Capital works high on Council's budget

Byron Shire Council's 2009-2012 Draft Management Plan and Budget is now on public exhibition.

Council's general manager Graeme Faulkner said the plan focuses on the delivery of infrastructure and community services without putting more financial burden on Shire residents. 'Council is adhering to the 3.5% rate pegging announced by the state government and there is no additional rate variation increase proposed for 2009/10,' Mr Faulkner said.

'The Draft Management Plan and Budget outlines Council's programs, an overview of capital works, and the proposed rates, fees and charges - \$47million has been allocated for a range of capital works including the construction of the Brunswick Valley Sewerage Treatment Plant, local road reseals, stormwater upgrades, cycle ways, construction of the Byron Bay Library, Byron Regional Sport and Cultural Complex, Suffolk Park Children's Centre and upgrade of the Mullumbimby Swimming Pool.

'Further development of the Affordable Housing Project at Station Street Mullumbimby will be continued along with implementing key actions from the Cultural Plan and the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan.'

A public presentation of the Draft Management Plan is being held at Council Chambers on Tuesday May 12 at 6pm for all interested community members.

Mayor Jan Barham said, 'I encourage the community to attend the public meeting to find out what priorities and funding have been allocated for the next year. Council's budget is tight and we welcome community input on the priorities that have been set by the council.'

Included among the expenditure is \$7m for sewerage services, \$4.3m water supplies, \$ 5.5m waste services,

High costs put the squeeze on local poor, says forum

A combination of hefty living costs, specifically in terms of accommodation and the level of unemployment, is the main reason for the alarmingly high rate of poverty in the Byron Shire, according to General Manager of the Byron Community and Cultural Centre, Paul Spooner, at a poverty forum last Friday. Holiday letting forces the pricing up further and there is a greater need than ever for affordable housing.

The Poverty Forum attracted about 30 people. It was held in the Fletcher Street backroom of the Community Centre - a fitting venue, as Paul Spooner commented, given the plethora of services conducted there. With representation from St Vincent de Paul, Salvation Army, the Northern Rivers Social development Council and emergency relief services amongst other bodies, the forum generated much lively discussion on the deplorable situation of poverty and homelessness in the Shire.

'Something is going on that needs to be talked about,' said Paul by way of opening up the dialogue. The national rate of those officially living below the poverty line is 11.7% - the Richmond electorate's rate is 16.6%, or one in six people. More figures were cited, such as the state-wide median rental which is about 23% of the median income; in Byron Bay it is twice as high, at 47%.

The fact that younger people are increasingly applying for assistance is equally disturbing. Various solu-

tions were proposed, perhaps the most positive being the need to lobby governments at both state and federal level for facilities and funding.

A centre like the Matthew Talbot Centre for the homeless was proposed; someone else spoke about the enormous disparity between the wealthy and the impoverished in the area (the 'resource-rich' versus the 'resource-poor'), offering ways that those without could somehow benefit from the sort of unwanted possessions

Last Friday Byron Youth Service, using a grant from the Northern Rivers Community Foundation, invited seven youth workers to bring young people from the seven regions that make up the Northern Rivers area to Byron Bay to attend a forum to discuss ways that they can change their communities for the better.

The young people attending the Forum came from areas between Coraki and Tweed Heads. During the morning session of Seven from Seven, each area worked on answering these questions about their own communities:

- What's good?
- What's not so good?
- What annoys you?
- What excites you?
- There was a number of areas

in which all of the young people were pretty much unanimous in their answers. The lack of venues, youth events, organised parties, in particular music events were top on the list of things that were not so good in their communities. Other things that the young people found to be a problem were things like transport, both the lack of and the expense of those services that are available, stereotyping, bullies and violence, alcohol, accommodation, drug use and the lack of jobs for young people.

Some of the things that they found to be good about their communities and excited them were festivals, beaches, skate parks, working in the community and the future. One thing that was particularly noticeable

was just how closely each region identified similar problems and issues.

Throughout the day there was a host of events, from graffiti and fire twirling to brainstorming sessions and volleyball.

Each group has returned to their own regions with an achievable project that they will work on with a mentor and connecting with others in their community. The forum will be followed up in six weeks, with all regions returning to Byron

to deliver their projects and discuss the outcomes.

Seven from Seven was the brainchild of Rosalie Bryant, who runs the Mentor Net program for BYS and was made possible by a grant from the Northern Rivers Community Foundation.

Mentor Net is a project designed to offer young people support through linking them with trained adult mentors. Anyone interested in becoming a mentor can contact Rosalie at BYS on 6685 7777.

Combat climate change with compost

This is International Compost Awareness Week, and local groups are intent on demonstrating the wonders of compost by practical example.

According to Compost Australia about 60% of the rubbish Australians put in the everyday mixed-waste 'garbage bin' could be put to better use in the garden as compost and mulch or could be returned to agricultural land to improve soil quality. Using compost in your garden also reduces the need for water by an average of 30%.

Alarming, such a huge amount of organically-active material buried 'anaerobically' (without air) in landfill causes over 3% of Australia's total greenhouse gas emissions annually by producing methane: a gas with 25 times the global warming potential of carbon dioxide. If properly composted instead, this same organic waste could help to abate climate change in yet another way: by sinking or 'sequestering' carbon back into the soil.

Compost bonanza

Sustainable Streets is holding a Backyard Compost Bonanza in Mullumbimby this Saturday morning. Upgrade your skills with a demonstration of various composting methods such as worm farming, Bokashi, hot and cold composting. Choose the method and mix most suited to your needs - whether it be just doing your bit for the environment and or using waste as resource to boost your garden's magic.

Building a compost heap is precise but easy - a pile of kitchen scraps and grass clippings in a corner of your yard is not compost. Cost is \$5 per person, kids free.



Arts group lobbies for \$2m strategy

Last Wednesday Virginia Judge, Minister Assisting the Premier for the Arts, met with representatives of ten leading arts organisations in the Northern Rivers to launch a new Arts and Creative Industries Strategy for the region.

The visit came after a NSW government report recognised the Northern Rivers as the hot

spot for the arts in NSW, with double the growth rate in creative jobs than Sydney.

The arts organisations in the region (including Arts Northern Rivers, the Writers Centre, Screenworks, NORPA, NRCAC) have formed the Northern Rivers Creative Industries Consortium.

Together they made a unit-

ed pitch to the Minister for \$2 million to support creative jobs and business growth in the region, through implementation of the Northern Rivers Arts and Creative Industries Strategy.

Minister Judge said that 'creative jobs in the Northern Rivers were growing at a rate of 5.1 percent - double Sydney's

growth rate. This is a remarkable effort for a regional area. I will do everything in my power to support these organisations in developing more opportunities for local artists.'

