s journey is personal, *Inhaling The Mahatma* also sounds a political warning. As a reporter in 1992, he was caught up in the violence at Ayodhya, deep in the ‘cow belt’ of Uttar Pradesh in northern India, when a 500-year-old mosque built on the ruins of an ancient Hindu temple was destroyed by members of a mob incited by the opposition BJP. In the subsequent nationwide unrest over 2000 people, mostly Moslem, were killed in the name of Hindu nationalism.

Deeply shaken by the episode and what it revealed of Indian politics, Kremmer returned to Ayodhya as part of his yatra ten years later. There he found ‘those working hardest for peace and communal harmony were people we normally associate

with medieval institutions, Hindu priests and maharajas, and those doing the most to keep the hate alive were modern politicians’.

He realised that democracies around the world, including Australia, are increasingly being driven by such destructive politics of the emotions. ‘Politicians may speak the language of faith,’ he writes, ‘but that rarely makes them holy.’

Indeed, seduced by the great tolerance of secular India, he suggests that Hinduism may find a place as an international religion of the twenty-first century.

What started as a young reporter’s anxious need to translate the massive complexities and ‘repugnant’ reality of India into digestible sound bites for a Western audience evolved for Kremmer into acceptance and refuge. ‘India is like a lover who insists on showing you their worst side,’ he concludes, ‘knowing you will still love them.’

