The Festival's aim is to promote affordable family fun while showcasing the simple pleasures of Brunswick Heads and event highlights include kite making and bike decorating workshops, Rokakku kite fighting challenges, a decorative bike parade and expo and skills circuits, circus performances and a Star Search talent contest and of course the major event which will be the Country Energy Kite Record attempt.

The current Australian record for the most kites in the air at once is 1127 set in Glenelg South Australia in 2007 and the World Record of 1655 was set in Malaysia in 2008.

Byron Shire Council's Youth Activity Centre major upgrade is finished and the centre is now available for creative and recreational events for young people in the Shire.

Byron Shire Council's Community Development Officer, Robyn Masters said the new improved facility will capitalise on the range of creative and recreational events for young people in the Shire.

In celebration of the upgrade, a re-Vamp concert will be held from 2pm to 6pm on Saturday March 21 at the Youth Activity Centre (YAC) in Gilmour Crescent, Byron Bay and will showcase the Shire's local talent.

At a cost of about \$260,000, the upgrade included a new acoustic ceiling, internal access and upgrade of the disabled toilet, painting and ensuring fire safety certification.

'People have been asking when we will have our entertainment licence. Well, now we do, so as a community let's work with our local young people and support their creative pursuits,' Ms Masters said.

'The reVamp concert has been planned to coincide with Harmony Day and is a great opportunity to focus on the community working together as a whole. 





BEC Trust seeks help with bush rehabilitation

The Byron Environment Cen- Threatened Species Conservatre (BEC) Cumbebin Wetland tion Act 1995. Sanctuary Trust has been using chemical-free strategies in a number of camphor laurel their bush rehabilitation program behind the Byron Market

This area provides critical habitat for the endangered Wallum Froglet and the Mitchell's Rainforest Snail (Thersites mitchellae) which lives on the edges of the swamp forest of this wetland. Both are listed as endangered under the NSW


On the south west corner are trees which have been creating shade and wind protection on the buffer edge of this sensitive wetland. As part of its management strategy BEC has chosen not to eradicate the camphor laurels until the native trees are well established to enable continued protection of this

Sharon Curry, spokesper-

son for the Cumbebin Wetland Trust, said these camphor laurels were recently poisoned without the trust being notified and many of the native tree planting and regenerating plants have disappeared from the site. The leaves of the camphor laurels are already drooping and the sun is starting to enter this shaded area which will enable further weed invasion, damage to the wetland trees and pose a real threat to on 6684 2272 or Sharon 6687 these endangered species.

'We are now desperately in need of advanced native trees like native figs, lilly pilly, tuckeroos, watergums, macarangas, cheese trees and Bangalow palms to compensate for this loss of environmental protection to our wetland, said Ms Curry. 



Cane toads are clustering – it's time for mustering

Right now hundreds and thousands of tiny cane toads (metamorphs) are literally underfoot if you are taking a daytime stroll near any fresh water, be it a dam or a puddle, a lake or a river. In the Byron and Tweed shires cane toads are in our food if it's outside and camping near our bird baths, drains and fish ponds.

Control is best at egg or adult stage. The eggs are laid in long strands in a clear jelly, in areas of still water such as ponds, drains, dams and slow flowing creeks. They hatch 24 to 48 hours after laying. A female toad can lay over 20,000 eggs at one time.

If you find the eggs, pull the long strands out and lay them in the sun. Fully grown toads are easily caught at night. The largest toads are females - if you grasp them firmly, round the middle and back legs, with a gloved hand, put them in a plastic bag and into the fridge for an hour, then into the freezer for ten hours, you will be doing our native frogs and animals a big favour. 

YAC at risk

The lengthy, sorry saga of Byron Shire Council's Youth Activity Centre (YAC) in Byron Bay came to a head last Thursday when councillors were virtually forced to vote 6-0 - Crs Barham, Staples and Heeson absent – in favour of a recommendation to issue notices to vacate to tenants of the building by June 1. This move follows advice from Council's lawyers, to which we are not privy, that Council is exposed to high levels of risk as it is operating outside of the terms of the licence issued to it by the Department of Lands (DoL).