The Consortium is now preparing a proposal for the Minister, seeking a \$2 million investment in creative jobs growth in the region.

Writers get chance to pitch a novel

The Byron Bay Writers Festival 2009 provides an opportunity for new writers to pitch to big-name publishers but this year the event is providing new sport for Festival audiences and going live.

Survey looks at economic value of tourism

Byron United and Byron Bay Tourism have joined forces with Tourism NSW and Chambers of Commerce in Mullumbimby, Bangalow and Brunswick Heads to survey the their local businesses on the economic impact of tourism.

The groups believe everyone who is employed or is running any business in Byron Shire is affected by the state of the overall economy whether or not they deal directly with visitor tourism.

'For instance, if the economy

shrinks the immediate effect of loss of jobs brings employment risks to the teacher, the tradesperson, the health professionals etc as people relocate in search of work.

'When a visitor orders breakfast at a café, this creates demand for local eggs, bread, local cutlery and crockery retailers, employees, while also providing income for the café owner/employees who might spend that income at a doctor, car dealership or corner store for example.'

The survey is being conducted by Urban Economics (www.urbanomics.com.au). The completed surveys will be returned to Urban Economics and they 'will proceed with all confidentiality maintained'.

President of Byron United Ed Ahern said, 'The business community has been reaching out to Council for some time, asking for acknowledgement of the significance of tourism to the broader Byron Shire community, the flow-on effects to jobs for teachers, doctors,

plumbers and Council's own bottom line benefits.'

He urged businesses to 'please complete the survey form as soon as it is received and return it by the due date.'

'We hope this study will help highlight the reality and lead to positive recognition and action to supporting our Shire's primary economic driver.'

which end up on front lawns for council pick-ups. A greater need for compassion, especially on the part of the rangers who regularly confiscate the few sad objects left on sand-dunes by the homeless - objects which constitute their 'homes' - was called for. Essentially, most agreed, it was time to take the situation to government level.

Major Darren Elsley from the Salvation Army in Byron Bay reports that he has noticed a 35% increase in new people

for the first quarter of 2009, compared with the same time last year. As for Trish Evans, Affordable Housing Project Officer with the Northern Rivers Social Development Council, she regards it as imperative that, given all the federal government funding opportunities around at the moment, the region secure its share.

With much of the spending directed toward housing development and the homeless, she feels strongly that 'we need to draw attention to ourselves'

and 'collaborate with each other'. Initiatives such as the Byron Bay Poverty Forum are one significant way this might be done.

The Northern Rivers Social Development Council cites some sobering statistics for the region. According to the Department of Housing Sales and Rent (December quarter 2008), the Richmond-Tweed separate house rents are the highest in the state outside of Sydney, while the vacancy rates in the Northern Rivers

are comparable to Sydney. And whereas the median household income averages out at around \$35,000 per annum, with rent constituting around 45% of that amount, in Sydney the figure is \$60,000 per annum, with rent constituting 33% of that amount. Byron Bay traffic about access, not bypass: Council

Byron Shire Council says that, according to the findings from the Main Road 545 (MR545) traffic study, Byron Bay's traffic solution is about access not a bypass.

Byron Shire Council's director of asset management services, Phil Holloway, said in a press release last week that the MR545 study found over 80% of vehicles enter and stay within Byron Bay for at least three hours with most staying longer.

'The MR545 Study shows Byron Bay town is the destination for most vehicles and therefore improved access to and traffic distribution within the town centre, is required, not a bypass of it,' Mr Holloway said. 'A true bypass would serve a minority of travellers and is hard to justify in terms of cost-to-benefit and attracting the necessary approvals and funding.'

The MR545 Study recommends a second rail crossing that links Butler Street to Marvell Street via the old emergency rail crossing and a new roundabout at Jonson and



Marvell Street. 'The location of the second rail crossing is the key to successful traffic flow movement,' Mr Holloway said. 'The study shows that the further south a new access point is provided, the less traffic it will attract and therefore not alleviate the congestion and lack of traffic movement most notable at peak times such as Christmas and Easter.'

In receiving and noting the report, Council resolved as a matter of urgency to seek the necessary state approvals and write to the Minister for Transport and Roads.

Byron Shire staff will also be meeting with the Australian Rail Track Corporation to discuss the option of a second rail crossing. State authority approval for the second rail crossing is required prior to the works being undertaken.

Council also requested staff to prepare a report on the development application and design work previously undertaken for the option known as the 'mini bypass'.

'Encouragingly, the RTA welcomed the study and is accepting of its conclusions,' Mr Holloway said.

The MR545 study looked at

the current demands (2008) versus the future needs (2018 and 2028) of the 19 kilometre long transport corridor from the Pacific Highway interchange at Ewingsdale Road to the Ballina Shire boundary.

Consultants engaged for the study, Opus, reviewed and modelled the number of vehicles the road carries, the origin and destination of traffic, vehicle traffic times and intersection capacity at key points along the corridor.

'The MR545 Study had a broader scope than previous studies and looked at the needs of the road corridor, considered potential future developments and has provided direction regarding the role of park and ride and car parking,' Mr Holloway said.

Byron Shire staff will also prepare a report to Council on the potential for Park and Ride and explore the role car parking can have in improving the amenity of Byron Bay.

Cameron calls for return to rail

Byron Shire Councillor Basil Cameron has released a discussion paper called Getting On Track, examining existing transport links in northern NSW and setting out a case for regional commuter trains and a rail link to Queensland.

Commenting on the NSW government's cross border transport report, which recommended sticking with buses rather than returning the rail service, Cr Cameron said, 'Our region deserves better than to have to wait three years for

such a shallow document, especially as the lack of rail services is contributing to major congestion and safety issues within the region.

'We need a better balance of regional and national interests in the development of cross border transport links and that means councils across the region are going to have to continue to work together to ensure our future transport networks are sustainable and provide maximum benefits to the community.'





Transports of delight

According to the latest report on the much-studied Byron Bay traffic flow – if flow is the right word for a pace often slower than treacle – 80% of vehicles enter and stay within Byron Bay for at least three hours with most staying longer. This observation in the category of the bleeding obvious – it is a tourist destination, after all – gives ammunition to those who say a bypass will not solve the town's traffic woes.

However the report by consultants Opus for Byron Shire Council does recommend a second rail crossing linking Butler Street to Marvell Street via the old emergency rail crossing and a new roundabout at Jonson and Marvell Street. This will give some hope that the primary congestion where Shirley, Lawson and Jonson Streets congeal at the roundabout is lessened, and give commuters a chance to scoot around the visitor queue. Despite Councillors voting to lobby the state government on getting this 'mini-bypass' up, no-one should be too excited about jackhammers tearing up the bitumen very soon.

