Firies want women

If you're looking for a new, exciting career that will not only teach you new, potentially life saving skills but also pay you while doing so, then this might just be your thing. NSW Fire Brigade stations based in Mullumbimby and Bangalow are both looking for applicants who are interested in joining their teams. Mullumbimby station captain Josh Rushton is especially keen to recruit women for his team, as he believes that they have a great deal to offer the fire brigade.

'Women are the greatest untapped resource in this community,' said Josh. 'I only have to walk around town to see women working the shops who are in close proximity to the fire station and would make ideal fire-fighters.'

The criteria for application are simple: you must be an Australian citizen or perma-



nent resident; you must be over 18 and you must pass a basic health assessment run by the department. Other than that, you need to live within three kilometres of the station, so you need to be in town.

According to Josh, women needn't be concerned about being of slight frame or build as long as they have a healthy level of strength and fitness. 'There is a big range of strength and size among the men,' said Josh, 'but people of slight build are very capable of working in a team and carry out rescues of people larger than themselves. It is only a matter of

technique and training. The team at Mullumbimby is fantastic; the highlight of my working life so far has been working with the Mullum crew and I know anyone who joins us will feel the same. Not only does joining the fire brigade teach you some fantastic skills, it also teaches you how to work well in a team, think on your feet and some good leadership skills which can be applied to all areas of life.'

Josh is urging anyone who meets the criteria - and that's probably you - to come along to an information session to learn more about what the job entails. There will be sessions held at both Mullumbimby and Bangalow Fire Stations on Thursday October 5 from 7pm. Application forms will be available on the night or by calling the zone office on 6624 5384.

Have we got a café for you!

The Department of Lands is inviting proposals to reestablish the Clarke's Beach Café at Byron Bay, said the Minister for Lands Tony Kelly last week. The Department recently took the café out of Byron Shire Council's control for what the Minister says were 'non-compliance issues involving its operation'.

In an extraordinary piece of commercial spruiking for a government minister, Mr Kelly said in his press release, 'This is an opportunity for the right business person to reopen the café to the community, taking advantage of its unique beach location and ocean views.'

'A strong market niche has been created with over

25 years of operation of the café and we're looking for someone with the capability and vision to continue this key service. The café is situated on Crown land fronting Clarke's Beach and is surrounded by parkland used for community recreation. It's only a ten minute walk from the Byron CBD.'

Mr Kelly said it was anticipated the preferred proponent would be offered a lease over the site and start trading within six months of the lease commencement.

'It is also expected the successful proponent will refurbish and/or redevelop the facility with a commitment to manage the site's social and environmental values. The café is a good example of business and

community parkland infrastructure combining to meet the recreational and community needs as people enjoy public reserves and open spaces to improve their health, fitness and general lifestyle.

'The provision of these types of facilities on Crown reserves and other public space was strongly supported during the recent regional consultations on the Iemma government's draft state plan.'

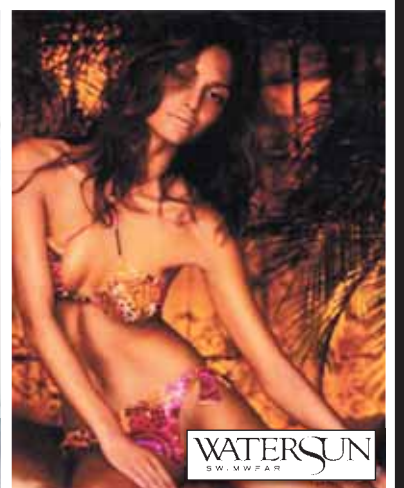

Billinudgel Hotel celebrates its 100th

The Billinudgel Hotel is holding a weekend of celebrations to mark our great achievement of 100 years of trading.

When the hotel first opened its doors in 1898 it was originally called The Tramway Hotel. It was built at the same time as the completion of the railway track and was the drinking place of the workmen who maintained the tracks. The original hotel fell victim to fire and in 1906 a new hotel was built.

The name was changed to the New Brighton Hotel and then later changed to the Billinudgel Hotel.

In 1927 Ma Ring purchased the hotel and the ownership has remained in her family up to this day. Ma Ring shaped not only the hotel but also the town of Billinudgel.

She is famous for many things, mostly her card playing, her quick wit and the honour that when she passed away she was the oldest licensee in not only Australia, but the world. The town held a

massive celebration for her 100th birthday and 'we are about to do the same for her pub!' say party organisers.

On Saturday October 14 there will be a Black and White Ball. Tickets will be available for \$25 a head and include appetisers and a two-course meal. Bookings essential.

On Sunday October 15 a Family Fun Day will start at midday with music by Dallas Lang, a Vintage Fashion Parade showing the fashions of the last 100 years supplied by Victoria's Vintage Fashion, followed by more music with the Shady Three.

Be prepared for the storm season, says SES

Storm season is upon us again and the NSW State Emergency Service (SES) is urging people to be prepared. Local SES controller Noel McAviney pointed out that peak storm activity is between September and the end of December, so north coast residents need to start taking precautions to make sure their properties are at less risk from storm damage.

Precautions include keeping gutters and downpipes clear of leaves and debris which build up over winter and can cause gutters to overflow into ceilings causing water damage; trimming back branches and trees that overhang your home, pergola, garage or fences (make sure your local council allows

this); clearing choked drains to prevent flooding; clearing loose items around the yard/balcony which may become missiles in strong winds.

During and after a storm, the SES urges people to bring their pets and children indoors; put cars under cover but not under a tree; stay away from windows and

damaged areas of your home or property; stay away from fallen powerlines and flooded areas especially causeways and stormwater drains; and always to drive to the conditions.

SES members will be at the Lions Club street stall on the corner of Stuart and Burringbar Streets Mullum-

bimby on Thursday September 28 from about 9am to hand out storm safe brochures and answer any questions. To contact your local SES branch for information (not in an emergency) call 6684 3444; for assistance during storms call 132 500. If the situation is life threatening the call 000.

Fixed speed camera at St Helena

A new fixed speed camera is now operating on the Pacific Highway. 'This speed camera is an important initiative that will improve road safety along the Pacific Highway at St Helena, an RTA spokesperson said. 'Fixed speed cameras in the right places are an effective road safety tool.'

The new speed camera is 1.4 kilometres south of Ewingsdale Road and will monitor speeds approaching the sharp curve on the Pacific Highway at St Helena.

'The speed camera will cover both directions on the Pacific Highway and will operate 24 hours a day, seven

days a week,' the spokesperson said. 'The speed limit in both directions will remain at 60kph.'

The spokesperson said speed camera sites in NSW are determined using strict criteria based on the crash history and recorded speeds at sites.

Moffat takes Thursday prize

Abstraction that speaks to the heart is how Richard Moffatt described 'No 433', the work that won him the major acquisition prize at the 11th annual Thursday Plantation East Coast Sculpture Show, which opened on Sunday September 24.

Made from 1500 kilos of scrap steel, the sculpture's rust-red tubing curves around itself in continuous, intertwined loops, creating a sense of fluid intimacy.