The one solace is an additional motion from deputy mayor Tom Tabart, supported 6-0, to authorise the general manager to enter into negotiations with DoL to see if Council can acquire the site for a token price. However, as Cr Ross Tucker pointed out, DoL is probably not likely to want to give away one and half hectares in a prime location, especially when the current push within DoL is to sell or 'value-add' to its assets which, incidentally, really belong to us.

While current general manager Graeme Faulkner and community services director Mark Arnold seem to be doing their best to get their heads around the issue, Council's handling of the YAC in the past has been atrocious. The building itself was left to deteriorate, and now we find there are no written formal agreements for some of the tenancies. Negotiations among all parties must have been woeful. Council and DoL officers get paid well above the average wage for this Shire, and are certainly paid lots more than councillors for the hours they put in. You have to wonder what levels of competence are at work, if any, to allow the issue to come to talk of evictions.

GM Graeme Faulkner has until the first of June to negotiate with DoL and the YAC's occupants to arrange formal sub-licences to occupy the building. If the negotiations fail, essential services in support of our youth will be out on the street and the future of the YAC will be once again uncertain. One alternative given in the staff report is that 'the Department might lease the building for commercial purposes to realise the market rent of some \$63,000 which the Department had previously sought from Council but subsequently waived because of the community use nature of Council's current occupation'.

Perhaps the one bright spot in the gloom is that there are votes in supporting youth. Surely local MPs Don Page and lan Cohen would be happy to lobby the lands minister on our youth's behalf to ensure the negotiations have a positive outcome. Their websites are www.donpage.com.au and www. iancohen.org.au respectively. NSW lands minister Tony Kelly can be reached via www.lands.nsw.gov.au/about_us/minister. Mr Kelly was the local government minister for two years, so he should have some sympathy for local youth issues.

It would be a crying shame if a great resource for our youth was forced to close. Your voice is important in ensuring our youth can have some confidence in the Shire's ability to care for them.

Every holiday let property needs to be a member of the HLO and be approved for holiday lets; every holiday let property has to have an owner/manager that lives locally; all neighbours of holiday lets need to be given the security hotline number; every tenant has to sign and understand the terms and conditions especially relating to noise and parties which will

breached; if certain properties have continued repeated infringements then it should be those houses that get banned from holiday letting; and cut out two and three night stays to remove the weekend party crew element.

Byron Bay is an incredibly popular town and our economy, whether we like it or not, is heavily reliant on tourism. Already at many times of the year there is no accommodation to be found. So if we remove thousands of beds from the equation what will the flow-on effect be?

I recently ran into an old mate driving an airport shuttle bus. The last I'd seen him he was running his own landscaping business. He told me that when the crunch came his work dried up and now he is driving the shuttle to make ends meet until things get better. Tourism across Byron Shire is a stable force when many other industries are hurting. Why mess with that?

Destructive mischief lies in Council's compliance regime

One would think that with an enlightened Green Council well established at the helm the days of Council cops ('compliance officers') using heavy-handed tactics to intimidate the owners of illegal dwellings would be over. The general manager's apology over a Wilsons Creek matter shows otherwise.

The elected Council professes concern with this growing problem, and one local real estate agent believes that as many as 4,000 people in the shire may live in such dwellings. Most such dwellings are not just 'unauthorised' in the sense that no development consent was applied for, but are 'unlawful' in the sense that the zoning does not permit more than one self-contained dwelling per site, such that there is no point drawing attention to oneself by seeking formal approval.

Council's inevitable response has been to seek a report from Council staff. Inevitably that report is overdue. Eventually, when all the avenues of due process have been exhausted (two years? five years?), we may end up with that new

existing policy.

