Council goes ahead In the swim for a safe rescue with new STP


masks and holding up signs such as 'Fix Mullum's Poo Pipes', Byron Shire Councillors voted unanimously last week to award the tender for the design and construction of the Brunswick Valley Sewage Treatment Plant off Valances Road, Mullumbimby. The plant, which will take sewage from Mullum and Bruns, is so far expected to cost \$25.6 million.

Council will also seek Stage 3 approval from the Minister for Water and Energy prior to awarding the contract 'such that the Stage 2 Ministerial approval for subsidy funds under the NSW Country Towns Wanot void'.

Earlier Cr Tom Tabart was successful with a motion, after lots of Despite protesters wearing face confused debate, that 'should a tender be let for the construction of the STP... a report be commissioned to establish whether replacement or continued repair or a combination of either is the best option to resolve the Mullumbimby [stormwater infiltration] problem, using a consultant conversant with sewerage design and repair, to be resourced from the existing \$500,000 2008/09 budget'.


If replacement of part or all of the system is recommended, then funding will be a priority action for the 2009/10 Management Plan.

A small group of locals and a couple of Japanese Wwoofers held a demonstration outside the Council Chambers last Thursday to persuade the councillors to 'fix the poo pipes' rather than immediately spend money on a new STP. Their priorities were: replace disintegrating terracotta pipes under Mullum; build wastewater storage for farmland irrigation; replace faulty 'stink pump' in Mill Street which, in wet weather, dispatches untreated sewage into the Brunswick River; and then build a new STP. 'Since the life expectancy of the new STP is only 30 years, ratepayers may still be paying for it long after its use-by date,' said the protesters.

Attending a demo for the first time, Eri Ogawa from Wakayama in Japan said, 'I feel I can do a little thing – I was glad to join you.' She and her partner Tomoki Fuchinoue, buoyed by their activism experience, feel motivated to protect the beautiful traditional old houses in their home town which lie deserted and are usually demolished rather than being renovated. Last January during storms and flash flooding, eleven local creeks and causeways found themselves home to unexpected visits from vehicles which had been swept along with the rising water.

Several of these cars still had drivers and passengers inside and local rescue crews were called in to help out. Fortunately there were no casualties but this isn't always the case in such dangerous situations.

As part of the equipment available for such rescues the SES has implemented the use of the throw bag as a means to reach victims in the water and pull them to safety.

The bag contains about 30 metres of polypropylene rope which floats on water. The bag is thrown into the water close to the victim and dragged to shore by rescuers.

'The rope has no memory,' says Matthew Armour, Regional Learn-

rope it will not get kinks or twists in it. It's just a matter of throwing the bag as close as you can to the person in the water and they can catch the rope and be pulled to safety.'

On Sunday 25 rescue workers from the local SES, the police, the VRA and both the rural and NSW Fire Brigades gathered at the river at Ferry Reserve caravan park for specialist training by Matthew in the use of the bag. The group also tried out an experimental harness made from the floating rope

The throw bag, which is very easy to use, costs around \$70 and is becoming part of the standard equipment in water rescue and hopefully all emergency and rescue vehicles will carry the bag in the near future. It is also a great idea for any watercraft.

Local Controller for the Byron Shire SES Noel McAviney said that all of the Byron Shire's rescue vehicles now had throw bags.

Noel says that the best thing to do in flood waters is to stay in a car that is stationary if the water level is low but if the car is moving along the creek or causeway to try and get out of the vehicle as quickly as possible, remembering to check for floating debris.

During debate Cr Ross Tucker said, 'You're going to spend \$40m on an STP for Mullumbimby and Brunswick and then invoke clause 45? That's not a clever way to go - it's dysfunctional, poorly thought-out decision-making.

During public access Mullum residents Deborah Lilly and Susan Skyvington told Councillors about the town's sewage problems.

Ms Skyvington has lived in Dalley Street near Heritage Park for the past 18 months and had raw sewage overflow into her backyard during heavy rain in January and February this year. Her plumber said that it was backing up from

Council agreed with the plumber and accepted liability and paid Ms Skyvington's plumbing bills.

