

Twister trashes Lennox Head

A water spout came ashore at Lennox Head last Thursday, became a tornado and trashed houses and caravans. The state government declared a disaster, made more difficult by asbestos spread across the town.

Paramedics received multiple triple zero calls for assistance but there were few injuries despite the level of property damage.

Byron Shire SES Controller Noel McAviney said that there were some storm affected areas in the Shire, though nothing as devastating as Lennox Head.

'We ended up getting nine call-outs in total after the storm,' said Mr McAviney. 'We had two trees over cars. One of the cars had the back window smashed in and one was pretty badly damaged. Both of the cars were in Mullumbimby. The other seven calls we got were from people in the Suffolk Park area, mostly from people with water in their home.'

Mr McAviney said that the Byron SES had their hands full in their own backyard on Thursday but were able

to send teams to Lennox Head on Friday and Saturday to help out with the cleanup.

Fair Trading Minister Virginia Judge has warned storm victims to avoid unlicensed traders when carrying out repair work on their property. 'Unlicensed traders often target storm affected areas hoping to make a quick buck from vulnerable residents,' said Ms Judge on Thursday afternoon.

The Southern Cross Credit Union has kicked off a Lennox Head Tornado Appeal. In conjunction with the Lennox Head Chamber of Commerce, Southern Cross started a relief fund with a \$1,000 donation to the appeal.

'This small coastal town has immediately displayed its strong spirit by supporting affected residents,' said Neale Wilson from SCCU's Lennox Head branch. 'We have set up a dedicated account for donations.'

Anyone wishing to donate to the appeal can ask at any Southern Cross Credit Union branch across the Northern Rivers.

Mr Holmgren will also review permaculture as a design system specifi-

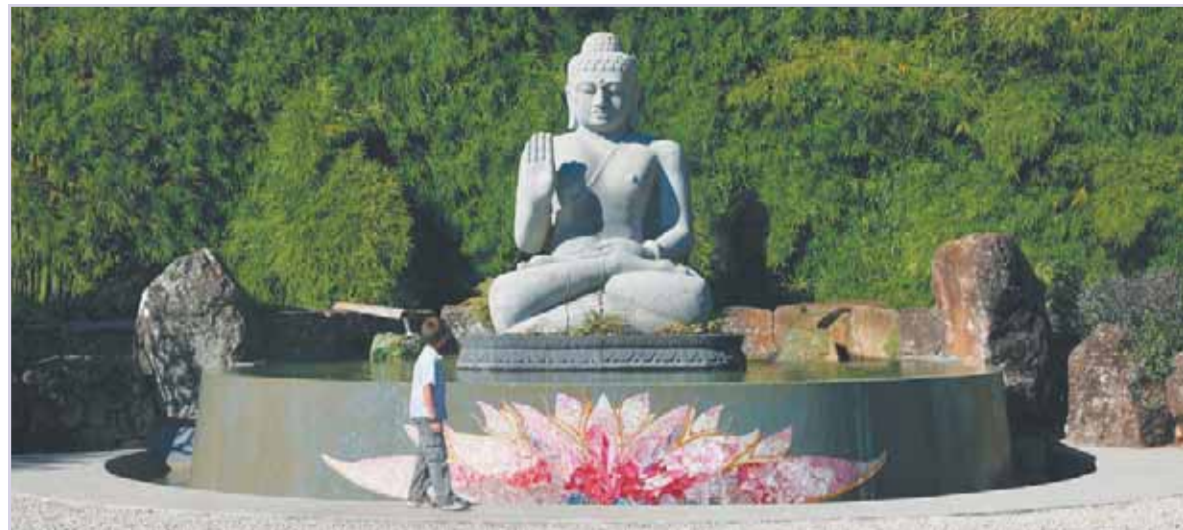
cally evolved over the last 30 years to creatively respond to futures that involve progressively less and less available energy.

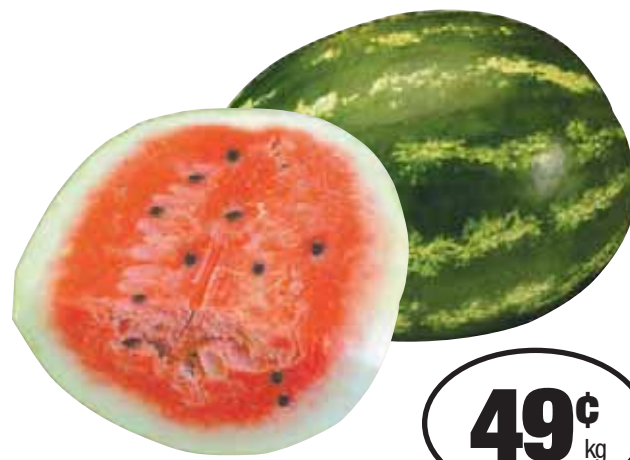

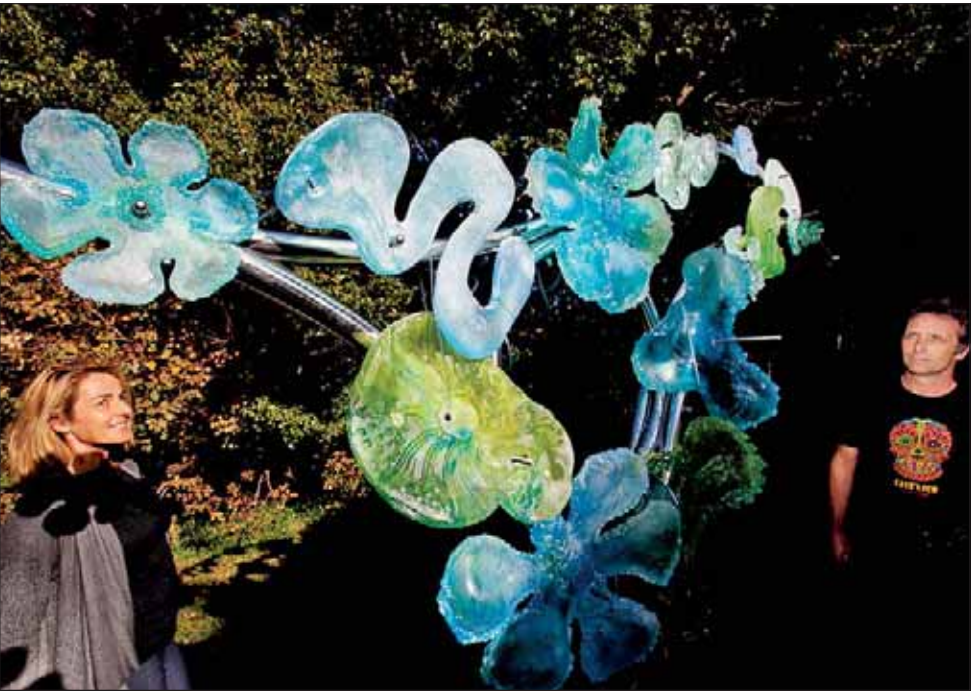

Dune care funding

Byron Shire Council has been awarded \$47,000 from the Northern Rivers Catchment Management Authority to continue the fight against coastal dune degradation. The funding will be used for contractors and Council staff to treat environmental weeds in areas of the shire not currently worked on by Dunecare groups.

Work areas include Cavanbah dunes (fronting Cavanbah Street), Belongil carpark areas, northern Seven Mile Beach and northern Suffolk Park.

The main weeds to be targeted under the funding program include Bitou, Lantana, Asparagus, Senna, Glory Lilly and Umbrella trees. Illegal campsites will be also be removed and rehabilitated and eroding sand stabilised.

NPWS to spray bitou

Weather permitting, bitou bush control in Brunswick Heads and Billinudgel nature reserves will commence on Thursday.

National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) pest management officer Lisa Wellman said that this is the second year Brunswick Heads and Billinudgel nature reserves have been targeted with aerial spraying.

'Brunswick Heads (north of the river) and Billinudgel nature reserves will be closed at the commencement of each scheduled spray day until the work is completed,' Ms Wellman said.

'The reserves will be re-opened daily if conditions are not suitable for spraying. The spraying itself should only take a few hours, but it is weather dependent so spraying may be delayed.

'Aerial spraying enables the control of bitou bush over a broad area, which would otherwise be extremely difficult.

'Two years of concentrated control at Cape Byron and Broken Head have seen expanses of Bitou Bush turn into healthy regenerating head-

lands. The control has been so successful in these reserves that aerial spraying is not required this year.

'The 2009 aerial spray in northern Brunswick Heads and Billinudgel nature reserves was also highly effective, with 90 per cent of bitou bush killed and no negative impacts on native species. Monitoring of the site has found that native plants have increased in size, number and variety on the foredune.

'A followup spray is crucial to enable native plants to continue reclaiming the sand dunes from the monoculture of bitou bush.

'Aerial spraying of bitou bush has been used effectively in NSW for over 20 years. Spraying is conducted in winter when the bitou bush is actively growing and the native plants are dormant.