Recently David Murray, boss of the compliance section, wrote to me saying that his staff are guided by 'Policy no. 5.60 Unauthorised Development & Activities' and by other guidelines issued by the Ombudsman. In these documents, however, I've been unable to find any references to threats to refer a landowner to the Taxation Department or the Tenancy Tribunal, as per the case referred to earlier. What elected councillors need to understand is that enforcement agencies by their nature tend to exceed their powers and by their nature tend to attract people with personality deficits which translate into bullying. Accordingly it's up to elected Councillors - who else to protect the community from excesses of zeal, and the only realistic way to do this is to go public, particularly when there is a flagrant breach of policy; bureaucrats hate publicity.

It is regrettable that in the instance referred to above it was the GM who made the public apology; it should have been the Mayor who went public, instead of casting the GM in the time-

Interestingly urban unlawful housing doesn't rate a mention, which probably means that it is now de facto legal to convert your urban garage, extension or toolshed into a self contained accommodation unit. These are only a problem in rural areas, it seems.

This list of priorities seems to pre-empt the outcome of the staff report referred to earlier and also seems to contradict the Ombudsman's requirement that a Council must not fetter itself by adopting a policy that predetermines its decisionmaking in particular cases. Nor does it sit well with a January press release issued by Council's new spin doctor ('media communications officer') suggesting that 'our priority is not to make people homeless'. If anyone in Council actually knows what they're doing in relation to this problem please contact me urgently.

Bona fide complaints

Without a complaint being lodged, Council staff have a culture of not acting, even if they are fully aware of what's going on at a particular location. One of the things that motivated me to write this piece is that there is no discussion in any of these documents of what *type* of complaint may legitimately precipitate a visit from Council's troops. Any person may complain, for any reason, simply by making a phone call, and Council will not only agree to keep your identity secret but won't even check to see that you actually exist. In other words there is no concept of a bona fide complaint.

The landowner duly filled out the form and paid

Normally in this type of case the applicant receives either a copy of the complainant's letter with name and address blacked out, or in the case of a phone call, a 'transcript', being an annotated record of the conversation. In this case however staff sought to fob the applicant off with an internal form which the staff had obviously filled out long after the phone call on the basis of the original notes. The landowner complained that he was entitled to the primary information, not the staff's processing of it. In reply he received a threat that if he didn't grant access soon, then Council would obtain a search warrant; the complaint about his FOI was ignored.

What seems to be going on is this: the landowner is quite sure he knows the identity of the complainant and what triggered it. He has further information the complaint she lodged included allegations against other close neighbours. No neighbours, however, received equivalent letters from Council, meaning that staff, if this information is correct, had singled him out for attention. Thus if staff had agreed to release original notes of the actual telephone call they would have revealed an embarrassingly selective enforcement of the law.

About thirty years ago, this type of question stopped me in my tracks. To even hear it posed astonished my early 'take it as given' self. I remember holding in my left hand the magazine with an interview with James Lovelock. He suggested life ing again.

played an active part with the physical earth in regulating the planet's cycles of carbon, nitrogen and oxygen. The overall effect was an interplay like that of a superorganism. Yes, this is his Gaia Hypothesis, named after the old Greek earth goddess.

Years later, a throwaway line buried in a textbook stopped me again. The reference was made to cells being the result of ancient teamwork.

In the library, I found this idea was given modern form by Lynn Margulis. She worked with Lovelock at one time, contributing to the Gaia Hypothesis with her insights into microbial communities. She called the cellular teamwork 'endosymbiosis' - 'a mutual relationship within a cell'.

forcement, which is listed as a 'high' priority.

Parking fines do yield revenues, but Council does not have to choose between revenue and enforcement of the Companion Animals Act. For example, consider this very common occurrence: a dog owner takes a dog to a designated exercise area but does not keep the dog on a lead when approaching the area (\$220), does not pick up the faeces deposited by the dog (\$275), and walks the dog beyond the designated exercise area into a prohibited area (\$330). Total fine: \$825, over ten times greater than the

minimum parking fine of \$81 for the most common parking infractions. Such fines would apply to the dogs in the shire that are roaming on sidewalks in towns, on beaches, in neighbours' gardens in suburban areas, and on farms and other country properties.