'Building a new STP will not fix the problem,' Ms Skyvington said. 'It would be like a 50 year old getting a kidney transplant, but his intestines and bowel are past their useby date and leak toxins into the body.

'Some council staff and councillors try to say that a large proportion of leaky pipes are on private properties and it is ratepayers' responsibility to pay to fix them. This is currently being suggested by BSC in my own situation.

'My plumber has assured me it is a problem in the mains sewer, because if it were being caused by a fault in the pipe between my toilet and the mains sewer, it would be occurring all the time, not just after heavy deluges."

Lovers of raw milk, ethical animal treatment and sustainable local industry are coming together to build on a concept called Herdshare. A herdshare is a co-operative of people who buy a herd of cows and then pay a manager to care for, board and milk their cows. In return, the cow share owners pick up their fresh dairy produce from their local farmers markets, for free.

Joanne Hay, director of Herdshare.com, told The Echo, 'Many people don't drink cows milk or eat beef for ethical reasons. Herdshare puts the treatment of the animals back in the control of the consumers, not the corporations.





Wilson told The Echo, 'For sometime now I have been keen to play my part in doing the right thing by the environment. Initially the system we had installed will not produce 100% of the power we use but in time I plan to increase the number of panels we have on our roof so that we produce all the power we will use plus more?

There is no government funded rebates available for solar systems when used for business which makes Wilson's move to solar even more laudatory.

'The state and federal governments are always talking about providing incentives for people to go solar but they are not really coming up with anything. Rebate or not, I am in an industry that sells appliances. The short term financial hit was significant but the long term benefits are what is important. We use power in store and our stock uses power once sold so it makes sense to me to do what I can.

'It gives us all at Bi-Rite Electrical a great deal of pride considering that we are one of a very small number of businesses in the shire to install a grid connected solar system and make the full benefit of the boundless resource the sun Malloy. He said that the Billy-

Dealing with sewage

Byron Shire Council is stuck between a rock and a hard place when it comes to dealing with sewerage issues in Mullumbimby, especially as it has 40-year-old cracked pipes which can't cope with stormwater infiltration in a high rainfall area.

Residents have a reasonable expectation that their backyards should not be swamped with other people's shit. Property developers have a reasonable expectation that appropriate subdivision should not be held up by an inadequate sewage disposal system. All of us should have a reasonable expectation that the Brunswick River is not polluted, thereby damaging the natural environment and threatening public safety.

Council is struggling to deal with all these expectations by building a new sewage treatment plant at a cost of at least \$25 million and working urgently to repair the dilapidated pipe system beneath Mullumbimby. Alternative methods proposed, such as effluent storage and piping suggested by civil engineer Duncan Dey in *The Echo* recently, have not had much public debate, at least by councillors.

However I can understand councillors' sense of urgency to get something done. Partly because there is precedent for Council to compensate residents for sewage inundation affecting their properties. Could this also mean you could sue Council for infections caught from the Brunswick River? And how much longer will the NSW Department of Environment and Climate Change (DECC) allow Council to pollute?

And as Cr Richard Staples pointed out, there also needs to be more emphasis on the 'front end' of disposal - us. Do we allow gimcrack plumbing in the backyard to affect the sewers? How much water are we allowing to go into the system? 'Flush and forget' is no longer a reasonable expectation.





was answered. When will the spin stop and the truth be revealed?

We still do not know anything about any of the underlying investments of the obscurely named Structured Products. We do not know any of the terms. We do not know how much interest has been foregone (Is it over \$10 million?) We do not know what was revealed at the October 13 workshop.

The only information that was provided at the Council meeting was a generic anatomy of a CDO, described by the Auditor as 'quite a complicated little structure, as well as the fact that the valuations (which now show unrealised losses of \$9.7 million) have been provided by the 'arranger'. Who is this arranger? Is it the ANZ unit that sold the Structured Products to us?

It was confirmed that the Auditor's qualification of the accounts has resulted from the inability to verify independently the value of these investments.

We also learned that some of our Structured Product investments are linked to Hedge Funds, some are invested in Funds of Funds (providing an additional two layers of fees to the managers), and that the Capital Protected Structured Products that are not paying any interest will repay the initial investment amount at maturity 'provided the issuer can do it'. But we do not know who these issuers are, so can only hope that they will be solvent.


