Heroes in flight at Arts Expo

Catharina Sauerland has her nagging mother to thank for her entry in the Ocean Shores Arts Expo. On the due date for entries, Catharina submitted her piece 'Heart Of A Hero' into this year's new Arts Expo section sculpture and was amazed when she found out she has won second prize.

Catharina's sculpture was one of a record 180 works entered by 160 artists in a show that is coming of age. Five years has seen the gradual and organic evolution of the Arts Expo whose aim is to provide an opportunity for the Ocean Shores community members to participate in a local cultural event.

It encourages an evolving

sense of community while at the same time creating an opportunity for artists of all ages to be involved in an art show. Organisers feel that the quality of work is creating a buzz and that this show has finally put the Ocean Shores show on the art map.

Artist and organiser of Bangalow's Art on Sunday, David Arrowsmith, was very impressed with the expo. 'This is my third year at the show,' said Mr Arrowsmith. 'Ocean Shores has raised the bar in terms of quality. I can't pick a favourite work, I've got about six!'

'The judging panel was fair, square and egalitarian. I am betting that other public exhibitions will be taking a leaf out of the

Ocean Shores book.'

About 200 art lovers gathered at the community centre on Friday night for the opening of the show and to see the presentation of awards with prize money totalling \$3500.

This year's theme was 'Belonging' and the winners of the five categories created works with this in mind. Catharina's ceramic piece is a sculpture of the torso of a superhero with the visible heart containing a tiny super hero child bursting through the breastplate.

'Heart of a Hero is about Super Man with a vulnerability; the need to nurture the child within,' she said. 'Belonging comes from this vulnerability.'

Billibong puzzles locals

Concern is mounting for missing postal worker Karen who disappeared in the vicinity of the Billinudgel Billabong early last week.

The Billi Billabong, or perhaps Billibong, which is a growing feature of the town landscape, is well known as being responsible for the disappearance of several cars in recent years but the postie is the first know human victim of the devilish waters.

Postal manger Sue Stirton is very concerned for the safety of Karen and others who may venture too close to the billabong.

'The biggest problem is the crocagators who have recently inhabited the pond,' said Ms Stirton last Friday. 'Heavens above! I was in fear of my life.'

'We got some chooks from Ken at the pub and managed to keep the crocs at bay until Bindi and Bob junior came and took them away. Draft local environmental plan for Shire up before Councillors

Byron Shire Councillors will consider the long-awaited draft Local Environmental Plan (LEP) at their planning meeting this Thursday August 14.

Council's Director of Planning, Development and Environment Services, Ray

Darney, said a huge amount of work had been done by Council planners to get to the position where the plan could be considered by Councillors before being forwarded to the Department of Planning to determine whether the plan can

be exhibited for input by the community.

Mr Darney said Council planners have been preparing the new plan since June 2006, and in this two year period some substantial changes in direction by State Planning had caused changes

in direction for the LEP process and some time delays.

Some of the key issues that have been addressed in the new plan include defined floor space ratios, secondary dwellings, coastal hazard areas, rezoning of the super-

market site at Mullumbimby, business zone for Jonson Street south, hospital rezoning on Ewingsdale Road and some land releases at Bangalow.

Mr Darney said he had not supported a rezoning to business of a residential site

on Broken Head Road, Suffolk Park, adjacent to the BP Service Station. It was considered that residential use as per its current zone was more advantageous than to move to a commercial rezoning for a supermarket.

Greens launch team for Council election

Byron Shire Mayor Jan Barham launched The Greens campaign for election last Saturday at Brunswick Heads.

Cr Barham said she was proud of the achievements of the Greens councillors on the Byron Shire council, particularly their record of financial management and the capital works that can be undertaken now that the council has cleared the debt of many years.

'After many years of careful financial management, the Council is now investing in major works,' Mayor Barham said in a press release. She pointed to the completion of the sewerage plants for Byron Bay and Bangalow, Mullumbimby Civic Hall, the extension of the Myocum tip, the repair of roads and bridges and the planning and funding in place for new projects such as the Byron Bay library as achievements.

'Council has also taken a lead on climate change, reduced legal expenditure and court battles as well as delivering more efficient services for assessing development applications,' said Cr Barham. 'It's unfortunate that some projects have not been delivered in this term

of council but there has been significant work completed and a commitment to progressing community priorities.

'Council has recently released for consultation a Northern Shire Sporting Fields Draft Strategy, a Bike-way Plan, Cultural Plan and has finalised the Draft Tourism Management Plan. I am committed to follow through on the delivery of these important projects as well as works such as Helen Street footbridge, Byron Library, Suffolk Park Childcare Cen-

tre and the Brunswick Valley STP.

'The Greens team for the elections features experienced councillors, Crs Tabart, Staples and myself and welcomes Simon Richardson, a younger but experienced campaigner. Simon will bring new energy and passion to the council and as a local high school teacher has a strong focus on youth issues.