'The work reflects my personal growth as an artist. It's not intellectual but simply about being open-hearted,' said Moffatt. 'When you love what you do to the depth of every cell in your body, it emanates from your work and people receive that.'

Moffatt lives in Tanja, on the South Coast of NSW near Bega. Since taking up full-time sculpting six years ago, he has won a number of awards including a Thursday Plantation commendation in 2001.

This year's sculpture show features 62 new works by 56 East Coast artists. As in previous years, it is supported by WHK Rutherfords Financial Advisers and a number of other local businesses and organisations.

The other award winners are: Beach Hotel Regional Artist's Prize, \$1000, Catherine Lane of Ocean Shores,

NSW, for Comfort Zone; TAFE Arts Prize, \$400, Laurindo de Abreu Soto of Belmont, Qld, for Spirit of the Forest; and Crystal Castle Ephemeral Art Prize, \$500, Jess Poulsen of Bangalow, NSW, for God's Eyes. Highly Commended were Sally Simpson of Berry, NSW, for Inversion; Gordon Pupan-

gamirri, of Main Arm, NSW, for The First Tiwi Family; Phil Carr of Crabbes Creek, NSW, for Mordred; and Craig Raynor of Lismore, NSW, for Phallic Flowers.

'I would like to see some deal with the energy authorities and the solar HWS manufacturers where people could get Solar Hot Water systems installed and then

pay them off over 2-3 years as a component of their power bills. When you have a solar HWS your bills are much lower anyway - so in a couple of years the installation would be cost-neutral.'

Waywood insight into artistic abilities

Waywood Framing & Gallery is giving people a rare opportunity to gain an insight into the all too often overlooked extraordinary abilities of people with disabilities. The gallery is hosting a unique exhibition of artworks

created by some of the finest young artistic talents in Byron Shire – the fact that all four artists have an intellectual disability is incidental.

Liam Bruce, Zion Stewart, and Mathew Wiggins have Down syndrome, Aaron Houston has Aspergers syndrome; all four have a passion for art. Margie Bruce, Liam's mother, explains that Liam has always been interested in art, and when he was a young boy struggling with language often used art to communicate. What he is doing now is a natural progression of that desire to express himself, as all artists do, through his work.

'The lovely thing about these four men is that they do what they do for the love of it, not because they want to produce something perfect,' said Margie. 'They have no internal critic telling them their work isn't good enough; often they don't even use their art tools correctly, they don't care as long as they are creating something.'

It is this freedom and lack of inhibition that shines through their artworks that captured the attention of Waywood's owner Patricia Hughes. The boys had exhibited at the gallery as part of a

'Small Works' exhibition and Patricia was so impressed by what she saw that she asked them if they'd be interested in mounting an exhibition themselves.

'I was so impressed with the guys; they all have personality plus and really took time to chat to me about their work,' said Patricia. 'Disability aside, their work was good and I thought it would be good for them to have an opportunity to showcase their talent.'

The exhibition is aptly named 'See What I See' and is described as 'an insightful journey into the lives of four young adults with intellectual disabilities depicted through their art. Their remarkable vision shines from the heart with senses of innocence, friendship and good humour always at the fore. This show may open your eyes to a different way of looking at your world. One that's empowering, uplifting, uncomplicated, courageous and swathed in heartfelt laughter'.

The show will run for a week until September 29 at Waywood Framing 7 Gallery, Centennial Circuit, Byron Bay Arts & Industry Estate.

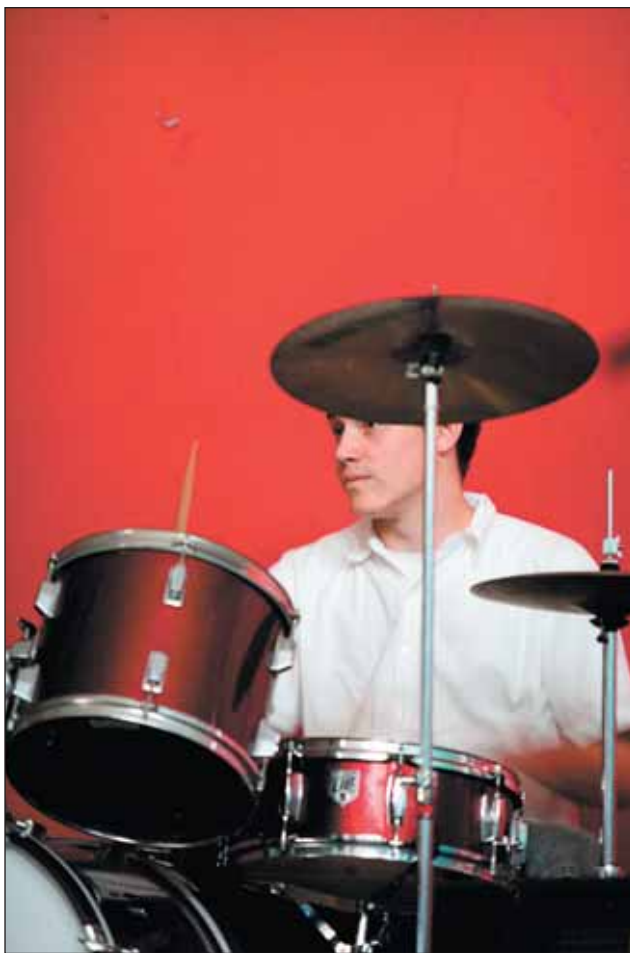
New musical opportunities for youth

ISP shuts down services

All hell broke loose for numerous Internet Service Providers (ISPs) on Wednesday when their provider shut down all services without warning. In summary, virtual ISPs buy internet services from larger umbrella ISPs and then resell their services. Veridas Communications, a large ISP, who until Wednesday provided over 100 smaller ISPs, closed up shop leaving these companies with no internet access themselves and no way of providing it to their customers.

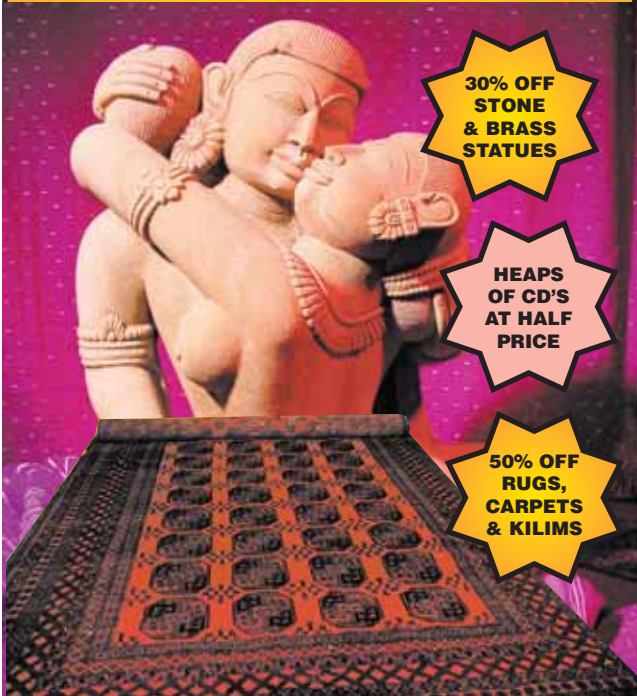
Melissa James of Local Internet, one of the ISPs affected and who has over 1,500 customers, said, 'There was no warning that the service was about to be discontinued, nor has there been any contact since. There has been no way whatsoever of getting through to Veridas to get an explanation of what happened.'

