





FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES Envirofund success for BVL

Successful Round 8 Envirofund projects were recently announced by the Federal Government. 1,922 applications were received with 1,126 projects being funded. BVL sponsored three applications: 'Coastal Melaleuca Wetland Restoration' [\$20,780], Restoration of endangered littoral rainforest in Byron shire [\$50,000] and 'Improving reef health in the Byron Marine Park [\$22,488] all of which were successful, bringing a total of \$93,268 in funding into the Brunswick Catchment. New local group promotes 'real democracy'

A new local group intent on returning power to the people was launched this week. Real Democracy Byron Shire (RDBS) says it operates on the principle that, by law, the people collectively are the highest authority in Australia, which it calls 'Collective Sovereignty'.

The group invites residents of Byron Shire who are dissatisfied with their level of participation in the decisionmaking process and who are ready to fulfill their responsibility as a part of the Collective Sovereignty, to claim their right to a self-determined future by joining the Real Democracy movement.

Using the internet, and a network of meetings and local groups, local, national and global decisions 'can now be collectively debated and subsequently resolved online, enabling the community to be fully empowered', says the group.





Own goal or winner?

An investigation of 2.3 hectares of crown land at New Brighton for possible sportsfields seems like grasping at straws if it is an attempt to placate sports lobbyists in

Mayor Jan Barham put up the notice of motion last week and just got it across the line on her casting vote. The land in question is on the seaward side of an existing sportsfield.

In environmental terms, it does not seem a viable choice. The land is zoned for coastal habitat and a prime target for inundation if global warming has its way. Cr Barham's argument that the land is degraded is the same one trotted out by the supporters of Lot 107, Shara Boulevarde, North Ocean Shores, for sportsfields. It can always be rehabilitated.

In political terms, it has so far failed to impress the Brunswick Valley Sports Association and it will never impress Crs Jan Mangleson and Ross Tucker. Whether this matters much in overall votes for The Greens remains to be seen.

In legal terms, it is debatable that it fulfils Council's section 94 requirements for sportsfields at Ocean Shores. In sporting terms, another field is better than no field at all, and there is still hope the new owners of the Yelgun site will accommodate sporting activities.

Cr Jan Mangleson's comment that Cr Barham's move was 'rule by notice of motion' was a cheap shot. Cr Mangleson knows full well that any councillor may lobby his or her colleagues on pet projects by having a notice of motion included in the business papers; it is hardly the sole province of the mayor.

Money money money

Auditor Kevin Franey of Thomas Noble and Russell last week gave a fluent presentation of the mysteries of money management in relation to Byron Shire Council's 05/06 financial statements. The upshot was that Council is generally in a sound position – much better than the general fund debacle carried over from the 91-95 term which required Council to take out loans to replace money misused – and warranted qualified congratulations from Mr Franey.

The working funds surplus in the general fund has gone from \$142,000 in 2002 to \$1,080,00 in 2006 and is expected to reach \$1,900,000 by 2009 – a comfortable buffer. Council's debt service ratio is under 5%, below the far north coast council average, and well below the 2001 figure of 8%. Its short term position is 'sound', according to Mr Franey, and its future depends on the successful management of its \$355 million in assets that's roads, reserves, buildings, and quarries to us.

The big bogeyman for all local councils is the constant underfunding by the state and federal governments. So critical is the situation a Local Government Financial Sustainability Task Force has been established by the Local Government and Shires Association (www. Igsa.org.au) to see if many councils can avoid going under altogether.

Only a week ago, Veselin Topalov was shrugging off his loss of the World Championship title to Vladimir Kramnik with the words, 'The title itself is nothing for me. If I continue to win tournaments and be No.1 on the rating list, it is of no importance at all that the title belongs to Kramnik.

However, a week later Topalov is close to losing his number one ranking as well, after a disastrous showing in the Essent Crown tournament played in Hoogeveen, the Netherlands.

Topalov treated Hoogeveen as an opportunity to restore his image after the bitter world title match. He signed autographs, posed for photos with juniors and even joined in jokes about computers in the toilets.

Unfortunately over the board the Essent tournament proved catastrophic for Topalov. The Bulgarian lost his first two games, to 2005 World Junior Champion Shakhrvar Mamedyarov and to top woman player Rh7 18.Nh5 Bh8 19.Kb1 Nc5?! 19. Judit Polgar, and after losing a second game to Polgar could only manage to come third in a tournament of four players. Mamedyarov and Polgar came equal first.