Generally speaking, drivers who are careless about their parking do not harm anyone by their actions though they may inconvenience others and should be held accountable. In contrast, roaming dogs, attacking dogs, and dogs in prohibited areas are a serious threat to pedestrians, drivers, livestock, and wildlife.

It is even more important that their owners be held accountable. Council should deliver on their duty of care to residents of the shire and begin serious enforcement of the Companion Animals Act throughout the shire.

Any improvements to sportsfields in the Byron Shire is always welcomed by the community, particularly our young people. Let's face it, there is so little positive entertainment available to occupy our youth compared to neighbouring Shires.

When you said 'it was a good day for sportspeople' in your Council Roundup (Echo, February 24) referring to the \$345,000 approved to be spent on implementation of the Northern Shire Sporting Fields Strategy, you forgot to mention that the large community of Ocean Shores (same popula-

tion as Byron Bay) missed out completely... again!

The community here does not begrudge the \$235,000 to be spent upgrading netball, soccer and touch football facilities at Mullumbimby. Mullum residents have a lot to thank the Mullumbimby Municipal Council for (before they amalgamated with Byron Bay Council), because they were smart enough to foresee the need and provide ample sports grounds for a fast growing population in Mullumbimby.

We know the Stan Thompson Oval at Brunswick Heads desperately needs the \$110,000 to upgrade seating, lighting, bins, fencing and leveling and marking of fields; but to constantly and deliberately neglect the 17 sports groups and many talented athletes who are based in Ocean Shores is outrageous, especially since our Green Mayor, Jan Barham, promised to provide alternative sportsfield facilities back in 2000, in exchange for selling off our last community sportsfield site (18 high, dry acres) on Lot 107, North Ocean Shores.

For Council to then rub in this unequitable situation in their agenda papers (12/2/09, page 47) by advising that our hockey players that they still need to travel to Murwillumbah to train is beyond insulting!

The real face of Melanoma

Jason Pudsey of Suffolk Park was given 2-3 months to live at the most in June 2006. The melanomas ravaged his body leaving disfiguring scars, yet despite those odds, he is still alive and doing well.

He approached The Echo to provide a personal account and highlight what is not being discussed. 'We have seen the ads on TV of a girl suntanning and little black gribblies breaking into the bloodstream,' says Jason, 'but the real impact of this is not conveyed and there is still a great deal of ignorance around melanoma.'

'Many people, including young sun-seekers think it can be cut out, and in a few cases where it is detected very early it can be.

Jason says that people avoid skin cells changing. this surgery, as they worry about the cosmetic appeal of scars on their body.

'Concerns about small scars pale into insignificance with the scars you will get from surgical attempts to remove brain, lung and liver tumours.

'The "body beautiful" is highly desired in society, and is more prioritised than health and wellbeing. I also was worried about the cosmetic appeal of a scar on my arm; now I have a massive one on my arm and four scars on my head.

'People think they can just be cut off and all is well, not knowing that cancer cells are flowing around the body searching for a "home" in which they can grow into lethal tumours. Once melanoma develops, it heads for the brain, lungs and liver, all vitally important organs. So fatality rates are high. However, there is hope for longer term survival and living with the disease when conventional and complementary medicines are employed.

'Melanoma moves into the brain and builds massive pressure till the brain collapses, it gets into the lungs until the patient slowly suffocates, it grows in the liver until nausea and poison stop digestion – all unpleasant ways to die. Melanoma begins when something goes wrong in a melanocyte, style, especially here in Byron a cell which shapes our skin pigmentation. After growing to 1mm in depth, which can take vitamin D and K, but any more just a few weeks, your chances

tastasising in your body go up exponentially.

'Melanoma is a deadly cancer. It is chaotic and spectacularly resistant to chemotherapy and radiation therapy. It is increasing in incidence in Australia by 3% per year. Currently over 1,000 people die annually from the disease in Australia. The typical age range is between 30-50 years, with the average being 40 years. Only 10% of patients in whom the disease has metastasised (spread to other parts of their body) are still alive after five years. In other words, 90% of people with melanoma in their blood stream will be dead within five years.'