'We have since been calling every one of our customers to try and apologise and explain why their service is disconnected. Of course with no way of contacting them via email it has been a long process.'

The impact is on you

Development is all about social impact. A new child centre gives greater hope to young families, an entertainment centre satisfies culture vultures but maybe annoys neighbours with noise, a tourist facility keeps the holidaying punters happy but the impact on a nearby creek alarms the environmentally concerned. Mother Earth might have her own impact assessment as well, and it's likely to be more forceful than an opinion scribbled on paper.

Weighing the good and the bad against each other and coming up with a balanced conclusion is the hope of Byron Shire Council's new Development Control Plan for Social Impact Assessment (SIA) and its Social Impact Assessment Policy, which have just gone on public exhibition. The 16 page draft DCP applies only to certain developments, obviously the ones likely to have the most social impact. These include residential development for 20 dwellings or more, commercial uses in non-commercial zones, an event for 200 persons or more on private land, brothels, licensed premises, and service stations, among many others.

The draft Policy is interesting chiefly because it sets out the scope for any social impact assessment. However, it is not a document which will carry as much weight in the courts as the DCP, nor will the DCP carry as much weight as Council's long-awaited shirewide Local Environmental Plan (LEP) which we hope will incorporate strong elements of social impact assessment. The Policy may be valuable in the hunt for funds for affordable housing just as the Cultural Plan is expected to open the door for arts grants.

The development applicant must make the initial determination as to whether or not an SIA is required. This is not as sinister as it initially sounds as the criteria for assessment include the types of development mentioned above. That is, if you're developing a brothel, for instance, tick yes and proceed to a pre-lodgement meeting with Council staff to get a grandly-named Social Impact Assessment Scope for your proposal.

The person using this Scope – which will probably need to work like a microscope, a telescope, a periscope and a stethoscope – for the developer will need to have appropriate training in social science or community needs analysis. Hopefully this will mean the developer will get a true picture of the real social impacts on a community and 'stakeholder consultations' will result in a modified development or a move to plan B. Elements which need to be considered in the SIA include transport, safety, diversity, amenity, employment and training, and culture.

The draft Plan and draft Policy are on exhibition until Friday November 3 They can also be viewed in PDF format on the Council's website www.byron.nsw.gov.au. Click on the 'Documents on Exhibition' link.

Council is also holding a community information session on Wednesday October 18, 3pm-5pm, in the council chambers. It's your chance to find out more and ask questions of staff.

It's all a useful step in staving off the development barbarians at the gate and making good developers better. Whether or not the next state government will come to the party is anybody's guess.

Govt loses head over Noongar decision

John Howard has yet to release his definitive list of Australian values, but we can anticipate at least a few of them: respect for Australian law, a fair go for all, upholding the right of minorities, racial equality, rejection of stirring up hatred against any section of the Australian community.

An admirable wish list. Last week his government gave them all the finger.

The Federal Court's finding that the Noongar people can claim native title over some 200,000 square kilometres of Western Australia including the city of Perth was certainly unexpected, but one might have thought that the politicians would have read the judgment as a whole before running to the shock jocks.

If they had done so they might have noticed that Judge Murray Wilcox had pointed out that the decision was in no sense a pot of gold for the Noongar; as always any form of freehold title and most forms of leasehold title had extinguished the claims. The central business district was not threatened, and nor were suburban backyards or public amenities. In fact for areas already occupied by immigrants, which meant just about the lot, there would be no discernible effect.

The finding would enable the Noongar to conduct ceremonies at specific sacred sites, and to pursue some other traditional activities, but this did not mean nightly kangaroo hunts down King George Terrace or regular corroborees at the WACA. Essentially it merely confirmed what the judge found had been going on since European settlement in

1829; the maintenance of the society and a continuous connection with the land.

It was this continuity, highly unusual in urbanised areas, that gave the claim its validity, and the same situation was most unlikely to exist in other capital cities. The law had not changed and native title rights had not been extended in any way by the decision.

There was absolutely no cause for alarm. So, naturally, the government panicked.

As the Western Australian Labor government said it

ing the claim and 1000 to 1 against any winner being silly enough to try to enforce it. Titles like the one the Noongar have been granted are almost entirely symbolic: they represent a rare and hard-fought win which has little to do with actual property, but an enormous amount to do with morality, and with the self-respect of those whose morale desperately needs a lift.

The sensible thing to do with them is to accept the court's verdict and sit down to negotiate the best mutual

no threat to anybody, why not leave it be?

If Howard's stance looks mean and spiteful (and it does and is) surely Beazley has everything to gain by taking the high ground. But no; as with the Tampa in 2001, that would require an act of moral courage above and beyond what the pollsters on one side and the roosters on the other are telling him.

To the Aboriginal Australians who have for so long placed their faith and their votes in Labor, this is a betrayal. Or perhaps, as Noel Pearson suggests, it is just further confirmation that Beazley stands for nothing.

would consider an appeal to the High Court, John Howard said he would encourage such an appeal. His immediate reaction was 'one of some considerable concern'.

The loathsome Phillip Ruddock was despatched to spread fear and despondency across the land. Backyards might be safe, but access to beaches and parks might be cut off, he gibbered (Wilcox specifically stated it would not), and who knew where else it might lead? 'It is not possible to guarantee that continued public access to all such areas in major capital cities in Australia would be protected from a claim to exclusive native title,' our learned and deeply mendacious chief law officer raved.

Well, maybe not, but you could get odds of at least 100 to 1 against any court grant-

outcome from it. This is what Paul Keating did with the Mabo decision, and the result is now admitted by all sides to have been highly successful. Howard always rejected the Mabo process, so it is hardly surprising that he would like to wipe Noongar off the books as soon as possible, and the hell with the law, the fair go, the respect for minorities or anything else that gets in his way.

But it is depressing, though predictable, that Kim Beazley should also support an appeal against the Federal Court verdict. Beazley is at pains to point out that, as a Perth resident, he does not feel that his backyard is threatened, and nor should anyone else. But, he says gravely, we need clarity. We do? The decision looks clear enough to me, and if there is

Am I the only one who found the press coverage of the television battle over the West Papuan boy Wa Wa thoroughly distasteful?

I'm not referring to the preposterous antics of the television stations as they competed to show the most concern for the hapless ten year old; these indeed defied parody, and deserved every word of the merciless treatment they received. But at the centre of it all was a child threatened, allegedly, with ritual murder and cannibalism. This is a genuinely tragic story, but even the quality broadsheets chose to stud their coverage with merry quips about stew pots, barbecues and casseroles.

Given their cheerful lack of compassion in this case, one can only suspect that either their regular sanctimonious outrage over child abuse in Australia is a total confection, or that they still regard the human rights of so-called primitives as not worth protecting. Perhaps Howard and Beazley have read the mood correctly.

