

Police flag concerns Taste of Byron a top treat over NYE safety

In a confidential letter to Byron Shire Council, the officer in charge of Byron Bay police, Inspector Owen King, has expressed his concerns about public safety on New Years Eve in Byron Bay. This led Mayor Jan Barham after an urgency motion last week to seek to commit \$12,500 to lighting and toilets.

While declining to release his letter to the press, Insp King told The Echo, 'I could not wait any longer to find out what was happening. I needed to tell my commanders what resources I needed.

'Council does have a legislative responsibility for the safety of residents and visitors. Police too need safe working conditions and I outlined to Council the risk management measures I wanted to put in

The NYE vote got up 7-3, Crs Tucker, Tardif and Kestle opposed, after Councillors expressed misgivings about putting any more money into NYE. It transpired the money would come from an existing \$25,000 budget for waste management and would not interfere with the cleanup for the night.

The air was appropriately perfumed with cooking smells as the sunglasses-clad crowds jostled and thronged from stall to stall juggling cardboard plates of food. The stalls themselves were a gratifyingly representational mix of both local eateries and producers - some of them almost impossible to access due to the length of the queues.

I tasted a lot of Byron that hot afternoon - but also beyond: the most delicious thing I ate, and to be sure the winning Taste of Byron Dish, was the Iluka Prawn, Pink Ginger and Coconut Wonton with Tahitian Lime and Wasabi Mayo from Lismore's Basilico restaurant.

In fact all three of their offerings were superb: clean fresh flavours, use of local ingredients, impeccably cooked chicken and prawn, given the conditions. Honourable mention of the day went to Brown Sugar café, not only for their really gorgeous Rosewater Yoghurt Balls with creamy chocolate sapote sorbet but also for the vicissitudes they encountered: firstly no power to run their espresso machine and continued on page 4





Work and welfare laws draw flak

About 120 people turned up at Railway Park, Byron Bay, last Saturday to voice opposition to federal government legislation on welfare and work.

Christine Smith of the Community and Public Sector Union told of local workers being offered wage cuts or the sack. One worker was told to work a double shift for no wages or face dismissal for misconduct. Such a dismissal results in eight weeks delay receiving welfare payments.

Greens MLC Lee Rhiannon flew from Sydney for the rally and reinforced the message that WorkChoices and Welfare to Work legislation combine to throw people off welfare and into low paid Private Members Bill designed to protect local council workers from the WorkChoices legislation by changing the legal status of their employer. 'The government has legislated to take corporations power of the commonwealth. This bill takes it back,' she said.



In bed with sex

Byron Shire Council was pretty much hogtied in its decision last week to approve the Shire's first legal brothel in the Byron Arts & Industry Estate, whatever individual councillors' ethical inclinations. A previous council had written into the Local Environmental Plan (LEP) that brothels are a permissible use in an industrial zone – this with the state government of the day requiring Council to choose a zone under new legislation (Disorderly Houses (Amendment) Act 1995). In addition earlier grounds for refusal on sewerage capacity in April 2006 had been washed away by the new West Byron plant coming on line. At the time of the April vote an amendment by Mayor Jan Barham to include considerations of social amenity got voted down, so no joy there. Had Council refused the DA, the applicants would be almost certain to get the decision overturned in the Land and Environment Court, thus throwing away ratepayers' money.

The objections offered by the councillors opposed – Lazarus, Mangleson and Barham - do not seem to hold water, legally speaking. The planning staff had canvassed the issue of proximity to church, childcare centre and entertainment centre and the brothel appears to meet the guidelines, though neither the LEP nor the Act adequately define 'proximity'. The notion that the brothel might have an impact on future development of the estate is no consideration for assessing the merits of the DA before Council under current law. That our industrial estate is 'different' to all others is Council's fault for allowing unauthorised uses, eg residential, to become established over a number of years - you can hardly tell the applicants their authorised use doesn't 'fit in'.

Though not relevant to the assessment process, since Council does not have a completed social impact assessment development control plan, Cr Barham's concerns that the brothel encourages the Bay to become a sex tourism destination might be valid. The Bay is already a sex tourism destination. Young lads don't flock here from overseas and from up the coast in search of macramé classes. Council is better placed to assist local young women overcome the exploitation which already occurs as part of youth culture, rather than worrying about a facility in which sexual activities are closely controlled.