Opus's study of Main Road 545 (MR545) – the stretch from the Pacific Highway interchange at Ewingsdale Road to the Ballina Shire boundary – looked at other issues besides bypasses, park-and-ride among them. Given that traffic on Ewingsdale Road is likely to be slowed down by a series of roundabouts out as far as McGettigans Lane, it might be easier to take a shuttle bus to town. The cost estimates for road improvements along the length of MR545 range from a low of \$8.6 million to a high of \$17.4m – another reason to expect not too much to happen at once.

Opus's modelling shows that, out to 2028, tourists will continue to provide most of the traffic (63.4%) followed by Belongil Residential (12.6%), BayShore Village development and the commercial rezoning of south Jonson Street (6.2%). As the consultants point out, however, forward planning will be affected by 'real life uncertainties such as the current economic downturn, fuel prices, variations in tourist travel, and the like...'. We might also mention the possible impact of climate change, or swine flu for that matter. The biggest uncertainty could be Council's ability to get a measure of consensus from the community on what options should be favoured.

Opus will not win many friends among lobbyists for the restoration of the Casino-Murwillumbah rail link with this suggestion: 'If heavy rail use of the rail corridor is permanently abandoned, the remnant corridor could operate as combined cycle and public transport route. As the spine of a public transport route, it could be adapted and extended to provide a local network for public transport vehicles separated from the road traffic.'

'Therefore the rail corridor should be considered a potential future transport and communication asset for the local community and not alienated by inappropriate development after its abandonment.'

Coincidentally the state government's Cross Border Transport Taskforce on the rail link notes that 'a determination on the future of the Casino-Murwillumbah rail line would enable Byron Shire Council to finalise and proceed with appropriate plans to address significant and increasing traffic congestion in Byron Bay township'. That view hangs on the 'determination' being to close the line and the Rail Infrastructure Corporation's so-far rigid view that it would require a bridge or underpass for a second rail crossing 'if the line were to be kept available'. Is this a carrot being held out to Council to fall in line with the state government's plan to keep the line closed?

No doubt more carrots (and sticks) will follow, along with plenty of debate within the community on the future of local transport. Ladies and gentlemen, start your engines!

Kevin is messing with our minds

During the 2007 election campaign Kevin Rudd announced that he planned to have a bit of fun messing with John Howard's mind.

As became clear on polling day, few voters begrudged Kevin07 this harmless diversion; indeed, the majority laughed along with him.

But two years later they could be forgiven for having their doubts; perhaps they should have stopped him while there was still time. The Prime Minister now seems to enjoy messing with the collective mind of the entire electorate.

It was never going to be easy to explain that the best way to deal with a downturn caused at least partly by profligate spending and lack of saving and investment was by handing out money. Orthodox economists applauded the prompt stimulus, but it still defied common-sense, especially after Treasurer Wayne Swan started talking about the need for a harsh and unpopular budget.

The problem was compounded when Rudd followed up by announcing the biggest infrastructure program in history, \$43 billion for a broadband network. Doubters were quickly directed to the fine print: this was not all going to be government spending, the private sector was to be involved as well. In fact the government might be up for a mere \$22 billion or so.

And in any case once the network was up and running the government would sell its share, so in a sense it shouldn't be counted as public spending at all. But if it was it was good public spending because it created infrastructure and therefore jobs.

Not entirely convinced, the punters resumed listening to Swan and Finance Minister

Lindsay Tanner warning of the hard times ahead and the need for swingeing cuts and draconian discipline – and then Rudd unveiled a defence program which involved spending squillions on imported weaponry to deal with a situation which might or might not occur some 20 years in the future.

In the meantime, Swan explained, there would not be

spring instantly to mind. But has there ever been a less likely candidate for popular acclaim than the late unlamented Richard Pratt?

This is a man who stole – yes, stole – hundreds of millions from ordinary Australians to finance one of the most self-indulgent lifestyles of the century. And he admitted it: when he died he was facing criminal charges which the prosecution

followed the Columbian drug lord Pablo Escobar, but while Escobar gave to the poor, Pratt was more inclined to subsidise the hobbies of the rich. It must be doubted that too many of those who paid extra for the cardboard around their cornflakes were regular patrons of Opera Australia.

It should be noted that, when finally sprung, Pratt returned his Order of Australia; now his claque of devotees want it back, to cancel any shred of remorse the corporate criminal might have exhibited. This is in sharp contrast to their eagerness to strip the honours from another fallen idol, the former Judge Marcus Einfeld.

Einfeld was rightly jailed for perjury and other offences, but in material terms the damage he inflicted on the public was very small; compared to the depredations of Pratt it was unnoticeable.

Einfeld, too, did a great many praiseworthy things in his life; he was formerly regarded as a living national treasure. But none of the famous and powerful who gave him the accolade want to know him today. In particular the Jewish establishment, so unstinting in its embrace of Pratt, has dumped Einfeld like a stale pork sausage.

Perhaps it is because he was not as enthusiastic and generous a supporter of the Zionist cause as Pratt, and he was less charismatic in other ways; his mistress was not as glamorous as Pratt's and of course, he didn't die of cancer. But it is hard not to suspect that the real difference is simply that he didn't have as much money, even if a lot of Pratt's really belonged to other people. Wealth may not buy happiness, or even votes, but you can't beat it if you're after instant adulation.

■ Re your lead story on aerial spraying last week – words like 'biodegradable' may reassure some but I, for one, won't be volunteering for dune care work where spraying has occurred.

In 1997 I prepared a review of glyphosate herbicide for the Byron Environment Centre newsletter. We soon received a letter from Monsanto stating:

'Certain information in the article is considered by Monsanto to be false or misleading. If you are not prepared to remove the article from the website please contact...'

We wrote back 'To date our investigations of the article under challenge have failed to identify any "false or misleading" information, as claimed by you. Please supply details of any corrections you think are required.' They never replied, so we don't know what offended them so much. Maybe it was the following:

'There have... been an increasing flow of reports, mostly from North America, that the active ingredient [of Roundup], glyphosate, can and does:

- bioaccumulate in plant parts,
- get washed into water-courses attached to sediment,
- have potential to cause chromosomal damage and tumours,
- reduce nodulation and

hence nitrogen uptake by legumes (cloves, beans etc),

- persist in 'the environment and in plants for long periods.'

It's time Council and agencies like Parks stopped using herbicides.