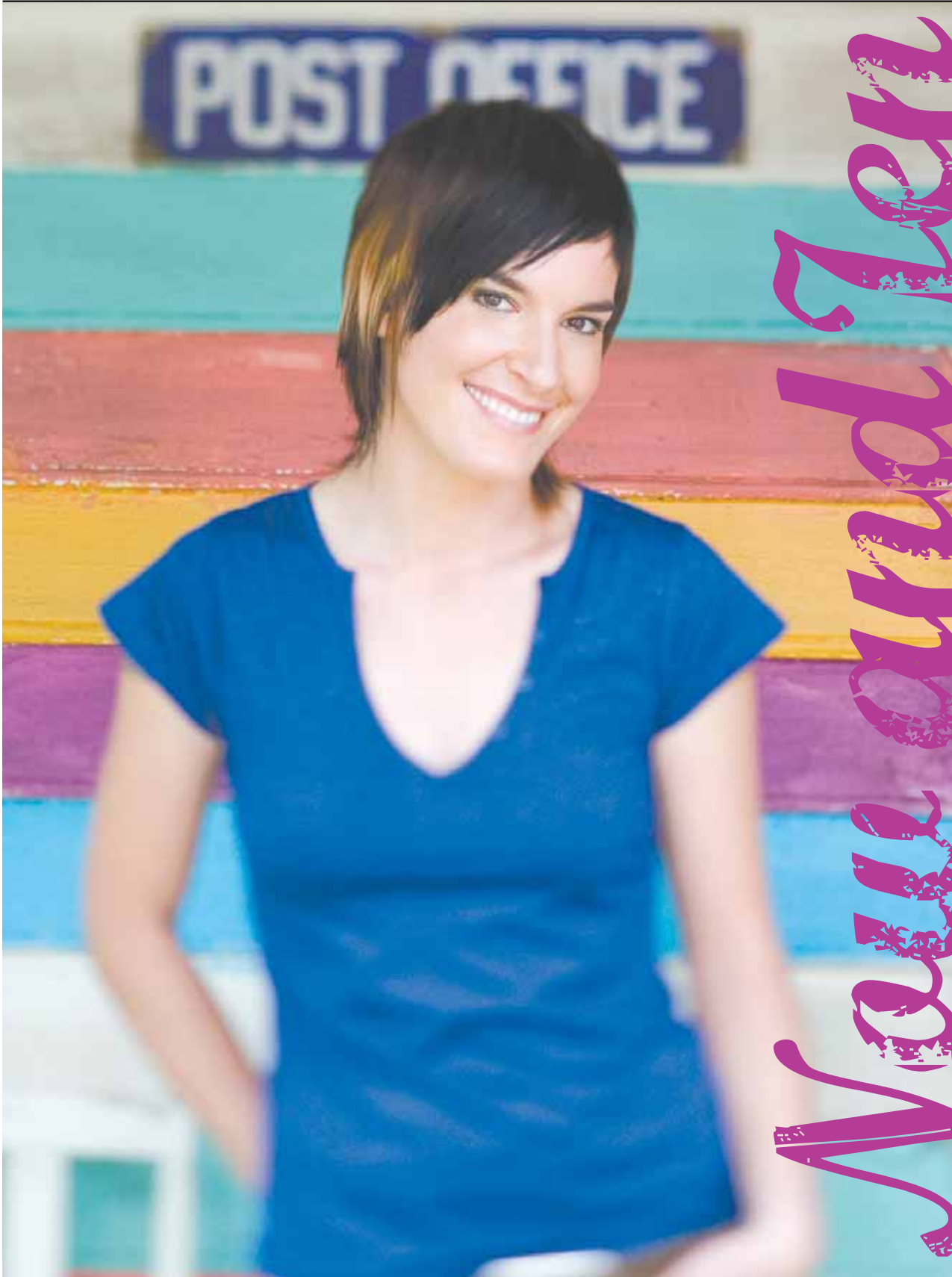

**Jen Cloher is the poster girl for self made music.** Talented, powerful and independent she's a musician who's calmly taking it all in her stride, finding herself making the jump from support with artists like Ben Lee and Mia Dyson to headlining a national tour. Jen attributes a lot of her band's strengths to the vibrant independent market being supported across the country by the ABC.

'As an independent band you really need to have that national airplay. Otherwise you'd be on the road building audiences all the time. So I guess we are really very lucky.'

Live material can change so readily, and in an effort to capture some of the moments, she and her band, **The Endless Sea** make sure that a lot of the gigs are recorded.

'We do record the live stuff. We usually just select about 10 key shows, to try and capture that live sound.'

The sound guy records every live gig though, just for us, in case we do something special.'

Jen Cloher and the Endless Sea are out on the road promoting their debut album 'Dead Wood Falls'. It's found itself awash with glowing reviews and finds itself in stark contrast to the band's live show. The album is dark and quiet and broody, it's unselfconscious and at times completely unrestrained, and at others, exacting and controlled.

'The album is definitely a head phone listen. But live we change everything so much. It's not something that is intentional. We learnt that by opening for acts, because you really have to step up to the plate. The album I suppose reflects how we were playing about two years ago. I think it's absolutely perfect for what it is.'

So the secret to Jen Cloher's success? Having a good plan.

'I think people are definitely waking up to the fact that you have to have a good plan! If you write a good plan you really get a lot more focused. I am self managed, but I'm lucky that I put my work through an independent label who promotes me in the market. I mean who is going to listen to a musician ringing them and going on about how great they are?'

It's been a big year for Jen and her band with live shows creating a certain anticipation in watching their development. There's a feeling of paddling out on a wave that's about to break.

'It's interesting just watching. It feels like there's a bit of momentum out there and that comes from people buying the album and seeing the live show. People start to talk and it really gets it going. There's been a few gigs that brought it home to me... walking into a packed room in Annandale of over 300 people...'

For Jen, being in control of her work has been imperative. She is the songwriter, the composer, the arranger. She is the boss. The Band operates very much according to her vision, and there's a kind of creative harmony that comes through the music. No one is vying for leadership in this band, Jen Cloher is in charge.

'Artists are really starting to take control of their work. There's been a revolution in people taking control!'

## Interview

### Are you my Wolfmother?

**Myles Heskett, Chris Ross and Andrew Stockdale are the key holders of kool. This curly topped crew have taken the music world in their teeth and given it one hell of a shake. Mild mannered by day, when these former graphic artist, photographer and digital maestro's dropped their equipment and took up guitars, a beast was unleashed. I spoke with Myles from the States amid his hectic tour schedule.**

### First question I came up with was fucking brilliant. Where are you?

'We're in Washington. It's great we have been here since February – the album came out in May. It's been really good... but we are a bit homesick. We don't get a lot of breaks. After we do our Aussie gigs we will be heading over to Europe to do the Festivals over there. We are doing the Redding Festival... and supporting Pearl Jam.' Gees, every boy's dream.

The whole trip has taken **Wolfmother** by surprise. After all they spent five years playing without ever doing one live gig.

'We spent five years jamming and getting it really tight. Once we started playing – we got signed and that really helped. The guy from Modular Records heard about us and came to our fifth show.'

Since they've been in LA, the guys have rented an abandoned Hollywood recording

studio for their rehearsal space. In its heyday the space hosted sessions like Pink Floyd's 'The Wall', and from this place wild freeform jams have evolved into fully formed songs.

