



Uncle Harry asked to leave



Members of the Arakwal Corporation have asked Uncle Harry to leave the campsite next to Council chambers in Mullumbimby. He and his supporters occupied the site from September 3 until last Monday.

Stan Robinson Park at the council chambers in Mullumbimby was the centre of controversy on the weekend when the Arakwal people gathered to demand that Uncle Harry and others camping in the park leave.

Police and security arrived at Stan Robinson Park at 6am on Monday to enforce the eviction notice and dismantle the camp.

By that morning, Uncle Harry and his supporters had vacated the land; however, some protestors had remained without camping equipment.

Spokesperson for the Arakwal people Delta Kay was both angry and distressed as what she sees as an invasion of Arakwal land as well as the media coverage that Uncle Harry has received in his quest for answers regarding the use of the land for the Woolworths development.

'We are here to let the Mullumbimby locals know that we want these nutters off this land,' said Ms Kay.

'We are the people of this land. Harry Boyd is from Woodenbong. They are breaking lore. You can't go into other people's country and light fires and bring in people.'

Ms Kay said that she felt that Uncle Harry and a contingent of random Indigenous and non-Indigenous people were pushing a barrow for their own hidden agenda.

Using Woolies to bolster own campaign

She told *The Echo* that she feels Uncle Harry is using the Woolworths issue and those involved in other protests against the development to gain tenure in the Arakwal region and to bolster his own campaign to gain cultural governance of the area. He wants to be recognised as the true custodian of Arakwal land, according to Ms Kay.

Uncle Harry's denial of the Arakwal and Bundjalung is common knowledge to those who have visited the park.

'I am confused as to who is here for Woolies and who is here for Uncle Harry,' said Ms Kay.

When asked about the Woolworths development, Ms Kay said that it was wrong for anyone to speak on behalf of the whole community. 'This issue has divided Mullumbimby and Uncle Harry is just fueling the division. As far as the Arakwal are concerned, there is no cultural significance to the development site. There is nothing buried there nor was it a special place for the Arakwal people.'

About twenty Arakwal people arrived at the park on Saturday to ask the campers to leave and they appeared again on Sunday.

Ms Kay says that Arakwals will visit the camp every day until Uncle Harry and his mob vacate.

'We will visit each day,' said Delta. 'We cannot stay here 24 hours a day until they go. We have jobs to go to and families to look after, we cannot afford to sit around all day.'

Optus tower opposition grows

Residents adjacent to the lookout at Ocean Shores have begun to voice their opposition to a proposed Optus Tower destined for the site.

Homes in the vicinity recently received letters from the council informing them that the tower would replace the 25 metre pole currently on the site and that the existing blackspot equipment would be transferred to the new Optus monopole.

Byron Shire Council's executive manager of planning Ray Darney said the proposed Optus telecommunication tower would replace the existing pole with one 30 metres in height and it would be located approximately 60 metres from the nearest residence.

Health risk and aesthetics concerns

Tina Beattie lives directly below the current tower which is where the proposed replacement will also be installed. Her foremost fear is the health risks created by radiation emitted from the tower.

'My major concern is for our health,' she said. 'Some research shows that

radiation emitted from these types of towers could be genotoxic. This tower is too close to where people are living, it is a serious health concern.'

Another concern Tina has is for the aesthetics of the site. She says that the tower would be five metres taller than the current tower and would have several large 'branches' attached to it, similar to the one on Mudges Road in Ocean Shores. 'This lookout is a tourist attraction. The new tower will be an eyesore that will be seen from as far away as Byron Bay.'

Council does not currently have a lease arrangement with Optus for the site at Warrambol Road. Mr Darney said the application will be determined on merit and reported to Council for consideration before any lease arrangements are negotiated with Optus. Council has an existing ten-year licence with Broadcast Australia Pty Ltd (SBS) at the site, which generates \$2,000 per annum.

Mrs Beattie says she intends to present council with a petition when the matter becomes before them.

For anyone wishing to view the plan, the development application is on exhibition until Wednesday October 6.