■ I'm not really surprised that my letter brought such a hysterical response from the selfappointed vanguards of our children's freedoms (Letters, November 25).

■ In his book, *The Medium*, *The Mystic and The Physicist* (Esalen), Laurence Le Shan pointed to the difference between structural and functional entities. The former are the domain of science. They are material; even though, at a certain level of observation, they are seen as purely energy fields in space. They may be counted, measured and located in space/time.

Functional entities might be said to exist only in cyberspace, the noosphere, the group mind or the Akashic

Record. They exist only when conceived of by a conscious mind. Such things as the focus of a telescope, the point between intersecting lines, artistry, memes and culture are not subject to the constraints of the laws of physics, eg, the speed of light.

They are also beyond the purview of science. It is in the realm of the functional entities that psychic healing and communication through time and space occur. Here the emphasis is not on things but on the relationship between things.

Here lies religion - the relationship between the individual consciousness and its environment. Material scientists on the one hand ignore the whole area, by far the most interesting, and yet many feel empowered by virtue of their extraordinary intelligence to make pronouncements about religion and God.



Local printmaker wins residency

Scott Trevelyan, master printmaker and visual arts facilitator is the recipient of the inaugural Accessible Arts Bundanon Residency for 2008. The four-week residency initiated by Accessible Arts, the peak arts and disability body for NSW, in partnership with the Bundanon Trust, is the first to be offered to a person with a disability along with a stipend to support his work. Scott has a traumatic brain injury, due to a serious motorcycle accident in 2002.

Scott, a 36 year-old printmaker, was half way through a Visual Arts Degree at Southern Cross University when he had a serious motorcycle accident. While travelling in Byron Bay, Scott hit a tree at high speed. In a coma for ten days, he suffered eight broken vertebrae, two broken ribs, a punctured lung, a broken shoulder blade, dislocated hip and damage to the right side of his brain.

The concept of his motorcycle, that had changed his whole life and perspective, had also become a lifeline for his growth and creativity. He produced 300 copperplate etchings of Senna motorcycle images, (the same number that Ducati had produced on the production line). 'I found the process of being in a known repetitive headspace very comforting, Scott said. It was this process that he was later to learn is quite common with those that have survived TBI (Traumatic Brain Injury). Scott will use the residency to develop a new body of work for his own contemporary art practise and will have access to the Bundanon Trust Printing Press. He will record and interpret the entity of the landscape at Bundanon. This imagery will then be reworked for upcoming exhibitions.



What might a seventeen year old girl from Byron do when she is confronted with the 'boredom' and 'frustration' experienced by many teenagers growing up in a Shire 'a million light years away from where it is all happening'? Answer: Chase rabbits, of course.

Theatre director and teacher Robert Owens has gathered together a group of 20 young actors from around our Shire to produce an original production based loosely on the adventures of Alice in Wonderland.

From Mullumbimby to Banda Aceh

The tropical forests of Banda Aceh, teeming with exotic lizards and monkeys, are a long way from Mullumbimby. But the lessons Alice Moffett learnt while working for Rainforest Rescue in Mullum are already proving invaluable in her new role in Indonesia.

Alice has started a 12-month assignment as a volunteer with the Australian Youth Ambassador for Development (AYAD) program, funded by the Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID).

'My role in Banda Aceh is similar to the one I had in Mullumbimby in that I am still working in public relations and fundraising,' Alice said. 'But back in Australia my work was related to rainforests, whereas over here in Banda Aceh it will be all about Permaculture. My experience with Rainforest Rescue has given me a great environmental background and I am now applying those skills to the task at hand.'

Post tsunami

Alice is volunteering with GreenHand Field School (GFS), which was established after the Boxing Day tsunami of 2004.'The tsunami devastated the coastline of Aceh. It destroyed many of the food crops, taking away topsoil and causing a major salinity problem. Only now are farmers able to begin harvesting crops like rice?

GreenHand Field School was established in Banda Aceh by the Bali-based IDEP Foundation collaborating with a local non government organisation with advice and input provided by Australian consultants.

GFS manages programs to train the people of Aceh in organic garden design, waste water management, composting, sustainable farming practices and improving environmental conditions so they can once again grow successful home gardens and crops for food security?

