New STP tender awarded

Byron Shire Council has awarded the design and construction contract for the new Brunswick Valley Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) to Brisbanebased civil contracting company Fulton Hogan.

At a total cost of around \$25 million, site works are due to commence in March 2009. The new STP is located on Council-owned land at the end of Vallances Road, Mullumbimby.

Council's Director of Water and Recycling Management Services, Phil Warner, said the STP will result in better wastewater management practices in the Mullumbimby and Brunswick area and improved water quality in the Brunswick River estuary.

'The treated effluent, from the new STP, will be available to the Main Arm Irrigation Scheme for dairy pasture irrigation and will significantly reduce the amount of fresh water drawn from our creeks for irrigation purposes,' Mr Warner said in a press release.

Mr Warner said recent surveys revealed the site had at least 133 terrestrial invertebrate species inhabiting the site. This includes 104 bird species (two threatened), 13 mammal species (three threatened), nine frog species and seven reptile species.

Works already undertaken at the site include cattle exclusion fencing, reinstating billabong tidal inundation and tree planting.

'Council in conjunction with grants and subsidies from the NSW Department of Water and Energy, Envirotrust, NSW Department of Primary Industries Fisheries Conservation Unit and the Federal Government Community Water Fund are committed to protecting and restoring the ecological qualities at the site,' Mr Warner said.

Currently Mullumbimby and Brunswick Heads are served by Mullumbimby STP and Brunswick Heads STP built in the 1960s. The scheme continued on page 2



Main Arm power supply gets upgrade

Country Energy will invest more than \$250,000 to improve electricity supply reliability in the Main Arm area.

Far North Coast regional general manager, Brian Glawson, said the project involved replacing more than 2km of powerlines along Main Arm Road from Palmwoods Road to The Pocket Road.

'This upgrade will improve the supply reliability for people living in the Palmwoods, Verdue Valley, Blindmouth, The a number of severe weather Pocket and Upper Pocket areas,' Mr Glawson said.

'Country Energy provides an essential service and the new larger gauge aluminium conductors being installed will assist in providing a more robust power supply to the residents of this growing area.

As part of the project, crews will work 'live line' to replace 11 power poles and a number of cross-arms in preparation for the heavier high voltage conductors.

Energy will do as much of it be carried out. "live" as possible to avoid in-

Local teacher helps Cambodian kids

Director of Byron Bay Preschool Victoria Handley recently returned after a year away in South East Asia where she worked with disadvantaged communities, children and their paintings. Cambodia was where she spent most of her time, and Victoria volunteered for a small NGO called Cambodian Children's Painting Project.

'The project helped impoverished children who were sent to work by their families rather than attend school,' Ms Handley told The Echo. 'They had to collect rubbish, sell beads, trinkets or give favours to the ever increasing tourist trade.'

Many were the sole providers for their families, as the tourist dollar far outweighed the average adult Cambodian's wage, she says. 'Extreme poverty, domestic violence, drug and alcohol abuse were often ria - who is also an artist - inipart of their daily life.

The centre focuses on paintings that could be sold to produce an income and also provides a safe and caring environment where the children receive nutritious meals and basic education on health and hygiene.

'Free dental and medical care is also included, Victoria says. 'The children between five and 15 years old are given daily English lessons, school uniforms and bags.

During her time there, Victotiated the 'Artist in Residence Mentoring Program, in which she tutored individuals on the development of their skills with oil paints on canvas.

Some of them were extremely powerful and expressed the country's traumatic past, others the joy of childhood and the imagina-'A Cambodian social worker tion. Since then CCPP has been invited to exhibit 100 paintings for the Nobel Peace Prize.'

living in Thailand. She taught art in schools for abandoned children, and worked with a Burmese artist who introduced her to a rich culture of artists residing in the town illegally. 'I was deeply touched by their lives and their uncertain futures, and their hope to one day return to Burma or be resettled in a foreign country. Even in a school of 100 abandoned children, living with the bare essentials; a bamboo floor, a mat to sleep on and maybe a few blankets and a bowl of rice with some vegetables if they are lucky, I saw love and compassion and cooperation. I saw playfulness and friendship.

