

Council defers **Epicentre** decision

Byron Shire Council voted 6-4 last Thursday to defer a decision on a development proposal for the Epicentre site at Belongil until they could workshop the issues involved. Queensland developers Kendall Street Developments have proposed creating a 43 lot community title subdivision on the two hectare site to carry a 'manufactured home estate' of 41 two storey four bedroom dwellings, a community recreation area and a general store/

Moving to defer, Cr Tom Tabart said, 'We have been asked to approve a development which is neither fish nor fowl. There is no real explanation why it is recommended for approval.'

Cr Tabart said a workshop would look at the opportunity to get affordable housing on the site and reassess the density. He said he had ongoing concerns about contamination, acid sulphate soils and parking and traffic arrangements.

Speaking against deferral, Cr Ross Tucker said, 'The [staff] report is quite comprehensive and very clear to me. The report does address the issue of affordability; if you decrease the density you move away from affordability.

'There is no value in having a workshop. You cloud the issue and move away from the merit assessment made by staff.'

Cr Ray Kestle moved an amendment, defeated 6-4, to go with the staff recommendation to grant deferred consent dependent on 63 conditions of consent being fulfilled. 'This is the only thing that can happen on this site,' he said, 'it's hard to get away from that.

'It should stand or fall on its merits rather than us tinkering with densities. This is beachfront property - where in Australia would you get affordable housing 50 metres from the beach?'





Rest is best for the flu, say experts

It appears we have become accustomed to 'soldiering on' when we have the flu, as the old television ad once encouraged. In fact, our entire societal system seems to depend on and encourage soldiering on. We live in an unaffordable world compounding the need for long hours and quick fixes. 






Building on sandhills

You can only guess at the motivations of property developers when you read their development applications, despite whatever motherhood statements they may contain. You would logically assume that turning a profit is among them. This would apply to the proposal by Kendall Street Developments for the iconic nearly-beachfront Epicentre site at Belongil. Councillors looked at it last week and decided 6-4 to defer any decision until they had a workshop on the application's merits. Its merits are at least superior to a slaughterhouse's these days.

It is two hectares of prime commercial property, as long as it stays above water. The community title subdivision proposed would contain 41 demountable 'manufactured homes'. It has been described as 'affordable housing' but consider the costs involved in buying the land and constructing 41 two storey four bedroom homes, a general store and three internal roads and ask if the result is affordability, no matter how altruistic the developers. Cr Tom Tabart is right in saying, 'There is no rule which says poor people can't live on expensive land', but the property market in Byron Bay dictates against it.

The site plan by architect Kevin Hayes reveals a substantial density issue but nothing greater than what's already been created on the fragile Belongil Spit. The bigger issue is the nearby ocean and the coastal erosion zone and how long the manufactured homes will be in place before they have to be demounted. Council planning director Ray Darney noted that if the land was inundated, the individual owner would still have a community title lot, just not permission to have a house on it. It's a big price to pay to own a piece of underwater paradise.

In regards to another iconic piece of Byron turf, Councillors last week voted unanimously – Cr Kestle absent – to support the state government's 'structure plan' for the remarkably undeveloped Sandhills Estate. Like the Epicentre, the Sandhills has had a colourful history, remaining dunes up to eight metres high until the 1960s, then sandmined, subdivision of 27 lots in the 1970s, then reserves created for a senior citizens centre in 1975, a community kindergarten in 1983 and for the Feros retirement village in 1987, and it recently served as an illegal rough camping area. It also contains Council's Youth Activity Centre (YAC) and the local courthouse sits on land extracted from it.

The structure plan for 14 hectares of the Sandhills stems from a strategic planning study by Geolink and an agreement entered in July 2003 into by Council, the then Department of Land and Water Conservation, and the Arakwal Corporation, which had a native title claim over the site. The plan is still sketchy, especially considering the site plan doodle by Ray Darney in the Council papers.

However, there seems to be good stuff in it – a site for a new library (not likely to start to materialise until at least 2010, we would guess), eight hectares set aside for nature conservation, two hectares for a botanic garden, and some residential lots for the lands department to flog off. It could become an important civic centre, giving the town the greenery it lacks.

The devil is in the detail. As the staff report noted, Council would need to extract support from the state government for maintaining environmental values on the site and for general maintenance costs. It could be a project on which both governments, and the general community, could work together to create a thing of beauty.


Daniel even has a novel way of finding who in the pack has leadership potential. It could do away with those boring pyschological tests forever.



For a comedian known for his rather rugged edge, Singapore seems like a very unlikely destination. Crikey, isn't chewing gum even an offence there?

According to Jonathan, things, they are a changin.

'What is happening in Singapore is they are having a bit of a renaissance. They have been so repressive in their attitude to recreational activities, artists have tended to leave the place. Singapore has now reached a point because business is stagnating they are realising that business feeds off art. The idea of going outside the box is fed through art, the more people are in touch with performing and the arts the more they flourish. They can't flourish without the stimulus and there are a lot more groovy scenes happening

While English is commonly spoken, Jonathan is keen to learn and perform in Singlish, a Singaporean pigeon English.

