

# One storm could cause \$100 million damage

Just one severe storm could affect beach front property worth over \$100 million according to the head of Australia's first large scale investigation into the impact of severe study will be to model the imporstorms and sea level rise on coastal New South Wales.

Dr Rosh Ranasinghe from the Department of Natural Resources's Coastal Unit will lead the study, which will bring together scientists from the University of Queensland and University of Sydney along with international expert Professor Magnus Larson from Lund University in Sweden.

'It is hoped these Boycott Japanese products demonstrations will put pressure on Japan to stop killing whales,' said Dean Jefferys.

'When Japan starts losing millions of dollars in revenue, lost taxes and investments it will have to stop killing whales. When a country is so out of step with world public opinion then people's consumer power can bring them back into line. The world needs to do to Japan what we did to South Africa to stop Apartheid.

It's everybody's worst nightmare: you're travelling abroad in a foreign country far from home when war breaks out. You find yourself unable to leave the war torn region and unable to get to safety. You are without your family and friends; you're on your own, and you're scared.

Unfortunately for a number of Australians, this is the situation they have found themselves in while travelling to or temporarily living in Lebanon at the time of the outbreak of hostilities between Israel and Lebanon, or, more specifically, Hezbollah.



Resources] and we will be factoring sea level rises into the coastline management plan,' said Council's Director of Planning, Ray Darney.

Byron Shire Mayor, Jan Barham, is concerned that the lessons learnt from overseas studies are not being heeded in Australia. 'Best practice demands that we should look at worse case scenario planning, which means working with a sea level rise of 0.8 metres.

'Next year the IPCC [Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Changel is due to release its next report and the indications are that the sea level rise benchmarks could be revised upwards,' she added.

The first meeting of Byron Shire Council's new coastline management plan committee, which is made up of community members, councillors, council staff and representatives of various interest groups, is scheduled to take place next month.







## **Advertising on the ABC**

The big carrot dangled in front of Aunty viewers when the prospect of advertising is raised is a healthy boost in the cash strapped broadcaster's programming budget. Australian made drama has been particularly hard hit in recent years as government funding has not kept pace with production costs and the ABC has had to rely on more and more imported drama. SBS raised \$29 million last year from advertising revenues and managing director, Shaun Brown, has been reported as saying that every dollar was allocated into the production budget.

Advertisers will be waiting in the wings eager to access the ABC's well educated, higher socio-economic audience who traditionally avoid commercial television. But here is the rub, of course. Does this discerning audience avoid commercial television because the content of the programs don't appeal or because they find the endless commercial breaks a turn off?

Some commentators on the subject have argued that if the entertainment value of the ads can be raised to suit the tastes of Aunty's audience then advertising could be made tolerable. It's hard to see however how such a subjective quality check could be workable.

The Northern Rivers branch of the Friends of the ABC debated the issue recently in Bangalow. It believes that if the broadcaster is forced to accept advertising, the quality of product could well worsen rather than improve. It's not just the distracting nature of advertising breaks that has the Friends worried, it is the pressures on editorial freedom that commercial interests might bring. President of the local Friends of the ABC, Neville Jennings, cites current affairs programs as being most at risk suggesting producers might be discouraged from shining the spotlight on companies which also help fund the broadcaster through advertising contracts

The introduction of commercial breaks on SBS Television in 1991 turned on the cash taps, but turned off the viewers it seems. More than half SBS viewers turn off or tune out during advertising breaks, a far higher proportion than viewers of other commercial channels. SBS has now announced a change to its format to start screening ads during programs, despite research that its audience is overwhelmingly against the move. Unlike channels Seven, Nine and Ten which can screen up to 15 minutes of commercials each hour, SBS viewers will only be subjected to five minutes per hour. SBS believes the promise of an extra \$10 million in advertising revenue is worth the risk of alienating its audience.