'This results in the bitou bush absorbing the herbicide and dying while the native plants survive. A buffer zone will be put in place around threatened plants and waterways.'

Reg Byrnes sets the terms for his own farewell

Hundreds gathered on the lawn in front of the Brunswick Surf Life Saving Club on Saturday afternoon to celebrate the very full life of Reg Byrnes and to follow his last letter to the T.

Reg knew he was not long for this world, so he made sure the arrangements for his wake were clear and succinct, so there would be no mistakes made on the day, a point that thoroughly tickled guests at his final farewell.

Born Arthur Reginald Byrnes on August 4, 1926, at Mullumbimby Creek, he was known as Reg to most and 'Hookey' to many. Reg had his finger in just about every pie in the area and was a valued member of many clubs and committees in the shire. Reg was instrumental in the founding of both the Mt Chincogan Footrace and Fiesta and the Brunswick Heads Woodchop – some say he was the one who named it the Festival of the Fish and Chips.

Reg himself was proud to have been the last dairy farmer in the area to transport his produce by horse and cart from his property in Valances Road and to have been both the first and last nude swimmer in the old Mullumbimby pool.

Reg was also an avid author

fective in making sure those around him also got it right.

"To thine own self be true" is an old phrase but one that truly applies to Reg,' said mate Barry Hammond at the service. 'Reg was a man who always stood up for what he believed in. It would be impossible to come to the surf club and not feel Reg's presence.'

Barry went on to say that even though Reg was 'late in the marriage stakes', he had a very happy life with wife Betty whom he wed in 1975.

Ros Hogan from the Woodchop committee said that Reg's passing was a legend lost. She praised a man who gave thousands of hours to the festival.

SLSC president Craig Reid said 'Everyone knew that Reg was a legend, he saw a lot of summers on the beach.'

It was this loved beach that Reg chose as his final resting place.

Mark Edwards, who was MC for the event was very careful to follow Reg's last long set of written instructions very carefully: 'Make sure Rocky has the screwdriver. Get Rocky to open the ashes with the screwdriver. Get him to pour in some Toohey's. Spread some of the ashes over near Mossy's [David Moss' ashes under the old tower] but not on the path, I don't want to be trodden on.' And so on.

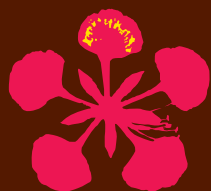

Protest targets Israel's flotilla raid

Protesters gathered in Byron Bay last Saturday to express their opposition to Israel's recent attack on an aid flotilla bound for Gaza. Organiser Gareth Smith told *The Echo*, 'We got 23 signatures to a letter to Kevin Rudd plus complaints to the police over the "offensive-ness" of our banners.'

'Interactions with Israelis were friendly, so unlike last September when two threatened to kill me had we been in Israel.'

The letter to PM Rudd reads in part: 'We the undersigned call on the Australian government to condemn in the harshest terms Israel's acts of piracy and murder in international waters of humanitarian aid activists.'

'The siege of Gaza violates international law as it is collective punishment. Israel blockades nearly all the essentials of life from the captive 1.5 million people of Gaza whose only "crime" was to express their democratic choice of Hamas in a fair and well scrutinised election.'



'After the Israeli blitzkrieg of Operation Cast Lead which attacked schools, sewage and water treatment plants, the university, police stations and other civil agencies (20,000 homes were destroyed), the need for reconstruction is massive yet Israel bans all building materials.'

'Israel's inhumanity and breach of UN resolutions is a matter of record and yet Australia mutes its criticism and boasts Israel as friend. We call on your government to make a principled stand by condemning outright this latest Israeli barbarity and to demand an

end of the siege of Gaza in the UN and other fora; support Israeli boycott, disinvestment and sanctions; support calls for an international enquiry into the flotilla massacre; and enforce the law preventing Australians from serving in the IDF.'

Local dance troupe wins at indigenous festival

On Saturday May 29 around 30 local kids took part in the dance comp at Stylin Up Indigenous Hip Hop and R&B

festival in Inala near Brisbane and won.

The crew, who are aged between 9 and 21 years, call themselves The United Nations of Hip Hop and come from Federal, Mullumbimby, Lismore and Coraki and even as far as Yamba. The name came about as three quarters of the group are of indigenous Australian background with the rest of the group's heritage covering many corners of the globe.

The young people have been taking in dance and circus workshops over the past three months, at their schools, community centres and church halls, run by arts workers Zahra, Lou and Mitch and Nadine from the Creative People Collective.

Aisha, Marli and Bodhi from Federal and Lulu and sisters Nadji and Phoebe from Mullumbimby, have been working with Zahra and Lou at circus and dance workshops weekly in Federal. There, with other children in the community, they learn acrobatics which they incorporate into dance routines.

'The level of dance at the competition was very high and quite daunting for our group to watch before they performed,' said circus teacher Lou Harwood, 'but as soon as they hit the stage, (despite a three hour plus journey to the festival for some of the kids!) they unleashed their amazing energy and ability we have witnessed over the few months we have

worked with these kids.

'Their choreography and music, thanks to their dance teacher Zhara, is very original and of a very high quality, combining street dance moves with circus balances and acrobatics.'

'This group of children and young people are some of the most amazing kids I have worked with. They are highly skilled in learning and perfecting new dance and circus moves, have great determination, imagination, intelligence, and resilience.'

'I think it is for these reasons, plus the fact they are all astounding performers, that the United Nations of Hip Hop, wowed their audience and won the competition and trophy at Stylin Up.'

'Brian's wife Kerrie (Mandy Nolan) wants an ensuite. Their 17 year old son Dylan (Dylan Bradbury) can get that dirt bike he's always wanted and daughter Zoe (Zoe Hutchence) aged 14 wants to get her belly button pierced... and go to Europe.

'All sounds good. But there's a catch. The family must move to Roxby in the middle of the desert and dad must retrain as an industrial sparkie to work

in the uranium mine. Dylan doesn't want to leave his mates and his garage band, so he turns to the internet to find out more about uranium mining.

"It's a hole!" Dylan tells his dad. "Yes," replies Brian. "But it's a \$180,000 a year hole!" Bit by bit the information Dylan unearths on the net reveals that maybe not all that glitters is gold.

'Two of the world's leading medical scientists on radiation effects, Canadian nun Dr Rosalie Bertell (who led an international team into Chernobyl) and famous paediatrician Dr Helen Caldicott (Harvard

Medical School) and others are interviewed to unmask the hidden dangers behind uranium mining.

'Their message is clear: there is *no safe level* of radiation exposure below which there is no risk of cancer or birth defects occurring.

Makeover for Byron ER

Building extensions to enhance the Byron District Hospital (BDH) Emergency Department (ED) were due to commence last Monday.

The extensions will see the construction of a Safe Assessment Room within the ED, which will provide a dedicated room for patients presenting with a mental illness.

Keryn York, BDH acting executive officer, said during this period the ED will be relocated into the BDH operating theatre which will result in changes to access and patient flow within the hospital.

'Due to the unavailability of the operating theatre, alternative arrangements are in place with neighbouring hospitals to utilise their operating theatres,' Ms York said. 'We would like to apologise in advance for the inconvenience these temporary arrangements will cause to patients and visitors during this period.'

'No delays'

'I would like to reassure patients waiting for surgery that these arrangements will not result in any delays.'

The entry, reception/triage and waiting area of the ED will remain the same.

Ambulance entry to ED will be through the public entry to the ED. Ambulance vehicles will have a dedicated turning area for access.

The ED carpark area will be closed to all, except emergency vehicles, deliveries and drop off/pick up vehicles.

Use of the consultation rooms by external users will not be disrupted.

Construction of the Safe Assessment Room is expected to be completed in eight to 12 weeks when BHD will return to normal operations.

Writersfest program released

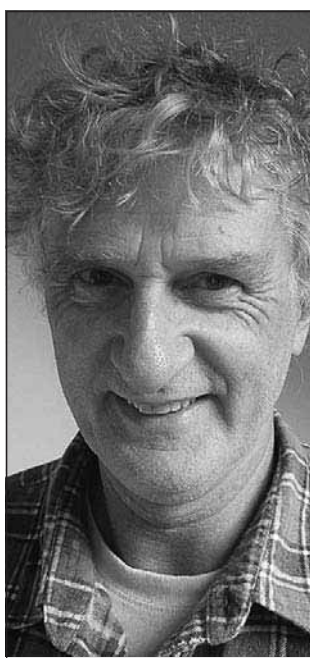

Coasting along

As some readers might have noticed, councillors have adopted Byron Shire's Coastal Zone Management Plan (CZMP) and sent it off to the minister for approval – or shredding. Council has followed a legislative process under the Coastal Protection Act, which even now is being fiddled with by the NSW minister for climate change and the environment Frank Sartor, who endeared himself to one and all through his handling of the planning portfolio.