Sun breaks through for young lives lost

Around five hundred people attended the memorial service of Jarah Blackett at the Byron Bay YAC last Thursday morning.

Just over a week ago, Jarah, 23, and mates Todd Hepner and Byron Nicholson were tragically killed in a car crash at the junction of the Pacific Highway and Woodford Lane.

Crowds covered the grassy banks outside the YAC, and thankfully the clouds broke for the first sunny day in a week.

Others queued up at the empty coffin in order to inscribe its lid with messages.

Flags and flares fluttered in the light breeze. The service, a celebration of Jarah's life, took place inside the hall where a slide-show was presented.

The funeral services for Todd Hepner and Byron Nicholson were held privately.



Road closure gets run around

Council's executive manager of community infrastructure, Phil Holloway, told *The Echo* Council had endorsed the closure of the Woodford Lane access and made the request to the RTA in 2007.

When *The Echo* asked the RTA whether they would close the road, a spokesperson responded that they are investigating whether the closure would improve road safety.

The RTA said it is not aware of any complaints about the safety of the intersection.

A spokesperson for the Minister For Roads, David Berger, told *The Echo*, 'Without wanting to pre-empt the findings of the police investigation, the Minister has asked the RTA to review this section of road to determine if road safety improvements can be made to further enhance road safety.'

Arakwal don't exist: Uncle Harry

Uncle Harry came out briefly on Sunday to talk to the group and participate in a conversation with the Arakwals and *The Echo*.

Ms Kay said that, as spokesperson for the Arakwal corporation, she was advising him that he was not authorised to stay in the park or to speak on behalf of the Arakwal or Bundjalung or any Indigenous people in the area and he was not authorised to stay in the park.

Uncle Harry said he was there in a demonstration against Woolworths and for the betterment of all people.

When asked what he thought about the Arakwal and Bundjalung, Uncle Harry said, 'They

don't exist to me.'

Arakwal man Brian Kelly asked Uncle Harry if he would face the Bundjalung elders' council with his opinions and Uncle Harry said he would.

He said that the elders were welcome to visit him whenever they wished, which evoked uproar from the Arakwals who said that it was not for the elders to visit Harry but the other way around.

They added by saying his lack of knowledge and respect for tribal lore is another reason he should not be on Arakwal land. Late last week the Byron Shire Council issued an order to the group to cease using the land as a camping ground.

Stan Robinson Park is owned by Byron Shire Council and under the *Local Government Act* is designated as operational land; it is not Crown Land.

Council asks protesters to leave

Council's general manager Graeme Faulkner said the order required the group to remove all temporary structures from the area.

He said the protest group had originally told Council they would be protesting for 72 hours over the issue of Woolworths coming to Mullumbimby.

'While the protesters have been peaceful during this time, the 72 hours has been surpassed and the group has given no further indication of when the protest will end,' said Mr Faulkner.

'Council did not support the Woolworths development application nor was it involved in the sale of the land.'

Police visited the site early on Friday to request that the group abide by the eviction notice and vacate the site as soon as possible.

Mr Faulkner said that Council had concerns over hygiene amenities and safety with cars coming and going from the park. 'There have also been numerous complaints from the community over the use of the park as a camp site,' he said.

According to the campers, they had been the target of attacks recently with children sleeping in one of the vehicles being terrorised by men wearing balaclavas and one man receiving an injury to his head in what they say was a barrage of attacks over a two-day period last week. Members of the group say they felt they were being assaulted and that police were ignoring their plight.

Waves of coastal unrest roll on

Now the independents have given government to Labor, we are told regional issues are on the radar.

This seems to consist chiefly of farming and broadband concerns, but the other problem the feds will have to come to grips with is coastal management. And despite preliminary reports, the federal Department of Climate Change (www.climatechange.gov.au) still has a way to go on planning.

The ABC TV program *The 7.30 Report* highlighted the coastal controversy last week when it told the story of the Strini family's loss of a development opportunity because of climate change fears. The Strinis wanted to build eight beachside townhouses at Lakes Entrance in Victoria and had approval from the local council and the catchment management authority.

Startling precedent

Then an objection was lodged with the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (VCAT), which is a bit like the NSW Land and Environment Court but covers a broader range of issues.