Holiday blues

My family and I were visitors to lovely Byron last week, however our stay was somewhat marred by a rather nasty incident regarding accommodation I booked via the internet.

I found a holiday house in Belongil Beach. I called the owner, a private operator, and he took a \$350 deposit for a six night stay - balance due on day of arrival - no linen included. Pics of the place looked fine on internet. I paid \$100 for linen and cot hire.

When we arrived late on Sunday September 10 (it was raining cats and dogs) we got a rather nasty shock. The



house was appalling: holes in walls and floors, dirty black marks on doors, broken cupboards, dirty stained shower, cracked shower screen, broken missing tiles, lino dirty and coming off in the kitchen floor, windows that would not close, etc.

I called the owner that evening and told him I felt the accommodation to be substandard and not to a standard where we could stay there. I requested the money be returned to my account. He refused, and told me it

was my choice whether I wanted to stay or not but the money would not be returned. I believe a total of \$700 has been taken from my credit account (definitely \$350 was taken, am waiting to hear from my bank about remaining \$350). The owner has since pulled the house from the website.

We found somewhere else to stay, which was clean and a relief as we have a four year old boy and a five month old baby.

The locals tell me this sort

of thing has been happening quite a bit. I know \$700 (plus linen hire) for six nights isn't a fortune but I do believe that there should be some kind of basic standard a person should offer.

I've made some enquiries with Fair Trading.

Thanks for all the fish

I am writing in order to provide feedback and information to those people who either made a complaint to the RTA/Abigroup, or have an interest in the campaign aimed at reducing the level of sediment pollution from the Yelgun to Brunswick River highway upgrade.

As most readers of *The Echo* will know, a coalition of community and environment groups set out to alert the community about the extensive impacts associated with the 10km long highway upgrade. The upgrade follows a course abutting a number of nature reserves and the Cape Byron Marine Park. It had been clear that the level of sediment entering the Brunswick River and the Marshalls

Creek was unacceptable to those that cared about the natural environment and to those human users of the waterways (eg fishers).

Since June, when this campaign began, there has been a large plume of sediment entering the river and Marshalls Creek once a month with a duration of days each time. This continual impact has undoubtedly affected fish stocks and the 'web-of-life' in the river and creek. We expect the ecosystem to take a long time to recover after the completion of the upgrade (some eight months away). We also expect unacceptable impacts to continue. This is because, although there is legislation in place that is supposed to protect

the environment, that can be effectively bypassed when one state minister (Bob Debus) is overseeing another state minister's (Eric Roozendaal) project.

Nevertheless the good news is that the campaign has been successful in reducing the impacts by highlighting the issue and hence forcing the authorities to act to some extent. Hence, probably millions of aquatic animals and plants are alive today thanks to the efforts of the coalition of groups. Further, the Environment Protection Authority has collected evidence and is investigating the possibility of prosecution (but don't hold your breath).

As the spokesperson for

the Coalition, I thank the members of local community groups, (South Golden Beach Progress Association Inc. and New Brighton Village Assoc. Inc); local environment groups, (CONOS, BEC, BEACON) and regional and state environment groups (North Coast Environment Council and the Total Environment Centre). Also thank you to those that have supported us by phoning the Pollution Hotline (free call 13 55 55) to make a complaint.

The campaign is to continue with the focus moving towards seeking compensation for the impacts (eg fish restocking; habitat repair).

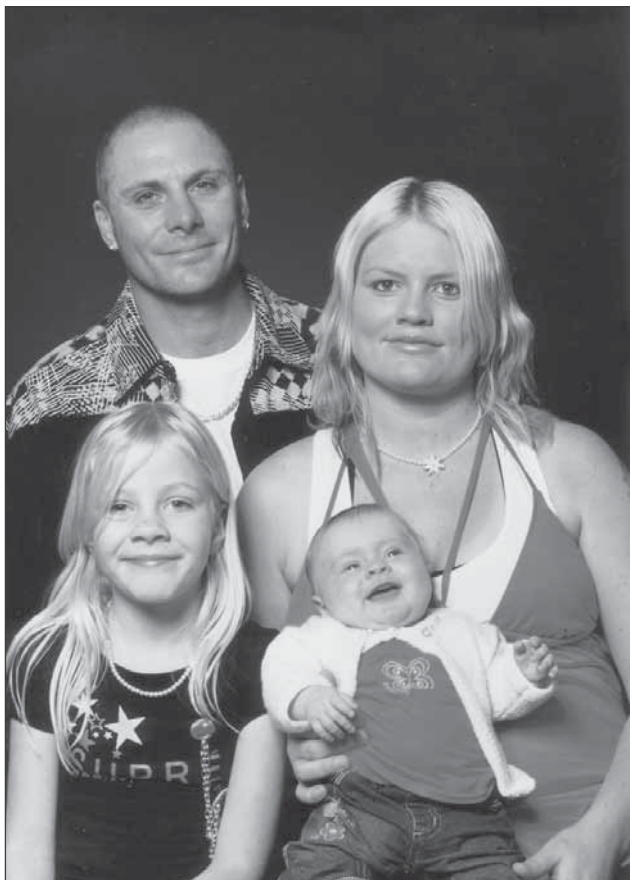
Hard times for a young family

Ahine'ea (Hinay) Jacobs and Shane Esposito are a young couple living in Byron Shire who have experienced more than their fair share of personal tragedy. Shane was born and bred in Bangalow and Byron Bay while Hinay has lived here for 12 years. They have a seven year old daughter named Shinay.

Then four years ago tragedy struck when their second daughter Sophie died when she was only one day old as a result of a hernia in her diaphragm. Only a parent who has lost a child could understand how difficult it must be to learn to live again after such an experience; the rest of us just stand in awe of how these people find the strength to go on. Hinay and Shane did find the strength to go on and in May this year welcomed their third daughter Stella to their family. Unbelievably, tragedy struck again. On September 18 this year, at just shy of four months old, Stella contracted meningococcal disease and died.

A close family friend of the Espositos told how Stella had been unwell with a cold for about a week. Then last weekend while out visiting friends, Stella became fretful and started vomiting. On the way home she started to cry uncontrollably and Hinay instinctively felt that something was not right with her baby. She rushed Stella to the hospital and within 20 minutes of her arrival Stella came out in the telltale rash



that is one of the symptoms of septicaemia that occurs as a result of the presence of meningococcal bacteria in the body. Despite Hinay's prompt action, it was too late for Stella to be saved and she died within hours of arriving at hospital.

Hinay, Shane and Shinay must now do for a second time what most people don't even have to do once: say goodbye to their daughter and little sister. Friends and family of the Espositos are offering the community an opportunity to show their support to this young family by the establishment of the

Meningococcal is one of the most deadly diseases around because it is so difficult to diagnose and progresses so very quickly. It is most prevalent at this time of year as often people have other viruses which may weaken their immune systems. While anyone can catch

meningococcal, it is most common in children under the age of five and teenagers and young adults aged between 15 and 25 years.

The disease is bacterial and lives in the back of the nose and throat, often without causing harm. It is transmitted through saliva and spread by sneezing, coughing, intimate kissing and sharing food or drinks. Young children and babies are more susceptible to catching the disease as they tend to put things into their mouths, while teenagers and young adults are at greater risk due to the nature of their socially interactive lifestyles.