Victoria is currently working on an exhibition of her work with a group of four Burmese

ugees and illegal immigrants artists, and will later in the year exhibit the Cambodian children's paintings in Byron Bay to raise awareness and funds for these projects.



The Splendour saga

The final determination of the Splendour in the Grass festival consent for Yelgun rests with the Land and Environment Court and the case is being heard this week in Sydney, February 16 to 18. Conservation of North Ocean Shores (CONOS), with the assistance of the Environmental Defender's Office, is challenging Byron Shire Council's approval of a 'trial' event now set down for July 24-26 this year. How the court will rule is anybody's guess. The reality of judgement does not necessarily correspond to the reality on the ground.

In the meantime residents have had some concessions from Council in relation to a s96 development modification application lodged by Billinudgel Property Trust for the festival. Council voted to allow some changes but did not vote in favour of increased hours for music from midnight till 2am. Food outlets will be able to stay open until 1.30am which makes sense for patrons chilling out after the event. However if the maximum camping is around 5,000 and the maximum attendance for a day is 15,000, the orderly dispersal of the extra 10,000 has potential to be a logistical nightmare. Crs Tom Tabart and Basil Cameron, whose motion on the modification got up 7-2, were particularly concerned with the ability of the access roads to cope with an emergency evacuation.

Local residents continued their opposition to the proposal, with 70 submissions received on the s96 application. The main concerns were of course environmental impact and social amenity.

Plonking an instant 15,000 person village in the middle of bushland still does not make sense, particularly when the 'villagers' have no communal attachment to the landscape. The rationale in the staff report that the 'trial' event will help ascertain 'if there are any impacts' on wildlife because 'the ecological impacts of festivals on biota, particularly fauna, is unknown' is hardly reassuring. Does anyone remember the 'precautionary principle'?

Power plays

Country Energy's further upgrade of its powerline from Lismore to Mullumbimby was bound to stir up residents. First cab off the rank was Skinners Shoot residents Terry Ahern and Tony Pangallo, at public access urging Council to lobby the power provider to fund an upgrade of Skinners Shoot Road while it constructs its substation at the end of Yagers Lane. Not all residents in that area will see a road upgrade as a good thing.

There is also a new substation planned for Brunswick Heads and an upgrade of the Mullum substation. The project's Environmental Assessment (EA) report will be on display until March 6 at Council's Mullum admin building and at the Byron Bay Library.

Submissions close March 6 and need to be made to the Department of Planning. The EA can be reached online via Country Energy's website www.countryenergy.com.au/upgrades. Once there, press the 'North Coast' button and then 'more' after the upgrade description. Then under 'Environmental Assessment Exhibition' press the 'NSW Department of Planning website' link. What could be simpler? At least it's not on display on the bottom of a locked filing cabinet stuck in a disused lavatory with a sign on the door saying "Beware of the Leopard". What characterises every response they have made to the unfolding economic crisis is their naïve, feeble and hopelessly misguided belief in a concept called Australian exceptionalism. They talk globalisation (enthusiastically) but, when the rest of the world's economy starts to

How are these unprecedented sums of money going to be raised? Who is going to lend to nation states that are in recession and heading for depression?

The idealist fantasy behind this world capitalist bailout strategy is that somehow the cracks in the system can be papered over by printing more money. It's what Robert Mugabe has been trying in Zimbabwe without any noticeable success

The next stages of the crisis can be easily sketched: 1) not only major corporations and banks will go broke, but countries like Greece, Hungary, Portugal, Egypt, Mexico, Peru, Pakistan, Malaysia; and 2) protectionism has started in the US ('Buy American' -President Obama) and the UK ('British jobs for British workers' - Prime Minister Gordon Brown) and that's a prelude to currency wars accompanied by trade wars.

Are the economics writers warning of these implicit dangers? No, they're hopelessly at sea giving risible interviews to the ABC trying to convince listeners that their beloved free market will be resuscitated, if not this year then next.

Meanwhile, world leaders are rushing from Davos to G7, G8 and G20 summits trying to save capitalism which has passed its used-by date, when they should be trying to save the planet.