Though not a thing of beauty and a joy forever, the brothel building plan indicates it is designed to minimise its presence and maximise security for patrons, the workers and the public. The moral dilemma it poses is a matter of individual taste. If it exploits women, then it does so in a controlled environment, though not all women who take up prostitution are in desperate circumstances. The claim that it will bring entirely 'bad people' into the neighbourhood is not necessarily true – it will most likely entice staunch burghers of the community who have hitherto relied on the Ballina establishment or phone services.

And given the causes of current international conflicts one wonders if institutionalised religion is a greater harm to public morality than prostitution.







'Nobody's got the right to give up'

Among his many titles, David is a scientist, broadcaster, author and chair of the David Suzuki Foundation. He is an officer of the Order of Canada and a recipient of UNESCO's Kalinga Prize for science and the United Nations Environment Program medal. He is Professor Emeritus at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver and holds 14 honorary degrees from universities around the world. He is also familiar to television audiences as host of the long-running television program The Nature of Things, while his written work includes more than 30 books. He is a native of Vancouver, Canada.

This was David's last speaking tour of Australia in his 70th year and he included Byron Bay and Lismore in the tour and launched his autobiography at the events.

This is your last book tour. How do feel? Is there a sense of nostalgia?


What I am hoping is that I never write another book. I am sure I will come back here as long as my health is OK, mainly as a tourist, but I'll still do talks.



CHESS by lan Rogers

Vladimir Kramnik of Russia has won the 2006 World Chess Championship match after an acrimonious three week contest against Bulgaria's Veselin Topalov in Elista, Russia.

Kramnik and Topalov, both 31, were tied 6-6 after the 12 regulation games but Kramnik edged out Topalov 2.5-1.5 in the rapid tie-breaker. Kramnik becomes the first undisputed World Champion since 1993 when then champion Garry Kasparov broke away from the World Chess Federation.

Without doubt the Elista contest has been the most controversial, bitter and entertaining World Championship match since the notorious Karpov-Korchnoi contest in the Philippines in 1978, a match also decided by the narrowest of margins

After falling behind 2-0, Veselin Topalov's team decided to counterattack off the board and their insinuations about Kramnik possibly receiving computer help in the toilet adjacent to his rest room almost caused the match to be abandoned. A blunder by the referee in starting the fifth game while the rest room argument raged caused Topalov to be handed a free point on forfeit but Kramnik surprisingly and courageously agreed to continue the match under protest (pressure from Russian President Putin may have contributed to Kramnik's decision).

The incident seemed to give a boost to Topalov, who even managed to take the lead by

winning game 9, given below. Meanwhile the sniping from

Team Topalov continued, with Kramnik being falsely accused of avoiding a drug test and the Russian reasserting his option of legal action to overturn the game 5 forfeit if he lost the match.

Over the board the players fought like tigers, in games filled with great ideas and even greater blunders. Topalov showed himself to be a master of the opening phase of the game but Kramnik's fighting spirit ultimately prevailed.







SO WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BE A SINGER/ SONGWRITER? Well obviously talent, inspiration, passion, humour and a whole lot of resilience. The singer/songwriter has become the modern day poet, plying their craft to reflect experience, pass comment, or communicate emotion. It's an intensely creative role and one that music audiences have come to truly appreciate.

I was driving American comedian Tom Rhodes to the airport the other day. I had one of Tex Perkin's CDs playing, I think it was Dark Horses. He was like 'Man, who is that?' I tried to explain Tex and the many

incarnations. The Beasts of Bourbon, The Cruel Sea, Tex solo, Tex Don and Charlie and now, Tex and Tim. A truly great singer/songwriter who knows how to share the love around. Without being insulting, it was hard to convince Tom that

and now, Tex truly great gwriter who vo to share the d. Without ting, it was prince Tom that

Tex was Australian. He's like 'Man, but it's so good.' There's more to Australian songwriting than 'I come from a land down under' and Rockstar INXS. There's a whole landscape of music rich in genre, created by mainstream and independent artists alike.