'Although difficult, and a challenging and tenacious disease, there is hope. I was given 2-3 months at the most in June 2006. And despite this latest brain tumour (it's the first new growth to appear in my body in 14 months), I have kept the disease from growing through a combination of conventional and complementary medi-

Jason claims our outdoor lifestyle in Byron Shire is both a blessing and a curse – it is the sun that can do this damage if we are not careful, but our community also offers a range of healing modalities.

'We have many healers such as the famous Grace Gawler living here which allows a multifaceted approach to living with cancer. There is a Melanoma Unit in Brisbane with an attached support group and one in Sydney, but nothing up and running in the Byron and Northern Rivers Region. Lifeline in the sky: help keep the rescue helicopter flying

It's the fastest lifeline to any emergency in our region, whether it is remote bushland or ocean-side. The Westpac Rescue Helicopter Service, based in Lismore, has been busy saving at least a life a day on average so far this year – be it motor accidents, search and rescue or inter-hospital transfers. This essential service is also free; funding remains, like any charity organisation, reliant mostly on the generosity of the public's donations.

Meet Chief Pilot Lynton Beggs and the two helicopters that are under his command.

Own an investment property?

Did you know that any property you own but do not live in may be liable for land tax?

If you own one or more investment properties in NSW with a total land value of more than \$368 000, you need to register with the NSW Office of State Revenue for land tax. Investment properties include vacant land, a house, unit, flat or a holiday home.

Land tax generally does not apply to the principal place of residence or to farms.

If you think you may be liable for land tax, you can register:

- online at the OSR website: www.osr.nsw.gov.au or
- by calling the land tax helpline on 1300 139 816.

All property owners who may be liable for land tax must register by 31 March.

If you aren't registered by this date, you may be charged penalties or interest.

The Valuer General provides independent annual valuations of all land in NSW to OSR for land tax purposes. You can find details of how to calculate your land tax liability at www.osr.nsw.gov.au

Cape Byron Steiner School celebrates 21 years

For the love of the land

WITHIN THE 3.5 HECTARES OF LAND in the rolling hills of Ewingsdale, the Cape Byron Rudolf Steiner School has established an oasis of learning, with architectually designed buildings nestled amidst verdant gardens, and regenerated forests.

The school was established in its present site when 2.4 hectares of land was gifted by the Mackellar Family. The site at that time was being used as cattle pasture, and had few trees to offer shade and comfort to the new inhabitants. The school's policy for the beginning was to focus on the environment as a centrepiece of all development and educational activities. According to one of the school's founders, Susan Perrow, 'the first construction on the site was a large compost heap and vegetable patch.' Since the school moved onto the Ewingsdale site in 1990 there has been extensive tree planting, with over 20 varieties of fruit trees, allowing the students to wander around throughout the year and harvest food for consumption.

Another of Rudolf Steiner's legacies was the development of 'Bio Dynamics'. This system of agriculture has been practised on the school site throughout its lifespan, and today the results are obvious. According to Cape Byron Rudolf Steiner School's site manager, Gavin Colley, 'when the site was first settled it was impossible to grow anything, now it is hard to stop things growing!'

Keeping a closed loop on energy

today's environmentally sensitive world, but for the Cape Byron Steiner School, it has been a reality for 21 years. The school has used solar power to meet its electricity needs since inception, for many years it was off the power grid, but more recently it has connected to the grid and is able to feed solar power back into the mains. The School was the first solar powered school of its size in N.S.W. and continues to expand the solar system to match increasing power needs.

The school treats all its grey and black water onsite and re-uses it for irrigation. Students use composting toilets and waterless urinals, which feed into reed bed filters, and have extensive rainwater tanks for drinking water and toilet flushing, minimising the need to use mains water.

Most importantly, students, staff

and parents have always been actively involved in the creation and upkeep of the school site. Over the years, the energy of so many people has been invested into this land, that now provides an environmental sanctuary for the current students, one that gives an added dimension to their educational experience

Gavin Colley says of the student's experience, 'for the students the environmental practices become second nature, and for many it is just taken for granted that it is the way things are done. The benefits become obvious when they leave the school, and realise that much of the world does not operate this way, then they have the vision to make a change.'