Supporters of a commercial free ABC say that the example of SBS is a warning of what may come if the national broadcaster is forced to dip a toe into the commercial waters. Strictly speaking, the ABC is not currently commercial free anyway. The many program trailers and promotions for ABC products such as videos and CDs already provide ample time to make a cup of tea and take a leisurely pee. The addition of even more advertising time per hour could be enough to persuade even the most patient ABC watcher to turn off and pick up a book instead.

All religions share equal perks, like freedom from taxation. But the God to which the federal parliament officially prays at the start of every sitting remains the Christian trinity.

This, however, is supposedly as far as it goes: section 116 is generally taken to mean that Australia should and politics is breached, especially by those talking of a moral crusade (which actually means making their reliextreme Islamists do with Sharia law) it is time to be both alert and alarmed.







# A mother's story of the downward spiral into drug addiction hell

For over 30 years The Buttery at Binna Burra has been helping people with their addictions. Residential and outreach programs are offered for those struggling to overcome drug, alcohol or gambling problems and assistance is given to help families cope with the strain of living with addiction. One mother tells her story below of the painful journey her son travelled from addiction back to good health with the help of the good folk at The Buttery.

I know I can say this to every parent out there and that you will understand -Life with Michael when most of the time when my son was afflicted with this terrible thing, I simply wanted it to be me. I wished more than anything in the world that I could swap places with him and take from him all his pain, all his breath. Would he be misery.

I felt it would be easier to

it hurt me more to see him suffer than it would for me to go through it myself. It is something they don't tell you in birthing classes. It's the real essence of loving a child – that you would give your life in exchange for theirs if it really came down

It's why on many nights during those dark times all I could do was stand on the balcony and howl at the moon like a wild animal, (much to the utter bewilderment of my poor husband who wanted to console me but found I was inconsolable). I would cry and sob for hours until physical exhaustion stopped me.

Watching my son destroy himself was unbearable and looking ahead to a life without him felt so barren and so empty that it seemed like no future at all. I'm not sure what would have happened if Michael had died, or even if he had just continued as an addict, but somehow during that very dark time we found The Buttery.

I can say, '100% of unsubstantiated figures quoted in letters to this column are absolute clap-trap.' But unless I provide the source, how can you possibly decide whether to believe me or not?

## Saving our birds

Driving through Brunswick Heads the other day I noticed a noisy mynah (native bird) lying on the road who must have been hit by a car not far ahead of me. The bird's family were swooping down, puzzled as to what had happened to him. As I always do, I stopped to move his (still warm) body off the road to the side where the family could grieve safely.

I drove on feeling distraught that anyone could hit a fellow creature and not stop to check whether it was alive or move the body. I have hit birds (and other wildlife) myself before – it's easy to do. Sometimes the bird is just stunned and needs time to recover but lying on the road spells almost certain death from the following car.

Likewise other creatures – sometimes they can be saved but left on the road they have no hope. Often more deaths follow as the would-be consumers of the dead bodies are killed or, as with the mynahs, grieving family members gather round and are also hit.

We need to speak up on behalf of the birds (and other wildlife) that are left to suffer on the roads

Please listen up - if a bird (or other creature) is lying on the road, or you hit one, please stop and move it to the side of the road and if the creature lives ring WIRES (6628 1898) for help in its nursing care.



Every five years, the Australian Bureau of Statistics holds a Census. It's important to do this because every Census provides us with information that helps shape our community. This Tuesday 8th August it's Census time again.

Your involvement in the Census is vital. With the input of everyone in Australia, we can build an understanding of our population. And the information provided is used to make planning decisions about everything from education to healthcare.

In the days before Tuesday 8th August, a Census Collector will deliver a Census form to your house. No matter where you are on Census Night, you're required to be included on a Census form. Soon after Census Night, your Collector will call back to pick up your completed form. If you're not at home, your Collector will leave a card with an estimate of when they will return.

