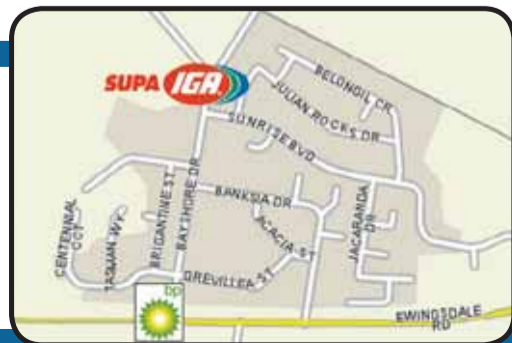

Australia's workplace relations system has a set of rules and obligations that all employers are required, by law, to comply with.

No one can be forced to sign an agreement. And any agreement signed by an employee aged under 18 must also be signed by a parent or guardian.

Other obligations include:

- Minimum wages.
- Working hours.
- Four weeks paid annual leave.
- Ten days paid sick leave.
- One year unpaid maternity or paternity leave.

The **Workplace Authority** will check agreements against a Fairness Test to make sure you get a fair deal. If an agreement doesn't pass the **Fairness Test**, it will need to be changed so that it is fair and the employer will have to make up any back pay. For more details, use the Workplace Infoline or the web site.

The independent **Workplace Ombudsman** will make sure that employers meet their obligations. It will investigate and prosecute those who break the law.

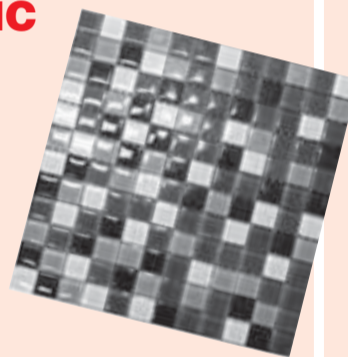

Naomi says that after her dash through Melbourne's Botanical Gardens in the annual Mothers Day Classic Fun Run/Walk she felt 'so alive', and when last year she looked around the Byron Shire for a similar event to participate in, she found none.

She decided to create her own, and the So Alive fun run/walk to raise money for breast cancer research took root.