VCAT overturned the approval, citing dangers of inundation in rising sea levels. It

sets a startling precedent for the coastline, and apparently the Strinis have no chance of compensation, despite allegedly spending \$600,000 on interest payments, planning costs and legal fees.

A federal government report, 'Climate Change Risks to Australia's Coast', last year identified 'between 157,000 and 247,600 existing residential buildings at risk of inundation with a sea-level rise of 1.1 metres.

'This analysis included storm tide estimates (for a 1-in-100 year event) for New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania and a high tide event for others.'

Since then, the NSW government has adopted coastal management plans - see www.environment.nsw.gov.au/coasts/coastalerosionmgmt.htm - along with putting up the

Coastal Protection and Other Legislation Amendment Bill which 'includes amendments to the Local Government Act to allow councils to levy an annual coastal protection service charge outside rate pegging.

Councils would be required to levy this charge on landowners for long-term coastal protection works (eg seawalls), where the works were constructed by the landowners.'

Last Thursday the Local Government and Shires Associations of NSW 'conditionally welcomed' changes to the Coastal Protection and Other Legislation Amendment Bill, but said a more proactive and long-term strategy is needed to deal with coastal erosion.

Association president Cr Genia McCaffery said, 'The Coastal Panel now has three

representatives from Local Government, and its charter now gives it the potential to assist councils in addressing complex, contentious coastal planning issues.

The early draft of the Bill gave landowners an unfettered right to repeatedly protect their own properties, with no consideration of the longer-term effects or impacts on their neighbours.'

In May this year Byron Shire Council resolved to adopt its controversial Draft Coastal Zone Management Plan. According to Council, the plan attracted 654 submissions from 622 people.

How Council's plan and the state government Bill will mesh is uncertain. It remains to be seen if the interests of residents, environmental protection and infrastructure can be satisfied at all.

As with the Strinis' experience, the answers most likely lie with the courts' interpretation of coastal legislation.

In NSW, class 4 actions in the Land and Environment Court to planning approvals in possible inundation areas could be on the cards, and it's not likely to be a pretty sight.

Developers, councils and residents would all like certainty but in the realm of climate change, certainty is not necessarily an option.

How to Live? How to Die?

A story from a past client

My mother Netta had been in and out of hospital; her last visit was three months before she died. Whilst in hospital she said to me "I never want to have to be in a hospital again". I looked at her and answered "OK, you will never have to be". This was a huge step into the unknown and I had no real knowledge of what I was taking on, but I felt like it would somehow work out. At that moment, something changed in Netta - a fear, a holding on was let go and she felt safe to surrender to the next stage.



The practicalities of keeping that commitment to Netta meant that her doctor had to be on board with this decision and then Byron Hospice Service (then 'Amitayus'), Feros Home Care and Feros Village in Byron Bay and the community nurses, who were all willing to get involved and help.

We moved my mother into our granny flat as her condition weakened. Having help from the Byron Hospice Service was very important for our family, giving us short breaks and support, knowing that someone was there to sit with Netta and talk with her, or simply just be there.

It's been three and a half years since my mother died peacefully and I still feel a very deep bond with the volunteers from Byron Hospice Service who assisted my mother to die in peace, with grace and dignity.