'I feel very proud of the team and our shared commitment to the shire.'

One issue not addressed in the new plan was that of holiday letting of houses in residential zones, although this can still be reconsidered by Council when they debate the draft plan.

An important issue addressed in the draft LEP is that of coastal hazards. This is especially relevant following recent court decisions in Victoria and NSW about the importance of considering climate change and coastal storm impacts in planning.

Consideration by planners of the Byron Shire Biodiver-

sity Strategy has led to some rural areas being zoned E2 Environmental Conservation, while at Bayside Brunswick Heads the strategy has led to a decrease in area available for residential development.

Areas at Lilli Pilli and the Cypress Pine area at Suffolk Park have been zoned a new zone 'E4 Environmental Living', which allows for a dwelling while acknowledging the special biodiversity attributes of the areas.

As well as the Biodiversity Strategy, another important initiative in the plan is Affordable Housing provi-

sions. These included floor space ratio bonus for development that entered into a Voluntary Planning Agreement for a contribution to affordable housing.


Council will also be able to consider affordable housing opportunities in residential and business zones. In addition, it has been recommended that secondary dwellings be allowed in some residential and rural zones. This provision is aimed at providing a rental opportunity for a second dwelling, without having any right to subdivide.

Mr Darney said that while

he hoped Council would approve the plan so it could be forwarded to the Department of Planning for review by their legal section, he could understand that Council might want further time to consider the planning provisions incorporated in the plan.

'Councillors might also consider the option to defer sending the plan to the Department until after the local government elections in early September, so the new Council could consider the plan and its implications,' Mr Darney said.

Caleb and Galit Vella, pictured above, are an enterprising young local couple who are delivering their first baby and organising the first Oktoberfest in the Byron Shire, possibly simultaneously, on the long weekend starting on Saturday October 4.

For those who don't know, Oktoberfest is one of the biggest European festivals, garnering over 6,000,000 visitors to the 42 hectare site in Munich to celebrate German beer, German food and German music and entertainment.

Caleb is second genera-

tion Australian of Maltese descent with a touch of German a couple of generations back and Galit is from Israel. So why Oktoberfest?

'It's a festival suitable for the whole family, and it's going to be a very entertaining two days,' said Caleb. 'The beer tent will offer tastings of good Oz beer as well as some famous German lagers, and there will be food tents, music, stalls and a few surprises.'

Safety is a priority, with a fleet of buses to take people to and from the site. The Oktoberfest will be held at the Giants sportsground in the Mullum industrial area

and part of the entry fee and profits will be donated to the Giants.

Plans are under way for brass bands, rock n roll bands, choirs, and singalongs, comedians, beer tastings and of course the traditional fare – German sausages, pretzels, sauerkraut, apple pancakes, gingerbread, potato soup etc.

Civic hall opening event delayed

Cr Peter Westheimer and Julie Brooks, Chair, have issued a joint media release on behalf of the Mulumbimby Civic Memorial Hall Sec 355 Committee, noting that the committee has agreed to delay the Hall Opening event for several weeks. 'We apologise for any inconvenience to the group of enthusiastic supporters who have offered their services but the committee has agreed that all current efforts need to be focussed on ensuring the Hall is

operational for its first hirers by mid August,' the press release said. 'While venue booking processes have been in place, the delay in the issue of an Occupation Certificate has had its effect on the operational issues including OH&S procedures and facility cleaning and maintenance.'

Council's Director of Governance and Community Services, Mark Arnold, told *The Echo*, 'The Building Certification Unit that issues the Occupation Certificate

has identified a number of issues that need to be resolved prior to the Certificate being issued to allow for the operation of the Hall to commence. These issues in general relate to signage, documentation in respect to systems and certification of the systems.

'These issues are being or have been addressed by the Building Contractor, Project Manager and Council. An inspection of the building in relation to the completion of the outstanding issues, previously identified has been programmed for [last] Monday and it is anticipated that this will allow for the hall to commence operations following the induction of the Hall Committee in the running of and operation of systems.'

The Committee and Council say they have worked incredibly hard over the last months to set in place all processes and procedures to open this newly refurbished hall as well as enthusiastically planning an open event. 'It became apparent this week that although all efforts were being made, we could not do the hirers and the opening event justice in such a short time frame,' said Cr Westheimer.

Learn to convert weeds to rainforest at free workshop

As part of the Biodiversity Extension Service, Byron Shire Council is offering a free workshop on Sunday August 31 from 10am to 1pm for Shire landholders who want to get started on restoring habitat for native wildlife.

'Byron Shire is home to an extraordinarily high diversity of native plants and animals,' said Wendy Neilan, Biodiversity Extension Officer.

'Unfortunately our sub-tropical climate also provides ideal conditions for prolific growth of many environmental weeds. Many of the landholders I work with who are relative newcomers to the Shire buy their piece of paradise not realising that the green vista before them is often a wall of weeds.