■ The juxtaposition of adjacent page articles (*Echo*, April 21) on aerial spraying for Bitou and a warning on mozzie-borne viruses are not unrelated. There is a prima facie case that poorly functioning immune systems are less able to provide immunity to insect attack and that aerial spraying will pollute people. The authors of climate change and the threateners of life on this planet, technologically dependent *Homo sapiens*, have no idea how much Roundup can be taken in by people so that it will not compromise immune systems. Nor do they know with certainty how long it remains in the air

or how far it travels.

But that risk may be entirely unnecessary. It is possible that Littoral rainforest gradually supplants Coastal Heath and that Bitou acts as a natural stage of seral succession to forest where the former, because of rampancy, is able to lay down more organic matter for soil improvement to support rainforest, than the low growing Coastal Heath.

Further, the society itself has not the concern for Bitou that aerial spraying implies. If it had there would be regular teams of volunteers overcoming it bit by bit by tree plantings protected from weeds until the trees shaded enough for the Bitou to no longer be a problem. Strong Littoral rainforest does not harbour Bitou.

Unlike wholesale spraying, the gradual approach incorporates the rarely heeded precautionary principle.

Council in action

Good science

In *The Echo* of April 21, Sapoty Brook wrote on the Carbon Emergency that seabed drilling at past atmospheric CO₂ levels of 400ppm to 450ppm, the Western Antarctic Ice Sheet was completely melted and that we will reach 400ppm in six years. This is scary stuff, but is it justified to state this as if it was a good science prediction?

Good science does not take two events that occur at the same time and make the assumption that one is the cause of the other, in fact it may well be that both events are the result of some other event or factor. Before we could see this information as telling us anything about our current situation we would need to know a lot more about what other climate change factors were present at that time of Earth's past. The tone of this letter is that the only cause of climate change is CO₂ concentrations whereas there is a vast amount of scientific knowledge regarding other major causes of climate change.

We would need to know for example if this was a time when the solar magnetic field was very strong and as a result was shielding Earth from the waves of cosmic radiation that have been shown to result in major cooling effects.

Jumping through employment hoops

Social security for the unemployed is already an authoritarian and paternalistic system and the current government's efforts to make it even more so, especially for youth, are likely to prove counter-productive to their aims.

Unemployment clients are already expected to jump through hoops – and imaginary hoops at that. Devices such as job search diaries I refer to as the tit grip and ball grabber clause because the DSS itself knows full well that the conditions laid down are impossible to fulfil but it allows them to call in anyone at will and hassle them at their leisure at any time.

This causes resentment among the clients and often causes them to expend all their energies and ingenuity in at-

tempts to outmanoeuvre the system.

I can remember asking one of my handlers when I was an unemployment beneficiary just how many vacancies were registered with her organisation per month. I was told a couple of labouring jobs and couple of commission sales jobs (and commission selling jobs is a form of bondage rather than a 'real job' after all).

Believe it or not I once worked for the CES at Balgowlah. At that time every CES had a person (I forget their designated title) who spent their entire day matching vacancies with clients, free to both client and employer. Due to this system many employers registered jobs with the agency.

For ideological reasons the Howard government privatised

the employment system by first castrating the CES by reducing staff numbers. Naturally, the most useful member of the staff – the job matcher – was the first to go.

The government then claimed that the system was inefficient – as all their efforts had gone into making it so this was hardly surprising and both the DSS and the private employment agencies degenerated into being the dole police.

The Howard government created a top-heavy clumsy system of enormous expense to the taxpayer which achieves very little as it doesn't change people's attitude to work – those who want to work will find jobs – it is cheaper in the long run to let those who don't want to work alone as the cost

of the whole superstructure forcing them to go through the motions is more expensive than just allowing them to create their own existence as they wish.

After all it is the greed generated by the Protestant work ethic that is one of the key factors destroying the world environment – people who are willing to live on loss should be rewarded not punished. It should also be kept in mind that the dole given without too many questions was the greatest stimulus to the arts ever given by any government at any time.

Unfortunately with Therese Rein making so much money out of the current system it is unlikely to change.

Get out on the streets

Can Byron Shire march for something? Like a clean green grid? It's time for us to lead once again, to get out in the streets, and here's why.

The suggestion that Australia could not afford to replace its coal-fired power stations has been revealed to be complete rubbish. The nation has spent since January several times the money required in cash handouts and commitments to longer term infrastructure spending, not to mention handouts to industry. The money allocated to assist big business in the carbon trading scheme alone would be sufficient to bridge the gap that may occur between savings on coal-not-burnt and returns from investment in renewable generation. The other moneys spent dwarf these requirements.

What this means is that we have finally actually won. The logical way forward is to begin building the solar and tidal facilities we need and can produce through the Australian manufacturing industry. At this point the coal industry is standing in

the way of a major rebirth of Australian manufacturing, the solving of the greenhouse effect as this manufacturing goes global, clean air, and your job. This is the stimulus package we can afford.

Because of its returns over the long term there are no issues around the harrowing and dreadful repayment of debt. Renewables at this point are quite simply the most sensible investment option available to Australians, and an ideal place for superannuation funds. Given the incapacity of super funds to return consistent profits to members in recent years the new facility should prove particularly attractive.

The way forward with this is to commit firstly to buy electricity at a set 2009 price for thirty years, the life of the construction and finance packages. The second stage is to ban the importation and manufacture of the internal combustion engine in Australia while encouraging other countries to join us. The third stage is a simple transference of government

policy that will save households literally thousands of dollars a year and improve the business climate in Australia: abandon monetary policy as a means of controlling inflation.

The fourth stage involves a regulation of banking in a more detailed process centred around the separation of housing and commercial finance and the return of banking to a service industry from its current position as a dominant market parasite. All of these things are actually easy to achieve. There are no technical issues opposing either the development of the clean green grid or the interchangeable battery vehicles (IBVs). These are purely matters requiring legislation. The latter two points of the program are similarly straightforward. What is required is public desire, political will, and political/economic intelligence. It is to be hoped that the Rudd government possesses sufficient of these to move forward.

rorist group was involved in the wholesale murder of civilians including children. In 1948 the Irgun emerged from the underground and formed the Herut Party, a forerunner of today's Likud Party in the newly formed state of Israel. That year after Begin's visit to the US a letter was published which described Begin's Herut party 'as closely akin in its organisation, methods, political philosophy and social appeal to the Nazi and Fascist parties'. This letter was signed by Albert Einstein who opposed the formation of a Jewish state.