The information that you provide in your Census is kept strictly confidential. Collectors are bound by law to keep your information secure, and the ABS will not release any details that may allow you or your household to be identified. Once Census

processing is complete all name and address information will be destroyed.

This year, you also have the choice of completing your Census form online at www.census.abs.gov.au The 'eCensus' uses the strongest encryption technology that a standard browser will support, so it's another highly secure option. If you submit your Census online, the Collector will not return to your home.

The Census can help build a better future for our country but we can't make it a success without you. So do your bit for Australia and fill in your form on Tuesday 8th August.

# **Looking back to earlier times in Byron Bay**

Death of a Whaler by Nerida Newton

Published by Allen & Unwin Reviewed by Rusty Miller

This yarn accurately paints the atmosphere of Byron Bay just at the end of its whaling operations and sets you well into what Australian historians might call the Aquarius Rainbow era; a milestone time of major social and economic changes (1962 into the mid 1970s) that reshaped the personality of this community forever.

It begins with a tragic incident two days before the whale processing plant warm pet accompaniment to (located at the Belongil) shuts down. Then, Newton steadily lays out the many impacts of this traumatic event, while slipping in pieces of real history. Protagonist Flinch, a true son of Byron, is a quiet, humbled, and physically lame young man hampered in life by a now deceased psychosis marked single mum. 





## DIANA ANAID HAS NEVER DONE ANYTHING BY HALVES.

At just 28 this talented young singer/ songwriter has created and released three remarkably good albums, had a hit single blasted around the country, and performed stages all across the USA. Not bad for a country girl from Nimbin. Diana is getting ready to head back to the States, but before she departs she's planning a live recording of her fourth album and video clip, all to take place in one spectacular mini-festival at Nimbin Bush Theatre this Saturday night. Diana found her voice quite early, and it was Nimbin that first nurtured this emerging

'I wanted to be a singer since I was tiny. I used to carry around a pad and pen. I got on stage at the age of 7 in Nimbin – so Nimbin is very sentimental as a place – we came back through when I was 11, and this is where I have the longest feeling of family. The musicians around here are incredible, so supportive, not to mention talented – I hope that I can help put Nimbin on the map for the right reasons, there is just so much talent in the Rainbow Region.'

Byron has also suffered the 'stereotyping' from outsiders, although as Diana points out, however one dimensional, it's eminently more positive what happens to Nimbin

'I'd rather be labelled as a trendy haven for superstars, than a drug haven. Nimbin on a good day is amazing – it has a huge community spirit. The people are so loving and compassionate and forgiving. And for people who are lonely and depressed with no family - it lifts them up. I have had times when I have been heart broken, or suicidal, and people were here for me and that's what it's all about...that's what I write my songs about – I want to connect in the most important way. I want to make people understand. It's a powerful thing. When you make them cry because you make them remember something it's indescribable. A woman wrote to me and told me the song Last Thing gave her the courage to end an abusive relationship.

Music can be a potent instigator of change, a message stick for the masses. How many musicians really want to change the world?

'Lots of people get into music to change the world, or make millions of dollars and give it to Greenpeace. It's the same for me, I really want to reach out and help people.'

It takes a lot of courage to be an emotionally honest songwriter and Diana's songs are raw to the bone. 'I really admire Alanis when she opened up and said some things in her songs – some people will say the same, and have been through it worse – very rarely would I make anything up...'

So is that a kind of musical integrity?

'That's a beautiful word, integrity, it really applies to the music industry. If everyone around has integrity it makes the whole experience much better.'

Being an independent musician is crucial for Diana retaining her courageous and individual voice. 'I have been an Indy artist for the last 3 albums. Its not about the Arias and how much you sell or how many promoters you suck up to, it should always be about the music.'

'The Internet has really opened a lot of channels to make music without having to sign to a record label and people can make their music that way and virtually anyone can access it, and everyone has a chance.' So is song writing a coping mechanism? Can it help transform those more challenging life experiences?