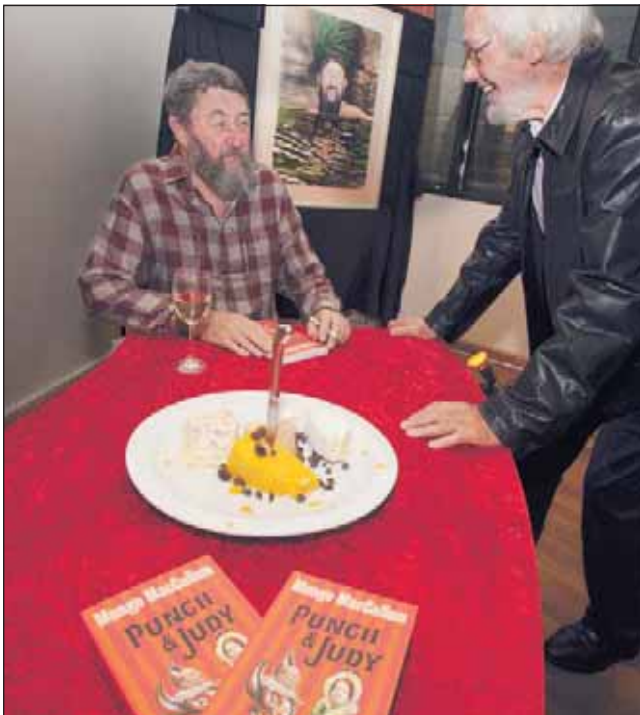

Another missile into the political discourse

It started as the election nobody cared about and finished as a fascinating cliffhanger.

In the process we learned a lot about how our constitution works when a minority government is on the cards.

Mungo MacCallum's *Punch & Judy: the Double Disillusion Election 2010* takes us through the campaign and its aftermath with the author's customary wit and readability.

This is the third 'instant' election book from Mungo, following *Run, Johnny, Run* (2004) and *Poll Dancing* (2007). 'Instant' implies no lowering of the author's high standards, but rather the impressively swift publication of these books, once the result of the vote is known.

In the case of *Punch & Judy*,

the interminable post-election manoeuvring to set up a government upset the finely-tuned printing timetable, but it allowed the account to end on a dramatic note.

At the launch Mungo was quite rightly lauded for a long career in political journalism that has seen him write for every major title in the country.

Less well known nationally but arguably just as impressive are his columns for this newspaper, which have appeared every week (with minimum time off for holidays) for more than two decades.

To write a thousand columns chronicling the ups and downs of political life in Australia while maintaining such a consistent level of humour, insight and tolerance for the system is a quite an achievement.

Byron Motorcycle Centre rides into the sunset

Motorcycle owners in Byron Bay are losing their local bike workshop.

Byron Motorcycle Centre proprietor and bike mechanic Owen Fudge will close his business of three years on Friday due to a recurring leg injury that has affected his ability to work.

'I'm planning to get my body fixed and become a domestic engineer, a house dad,' he said.

'People are going to have to go elsewhere to get their bikes serviced.'

With no potential buyer to step in and take over the business, Fudge says his only option is to close his store before he goes broke.

Fudge, who moved from Katherine in the Northern Territory to the Byron Shire five years ago, said the 'ridiculously high' overheads in Byron Bay mean his business is not viable unless he can work at full capacity.

He says the closure of his business is a sad sign of the times for the town.

'Byron has lost another service and you can't keep losing



services like this,' he said. 'This business could have survived if I had it running in Alstonville or something. I could have kept it alive.'

While he praises his landlords as 'gentlemen', Fudge says many others need to take a hard look at what rapidly rising commercial and industrial rents are doing to Byron Bay.

'It's a hard place to do business... the landlords are killing the place,' he said. 'Landlords

should look at the future of the town and say we need services here to keep people here.'

Byron Bay does have one other motorcycle workshop, Desmo Headquarters, but it specialises in repairing Ducati motorcycles.

Its owner, Arthur Davis, told *The Echo* he would not be able to service Fudge's customer base.

'We're just a specialist Ducati shop. Ducatis are all I've ever

worked on,' he said.

Fudge says he hasn't ruled out reopening his business once he is well.

First, however, he'll be having a knee reconstruction, spending some time with his kids and, curiously enough, studying to become an explosives expert in the mining industry.

'I might like to get a job with the other passion in my life: blowing things up,' he said.

Lighthouse run for cancer research

Cancer sufferers who undergo daily exercise have a survival rate which is nothing short of impressive.

This result, according to Barb Pinter from the Byron Bay Breast Cancer Support Group (BBBCSG), is based on an 18-year Harvard study – and given the group's involvement in the impending Byron Lighthouse Run, serves as a timely reminder of the ben-

efits of exercise.

The annual run, hosted by fitness coach and personal trainer Lisa Parkes, will take place on Sunday October 21 – and this will be the third year in which the BBBCSG has been involved.