The first of Polgar's wins against Topalov, given below, was another milestone for the Hungarian legend, in this case the first win in a regular tournament game by a female over the world's top ranked player. Whether he retains that status is unclear, but it already seems that the near invincible Topalov of the past 18 months is gone.

Deya Dova has the kind of voice that has you thinking you are in the presence of angels. But not those airy fairy ones wearing sheets. I'm talking serious angels. All powerful, fierce, passionate, sweet, slightly wicked and heavenly all at the same time.

Deya has just recorded and released The Jasmani Garden and will be launching it at the Byron Community Centre on Thursday.

The album was put together just months after giving birth to her third child.

'I just wanted to have some time to myself and get back in touch with my music because ultimately that gives me so much joy. I thought I am going to go down to the studio (at home) and put down piano, put down guitar, press record and see what happens. It was such a beautiful process. It was something I did each day. I just multi-tracked my voice and as the songs layered themselves up I would go: Oh gee a gong would be nice there...

Being a multi-talented artist, Deya has produced before, but not with such detail.

'I always go for the purity of sound. With this album it felt like it was coming together from very world sounds - each song was like it was from a different country.

This album is a departure from the music of the woman formerly known as Miranda. Renowned for her passionate song, driving guitar and thumping lyrics, her latest project has its roots in trance and improvisation.

'This other voice was stepping into my music - one of syllables and vowels. It just comes from inside of me and I always used to call it my inner culture. These are songs from my soul, so more and more these kind of sounds I was feeding into the guitar vocal tracks, and i thought wow they stand alone by themselves, I am just going to the studio to open my mouth and see what happens!

'It's hard to describe. It's like new world music scatting. It has a real world music genre about it, but this music doesn't come from a particular culture or tradition that I 've learnt: "neworld" is the term I have come up with.

'Something quieter is happening here. It's meditative. You want to come home, run a bath, light candles, and listen to it, and go on a bit of a journey. It's got a real nurturing influence. Trance is a big influence for me. Particularly tribal trance.'

'It really feels like something that comes from something inside. It's not like I've gone oh gee, I've had all these experiences so I'll write about it, it's very unconscious – it seems to bypass identity, a kind of pure place. it's great for me because it contrasts with the raunchy singer songwriter thing I have been known for in the















SOAPBOX: MANDY NOLAN

Right now we are one of the only areas not on water restrictions. While the rest of the East Coast is bathing in a bucket we have our taps running free. Sometimes I brush my teeth three times before breakfast just because I can. In fact the other day I rang friends in Sydney who haven't been able to wash their car for months. I suggested they drive up for the weekend and wash it up here. This could be a new angle for tourism: 'Beautiful Byron. Paradise with a bathtub.' They released details of the 'least' water conscious of the Sydneysiders. Surprise, surprise. Woollahra came in at number one, followed by Vaucluse and

every other wealthy suburb with flashy cars and enormous gardens. It seems the plight of farmers is of little consequence when the prize roses are at risk and darling what's a \$200 fine now and then when relandscaping would set you back a hundred grand? Of course the poorer suburbs were the most careful. After all a whole family can bathe for a week in one inflatable pool. Without water, life becomes unsustainable. You can't even make beer. Water is our cultural conduit. It is the stuff of lattes. It fills our swimming pools, washes our streets and takes our poos to a better place. All over the country we are

being asked to reduce our water consumption. I am no water expert, but surely the residents of the driest continent should engage in year round water management practices. It's a bit late to start being careful when there's nothing left. We are our very own water storage units. And there's over 20 million of us. We are over 90% water. Now that's fine when the H2O is flowing. But in times of drought, water restrictions need to start at home. People need to reduce their water usage by around 50%, and replace the remaining 40% with some other bountiful substance, i.e. dirt, cane toads or bullshit.






I had a little conversation with **Ash Grunwald** in bed. Well, OK I was at my desk, and he was on the phone from his sick bed Get em when they're down. That's what I always say!

Ash has been one hell of a busy boy, hosting the Roots N All for Triple J, touring and creating and releasing his latest offering: Give Signs. How does a man in perpetual motion get the time to just

'There is no doing the normal things – you'd think you'd have to be doing normal things to write songs for normal people. You don't want every song to be about touring. I need to be alone and quite busy to write songs.