'How we manage patches of weedy regrowth is important as they provide habitat

for native fauna and can contain many species of rare or threatened native plants.

'We are offering this workshop for people who want to restore native vegetation on their property but are grappling with where to start.'

Participants will be shown first hand techniques for restoring native forest by Goonengerry resident Patrick Morrissey, who has worked on regenerating his





Byron's plan to 2028?

Byron Shire Councillors for 2004-08 could be forgiven for thinking they've had a rough trot in the dying days of their term of office, with an election only 32 sleeps away. Their winter break was disturbed by two extraordinary meetings, the most recent included the decider on the controversial Splendour DA at Yelgun.

But wait, there's more: this Thursday Councillors have to decide whether or not to publicly exhibit the draft Local Environmental Plan (LEP). The creation of a new LEP for Byron Shire is one of the most important decisions of all, as it will influence the future pace and nature of development, and whether or not the natural environment will survive it in any meaningful way.

Believe it or not, the last time Byron Shire had a new LEP was in 1988, during the term of a progressive council. In many ways it was a far-sighted document, keeping the Shire in reasonable condition compared to most of the developed world, resisting the push for a regional metropolis with wall-to-wall cafés, shopping malls and McMansions. Now the plan is tired and frayed, held together by band-aids, and needs replacing – it would also help if some of its current provisions were observed, with Council either reluctant or too understaffed to enforce them.

Before we get to the new LEP, however, there is one important question – should our current Councillors be voting on this issue in the 'caretaker period' (from August 4) in the leadup to the September 13 election? According to staff advice in the report, during the caretaker period Council must ensure that major decisions are not made which would limit the actions of an incoming council; exercise due caution in making major policy decisions that would bind an incoming council; and avoid entering major contracts or undertakings.

Council officers reason that Councillors should put the draft LEP on public exhibition in any case because 'delay of resolution for public exhibition of the draft LEP... could delay the project by approximately two months' which might jeopardise conditions of grant funding for the project and 'jeopardise the ability of Council to meet the initial timeframe for gazettal, being March 2009, particularly if the Dept of Planning do not stand by their indicated extension of time'. They seem pretty compelling reasons to proceed now. This process, begun with community-based planning strategies in 1998 – ten years ago! – and resolved by Council to proceed to LEP stage in December 2004, has gone on far too long. It's time for the community to have its say on draft provisions for issues such as holiday letting, coastal management and development density.

Should the exhibition get a vote in favour, it is good to see that staff have recommended a three month exhibition period rather than the statutory minimum of 28 days. Under state legislation there is also the possibility of a public hearing on the document, which sounds like a good idea given the amount of controversy which has surrounded the process to date.

Modern Olympics parodies tradition

I had planned to make this column an Olympics-free zone, figuring that games addicts would get more than their fill elsewhere. But then the Russians took the opportunity to invade Georgia, and the chance to make a few pungent comments on the modern Olympic tradition (as opposed to the ancient Greek one) was too good to miss.

The whole point of the four-yearly festival at Olympia in the western Peloponnessus was that it was a time when wars were suspended. Since wars between the many city-states of the time were more or less ongoing, this period of truce had enormous significance. There were occasional breaches, but they were very much the exception and the transgressors were thenceforth regarded as outsiders by the civilised world.

There were times when the tradition seemed to be taken to extremes: when the Persian despot Darius led an invasion of Greece and finally got past Thermopylae on his road to Athens, he was puzzled to find that the hitherto fierce resistance suddenly vanished. Puzzled, he interrogated some captured peasants who explained that it was the month of the Games; all wars ceased and the young men repaired to Olympia to compete for a wreath of olive leaves plucked from the sacred tree of Zeus. Fortunately they returned in time to defeat Darius at Salamis and Plataea and preserve both their traditions and democracy, but it was a close run thing.

Since the Olympiad was reinvented in 1896 wars have continued unchecked through the period of the games; indeed three times

(in 1918, 1940 and 1944) they have been so intransigent that the games have been cancelled altogether. But as far as is known only the Russians have actually launched an invasion while the games are in progress. What's more, this is the second time: they invaded

least the Russians could have waited another few days. Even a fortnight without anyone starting a war would be better than nothing.

The Northern Territory election was a nasty shock for Labor, and not just because of the size of the

Hungary during the Melbourne games of 1956, causing a savage outbreak during a water-polo match between the two countries.

This, of course, is another great difference between the old and the new. The games of Olympics were contests between individuals, not nations. The young men of Greece competed for personal glory. Even the chariot races (the only teams event) was considered a contest between the individual owners. The idea of a country by country medal tally, let alone of politicians sitting in the stands and using the victories of their fellow countrymen as a photo-opportunity, is a parody of the tradition; indeed it is a contradiction in that it elevates the idea of nationalism, which is exactly what the original games aimed to remove from the festival.