'It is good to get it out on paper and sing about it. I always hope that if it happens to me that it might have happened to someone else. I am on stage surviving not crying in the gutter about it, I can cope.'

I once dated a songwriter. You can't help but try and find yourself lodged somewhere in a cryptic lyric. Although it's usually never flattering. Are Ex lovers looking for themselves in Diana's lyrics? Is it the ultimate revenge?


'I never take advantage of that... But when I sang 'I go Off' it was for a guy who said I would never make it. It broke my heart to pieces. I was screaming in the car all the way home going 'I go off' it was like a mantra, and when that song became popular, it was streaming out of any window in his home town, he couldn't avoid it. He wasn't a boyfriend, just an old disgruntled muso, telling me that I would never go off. And yes it was the ultimate revenge. Thank you to that man!'

This Saturday is sure to see Diana Anaid going off again.

'Saturday will be the hugest festival party vibe, the Channon market chai tent will be coming with all the rugs and pillows, and a teepee for extra chill out space and it's totally family friendly, street performers, stilt walkers, fire spinners, fortune tellers, face painters...The Happy coach will be bringing people from Byron and Back – for only \$5 (he will need a minimum of 20 people, so call him on 6685 3996).'

Everyone's invited to wear something wild and funky as it all contributes to the wild party vibe for the night and the DVD. It's also incredibly cheap. Just \$5 and \$3 for kids. 'We want everyone there, we don't want to make money we just want everyone there.'

Renowned for left of centre world class talent, the Spiegeltent offers old world vaudevillian charm. So how do three boys from the Bay find themselves in such sumptuous surrounds?

Tim Reeves of the Old Spice Boys went on to say: 'I think the boss of the Spiegeltent saw us, or heard about us and his right hand man said you should get these guys. I was told that if you are going to Edinburgh it can be a meat market and can be very disappointing because there is just so much on. But to be invited makes it a lot easier. We have 16 gigs in a row, every night at 6pm.'

This is something Tim, Azo Bell and Billy Milroy have really worked hard towards with seven solid years of gigging under their rainbow belts.'I was going through our fan base, we have people from Alaska, all over America logging on. We got a lot of confidence from doing the Blues and Roots Festival for

three years running. A lot of the blues acts would see us and start talking about us, if you can get these guys impressed, and say you are world class, it's a huge head start. I've been doing this since I was 16, that's 42 years in bands!

'The first incarnation of Spice Boys didn't work, because we had some real ego problems with me and Azo. I went to Melbourne and when I came back it just seemed to work this time. Philip Adams loved us and Jack Thompson. We have done some shocking gigs! This band isn't a band you can't just get a little bit. It's bizarre, one week in Malaysia we were playing to 10 000 people who treated us like royalty, and then the next week in a technical college performing to blokes doing welding. Never again! We almost fell apart emotionaly and psychically from this total indifference from big boofy blokes."

It's really mixed up and the roads are really bad there so for a long time these people didn't mix. It's hard to get around, but they all come there to record at the Arts Festival. Time Magazine voted the band one of the top ten in the world next to Radionead and U2. Hanitra is the main singer and instrumentalist with the band. The arts centre Antshow is Hanitra's dream, to bring all different music traditions together to record. What started as a study tour is now a series of concerts as well.' ## PART GUITAR, PART BIRDMAN

I've been playing their brand new album. A rare treat. It is in fact their first album of all new material in twenty five years. It's a mature take on underground rock with all the eccentric zeal of their late 70's and early 80's legacy. It's like the door in the floor of rock, featuring raucus guitar and fluid keyboards. layered under Rob Younger's trademark vocals and underpinned by a relentlessly driving rhythm section powered by the latest recruit, Russell Hopkinson. The sound is rich, and even more complex. Released locally on the band's own Crying Sun Records through Shock distribution, the songs on Zeno Beach are more collaborative than on previous albums where compositions were invariably penned by Tek. With vocalist Younger and guitarist Chris Masuak having successfully fronted their own groups since the initial break-up, it is not surprising they have contributed towards the writing, as have both keyboardist Pip Hoyle and bass player Jim Dickson. Radio Birdman is music history in the making, yours in the taking. They play at the Hotel Great Northern on Thursday.