The current band of teachers has experience teaching in Scandinavia, the US, Canada, New Zealand, and the UK, while others have moved here from schools within the Northern Rivers

Many teachers have arrived at Cape Byron from Steiner education backgrounds, and many have arrived from government, grammar and private school systems. Some have

This pursuit of excellence and an expectation that students can achieve their goals permeates throughout the staffroom.



It became less godly in the 18th and 19th century when it had a resurgence as vaudeville, and continued right up to the 1940s. It's this era that inspires Ms Conti the



Groove Drops

COME NOW SELECTA and GROOVE D without a dance floor for a 'chilled post working week crowd', says Drew aka DJ Mr. Link. Drew has been around the traps and owns an extensive record collection of rarities crossing many genres. 'Growing up with a mother who listened to everything from Jefferson Airplane to Cowboy Junkies to Sade to James Brown gave me a great appreciation for a very diverse musical landscape but it wasn't until 1995 when a friend, who would always lend me mix tapes of a lot of early 90's hip hop, showed me a video of Mixmaster Mike and Q-Bert at the 95 DMC DJ championships (still the most amazing thing I've seen on decks) that I decided, DJ-ing would be my thing.' Drew has since played alongside artists such as 1200 Techniques, The Herd, Sleeping Monk, 206 Collab, 2up, Low Budget and as a DJ, supported such acts as Kool Keith & Kutmaster Kurt, Jade Nemisis, Koolism, Katalyst, Sonic Animation, Ollo and On Inc. Mr. Link became a short term regular on the Sydney hip hop radio show Droppin Science while also DJ-ing for the premier Sydney MC battle



nights 'Battleacts' and not least but last, Drew released three albums as the now defunct Chaos Maths with partner Smokin Jodes. While GROOVE DROPS features funk, soul and jazz, an evening of COME NOW SELECTA delivers the Jamaican sound with guest DJs Dollamix of the Nice Up, Ari from Mighty Highness records and Sippa from Palmskinz Parlour. GOOD-FOOT at Liquid has been one of Drew's recent projects and he has now settled in with a DJ residency at Satori where he also manages the entertainment.

Q: What happened to GOOD-FOOT?

A: 'Myself and Sifixion (The Bird/Red Bantoo) were putting on this monthly night last year with Katch and Dave from the Resin Dogs but unfortunately Dave joined Wolfmother to further his ambitions of world domination and Katch was beamed up to dj grandmaster status, so we can't afford

his rider anymore; but the GOODFOOT will be back soon at a new venue featuring a new line up of Non SiFixion, Dave was Dog now Wolf, dj Dropped Pie and Stumped Summary.'

Q: Is scratching an integral part of your dj performance?

A: 'Scratching used to be a whole lot of my performance when I was doing hip hop gigs down in Sydney and at uni, especially with my old band Chaos Maths, but it needs to be tight and I don't practice enough plus I'm not so much on the hip hop tip anymore, it's still my first love when it comes to music but I'd much prefer to see people dance rather than nod their heads, so now I still do but only when it really complements the mix or the track. At home... always!

Q: What do you focus on when mixing into a track/ style that doesn't beat-match with the previous one?

A: 'I just try to cut it up, do a straight drop or wait for just

the right moment cause a lot of music I play isn't quantized, it's all live, so it's important to get the mix just right, plus it's always a far better feeling for me when I can find tracks from different genres that complement each other rather than just rely on beat matching. It's definitely a delicate balance of both though and a lot of DJs keep the groove real well but they forget to change it and it gets boring, so that's what makes a good DJ, someone who can flip the script and keep you interested.


Q: Who else is playing at Satori in March?



