



Members of a Northern Rivers public transport advocacy group TOOT were forced to drive to Tweed Heads to meet with a politician when the bus service at the centre of their dispute ran two hours late.

Rob Goodacre awarded Maritime Medal

Rob Goodacre of Ocean Shores, a member of the Brunswick Valley and District Volunteer Rescue Organisation Inc for 20 years, has been awarded a Maritime Medal for outstanding contributions to the boating and marine community in

When asked about his most challenging rescue to date, Rob recalled the rescue that was submitted for his award nomination: 'At about 6:30 one morning, a trawler sank about 15 miles off Cape Byron. Two fishermen were awaiting rescue in a small dinghy among monstrous 5m seas with 4.7m swell and winds up to 35 knots. We are out in extreme conditions, but this time the GPS failed. With our navigation system gone, we had no way of finding the men other than by compass bearing and flares.




Site chosen for new Byron hospital

North Coast Area Health Service Chief Executive Chris Crawford last week announced that agreement has been reached for the purchase of a six hectare parcel of land for the construction of the new Byron Shire Central Hospital. The land is at Ewingsdale, on the southern side of Ewingsdale Road, near the intersection of the Pacific Highway.

Mr Crawford said, 'Contracts have been exchanged and settlement is conditional on approval for subdividing the larger lot of which it is a part and the subsequent rezoning of the land for hospital purposes. 





Hospital on way

It is good to see some progress made on the Byron Shire central hospital issue. Contracts have been exchanged – conditional on approval for subdivision and rezoning of the land for hospital purposes – on six hectares on the south side of Ewingsdale Road, adjoining both McGettigans Lane and the backyards of home blocks in Parkway Drive.

We are still a few years out from success however, so the next NSW health minister - whoever he or she will be – need not reach for the capital works chequebook just yet. One less election promise to worry about.

First line of objection might come from Parkway Drive residents, though it means only a short walk to Outpatients. The proposal will have to get approval from Byron Shire Council – rezoning always takes a while - though under the freshly bastardised planning act the relevant minister should be able to call it in for a going-over with the rubber stamp.

We will get quite a range of services, if the health department's budget doesn't implode entirely, importantly retaining maternity and 24/7 emergency, and including palliative care for an aging population.

It has been a long battle to get to this stage, along the way the good graces of volunteer committee members being stomped on by bureaucrats and airily-promising ministers. And while it is good to see a result, there is still something to be sad about. We will lose the wonderful existing hospitals at Mullumbimby and Byron Bay. Lots of local residents owe a debt of gratitude to the caring staff who have looked after them over the years, and quite a few schoolies and holidaymakers should say thanks to the nurses who patched them up late at night in

It is the dawning of a new era for local health services – let's hope it's a bright dawn not too troubled by dark clouds of economic rationalism.

Off the track

Locals could be forgiven for thinking the whole federal/state debate around restoring the Casino-Murwillumbah rail line was just a point-scoring exercise for the major political parties.

The feds and state Labor did nothing other than blame each other for the matter not reaching resolution – it is a convenient way to promise spending money one never intends to spend.

The just-publicised Byron United proposal for a 'temporary' cycleway on the track has some merit and would definitely give local cyclists a buzz, as well as revive business hopes of a town bypass. When the Labor ministers come up to deliver promises for their local candidate for the March election, get them out on the track for a little healthy exercise.

CHESS by Ian Rogers

The latest human versus computer match – the World Chess Challenge in Bonn, Germany - is turning into something of a nightmare for World Champion Vladimir Kramnik.

The first time Kramnik faced the computer Deep Fritz, in a match in Bahrain 2002, he squandered a 3-1 lead to finish tied at 4-4. Four years on, Fritz is much faster – 'seeing' around eight moves ahead for both sides in standard positions - but Kramnik also appears to have prepared well for the six game match which will see him collect \$US1m for victory, half that amount if defeated.

Before the match most pundits predicted a close contest, with Kramnik's chances preferred. The first game looked promising for Kramnik, who built up a winning endgame only to play too quietly and allow his advantage to slip. However, it was the second game, Kramnik remember that human error can ruin the best of efforts. The Russian carefully built up what he thought was a winning position, only to discover that his 'winning' move turned out to allow checkmate in one move – a basic mistake Kramnik had never made in the 15 years since he turned professional at age 16.

'I don't know what happened with my mind,' admitted Kramnik, 'and you wonder if it might happen again. You have to be even more concentrated than against humans, which of course takes more energy.