Hunter S hits the big screen (again)

Dendy Byron Bay Cinemas in conjunction with the Byron Bay Writers Festival is presenting Gonzo: The Life and Work of Dr Hunter S Thompson on Thursday March 5 - drinks 6pm, film 7pm,

On August 20, 2005, in Aspen, Colorado, the remains of Dr Hunter S Thompson were fired from a cannon atop a 47 metre high tower in the shape of a double-thumbed fist clutching a peyote button to the tune of Bob Dylan's $\mathcal{M}r$ Tambourine Man. Red, white, blue, and green fireworks were launched along with his ashes. Thompson's funeral was financed by actor Johnny Depp, a close friend and also the actor who portrayed Thompson's literary alter ego Raoul Duke in the film version of Fear and Loathing in Las Vegas. People attending the funeral included actors Jack Nicholson, Sean Penn and Bill Murray, former US Senators George McGovern and John Kerry, Rolling Stone founder Jann Wenner and writer Tom Woolfe. Thompson's spectacular funeral anchors the film.

Killer plants grab the edge in the nitrogen cycle

My friend and I made a special trip to the pond so I could snap some portraits of our rather well behaved triffids. These red carnivorous plants aren't bigger than the palm of my hand. In the sunshine, their bright sparkling leaves are living flypaper. Each can curl around a small insect attracted to the sticky droplets, slowly digesting the corpses. Making the best of a hard place is this sundew.

These plants (Drosera species) depend on catching prey for the nitrogen they need. The soil they tend to live in has no nitrogen to speak of. Nor do they have the typical plant enzymes for using that type of nitrogen. They, like us or any other living organism, cannot do without it. To get that nitrogen, they straddle two lifestyles, utilising both animals as well as sunlight.

History and mystery. Chemistry and biology. Our present atmosphere is almost 78% nitro-

ago, the world was a seething mass of exploding volcanoes spewing carbon dioxide and ammonia. Lightening cracked endlessly. Neutrinos from space bombarded the earth.

Chemical transmutations are thought to have released some nitrogen as a gas. But there was that wild card! Bacteria existed, using ammonia, breaking it down, compounding nitrogen into nucleic acids and proteins. They also released nitrogen gas. This made powerful global changes. In fact, astrophysicists know that an atmosphere with nitrogen gas is signaling the existence of life, present or past, perhaps very small. Throughout the galaxy, the hunt is on.

Back in 1860, they caught the eye of a local gentleman with his family strolling a quiet lane. He was surprised to see all the insects caught in the sundews. Together, they brought some home and he set about experimenting.

He learned plants prevented from trapping insects did not thrive, flower or set seed. So, he felt correct in labeling them as carnivorous. His sons did drawings of the plants for his book. The book was well received. As I send my photo and story, also inspired by sundews, to the editor at The Echo, I think of him. Today, the 12th of February, is his birthday. Happy

The possibilities and perils of biodiesel for fuel

In a world of peak oil and climate change, biodiesel is an industry that should be going gangbusters. In some parts of the world it is. But in 2007 biodiesel amounted to less than one half of one per cent of the total fuel production in Australia, and half of the biodiesel factories in the country are in mothballs.

This at a time when our oil imports increased by 30 per cent from 2003 to 2007, and when almost \$10 billion is provided to the fossil fuel industry in government subsidies each year. With the transport sector being the third largest emitter of greenhouse gas emissions in the country, our continued addiction to fossil fuels drip-fed at great expense by multinational oil companies is almost criminal.

Problems

So what is the problem? Well, there are a few. It is not widely available in the retail market, even in blends. The rise in feedstock prices last year and the use of the wrong technology in some plants have led to them being closed down. While it is relatively easy to produce B100 (100 per cent biodiesel) in a backyard operation, meeting the Biodiesel Fuel Quality Standard in order to sell the fuel requires a long and complex industrial process. And the federal government is sending mixed policy signals about the future of the modern diesels with commonindustry.

the waste is used to produce biodiesel. Another is to rotate food and fuel crops. Also, some crops suitable for biodiesel, grown on land that is too wet, other food crops.