Herut's ultra nationalistic irredentist policies represent the cornerstone of the Palestinian problem which exists today whereby the expulsion of all non-Jews from Palestine is the core agenda. Add to this the contemporary religious extremism of the likes of Rabbi Abraham Kook whose influential teachings include ideas based on the Talmud and taught at Mirkaz Harav Judaic religious college. Choreographer and former solo artist for the Australian Ballet, Robyn Brawley, was one of the adjudicators at the performance boards event.



girls. It gave them the freedom to dance from the heart.



The wallum offers a cone of fragrant blossoms

My friend and I both noticed the dwarf wallum (*Banksii* species).

'Isn't it wonderful how they are blooming right now?' she said. 'And they have all the old blooms and the old seed heads still on their branches too?'

Giving up the light and heat of summer isn't all that bad if the wallum will burst into flower. Here around the Byron headland, on the ridge of the Arakwal heathland, there's still a whiff of what the Bundjalung people call 'honeysuckle country'. The dwarf *Banksii* species and the taller ones have all been existing for some 40 million years. It's a deep pleasure to get to know them here where they flourish still, in their own sanctuary.

The hard dark cones have small gaping holes. These are what's left after the pods open and the ripe seeds have gone. I was surprised to learn that the seeds would have ripened for a full year and these cones can be still attached to the plant for much longer.

We looked closer at the green soft spikes where the

newest flowers were growing. Each 'bristle' is a flower which will soon open and drip with nectar. Some of the spikes are more advanced and already blooming.

There was some scent on the wind. Maybe it went to our heads.

'Imagine having all the growth and blossoms and seeds of your life exposed to everyone for years like these *Banksii*,' I said, a bit dreamily. 'We are so unlike plants!'

Vegetation startles me. Unlike me, plants stay still. They send roots down into the dark in one direction, reach for the sun in the other. Unexpectedly, the thought occurs to me that our projects in life are much like plants.

Fanciful yes, but my work is much like this wallum. As a biologist and writer, I have been part of project after project year after year. New growth, different blossoms, some broken off, some surviving. Some becoming seeds ripening, some scattering finally on the wind.

My latest project is, of course, producing regular articles for *The Echo*. Over the past two years, this has required I



put down roots while soaking up sun. The 53 articles, with hundreds of photos are now a DVD produced by John Giles. Artwork by Favian Sansom. There is even a slideshow with solo piano by Tim Shanasy. The launch is May 7 at 6pm at the Byron Bay Community Centre.

A cone of blossoms now ripe seeds about to burst open into the breeze. You're invited.

Oh I have been busy photosynthesising, er, I mean putting energy into organising the launch, writing, teaching students, holding everything else together. But I also did a

bit of digging down too. I read again a book I had loved when I was a girl.

I wasn't sure why I ordered *The Sword in the Stone* by T H White from the library. But by page 68, I knew I was in a curious process of self-renewal. Paragraphs that once caught my very young imagination were extra bold and vivid as I read them once again.

The wizard Merlin is teaching an unsuspecting future King Arthur, who is a young orphan of no account in Sir Ector's household. Merlin astonishes the boy by changing him into a fish, a hunting bird, a snake, an owl and a badger. He spirits him away on adventures with knights and giants and even Robin Hood and Maid Marion, who stalks and shoots arrows as well as any woodsman.

The boy is delighted. He even gets to listen to trees talking. Time races, a year passing every two seconds, and he hears what different trees care about. In this adventure, as with others, there is much he doesn't quite understand in all the talking. But he glad to 'leap along in their wake, jumping

at meanings, guessing, clutching at known words... he had the glee of the porpoise then, pouring and leaping through strange seas.'

Don't the world's stories fascinate me, though even now I still don't understand much! Who wouldn't want to be some other creatures for a while and change back again? Back then, as a girl, I wondered. How could this magic happen to me too?

It's not simply facts that inspire a person to get into the sciences. I bet it's not only feelings that draw a person into the arts. It's not just the material world we experience, or only the living people we touch or that touch us.

If my Byron writing project is a cone of seeds about to scatter, well it's also a magic experience. It develops in this community of people and other species. Time weaves back and forth. Perspectives alter again and again. It's mine, then ours, then yours forever. You are so much a part of it. You are it completely. Thank you. Thank you again.

Byron Council's coastal retreat policy is indefensible

Byron Council's Greens' glass is always half empty. Their alarmist and pessimistic outcries about possible future climate are acting as a ball and chain on Council's planning policies.

At last week's Council meeting, on the urging of BEACON representative, Dailan Pugh, Council deferred the Draft Belongil Creek Flood Study to allow for a further report that considers even more extreme flood levels and all the constraints of Climate Change Scenario 4. It seems that only

a planning flood level of Biblical proportions across the residential areas of Byron Bay will satisfy Mr. Pugh. Climate Change Scenario 4 is where we all go to live on top of Mount Chincogan.

Mr Pugh's pessimism is well known to readers of *The Echo*. In April 2006 he wrote, 'After a six thousand year standstill, sea-levels are on the rise again due to the thermal expansion of the seas as they warm and the melting of the world's terrestrial ice-masses'. More recently he wrote, 'The seas off Byron are rising at an accelerating rate due to



the expansion of the warming waters and melting of terrestrial ice masses', - 'worldwide seas rose 17cm last century, with estimates of rises for this century many times this.' Etc etc.

Rest easy, Mr Pugh, the ice is continuing to grow in the East Antarctic and despite the recent sea level rise the dune north of Belongil Creek has been stable for 6,000 years, growing and moving seaward over the last 100 years.

Sea level changes

If you take just a little trouble to do a little bit of research, you find that sea-levels have not been at a 'standstill'. In fact you find that during the last 6,000 years sea levels at Byron Bay have been 1.8 metres higher than current levels and have been on average one metre higher in four out of the five millennium periods. The fact that Byron Bay's current dune has withstood higher sea levels and significant weather events in the recent past has significant planning implications which the Greens would prefer us to ignore. As an example, the intensity of the 1974 cyclone has been established as a one in a 500 to 1,000 year event. If you want the referenc-

es, I will gladly provide them. Further and most importantly you also find that the past rise and fall in sea levels do not necessarily correspond to higher temperatures or lower temperatures in this period. Yes, higher temperatures in the past have corresponded with falling sea levels!

Mr Pugh is also worried about the defence of the Byron Bay township. He states: 'Our disappearing dunes are already an incomplete line of defence.' Belongil residents agree the narrow dune is Byron's vital first line of defence during significant weather events. However, climate change is not the culprit for the recent demise of the Belongil dune. The culprit is Council's 1.2ha of pool, car park and rock protection works that the Council plunked into the sea in the 1960s and 1970s. Council was alerted by various government departments at the time of the likely impact of these works on Belongil Beach but chose to ignore the warnings. Now they have hitched their star onto climate change as an 'out'.