The modern Olympics has been described as war without blood. The ancient Olympics was a great occasion, precisely because it was just sport – sport without war.

This may now be an unattainable ideal, but at

swing in a remote corner of the country. It suggested strongly that the advantages of incumbency have been greatly overstated, and is an ominous portent, particularly for the forthcoming election in Western Australia. The similarities are all too stark: an over-confident leader seeking to take advantage of a demoralised opposition by calling an early poll, without giving the voters a convincing reason why it should be necessary.

A sizeable number of Northern Territorians obviously felt that it wasn't; they either refused to vote at all or took the opportunity to lodge a protest. In the tiny electorates of the Territory even a relatively small revolt can have a pretty big effect, as we have just seen. The reaction in the larger electorates of Western Australia may not be so drastic but there must be a few marginal backbenchers wishing their leader had been a bit more cautious and responsible.

There are, of course, other differences. The Country Liberal Party ran largely on a platform of law and order,

which in the Territory (and in some other parts of Australia) is code for race: less welfare and more gaol for Aborigines. But the mere fact that this campaign took off could spell wider trouble. This was the first election to really test the political implications of the Howard intervention into Aboriginal communities, and the message appears to be that they liked Mal Brough's gung-ho approach more than former Chief Minister Clare Martin's more consultative one. It is to be hoped that other endangered Labor governments do not try and hang on to office using the same populist message.

And despite ever more strident pleas to piss or get off the pot, Peter Costello can still not summon up the strength to do either; obviously his working holiday on the beaches of Fiji has sapped what little energy he had left after a hard year of procrastination. However his supporters, especially those on *The Australian*, report a glimmer of hope: their hero, may, just may, be willing to accept coronation as leader of the Liberal Party if, but only if, he receives no opposition of any kind and is not required so much as to lift a finger on his own behalf.

Even then he is not making any promises, but it should be firmly understood that if the exercise involves any effort of any kind on his part, then all bets are off. It is not entirely clear whether this guarantee should apply only to the process of levering him into office, or whether it would extend to his full tenure as leader. But given his record, this probably doesn't matter; it would make no difference either way.

Tucker, Tardif, Woods, Mangleson and Barham vote that the DA is not covered by caretaker period restrictions on dealing with controversial DAs. Barham moved a successful motion alleging that the applicants had stated that they will apply for a change of date. And a final Tucker, Tardif, Woods, Mangleson, Westheimer and Barham motion for support to bulldoze part of the 7(k) habitat ridge for a tunnel. Did the voting pattern and the aborted rescission provide anyone with both credibility as well as their desired resolution? Perhaps it was one of those Greens middle paths.

On Wednesday August 6, Council, in caretaker mode, enacted this highly controversial DA by the issue of a Notice of Determination.

I consider the recent Splendour event, with its rampant unlawful street drinking, litter, camping, holiday lets, late noise, veg-

etation damage, smashed glass, vomit, graffiti, and our public spaces used as toilets, identifies that events of this size are unmanageable and socially damaging for our Shire. 

one day, advertised to death the next'.

What is going on? Does anyone else see the contradictions in all this?

For example, large computer systems are now developed with small teams of users and techies collaborating in the same space, rather than working solo on unconnected pieces.

So where to with Splendour? How do we mend the deep rifts? After next year's trial we will have an opportunity for robust assessment. Honest and serious collaboration will be required. It won't be easy but unhealed wounds aren't healthy for anyone.

■ It would appear that Byron United, which for some time has proclaimed its impoverished state, has discovered a new source of funding. How else could an organisation, whose president (in Council) justified unauthorised signage at his emporium as a necessity of poor times, suddenly be flush enough to mount an expensive dirt campaign in the local media?

The most recent example in the *Byron (United) News*, the ad 'Show me the/Our Money', is an example of a standard misinformation tactic – list a number of

• The parks were taken from Council in a state-directed revenue gathering

push (they made money). Byron was not the only victim of this cynical grab and the lame justifications offered have never been justified – despite numerous requests.

This push to take control of the new council is reminiscent of the Tweed experience where developer-sourced money (\$500,000) was spent in support of a number of candidates who claimed ignorance of the origin of their good fortune. The council was subsequently sacked for deceiving the electorate after this group won a majority on council (by 17 votes on a random recount).

In this instance BU is within the letter of the law which the Iemma government has ensured will do little to inhibit donation deceit – disclosure is not required until February 09.

I invite BU to let us know where the money is coming from prior to the election.

■ In response to Messrs Berry and McKay (Letters, August 5), there were more than 300 people at the Woolies protest. As a nearby resident to the Woolies site, we have very real and legitimate reasons to oppose them. The negative impacts of this development on the residents of Station, Prince, Train, Stuart, Tincogan and Mill Streets are real and acknowledged by traffic reports and Woolies themselves. Sewage woes

Duncan Dey (Letters, August 5) is spot on. Here are a few other points that need to be considered.