'There are signs everywhere saying: speak proper English. I like to go and write 'ly' over the proper. That's my little joke. But I think now they are reaching a point of confidence in themselves as a nation.'

Jonathan has a gift for language, but he is rather

modest about it, preferring to suggest it's just that he makes an effort, where most don't.

'In our culture we tend to forget how important the greeting is. In other culutres how you greet someone is very significant. I can do that in 40 languages, just doing that has already made a huge stagement about how much respect you have for people.

'I think they should be teaching that in schools, it sends a strong message that although I am not good at it I have made an effort to find out. It creates a trust and respect between you and the person you are talking to. (This is key to his success on stage). As Australians we expect people from other cultures to meet us all the way as far as language is concerned.

It has always amazed me that a comedian as clever. funny and creative as Jonathan hasn't managed to crash his way through to the dizzying heights of Australian success. Why isn't Jonathan on Rove? Or Glass House? He has the talent and the routine and the ability to perform to any crowd, anywhere. He is one of our only Global Comedians

'I am incredibly frustrated with scene in Australia when you see people being treated lke comedy gods it can be very dishearteneing. There are a lot of very very good comedians in Australia that don't get recognised.'







I NOW PRONOUNCE YOU CHUCK AND LARRY

This film has been panned by most critics, so I feel like a bit of a dill admitting that I quite enjoyed it. Subtlety is decidedly not its long suit, but with Adam Sandler as the star attraction you know that the sledgehammer approach to humour awaits you. He is as in your face as ever for the first half of proceedings, in which you learn within the opening five minutes that Chuck is a hero in the New York Fire Department and a chick magnet to boot. In such roles, Sandler's gum chewing conceit is near unbearable and I hardly raised a smile until the halfway mark. By then, the more artful Kevin James as Larry, his hetero buddy in the brigade, has grown in stature

but sincere attack on homophobia has become clear. The guys pretend they are a gay couple in order for the widowed Larry to be eligible for welfare payments that he needs to help bring up his two little kids. They set up house together with the aim of convincing a tribunal that they are the real deal. Complications arise when

Chuck falls for Jessica Biel, the gorgeous lawyer who is representing them, and they experience from the other side of the fence the prejudices held by broader society, and their workmates, towards gays. These are tough times for gag writers, so let's get one thing straight; there is no joke without a butt. Humour is never victimless, so if you are a precious soul who cannot accept this maxim and adhere



daily lengthen the list of targets that are taboo, then you'll want to give it a miss. The jokes that see the light of day are of the recurring school yard tripe variety for the most part and, at best, this is a mediocre, too predictable movie. But it comes across as genuine, nonetheless, and its message of inclusiveness, if not pitched at MENSA, is strongly proclaimed. George Michael's concluding 'Freedom' says it all.

KNOCKED UP

LUCKY MILES

A Cambodian, an Iraqi and an Indonesian walk into an Australian desert ... It sounds like a joke intro, and co-writer/ director Michael James Rowland has dealt with the provocative issue of boat people with a thankfully light hand. We are spared a political diatribe and that it's not really very funny (or as confronting as Michael Winterbottom's 'In This World' from 2002) is not enough to detract from what is yet another in this year's sequence of excellent Oz features. It starts with a dozen men being dumped by an Indonesian fishing vessel on the godforsaken north-west coast of Australia, a few hundred kilometres south of Broome

An overlong first act whittles the refugees down to the three primary characters who,

despite being lost in this hostile environment, with the prospect of perishing in its sands, never seem to develop any sense of camaraderie. They don't even call each other by name and, as often as not, are close to being at each other's throats. The engineer from Basra is a particularly difficult character to warm to, whilst his two Asian companions are simply clueless. Searching for them is a trio of Army reservists in a dusty old Land Rover. They suspect that their quarry might be more organised than your average refugees and it is they who get the most humorous scenes, without the situation ever being allowed (or able) to break into the hilarious black farce that it potentially is. John

have livened things up a bit and there is a nod to that now stereotypical outback psycho near the end when you fear that one of the characters has got into the wrong ute. The dry, empty landscape and the unhurried pace imperceptibly cast their their spell, but the movie is strangely unmoving. The strongest emotional thread running through it links the opening and closing shots. An Australian leaves his Khmer girlfriend in Phnom Penh (who, as it turns out, was pregnant) and years later the grown up son has set out to find his father in Perth

There is never much made of this, though, and, if anything, I couldn't help feeling that the story concluded at its most interesting point.

OVEN BAKED SPRING LAMB CUTLETS, PROSCIUTTO, BASIL, ROAST BEETS & **PERSIAN FETA**

Serves 4

- 12 spring lamb cutlets fat trimmed
- 12 basil leaves
- 12 slices prosciutto parma/serrano jambon
- 4 med beetroot peeled & sliced in wedges
- 3 cloves garlic sliced finely
- 2 tblsp olive oil
- 2 tblsp sweet chilli sauce
- 1/2 tsp smoked paprika
- 1 tsp cumin seeds
- 1 tsp coriander seeds
- salt & pepper

200g Persian feta

- 1/2 cup picked basil leaves
- 1/2 cup picked Italian (flat leaf) parsley
- 24 nice stems rocket or 2 cups wild rocket
- Juice 1 lemon
- 3 tblsp extra virgin olive oil

Method

Toss beets with oil, sweet chilli, spices & season. Bake on baking paper for 30 mins at 160°C & toss during cooking till beets lightly caramelize.