There are also concerns about the invasive nature of some species used for biodiesel production. A report by the Invasive Species Council last year found that, of eighteen proposed biofuels plants, many pose a weed risk. As the report puts it, 'Unfortunately, the very qualities that are sought in biofuel plants are often the features of a weed – hardiness, water thrift, a paucity of pests of modern tractors and other and diseases, and an ability to outcompete other plants.'

Check standards

More older diesels seem to handle biodiesel, although the natural rubber hoses used before about 1990 are subject to decay and so must be replaced by synthetic hoses if using B100. No matter how old your car is, check that the fuel you are putting in meets the biodiesel standard. Lots farm machines are more suitable for high biodiesel blends, but again, check with the manufacturer or dealer.

Another problem is the fact that biodiesel made from tallow can solidify at relatively high temperatures – even 11 degrees – so in areas where the temperature gets down near freezing, using lower blends such as B20 means you won't have to stay in bed until the vour thing.

There are already carmakers that warrant their vehicles for up to B100 in Europe, but for some reason won't honour warranties in Australia if the blend is over B5

Consumer pressure

Consumer pressure can lead to change, though. We have heard of customers successfully lobbying car manufacturers to warrant new vehicles for B100 where they are buying fuel produced to the biodiesel standard. So if you are interested, either don't take an initial 'no' for a final answer, or go for a brand that is more biodieselfriendly.

The only local commercial biodiesel retailer, North Coast Biodiesel at Byron, sends used cooking oil to be processed to the biodiesel standard in a refinery, then buys back the finished product. There are obviously limits to how much fuel can be produced from cooking oil and tallow, so it ficer at the Environmental Deis hoped that such a highly productive and environmentally conscious region will also play a part in the introduction of suitable crops and waste products for making into biodiesel.

What about the 'diesel trees' being imported by a Teven farmer from Peru: are they a step in this direction? The idea of a plant that can produce fuel without any processing is very attractive. Still, in the absence of independent testing so far, it is not possible to know what the greenhouse and energy conservation savings are. It's also unclear whether they might become weeds. Hopefully by the time the trees are mature - at least 12 years - all new diesel engines will take B100.

By then, though, we may also have cheap plug-in electric cars, which will be the subject of next month's column.



Claire's courage shines through

If Writers Centre Project Coordinator Susie Warrick was unaware of the mettle her daughter Claire was made of she has, in a cruel twist of fate, since found out.

Thirty-year-old ex-pat Byronian, Claire Warrick, a righthanded graphic designer who has been living in London for the past five years, was diagnosed with tonsillitis late last year. Failing to respond to treatment Claire was hospitalised, where doctors discovered an abscess in her throat that had burst into her shoulder and released the deadly necrotising fasciitis bug, which kills one in three of its victims.

Claire's condition deteriorated rapidly and, in an effort to stop the spread of the disease that 17 previous trips to theatre had failed to halt, doctors decided to amputate Claire's right arm and shoulder. Six weeks after being admitted to hospital she woke up in intenlimb had been removed.

The revitalisation of the arts in our area began with the arrival in late 1972 of a group of student union organisers who were looking for a site for a major counter-cultural lifestyle festival. They found the idyllic location in Nimbin, at that time almost a ghost town. One of the attractions for the organisers was the fact that they could 'recycle' many vacant buildings in the town. Many of the local buildings were decorated with murals; several painted by renowned visionary artist Vernon Treweeke, who was the subject of a 'comeback' exhibition at Penrith Regional Gallery in 2003.

In May 1973 students, artists, musicians and other young people from all over Australia gathered in Nimbin for the Festival, which ran for ten days from 12 May to 23 May. During this time, festival-goers (up to10,000) took part in workshops and discussions, swam and walked around in the nude, smoked ganja, listened to music, and talked about the new social order. Byron Bay and surrounds gradually morphed from a small fishing village with a contingency of dedicated surfers to a colourful, vibrant arts and crafts community. Artists came from all over the country and, in fact, the world to settle in the Byron and Tweed Shires.

In the last six weeks The Gathering has introduced you to many of these sculptors, ceramic and visual artists, photographers, musicians and indigenous artists.