The Brunswick River is badly polluted. Almost every time it rains (say 30mm/50 mm) we suffer a raw sewage overflow into the river, sometimes millions of litres

One of the main reasons for this is that the 45 year old delivery system for raw sewage (earthenware pipes) is broken, cracked, separated etc and because of this delivers much more stormwater than sewage.

Council has spent in excess of \$2m on repairs to the old pipes with little improvement. Council is persisting, trying to repair the pipes and intends

to spend \$500,000pa over the next three years. The BRCWS Committee considers this money to be better spent on renewing existing old pipes. A new STW costing approx \$40m is to be constructed in the next few years and unless the antique delivery system (pipes) is replaced it will, in wet weather, process millions of litres of stormwater.

The Mullumbimby Primary School (280 students) is forced to use 'Portaloos' when we get reasonable rain as the school's toilets are unable to flush (they overflow).

The volunteer committee (most have been members for ten years) is concerned that when Council staff change, Mullumbimby will be left with a legacy of problems in the future.

Common sense states that the existing delivery system pipes (45 years old) is not repairable and certainly will not complement a brand new STW costing \$40m.

Come on, Council, this new system has to last at least 30 years, so why not do it properly to start with?

And that would be enough for me. But this is not an ordinary land, and we are not an ordinary community, and last night, Mehil Beckerman, the organiser of the run, called me on the phone, concerned, to check that I had recovered! This wouldn't happen in a

city! And then I had to hug myself, because I am lucky, because I am part of this extraordinary community, and because human concern is a threatened species in the world, yet this beautiful and rare creature is still thriving in our neighbourhood.

Recruiting warriors of words for the local theatre


Local theatre company Baywrite makes a recruiting appeal:

‘Monks with mobiles. Talk about attachments! And silent meditation!

‘Sitting in the hall and the mobile rings. Oops...sorry...must answer to the world...Dear me...What has come over you, my learned teacher? Have you abandoned the path? Are your robes camouflage for a military uniform? For the Rangoon Battalion of Monks?’

So the army captain taunts the imprisoned monk in Henry Di Suvero’s latest play about last year’s uprising in Myanmar. The ‘three-hander’ explores the philosophical differences between a practising Buddhist monk and his military captor who is also his former student, and was read recently at Baywrite Theatre’s monthly Saturday Readings session.

Henry, pictured, is one of several talented writers living in Byron



Shire who are members of and contributors to local theatre company, Baywrite, which encourages and supports original scriptwriters and undertakes major productions every year. Over the last three years it has successfully produced the

short play festival Hot Shorts from which the audience selects the best play.

In last year’s production, Henry’s play *Howard’s End* was one of the finalists. Henry, originally from the US, comes from a background in the law where, he says, he witnessed ‘drama’ everyday in the courtroom. He has a passionate interest in justice; he is amazed at how little integrity and how much hypocrisy there is among politicians and so he has been drawn to political theatre and to the challenge of creating situations and characters to bring political issues alive.

During the 80s he worked at the Law School in the University of PNG, and travelled into Irian Jaya where he met fighters from the resistance movement, the OPM. On returning to PNG he set up a people’s tribunal to try the Indonesian government for war crimes. He used real evidence and real

participants – refugees living in PNG – and his ‘mock’ trial played to packed houses. ‘It was great political theatre,’ remembers Henry, ‘but it got me kicked out of PNG – the government revoked my visa!’

Now retired in Byron Bay, Henry works on plays about local, national and global politics. He sees many difficulties in getting his plays produced. Political theatre has a limited audience – it used to succeed through its shock value, but these days TV news and documentaries shock people every day; besides, Henry does not like to use violence, preferring his plays to be cerebral.

The major Sydney companies do not accept unsolicited scripts; companies prefer monologues and plays with few characters to reduce costs which can be prohibitive – a successful three-week run of an independently produced play at the Belvoir Street Downstairs for

instance, can bring in \$12,000 most of which goes on publicity, advertising and rent.

That leaves local and community theatre companies like Baywrite which also have to succeed financially and which need committed and energetic producers and directors of a high standard. So an invitation is extended to artistic and creative people with an interest in theatre to join Baywrite and work with people like Henry and others to bring some of the promising talent in the community into fully-fledged life on the stage.

Council Election 2008

BEACON lists its strategic issues, BU takes up sport

Karin Kolbe declares her candidacy, OSF announces its team, nominations open, excitement escalates...

Teams of candidates are beginning to assemble for the September 13 local government election. Some have announced themselves, others, such as the Tucker/Woods/Heeson group, have just quietly come into view.

Nominations opened on August 4 and will close at midday on Wednesday August 13, after which the candidates' names will be revealed.