Symptoms include headaches, nausea, fever, chest and stomach pains and aching joints, but these symptoms may not all be present at once, nor do they appear in any particular order. Babies may become drowsy, vomit, develop a fever with cold hands and feet, become fretful, moan or cry uncontrollably.

Unfortunately, all these symptoms can easily be attributed to other things and often it is only the appearance of the telltale rash that leads to positive diagnosis, by which time the disease is well advanced. If you suspect that meningococcal may be present, seek urgent medical attention. Trust your instincts; if you are not happy with one doctor's diagnosis, seek a second opinion. Brunswick Heads to Yelgun

Progress Update No. 6

Earthworks, drainage, retaining walls, relocation of services, bridge construction and landscaping are proceeding along the entire length of the Brunswick Heads to Yelgun upgrade. Construction of the Yelgun Rest Area and the Billinudgel Pedestrian Bridge is also continuing.

Over the next 3 months various activities are scheduled:

September

- Traffic switch on to Marshalls Creek service road. Bonanza Drive entrance to Billinudgel and Balemo Drive will be opened.
- Traffic switch onto Tunnel Road and new sewage treatment plant access road.
- Commencement of concrete machine placed sub-base and base concrete paving across the project.
- Construction of Brunswick River northbound bridge deck, abutments, and southbound pier heads.
- Construction of bridges at 13 locations, including bridge decks, parapets and traffic barrier railing installation.
- Construction of surface drainage and road carriageway earthworks along the entire alignment.
- Demolition of Marshalls Creek and Marshalls Creek Overflow bridges.

October

- Completion of works on the Brunswick River service road bridge.
- Continuing concrete paving across the project.
- Continuing Brunswick River bridge deck, abutment and pier head construction.
- Construction of Rajah Road roundabout.
- Continuing construction of retaining wall at various locations.
- Continuing bridge construction at 13 locations, including recommencement of bridge piling works at Marshalls Creek.

November

- Continuing concrete paving across the project.
- Continuing Brunswick River bridge deck, abutment and pier head construction.
- Traffic switch on to Brunswick River service road.
- Recommencement of tube stock planting.
- Commencement of asphalt paving on the interchange ramps.

Locals assist orphans in Kenya

In the face of overwhelming adversity it is often difficult to see how one or two people can make a difference, and in many cases the answer is that it's all too hard and nothing gets done at all. One Northern Rivers couple have become an exception to that rule and are making a world of difference to Kenyan orphans with their dedication, commitment and generosity.

Ivan and Mary Budulica decided 12 years ago that they needed to do something to help the huge number of African children who are orphaned as a result of AIDS, poverty, abuse and neglect. Three years ago, they put their plan into action and with their three children, relocated to Nakuru, Kenya, about two hours drive from the capital Nairobi.

With their own money, they bought ten acres of land and built an orphanage suitable for housing up to 20 children and staff. Before the building has even been finished – they are in the completion stages now – the Budulicas have already taken in 20 children under the age of four who will remain in their care until they are 18 years old.

Now entirely reliant on

donations, the Budulicas are looking forward to completing the building – their house is getting very crowded! – and purchasing adjoining land in order to build a school for their young 'family'. What is most surprising about the success of this couple is how very simple their formula is.

'We are very focused on providing our children with a healthy diet and a safe, loving environment,' said Mary. 'We offer plenty of fresh fruit, vegetables and nuts and they

are thriving. One of our children was taken in after being abandoned in a hospital ward suffering category four AIDS. She was riddled with infection and suffering malnutrition and tuberculosis (TB). After six months in our care, with anti viral drugs and a healthy diet she is a different child. While she still has a long road ahead of her, she now has a much brighter future.'

The reality is that an estimated 12.3 million children in Africa have been orphaned by AIDS, with approximately 890,000 in Kenya alone. TB has increased sixfold in the last ten years and children are often neglected through poverty or mistreated as a result of social problems. Some children are dumped and left in plastic bags or by the side of the road.

Ivan and Mary founded Mission in Action (MIA) in the hopes that they could make a difference, and for the 20 young Kenyan chil-

dren in their care they certainly have.

They aim to continue providing a healthy, family environment for these children as well as giving them a good education so they have choices when they are adults.

'We will educate them based on the British curriculum as this seems to give them the most opportunities,' said Mary. 'however we realise how important it is for them to stay in touch with their own culture. All our children will learn to speak English, Swahili and their own tribal language.'

All the orphans have local sponsors, and there have been other generous 'one off' donations such as the one that allowed MIA to drill a borehole providing the mission and surrounding village with an abundant supply of clean drinking water.

Cohen puts his view on T2E highway option

The Minister for Roads is due to make an announcement on the preferred route of the Ewingsdale to Tintenbar section of the Pacific Highway – possibly as soon as next week, according to Ian Cohen, NSW Greens Upper House MP.

'I have lobbied long and hard for the community on this issue, and the decision is now in the hands of the Minister, Eric Roozendaal, who has been far more reasonable and receptive than his predecessor, Michael Costa,' Mr Cohen said. 'Regardless of the outcome, it is important to make the Greens position clear. Our priority is to minimise social, environmental and economic impacts for our local community.'

'After broad consultation, including the gathering of evidence in a Parliamentary inquiry, the Greens continue to support the A-class upgrade along the existing Pacific Highway corridor for the T2E. This option stands to have the smallest impact out of all four options. An A-class upgrade refers to dual carriageway with separation, restricted private access and a speed limit of 100kph.'

'For twelve years prior to April 13, 2005, the T2E community was assured by the RTA and the State Government that the upgrade of the Pacific Highway between Tintenbar and Ewingsdale would follow the existing highway corridor. The T2E is a sensible option because it would link both existing and approved A-class upgrades of the existing highway corridor north and south of T2E.'

'The adjoining Ewingsdale to Tyagarah upgrade which was completed in 1999 is A-class and has had no fatal accidents recorded since it was built.'

'The Ballina Bypass planning was completed in 1996 and approved in 2002. Commencement was promised by the then Minister for Roads, Carl Scully, and federal funds have since been allocated. Ballina Council has planned for future urban development some distance from the highway corridor following advice from the NSW Department of Planning.'

'The Bangalow Bypass has been built (\$24m in 1996). The St Helena upgrade planning was completed in 2002, including the EIS for the B Modified route which was chosen as the preferred route.'

'Land in the T2E corridor was zoned 9A for upgrade and other land purchased to allow the upgrade to be built on the Pacific Highway corridor. Homes along the high-

way have had air conditioning installed, along with double glazed windows.'

'The alternative floodplain route for T2E is well outside the Pacific Highway corridor and is highly inappropriate. It would impact negatively on native species, SEPP 14 wetlands and wildlife corridors and leave massive visual scars on the Ross Lane and Coopers Shoot escarpments. It would also irrevocably destroy a 1,000 acres of highly fertile, drought free and regionally significant soils.'