The Combination

David Field was the corrupt detective who spat into the cooking vat in Gettin' Square (2003). He was also one of Bryan Brown's henchmen in Two Hands (1999), so you wouldn't expect him to make his debut as director with a piece of kiss'n'cuddle fluff. There is a love story here, but it is a fraught, cross-cultural one that is thrown into the contemporary mix of urban tribalism and working class family loyalty. George Basha, who wrote the screenplay, is John, a Christian Lebanese who has just been released from gaol. Going home to Sydney's west, he finds younger brother Charlie (Firass Dirami), though still at school, running with a

charismatic Leb gang leader Zeuss (Ali Haidar), getting out of his depth as a new-kid dope dealer in the employ of the ruthless Ibo. Having been inside, John, who has begun courting Sydney, a blue-eyed blonde Aussie chick, sees it as his mission to stop Charlie from heading down the same path. The unfolding drama is dealt with even-handedly the vengeful mentality that gorges itself on the teat of denigration and alienation is what stokes the mindless fury of Zeuss and many young Lebanese men – but the depiction of Sydney's parents as stereotypical Hansonites might have been better written. Field has inspired astonishing performances from his novice actors – Basha you'd expect to impress, but Dirami and Haidar are exceptional – and he has been aided and abetted by cinematographer Toby Oliver's stunning visuals and an intoxicating score from Labib Jammal. Combined



with a script that is all muscle and no flab, and taken at full throttle with uncompromising honesty, the result is visceral in its impact. Check out the restaurant scene, with the Arabic band going right off and everybody dancing before the segue to John making love to Sydney – all you get is a brief look at her sweating back, but it's as sexy as anything; the intense and beautifully shot and aurally recorded sparring session in the gym; the volcanic encounter between John and his mother when he stands on his dig and tells her why he is so hard on Charlie; the shocking, unexpected violence. It's unforgettable. A no-names cast won't help at the box office, which is extremely dispiriting, for this is a fantastic film, compared with which the nauseatingly over-hyped Australia now seems piffling, bloated and entirely irrelevant. I cannot recommend it highly enough. Support a homegrown product – you'll miss something special if you don't. ~ John Campbell

Last Chance Harvey

I've always been convinced by Dustin Hoffman's characters from the Sixties' Ratso Rizzo and Ben, the gormless graduate, to his mental Raymond Babbett, to the recent Bernie Focker and Mr Magorium of the magic emporium. As Harvey, he's a jaded writer of jingles for TV

commercials whose daughter Maggie has chosen her stepfather to give her away at her London wedding. As Kate, the beautiful Willesden Green spinster of a certain age, Emma Thompson brings a similar credibility to her part. She has an unchallenged patent on the tilted head with sincere gooey smile, and she can also cry at the drop of a hat (remember those heartbreaking tears in Love Actually?) – but she is asked to resort to her talent for the lachrymose too often here, making Kate out to be more of a self-pitying sook than is necessary in what is a warm and fuzzy but immediately forgettable romantic comedy. For the viewer who foremost wants to feel good at the end (and what's wrong with that?), the essential need is to believe in Hoffman's and Thompson's compatibility as potential lovers - so rest assured, the veterans fulfil that need with consummate ease. The earlier sequences work best, intercutting between Harvey's anxious trip to England, where he must cope with Maggie's metaphorical dagger through the heart before being told over the phone that he has lost his job, and Kate's mundane existence of menial employment, calamitous blind dates and clingy mother. There are spiky observations of social mores, a few decent laughs and a running if mechanical gag concerning Kate's mother's fears about what the Pole next door is doing in his ba yard with his axe. The couple's meeting is plausible (less so is their stroll from Paddington to South Bank - like walking from Suffolk to Belongil in five minutes), and her insistence that he return to Maggie's reception and his that she accompany him leads to the movie's peak. Following the fun and pathos at Grosvenor House (rom-coms are invariably set in locations swanker than those with which the majority of we fantasising punters sitting in the dark are familiar),