The GFS Permaculture about how it affected them. Training Centre is in the tropical hills of Lhoong, which used to be a stronghold for resistance fighters.



'The first time I went there I black wave came and how her was absolutely amazed by the scenery. It's 90 minutes from Banda Aceh on a new road which is still being rebuilt. Everywhere you look you can see the evidence of the tsunami – the original road that was consumed by the sea, the bridges that were destroyed, and the remnants of homes.

'But the rebuilding has been amazing and the villages have popped back up. Each international donor has built different styles of housing, so every village is distinctive depending on which country funded that particular rebuilding project. There are rows of houses that are all exactly the same - some with bright blue roofs; others painted in pastel colours. The housing is practical, but very small?

A story to tell

Everyone she has met has greeted Alice with a warm smile, but not far below the surface there is a story to tell.

'There's not a single resident of Banda Aceh who was not affected by the tsunami. Without me asking questions, people will just start talking

'Just the other night I was sitting on my doorstep chatting to my next door neighbour who told of how the

mother, sister and brother ran to safety and how she lost her

father. It's hard to comprehend the depth of the loss. 'But there is a strong sense of purpose, resilience and a resolve to get on with life and people are also very grateful of the support they received from countries like Australia?

The first morning I was woken at 5am by singing, which was the call to prayer.

Alice will be promoting the work of GreenHand Field School during her 12 month stint in Banda Aceh.

'The work GreenHand does is fantastic. They are helping communities to regreen their villages, reestablish gardens and plant vegetables to enhance food security.

'They have a fantastic education centre where people can come and learn about permaculture techniques and then they can take that knowledge back to their villages.'

When she has finished her assignment Alice is hoping to continue working on environmental projects in developing countries or back in Australia.





Where the Weird Things Are

Long time friends singer **Gyan** and artist **Michelle Dawson** have just finished collaborating on a very beautiful project. The two of them have self-published *How Weird is That*, a whimsical book of mythical stories and illustrations. For Gyan it started from a fierce protectiveness of her friend's drawings.

'Michelle was investigating 18th century botanical descriptions of the Thyalcine before cameras were invented - so all she had to deal with was very odd descriptions of what turned out to be hybrids - she drew to the descriptions and these crazy animals were created and then she went a bit left field and started taking poetic liberty and started to move it to more mythical creatures. She has lived with plates, (pencil drawings on aged paper) and has had them on the wall of her studio for so long people started saying I want them and I said oh no! She's going to separate them! I'd taken snapshots of them as the whole family together, so I went home and wrote a story so if they were ever separated there would be a record of them together. I showed her and she said maybe we should put it into a book. We started work and she kept expanding and adding sea lions, and I would have to keep trying to include them in my verse.'

Gyan laughs, 'I just wanted to keep it together, it was about keeping the family together!' This is Gyan's first book, it is a delightful book more for the adult than a child, but equally as enticing for children.

The Thyalcine was the original inspiration because of its very strange appearance, and in researching it they found their way to describing a non mythical creature that sounded mythical.

This delicate book has found its way to bookshops around the country.

'It's on the counter in Berkelouw Books in Paddington and Readings in Carlton, they've really taken to it. When they told me they were going to put it on the counter I was thrilled! It's so bizzare having libraries ring you up and say can we buy two copies!'

The book has already found its place in a wider market

and plans to take it overseas are afoot with Gyan's musical comrade, Jane Siberry (Calling All Angels). 'We are going to put out a narrated version by Jane for the Canadian/American market.'

It's been a year of creative purpose for Gyan who will be releasing her new album in early 2009.

'It's called *Superfragilistically* it just popped out in a song, because you know I am super fragile! I go to so many gigs now and walk out because I can't handle volume – all the gear is getting supersonic and they just crank it up.

'The new album is very orchestral. The last album was very intuitive and people just playing the parts, and with this one Si (Simon Greaves, her partner and collaborator) has a classical background – I can sing him lines and he can put it into four parts, it's great because I am back to where I started.

Gyan admits to finding a different musical path as she 'doesn't have the skin' for the traditional commercial routes.