Mayor Jan Barham remains optimistic – Zeus knows why – saying in a press release the adopted plan 'allows Council to move forward', wherever that may be. This is in the face of confusion about and opposition to the 'planned retreat' element, mainly from the so-called Byron Preservation Association, which seems to be chiefly interested in the preservation of Belongil homes – fair enough, though the name is misleading and vague.

The coastline arguments have been rehearsed several times – to the point of nausea. How much do you protect private homes at the expense of public beach? Do you need to retreat if the dunal front can be rebuilt, albeit artificially? In the face of the perfect storm, is 'planned retreat' an oxymoron like 'military intelligence'? Where do you retreat to? And on and on.

As I have noted before – to the point of nausea – lawyers will be (and have been) involved as landholders and Council defend their turf. Some councillors might have breathed a sigh of relief now that the plan is in the minister's hands. It is presently his problem, and increasingly a problem for the federal government as well.

Of course the final arbiter in the coastline controversy will be the weather. As the tornado which visited Lennox Head last Thursday showed, anything is possible.

A history of folly

By coincidence, as Israel was indulging in its latest shot at infamy on the high seas I was reading *The Age Of The Warrior*, a collection of articles by Middle East correspondent Robert Fisk. Fisk has lived in Lebanon for thirty years – and sometimes jokingly refers to himself as 'Bob of Arabia'. He writes now for *The Independent* (www.independent.co.uk/opinion/commentators/fisk/), heap-ing scorn on all chancers who murder civilians in the name of 'democracy' or Islam or Israel, from Begin to boofhead Bush, from Hamas to the ruling class of Saudi Arabia.

As Fisk points out, the USA's involvement in the Middle East is the latest folly in a long history of Western stupidity. Blair and Bush learned nothing from history – Blair apparently didn't have the patience to read his foreign office background notes – or they might have registered Lawrence of Arabia's 1929 entry in the *Encyclopedia Britannica* on guerilla warfare, which explains the difficulty of fighting an insurgent force which fades away and reappears like 'vapour'.

Fisk also quotes Lawrence on his trip up the Tigris in the 1920s with a troop of English soldiers, 'full of the power of happiness... And we were casting them by thousands into the fire to the worst of deaths, not to win the war but that the corn and rice and oil of Mesopotamia might be ours.' Sound familiar?

Before they follow the lead of oil moguls, arms dealers and daft religionists in setting Middle-Eastern 'policy', all political leaders should be required to join Bob of Arabia in stepping over the bodies of murdered children in refugee camps. They could at least be present like Richard I (1157-1199) when the killing starts.

Clueless Labor takes a nosedive

From the deep north, we report that the government in is diabolical trouble. It now appears that in Queensland – Rudd's own home state – the punters are preparing to forget about the parachute and jump out of the plane.

Admittedly this is Queensland, the state that gave us Joh Bjelke-Petersen, Russ Hinze, Clive Palmer and the cane toad. But where Queensland goes, can Western Australia be far behind?

And if the dominoes start to fall, suddenly we will wake up to find Abbott in the Lodge, Joe Hockey in the Treasury, Julie Bishop running foreign policy, Phillip Ruddock, Bronwyn Bishop and Kevin Andrews running ministries and Barnaby Joyce – the shadow finance minister who had to take off his trousers to count up to 21 – naming his own price

for keeping the Nationals in the coalition.

The prospect, once the stuff of febrile nightmare, is rapidly turning real. And the truly bad news is that no one in the Labor camp seems to have a clue what to do about it.

In the circumstances the workers should be very grateful to Fair Work Australia and the \$26 a week catch-up award for the lowest paid, which came through last week. Under a coalition government there would not be too many like it. Tony Abbott, in his Mr Nice Guy mode, assured the honest toilers that he was never one to begrudge them a rise – but he only hoped it would not be a case of one man's rise being another man's job, the usual code for the employers' line that it is never actually the right time for a wage rise – in good

to bring back WorkChoices as part of its scare campaign. But it now looks as though the unions, realising that a change of government is suddenly a real possibility, are going to get back on the airwaves in a big way.

Frankly it's just as well; so far the government's advertising campaign extolling the RSPT has been even more boring and unconvincing than the miners' campaign against it – and given that all the facts and logic are on the government's side, that is condemnation indeed.

At least the backlash against Rudd's broken promise on this aspect of the campaign has been less severe than might have been expected; Abbott and his colleagues have had a bit of fun with the apparent invocation of a national emergency, but by and large the public seems to have shrugged it off.

As Rudd and other have pointed out, Howard did much worse and much more of it and in the current mood of disillusionment and despair at the whole process, that is all that needs to be said. All politicians are bastards, a politician is an arse upon which everything has sat except a man, and whoever you vote for a politician always gets in, so why bother.

This public reversion to cynicism about politics and its place in society is perhaps the very worst legacy Rudd could leave Australia, but it seems highly likely he will do so. His election campaign and the first year of his government did a lot to restore the hope and trust that Howard had so badly eroded; but in the last few months he has pissed it all away in favour of timidity, indecision and, of course, a sack full of broken promises.

Part of the problem is the group of time-servers, mercenaries and mug lairs he has collected around him; mainly refugees from the New South Wales right, they are ignorant of the past (it's irrelevant), uninformed about the present (they only talk to each other) and uninterested in the future (it doesn't go past the next Newspoll.) But it is Rudd himself who has been the most crashing disappointment: Kevin 07 has melted in to Kevin Zilch.

What a pity Barack Obama has again been forced to cancel his visit; it would have been nice to see a real politician, if only from a distance.

Parklands raises the hackles

■ Please some clarity, Mat Morris! On May 28 in the *Northern Star* you insulted over 30 progress associations, village groups, and other community groups by calling them 'a fundamentalist opposition'. The great many people who oppose the proposal for a permanent festival site at North Byron Shire Parklands are not 'fundamentalists'; they simply oppose the proposal on a great number of grounds, environmental impact being only one.

You make it sound as if North Byron Parklands are doing Bilinudgel Nature Reserve and us a favour by planting more trees. The truth is that along with planning more tree planting, NBSP are also planning events that will be appallingly disruptive to the neighbours and the wildlife.

It is interesting that only now, in local papers and in a flyer, NBSP is inviting 'feedback'. Is this what you call community

consultation? The community should have been consulted long ago. Your proposal was lodged with the state on April 20, 2009, over a year ago.

NBSP wants to look like they are doing the right thing, but we're not conned by them. They have told visitors to their site that they intend to increase attendance at their events and the number of events they stage on their property.

Then they downplay the number of event days by conveniently not mentioning the prep and take-down days, which will consist of weeks before and after large events and days for smaller events. This is not about saving animals and planting trees. This is about how many people they can pack onto a site that is not suited for this use and how much money they can make.

■ I wish to take issue with Mat Morris, general manager of North Byron Parklands (NBP) and his letter to *The Echo* June 1, which is full of contradictions and inconsistencies. Firstly, Mat, your mathematics and research skills definitely need to be questioned.

Your spin and media take on the North Byron Parklands site at Yelgun is that you are 'consistently improving the biodiversity values of the land', yet you make excuses of why you haven't undertaken fencing of vegetated areas.

It is ironic that you continually promote your protection and enhancement of the environment at NBP, yet you have failed to protect valuable areas of Swamp Sclerophyll Forest on Coastal Floodplains (EEC) which are now in serious decline.

Furthermore, you have not maintained the existing fencing of 7(k) Habitat lands, there-

by providing opportunities for cattle to trample and degrade valuable habitat.

Secondly, Mat, it would be appropriate if you could retract your statement in the *Northern Star* (May 28) where you stated that NBP had to pay CONOS \$150,000.

The Land & Environment Court ruled that a 'trial' Splendour in the Grass festival was prohibited in a 7(k) Habitat zone under the Byron LEP. As you would be fully aware, the court awarded costs to CONOS of approximately \$93,000 which covered barristers' and solicitors' fees. CONOS received no monetary gains from the court's decision.

Council finances

I was amazed to read Cr Tucker admitting in his own newspaper that Council is in dire financial straits and the restructuring program put in place by the current manager Graeme Faulkner for saving ratepayers monies is not working as the increase in staff wages and entitlements has surpassed any savings made by the program of not replacing automatic staff redundancies.

Is this the same Cr Tucker who in September 2009 opposed the total Council organisational restructure put forward by Cr Tabart after Cr Tabart considered the compulsory restructure supplied by Graeme Faulkner to fall short of what he thought was necessary?

Cr Tucker also states that Council is in a precarious financial situation. If this is so why did Cr Tucker oppose in May 2010 a motion put forward by Cr Tabart for a full assessment of Council's financial situation? To any business person this would have been a sensible way to go without casting any aspersions on staff, which was one of the reasons he chose to oppose Cr Tabart's motion.

Cr Tucker is wrong in implying that wage increases and entitlements will increase and have increased automatically. This is not the case. If Cr Tucker takes the time to investigate he will find waged employees have had very little increase in wages in the last decade while management and middle management have had large increases in money and entitlements.