'There is scientific evidence that climatic change will cause severe storm activity and rising sea levels which are incompatible with the concept of a motorway built on a tidal floodplain approximately one metre above sea level. The RTA has publicly stated that they do not address climatic change in their planning for the T2E.'

'The existing highway corridor is already owned by the State, so less privately-owned freehold land would be required. An A-class highway along the existing corridor would preserve the integrity of most of the T2E farms. A floodplain route is less safe because of flooding, fog and East-West alignment coming up the Coopers Shoot escarpment.'

'A floodplain route would sever most of the farms along its length making many unviable at a time when 92 per cent of NSW is in drought. It would transfer the noise and amenity burden from the existing highway to new receivers (approximately 294 properties).'

'The floodplain route is longer and more costly to build than the highway corridor route. It will leave the existing Pacific Highway black spots at Tintenbar Hill and St Helena without upgrades and while continuing to carry large volumes of traffic as an alternative route to the motorway. Bangalow would still have 8,500 vehicle movements per day through the town.'

'The floodplain route is not supported by the Department of the Environment and Conservation, the Northern Rivers Regional Development Board or by the Draft Far North Coast Regional Development Plan.'

'An A-class upgrade on the T2E along the existing highway corridor coupled with the development of an integrated inland transport network would improve safety and minimise the environmental impact on the highly populated coastal fringe. One can only hope the Minister is listening.'

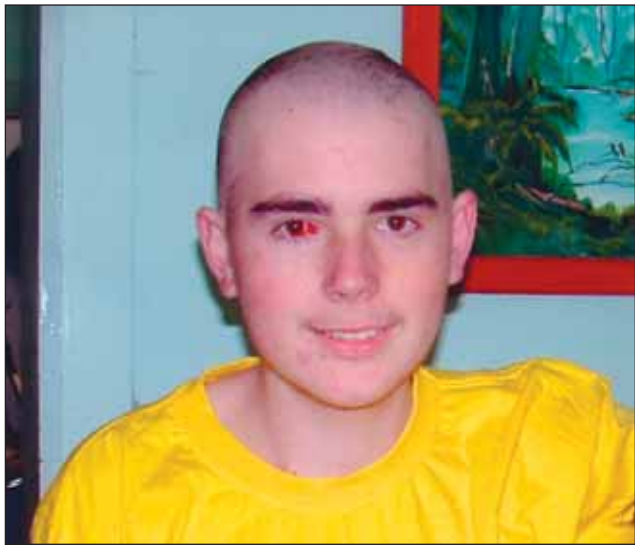

Damien's unlucky world first

All parents think that their child is unique, and truthfully in one way or another they probably are. In the case of Damien Liddle there is no doubt that he is unique, but unfortunately for his parents his current claim to fame is that he is the only person in the world to have been diagnosed with a primitive neuroectodermal tumour in his eye. In layman's terms, Damien has a very rare form of cancer.

The Liddles are currently living through every family's worst nightmare as they travel to and from Brisbane in order to access the best possible treatment for 16 year old Damien. To date, he has undergone an operation to remove the tumour and now faces 14 months of chemotherapy. The doctors are satisfied that the operation was successful in that they managed to remove the entire growth, but due to the nature of the cancer, they are not prepared to take any chances, so the chemotherapy is a must.

Close family friend Sue Stirton explained that the Liddle's situation is particularly difficult as his father Graham is tragically losing his sight.

'Graham can't drive, nor can he work,' said Sue, 'so Kim is the sole breadwinner for the family. They are struggling to keep everything going so that Damien can travel to Brisbane for his fortnightly chemo and Graham can go with him to be by his side for every minute of his treatment. Although a lot of his expenses are covered by Medicare, there are still

masses of hidden costs such as pathology, anaesthesia etc, not to mention travelling costs.

'Anyone who knows Graham and Kim will agree that they are two of the most generous people you could hope to meet; they will drop everything to help somebody who needs it, and this is our chance to return the favour.'

Kim and a host of other friends of the Liddles have got together to organise a fundraiser for the family and hope that the community will get behind it in order to offer the family a helping hand in their time of crisis. The fundraiser will take place on October 17 at the Brunswick Bowling Club starting at 5.30pm. There will be a three course banquet, lucky door prizes and a host of entertainment including bands Ragga Jump and Chantelle and the Latest Results. 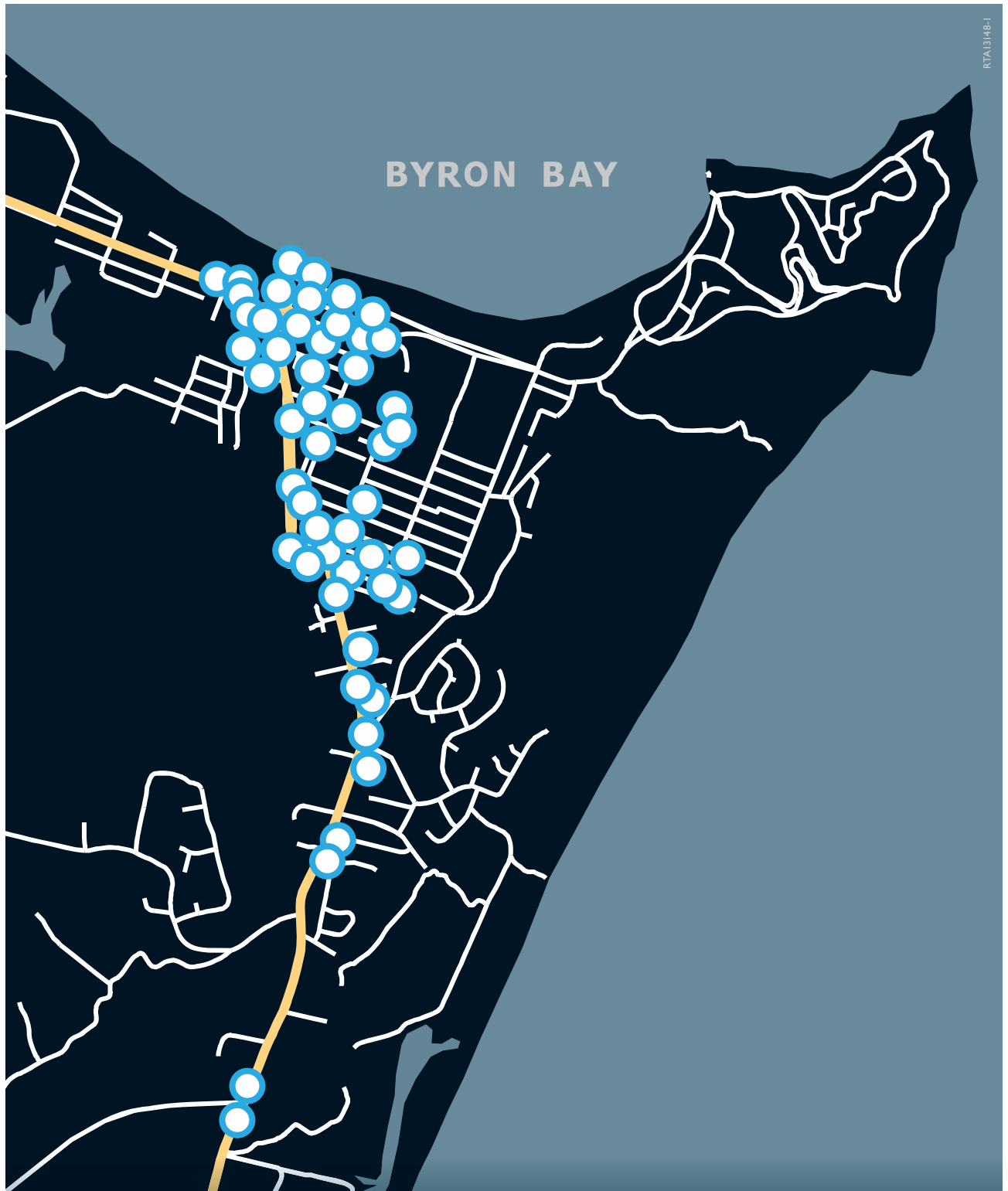