Meanwhile the lobbying has begun by various interest groups. The Byron Environmental and Conservation

Organisation (BEACON) has identified a dozen strategic issues for the next term of Byron Shire Council and is asking candidates to identify which they support.

BEACON President, Dailan Pugh, said that there is a plethora of outstanding issues that Council needs to redress in its next term, though BEACON has selected a dozen strategic issues that it considers will identify the environmental credibility of prospective councillors.

BEACON's strategic

issues for the next term of Byron Shire Council are:

Implementing adaptive responses to climate change by:

1. maintaining the policy of planned retreat in response to sea-level rises and coastal recession;

2. protecting and enhancing wildlife corridors to facilitate necessary migrations; and

3. Establishing an explicit greenhouse gas reduction program for Council.

Looking after our natural environment by:

4. restoring full funding for biodiversity management;

5. expanding the extension service to assist private land-owners manage native vegetation; and

6. establishing buffers to protect water courses, threatened species and ecosystems.

Protecting residential amenity and sustainability by:

7. establishing explicit holiday letting precincts and prohibiting holiday letting in most residential areas;

8. ensuring that new development does not exceed infrastructure capabilities; and

9. adopting a policy to limit the number, size and location of music festivals.

Ensuring Council staff complete a new Local Environmental Plan within 12 months that satisfies the above issues and is based upon:

10. urgently completing a Local Growth Management Strategy that explicitly identifies a staged approach to satisfying regional dwelling targets;

11. stopping new housing estates along Ewingsdale Road, at least until they are considered in the context of the Growth Management Strategy; and

12. protecting prime agricultural land.

BU goes north

Business lobby group Byron United has discovered the north of the Shire and is urging Council to identify a new location for the Ocean Shores sports field.

Land originally purchased for the new sports field in 1995 was sold by the current Council in 2004, with a promise that a new site would be found.

'It's been four years, and we still haven't been told where the sports field will be built - let alone when,' said

Byron United Vice President James Lancaster.

According to BU, the original seven hectare site on Shara Boulevard was sold to Council by a former Ocean Shores developer for \$115,000 in 1995. It was sold by Byron Council to the RTA in 2004 for \$250,000 and then gifted to the National Parks and Wildlife Service.

'Byron Council sold seven hectares of land for the price of a small urban block of land,' Mr Lancaster said. 'If it had been sold for market value, Council could have developed much-needed social and sporting infrastructure for the Ocean Shores community.'

'As it stands, most of the Ocean Shores sporting teams can't host home games because they don't have a field. We want to know why the land was sold, how the proceeds have been spent, where the new sports field will be built - and when.'

Kolbe stands

Suffolk Park resident Karin Kolbe has confirmed she will run as an independent candidate.

'Essential infrastructure needs to be core part of council's work,' Ms Kolbe said. 'Bike paths in particular are essential as they will help ease congestion, reduce our reliance on expensive carbon-emitting petrol, give people an easy way to exercise as well as drawing tourists.'

'I particularly like the idea of a cycle path through a sculpture garden as it would demonstrate a practical, aesthetic way of moving residents and visitors in an environmentally friendly way.'

'We need to think about how future generations will live here - to keep the environment clean and healthy.'

'We also need to support the people in our creative industries. These are the art-

ists, graphic designers, writers, filmmakers, clothing designers, editors, musicians, composers, web developers etc.'

Ms Kolbe is a book publisher with two titles selling internationally and a third in development. She is the president of TOOT, the group lobbying for Trains on our Tracks. Karin also works in information technology and has been a project manager and business analyst on large corporate and government projects.

OSF team

Our Sustainable Future is a registered party with no affiliations to any other political party, it says. The party will also be running a team in the Lismore Council elections. The Byron team includes Patrick Morrissey and Dave Moss, who announced their candidacies earlier. The other candidates are Eka Darville and Heather Harford.

According to OSF, 'Eka Darville is 19 and a highly talented performing artist and activist. He's been active in community initiatives, lobbying for a farmers market, volunteering for bush regeneration and doing youth mentoring for the Homebase program. He promotes awareness and involvement in politics, the arts and grass roots activism to the talented youth of the Shire.'

'Heather Harford is an active member of Brunswick Valley Landcare and Federal Community Centre Landcare and been successful in achieving improved facilities for her local community. She has been active for 35 years in rural planning, environmental management and protection. Heather is also a Byron Bird Buddy and monitors bird populations in the Cape Byron Marine Park.'

Enlighten Up Yourself

At this year's Byron Bay Writer's Festival, standup comedian and *Northern Star* columnist Sandy Gandhi released her book *Enlighten Up*. Published by Melbourne Books, this is a collection of her humorous columns that appear weekly where Sandy deconstructs society and the status quo with satirical sincerity. After her successful booklaunch I caught up with her as she continues launching all over the Shire.

So, Sand how is the book going?