'Back in 2008 we held a stall, an information table, at the start/finish line near the peace pole', Barb told *The Echo*. 'This time we'll be participating as a group with a banner, to raise awareness of breast cancer.'

Every day in Australia 38 women are diagnosed with the disease; one in nine women at some stage of their lives will contract it.

Exercise helps reducing recurrence

'Early detection and preventative measures are really being pushed now', Barb said, 'This is what brings us into the Lighthouse Run in a really positive way. Oncologists are pushing the exercise factor as well. For people who've been diagnosed, it's really important to start exercising – to reduce your chances of a recurrence.'

The actual Run raises funds for various charities, including the BBBCSG, and, said Barb, 'you can wander along at your own pace! It's such an uplifting, gorgeous walk and so beneficial in raising your level of fitness.'

BBBCSG is extremely energetic in its efforts at raising

awareness of breast cancer and has a program leading up to the Lighthouse Run called Pink October 2010 in Byron.

The program includes a Breast Cancer Day event on Saturday October 9, to be held at Railway Park (with Balinese chakra healing ceremony, Moment of Silence and free Zumba class); raffle draw on Friday October 15 of the beautiful Alexandra Spyrtos zebra painting to be drawn by Mayor Jan Barham; and a World of Women short film festival at the Byron Community and Cultural Centre over the weekend of Saturday October 30.

In addition, IGA at Sunrise has been very supportive of the group. 'They have put us in their Community Chest for October, so for every \$30 you spend you are given a token (which) converts into the much-needed funds for our group', said Barb.

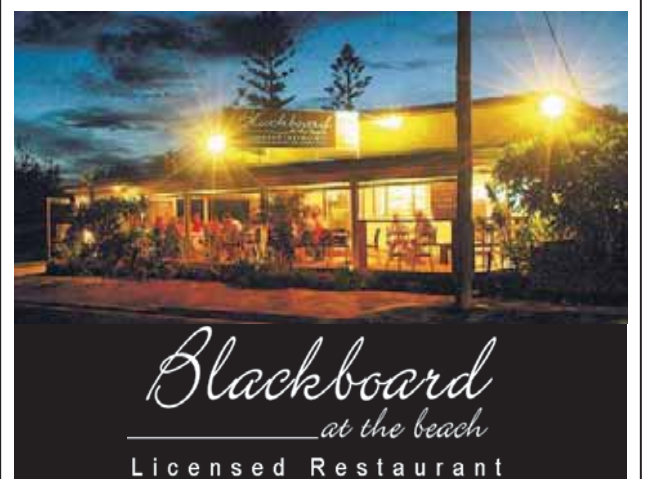

Buttery receives high level accreditation

Paul Kelly's song 'To her door' pays homage to The Buttery, and this week the Australian Council on Health Care Standards (ACHS) also sang the praise of this worthy institution.

'Being awarded accreditation by ACHS gives funding bodies and the community continued confidence in the high standards of service and delivery the Buttery provides,' Buttery executive director Barry Evans told *The Echo*.

Since 1975 The Buttery in Bangalow has been building steadily on its reputation as one of the leading drug and alcohol rehabilitation centres of its kind in the world.

'We offer a therapeutic community,' says Mr Evans, 'residents and staff work together as a community. It's different www.echo.net.au

from a rehab centre in that everyone helps each other. It's a service worthy of support both morally and financially.' Mr Evans claims 66 communities around Australia and New Zealand apply their own interpretation of the same model.

The Buttery recently participated in the auditing process that is a prelude to accreditation from the ACHS. The accreditation would place The Buttery among Australia's leading healthcare providers, according to Mr Evans. Other ACHS accredited organisations include Sydney's St Vincent's Private Hospital and Melbourne's Peter McCallum Cancer Centre.

Thwarting the Mallams myth

Woolworths for Mullumbimby continues to take shape down by the railway. The only visible protest is the construction company's fence (enclosing much, much more territory than was necessary for the project), which has been festooned with underwear and placards. Security personnel remove the placards as soon as they appear; it is not clear who pulls off most the underwear or indeed who had the clever idea of smearing the garments with brown paint.