# MR WALKER I PRESUME

Listening to **Don Walker** is a bit like being on a road trip. At night. With the occasional stop off at an out of the way tavern, and then back in the car for a few more beers. His lyrics are poetic, at time maudlin, and usually very funny although at the same time, quiet and unassuming. Originally a player with Cold Chisel, Don is blue ribbon rock and roll. I saw him more recently in the incarnation of Tex, Don and Charlie, a darkly robust and gutteral love song.

There's something wonderfully story-like about Don's songs. With lyrics like 'I want my children to look like you' you can only surmise he's a bit of a charmer! I lifted a little off his website, to give you a taste of the kind of journey that is a Don Walker show. functions on his life, such as pausing events or fast-forwarding over them. Michael is given this amazing device at 'Bed Bath & Beyond,' from a weird salesman (played by Christopher Walken) who lurks in the store's 'Beyond' section. When the remote begins creating its own memory and choosing what to fast-forward over, Michael sees how much of his personal life has passed him by and realizes the importance of spending more time with people he loves. Of course before we are introduced to the magical 'remote' we get to see all the problems that he's going to try to use the remote to fix. His boss

demands too much, he hasn't finished building his kids' tree house, he gets stuck in traffic, he can't communicate with his supportive wife, and he eats badly. Then his dog humps a stuffed duck. (It's still an Adam Sandler movie after all). The film is a fantasy comedy in the tradition of Back to the Future or Groundhog Day, or it could be seen as a technologically enhanced take on A Christmas Carol. We see Michael as obsessed with work and seeing family commitments as a burden holding him back from his promotion. Sandler's comic genius is evolving toward Bill Murray territory – that of a bright soul beaten and worn down by life, with a humorous shine tantalizingly repressed.

## WATER

This is the third of Deepa Mehta's 'elemental' trilogy, after Earth and Fire – and it's been worth the wait. Chuyia is a child bride who, after her unseen husband dies, is sent to a widows' ashram on the Ganges (though filmed, due to political heat, in Sri Lanka). Among a group of older women, and under the tyrannic rule of the housemother, she strikes a friendship with the beautiful Kalyani. Defying all proscriptions by falling in love with Kalyani is Narayan, a politicized city graduate visiting his family. Set in the tumultuous years leading up to Partition, this is a placid, languidly paced story that boils with restrained indignation. It is also Mehta's not very subtle poke in the eye to the moral relativists of the West who see tradition as unimpeachable and somehow superior. But if it is a searing indictment of religion and a diatribe against all societies' enslavement to conformity, it is also a tragic romance. Plainly written and seductively shot, it's one of those movies that, just when you think it's all over, comes back at you with a conclusion of heart-

stopping triumph and

rightness. Illuminating

and impassioned, the year's best so far. John Campbell

## **JINDABYNE**

Raymond Carver's original story of fishermen finding a dead girl in the river has been borrowed by Paul Kelly (Everything's Turning To White) and Robert Altman (in Short Cuts), and is now the subject of Ray Lawrence's first feature since Lantana. The murderer of the aboriginal girl is known from the outset, allowing Beatrix Christian the freedom, while following the wife's first-person narrative in Kelly's sona, to develop her probing, character driven screenplay. The men are unpurturbed by their decision not to report the discovery until their trip is over, but their public exposure cranks up the drama, pushing them

and their families to the brink. Unavoidably, it becomes a metaphor for our complacent denial of the callous treatment of indigenous Australians and there is a hurtful sadness at the film's centre. All characters are true to type and the cast is exemplary – the contrast of Laura Linney's bleeding heart with Deborah Lee Furness's forthright, earthy sheila being particularly well observed. Dour but even-handed, with understanding rather than forgiveness being the goal that everybody ultimately seeks, it is spoilt only a little by a deplorably tacky, Idol-type song at the end of an otherwise deeply moving smoking ceremony.