It's all heady stuff, and the rock and roll rampage is costing Wolfmother. Apparently Chris keeps trying to smash his very expensive keyboard at gigs.

'He always smashes the keyboard. The problem is he's chosen a really rare organ.'

The band credit a lot of their

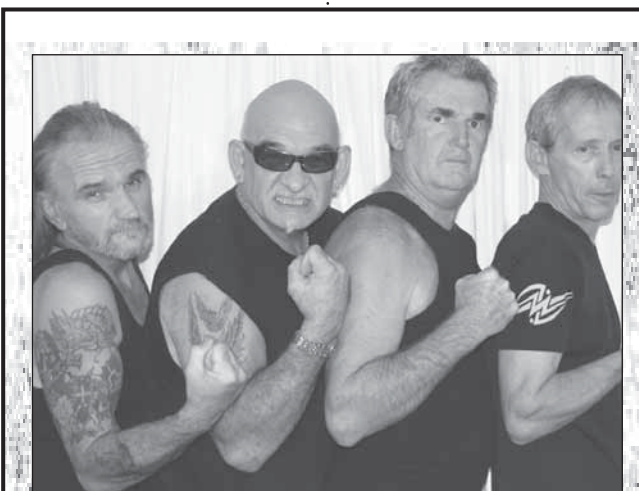

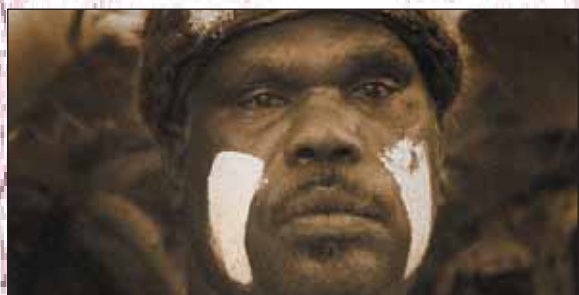



## THE BREAK-UP

This is a romantic comedy that delivers with the comedy but is almost bereft of romance. Gary (Vince Vaughn) is a Polack tour guide who is happiest when goofing off with his playstation or watching the Chicago Cubs on TV. His energetic partner, Brooke (Jennifer Aniston), works in a swank art gallery. They have a fierce row and decide to split, but neither wants to leave their shared condo. It is over its occupation that the never-ending battle of the sexes goes a few more bruising rounds. As co-writer, it's hard to fathom why Vaughn made such a rod for his own back in creating his slovenly, unarguably at fault character. A loud actor with a tendency to get louder when called upon for emotional depth, he can get tiresome. There are sharp sitcom gags and well-worn puffer jokes, but it rarely rises above the slanging match. Lightened by fine supporting roles, including a welcome return of Judy Davis as the viperish gallery owner, it hits some raw nerves, but its major weakness is that, until the soapy last scene, neither of the pair seems to care for the other, which makes it hard for the viewer to care. **John Campbell**



## CARS

Cinema regularly applies human characteristics to animals. Attempting it with hunks of metal is more problematic, but here it works remarkably. Lightning McQueen is a self-absorbed racing car who runs off the freeway when on his way to California to compete in a championship final. He finds himself in Radiator Springs, where he comes to learn the humbler but higher values of life from its yokels. He also falls in love and it is a minor failing that, try as they might, the creators couldn't imbue the female car with physical sexuality. When she shows McQueen how crass modernity has corrupted society and blighted nature, the story veers unexpectedly into the piquant and I'll be damned if it doesn't get all touchy-feely. In looking back to a less triumphal, more altruistic past, McQueen's enlightenment prompts him to reassess his own goals. Musically complemented by the sure hand of Randy Newman, the arrival at Rapid Springs is a gem of tumbleweed twang - its restorative tone and positive morality, mixed with fabulous animation, make it a tonic for audiences of all ages. **John Campbell**

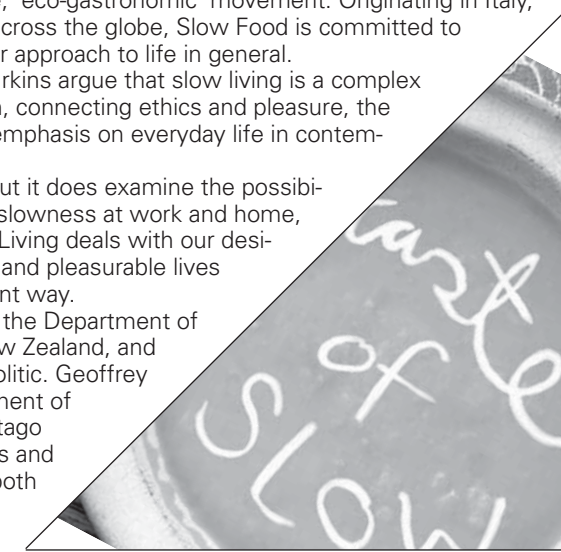
Speed is the essence of the modern era, but our faster, more frenetic lives often trouble us and leave us wondering how we are meant to live in today's world.