Meanwhile the opponents of the opponents continue (with a few honourable exceptions, as in our letters page last week) to conduct their campaign in favour of Woolies in anonymity. *The Echo* doesn't print unsigned letters, which prevents us from fully demonstrating certain views. Admittedly most anonymous letters and emails are of the barking-mad variety, but occasionally they contain ideas one assumes are shared by a number of people.

One of the ideas constantly recurring in unsigned emails is that the people who oppose Woolworths are somehow reaping a poetic justice for thwarting Mallams when they proposed a supermarket in Station Street in the first place. Having rejected King Log (Mallams) the frogs deserved to get King Stork (Woolies).

But this is a gross distortion. Byron Shire Council refused the DA, but the community opposition was muted, precisely because it was Mallams, a local family company, proposing the development. When Council turned it down, Mallams were able to get permission from the state government. Most of those who had made submissions against the DA would have accepted the new situation, but Mallams decided they would be better off selling to Woolies rather than undertaking the new project themselves. That was when the serious opposition took off.

But rewrites of history apart, in the absence of any detailed survey nobody really knows which side of the argument is in the majority.

As Mandy pointed out in her column a few weeks ago, the divide tends to be between old settlers and new residents or bourgeois/radical, conventional/new age, even footy/emo. These divides are unlikely to be bridged by reason, but Woolies proponents might like to reflect that one unimpeachably conservative source has come out against their business practices.

Last week the Anglican bishop of Bendigo told Christians that if they were concerned about ethical investment they should get rid of Woolworths shares, because the company runs more than 12,000 poker machines, turning millions of dollars of profit on the misery of some of the country's most disadvantaged families.

We all know by now that Coles and Woolworths dominate the supermarket business and use their duopoly to squeeze farmers into barely sustainable prices. At the same time they import food items from overseas, contributing to unnecessary carbon emissions. Their giant presence on the outskirts of many country towns has destroyed main street trading and accelerated the trend towards 'clone' towns with little individuality.

But, like the poker machines, these are all legal activities. What the bishop has pointed out is that what is legal is not necessarily ethical. It is legal to manufacture and distribute cigarettes, but few people would care to defend the ethics displayed by Big Tobacco. For the sake of a few cheaper products – and even that is questionable judging by prices at Woolworths in the Bay – some people are looking forward to the opening of the Mullumbimby store.

Well, *The Echo* does not. Mullumbimby was prosperous before Woolies decided to move in, and if it continues to prosper it will be in spite of the new supermarket. Let's also keep a sense of perspective: undergarments may upset some delicate sensibilities, but the fence they adorn is a giant symbol of corporate colonisation, a colonisation which is now inevitably part of Mullumbimby's future.

Abbott reaches a new and dangerous low

Last week I noted that one immediate consequence of the hung parliament was that all bets were off – everything was up for grabs.

I was referring, of course, to policy; as Julia Gillard pointed out, circumstances have changed somewhat since she made her election promises.

Even to get through stage A – passage by the House of Representatives – she needs the support of at least four cross-benchers, all of whom have insisted that they will treat every piece of legislation on its merits and vote as independents.

The four nominally supporting her government have also set other terms and conditions which will have implications for policy, most obviously in the field of climate change but in other areas as well. Clearly this will mean compromise and modification on a number of fronts.

And Gillard, by admitting as much last week, was doing no more than stating the obvious. When it comes to Labor's election platform, all bets are indeed off. What I did not mean, or expect, was that the normal processes of parliament would also be abandoned without any serious attempt at explanation or justification.

I assumed, for instance, that written agreements between the parties would be honoured and that the long-standing conventions would be upheld – that decent and civilised behaviour would prevail. And for this naiveté and optimism I must now apologise. Tony Abbott's decision to shred the solemn undertaking he gave to abide by the agenda for parliamentary reform has set a new and dangerous low which may result in the system disintegrating into something perilously close to anarchy.