'The people who buy the book love the book, there were 300 - 400 people at the launch and Dymocks at the festival only sold 22 copies, I thought comedy was a hard gig! But selling books is tough! They are available in all the Northern Rivers bookshops and newsagents and some gift shops and then it goes on sale around Australia in September.'

As a fellow comedian I know the narcissistic horror of having a profile in a small town, for Sandy it's much the same, although she is in costume and can often get about town as the very unsuspecting Ms Ahnana.

'It's hysterical in Bangalow there is a big poster of me in the window so I go stand by the poster when someone is looking in the window and give them a fright!'

When I first met Sandy, she had this quiet exuberance that belied her real talents. The petite Indian born little beauty never intended to become a comic, or a writer, it just happened as a natural course of events. The book was from an inspiration by a friend.

'The idea to put my book together came from an elderly friend of mine in Melbourne who is in a book club - she saw a copy of Danny Katz compilation of columns called *Dork Geek Jew*, and then she sent me the copy and said here is an idea. The actual design of the book I have put together is little epiphanies I have had sitting around doing nothing!'

Getting a book out is as hard as Sandy made it look. Ironically at her launch she had ABC Radio personality Mick O'Regan play midwife and delivered her book vaginally as she had always joked

'I've got a book in me... when I saw my gynacologist had been down there a long time I knew that he'd been reading!'

So what did it take to release *Enlighten Up*? (Besides of course a stiff drink, some rubber gloves and an epidural)

'First of all you go through those feelings of self doubt - like am I good enough to have a book? That process goes for a while before you put yourself out there, you can self publish and get out that way or find a publisher who believes in you.'

Sandy found herself a publisher. It was a credit to her relentless enthusiasm and commitment to her work.

'As my publisher said at the book launch - he wasn't sure if I was a writer or a stalker! You have to keep the pressure up, especially with creative work. I have realised that the most important thing for me to do is self promote. I won't get anywhere unless I do it. Having said that I have sold 35 copies out of the boot of my car in the last two weeks... if for any reason people can't get the book in stores, they can email me at sandygee1@bigpond.com and I'll make sure they get it!'


Sandy is delighted with the book's presentation.

'The book is beautiful, in fact when I took it up to show Philomena Carr at the Federal Store (because the photo was taken there on the outdoor loo), she said Sandy the outside dunny has never looked so good! It's great value \$23.95 - I just hope I get a tip of \$1 and 5 cents - hang on, I can't even buy a *Northern Star* with that! I thought it was good value but I had a pensioner ask if \$10 was enough, so I ripped it in half and gave it to them. Now I have half a book still for sale if any pensioners out there and feel like reading!!!!'

Sandy has globalised her stories.

'I've edited them and made them contextually correct for a wider audience. Although I have sold myself on being Australia's most easterly Indian.'

For Ms Gandhi, writing and



performing are one and the same.

'They are both linked together for me, my comedy comes from writing in my head and it took me a while for it to cross my mind that I could make it into a story, that happened accidentally because Rex Hunt came to town and got beaten up - if I hadn't sent that column in to the *Northern Star* I wouldn't be a columnist now.'

Sandy loves writing about topical issues and is often caught between deadlines doing a last minute rewrite before it goes to print.

'A lot can change in a story in three days! I try to write about political stuff where I am rooting for the underdog - I don't get involved in party politicking, I am sort of more

the partying politic.'

Sandy has a fascinating personal story, that includes 20 years as a tour operator through Egypt, Africa and Papua New Guinea and a fascinating childhood that begins in Bangalore in India and ends in Melbourne. I wonder whether Sandy will ever go there?

'I will write that book - about my life, but I'll have to kill my mother first. I think she is going to outlive me, she knows I am going to write the book!'

Admittedly Kramnik has played only one classical tournament in that period – a failure in the powerful Sparkassen tournament in Dortmund – and has also enjoyed success in rapid and exhibition events.

In the Mainz final, Carlsen tried to unnerve Anand by using Kramnik's favourite Catalan opening, in the hope that Anand would save his best weapons for the Bonn world title match. Yet if Anand did hide his best counter, he

showed that his second best is also more than adequate.

The only player to trouble Anand in Mainz was Judit Polgar, coming off a long lay-off from competitive chess.

In the second round, playing Black against Anand, she reached the diagrammed position and now set about finishing off Anand with some powerful moves.

55...Kd5! 56.Rh5+ Kc6! 57.Rh4 Nb2+! 58.Kd2 e3+ 59.Ke2 Rxc1 60.Rxd4 Rxc2+??

'I just didn't see 60...Kc5!' bemoaned Polgar after the game. The point is that 61.Kxe3 loses the rook after 61...Nc4+ so Black has time to play 61...Nc4 and keep the e pawn, which will soon become a winner. Instead, after 61.Kxe3 Rxh2 Polgar, her last pawn gone, was obliged to agree to a draw.