A window into days gone by

When Sue and Gerard Walker took over ownership of Stewart's Menswear in Mullumbimby in 2004, they also became willing partners in a longstanding relationship left behind by the previous owners. Many years before, Jean Stewart, a life member of the Brunswick Valley Historical Society, and mother of then owner Bill, donated one of the shop front windows to the Mullumbimby Museum as a display area. Over the years the space has provided an interesting view of days gone by.

The tradition has been carried on by Sue and Gerard who think it a small service to the community to contribute the free space, and periodically make way, as the curios are changed and different historical eras and themes are presented. Currently a selection of musical instruments and photos are on show, with the idea to create interest in Mullumbimby's history of entertainment and to encourage folk to add

information to the historical record.

The bulk of the museum's collection is housed in the old Mullumbimby Post Office, which was relocated to the Mullum market site in 1984. Liz Walton is a committee member of the Brunswick Valley Historical Society, the group who run the museum. Liz feels that many people don't know where the Museum is, even though everyone knows where the market is held, so bringing a small display into town gives people a taste of what the museum has to offer, and hopefully tempts them out to Summers Park.

Local historian honoured

It is these volunteers who enhance and mount the old photographs, and create the display in the shop front window.

a past president and current member. President of the Society Chris Gray said the awards were not given lightly and Mr Mills' Certificate of Achievement was only the fifth to be made to society members in 25 years.

A pizza local history celebrated

In 1976 the Wheatley family opened the doors to a small pizza shop in Jonson Street Byron Bay, but they never imagined that 30 years later the thriving business would have grown beyond its original site to a 150 seat custom designed and built restaurant employing over 45 people in busy Lawson Street. The menu still has the original pizzas numbers one to 14, but popularity and a willingness to give the customers what they want has seen the number grow steadily upwards of 20.

The Wheatleys have since moved on, but some time around the tenth anniversary of the now famous Earth 'n' Sea Pizza, an English engineer and an Irish chef spotted each other across a deep freeze in the UK, and fell instantly love. Three and a half years ago, after a sojourn in a restaurant on a Greek island which they purchased with their credit card, (the eatery not the island), David and Denise Woolsey, became the very proud owners of

what David describes as 'a business that we felt that we could believe in, not only because of its place in the history and culture of Byron, but also because of its ethics and involvement in the local community. We are delighted to be here.'

It was the couple's own altruism and a wish to celebrate what Earth 'n' Sea has done in Byron for the last 30 years, that became the platform for a birthday party planned as a fundraising event as well as a gathering of the Earth 'n' Sea 'clan'.

'We believe a lot of good work is done by the Lions Club. We believe in helping

youth and we support Street Cruise and the Byron Youth Service.' To this end, all profits from the kitchen and the bar on the night were donated to charity. With the generous donation by the staff of their time for the event, the total came to over \$1,600, and the Lions Club also ran a chocolate wheel which made almost \$800.

'That someone could create an idea that lasted 30 years is incredible. Not many businesses from 30 years ago are still going. What we have is really special because it was here at the beginning - always supportive of locals and the Byron ideal,' says David.

CHESS by Ian Rogers

While players over the age of 40 have almost disappeared from the upper echelons of the world rankings, Viktor Korchnoi continues as if the effects of aging do not apply to him.

After being just one of a group of chess superstars who emerged from the Soviet Union in the 1950s, Korchnoi gained a new lease of life when he defected to the West in 1976.

Korchnoi was already one of the oldest world title challengers when he unsuccessfully tried to prise the title from Anatoly Karpov in 1978 and 1981 yet a quarter of a century later Korchnoi seems to have lost little of his energy and motivation.

In 2006, aged 75, Korchnoi is now ranked just outside the top 100 and has already played a dozen tournaments in the first nine months of the year, ranging from playing on board one for Switzerland at the Torino Chess Olympiad, to an exhibition blitz event with Karpov and Garry Kasparov, to the powerful Geller Memorial tournament in Odessa where Korchnoi finished a respectable third.

Korchnoi has finally deigned to play on the senior circuit, but his performance at the European Senior Championship in Switzerland in August was disappointing.

Typically, Korchnoi bounced back immediately

and this week comfortably won the World Senior Championship in Italy.

'I have been developing as a chessplayer for a long time, perhaps, this fact prolongs my career,' said Korchnoi in a recent interview. '[In my view] chess is like a contagion, it's difficult to recover!'

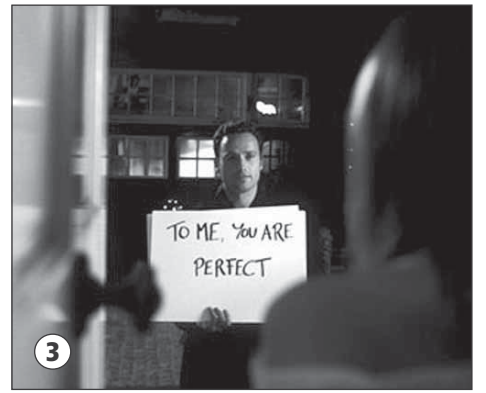

independent release, *Pure Things in Wild Places* traverses the musical landscape with a rich dichotomy of songs. At times reminiscent of Patti Smith, and then at others Joni Mitchell, this record is the one she felt driven to make after amicably parting with Columbia. 'For the first few months after we parted ways it was a little bit strange. I just kept writing, and I went right what will I do with these songs? I had a few dear friends who were willing to invest in the record, one was in the form of the studio and the other was in the form of a school friend who wanted to set up a business. I feel this is a much better sounding record than what I've done in the past, it's something I've

had my hands in from the beginning.' Carla believes music has a kind of spiritual, ethereal quality that exists for everyone. 'Sound doesn't belong to anyone in my opinion, you create these things because you feel so inspired, but ultimately it doesn't belong to us.' Creating an album is a collaborative process, and one that Carla fully immersed herself in. 'You have to ask for help, I couldn't have done it without the help of friends. I got a lot of musical direction from my partner Lucius Borich (of Cog fame). We have been together for 12 years, music is a huge part of our lives, we both inspire each other musically.'

So what inspired the journey of *Pure Things in Wild Places*?