## Just desserts

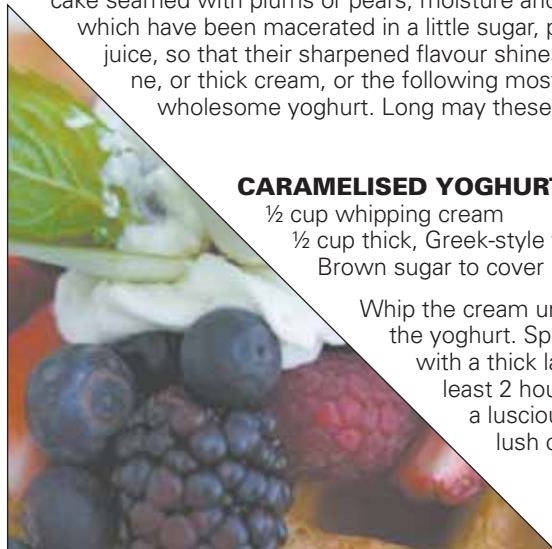

**MY FRIEND** Mandy and I used to take ourselves off to Lumby's after school, two Canberra teenagers whose box-pleat uniforms would be rucked up to our meaty thighs, and treat ourselves to waffles and icecream. The icecream would be melting by the time they hit the table, both from the heat of puffy, eggy waffles beneath and that of hot caramel above; a sizeable portion of cream featured as well, I seem to recall.

I do not come across waffles on many dessert menus any more – a shame, because they definitely have a place among all the other dietarily incorrect sweetmeats on offer – but even if I did I doubt they would tempt me much any more. Decades of diets and self-denial have trained me to a level of pure and genuine disinterest as far as desserts are concerned, and the joy for me now resides in the making of them for others. That vicarious pleasure – so firmly, by now, engraved upon my culinary psyche – of experiencing someone else devour is even more satisfying to me than if it were I doing the devouring, and I say this with utmost sincerity. (Ah, the power of the mind!) In fact for a long time in restaurants there I was practising another form of self-deception by ordering, at meal's end, a cheese platter – as if the fact it was a savoury course somehow extinguished the issue of calories.

These days I am infinitely more balanced, guided by the mantra that a little of what you fancy will not be bad for you, and so succumb to the occasional dessert. A dessert is generally, after all, the last thing you will eat in a particular establishment and the final memory you take away, and precisely for that reason a chef should care about this course. As it turns out, many chefs regard the dessert side of things as infinitely less important and interesting than the preceding courses; many chefs, and especially male chefs, feel a complete absence of passion in its regard. My teacher, mentor and ex-amore Gian Carlo loathed making them, and with undisguised glee handed the task over to me; with glee no more disguised I accepted it like a gift. Somehow there is something about making sweet things for other people which seems more to do with love than the whipping up, say, of a roast dinner or a glamorous entree. Perhaps it is the lyrical language of desserts. The language of food can be extraordinarily evocative; the language of sweet things may approach poetry. Rosewater pannacotta with Persian fairy floss and pistachio praline. Plums under snow with honeycakes. Lime mousse and lemon verbena icecream. Raspberry meringue. Red wine jelly with frosted fruits. Triple chocolate terrine. Chocolate kahlua parfait, caramel pecan parfait. Champagne-poached rhubarb scented with rose geranium and coconut sorbet. Poached peaches. Assonance and alliteration. Perhaps not Spotted Dick...

My favourite desserts, both for serving and eating, consist of three components: something cakey, something fruity, something creamy. Ideally a syrup cake, or a gritty polenta cake seamed with plums or pears, moisture and texture. The fruit as simple as berries which have been macerated in a little sugar, perhaps a liqueur or wine, or citrus juice, so that their sharpened flavour shines through. The cream either mascarpone, or thick cream, or the following most magnificent recipe based on worthy, wholesome yoghurt. Long may these sweet self-deceptions prevail!