The argument that if you pay peanuts you will get monkeys is

clearly wrong as we are paying large amounts of money and entitlements and are still getting people that cannot supply this community with sustainable financial and organisational skills. I have stated previously the restructure of water and recycling is a classic example of poor management where we have gone from one coordinator to six coordinators, which is non-functional and a clear case of two many chiefs.

We have plenty of examples of outside consultants being brought in to solve the problems that you would expect senior management and experienced staff should have and could have solved themselves.

It is time Cr Tucker started practising what he preaches and supported moves for investigating the sustainability of the management and middle management of Byron Shire Council. On this matter I would like to congratulate Cr Tom Tabart on his efforts to get transparency and accountability back into this Council.

Housing initiatives

Housing initiatives - we tenants have to create them ourselves! As Michele Grant mentioned in her letter to *The Echo* last week, as tenants we are at the landlords' and ladies' disposal. Countless community meetings have brought up the urgency and despair for affordable and sustainable housing including the recently held Transition Towns Byron Shire Potluck with a Purpose.

There are ways to get out of this dilemma. Establishing

housing cooperatives is one of them. One of them is at BEND - Bega Eco-Neighbourhood Developers, a not-for-profit incorporated association) in Bega. Within BEND an affordable eco-housing cooperative formed and partnered with an existing community housing provider www.thebegavalley.org.au/bend.html.

Another and completely new way would be to join the 'Tenant Syndicate' that has its origin in Germany. Its idea and aim is to withdraw properties and housing stock permanently from the speculation market. The syndicate is currently made up of 33 autonomous self-organised independent house projects which are linked by the fact that the Syndicate is a member/ director of each house company (Ltd). Each house project pays a small amount of their rental income into a solidarity fund which is used to legally and financially support new projects. See www.syndikat.org

Whether co-op or syndicate, all initiatives have in common that the members/ tenants participate in designing their own living space and surroundings. This allows each project to become architecturally, ecologically and socially authentic and real - www.nif.co.uk/planningforreal.

In its Affordable Housing Strategy, Byron Shire Council considers making Council property available for affordable housing. Let's come together and discuss our options.

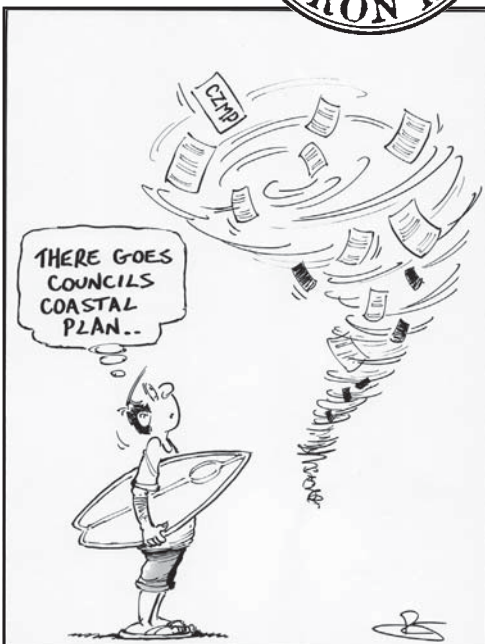

Mayor Barham should choose her national media interview spots more carefully! Baseload myths

I believe Giovanni Ebono's article in Your Sustainable Community ('Neighbourhood juice undermines the baseload myth') needs clarification as I fear it may mislead some of your readers. I would hate all our 'relatives, colleagues and acquaintances' to get the wrong idea about baseload energy and decentralised generation. I am a writer and energy researcher and I have no association with any vested interest in the energy sector.

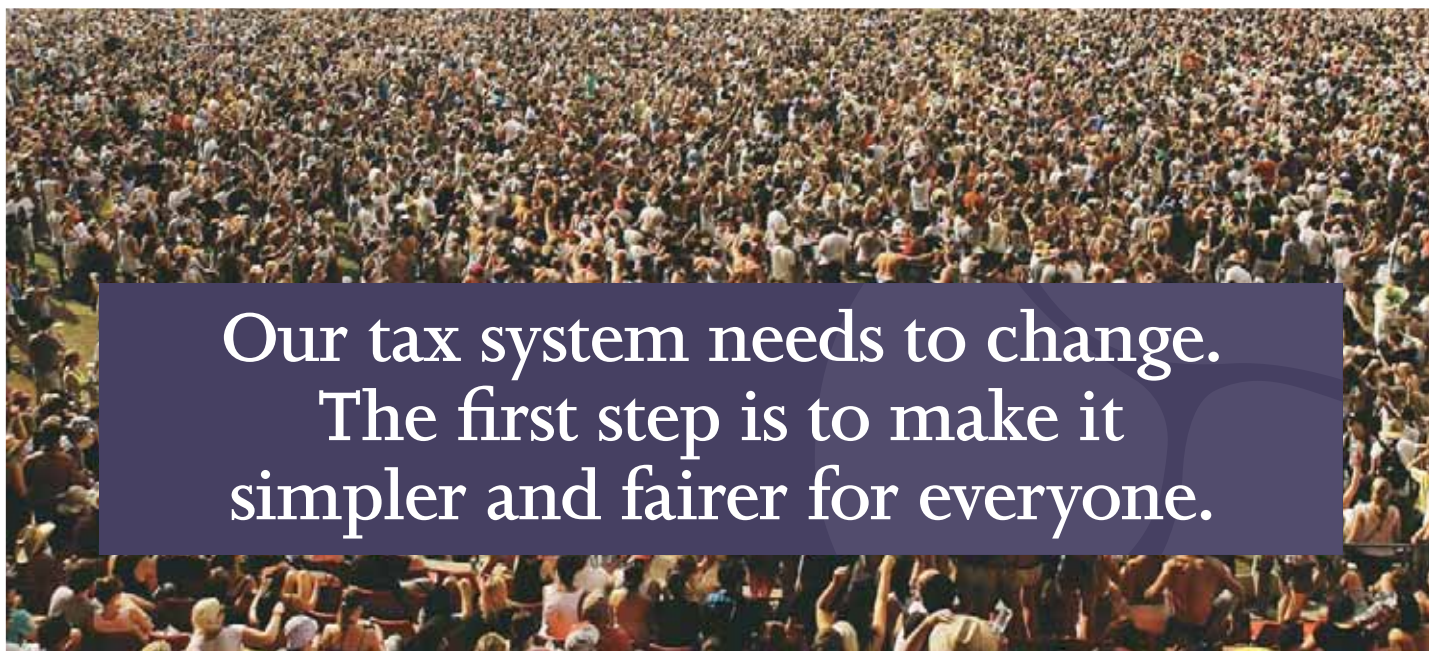
It is correct to define baseload as the amount of electricity that always has to be available but this does not imply it is a minor part of our electricity demand. On the contrary, according to the Australian Bureau of Agricultural and Resource Economics (ABARE), in 2009 baseload made up 76 per cent of total electricity consumption. Most baseload is consumed by industry, not households which only make up about a quarter of total electricity consumption (and probably only 20 per cent of baseload). This makes it very unlikely that domestic hot water services using off-peak electricity have significantly added to baseload demand.

It is also nonsense to suggest that hydro-electricity pumped storage is a significant user of baseload energy. Australia's pumped hydro facilities are minor and could add no more than a very small percentage to baseload energy. The big users of baseload are our very valuable 24 hour a day industries like steel and cement making and aluminium smelting. Without which we couldn't build wind turbines or solar thermal plants.

Decentralised electricity generation is very different to decentralised computing. With personal computers the end product is quite different to large central mainframes. With electricity, every electron is exactly the same whether it comes from a large nuclear plant or rooftop solar panel. The usefulness of the product doesn't change for electricity whether you make it locally or centrally. What changes is the cost.

Anyone, like me, who has solar panels on their rooftop will know two things about solar power. It is neither cheap nor a steady supplier of electricity on cloudy days. The NSW government has to offer us 60 cents/kWh to buy our decentralised solar power when they get the same electrons from the Hunter Valley for about

Ant stigmergy a message for humans

Mary Gardner

Standing in the queue at the supermarket I get close to media celebrities. There, on the cover of magazines next to the lollies, are their faces and headlines. I get uneasy as they peer through the groceries like jungle cats through tree branches. But the man at the checkout says 'hello' and I focus again on the immediate situation. Never mind the glam top cats. I, like many others here, am collecting food to survive. We everyday folk maintain the forest. We are ants.

Funny how the debates in society are echoed in science. Are some living beings more important than others? Do celebrities, like jaguars, really manage the jungle? The upper hand of the debate these days says that the ants do.

Ants are typically 10%-15% of the animal biomass anywhere even here in Australia. They are worth noticing. The problem with looking at ants is that identifying the individual species requires special expertise. What works better is to understand ants as functional groups.

In Australia, Moloney and Vanderwoude say that the dominant groups are species of the Dolichoderini subfamily: fast moving, numerous and likely to take sole charge of food resources. These include species commonly called odorous house ants and meat ants. The first invade kitchen pantries and the second attack and kill cane toads.