Exonerated drug test refusenik Vassily Ivanchuk

The exoneration of Vassily Ivanchuk after he had refused a drug test at the 2008 Dresden Olympiad was greeted by the chess world with a sigh of relief.

The Ukrainian grandmaster is one the most cherished of the elite players, his eccentricities and mood swings adding to the feeling that Ivanchuk is special.

A ban would have been devastating for both the chess world nent in that fateful final round, anchuk personally, whose love for the game is legendary. The thought that Ivanchuk might enhance his chess pharmaceuti-

Yet - surprise, surprise - on the morning before the 2009 hearing, journalist and GM Hans Ree was already telling the world in a Dutch newspaper that Ivanchuk would not be banned.

Over the past seven years of chess drug testing, six play-ers have refused tests. The three grandmasters who refused tests have all escaped penalty; the three amateurs have all been penalised, although only one received a two year ban.

The amateurs have become pawns in the game that the world chess body FIDE is playing with WADA. By punishing only amateurs FIDE can have the best of all worlds: they keep their top players happy while being able to provide a few sacrificial lambs to show WADA that drug-testing rules are being stringently enforced.


Whether John Fahey, the WADA chief, will continue to turn a blind eye after the irregularities in the Ivanchuk case become public is a question which will leave FIDE officials nervous for some time to come.





It's a highway town, a truckstop that not even trucks will stop in. Last night I had dinner at a hotel called The Hideaway and I thought how appropriate. If I lived here that's what I'd do. I'd hide away. I think that's what everyone else was doing. There were only five people in the pub. A really pissed guy in a wheelchair playing darts and a family of obese people who I am thinking of entering as late starters on Biggest Loser. Mum, dad, nanna and daughter were all enormously sad and swollen people. Soft sweaty little faces, red with the heat, with tiny little eyes poking through puffy slits of flesh. They were delicately wedged under one of the smallest tables eating the biggest steaks I've ever seen, consuming their meals with such intense passion no-one spoke. There was just the sound of chewing and

Exactly the kind of place you'd go to if you were on the run. I felt like a criminal. A natural born killer. I lay naked on the bed surrounded by rissoles and took a photo for Facebook. I





Minchin A Do About Everyting

Tim Minchin is a nerd. The recent documentary Rock N Roll Nerd attests this, and in a way he is a bit of a remarkable outsider - the comedian who's not really a comedian and the musician who's not really a musician. Truth be told, he's ridiculously talented at both, and when he sits behind his grand piano, his comedy and his music merge to create a powerful dark apocolyptic yet spiritually uplifting show.

I ask him if he thinks comics are smart.

'You do have to have a quieter intellectual brain to do comedy. I've never met a thick comedian, there are certainly people who can be funny without doing it in a self-aware way.

Being funny has always been a bit of a curiousity for Tim.

'I don't know how I am funny, or if I am until I am on stage. My comedy addresses topics of an intellectual nature like boobs and philosophy. The first thing you notice as an introspective person is that you are flawed, it's your cracks that make you interesting.

Being the focus of a documentary can be really intense. Tim got a taste of this first hand in Rock N Roll Nerd, a documentary feature film that has just hit the cinemas.

'The girl who made it is my best friend, and have I have an undying respect for her as a person but that doesn't mean I like watching it. I don't even like watching my DVDs and that's the as good as I get version of me.

When it comes to creating his material, Tim likes to dance on the darkside. While there are no taboos, he has his own private moral compass that dictates just what makes the stage.

'You have to be setttled in yourself, about what your motivators are. I never do a joke Byron Bay: 6685 6262.



about why I am doing it nor do I need to stay pure: I need to know my intent, and there's nothing I say that doesn't have some justification. The amazing thing is seeing below the jokes."

Tim pushes the barrow of human fear, he broaches those subjects we are most frightened to tackle, like death.