'I am going to sell this show as an orchestral ensemble to theatres, and opera houses so you can play with the group of players that you record with – that's very exciting for me.'

Even the creative process for song making was different

for Gyan this time.

'Every song, and there's about 16, is captured as I've written it. I am pulling it out as I go – it was a bit like cartooning – we have a studio at home, I tried to go back and re-do them but you can't reinvent that magic.'



bass - he would function as a bassist, drummer, and entire mini orchestra simultaneously. Silverman's self-taught percussive technique, banging the strings and the instrument's body, led him to develop the Magic Pipe. Eventually frustrated by the inability to get all the sounds in his head from the upright bass, he built a system of electronically wired, steel plumbing shaped somewhat like a harp, with a thick bass string wired from top to bottom and a hole that billows smoke during the climax of his live shows. Adding an electric cowboy boot plugged in and played like an African talking drum and an electrified musical

handsaw, Silverman evolved into That 1 Guy, playing everything with he could with his hands and feet. He would never play a conventional bass in concert again. That 1 Guy, presented by Ku on Thursday at Bangalow's A&I Hall.


Australia

This is Baz Luhrmann's grand attempt at becoming the Bradman of Australian cinema. The hype surrounding his epic has been phenomenal, to the point that to say anything at all negative about it would be to run the risk of being charged with high treason. Not surprisingly, it lives up to expectations because, thanks to the unrelenting blitzkrieg of modern PR, nowadays you can both lead a horse to water and make it drink. But let's not carp, for this is a visual treat with the theme of reconciliation between black and white forcefully and most genuinely expressed. Basically it's a romance, with posh Lady Sarah (Nicole Kidman) falling

in love with rugged Drover (Hugh Jackman) when she comes out from England to manage her cattle property in the Northern Territory. With it she has inherited the household staff, which includes a little half-caste boy, Nullah (Brandon Walters), whom she determines to save from the authorities who would take him away for assimilation. Carney (Bryan Brown), a rival cattle baron, and his soon to be son-in-law, Fletcher (David Wenham), are rotten cads who want to take over her holdings and the action is set against a backdrop of impending war with Japan. As affairs of the heart go, it never really catches fire, due mainly to Kidman's playacting, which is a pity, because Jackman is excellent, mixing rawhide muscularity with undemonstrative sensitivity. But, as always in a big Aussie outdoor drama, the landscape is a star of equal billing and







cinematographer Mandy Walker triumphs in capturing its mythic splendour, 'its beauty and its terror.' Among a cavalcade of striking images, the stampede that ends on a cliff top (the horses don't always gallop in slo-mo!) and the bombing of Darwin are fabulous. Many of the constructed tableaux call to mind the photography of aboriginal artist Tracy Moffatt, except they don't have her sense of mystery, of something weird and untoward going on at a deeper level. With Baz it's all there on the surface - subtlety and nuance are not his go and, as a broad-brushstroke storyteller, it's hard not to dispel the frustrating notion that he assumes his entire audience has the emotional and intellectual capacity of your average twelve yearold. The heroes are far better than good and the villains far worse than bad. The kid, whose cloying voiceover puts us all in the sand-pit with rattles and bibs, is as cute as a Disney button and his grandfather, King George (David Gulpilil, who else?), the symbol of an ancient otherness, is a latter day Marbuck minus the menace. The humungous finale, towards which Lurhmann has worked with single-minded determination, ticking all

the boxes demanded of convention, in an effort to have your heart burst with blubbery joy, is a classic of formulaic melodrama. It's nice, but the hanky remained in my pocket, though audible sobbing from other quarters suggested that this was a minority response. It's not the best Australian film of the year, but it's not the worst either – not by a long shot, and spontaneous applause at the finish (which seems pretty naf in a cinema) indicated that it went down a treat with the punters. However, at 165 minutes, and with the drove to Darwin done and dusted by the halfway mark, it cries out for an old fashioned intermission so that we can all get stuck into some damper and billy tea. Body of Lies