The Bangalow Pacific Songwriters Festival is the first festival of its kind. While there are camps and seminars that focus on songwriting, there's books and articles, this is the first Festival which brings the song and the songwriter to the fore. The festival celebrates songwriting as a craft and will feature a host of performers from national headliners like Tex Perkins and Rob Hirst (Midnight Oil) and locally based performers such as 2006 Dolphin Album of the Year winner: Sara Tindley and ex front man for James Morrison, Mr Percival, who has developed his own unique spontaneous songwriting with the aid of just an audience and a few delay pedals.

The Festival is the love child of Mook and Shanto, the creative yin and yang of the Byron Vista Social Club. Over the past two years these dedicated musians have imbued a closed and disconnected music scene with their utopian sensibilities. The Social Club has exposed local music lovers to the vast array of talent we have here, and it's done something that I believe is even more important: it's exposed singer/songwriters to each other and nurtured a creative community in an industry which often has a fairly closed competitive edge.

Leigh James was one of the participating artists who acknowledged this: 'I guess there are a number of festivals that cater for different genres of music but not specifically songwriting, and now it's time to focus on the song. Mook and Shanto are approaching it from the ground up. They've put in a lot of energy. It's more of a cooperative approach, and it's great to see they are already getting some 'name' people. It's a platform for the excellent acts which have been hatched via the BVSC and it's a great springboard for them to get a new audience. I'll be doing a set on the Saturday evening.'

Lismore based Luke Vassella has four self produced CD's and is looking forward to the one day festival.

'It's going to be great for the North Coast community of songwriters to be able to get together and be in the one spot to celebrate what we have and resonate together.


'There is always a lot of different jam nights and singer songwriter nights, the Bangalow Songwriter's Festival has come out of that, and in particularly the Byron Vista Social Club.'

Luke echoes the sentiments of those who participate

and attend the Sunday evenings at Ewingsdale.

'I love it, I've been to two and played at one. I fell in love with it, I love the atmosphere, the quality of the music. I think we will be trying to do everything we can to achieve that for sure.'

The Byron Vista Social Club recordings reflect the ambience and creativity of both the event and the people in the region. Perhaps the reason we have a festival like this established here says something about the organic nature of songwriting. Investigating the deep underlying inspirations, the challenges and the processes of songwriters is Deb Kruger, author of Songwriters Speak. She'll be doing in depth interviews with both Tex and Rob during the Festival. With a huge line up, don't miss out. The Bangalow Pacific Songwriters Festival is on Saturday 28 October at the Bangalow A&I Hall. During the day there will also be a series of workshops run at the Scout Hall and the Moller Pavillion, all day performances and street busking. This will be a complete creative immersion. but by the time I do he's sitting on his porch overlooking the Melbourne traffic eating jelly babies. The interview has a soundtrack of passing traffic and squishy jubes

'I actually have a whole bag of them. I am eating three at once.'

It's wonderful to see a man who experiences such simple pleasure.

I haven't spoken with Greg in over two years, in that time he's been a regular panellist on Spicks and Specks, performed 3 new solo shows at the Melbourne comedy Festival and appeared on Rove a couple of times. Greg spent a significant amount of time in the last few years on commercial radio, hosting The Arvo on Austereo with Judith Lucy and Peter Helliar and was a regular on The Cage on Triple M. These days it's a one day drop in with Tony Martin on his Triple M Breakfast show.

'I hated doing breakfast radio in Sydney. I swore I'd never do it again. I have been doing Tony Martin's show on Triple M one day a week and it's such fun I'd rather be doing it than not doing it. It's exactly what I wanted to do.

I've been doing that and I am writing a TV 6 part thing for Ted Robinson, he's head of comedy at ABC for a while, does the Glass House and Good News Week.

Greg returns to Byron Bay with highlights from his most recent show at the Melbourne comedy festival.

'I did a show that I will probably do up there. It's a show on language, and how we use it, and most of it will be stuff they haven't heard, it was probably the best received of any of my shows.'

Greg Fleet is undoubtedly the most prolific Australian comedian. The only comic I know of to perform a new show every year at the comedy festival in Melbourne, Greg doesn't rest on his laurels and milk the same hour and a half of material for 10 years, he is constantly delving into his life and creating new and unique comedy material. For Fleety, humility is the key.