Season lamb & grill for 2 mins on each side. Lay out prosciutto with a basil leaf on each slice & wrap cutlets in prosciutto. Bake for 5 mins at190°C till prosciutto lightly crisp.

Divide beets between 4 plates. Spoon feta over beets. Toss rocket & herbs with lemon juice & olive oil & season. Sit salad on top of beets with cutlets to the side.

PIZZARESQUE

After the fiasco of the Saturday night we rang two pizza outlets requesting home deliveries I was taking no chances: I was making my own, in spite of having been offered a perfectly sound explanation by one of the places. (It was the first Saturday night of the school holidays and only 8pm, my address a regularly frequented one by pizza deliverers, and my request was refused twice: the first time mysteriously and inexplicably, the second because the delivery driver failed to appear for work that evening. I shall mention no names, but it was an interesting situation...)

And so the following weekend we planned for winter cosiness to stay again at home. I foraged through my kitchen cupboards in search of yeast, and to my delight unearthed a packet still several weeks shy of its expiry date. I hadn't made pizzas for years and was absolutely in the mood for the cathartic, soothing ritual of working with yeast. Plain flour, blood-warm water, a pinch of sugar, some olive oil and I was up and running, pounding and punching, pummelling and persuading the dough into a silky soft ball of future pizza bases. Cold weather meant that there was nowhere warm for it to prove until I found a slant of sunshine and left it there in its bowl, a dampened cloth cover to keep out the draughts. Meanwhile the filling was to be chunks of local orange pumpkin roasted in garlicky olive oil, fresh basil from our garden, some Persian fetta and semi-dried tomatoes from the fridge. Things were looking good: who needed home deliveries anyway? After a couple of hours I drew back the cloth from the bowl, to regard the ball of dough little larger than the size I had left it. All that muscular vigour, those good ten minutes of kneading air, lightness, passion and possibly perspiration into this thing which now glared defiantly up at me: the bloody yeast!

In my stubborn way I pressed on: I figured that, at worst, it would still be an edible if scone-like foundation for my glorious topping. I tore it in to four pieces, stretched them into discs, piled on the pumpkin et al and slid them into a ferociously hot oven. Fifteen minutes later they were before us on plates, unsurprisingly little altered from their pre-cooked states. The topping tasted great, and the dogs loved the bases

Since then I have armed myself with a brand new box of powdered yeast and a packet of OO flour: I will not be caught out again (although, ironically, the very day I brought home those ingredients I went to turn on the oven, only to discover that I had run out of gas - indubitably the result of its having blasted away at maximum heat for the duration of the pizza-making episode...)

There was only one thing to do, and that was to drive to darkest Lismore to Fire In The Belly. Amazing the lengths to which one will go - but this was a destination toward which I had for a while aspired, having heard positive reports and read of assorted awards. It's in a dubious location, a soulless strip of Dawson Street beside a motel - but once you are inside it shouts warmth and atmosphere, fun and good cooking smells. The several rooms include a front one containing romantic booths as well as long tables, and the back one where we ended up which offered intimate glimpses of the busy kitchen and the grotesque red dragon adorning the wood-fired oven and which led out into a little garden where I imagine on a balmy summer evening it would be the place to dine. It was a Wednesday night in a regular, non-school holidays week and when I had rung to ask if I needed to make a reservation the answer had been unhesitatingly yes. The place was pumping, and many of the tables looked like Girls Nights Out, with pretty twenty-something year olds shrieking to the mini explosion of Seaview champagne corks. We shared two gourmet pizzas, the Broccoli Hugger (fresh broccoli, snow peas, roast pumpkin, basil and macadamia pesto) and the Garlic Prawn, which included avocado and camembert: they were both divine. The bases use cold-pressed extra virgin olive oil and certified organic flours – a combination of unbleached and wholemeal - and much of the ingredients are sourced locally.

Their excuse for not delivering to my Byron Bay address is utterly forgivable, if not entirely regrettable.





much misinformation about Camphor-infested land.' how to kill Camphor Laurels, people end up with halfdead trees or trees that reshoot after two or three years, think Camphors are too difficult to kill and give up. In fact, they are one of the easier woody weeds to deal with once you're shown how,' says Tweed Landcare Camphor Laurel Control workshops.

'Combine this knowledge - which you'll get at the practical demonstration at the workshop – with some help on what priorities you might consider when drawing up your long-term Camphor control program and you're off and away. Most of us need a control program that spans several years, so we need to set ourselves short-term goals to keep us going. It's certainly a great feeling to be rewarded by seeing healthy, another clean grazing pad-