Body Of Lies is filmed mostly in Morocco and is vividly staged for maximum dramatic effect. The film may not tell us anything we didn't already know about the way the US does business in the Middle East, but it's compelling nonetheless. Partly this is because of the fine performances: Leonardo **DiCaprio and Russell Crowe** are both in very good form. DiCaprio is excellent as a CIA operative desperately trying to do the right thing in a morass of manipulation and half-truths, while Russell Crowe hams it up enjoyably as DiCaprio's bloated, eyeson-the-prize superior, who firmly believes that 'nobody is innocent' and scoffs at things like human casualities. The jet-propelled narrative, which is filled with suspense and action in the best Ridley Scott tradition (the director has always been a consummate storyteller), also gives some insight into the impenetrable difficulties of the situation. ~ Lounge Cinema



FRENCH CONNECTIONS

Victoria Cosford

The Dordogne region - otherwise named Perigord Noir - is in the southwest of France, an area renowned for spectacular medieval castles and villages, for the prehistoric paintings in the Lescaux Caves - and for a residential cooking school called La Combe en Perigord. It was from this school that wellknown cookbook author and ex-television chef the divine Belinda Jeffery recently returned, having spent a week there as guest chef teaching a group of eight people. La Combe en Perigord is the brainchild of Wendely Harvey and Robert Cave-Rogers, an Australian-British couple who established it in 1996 as a base for their cultural and culinary programs. Throughout the year international chefs arrive to conduct week-long classes interspersed with trips to farmers' markets, medieval village fairs, vineyards, duck farms, restaurants, walnut mills and foie gras farms. This is a region whose truffles, walnuts, wild mushrooms, prunes and foie gras are considered unrivalled; it has even been claimed to be the best place to eat in all of France.

It is possible to have a little too much foie gras, Belinda learned – although she loved the whole experience and especially the small villages with their several bakeries, butchers and pastry shops run mostly as family businesses. This is what so many of us seek in overseas travel because it is something we, growing up in Australia, have never had. Steeped in tradition, these are places which seem almost untouched by the progress and change which constitute Modern Life: there is an innocence and a romance we find compelling.

Listening to Belinda's account made me sag with the longing to simply go - until I remembered that the \$10,000-odd required for the week's course was slightly outside my range, and this before the air fare. Luckily, there are a few French restaurants in this particular region where I can pretend. Rumour has it that yet another is about to open in Mullumbimby – which gives rise to the suspicion that, in the cyclical way of food faddism, French food is finding favour again. Plunged into the green of Tintenbar is a big old barn of a building attached to a church called Che Bon run by a young French couple who haven't been here long enough not to commit the odd endearing grammatical error ('Oh Victoria, you will be interesting in our wine-tastings...'). They offer up French country cooking served with lashings of warmth, whimsy and generosity: fabulous house-cured salmon and duck confit, a hot chocolatespurting 'surprise' dessert, a positively sinful seemingly bottomless bowl of potato gratin. There may be pyjama-clad children in a corner parked before a television set and a kitten with a bell around its neck skittering across the ample floor... In Byron Bay, The Petit Snail has been steadily acquiring fans in the few months it has been open, with its regularly changing menu, its cosy interior, the irrepressible 'Chauby' who may break out spontaneously into song as she bears your meal to the table. Which, if you're lucky, could well be beef marrow presented as four conical little bones upstanding on a plate with the melting fat inside to extricate and smear on to garlic-rubbed croutons - gorgeous peasant stuff you might find in a village somewhere in France. I have yet to Sunday-lunch at Jean-Claude at the Mallanganee Lookout west of Casino. All in all, when the Gallic urge strikes, there's no need for me to even consider a passport...

TRUE FOOD GUIDE

In 2008, the first genetically engineered crops were introduced into Australia, with GE canola now grown in NSW and Victoria. Canola is found in a range of foods from margarines and vegetable oils to ice creams, breads and sauces. The majority of Australians do not want to eat GE food, with food companies increasingly responding to consumer demand by removing GE ingredients from their products. Six years ago Greenpeace Australia produced the first edition of the True Food Guide, which gives food brands a green or red light rating based on their policy on using GM ingredients. This is the only Australian guide that lets you know which food products contain genetically engineered ingredients. Since its launch, 25 of Australia's top food companies have developed and implemented GE-free policies. Notable companies in the red include Woolworths, Kraft, Nestle, BirdsEye, John West and Leggo's.