'A lot of my songs are on positive things. When I wrote for the last album I was pretty much bedridden (gees are we seeing a pattern here?) I went to Spain and I was really sick. I was in a non English speaking place, and I didn't speak Spanish. I wrote five songs for the new album.

'The flipside of touring is that it can actually help songwriting. When you are touring you become an observer, as soon as you have one other person with you you become your own little world and don't take



in as much... you don't sit at a bus stop and strike up a conversation with some 65 year old and find out about the place:

Ash Grunwald is an artist who has built up a following by playing lots of gigs, including those off the beaten track

'I value my phases – when I started it was more regional – I'd get in the car and do the small towns. I realised that I want to make the best music I can make, but I want it to be low brow, I don't want it to be for people. I have things to say and I want people to understand it.'

I suggested that good performance operates pretty much as a conversation with the audience.

'That is exactly exactly exactly

what I want to do – when you realise it changes what you do. You are in this feedback circle – you give it out – they give it back, you get really stoked and give it back... and so on.


'The performer has to interact with audience. I've been to gigs where the band looked like they were really pissed off. I guess that's the thing about cool, it has slight negativity about it. You don't want to be cool. Cool is so destructive. Cool is so pretentious. You end up thinking the wrong thing is important...'

For Ash it's all about playing

'One thing that freed me is that I know live shows are the main thing that I do. I have been working hard to make it sound pretty big. I am not going to be constrained by whether or not I can do it live, it's the fourth album and I thought it doesn't matter. I liken it to being a painter, every song is like a different painting and an album is like an exhibition.

'Musically I like albums that brood a bit and then have a lot of energy on stage in the live show.'

Playing songs from Ash present and Ash past, Mr Grunwald plays the Hotel Great Northern on Friday.



FAST FOOD NATION

Traces of shit are found in the meat of a burger chain's Big Boys. Don Henderson, an executive of Mickey's, is sent to Cody, Colorado, to

investigate. Director Richard Linklater might have gone for laughs but instead he has made a subversive critique of the tarnished American dream. In its heartland, 'the machine' is devouring society. Unconventionally, the film's main characters never interact, their mutual isolation making more painful the understanding that dawns on them - that they all contribute to the big picture but are powerless to change it. The focus gradually shifts from the ruthless expediencies of business to the lives of the illegal Mexicans employed in the town's abattoir, but Linklater's approach is that of a humanitarian rather than an ideologue. Because he does not haranque us we can see our own reflections in the scenario. Crusading students cut down the fences of a feedlot to free the animals. but the cattle will not leave. The symbolism is bleak, but you know it's true. A flawless cast includes Catalina Sandino Moreno reprising her part from Maria Full of Grace, Bruce Willis in a great self-deriding cameo and the ever-reliable Grea Kinnear as Henderson, whose hotel






PEACHY KEEN

Victoria Cosford

MUST BE THE SEASON of the peach... judging by the bags of beautiful fruit my partner brings back from Paul's Peach Farm in Teven. Impelling me, of course, to search through all my cookbooks for ways in which to employ them...

Best planted in early winter, they should be thinned a couple of months after flowering, when they have reached two centimetres in diameter, the pretty little flowers nipped, as they say, in the bud. And ideally picked with the palm of the hand, the palm curving carefully, gently around the shape of the fruit so that fingers or pressure do not dent and bruise. Farmers, apparently, are particular about their pickers for this very reason. Peaches belong to the group of stone fruits called drupes: those which are composed of an outer skin or epicarp, a succulent and pulpy layer or mesocarp and a hard woody inner stone or shell, the endocarp, which usually houses a single seed. Nectarines are simply another type of peach, with a smooth as opposed to a fuzzy skin; regular peach trees occasionally produce a few nectarines, and vice versa. There are clingstone peaches and freestone peaches, and come white-fleshed or yellow, the white generally being considered the more desirable. Which has always mystified me, as I adore the golden-fleshed variety for its luscious, slightly tangy


Paul's peaches are like this, and I have already transformed some into a heavenly cake. Meanwhile Barry the Byron Muffin Man is whipping up batches of Peach and Strawberry Muffins and a glamorous dessert of his own invention, consisting of a base of chopped peaches scattered with sugar, flaked almonds and raspberries, topped with cake batter and baked. Scooped out of its baking dish while still warm and served with cream and icecream, he went on to elaborate, leaving me wondering why he hadn't rushed a sample down to the cottage for me to try...