Ice mass expands

There's good news for Mr Pugh's concern about melting ice. The recent Scientific Committee on Antarctic Research report has found that the larger East Antarctic ice mass has expanded and the ice is now 10% thicker than it was in 1950s, thus more than compensating for the changes in the West.

When I pointed out these various facts at the Council meeting Mr Pugh interjected saying 'rubbish!' Well Mr Pugh, the relevant graph of historic sea levels is shown above. Sea levels were higher (~1m) but air temperatures were cooler than present (from 3500 to 1500 yrs BP). Note the warmer

phases 4300 to 3800 and 5500 yrs cal BP.

In another recent letter, Mr Pugh was alarmed that the 'Council is now intending to decimate the 20 year old policy of planned retreat in response to coastal recession - these are not the actions you would expect from a Green Council.'

He also stated: 'Due to major coastal erosion associated with a cyclonic period in the 50s, 60s and 70s, the Department of Public Works [PWD] assessed coastal recession trends and mapped those areas likely to be eroded over the next 50 and 100 years. Council then included the erosion precincts into its Development Control Plan (DCP) as part of "planned retreat" in 1988.'

PWD got it wrong

It is now very apparent the PWD simply got it wrong. The 1978 PWD report used to justify the 1988 coastal planning instruments was said to be wrong by experts at the time and thirty years later the resulting 'retreat policy' is still indefensible. The long-term erosion trends the PWD mapped just reflected the recent coastal realignment caused by Council's seaside structures.

In 2004 Council resolved to keep the artificial headland created by these works; it has also been recommended that this may involve a rebuilding and expansion. This policy threatens to continue to further the realignment of Belongil Beach, posing a further threat to all low lying areas of town, now protected by the dune.

At the meeting of April 23 Council considered a staff report on the Belongil Flood Study, which stated: 'Whilst the Study does not consider coastal erosion in general, it is noted that while the town is severely affected by flooding under Cli-

mate Change, the town is also at risk from severe coastal erosion under Climate Change.'

And importantly it noted, 'This issue needs further consideration and discussion as it may affect the long term viability of the Byron Bay town centre, without the construction of significant infrastructure. This issue would be considered by a Floodplain Management Plan, however, this stage is some years away and Council may wish to begin discussions sooner rather than later.'

Belongil residents can only agree about the urgency and urge Council to consider these important planning issues.

Watch out for echidnas on the move, says NPWS

North coast drivers are being reminded to be alert for echidnas which move around more at this time of year.

National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) Community Relations Ranger, Lisa Walker, said that wildlife carers have had a dramatic increase in the number of calls in the past few weeks about echidnas being injured or killed on local roads.

'Motorists need to keep an eye out for these unique little creatures,' Ms Walker said.

'Autumn is a busy time for echidnas when young ones are dispersing to new territories.'

'In late winter the more mature male echidnas also become active in readiness for the breeding season.'

'This signals the time when the female echidna releases a pheromone that attracts the

males. She is then pursued by her male admirers who can be seen following on behind her. This is called an echidna train.'

'Echidna trains can last anywhere up to six weeks before mating happens. During this time the echidnas can be seen walking, foraging and resting together and this is when they are most vulnerable on our roads.'

The most likely time to catch

sight of echidnas is around dusk or dawn when they're out foraging, although in cooler weather they can also be out in the middle of the day.

'Echidnas don't like to get hot and, depending on the temperature, they'll change from day active to night active.'



ONE OF THE BIG NAMES IN REGGAE ON THE NORTH COAST IS RAZ BIN SAM, AND HIS NEW CD IS OUT THIS WEEK - OWN THIS LIFE. THE LAUNCH IS AT THE BEACH HOTEL THIS SATURDAY.

'I have always been playing music, mainly writing songs and lyrics,' he says. 'The Lion I band started four years ago, and before that I was trying to get a committed group together. In the beginning of 2005, I gave myself six months to finish the album I was working on (*Bin Tote Too*), before moving to Melbourne to find myself a band. About two weeks later I met a couple of the Lion I members, and they invited me for a jam and we've been together ever since.'

What made you move here?

'Surfing. I have been here nine years and was coaching at Black Dog Surfing for six years, and still surf almost every day. Initially it was for a three month surf trip with friends. I fell in love with Australia and wanted to stay.'

What drew you to the one drop?

'I have been listening to reggae forever - my parents listen to reggae, among other music. It was played at home on a daily basis - Bob Marley, Burning Spear. I really feel connected to the message and the way reggae artists use the lyrics. It's about life, love, religion, keeping it real and telling your story.'

Raz is no Rasta

'I don't sing conventional reggae, I am a Jew and an Israeli, and my main message is to give the Jew and Israeli a better name; to shed some clarity and light on the Middle East situation. I respect other people and their religion and their belief.'

'I believe in one God and that love is the golden rule. The biblical God - that is for the Christian, the Jews and the Muslim, are all one. According to the book, we are the sons and daughters of Abraham the father. My band members are all from different religions - Muslim and Christian, and I am a Jew. We all get along greatly!'

Perceptions of Jews and Israel are often mixed he says.

'I came across people in Australia that

have a judgemental opinion about Israelis. They would say things like "you kill the Palestinians." "Well I don't kill anyone - I even escaped compulsory Israeli military service for that reason.'

It is a complex and often misunderstood socio-political-religious situation in Israel, according to Raz. The media's short grab reporting of an event is often not explored in depth.

'The same people that watch the news and build an opinion on what they watch - and then criticise - these are the people I want to reach. The majority of Israelis want to share and prosper on the land, and having peace in that part of the world would boost the economy. I believe that the same goes for the majority of Palestinians. Unfortunately we have extremists on both sides, and the sad fact of blood revenge running through generations. Jerusalem is the centre of the biblical world, and is to be shared by all people and all religions. Jesus's tomb and the Western Wall are three minutes walk from each other.'

For some reason, Jews and being Jewish has a bad connotation, according to Raz.

'There is no reason for it - people are people, no matter colour, race and religion. There is good and bad in all of those. It shouldn't be generalised and globalised. In my songs I want to reach Jews all over the world who are afraid and ashamed of being who they are. Religion for me is like a tool; it is to be a better person (ie the Ten Commandments). These tools were created over thousands of years by highly spiritual people. Judaism is my roots. I question it all the time and some people don't need religion to better themselves. There are things that I don't agree with 100%, however I take in what I find positive and constructive and use that to become a better person with myself and for others. The new album is about much of this - and the way forward is love, education and consideration. No man is better than another. Bless.'