Kayaking to save the forests

The Sydney to Hobart is an iconic yacht race, renowned not only for its spectacular origin and destination but for the danger of crossing the wild and unpredictable Bass Strait. This summer, Byron Bay resident Simeon Michaels will undertake his own maritime adventure and paddle from Sydney to Hobart, in his kayak.

The trip will start in Sydney Harbour, passing through all the major towns along the east coast before making the 250km crossing of the Bass Strait. The last leg will see Michaels paddle past the spectacular Freycinet Peninsula, reaching Hobart some 60 days later.

Simeon said, 'My first big paddle was from Byron Bay to the Great Barrier Reef in 1999, and the unexpected public interest that it generated made me aware of the potential of marathon paddling expeditions.'

Following an increase in complaints from older consumers, the Energy & Water Ombudsman NSW (EWON) has produced a fact sheet for seniors about dealing with door-to-door or telephone marketers selling energy contracts. Clare Petre, Energy & Water Ombudsman says, 'We have been alarmed by the number of cases where older consumers have complained about being taken advantage of by energy marketers.

'In some extreme cases consumers have been deliberately misled by marketers and told their supply would be cut off if they did not sign a contract, or that their existing supplier is going out of business or being taken over.'

STANDUP COMEDY ISN'T REALLY A CAREER CHOICE. IT KIND OF CHOOSES YOU. THREE YEARS AGO **CLAIRE HOOPER FOUND HERSELF WANDERING INTO** THE BLINDING GLARE OF THE SPOTLIGHT FOR HER **FIRST FIVE MINUTES OF** STANDUP AND IT'S BEEN AN ADDICTION EVER SINCE.

So what would drive a girl to do such a thing? 'I have a strange theory that testosterone is required for someone to risk their dignity for possible accolades. Women can be very funny at telling stories but don't have any drive to go on embarassing themselves in public in that way!

For Claire, comedy has always been a passion. 'I always loved comedy. I thought the magic of a joke was the best thing in the world. I knew every Young Ones episode off by heart by 15. I would never have taken any of the female roles, they were all pretty stupid or terrible. I'd want one of the male roles. I made up my mind I could only be an obsessed fan. I met someone at Uni and she said if you do it, I will. She moved to Manchester 8 years ago and she and I have separately begun doing standup.

'For me the catalyst was a break up. I was engaged to a guy and we called off the wedding and broke up a year later. We'd made a home together. All of a sudden I decided it was the perfect time, it wasn't a conscious decision. I felt like I didn't have anything to lose. Some male friends set me up with my first 5 minute spot and it went quite well. I was really anxious to make sure no one knew I was doing it - and all my friends turned up which is a bit uncomfortable. You don't want sympathy laughs - you want big laughs by general strangers!

Finding subject matter, or subjects that are authentic, unique and relate to an

audience is one of the major challenges when going from being the funny girl at the party to the funny girl on stage. Claire found her involvement with Improv really helped locate just what it was she was going to share from

'I was doing improv comedy with a couple of guys doing standup. We were having this awesome conversation. I said something offhand like: I'd go to more protest rallies if there were less hippies there, and he said, that's material. So that was my first bit. Now I do material on everything and I am getting better at recognising what is good material for me.

Winning the Western Australian final for Raw Comedy was what finally opened Claire's eyes to the career that lay ahead.

'I went over to Melbourne and that definitely sealed the deal! I saw the Comedy Festival and I realised that the good life awaited. I had been working in theatre, where you fight for funding and with comedy all I had done is write 5 minutes of funnies and they'd flown me

It's been a fast track to funny for Claire who soon found herself receiving rave reviews for her one woman show in Edinburgh.

'I am really lucky. I got picked up for Comedy Zone for the year after Raw Comedy and I got mentored by Brad Oakes. You have a duty to the audience to give them your funniest material, make it the first time again and again... I am still trying to work out how I do it (write comedy) I find that if I write comedy it's a great exercise but not the best material that I have. I have to risk a topic at an open mic and then try and squeeze it in.

'I really only have a few short form jokes. They are four lines, a setup and three punchlines. I love them. I feel like a magician. There's



nothing up my sleeve and here you go. They come when you are falling asleep at night, or in the middle of a jog - they usually fall into my head as a set up and two punchlines and I know there's a third one - I just have to work it out."