'It's feeling that I am inspired by, there are some songs on the record that are not really about me. I put myself into the mind of my friends and try and imagine what they are going through. I have this thing called dark love, and there's an element of light as well - I wanted to honour the darkness and the light and honour them as emotions that are prevalent in human beings. The record is around the yin yang. It's important to honour the darlings and the demons!'

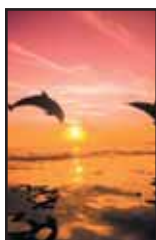

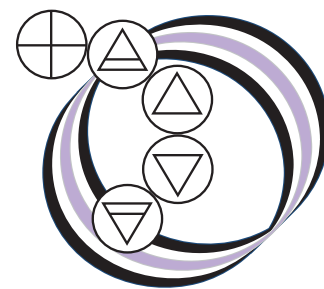

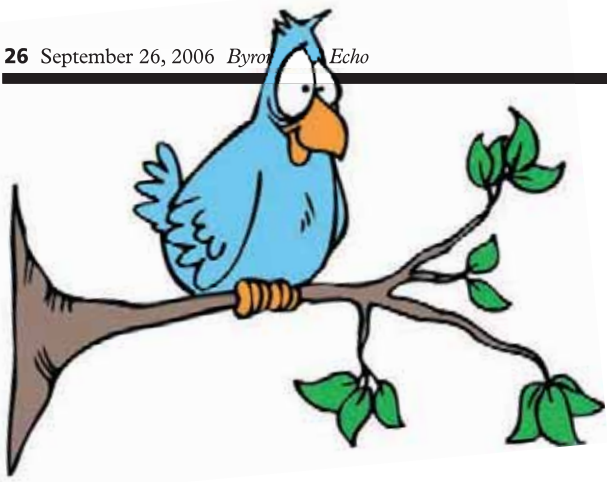

Make a splash with glass

Vetrocolour can be used for painted glass splashbacks, vanity units, benchtops, furniture – you name it. Here Ocean Shores Glass & Screens talks about commonly asked questions to do with the product.

Remember, plus or minus 2mm on the size required when 6mm glass is toughened; Australian standards. Glass panels that are more than 3mm out of square will be cut out of square. Panels 3mm or less won't be.

There seems to be some confusion developing out there about samples and differing shades when applied to glass splashbacks. To keep it fairly simple have a look at the corner where two walls meet. Notice the two are different shades of the same colour. This is due to light refraction and how we perceive it.

Remember half of a wall done the same colour can sometimes appear a different shade from a small sample due to the fact that the large section feeds on its own colour. Sure, there are other reasons as well, like chemical bonding to the glass surface, however we did state that we'd keep it fairly simple. Movie Reviews

TALLADEGA NIGHTS

It's an unholy trinity – the ear-splitting roar of NASCAR racing, thrashing guitars and Will Ferrell. You wouldn't credit how well it works. Contrary to the dud previews, this is a robust, funny movie with more depth than you might expect from its easily dismissed scenario. It takes a scornful swipe at the greed, gaucheness and rudeness of American culture while simultaneously maintaining a clear affection



for its mundane virtues, with Ferrell, at last, finding the perfect vehicle for his preparedness to act the imbecile without reservation – any sense of him being hip behind the facade is sacrificed by his running around helplessly in his Y-fronts. As Ricky Bobby, a speedway driver whose career crests and tumbles before he finally re-establishes himself, he is a few pressure points below his usual excess and ultimately wins you over to the idiot revhead. The characters surrounding him are acutely observed and parodied without nastiness. Gary Cole is terrific as his Bud-swigging, dope-dealing Daddy and Sacha Baron Cohen almost steals the show as the mincing French poof who comes to challenge Ricky. Irreligious, trenchantly un-PC and, like the best satires, willing to embrace that which it puts the boot into.

THE DEVIL WEARS PRADA

Andy Sachs is a sweet girl from Ohio who wants to make it as a writer in New York. She is employed as an assistant to Miranda Priestley, the editor of Runway fashion magazine, where she is sniggered at for her dowdiness. Being a Hollywood flick, she is, naturally, even before her makeover, more beautiful than anybody else in the building. It takes a long time for anything to happen and when it does it still isn't very interesting, for the wide-eyed innocent's path can be foretold with a stone cold certainty that drains any sense of curiosity

or potential for surprise from a formulaic script. You can see it all coming from a long catwalk away – how she will be seduced by the job and usurp the other girl, how her ruthless boss will eventually, like Henry Higgins, be won over and how her romance will be tested. As Andy, Jane Hathaway squeezes snugly into a bustier but is otherwise too good to believe. Thankfully, Meryl Streep saves the day as the grande dame of murderous chic. The fashion industry is a subject with tinder aplenty but, despite the brief spark of a Paris parade, there is no combustion here.

A GREEK FEAST

LATELY I AM DISCOVERING elements of Lismore which are gradually eroding my preconceptions of this big sprawl of a town. If it's not the smart Italian café next to the cinema complex (where on a rainy hungover Sunday morning you and your partner may be the only viewers in one of the auditoriums: your own private showing) it's the little back lanes and alleyways composed of ancient shops and dusty, dubious offices – or the undercover markets a block down from the Base Hospital where you can buy yourself a white peacock.

But the real reason I am becoming fond of Lismore is because of NORPA, and specifically its Lismore Feast. For several years I had been reading about this annual event held so evocatively under the stars; the time Karen Martini came up to cook for it I had cursed myself for not purchasing a ticket in time. So this year, especially when I found out who the visiting chef was, I was determined not to miss out.

Peter Conistis's food I had eaten in Sydney a long time ago, before he became quite as celebrated as he is today. Even then, however, at his tiny premises at the top of the Cross, he was steadily acquiring a sturdy fan base for his contemporary take on traditional Greek dishes.

And so there was to be a Greek feast. It had been raining all week; the prepaid tickets at \$120 a head were not cheap; I forced myself to remain positive. We had taken the sensible precaution of booking a room at the Bounty Motel down the road from the City Hall where the Feast was to be held, and so at the appointed time only needed to scroll across to the gardens out the front. Flanking the fountain, they were as dressed-up and glamorous as the various people drifting around in the mild night air sipping champagne cocktails. There was not a breath of rain. A trio of musicians in a little gazebo played gentle music; eventually we wafted toward a canopied area warmed by braziers, and the Feast began. Five courses with matching de Bortoli wines at two endlessly long trestle tables lay before us with the bonus of sharing the night with complete strangers. On the beautifully dressed tables amongst bottles of wine were platters of roast olives, fritters and dips and chunks of bread, goat's cheese-stuffed peppers and roasted chickpeas. Platters were cleared to make room for buttery tartlets of prawn, crab and haloumi; little pies plump with rabbit and olives; lamb shanks with baked giant beans. Up on the stage a band was warming up as we were slowing down: the Quarteto Batida meant that after all that food and all that wine the only thing to do was dance – and so we danced. We danced until it was time for dessert, the fried pastry 'diples' with creamy honeyed yoghurt, blueberries and crunchy candied macadamias, our palates too blunted to properly appreciate the accompanying sticky wine.

It was an exquisite night, superbly orchestrated – even down to the fact that fifteen minutes after it ended the skies opened!