Mandy Nolan



I was free to give birth. We rang the Mullum Hospital. 'You're lucky we just sent two women home who thought they were in labour but weren't'. Lucky alright, if I got up there and didn't get a shot at the birth pool there would have been a bitch fight. I may be a feminist, but three women in a birth pool is just a little too cosy. 'Excuse me, is that my placenta or yours?' I'm not a drug free birther. I like to go the gas. I'm in the bath hallucinating with pain and I make my nitrous request. The midwife, who was very adorable, informed me there was none, and offered me affirmations instead. 'You're doing so well! I had a small moment of panic: those bloody hippies have tricked me into a natural birth! Naked, and about 9cm dilated, I decided it wasn't the time for a tantrum. I fell into the pain and followed it. I used my voice to make a noise that I don't think I could make again. Except for my next Brazilian. The roaring was my only relief. And it was extraordinarily effective. I think roaring may even be better than gas. I thanked god I wasn't married to Tom Cruise and was left with the solace of biting on a sock. Ivy was born around 2.30pm. We think. The clock wasn't working properly. Which in Mullumbimby is a sueable offence. What if my daughter never knows her rising sign?

What if she's the only kid in the class who hasn't had her chart done? We called our daughter Ivy Mae Elizabeth Stevens. Named after maternal and paternal grandmothers - a small human legacy to the memory of our old women. I rang my nanna, Ivy. At 93 and blind she lives independently and hasn't lost a dot of her memory. She's a courageous, at times tactless but warm and extraordinary woman who I often use for inspiration: she's the one that offered me the family strap to discipline my kids, loves John Laws but hates injustice, who sits and entertains a constant stream of friends and animals and kids through the tiny home where she has lived for 70 years. It's the kind of place Diane Arbus would have paid top dollar for a photo shoot. I told my nan we had called our baby Ivy. She said 'Get out of here. You didn't. What an honour. Oh Mandy, you've done me proud. When I die, she'll be there to remember me by. I think I have to go now and have a cry.' So Mandy the super overachiever takes a break. I am now in that blissful breastfeeding land where thoughts start but never finish, tea is made but never drunk hot, and a whole day's output is just one load of washing. It's wonderful. (Tune in next week for episode one of *Matriarchal Jones and the Evil Hormone Plunge*.)

we take it to the dump. The car was loaded and ready to go. The cramps had started. I timed them at two minutes apart. But it was OK, I could still talk. Still time to tip it. By Myocum, contractions were a minute apart and getting more intense. With a history of births under two hours, and a whole recycling system to negotiate, and a stench that had me writhing, I made a quick decision. Pull out. I am committed to the concept of responsible waste management but I wasn't about to give birth there and have to pay extra on the car weigh-in on the way out. My partner looked relieved, although he thought we should call our daughter Tippi. Next job: sort the kids. After four phone calls I found a friend to come and be with my children. As luck would have it, none of the people who I'd lined up could make it. For a minute I thought I was going to have to give birth with the kids sitting around going, 'Are we there yet?' 'Shut up mum, we can't hear the telly.' An available girlfriend was located.

IVY'S STORY

Last Friday April 24 I pushed my fourth child, a brand new baby daughter, into the world. In just one push she was delivered, head to toe, still in her sac. A friend of mine remarked that it's just how horses give birth. I didn't mention that I had to chew her free, and in just five minutes she was up and we were galloping around the grassy fields outside the birth centre. Even after four shots at it, I am still humbled by the amazing human process, that as a woman, with a little bit of help, I can make people. The day started like most others, with me wandering the streets and people remarking: 'wow, still pregnant?' I was beginning to feel like a self-inflating camping mattress without the plug, just taking on more air, engorging to the point where bending over was a conceptual activity and thongs my only form of footwear. Friday morning I had taken one last look at the rubbish in my garage and given my partner the orders: 'It has to go. Today






CHESS by Ian Rogers

Play at Byron Services Club, Mon 7-10pm

For half a century, the Soviet Union was the dominant chess power and only a tiny trickle of defectors and émigrés were able to leave the communist empire and compete under other flags - most notably world title challenger Viktor Korchnoi and World Champion Boris Spassky.

When the USSR split into 15 pieces in 1990/1, many ex-Soviet Grandmasters took the opportunity to leave for greener pastures. Many countries gained a new ex-Soviet as their number one; these included Spain, Germany, Belgium and, controversially, Slovenia, who lured Alexander Beliavsky from the Ukrainian team without requiring him to change his country of residence. Australia also benefited, Irina Berezina becoming the leader of our Olympic women's team.

Earlier this decade the world body FIDE made country transfer rules quicker and easier - although far more expensive - resulting in some Grandmasters spruiking their services to the highest bidder. Subsequent Olympiads have seen Bulgarian

veteran Evgeny Ermenkov leading the Palestinian team (despite his political sympathies being with Israel) and Mikhail Gurevich moving (again) from Belgium to Turkey.


Last month saw another two prominent Grandmasters making unexpected changes of allegiance. Most attention was focussed on Sergey Karjakin's decision to leave his native Ukraine and play for the old colonial power, Russia.

Karjakin, pictured, who earned the Grandmaster title at age 12 (still a record) claimed that he did not have enough financial support in the Ukraine and wished to work with better coaches. Karjakin plans to move to Moscow and work with Garry Kasparov's old mentor, Yuri Dokhoian, who has a contract with the Russian Chess Federation preventing him from working with foreigners.

Karjakin's move has received a mixed reaction - not surprising in a country where political battles are often fought between the Ukrainian and Russian-speaking parts of the population. But if Karjakin's decision was a surprise, Ivan Sokolov's announcement that he would in future be representing Bosnia rather than Holland came as a complete shock. Sokolov, 40, moved to the Netherlands 15 years ago during the Yugoslav wars and has since won two Dutch Championships and become the most successful player in the history of the Dutch club competition. Concurrently Sokolov has frequently battled with the Dutch Chess federation over appearance fees and skipped the 2008 Dresden Chess Olympics. So when the Bosnians sent out feelers - and a firm financial offer - Sokolov was happy to abandon the 'richer' Netherlands and begin representing a

country which he believed would provide him with more respect and resources. Notably, Sokolov has no desire to relocate back to Bosnia and will remain as a Dutch resident and citizen.

Chess migration patterns were once entirely predictable: east to west, with Grandmasters going from being a small fish in a big pond to becoming the murray cod of a chess puddle. However, Karjakin's and Sokolov's moves show that players seeking opportunity may find it anywhere in the world.