For Ms Hooper, story telling is crucial to her onstage

They're the bits I really enjoy. I have the good fortune of things happening to me. Something I have been using recently only happened two weeks ago. I was really overtired and I grabbed a girl's boob by mistake and it went really bad. It was really embarassing, but as a comic you can get some mileage out

Being able to transform failure into humour is one of comedy's great triumphs. Something that binds audience and performer in a web of shared embarrassments and stuff ups. 'It's carthartic,' Claire went on to say 'But it feels good. It just magically takes the power back. It's like finding the right key to unlock something - something that's a bit frustrating or annoying or confusing and you find the way to make it right.



In the eighties a self-help book for women came out. It was titled Women who love too much and targeted the growing generation of female love addicts who sought approval and devotion in dysfunctional relationships. What woman at some time hasn't fallen to her knees in the driveway and crawled through the gravel chafed and sobbing after her man: 'Why don't you love me?' These women have now matured, they finally settled on a partner and popped out a few kids. Where they once sought love and approval from their alcoholic/junkie/work/sex addict boyfriends, they now find themselves grovelling for loving acknowledgement

from their kids. I call these women: 'Women who drive too much.' You can see us out there every day after 3pm. We're driving our swimming champs, our dancing divas, our karate kids to their afternoon activities. We're the idiots sitting in the car outside a church hall somewhere staring vacantly into the middle distance, trying to fill those 15 minutes before you pick up Precious from guitar, drop Snot Nose up to the pool, pop into Woolies, pick up the sequins for the ballet costume for Surly while slipping in one of those Mumsy chats with a woman you have known for 4 years but whose name you still don't know. But then, identities aren't important when you're a driver. We're like chauffeurs talking shop. Mums of teenagers drive their kids to the movies only to drag themselves back

for the pick up a few hours later, a bleary eyed blimp in a tracksuit. She wanders past a shop window, glances to catch her reflection, only to realise, where there was once a vibrant glossy haired girl, there's now a shapeless smudge. This is what labour pain prepares you for: the endless hours of thankless driving. There's weekend ferrying between towns so young Miss Supre can socialise with her big sunglass wearing buddies, or Surfie boy can compete in his championships. Here I am, an intelligent, talented, warm and compassionate woman working the streets as an unpaid cabbie. This generation of parents is possessed with the need to fill every waking second of their child's time with recreational and skill building activities. A free afternoon where the Mum leisurely waters her garden

fills her with guilt: I should be enriching the potential of my children! My Mum suffered no such condition. Her idea of afterschool activities was emptying the chook bucket, getting the clothes off the line, peeling the potatoes for dinner and doing my homework. I never attended a single ballet class. I could have been a great dancer. (Sure, a 6 ft 85 kilo woman is gonna be hard to lift, but they have cranes for that kind of stuff.) It's not a coincidence that 'driving' is the metaphor used when describing the feeling one experiences when teetering on one's emotional precipice. 'You're driving me crazy! Stop driving me up the wall! And my fave: You'll drive me to an early grave!' We don't do it because we love driving. We do it because we love them. All that's required, is the very very occasional: 'thanks.

GANGA GIRI - DIDGE GURU

In the past 10 years the didgeridoo has made its way to the world stage. This instrument is deeply reflective of the people who quietly fashioned it. There is a humbling quality in its simplicity, but the simplicity belies the complexities, the spiritual undertones, the deep primal understanding of what shapes existence. The didge is a storyteller, an elder – it has a mesmerising power that simply draws you in to a wordless narrative understood by all people. It's a sound and a language at the same time. To play the didge, it's important to have a respect for its cultural origins and significance, and this is something that **Ganga Giri** fully acknowledges. Ganga is well known for his ensemble which mixes pumping, percussive didjeridoo with fat tribal beats, and funky dub bass lines with world percussion sounds to create a unique tribal-technological deep earth dance experience. Their sound is both explosive and pulsating, ambient and flowing. Now kept busy igniting audiences at international music festivals, events and shows in many countries across the globe including Europe, Japan, New Zealand, Australia, the United States and Canada. With 6 albums so far, his latest release Raisin it Up will be officially launched at **Durrumbul Hall** on Friday. Peter Gabriel said of Ganga Giri's performance: 'Ganga Giri is a wonderful musician who is really taking the didjeridoo to places it has never been before and developing a unique style of music'. It was quite an experience for this young singer songwriter, who talked of her trip with a warm fondness. Here's her narrative of a roadtour:

'I was three hours west of Townsville driving across to Darwin, when a roadtrain thundered past throwing a stone up off the road. It sounded like a gunshot and left a tennis ball sized impression and cracked the windscreen from top to bottom. I played to bikers, families, miners, tourists and sailors. Every show was so well received I couldn't have expected a more wonderful response. Some people had travelled for over an hour to get to the shows It was then that I decided I would repeat the tour next year. Some people in the smaller towns said things like, "Don't write us off, just because there's only a few of us out here. Please come back." The cities (Cairns and Darwin) were great too. I met some good people. People were welcoming and friendly. Every venue on the tour invited me back next year. It is something I've dreamt of doing. Travelling this great country and taking nusic with me The v was my bedroom, office and kitchen. I worked pretty hard and there were challenges to troubleshoot. I'm completely independent and manage myself. Keeping up with bookings, performing, touring, doing buisness on the road was hard but not impossible. Making business calls from public telephones was challenging. I'd pull up a chair into a hot steamy phone cubicle if I knew I was going to be there a few hours and hope all the buttons on the phone worked. I wasn't always in places with good facilities. I'm currently

writing my second full length

album, which in part has been inspired by the tour. The album will be ready by June 2007. I've learnt a lot from the experience and it's broadened my horizons. Time has flown. I'm now back in Byron. One of the first things to do was stretch out on the back verandah, look out over the trees and check the surf.' You can catch Deb at the **Rails** on **Monday** with her support, Matt Connolly.


SARA GETS LUCKY



DJ Tim Healey of breakthrough UK dance act Coburn is headline DJ at this year's local summer festival Electric Sunshine Superdisco. He has been one the darlings of the Australian dance scene since Coburn's cult hit We Interrupt This Program. To understand the man better, I shot him a few quick questions..

How did you get into music?

I wish I could tell you my folks were a huge musical influence on me, that my dad had taken me aside one day and introduced me to Lou Reed, Pink Floyd etc and that Janis Joplin was my mum's icon, but alas no... As a child I was subjected to a strict diet of Abba, James Last and his orchestra, Hooked on Classics (eek), Buddy Holly, Boney M, and a couple of curiously cool curved balls: Blondie and Jean Michel Jarre. My parents liked The Beatles, but had stopped listening around the time of Sgt. Pepper's – that was simply 'too weird' for them. Having said that, they loved music and we always had a cool stereo. I distinctly remember my first record purchase. It was Adam and the Ants: Dirk Wears White Socks. A blinding record. The second was Madness – Complete Madness (a corker), and the third (ahem) was Elton John - Too low for zero. I also distinctly remember being obsessed by Grand Master Flash and the Furious Five about this time...

What state do you think the global dance scene is in? The music scene right now is probably at its most vibrant ever. The global festival scene is blowing up. People are relaxing into an 'anything goes' mentality across the board. Its OK to like a reggae band, a speed metal act, a rap artist, some pure pop, a bit of folk and some edgy indie. Thank f*cking God. Finally. My local scene is blessed. I live in Brighton, home to



all sorts of nefarious individuals and musos, artists, actors etc. If you haven't been to Brighton - you should. It's a tiny city of 250,000 with arguably the most cosmopolitan society in the UK. Fashion, music, bars, beach, clubs, students, gay scene - it's all there in spades.

I understand you have a slew of releases ready for 2007? Yep. First up is our single: Razorblade on Great Stuff Records, featuring the dulcet Icelandic vocals of Heidrun Anna - it has a kind of Kylie on acid feel. That will be out in January 2007. Next up is our Frontier recordings compilation mixed by Coburn, featuring loads of material from the vaults at our label Frontier Recordings - including our version of Black Betty, and some ripping kick-ass electro and breaks. That'll be available in February. Then in March the debut album by Coburn on Great Stuff will be unleashed on an unsuspecting world.





FLAGS OF OUR FATHERS

Nobody's criticism of his country is as heartfelt as the true patriot's. Clint Eastwood's love for America is patently clear in this examination of how society's need for symbolism and self-belief can so easily nourish spin and manipulation. Teaming up again with screenwriter Paul Haggis, he tells the story of how a group of unknown soldiers overnight became public property. The iconic photograph taken of US marines raising the flag on Iwo Jima in WW2 resulted in three of those involved being traipsed around the country to boost the sale of war bonds. Scenes constantly jump from battlefront to receptions and rallies, highlighting the reluctant heroes' varying reactions to the sham of their new status - one embraces it, another is bemused by it and Chief the Indian is sent spiralling into alcoholism and alienation by it. There is a lack of fuss and pretence in what Eastwood does. His concern is with the old fashioned virtues of honesty and loyalty, with showing that it is how a man treats his fellow that matters more than politics or doctrine, and he is not afraid of employing sentimentality in dealing with those themes.