'We all have these fears and because I am absolutely and completely sure that there is no such thing as tempting fate it's no problem to talk about them. Black comedy is about laughing at hard stuff. I am extremely keen to make jokes about dark subjects, you have to have your own compass - I really believe in pushing boundaries and you make your own personal choice. It's about how you perceive what happens around you. Media exploitation for example. In my suburb a baby died of abuse and the social work department here was dragged across the coals. So the Daily Mail puts the baby in the paper five days in a row, stirring up hatred towards the social workers. I think it's immoral to be selling newspapers on the back of dead baby.

So how does Tim see 'Ready for This'?

'I totally see it as a theatrical show, I have never seen myself as just a standup. I absolutely respect my audience, though but I can't worry my head about just performing to please.

'I hate taking criticism, I have to deal with the fact that if someone doesn't like me that is good, if really conservative Christians aren't walking out of my show I am doing something wrong.

I've Loved You So long

Sometimes the spirit can become so isolated as to be immune to love's recuperative powers. Juliette (Kristin Scott Thomas) is released from prison after serving fifteen years for committing a terrible crime - the nature of which is the hook from which, as the lured viewer, you cannot free yourself. Younger sister Léa takes her to stay with her and husband Luc and their adopted Vietnamese daughters until she has found her feet. But Juliette's emotional shell is impervious to kindly overtures, not least of all because it is sealed with apathy towards the outer world. The police officer to whom she must report, melancholic Capitaine Fauré, is

at first the only person capable of treating her 'normally.' As other encounters break down Juliette's indifference, the mystery of what led her to do what she did comes to the fore. She's not telling, for what's the point? Nothing can change the fact, nothing can lift the weight that she is resigned to carry in her heart. Writer/director Philippe Claudel's finely hewn script is a masterpiece of the softly softly approach, relying on intimacy rather than clout to imperceptibly build suspense. He sets his story in provincial Nancy, liberating it from the distractions of Paris (how many movies fall victim to the prepackaged fantasies associated with their glamorous locations – e.g. Vicky Cristina Barcelona), thus remaining focused on the everyday ordinariness that camouflages the drama. Scott Thomas is sublime, delivering a precisely measured performance that goes as deep into her character's being as her art will allow (her absence from the Academy's

Claudel's direction rarely ventures from the observant to the poetic, but when it does the results are telling; Juliette stopped in her tracks when confronted by a painting of a grieving woman, and later, her niece, P'tit Lys (Lise Ségur, the delightful Viet kid who steals a couple of scenes) reading in a whisper from a book of fairytales as Léa learns over the phone of the circumstances that engulfed Juliette all those years ago - both moments encapsulate the tenderness that sustains the film. Richly rewarding and worth travelling to see, it screens at the Old Drill Hall on Saturday night. ~ John Campbell

Good rarely comes of any third instalment - unless it's Origin III, with the series tied and Lang Park packed with toads who have just dragged themselves out of the primeval bog. Gloom descended when I saw 'martial arts coordinator' in the opening credits of this stinker. And I was right. The plot flatters to deceive in its opacity, for it is nothing more than bad dudes chasing the hero and girl, Frank and Valentina. He's a muscle-bound galoot with a permanently knitted brow - how anybody can breathe with a torso like that beats me. She's a greeneyed freckled ranga with a Cilla Black haircut and a tiny shiny dress. After using his fighting skills to give ten blokes a hiding (why do they always go one-out, standing like nongs waiting to be smashed?), Frank and Tina fang across eastern Europe in a sleek black Audi (product placement – gotta love it), with another mob on their tail. Frank rips through the gears... check the speedo! ... listen to the vrooomm! ... The pursuers let rip with automatic weapons, but they're hopeless shots... Tina's washed down a couple of eccies with swigs



of vodka and is in the throes of a potentially fatal attack of bad acting... and, oh no! here comes a pair of semitrailers! Frank tips the Audi to forty-five degrees and slices between the trucks on two wheels. Then into the forest. where the villains' car flies over a precipice - at which Frank's Audi had stopped a centimetre from the edge – and explodes in a ball of fire. Frank and Tina have their mandatory root there and then (wouldn't you?), relaxing afterwards with a contemplative view of the scenery (in the old days they'd have lit up a fag). But, better still... just when you think Frank's done his dash, he and the Audi plunge into a river. About a hundred feet under water, his response is what separates the men from the bovs – I know I'd never have thought of it. He swims to a front tyre of the Audi, unscrews the air nipple thingy, sucks in a lungful of oxygen (talk about auto eroticism), retrieves from the boot two six-foot long carry bags (lucky they were there, huh?), inflates and secures them to the Audi and together they float to the surface. Vicky Cristina Barcelona