Love The Beast

If, like me, you would not know a carburettor from a Bunsen burner, it is highly unlikely that you'll be motivated to go and see Eric Bana's ode to his 1974 Ford Falcon XB Coupe. Which is a real shame, for this is the loveliest of docos. Bana has had the car since he was a teenager. The day he got it was a dream come true for him and, despite the glamour, fame and wealth showered on him by Hollywood, he still cherishes it. He drove it in the five-day Targa Tasmania rally in 1996 and, again with his mate Tony as navigator, entered it in the 2007 event. Once or twice the rally sequences get a bit repetitive, but they are compensated for with beautiful scenic photography, the full-on commitment conveyed by Bana and Tony and some genuinely scary footage, from behind the windscreen, of competitors losing control and going off the road at high speed (making the 'fun' of smash-ups in movies such as

Wolverine look exactly like what they are – total bullshit). It is low budget and rough around the edges – part of its effortless charm is that it makes you believe that you could make a movie, too – but it pushes no political or ideological barrow and is emotionally ingenuous. When Bana prangs the beast his grief is inconsolable. Two days later he is in New York, dressing for a premiere. He downs a beer, 'it makes the red carpet shorter', and is delivered by limo to the gala function where he is photographed with Drew Barrymore and fawned over by reporters from gossyglossies, one of whom tells him he has great hair – and all the time he is agonising over the totalled Coupe. Well paced and interspersed with relevant edits of conversations with fellow car maniacs Jeremy Clarkson and Jay Leno (whose automobile collection is awesome), and TV's Dr Phil, who speaks to Bana (and indirectly to us all) about the things that matter in our lives, and why they do – we



all have a red Coupe – it owes its success to the immensely likeable, unspoilt Bana, his mum and dad, wife and kids and rev head mates. Not in a million years did I think I would get weepy over a story about a bloke and his car – but that's because it is about so much more. As one of his buddies says, 'love is never wrong'. A little gem.







A TALE OF TWO BOOKS




About two and a half years ago Anthony Telford realised that he lacked a certain type of cookbook. He had – as most people in the hospitality industry have – shelf after shelf of gorgeous glossy food tomes at home filled with exquisite photography and a lot of recipes he would never actually cook. What he wanted was one book containing all those dishes – unremarkable, prosaic, but salt-of-the-earth-useful – he would cook time and time again, like marshmallows for the school fete of one of his innumerable offspring, for example. Or scones or frittata or banana cake. Of course for all these recipes there is the internet – but who has time, Anthony asked himself, to go wading through four hundred entries for meringues?

Thus was born *The Basics - A Really Useful Cookbook*. This is Anthony's second book, his follow-up to the exceedingly successful *The Kitchen Hand*, a slender volume packed full of information on culinary matters, a 'miscellany of kitchen wisdom', no less.

In fact, a hundred of the best pages were plucked from this reference guide and added to *The Basics*. What probably sets the new book apart from the scores of other cooking bibles around – Margaret Fulton's, Stephanie Alexander's, The Womens Weekly's increasingly stylish series – are the hints and tips appended to every recipe. Occupying an entire page, these are the extra morsels of information potentially invaluable to the cook, be they beginner or advanced. For example, alongside the recipe for mayonnaise, Anthony lists the equipment required; what to do in the event it 'splits'; the types of oil to use and why; a handful of variations on the theme – advice often critical to the outcome of the dish in question.

This is a chunky book calling out for splodges and splatterings of the work in progress. Completely devoid of visuals of any kind – no stylised food shots – it is engagingly down-to-earth, with typeface that gives the pages a sturdy, homely quality as if the recipes have



been bashed out on an old-fashioned typewriter. These are, moreover, recipes which hardly need to be graphically propped up; we all know how Chocolate Crackles should look, or Macaroni Cheese, or a Beef Casserole, or Garlic Prawns. The caption of the cover claims that *The Basics* is 'the only cookbook you will ever need': it's an ambitious claim but it

might just be true! Especially given its affordable price of \$35.

Eat Fresh - Cooking Through The Seasons by New Zealander Annabel Langbein is that other type of cookbook: good-looking and glamorous with page after page of sumptuous photography you could almost eat. As good-looking and glamorous, it could be said, as the author herself, whose culinary output in publishing terms is prodigious. This is the fourteenth book by the Auckland-based cook and food-writer, who has won many awards and gained international recognition for her earthy approach to cooking. Divided into the four seasons, it features recipes both cosy and sophisticated; offers – although not nearly to the extent of Anthony's – extra tips and variations alongside many of them; throws in amusing anecdotes along the way. Much of the gorgeous photography features Annabel herself looking irritatingly beautiful given she's the mother of teenagers and presumably as passionate about eating as she is about cooking. Then again, a calorie-consciousness pervades many recipes, rendering the book ideal for those (probably 99.9% of us) who want to have our cake and eat it too.


FAREWELL CASA PEPE

the element of serendipity is essential.



My most memorable brush with fame, however, is one that I still dine out on. It was October, 1976. I'd been in Turkey for a month. On a diet of bread, tomato, yoghurt and watermelon, supplemented by a torrential dose of the runs in Kayseri, I was as thin and nervy as a whippet.

The day was hot and smelly. At noon I was still in my undies, lying under a creaky ceiling fan in a cold water, naked light-bulb hotel in Istanbul, down near Aghia Sophia.

I became aware of a rhythmic chanting. It was distant but building.

'Ali

!...ali!'

Getting louder

'... ali! ... ali! ...

Constant and frenzied, until it sounded like it was right outside my fly-specked window.

'Ali! Ali!'

I had no idea what it was, but I threw on some clothes, grabbed my trusty Olympus camera and raced downstairs to find out.

It was Muhammad Ali.

A month earlier he had defeated Ken Norton to retain his heavyweight title and, having converted to the Nation of Islam in 1975, he was a hero to Moslems as well as Blacks and agit-prop white boys like me.

The local blokes were going bananas. I pushed and shoved and squeezed until I was about twenty metres from whatever the vehicle was that Ali was standing on. Through flailing arms I caught glimpses of him. Handsome, proud, taller than all around him.

I lifted the Olympus as high as I could, aimed it in his direction and snapped blind. Not having the benefit of the digital screen's instant gratification, I could only hope that I'd framed him in shot – it would be weeks before I discovered that I did.

The hotel manager was at the desk when I got back. He looked like the guard in 'Midnight Express' and I had previously been intimidated by him. Now he was different.

'Ali,' he beamed.

I nodded, just as pleased.

'Ali.'

Byron Shire Council's general manager and planning director met last week with Department of Planning honchos on the proposed West Byron land release and other issues. A report to Councillors will go to the meeting of May 14. We suspect the Department's view, channelled from the Minister, will be that Council should go ahead with preparing to rezone the land or the government will do it instead under the controversial section 3A of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act, which allows the Minister to declare almost anything to be of 'state significance'.