The presence of Dolichoderini influences the abundance of others from the group Camponotini, the various carpenter and sugar ants. These in turn limit the numbers of other ant groups who also avoid the dominants by sticking to their alternative lifestyles.

One alternate strategy is that of the opportunists who take advantage of disturbances in the habitat. Another is adopted by those who avoid every other ant group. They forage at different times, in unexpected



places. They hunt for entirely other types of foods.

This assortment of functional groups maintains every habitat, dry or wet, as long as it's not too cold. The ants variously aerate soils, clean up dead bodies, trim leaves and move seeds. They even tend the caterpillars of Lycaenid butterflies such as gossamer winged ones which include the familiar Blues and Coppers.

The success of ants pivots on their social behaviour. They live in colonies, which protect

ferent scents that act as coded messages.

Nowadays, as we take a wider view of human society, we have glimpses of a superorganism. People are members of many functional groups, interacting with and modifying both other human behaviours and the environment itself. Stigmergy is coming into view as we try to fathom our patterns of collective intelligence and group effort, especially factoring in personal computers and mobile phones.

building. something strong, however invisible. A team of European political scientists led by László Bruszt analysed the strength of civil society in 27 countries before the fall of the Soviet Union. They found the stronger the culture of civil society, the stronger the progress that country made in its transition to a new economy.

So what is ecological civil society here now in Byron? Our volunteer conservation work throughout the Shire. The role of the Arkawal people as co-managers of the National Park. The farmers markets and community gardens. The Byron Community College, the Community Radio, the Community Centres. The art. The musicians by the sea at dusk.

The way we share food and resources with our homeless and disadvantaged. How we involve local children and youth. The way we raise funds for whales and rainforests. Even the way we don't do some things: not build, not fish, not litter.

There is still much more of this urgent invisible work to do as we take up ecological citizenship. We may not see the superorganism or comprehend the stigmergy. But just take a step. And then another.

One of our greatly underrated functional groups is us as civil society. When we volunteer, join in group efforts and even when we protest, we are building. something strong, however invisible.

one or more queens who are dedicated egg layers. In many, but not all species, all the workers are infertile females. When a colony is prosperous in size and resources, a small group of males and some fertile females are raised. These fly off to mate. The males die and the females start new colonies.

Observing insect colonies makes people see invisible things. In the early 1900s, Harvard biologist William Morton Wheeler saw superorganisms. He coined this word to describe how the colony as a whole has a life of its own, supported by its busy, small minded individuals.

In the 1980s, the French biologist Pierre-Paul Grassé saw into the workings of another superorganism, termites. He coined a word now used for ants as well as termites, a word describing how 'the individual labour of each construction worker stimulates and guides the work of its neighbour'. The word is stigmergy.

Since then, other biologists found that ants and termites are constantly laying down scent molecules as trails for each other. In passing, they rub each other's antennae with dif-

I have a personal fascination in behaviour within and between groups. I am always curious if and how our best thinking, however radical, can help us exactly where we are most deeply trapped in our status quo. For instance, in the midst of our climate and biodiversity crisis, I wonder how we can develop an ecological citizenship.

This call is echoing around the world. What would it mean, to act as more than consumers or workers or patriots? What else are we?

of agricultural production. This model nurtures neither the people nor the earth. It's unsustainable and, therefore, won't continue. I know it's inconvenient but it's true.

I once saw pessimism described as, when presented with opportunity we find problems; and optimism as, when presented with problems we find opportunity.

We need an alternative development model that can nurture both people and the earth.

From what we know of actual sustainable practice, such a development model is likely to be very prosperous and that presents us with commercial possibilities. Council can't do this or even consider the notion. With the greatest will in the world they can only tinker with the edges of 'business as usual'.

be around 10,000 bicycles in the Byron Shire. Mayor Jan Barham agreed, pointing out that the council had already anticipated such an explosion in cycle use.

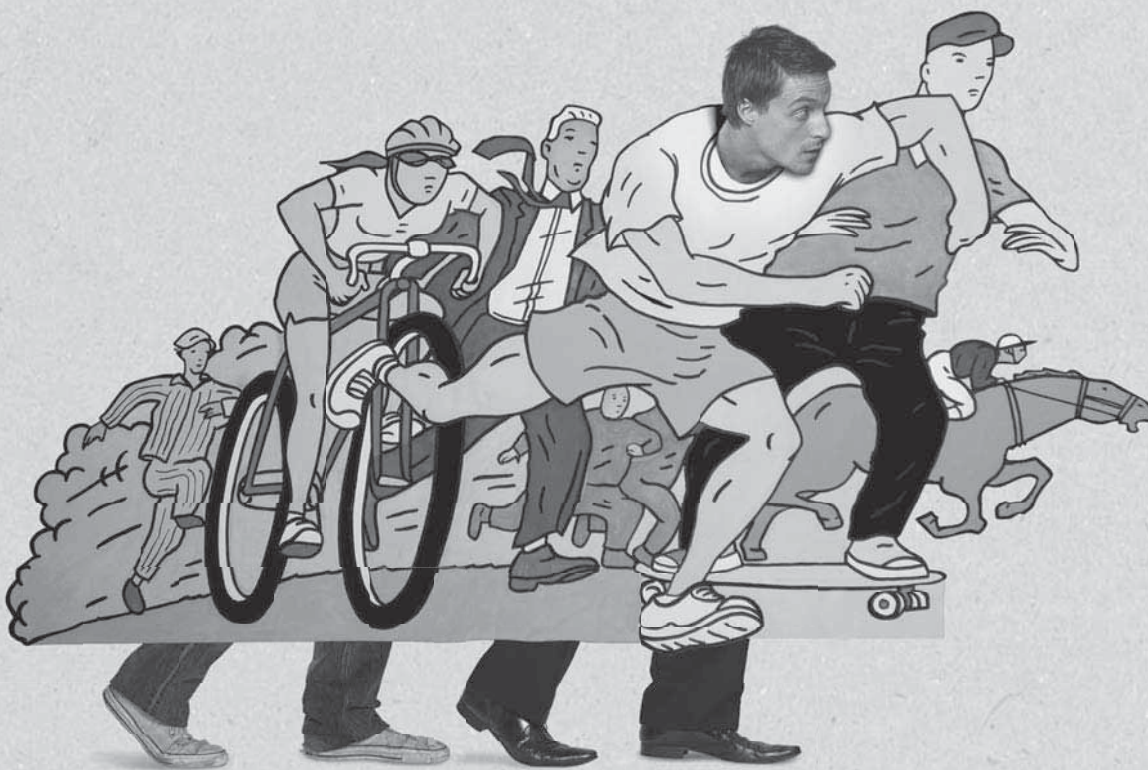

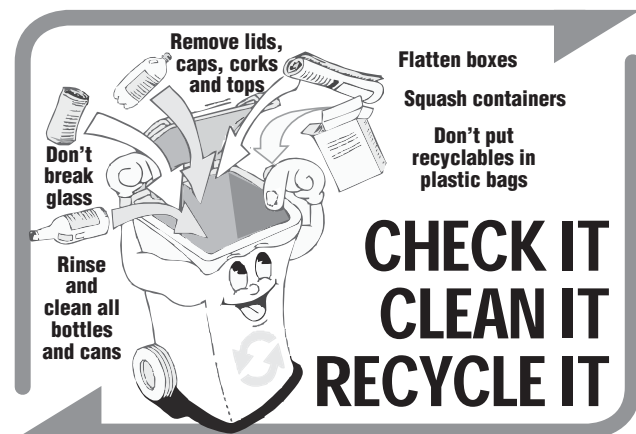

Weight watcher's guide to the joys of Japan

My lunch was presented with a darling smile, but what was that mossy green stuff floating at the top of the broth?

I lifted a tiny fragment of it with my chopsticks and was studying it closely when I became aware of the music that was being piped through the restaurant, which was just as weird.

They are a forgiving people, I suppose, but 'Colonel Bogey's March' did seem an odd thing to hear in Japan's holy city of Nara. I couldn't help visualising Alec Guinness marching across that damned bridge on the River Kwai shortly before it and the best efforts of the honourable Sessue Hayakawa were blown to smithereens and I wondered whether the girl who served me, Cio-Cio-San, had any idea of the tune's significance?

It appeared not as she cheerfully went about her duties.

After studying the menu with less than bolting enthusiasm, it occurred to me, not for the first time, that the reason why the Japanese have remained immune to the epidemic of obesity that is out of control in the over-fed, sanitised West is that their diet is so dismally unappealing.

Don't get me wrong, I would not have come back to Kyoto if I didn't like Japan so much. Its art and design, its para-normal punctuality, manic conservatism and stitched-up self-repressive character make me feel right at home, but how they can eat what they do is beyond me.