People – generally women – whose complexions are described as being peaches and cream might well owe that quality to a diet thereof - possibly skipping the cream. Peaches are fat-free, sodium-free and cholesterolfree; they are high in Vitamin A and an excellent source of Vitamin C. And certainly their uses need not be confined to fat-full muffins, cakes, pies and puddings: they provide a delicious twist to summer salads. Whisk together a vinaigrette of olive oil, red wine vinegar, a little chopped garlic and a pinch of nutmeg and use to dress mixed leaves, watercress, maybe some radicchio for balancing bitterness, chunks of ripe peach, real mozzarella, slivers of prosciutto for a meal requiring only sturdy bread.

However. When all is said and done it is for their sweetness that peaches are considered, and sweet indeed is the following cake, to be eaten cold for morning tea, or warm with thick cream, for peaches and cream.

PEACH AND WALNUT CAKE

Whisk 2 eggs until pale then add 5 heaped tablespoons of caster sugar and keep whisking till thick and very pale. Sift in 4 heaped tablespoons of SR flour, 1 heaped tablespoon of plain flour, a pinch of ground cinnamon and a pinch of ground nutmeg and blend thoroughly. Stir in 125 gr. melted butter then fold through 500 gr. washed and roughly chopped peaches and 1 cup of walnut halves. Pour into a lined springform tin and bake for an hour at 180°C.







True live seems to be fusing genres, does this open up new possibilities musically?

Definitely. We as a band and even more so as individuals are passionately interested in a wide range of genres. As to this opening up musical possibilities, I'm sure that it does but unsure of how it happens. We definitely don't talk about it. It seems to me that we have, as a band, put in the hard yards, the hard work to develop a sound of our own, so that now when we work on a new tune the end result feels natural and unforced. We like to think that there is more than a little mystery in the whole process.

Hip hop with live instrumentation to me is very Australian, do you see this as a new genre or idea? Well, the Roots have been doing it for a very long time.

It is definitely making an energetic appearance on the Australian music scene of late. New ideas are what creative people should aim for, and really new ideas are few and far between. A new idea can be heard and felt in the way a song is written, the way a live show is presented right down to the most minute detail. Having the strings in True Live is received extremely well. People love it. I do think some really exciting, new music will be coming out of this country in the years to come

How receptive are major record labels to emerging Aussie talent?

Hard to say. The music industry is a force unto itself. I had a personal experience that convinced me that you never know. I was the keyboard player in singer/songwriter Pete Murray's band for over a year at a time when he was virtually unheard of - We were doing gigs to not many people. Then at a particularly unmemorable gig, an A&R guy from Sony showed up and from there things really skyrocketed for Pete. I think that if an individual or a group is doing really sensational, things will eventually happen, but that said there is such an amazing volume of competition out there and really awful acts get signed all the time too.

What other Aussie groups are you digging?

I am digging a large, vibrant Australian Jazz scene that

making absolutely amazing music. Guys up in Byron like Greg Sheehan, Dave Addes, Thierry Fossmale. Bands In Melbourne like the Red Eyes (dub reggae), Shemesh (modern pop/rock). There's lots out there if you want to take a look.

Music can be a great way to voice political ideas, are enough musicians doing it?

That's an interesting question. Music can be a political vehicle, but if it's not good music, you know, it ends up being laughable. True Live's lyrical content has moments that touch on politics, but the main thrust is, and always has been music, and making that music kick ass. As individuals, we are very interested and aware of global trends and certain atrocities that have been, and are continuing to be committed in the world. The political aspect, mainly lies with the lyricist and for

our guy, Ryan and the content differs from song to song. As to 'are enough musicians doing it?' maybe, but definitely not enough are doing it very

Do you get any negative feedback from jazz or hip hop purists or do they get excited by what you're doing?

I don't think any of us are very involved in the "hip hop" scene really, but the feedback that we have had has been very positive. Some of us, myself included, are active members of the Melbourne jazz community and know a lot of players well. The feedback from them has been great too, although they usually have a gig on and can't come to our show but we drink together afterwards. Having said that we are definitely open to criticism from people involved in the music making process, or anyone for that matter, as long as it is constructive. It helps you to grow.