After this game, the two players' paths diverged. Polgar failed to win a game for the rest of the tournament while Anand gained confidence and defeated both Alexander Morozevich and Carlsen twice on his way to his ninth consecutive Mainz title.

VEGETARIANISM

Victoria Cosford

Vegetarian: A person who only eats side dishes. – *Gerald Lieberman*

I never passed through a vegetarian phase at all. Instead, unconsciously, I found myself over the years eating less and less meat for the simple reason that I was finding other foods like cheese and vegetables and fish infinitely more satisfying and, from a culinary point of view, even more versatile. To this day, however, I am unclear as to why the notion of doggedly sawing my way through a steak should strike me as boring, whereas doing the same thing with a piece of fish does not. It was probably Italian food that awoke in me the sheer joy of vegetables in all their possibilities – an antipasto table kaleidoscopically colourful with capsicum and eggplant and zucchini, tomatoes and fennel and beans agleam with olive oil – and even now if I entertain it will be largely meat-free dishes I serve.

People become vegetarian for a variety of reasons – ethical, religious, environmental, nutritional, spiritual, philosophical. The first Vegetarian Society was founded in England in 1847, but it wasn't until the twentieth century that the popularity of the movement really took off in the Western world – largely due to nutritional and ethical, and more recently economic and environmental concerns. The word was coined by the founders of the British Vegetarian Society and comes from the Latin word 'vegetus', meaning 'whole, sound, fresh, or lively' – the assumption, then, that a diet excluding all animal (including poultry, game, fish and shellfish) by-products is automatically healthy.

In fact while vegetarianism is considered a healthy and viable diet useful in keeping body weight under control, there is always the risk of meat being replaced with high fat cheeses, oil, calorific snack foods and sweets, as well as the danger of malnutrition. I am frequently amazed at some of the offerings of so-called health food stores and vegetarian outlets: so much of it, whatever vegetable- or soy-

based thing it is, has been crumbed and fried, left to grow cold in its congealing brown casing. And I am equally amazed that, given the enormous number of vegetarians around, there are not more vegetarian restaurants to provide for them and for the rest of us who, like me, are often not in the mood for meat. In Sydney some decades ago there was an innercity restaurant called The Metro, where you were obliged to join a long queue to get into a buzzy room largely composed of booths where you would squash in next to strangers after ordering at the counter. It was funky, kitschy and deafening, with the Ramones and Blondie blasting out of tinny loudspeakers; the servings were enormous, the flavours fantastic and the desserts, especially the crumbles, legendary.

Not since The Metro have I felt excited about vegetarian food – until I visited Casa Pepe in Byron Bay. The unlikely site which once housed the original Boomerang restaurant under the Budget Motel undergoes a clever transformation at night. Drapes curtain off and soften the dining space and braziers warm it so that you feel cocooned and private. Crunchy wedges of garlic pizza arrive once you are seated, a welcome gift. The menu is small: a handful of entrees and mains, six house-made pizzas and several salads. Everything is made on the premises: the Golden Paneer, fresh white curd cheese a lushly creamy contrast to its spicy tomato sauce; the organic tagliatelle slippery with fragrant mushrooms and chestnuts; the buttery pastry of a ricotta tart studded with rosemary and goat's cheese... This food is huge-flavoured and utterly gorgeous, and the Red Berry Crumble for pudding – apples and berries spiced with

cinnamon and cloves with the crumble crunchy with almonds – just about matches my memory of The Metro ones.

Casa Pepe is at the courthouse end of Byron Street, open for dinner only from Wednesday to Sunday. And I would definitely book first. (On 6685 7121.)

Academy seeks rugby coaches

The North Coast Academy of Sport (NCAS) is seeking one head coach and two assistant coaches for its high profile rugby program.

Academy executive director Tony Clarke said 'Rugby coaches who have experience working with juniors at a representative level, and who are prepared to take on extra coaching development themselves to assist our aspiring academy athletes are strongly encouraged to apply.'

Head coach applicants must have a minimum level two accreditation and recent and relevant coaching experience. For the assistant coach positions, a level two accreditation is highly desirable, but not mandatory.

Established in 1996, the NCAS Rugby off-season program runs from November through to April. The major aim of the program is to assist the individual development of each athlete so that they progress further in the sport.

Approximately 20-22 athletes aged 15-16 years from the Far North Coast and Mid North Coast rugby zones are selected soon after the completion of the club season.

Preliminary selection trials are held in each zone in November, which are followed by a combined zone final selection day in late November.

The program involves 10-12 days of activities (usually on weekends) and is delivered by the head Coach, Assistant Coach/es, Manager and specialist consultants. NSW Rugby Union Community Rugby Coordinator for the North Coast manages the program. Rugby Gold Coast is a sponsor of the program.

Applications close on Friday August 15 2008 and application kits can be downloaded via the Download section located on the front page of their website at www.ncas.org.au.