'For me, it's what I'd like to see, unless it's character I don't really go for arrogance on stage, if you are humble people like you a lot more. It's survival, if people think you are tough they'll go at you. I don't. No way. If anyone heckles me I'd run away. It's rude, I wouldn't do that to anyone ever. They wreck your night and come up and say I've helped you out. I have no tolerance – if someone heckles me I take it really personally, I argue with them like it was a personal issue.'

Often comedy is about survival. It's not about being funny, it's about surviving


the gig. Or at least making it to the carpark. I asked Fleety about his most recent gig 'challenge'.

'I did a corporate gig recently. They said it's going to be a businessmen's lunch – and I turn up there and I see 30 naked women. I see footy players and naked chicks, lap dancers, taking them out the back and giving private dances. In the middle of all this they stopped the strippers and said here's the comedian. They hated it. The thing is, I don't get almost having sex with someone – that would be so frustrating – I either want to have sex or not, I don't want to be somewhere in the middle.

'I actually did a gig recently that was one of the best gigs I've had in ages, I had one of those ones that was tremendous, you might be gettting to the stage where it's like you want to give up and it's a reminder of why I do it.'





Aussie hip hop culture has come a long way. From its birth in the early eighties to its current insurgence, it's a journey that many are not familiar with. In the early eighties movies such as Beat Street, Wild Style and Style Wars introduced the curious to graffiti and breakdancing. Early hip hop music such as 'the message' and 'rappers delight' came soon afterwards and hip hop culture was born locally and throughout the world. Hype magazine and Def Wish Cast became early pioneers of an Aussie scene that until recently was still very much underground. Now Aussie hip hop music is heard on mainstream radio stations. graffiti is used to advertise products with a 'cool' edge, breakdancing is seen on film clips from Madonna to Christina Aquilera and DJing is as common as playing the guitar. This isn't a local phenomenon because hip hop is now truly global. Throughout Europe, train lines in every capital city

are covered in graffiti. Early detractors criticised Aussie hip hop culture of trying to be American. If you hear an Aussie rapping about shooting people, his ho's, bitches and bling, the dude's a fool and doesn't represent true hip hop. Aussie hip hop is about Australia. it's for people to communicate artistically in a way that often isn't available in any other form. So it's fitting that as Aussie hip hop culture matures that a documentary has been released about it.

Enter Skip Hop, directed by Oriel Gutherie, it's the first documentary to convey the journey and current state of Australian hip hop culture. 

Urban Reclaimed Water for Byron Bay – creating a sustainable future

Byron Shire Council has been contributing to the sustainable management of water resources in the shire since the early eighties. In a bid to reduce the impact of the effluent discharge from the South Byron Sewage Treatment plant on the Tallow Creek estuary, the Council, in partnership with the Byron Golf Course, implemented an effluent reuse program involving irrigating the tees and fairways.

Over twenty years have passed since Council's first foray into reclaimed water reuse and the precious resource continues to climb in its value to the community. Council now also provides reclaimed water for rural reuse at Mullumbimby and through the National award winning West Byron Integrated Water Management Reserve. The Reserve continues to provide reclaimed water for the Golf Course via the reclaimed water pipeline constructed through Byron Bay as part of the recently completed sewage augmentation scheme.

The scheme includes a reclaimed water treatment plant designed to deliver high quality water that meets NSW Department of Health and NSW Department of Environment and Conservation guidelines for reclaimed water use in an urban setting.

The scheme offers the community and the environment many benefits including:

- Reducing the demand on potable water supplies from Rocky Creek dam, extending the service delivery capacity of our regional potable water supply.
- Cessation of effluent discharges to the Tallow Creek Estuary.
- Reducing effluent discharges to the Belongil Estuary and ultimately the Cape Byron Marine Reserve, thereby protecting the health of our waterways and ecosystems for the fisheries and tourism industries.
- Reducing the impact of water restrictions on playing fields and improving the playing surface quality.
- Increasing the economic viability of water dependent industries such as nurseries,
- Making reclaimed water available to a greater number of potential reclaimed water users now and in the future

By the end of 2006 Council anticipates connecting the Byron Bay Bowling Club to the Urban Reclaimed Water Scheme, and in 2007, Council, in conjunction with the Federal Government Community Water Grants program, plans to make reclaimed water connections with:

Byron High School
 Red Devil's Playing Fields
 EnviTE Native Plant Nursery
 Tennyson St Playing Fields

Reclaimed water is also being used to irrigate over 750,000 melaleuca trees at the BBIWMR. This project not only reuses reclaimed water it helps manage acid sulphate soils, sequester carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and provides habitat and connectivity along a regionally significant wildlife corridor.