The icv. mountainous waves of Alaska's Bering Sea are just about to claim another drowning victim, when Kevin Costner turns up in goggles and orange wetsuit and yells 'I'm a Coast Guard rescue swimmer and I'm here to help you!' Things improve after that, but not much. Randall is the ageing warhorse who has given his all to the job and lost his neglected wife as a result. Away from the prairie, Costner seems out of his depth in the these troubled waters (his recent 'Open Range' was a magnificent western), until you understand that he is simply being a cowboy with flippers. Enter Fischer (Ashton Kutcher), the trainee rooster whose ego rubs Randall the wrong way but, surprise, only masks a tragic secret. The training period, in which the older man and the rising star have their standard conflict before making up as beer drinking buddies, goes for longer than is necessary and only delays the big crisis that you know is coming. As corny as any such adventure dares to be, with the finale way too much to swallow, it's the sort

SUBURBAN MAYHEM

Remember Jayden Leskie? The toddler whose death put the Victorian town of Moe on the map? We couldn't stop staring, could we. The whole grisly business revealed, we were titillated to think, the tip of the iceberg of a society in complete disarray, off its face and aimless, careless of everybody else including its own children. Though not based on that case, Katrina is from a similarly festering world behind the quarter acre's brick veneer of respectability. Alice Bell's screenplay is constructed without cracks and Paul Goldman's choppy

direction shunts you through the nightmare. Beginning with Katrina speaking to camera about being a suspect in her father's homicide, (off-camera, it is a horrifying murder), we then go back to trace the events leading up to it. This is film noir for a harsher age. The main character remains repellant throughout, with Katrina making Lady Macbeth look like Bambi and, because of its obsession with sleaze, the movie slides irrevocably towards burlesque. Emily Barclay is despicable to a nicety as the ruthless tart (though I thought her not sexy), and she is wonderfully supported by an array of central-casting hopeless westies, with Genevieve Lemon squirmingly

good as her 'Auntie' Di. Riveting but heartless, and the music is too loud. John Campbell





GNOCCHI ON HEAVEN'S DOOR

Victoria Cosford

DOES THERE EXIST ANYONE WHO DOES NOT LIKE POTATOES?

I cannot imagine that, with the thousands of ways in which they may be fashioned, disguised or transformed, it is possible. Girls on diets thirty or forty-odd years ago use to claim an aversion to them, but that was when it was believed they were evil and fattening. (Evil they were definitely regarded as in the early sixteenth century when the Spanish Conquistadors took them to Europe where, alongside eggplant and tomatoes, they were considered the work of the devil, as well as

On the contrary, one could argue that a culinary life without potatoes would be a poor thing. They round out a meal, they dispense essential nutrients, they combine with a myriad other foods, they fill gaps, they are on their own unembellished by any other flavour or seasoning so neutral that they are incapable of causing offence (unless permitted to rot at which point they are as grotesque as anything else which does).

Some funny little facts about these tubers: the Incas would measure their units of time by the time it takes a potato to cook, making me wonder if there is a link between that and the childhood game which recited 'one potato two potato' etc...

Sweet potatoes are not related to ordinary potatoes.

In 1995, they became the first vegetable to be grown in space. When cooking new potatoes you should add them to boiling salted water rather than putting them in cold water. If you need to peel them a few hours in advance, cover them with a little salted water and add a slice of white bread to discourage discoloration.

If a soup, stew or sauce is too salty, add a chunk of potato to draw off some of the saltiness. (Their high level of potassium helps to counteract the adverse effects of salt in our diets as well). If you try to mash or blend boiled potatoes in a food processor the starch will be worked out of them and they will turn into a silky, velvet glue.