I know how wrong it is to say that. Weekend colour supplements and TV food shows tell me constantly that this is one of the great cuisines of the world, but



to each his own I reckon. (Wouldn't you love to see SBS's Maeve O'Mara just once turn her nose up at what she has been offered by the ethnic chef of the week and say 'yuk?') The Greeks and the Lebs, the Thais and the Indians – I could eat their food till the cows come home. But Japanese? Give me a break.

It's surprising, too, that a culture with such a long Buddhist tradition should be so shy of vegetarian dishes. Even more baffling is the paucity of restaurants displaying their menus in Latin script in the areas most frequented by foreign tourists. When you see one that does you go for it, not that it guarantees seamless communication.

I fried a burdock and the carrot which

I made chopped and seasoned it with soy sauce' indicated that they had an uncommonly gifted carrot working in the kitchen but, at the same time, had a graceful zaniness about it that for some reason reminded me of Ben Jonson's 'I sent thee late a rosy wreath'.

'Boiled bean curd refuse' didn't quite appeal as much as it might have, so I opted for the 'home made tofu with stubborn farm vegetables', assuming that stubbornness was here meant to be a virtue.

I ordered my meal with bravado, but Cio-Cio-San's vague reaction did not inspire confidence, so I took her out to the street and referred to the garish plastic

The ones who stuck to their dream

First Tests by Steve Cannane.

Australians, as everybody knows, are best in the world at everything. In particular Australians are best in the world at sport, and of all the sports at which Australians are best in the world, cricket is the one at which Australians are best of all.

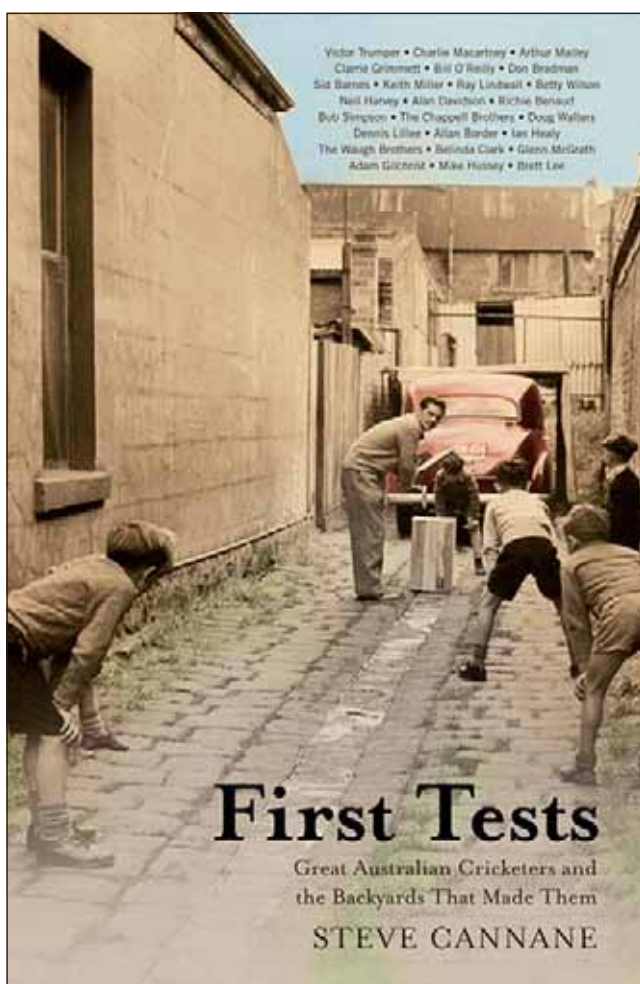
We didn't actually invent it, but we taught the Poms (and the rest of the world) how to play it properly. It's true that just occasionally Australians lose at cricket, but when we do it's almost always because the other side cheated, as in the Bodyline series of 1930, or else because the other side contained players who were so freakishly good they should have been subject to both drug testing and handicapping, like the great West Indian teams led by Clive Lloyd and Viv Richards. Otherwise they couldn't possibly have won, because as everyone knows, Australians are the best in the world.

Closer analysis

Right, now having got that clear, the question is: Why, and how? To what must we attribute this supremacy? The easy answer is that it is just a natural phenomenon; as Australian fauna evolved to be marsupials, Australian people evolved to be cricketers. But closer analysis suggests that there were particular features of the environment that aided this development.

The first, of course, was the weather; it is easy (or at least it was, before the coming of television and video games and paedophiles) for children to spend a lot of time outside in Australia. And there is a lot of outside for them to spend time in; even the most crowded parts of the cities have backyards, driveways, parks, gardens and nature strips, and as a last resort there is the street itself.

Kids who really want to play cricket will always find a way,



and some of our finest cricketers have come from pretty unlikely backgrounds. In *First Tests* Steve Cannane, an ABC journalist and broadcaster (and fair to medium weekend cricketer) has analysed the ascent of 25 of our superstars (28 if you count the Waugh twins as two and the Chappell brothers as three) and has concluded that it was these early years which shaped both their characters and their techniques in later life; the glories and vicissitudes of the fantasy tests played with a homemade bat and a compo ball were generally more significant than the formal training which came later.

Much has been made of Australia's fine government sponsored facilities for the chosen few, especially the Australian Cricket Academy, now inexplicably rechristened the Centre for Excellence; it is also indisputable that Australia's cricketing structure, where the promising progress naturally from school competitions through the suburban grade system to

state and eventually national representation is superior to that of any other nation. But Cannane sees these institutions, good as they are, as merely adding the polish to a product already honed by literally thousands of hours of less formal match play.

Greats practise'

Cannane subtitles his book 'Great Australian Cricketers and the Backyards that Made Them', but of course it was not just the backyard. In the country, it was more often the paddock: Don Bradman famously taught himself footwork by throwing a golf ball at a curved tank stand and playing the rebound with a single cricket stump. Bill O'Reilly, lacking a real ball, chiselled the semblance of one from a banksia root. Neil Harvey learnt to play spin and bouncers by batting on a street of cobblestones in Fitzroy. Richie Benaud hit balls around in a school storeroom his father

it always reminds me of those cubes you see clustered near the drain in a men's urinal. I blinked back the tears, watched with mirth by the fellow at the nearest table.

He resembled Charles Bronson and I deduced by the grimace on his face, his imitation checked Wrangler shirt and the wholehearted way that he was skulking his lagers that he was Korean. They are the Westies of the East and looked down upon even more than other outsiders.

I persevered, but dessert was no improvement. A white, rubbery round thing the size of a marble that tasted like a pen-

cil eraser blended cunningly with grainy brown shavings of lord knows what that were lurking beneath a blob of emerald hued gelatin which was not unlike Aeroplane Jelly but chewier and, in all honesty, not nearly as nice.

Cio-Cio-San and the other waitresses smirked as, in an agony of politeness, I swallowed it all.

I learnt later that, funnily enough, the green mossy stuff was edible green moss. Apparently it's loaded with nutrition, and the Japanese should know, they being the longest living people in the world. But it tasted revolting.

had cleared out for the purpose. Keith Miller invented the idea (taken up by many others) of putting a ball in a stocking and hanging it from a clothesline, and hitting it over and over again as it swung unpredictably. Dennis Lillee's first pitch was made from a discarded piece of linoleum.

Some have been more fortunate. The father of Adam Gilchrist, Lismore's favourite son (actually he was born in June, but he moved to Lismore as a boy), built his son an AstroTurf wicket and installed a mechanical bowling machine in his extensive suburban yard. But the basic formula remained: an insatiable thirst for the game, and a determination to play it no matter what.

Without exception the characters in Cannane's book dreamt of playing for Australia from a very young age. Many children (even John Howard) do; the Ginger Meggs ambition is very much part of the Australia culture. But unlike the rest of us, the successful ones stuck to their dream; they ate, drank and breathed cricket and made it their life. I suspect they would have done so whenever and wherever they found themselves. The determination, rather than the backyard, is the real secret of Australia's success.

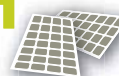

Kudos for CSIRO's supercomputing capability

One of the world's leading developers of graphics processing units (GPUs), NVIDIA, has announced that CSIRO has been selected as a member of its international network of high performance computing research centres.

GPUs are the computer hardware which lies at the heart of game consoles and, increasingly, supercomputers.

CSIRO's Group Executive, Information Sciences, Dr Alex Zelinsky, said the announcement – at the International Supercomputing Conference in Hamburg, Germany – furthers CSIRO's goal of being a world leader in the application of GPU technology to a broad range of scientific and industrial problems.

'To be involved in NVIDIA's CUDA Research Center Program, which is designed for institutions that embrace GPU com-

puting across multiple research fields, is a great honour for CSIRO,' Dr Zelinsky said.

'We're excited to be in such good company. CUDA Research Centers include Johns Hopkins University (US) and Nanyang Technological University (Singapore).'

CSIRO is currently the only CUDA Research Center in the southern hemisphere.

CSIRO's GPU cluster, with 256 GPUs, was the first of its kind in Australia and is one of the world's fastest computers.