Council is seeking expressions of interest for further commercial water reuse projects along the urban corridor.

Bangalow Bamboo - Innovation in Water Cycle Management

The Bangalow Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) is going through changes, as is the village as a whole. Byron Shire Council is, in accordance with its adopted policies and strategies, planning to construct a new STP and commission an effluent reuse scheme. This will better meet Bangalow's changing needs and at the same time stop effluent discharge to Maori Creek. The existing sewage plant was originally built in 1975, so is now over 30 years old. The new STP should be completed in 2007 with site construction expected to commence early in the year. The effluent reuse scheme will see over 900 bamboo plants being planted before the end of November this year.

A sustainable future

This project is an integral part of Byron Shire Council's Integrated Water Cycle Management and has many benefits for a sustainable future.

The project will

- address the needs of Bangalow's increasing population there will be an increase in the plant's capacity to treat effluent from the current 400 kL/day to 850kL/day
- address community expectations of sustainable water management and the desire to use treated effluent as a valuable resource
- offer best practice and innovation for protection, conservation and education about our precious water resources.
- offer greater compliance to today's stringent environmental standards – there will be a significant improvement in the quality of the effluent discharged
- reduce the demand for potable water from our existing water
 supply
- reduce the discharges of treated effluent into Maori Creek –
 Current discharges will be reduced initially by 12% of dry weather
 flows with ultimate aim to have 100% dry weather reuse in the
 near future.
- end Bangalow's sewerage moratorium which is currently in place

A trial conducted by Byron Shire Council and Southern Cross University found that bamboo offered the best response to effluent irrigation. Other potential crops investigated for sustainable effluent reuse included hemp and Kenaf. The use of bamboo will see a significant improvement in the overall quality of the effluent. Crops

of bamboo will be irrigated with treated effluent from the sewage treatment plant. The bamboo plants will uptake nutrients through natural processes of growth. The end result means that the nutrient discharge to the waterway will be minimized of a higher water quality.

Irrigation rates, while conservative at first, may be increased substantially if ongoing monitoring confirms sustainability of higher rates, but it is hoped that the bamboo crops will utilize full dry weather flows from the STP in the coming years.

A number of different species of non-invasive clumping-type bamboos are being evaluated for their potential to use effluent productively. Some of the advantages of clumping bamboos are that they are predictable, easily controlled and easily harvested. They also have very high growth rates and an ability to use added water and nutrients.

Effluent reuse in NSW is governed by the requirements of the NSW Department Environment and Heritage, NSW Department of Health and guidelines from a range of organisations including NSW Recycled Water Co-ordination Committee and the Australian and New Zealand Environment and Conservation Council (ANZECC)

Byron Shire has elected that the new STP provide an effluent standard greater than current modern practices for discharging into inland waterways.

The most innovative aspect of the Bangalow facility is however, the attention paid to what happens to the effluent after it leaves the treatment system. This treated effluent will be managed in an ecologically sustainable way that has no adverse impact on the natural environment, protects public health, achieves maximum resource recovery and meets the needs and expectations of existing and future communities.

Bamboo traditionally has hundreds of uses including; paper, textiles, clothing, furniture, building and mulch applications. The potential of these bamboo products is beginning to be realised in Australia. To ensure maximum resource recovery a goal of this project will be to maximise the value of the end products.







IRAQ WAR A MISTAKE

Tustine Elliot says we should focus on protecting Australia from the threat of Terrorism.

"The resources and funding being squandered fighting the war in Iraq could be better spent protecting Australia in our own region," said Justine.





CHAIN MAIL OF THE TASTIER KIND

MY FIRST INSTINCT when I received Anita's email was to disregard it – it was one of those chain ones mailed not to me exclusively, the ones I automatically delete without opening when they arrive on my computer, feeling indignant and obscurely offended. Loathsome idea - but this one, I soon saw, was different. This was a Recipe Exchange and all I had to do was to send a quick and easy recipe to the name at the top of the list then forward the email to ten friends; in return I could expect, assuming everyone cooperated, thirty six new recipes.