This is an audacious romantic comedy with a hint of tragedy and a bitter twist towards the end. This is another of Woody Allen's meditations on the vagaries of sexual passion and, of all his films, perhaps the most erotic. Vicky (Rebecca Hall) and Cristina (Scarlett



Johansson) are New Yorkers on holiday in the Catalan capital. Vicky is soon to be married, while Cristina is looking for Mr. Right Now. An hilarious pickup by the self-assured artist Juan Antonio (Javier Bardem) rocks both their worlds: a resistant Vicky is unexpectedly seduced by the suave Spaniard followed by Cristina who moves in with him. Vicky's fiancé arrives about the same time as Juan's psychotic, potentially murderous ex-wife (a scene stealing Penelope

Cruz) and the world moves again. Vicky Cristina Barcelona wowed audiences at Cannes who responded to a veteran filmmaker back in control of his career. Everyone is on form, but the moment belongs to Bardem and Cruz, whose spectacular energy raises hell across the summery beauty of Allen's Spanish backdrop. Sexy, smart and funny, Vicky Cristina Barcelona feeds the heart and soul in equal measure. It's his best film in years. ~ Lounge Cinema

THE MAGIC OF CUSTARD

Victoria Cosford

I never liked custard as a child – I actually never liked it until, well into adulthood, I learned how to make it. The magic of it changed my feelings completely. A nearlyretired old Italian chef taught me how to separate the eggs, whisk sugar and a little flour into the yolks until they became thick and

pale and dreamily creamy; then to whisk in previously scalded milk and keep stirring over a low heat until it thickened. He showed me how to divide the custard into two parts and to flavour one with vanilla and the other with cocoa powder; to then layer them with Alchermes-soaked sponge fingers for a Zuppa Inglese, or trifle. (The Alchermes never properly convinced me with its harsh medicinal taste and smell and its garish redness: it was, however, traditional.)

Custard is the cream which results from a milk-and egg-based preparation thickened by heat, and it forms the basis for a wide range of desserts and a smaller one of savouries (quiche being the best example). English in origin, its purest form is, to be sure, called 'creme anglaise', constituting a thin pouring sauce quite unlike the 'creme patissiere' which has starch added - usually plain flour although often cornflour - resulting in a stiffer mixture, perfect for filling trifles and eclairs and fruit flans. Consider all the desserts which derive from it! Ice cream and souffles, creme brulees and creme caramels, parfaits and semifreddos, zabaglione and bread-and-butter puddings. Curds – notably lemon – used to fill pastry shells are essentially custard puddings. And then there are Vanilla Slices, Millefeuilles, the Greek galaktoboureko, Bavarian Creams and custard tarts, pumpkin pies and Iles Flottantes.

You can stir a custard toward completion in a saucepan (with strict rules applying such as slow heating in a heavy pan over low heat, stirring constantly with a wooden spoon, straining at the end to remove unset egg). My old chef taught me to lay plastic film or baking paper over the surface once it is



There is a recipe I use often for Honey Parfaits, its principles grounded in custard-creation except that there is no heating at all required to effect the magic. Figs being as they are now so briefly in season, this dessert is heavenly served, fatly sliced, alongside figs you have halved and char-grilled. Scatter toasted pine nuts over the top for a seriously stylish affair.

HONEY PARFAIT

1 egg plus 3 egg yolks 1/2 cup honey 300 mls thick cream

Beat egg, yolks and honey together until light and fluffy. Separately, whip the cream until peaks form then fold into honey mixture. Line a loaf tin with plastic wrap and pour in the cream. Place in freezer until firm.

At last week's Byron Shire Council meeting Cr Simon Richardson was successful on a 7-2 vote in getting a place at a speed reading skills course at Ballina.