# AROUND THE TRAPS

Apart from the Weekend That Just Was, this is the time of year when a town which is the ransacked property of everybody may be reclaimed, albeit briefly, by its residents. Notwithstanding the traditional lament by small business owners that trade is 40% down on the previous year's (which by my calculation means that this year it is 200% down than it was five years ago, a highly impressive if not highly dubious proposition), most people I know agree that mid-winter in the Byron Shire is one of the most glorious experiences: the ocean still warm to swim in; the whale-sightings; the ability to park directly outside one's destination, just to name a few. Days which sparkle, scenery like postcards, three people in a post office queue. Dancing down empty aisles in Woolworths.

And always something opening, or closing, or changing direction or ownership, or simply to look forward to, in the lull before the next big event, the Byron Bay Writers Festival in early August. Pippi's at New Brighton has changed hands and now in the extensively refurbished space made infinitely brighter and lighter you can sample the authentic North Laotian food of chef Nou Nou in such dishes as seared fish of the day with sugar cane prawns, green pawpaw, banana blossom salad and red nam jim; or steamed black mussels with ginger and coriander paste: or tea-smoked duck on shallot pancake with spiced blood orange sauce. Belongil Beach Cafe has moved next door to swish, slick new premises which feel more Bondi than Byron; the brand new Cicada cafe has taken its old spot. What was previously Byron Street Burgers is still doing its great organic burgers during the day but has transformed itself into Byron Street Bistro and one of my new favourite haunts for warming French classics like Beef Burgundy, Onion Soup, Chicken and Mushroom Casserole and Bouillabaisse. Over a shared bowl of garlicky mussels and a bottle of red, French music in the background, you are bound to know someone at the next table in the snug little space owner Pascale has created. I await with anticipation the opening of the Continental Cafe in Brunswick Heads any minute; meanwhile the latest incarnation of that corner spot so lustrously located opposite the river has been lyrically named Lazy River, a wine bar specialising in reasonably priced mod-Oz food, as yet untried by this particular diner. At Fins back in Byron a special degustation menu is available as a winter treat: four courses for only \$65, or \$90 if you want the matching wines, and the menu includes Fins' signature dish of Spanner Crab Chowder as well as Moroccan Tagine of Fish and local King Prawns with Bacalhau. For the month of August Muoi at her eponymous restaurant is offering some truly gorgeous Vietnamese dishes - the whole chicken 'smoked' in a crust of salt especially calls out to me – and the fabulous deal of \$35 for three courses At Brown Sugar Cafe tucked up the end of the Byron Arcade there is the ongoing promise of superbly made coffee for a ludicrous \$2 – not to mention the excellent \$10 lunches. Kevin the owner will be one of four chefs cooking up a sumptuous four-course dinner on

At the Green Garage you can now buy organic-only produce from out the front on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturday mornings; manager Sean drives up to the Brisbane markets and personally selects the fruit and vegetables. Afterwards, keep heading out of town, turning south to Lennox Head where at Reflections Lynn Barkess sells her own utterly divine fudge with flavours like Lemon Meringue and Rocky Road and Caramel Sticky Date in a cosily cluttered gift shop in the main street. Also a talented photographer, she sells tiny gift cards with her beachscapes and seaside scenery. And finally, as a side-project to the Writers Festival, author/cooking teacher/restaurant owner Janet de Neefe will be holding two cooking classes in conjunction with Red Ginger in Balinese food, culture and spices. They will be held at Mullumbimby on the Wednesday and Thursday leading up to the festival, and bookings can be made at Red Ginger on 6680 9779. So hibernation is never really an option here in a place where something is always happening, changing, beginning and ending and beginning again...