GPUs speed up data processing by allowing a computer to massively multi-task through parallel processing.

NVIDIA's expertise in programmable GPUs have helped make supercomputing inexpensive and more widely accessible. The company is based in California.

NVIDIA's Director of Research, Dr David Luebke, said the CUDA Research Center program is designed to recognise and encourage the use of GPUs for scientific and high performance computing.

'CSIRO will gain access to the latest developments in GPU computing and become part of a wider community of organisations with GPU facilities, sharing information and ideas,' Dr Luebke said.

Platform Leader of CSIRO Computational and Simulation Sciences, Dr John Taylor, said that, as one of the world's most diverse research organisations, CSIRO is uniquely placed to put GPU technology through its paces.

'We're using the GPU cluster to speed up projects like



Many CSIRO scientists are already utilising the benefits of the GPU cluster in a range of scientific disciplines. CSIRO computational modellers simulating human swimming have found their code runs six times faster, when using the GPU cluster.

modelling nuclear analysers, running 3D X-ray and CT image reconstruction, measuring uncertainty in complex environmental models and understanding biomechanical processes like human swimming' Dr Taylor said. 'And we're getting

results 6-200 times faster than before.'

The GPU cluster is in everyday use with over 100 CSIRO scientists trained to use it. It was installed in Canberra last November by Xenon Systems of Melbourne and runs Linux and Windows applications.

Mick Daley calls Christian Pyle: 'the North Coast's most respected, irreverent and unconventional songwriter and producer.' It takes another musician to truly appreciate the genius of a man who professes not to compose music himself, but to 'pilfer' it from his instruments. Pyle releases his new solo album *Nothing Left to Burn* at the Byron Bay Brewery Buddha Bar on Saturday.

The album is an auto-biographical electro-rock oddity that sings up the dirt road that leads to his home (*Wait Son*), spurned relationships (*Ray of Your Sunshine*) and a childhood somewhere near Moreton Bay where he made cash by selling horseshit (*School without Dogs*). It's the clapped out old piano that I love the most though, it lurches through tracks like an ageing showgirl, still hitting the

right notes, but only just.

'I wrote most of it on the piano. It's actually the old one from Coorabell Hall that they were throwing out. It's full of ghosts. I go and sit at it and it gives me a song every time. I have hundreds of instruments. I just have them around so I can pilfer their songs. I even borrow instruments off friends just to steal the songs out of them.'

This is Pyle's second solo album brought to light after being diagnosed and recovering from cancer.

'People think that if you live around here then they can see you play anytime. Well maybe not. I only play Byron about twice a year, and I just had cancer, so maybe not.'

Pyle's not about to use his recent illness to promote his album. *Nothing Left to Burn* is not about having cancer. But the drive to finish recording and release it was.

'I don't want to be cancer boy – that's not who I am. But it made me finish the album. You've got a deadline. Dead being the operative word.'

Pyle is a prolific songwriter who enjoys the solitude of creating alone.

'I have hundreds of songs lying around that I never do anything with – working alone is pure pleasure, there's no compromise.'

When it came to making this album Pyle wanted to break the rules set by his clients.

'I went out of my way to make it unlistenable. I wanted to use sounds that clients wouldn't accept. I find that people are getting more conservative, so as a producer it gets boring when people making music want to play it safe.'

There's nothing safe about *Nothing Left to Burn*. There are expansive soundscapes full of unexpected turns that

reveal his fascination with tones generated from superb instruments and amplifiers, bizarre devices and electro-junk. Never one to court radio's fleeting favour, Pyle is more concerned with lasting resonance than the flash of pop fodder. These songs, beautifully conceived, oddly played, are pop music for thinkers, painters, idlers and lovers. The album was recorded and produced by Pyle at his Goonengerry studio.

'I played all the instruments, there is no other human being on it. I left all the doors open – all the stuff I try to stop I encouraged for myself, birds, kids playing, and just general noise.'

After a career where he's been the dude for hire with the instrument, Pyle became his own session muso.

'I would leave my studio and

walk back in character, I'd leave the studio and come back in as the bass player I would have wanted to turn up.'

The album is good. Really good. Full of noise and spaces and even a couple of secret tracks.

The band employed to translate the recorded into a live show are essential oddballs from the Byron hills. Nick Edin, M Jack Bee and Brendan Drinkwater are all consummate players with broad experience and appropriate eccentricities. Well versed in Pyle's approach to music, they'll tackle it with the proper combinations of gusto, skill and spontaneity. 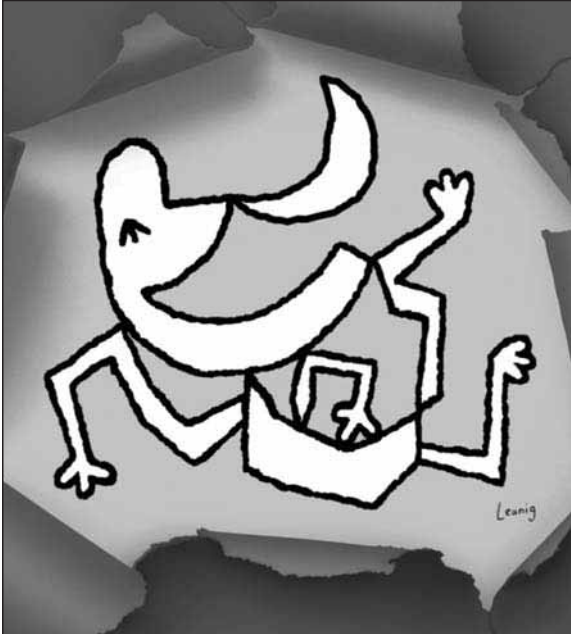

That Dreadful Jimmy Willing

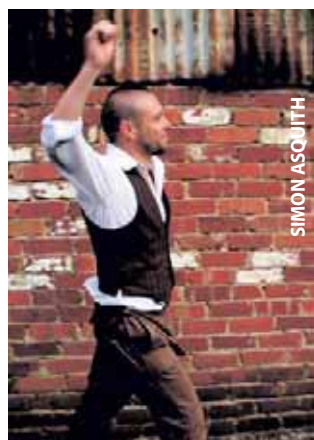

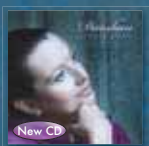

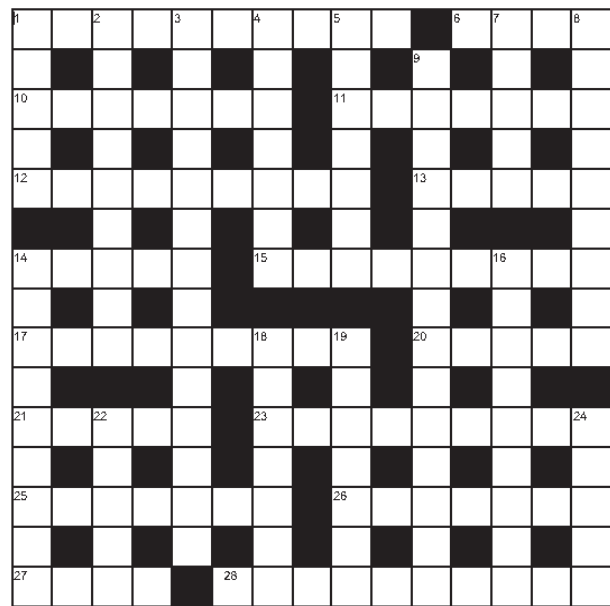

Norway, hardly a chess powerhouse.

However, the Russian connection remained important; he had been introduced to chess while living in St Petersburg and on a return trip to Russia he picked up that country's Under 12 title.

In 2008 his family moved to the Netherlands where he has been warmly accepted and many opportunities have been created for him, most recently an exhibition match against former world title contender Nigel Short which Giri drew 2-2. Watching the bubbly Giri give commentary to his final game win over Short in Amsterdam a fortnight ago, Giri was astonishingly self-confident, demonstrating long complicated variations without ever doubting that somehow the position must turn in his favour.

Giri's confidence in his own abilities are clearly shared by other top players such as World Champion Viswanathan Anand

who, it was recently revealed, called up Giri to play training games against him before his world title defence against Topalov.

Like Carlsen, Giri has not turned fully professional and remains a student, albeit one at a school with the flexibility to allow Giri to compete internationally on a regular basis. Giri will represent the Netherlands in the 2010 Chess Olympics in Siberia.

This week Giri added another tournament title to his collection, with a 90% score at the annual Sigeman tournament in Malmo, Sweden. Giri's best win was the following violent game against local Grandmaster Tiger Hillarp Persson.