How could I resist? As it has turned out, I have to date received only five, but each of them contains something of interest. This sort of chance and randomness I do love - a little like the time years ago when I decided I wanted to start up a Book Club so ran a small classified ad in this newspaper and went on to meet four interesting women, one of whom remains, beyond the demise of the Club, a good friend.

The recipe I sent to the name on the list was for an unusual and delicious salad, albeit quick and easy, made with burghul and button mushrooms in a dressing sharp with fresh ginger and garlic. Interestingly, all the recipes I received back were for sweet things. The first to arrive was entitled Norfolk Island Coconut Loaf and it is the one I am keenest to have a go at: according to its sender it is a no-fail recipe. You simply mix together two cups of self raising flour with two cups of coconut and one cup of sugar then stir in two cups of milk before pouring into a loaf tin and baking for about an hour in a moderate oven. I imagine that it would make a gorgeous weekend breakfast served warm and sliced with a good coffee. The next recipe was sent by a chef, and helpfully arrived complete with a breakdown of ingredient cost, weight per unit, calorie content and recommended retail price! Mysteriously named MacAlmond Cookies, these biscuits too are composed of a lot of coconut, though also an entire cup of cornflour and lashings of ground almonds and, without the chocolate piping at the end, work out at a surprisingly low 60 calories per biscuit. Then came the recipe from a woman in America. It brought back in a rush the memory of one of the very first things I ever baked as a child. Our next door neighbours had gone to live in Washington for several years and when they returned they brought back gifts; mine was a 'cookie' cookbook. Drawn to the recipe for a slice called Walnut Panocha I set about earnestly baking it. The main ingredients I still recall to this day: brown sugar, condensed milk, and naturally walnuts - there were eggs too I believe and butter, and presumably some type of flour in there somewhere. And coconut. I distinctly remember how intensely, cloyingly rich and sweet this biscuit slice was, the sort of richness that leaves you feeling faintly sick upon ingestion. Pam's Peanut Butter Rice Krispy Bars could only have come out of that supersized culture and sound about as treacherous as the Walnut Panocha: you boil together one cup of sugar and one cup of light corn syrup then add one cup of peanut butter and six cups of Rice Bubbles (or 'crisped rice'). This mixture is pressed into a baking tray and topped with half a kilo of melted chocolate and butterscotch. No cooking involved! And, one would expect, about 6,000 calories per piece.

Next came the cutely titled Lemonade Scones. Another super swift recipe, it is great 'if you have unexpected visitors', its author suggests. You mix one cup of cream with one cup of lemonade, three cups of self raising flour and half a cup of sultanas ('if you like them', sweetly); knead the mixture, roll it out and cut it into shapes before baking for fifteen minutes in a moderately hot oven. My aoodness

I have saved the best for last. From the UK, Peter sent a recipe for a Chocolate Raspberry Pavlova. It was not, however, the actual thing which enchanted me, it was the prose in which he expressed its procedure; it was prose I wished I had written. '... when you prod the centre,' he says, 'you should feel the promise of squidginess beneath your fingers', then a little further on, 'coarsely grate the chocolate so that you get curls rather than rubble, as you don't want the raspberries' luscious colour and form to be obscured, and sprinkle haphazardly over the top, letting some form, as it will, on the plate's rim

If anyone is remotely attracted to this rather charming form of chain communication I am happy to pass on the details. Meanwhile, I have some baking to do!

THE DEPARTED

For some time, Martin Scorsese has been directing films that suggest he is peeved at not being the man who made The Godfather. Having also fallen behind the likes of Tarantino in the brain splattering caper, he can at least hold his own when it comes to tough guys swearing loudly at each other. Matt Damon is a bent cop working for Jack Nicholson's Mr Big. Leonardo DiCaprio is an undercover detective who has been embedded in Nicholson's inner circle. The story is basically about who will get sprung first, but it becomes awfully knotty, with questions about morality, corruption and identity. As you would expect, it gets to the point where you feel nobody can be trusted - except for Martin Sheen's Queenan, for how could the good President Bartlet from TV's West Wing be anything but totally reliable? That's the sort of pretend world it creates. It's slick and glossy, with mobiles and texting playing as big a part as any actor, but after two and a half hours all we get at the end is the undergraduate symbolism of a rat crawling along a balustrade with the golden dome of City Hall in the background.