One of the great forms of potatoes is, to my mind, Potato Gnocchi. I will never forget my first lesson in their creation. I was in a sunlit room surrounded by chattering excited Italians: several cooks, some friends, a few suppliers, neighbouring farmers and the great chef himself to demonstrate. A table stripped bare and scrubbed for the procedure. The potatoes lolling, freshly boiled in their skins, waiting to be peeled while still hot. The great chef slipping his tiny knife underneath the skins and removing them, and the interjections beginning. Everyone had their own opinion on how to make the best gnocchi, but of course Gian Carlo's way would rule. Voices calling out - 'With eggs! With nutmeg! Without eggs! Peel potatoes before boiling, not after!' – and meanwhile Gian Carlo had denuded the pot of potatoes and was pushing them through the ricer shaped like a giant garlic press, and the snowy steaming threads surging through onto the table. 'No eggs!' he declared imperiously, 'the eggs make the texture rubbery.' Scattering on flour and working it in to the mound of potatoes, little by little, until he was satisfied with the texture, with dough soft and pliable and ready to be rolled into long, elegant sausages. His tiny knife cutting through quickly - everything, he warned, to be done quickly - into neat little half inch lengths, scattered with extra flour and carefully removed onto a platter. Boiling salted water to receive them, to poach them briefly till they rose, still perfectly formed, to the surface, then scooped out. It took me about a month but after practising every single day my gnocchi were every bit as light and as shapely as his: he told me so himself.

Potato fashions come and go - about a decade ago it was mash with everthing, and then the mash turned into smashed or crushed. Little beats a piece of seared salmon on a bed of creamy mashed potato, all those gorgeous juices sinking in and studding the vegetable with luscious richness. There are too many recipes I could offer up – besides, don't we all have our own? And, inevitably, simplest is nicest; new potatoes steamed or boiled in their skins and glossy with butter and freshly chopped herbs tossed through while still warm so those flavours are held and may meld.

It wasn't a great start for my Midlake interview. For a start I couldn't find the CD. Then I managed to grab a few downloads 20 minutes before. Tim Smith fronts Midlake, a five piece out of the tiny town of Denton, Texas. I was on a calling card to Tim a few hours after his gig in Barcelona. First attempt was a bit scratchy and I got cut off. Time to try again.

This time the line was clean. I got off to a good start by saying how much I enjoyed their song Balloon Man.

Tim's like 'don't you mean Balloon Maker

'Yeah, man, maker... I really like the 70's influence.

He's obviously unimpressed: '70's influence. I didn't think that. I thought it was more of a Flaming Lips kind of feel.' I attempted a patch up with 'really I thought it had a hankering back to Sergeant Pepper's.

Gees the guy is probably tired and here he is having to talk to a misinformed fuckwit like me. It's just really hard to start the interview with. 'Hi, I lost your album, but I've downloaded 3 tracks which I actually really like.

Turns out, Mr Smith is a really nice bloke. You know in that kind of kooky way. He doesn't like touring much and it appeals to

my maternal side - I feel like offering him a cup of peppermint tea.

'I don't enjoy it very much (being on the road). We are in our fifth week. But I'm homesick. I want to enjoy my own bed, my own toilet... People are like, shut up about the road being tough man, you just get really thankful when you get there, but I remember I had a day job not too long ago – I put batteries in remote comtrols, it really sucks, but I could almost go back to that right now.

Being on the road just isn't as romantic as one might think. You don't get to see much of Europe on a European tour.

'People think: oh you are in Rome, what did you see? We didn't see anything. We had a sound check, you have dinner, then play and then you pack up and leave. I think if you are 20 years old or 19 - you can probably do it..

It's not even like Tim can take time out to write a few new tunes between gigs.

'I can't write on the road - it's too difficult and besides. I usually write on piano, this next album I have chosen to compose on acoustic guitar. on the road - I need to be home - at home I can get all my records out, get the incense, the decaf coffee...

Poor love is obviously

having a bit of a homesick moment. They're awful moments. Often on tour, the only time you feel good is on stage. All the other bits feel weird and disconnected.

It's not surprising that Tim is a solo composer.

'It's very difficult for me to write songs with anyone else. I usually come up with some music first, or maybe have the first start line, and then I'll flesh it out later with the

'I'm pretty literal. I write poetry a lot, I don't always understand it, I think my songs are pretty easy to understand though, I don't think there's much more going on - I get a lot of inspiration from artwork from the Renaissance – that's why it's all about hunters and trees and snow...

It's a beautiful image. A smalltown Texan in a room drinking decaf meditating on a Breughel trying to locate the sound of a silent image with a piano as interpreter.

'It's more romantic to me - than what I see with my own eyes around me. I look more to the past or the future. I don't embrace the present. I have a real problem with focusing on the present - it's not as inspiring...

The phone cuts out. I couldn't