Over the years playing alongside Nick Taylor, Jackie Onassid, Strawberry Syme and Slinky has served as a catalyst for the development of Stu's style. He now describes his sound as 'sideslapping nu school tuff electro acid house'. Stu's parties are usually thematic. His next one, Future Fling (take 2) on August 19th at the Byron Entertainment Centre in the Arts & Industry Estate

adopts a 60's-70's future space theme. Stu says of it, 'I'm really looking forward to putting on a huge production at this fantastic new venue with live VJ'ing by MKG, visual design by Squiffy Vision, big props and installations by Zena & Corky and live circus performances and of course the highest quality local DJ line up. This is the fifth big Fling party I've held over the past three years which all started with the underground Schoolgirl Fling in 2003 at the Raunchy Ranch, followed by Famous Fling at the Byron Beach Resort, Schoolgirl 2 and New Year New Fling in the



## Bid to improve Aboriginal health

An opportunity to help improve health services to the local Aboriginal population has been embraced by the Northern Rivers Division of General Practice. A Commonwealth grant will be used to engage a consultant team to assess what primary health services are currently available to local Aboriginal communities versus their actual needs. The team will then design an appropriate and sustainable health service, which will include a structure for community control.

'The involvement of the community in this process is seen as a vital ingredient,' advisor Dr Dan Ewald, who is also a GP at the Bunjum Cooperative in Ballina. ## The perils of plastic

prompted Jason Olderoy, naturopath at Holdsworth House Medical Practice, to research xenoestrogens, the nasty substances that may well be the cause of the problems. What he has discovered is frightening.

It has been well documented in recent years that pesticides are a source of toxic substances that are infecting our food chain, including xenoestrogens, or estrogen mimicking substances that disrupt our endocrine systems and create excess female characteristics in both males and females. Xenoestrogens are toxic to our liver and reproductive organs and have been linked to cancer, infertility and other reproductive disorders. They can affect the entire body causing weight gain, edema (fluid retention), blood sugar imbalances and early menopause. What has not been so widely known is that common plastic contains the same toxic substances albeit in a more dilute form.

Mr Olderoy is concerned that we are not getting the warnings that we should about the likelihood that plastic is contributing to many of our major health problems.

'It can take years to scientifically prove anything,' said Mr Olderoy, 'however nature studies into the effect of xenoestrogens give very strong indications that link them to major health problems. It's too much of a coincidence to be ignored.'

Mr Olderoy is referring to marine life in contaminated areas whose reproductive rates were plummeting, cancers were increasing and horoccur. Subsequent studies ble.'

Disturbing evidence linking found that the pollutant plastics to serious health dis- chemicals were mimicking orders and infertility has the animals' hormones, specifically estrogen.

> What is of particular concern is the prevalence of plastic, particularly as a food storage material, in our lives. Mr Olderoy recommends eliminating plastic from day to day use as much as possible by getting rid of plastic drinking bottles - use glass, ceramic or stainless steel instead; replacing plastic kettles with stainless steel ones; never heating food in plastic containers; substituting waxed lunch paper for gladwrap when wrapping sandwiches, etc and using glass storage containers. And because the chemicals can be inhaled as well as absorbed through food and drink, always air out hot cars before getting into them.

> There are also some steps we can take to reverse the damage done, and many of them are as straightforward as following a healthy diet.

> 'Always buy hormone free meat,' said Mr Olderoy, 'and where possible organic fruit and vegetables, but at the very least spray-free ones. Everyone should be taking an antioxidant daily. Exercise is essential as sweating is very important for detoxification. Everyone should ensure that their detoxification organs are working effectively and should consult a health care practitioner to do so.'

While vegetables from the cruciferous family such as cabbage, broccoli, brussel sprouts and cauliflower are excellent for detoxification, cancer prevention and bowel health, Mr Olderoy emphasised that 'at the end of the day, I can't advocate enough the need to forgo the use of mone imbalances starting to plastics as much as possi-