A COOKING CLASS

Victoria Cosford

Kate Platt's cooking academy 'Araucaria' could not have hoped for a more brilliant launch than it enjoyed recently, thanks largely to celebrity chef Ben O'Donoghue - indeed, if this set the tone for the calibre of what is to come then we can consider ourselves exceedingly privileged. The three-day event began on Friday with the guests' morning arrival at Kate's Tuscan-style home in Ewingsdale. The setting – high on a hill with views that extend to the ocean - is precisely the sort that visitors to this region expect from brochures: lush landscape unfolding in vivid green, bucolic serenity. It was this which greeted me on the third day I attended, a sunshiny Sunday morning when I joined a group of mostly women sipping freshly expressed Zentvelds coffee out the front. We sat shyly arranged on a low stone wall and offered each other our respective names. A swimming pool shimmered and a fountain burbled; behind us the house opened itself out, dispensing generous hospitality in the most stylish of ways, an extension of the owner herself.

The real drawcard was, however, the chef himself. Meeting fame in the flesh can often be disappointing - in this case the flesh outdid expectations. Despite having hosted the sixhour seafood day on Friday and the six-hour red meat day on Saturday, he could not have been more enthusiastic as he prepared for the white-meat day. The structure of each day was the same: perfect coffee dispensed by the ever-charming and beautiful Rebecca Zentveld before the group settled down at tables facing the long marble workspace from which Ben dispensed his demonstrations. On the gorgeously laid tables (white linen, good glassware, hefty water jugs) were platters of chargrilled bread, marinated olives, garlicky basil tomato dice and creamy Persian fetta so that we could compose our own bruschette

and graze while watching the show.

Because show, in the hands of Ben O'Donoghue, was what we all got. Hardly an unbeautiful man, Ben possesses moreover a character so immediately likeable, unpretentious and engaging that, yes, within minutes he had us wrapped around his little finger. More importantly, he knew his stuff, with a seemingly bottomless font of useful, fascinating information about everything. And so, with a glass of chilled rose in our hands - from Granite Belt winery Au and sliding down effortlessly despite the ungodly hour - we gave ourselves up. Ben began backwards with dessert, a lemon cheesecake topped with lemon curd. As with everything he demonstrated, all the ingredients were locally sourced and so the base was crumbed Byron Bay Cookie Company biscuits and the cheese was, rather than the usual cream cheese, the low-fat quark made by Justin Telfer of the Bangalow Cheese Company. Next we were shown how to fill the hollowed halves of butternut pumpkins with a pumpkin biriyani mixture, wrap it in foil and barbecue it till soft. He prepared Byron Bay pork shoulder in a braise of coconut milk scented with Asian aromatics (an oriental play on the Italian classic) and whipped up marinated wok-fried turkey to be served in lettuce cups. Extraordinary aromas flooded our senses - fresh ginger and garlic and onions frying in macadamia oil; the tangy yeasty eggy perfume of the dessert; the citrussy notes of freshly bruised lemongrass and sliced kaffir lime leaves - so that by the time, well into the early afternoon, that lunch was served, it was no longer a cooking class but a group of laughing people already friends, having the time of their lives.

The next event is a one-day class on April 4 conducted by Steven Snow.

HEIRLOOM TOMATO SALAD WITH ROCKET AND RICOTTA AND HERB DRESSING

from Graeme Stockdale, head chef Utopia in Bangalow

1kg mixed tomatoes

2 handfuls of rocket

150g fresh ricotta (or boccocini or goats cheese) a few extra capers and picked basil leaves, to serve

HERB DRESSING

1 cup firmly packed picked herbs (I like equal parts basil, parsley and

1 tsp baby capers

1 anchovy fillet

1 clove garlic

juice of ½ – 1 lemon

½ cup extra virgin olive oil

Combine all dressing ingredients in a food processor and blitz until rough consistency.

• For the salad slice and dice all of your tomatoes into different shapes and sizes. Season and rest in a bowl for 5 – 10 minutes so the juices can start to flow a little.

Roughly combine other ingredients, dress liberally in the bowl and scatter with a few extra capers and basil leaves

Serve with some nice crusty fresh bread and, my personal favourite at the moment, a red wine in tumblers so you feel like a French villager.