Beneath Hill 60

This film is based on a little known but true story of mining engineer Oliver Woodward (Brendan Cowell), who in 1916 left his bride-to-be to join the Australian 1st Tunnellers in the mud and carnage of the Western Front in World War I. Deep beneath the German lines, Woodward and his platoon of secret Australian tunnellers struggle to maintain and extend a leaking, labyrinthine tunnel system packed with enough high explosives to cause the largest explosion the world had ever known, in an attempt to destroy thousands of German troops massed above ground. The central character is Oliver Woodward, portrayed by Brendan Cowell as a no nonsense man with engineering skills that make him valuable at the front. But being older, he's not called up until later in the war, which fuels rumours that he's a coward, perhaps the lowest form of life during those times. This slur on him, together with his interrupted romance with the lovely Marjorie (Bella Heathcote), gives the film added layers. The film movingly tells its story through the key characters, including those left at home. Thanks to director Jeremy Sims and a superb cast, it's an often moving portrait of the dreadful trenches, the easy camaraderie and the simple heroism of these men.

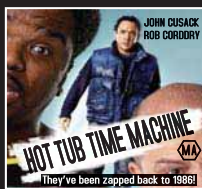

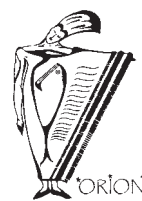

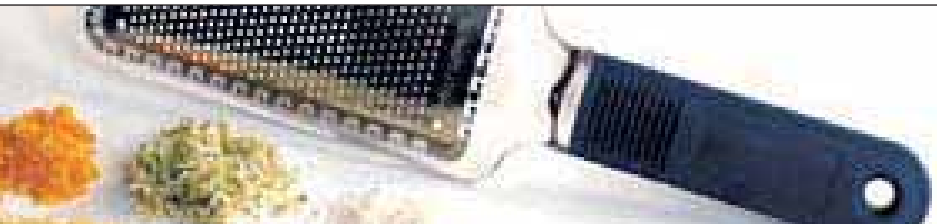

Salt of the Sea

Victoria Cosford

First of all it was the black salt I bought from an Indian grocery on the Gold Coast. Not black at all but a soft pinkish colour, it intrigued me so much I had to snap it up then, back home, pinch a tiny amount out to scatter over half a tomato. Scent a little like a beef stock cube, and offering no clue to the explosion of glorious, vibrant flavour in my mouth. Later I learnt that Black Salt is a special type of Indian volcanic rock salt: it is known as Sanchal in Hindi and is used in Indian cooking as a condiment.

Then several days later the man I love told me about the bemusement he felt when he noticed a colleague sprinkle salt on a chopped-up apple. This, it transpires, is no less odd than the Thai custom of applying salt to peeled orange segments – and perhaps there is nothing odd in either, salt being renowned, among its many virtues, for drawing out or enhancing flavours. Ah the magical mystery of food!

One local couple who has pretty well elevated salt to an art form is Senaka and Justine Harriman of the company Tridosha. Anyone frequenting markets would know their stall well: they've been doing three markets a month for the past decade, specifically Byron Bay, Bangalow and The Channon. Sen meets me in a local cafe and it feels like a private little triumph – on and off over the past eight years I have made attempts to do so without success. It's not that Sen is elusive, or difficult; on the contrary he is utterly charming but I quickly see ultimately very private, a man who would simply prefer his beautiful products to speak for themselves. As it is he prefaces our meeting by telling me it is his partner Justine to whom I should really be talking. It is Justine who is the 'fantastic cook, really passionate', who devises the various recipes, utilising their fancy salts, which come on gorgeously photographed cards. Whereas Sen, who grew up in Sri Lanka, has 'memories of running through coffee and pepper plantations... a tropical oasis of pepper and mangoes', Justine had always had a 'sophisticated appreciation of food'.

Tridosha Salt of the Sea is a range of Australian sea-salt blended with cracked peppercorns, herbs

and spices. Its concept was, Sen tells me, 'borne out of really humble beginnings, our dinner parties... It's just something that came from our kitchen table.' This was in Sydney twelve years ago where Sen was working at SBS as a camera operator and floor manager. He had cooked in restaurants in his teens, and acquired a reputation among friends, later, for his curry nights. 'That encouraged me', Sen says, 'then Justine came up with her idea of creative seasonings.' When they started the business Sen was employed in two other jobs; they made the move up here, an area where Sen had spent much time when younger, and set about fully establishing Tridosha. 'There was nothing like it around at the time', Sen tells me, 'apart from Maldon – but it was mostly things like chicken salt. We wanted to use sea-salt that wasn't bleached or refined. And we wanted to make a product that made as minimal an environmental impact or footprint as possible. Twelve years ago we made the conscious decision to make a sustainable product and we've never changed.'

They have a purpose-built space at Bangalow – 'it's all to scale, our whole life is to scale', says Sen, 'and we manufacture everything we put out there. In our blends we pay homage to various cultures: Thai, Indian, for example... we'll grow lemon myrtle and native mint and dry them out. We're so close to our product and presentation.' Sen cannot speak highly enough of their customers. 'We kept growing,' he says, 'because of our loyal and receptive audience. To expand would be to deny our reasons for coming up here. We've basically grown and determined our growth by our aspirations. Now it's not so much about expansion, it's about charting the course and looking for calm waters. My challenge is consolidation at the moment – maintaining customer-base and not growth for growth's sake. We honour our customers' intelligence and it informs everything we do.'

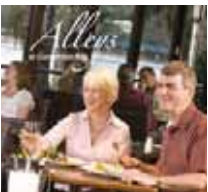

Winning ways with the duck

'Nevertheless, it appears that the editor is not satisfied with my work,' I continued, wishing that Bosworth had not so unerringly pointed out the hellish compromises in dealing with unsavoury characters one must make in order to get published. But there was worse to come from my confreres.

Nevertheless, the editor must be obeyed – he has a black flogger with 20 suede straps for recalcitrant cases – and so, below, I have brought you an actual recipe thingy prepared earlier with Chef:

SQUEAMIOUS CONFIT OF DUCK

Have the chauffeur take one's Bentley to the back five acres where one will find an abandoned farm shed upon the corroded tin roof of which a native duck is momentarily resting. Japan's team in the World Cup is known as the Samurai Blue. Last week they lost 2-1 in a trial with the Poms in Austria, sunk by an own goal by the fabulously named Marcus Tullio Tanaka. Local journos, if they breathe the same air as their fellow hacks in the footy writers brethren, would have undoubtedly described it as a gallant loss.

The boys will give it a crack in South Africa and do their country proud etc, but, like the Soccerroos and about twenty other finalists in the great celebration of Big Mac globalisation, they have their chance and Buckleys of lifting the Jules Rimet Trophy at Johannesburg on July 7.

Unlike their counterparts in green and gold, however, they will not feel the weight of an entire nation's self-regard on their shoulders. Australia, still young and on the make, remains unwilling to find an alternative

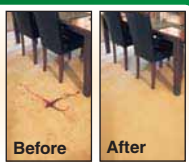

New housing falls in March

New housing expenditure fell back by a disappointing 4.3 per cent in the March quarter of 2010 to be 5.5 per cent lower than 12 months ago, according to the Housing Industry Association.

HIA senior economist Ben Phillips said that the result indicated that healthy leading indicators late in 2009, such as building approvals and housing loans, were yet to feed into activity on the ground.

'While the pipeline of activity should translate into stronger con-

struction activity later in 2010 HIA is concerned that without the government stimulus of the first home buyers boost and the social housing stimulus new housing construction will slide,' said Mr Phillips.

'On a more positive note, the strength of the general economy and a return to positive sentiment towards property pushed expenditure on renovations up by 2.4 per cent in March to be 9.7 per cent higher than 12 months ago.

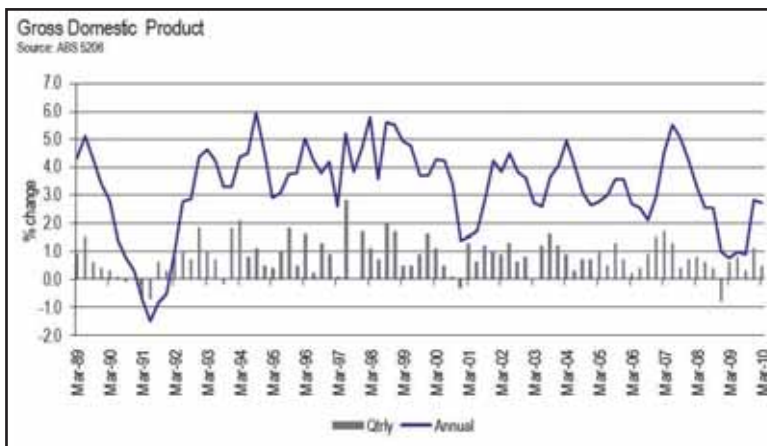
'Gross Domestic Product grew a moderate 0.5 per cent in March to be

2.7 per cent up on 12 months ago.

'This solid result was driven heavily by public sector investment which was up 11.6 per cent while the private sector declined by 0.6 per cent.

'The lack of private sector investment and moderate private consumption supports the Reserve Bank's decision to keep rates on hold in June.

'Interest rate increases are already showing up in weak leading indicators for housing construction; further rate increases will only further dampen activity.'