### CARAMELISED YOGHURT

- ½ cup whipping cream
- ½ cup thick, Greek-style yoghurt
- Brown sugar to cover

Whip the cream until stiff and peaky then gently fold in the yoghurt. Spoon the mixture into a bowl and cover with a thick layer of brown sugar. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours, ideally longer. The sugar melts into a luscious caramelly syrup for the faintly tart, lush cream. Dollop it on.

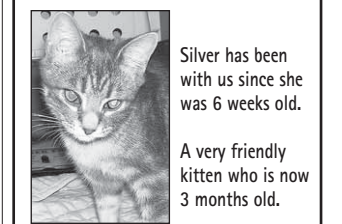

### PACE rides on to promote green energy

In an effort to raise awareness for climate change, members of PACE (Pedal Australia for Clean Energy) cycled through Byron Bay this week. Three bicycle riders and a bio diesel powered Landcruiser started out three months ago from Melbourne and are currently circumnavigating the continent.

'We are raising awareness about climate change, building grass roots networks and educating people as to what they can do,' PACE's Severin Staalesen told *The Echo*.

The group gives talks to schools and universities, and their next stop is Lismore's Southern Cross University to give a workshop on campaign strategies.

PACE focuses on three issues: transport, food and power.

With statistics provided by the Australian Conservation Society, they say that by cycling 40kms a week you can reduce your emissions by 500kgs per year.

Also if you eat 300 less grams of meat a week it reduces emissions by 600kg per year.

The group advocates accredited green power which is available from most electricity providers.

For a few extra dollars per bill, electricity companies have to source renewable fuel such as solar, wind or hydroelectric.

Nuclear power is not a solution, says Severin.

'Doubling nuclear output by 2050 would only reduce carbon emissions by 5%. It also takes 10-15 years to build a nuclear power plant which makes it not a long term solution.'

Since the journey started, sourcing vegie oil from restaurants for fuel has not been too difficult.

'In Lakes Entrance, the fish and chip shops are actually selling their used oil to the farmers at a set price. The farmers mix it with food grain so that it doesn't blow away,' Severin said.

They aim to cover 70kms a day, and new cyclists will be joining them next month. 'I am really looking forward to cycling in the natural beauty of the desert on the west coast,' Severin added.

Activities include bird and tree identification walks and practical workshops on weed control and protection of riparian vegetation to protect our waterways.

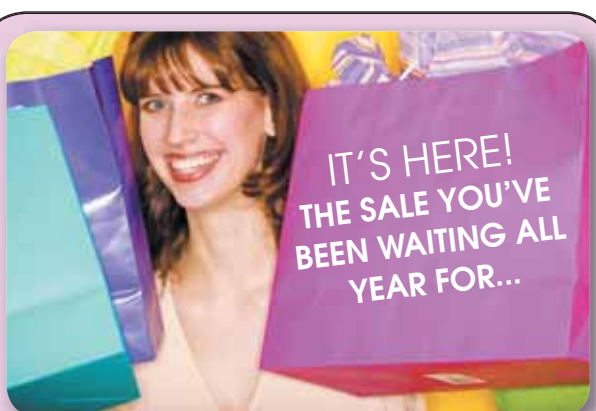

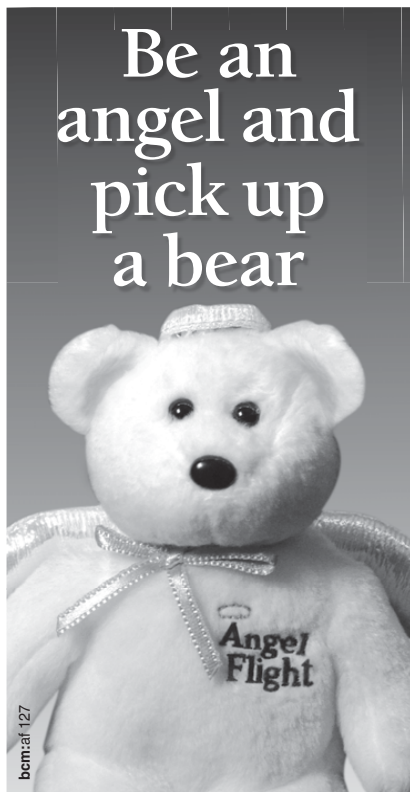
### Engine brake noise paper

Engine brake noise caused by worn, defective or inferior mufflers on heavy vehicles has been a community concern for some time, yet remains largely unregulated.