The reason the rural inde-

pendents insisted that both sides of politics sign the agreement before indicating which of them would have their support was precisely to prevent this happening; to lock both government and opposition into the reform process, to make it genuinely bipartisan. It was always obvious that the provision for pairing the speaker would give the government an advantage, but this was more than adequately

thus making pairing impossible. But the original idea was perfectly sound: although the opposition started by suggesting it would breach the Constitution, the Solicitor-General was adamant that it would not; if the parties chose to come to an agreement, it would be perfectly okay.

Ah, said Tony Abbott, so it would only be an informal arrangement, not written into the legislation; oh dear no, we

couldn't have that. Matters of governance are far too important to be left to an informal arrangement. So all bets are off. But wait a minute. Like many other conventions of government the entire system of pairing, which has been in existence since federation, is an informal arrangement. It is simply a fair and practical means of ensuring that the numbers in the House, which are determined by the electorate, remain unaffected when members – either government or opposition – are unavoidably absent.

True; so will the rest of the world please rearrange things so as to make sure events and meetings that could involve Julia Gillard, Kevin Rudd, Wayne Swan, Stephen Smith and the rest of them only take place while the Australian parliament is in recess.

And as for backbenchers, well, forget it. In the past they have asked for pairs for all sorts of reasons, but now only crises such as serious illness, bereavement or childbirth (women only) will qualify. Or that's the current line from Tony Abbott's ferocious opposition.

In the end it is likely that commonsense will prevail; after all, to have the place run with a modicum of civilisation and decency is as much in the interests of most opposition members as those of the government. But Abbott has now made it clear that his lust for power is absolute; he will stop at nothing.

And he is inviting equally brutal payback. Labor's unedifying attempt to bribe Alex Somlyay with the deputy speakership in exchange for the same guarantee as has been given by the independents – no support for votes of no confidence or to deny supply – ended in tears after Abbott's enforcers paid him a visit.

But by throwing the rule book out of the window, Abbott has indeed ushered in a new paradigm, which he may live to regret.

By the way, paradigm is an anagram of pig drama. In this context, it seems entirely appropriate.

Abbott has now made it clear that his lust for power is absolute; he will stop at nothing.

countered by other provisions which favoured the opposition and the backbenchers.

Overall the package was both sensible and balanced. And of course Abbott has said he will definitely stick with the rest of it – the bits that give him an edge. But on the speakership, the government is on its own.

The proposal by Rob Oakeshott is simple enough: the speaker does not have a deliberative vote, so by appointing one of its own as speaker, as is the convention, the government effectively loses one of its numbers, which in a parliament as tight as the present one can be crucial. The idea was that the opposition should therefore appoint the deputy speaker, who would also forfeit his vote, thereby evening things up.

Oakeshott then confused things by nominating himself for the job, which was unworkable: as an independent his vote could go with either side,

Rezoning challenges at West Byron

The Byron Bay West Landowners Association (BBWLA) has commenced planning for the 100 hectare West Byron Urban Release Area. The land is subject to a State Significant Site Study under the auspices of the Department of Planning and Part 3A of the EP&A Act. The landowners state in their July 2010 newsletter that this '... will result in the land being rezoned. In the current or future political environment it is unlikely to be refused.'

The Byron Shire community must clearly get involved to ensure the landowners adhere to the five principles they intend following in planning and developing their land. Four of the principles are 'motherhood statements' that may provide some comfort that economic, social and environmental sustainability and urban design innovation issues are to be considered. The fifth provides an escape if the landowners believe market and commercial considerations outweigh sustainability and innovation or both are beyond their expertise.

Environmental constraints

will have a significant bearing but, using urban density targets mandated by the Department of Planning, a 100 hectare site could be required to yield 1,500 dwellings. At roughly \$50,000 per lot, the \$50 to \$70 million in subdivision construction costs quoted in the Background Report could suggest the landowners are already thinking of a yield in the order of 1,000 to 1,400 dwellings. Clearly the impact of such a development will be substantial.

If rezoning is accepted as a fait accompli, transparency of process is a fundamental requirement.

Two issues immediately come to mind. Firstly, it is important that the community knows who the landowners are, the size of their respective holdings, and how they see themselves working together. Secondly, the community needs to know who is on the consultant team.