The National Transport Commission (NTC) has commissioned research to develop a means of picking out 'annoying' engine brake noise from the traffic stream. A second component of the proposed regulation is the

potential for governments to specify engine brake noise exclusion zones in noise-sensitive high-density population areas, where there is no risk to vehicle safety.

### CHES by Ian Rogers

After an astonishing final two rounds, the Australian open team at the Turin Chess Olympiad climbed over 50 countries to finish in a record-breaking 20th place in a field of teams from 143 countries.

Once before, at the 1976 Olympiad in Haifa, an Australian team has finished higher but that event was hit by a boycott from Eastern European countries. 30 years on, the boycotting USSR and Yugoslavia have split into more than 20 powerful chess countries, so the final result by the 50th seeded Australian team was beyond any expectations.

Australia topped all its regional rivals in South-East Asia and even outscored the second seeded Indians. Finishing only two points behind the sixth placed Russians was certainly flattering but such were the benefits of Australia's final round 4-0 whitewash of Peru.

As expected, Australia's young stars David Smerdon and Zhao Zong Yuan more than held their own on boards two and three but most credit for Australia's result should go to Alex Wohl who scored seven wins from eight games and narrowly missed a medal on board five.

After four previous Olympiad appearances ranging from mediocre to disastrous, Wohl had something to prove and the peripatetic 42-year-old (who lives in Wilsons Creek near Mullumbimby when not touring) made the most of what he said was likely to be

one of his last Olympiad appearances.

It might seem that Wohl was being too pessimistic but with the open Olympiad being cut to five players per team, he declared himself a realist. 'Smerdon and Zhao are safe, [GM] Darryl [Johansen] may return to the team and then there's Moulthun and Ray,' said Wohl, referring to two of Australia's prodigious juniors Moulthun Ly and Ray Song.

Australia's women players had a less successful Olympiad, finishing a few places below their seeding in midfield, with only Ngan Koshnitsky scoring above 50%.

This week's game sees Wohl outplaying an Egyptian International Master.

'It will be a world class final with some top pros and younger, well developed juniors coming up to challenge them,' said Showdown spokesperson Maz Pentecost. 'There's been a very

strong south westerly breeze and solid two metre sets, yet in nearly every age group we've seen at least two of the girls manage to get out the back. 'The spectators have had their hearts in their mouths; it's been so exciting. The young guys who've been watching, many of whom are up and coming competitors themselves, have been really impressed with the skill these girls have shown.'

One competitor to stand out in her 14 and under heat was Maddi King (pictured) who showed tremendous strength to paddle through the two metre sets and get out the back in order to catch not one but two of

the monster waves. While one was a wipeout, the other was a good ride which put her into the final to be run later today (Monday). Another local girl and member of the All Girls Surf Club, Lyla Wright from Lennox Head, also got through to the 14 and under final.

'Paul Young is the head judge here and he has been very impressed with the standard of surfing,' said Maz. 'He said that the cleverness of the girls and the way they choose their waves would give a lot of the guys a run for their money!'

The finals were to be held on Monday afternoon; results in next week's roundup.

## Swallowtail dart give hours of fishing fun

For some unknown reason, tailor just about vanished from the area in the middle of last week. Until then they had been about in good numbers with plenty of fish up to 2.5kg being caught most mornings and evenings. Best approach was with a medium sized shiny lure, with strips of mullet and blue pilchard baits also working.

'Snowy' or winter bream have shown up along all the beaches. They are larger than the river fish and well worth catching for a tasty feed. Try for them with cubes of mullet on a fair sized baitholder hook, set up on a running sinker rig around the edges of the rocks.

Some stumpy whiting have made an appearance both from low tide gutters along the beaches and around the edges of the weed beds in North Creek, with some fish over 500 grams. Use live worms, freshly pumped yabbies or fresh pippies for best results, although reports from the beach seem to indicate that they are hungry enough to bite on most baits.

'Schoolie' jewfish up to 10kg were around the beaches at night over the full moon, with fish being landed every night last week, and

some large beasts proving too big to handle and making good their escape. Some of the reports indicate that fish up to 20kg were around, so try again on the new moon and next month's full moon.

For a fun time fishing, take some fresh prawns up the

beach with light tackle and aim at the swallowtail dart that are around. Although not big fish, and quite a few are needed to make a good feed, they are probably on a pound for pound basis one of the most enjoyable catches as they fight so hard in the surf.