Knowing who the landowners are might give the community confidence. More than lip service will be paid to the planning and development prin-

ciples. For example, if professional developers are involved in the Association do they have a track record for innovation and quality or have their previous projects simply replicated development models that have long since reached their use by date.

Even in the most benign circumstances multiple landowner developments are notoriously difficult to manage. Combining different levels of landowner expertise, financial capability and land size with physical constraints and contemporary planning and urban design objectives make the achievement of even a barely satisfactory outcome a major challenge.

The Byron West site and the landowners must, however, transcend these challenges as the community will have to live with the outcome. This could be helped by a formal planning and development agreement between the landowners, the Department of Planning and Council. Planning agreements are now common, even mandated by the Department and local councils, in Sydney. Such

an agreement must be in place before the Site Study is completed and its content must be developed in consultation with the community.

The consultants involved in Site Studies under Part 3A are paid by the landowners, not the Department of Planning. They therefore have an immediate conflict of interest. A recent court case dealing with the professional obligations of consultants to the community and be Acts under which they operate should be a salutary warning to all the consultants involved in Byron West. And are the planning and urban design consultant members right up to date with recent innovations and thinking?

Even at this early stage the challenges presented to the Byron Shire community are evident. Byron West could be an example of development for the 21st century or it could be an unmitigated disaster. Let's hope the landowners fulfil their promise to recognise the existing and future needs and aspirations of the community.

Crs respond to pecuniary interest and zoning issues

■ Mr. Pugh is entitled to his views (*Echo*, September 14 and 21) be they accurate or not. However it's of concern to see *The Echo*, who promotes itself as independent, again publishing such defamatory and inflammatory letters without checking to see if they are factual or allowing the accused a counter point in the same space. Rather they rely on the accused to respond at a later date if they can. If they don't lazy journalism prevails, mud sticks and natural justice goes wanting.

I have consulted widely and am confident I do not have a 'pecuniary interest' as alleged by Mr Pugh. A 'non pecuniary less than significant interest' maybe, which when declared still allows one to vote. The difference between the two is significant and goes to the heart of Mr Pugh's serious allegations.

And ironically for someone who represents an environmental view, writing such alarmist letters to the press alleging pecuniary interests is the worst possible message Mr Pugh could send to the hundreds of property owners who are stewards of native vegetation in our Shire and trying to do the right thing.

A simple question by either Mr Pugh or *The Echo* would have provided an informed view, which would have reassured landholders, not scared them.

As a Councillor I try to make decisions based on facts, not fear or favour, and this means a lot more homework and time, which within the constraints of local government is frustrating. I'm also focussed on the broader public good, which is considerably under threat by Mr Pugh's public allegations. To explain in detail would be

to threaten what many of us are trying to achieve.

■ Dailan Pugh's recent letters have left me puzzled as it has been Cr Morrissey and I who have been active in having the CEA suggestions assessed. A report to the Strategic Planning Committee (23/9) contains a series of recommendations flowing from these assessments as well as measures that I put forward earlier this year. Recommendations include E2 environmental protection zoning for old growth and long term flying fox camps. Water and biodiversity clauses have been drafted to protect more riparian areas and fragmented Endangered Ecological Communities (EECs) not previously mapped as HCV (High Conservation Value). Many areas are proposed to retain E2 zon-

ing including HCV on council and crown land and shorebird areas outside National Parks and Waterway zonings. The list goes on.

Dailan misrepresents the purpose of an assessment made by a Council ecologist of a portion of vegetation on my property earlier this year. The only thing being tested was Council's vegetation mapping, which is acknowledged to be only 68 per cent accurate. This was part of a series of case studies aimed at ground truthing Council's systems. Nor is it correct to say that this assessment was the basis of the staff recommendation for E3 zoning of HCV vegetation in the Draft LEP on land currently zoned rural (1a, 1b, 1c). This was driven by land use issues, particularly an ability to continue agricultural uses. For the record, my property was not assessed on this basis as Dailan claims.

Pecuniary interests are a highly relevant issue and Dailan refers to numerous sections of the Local Government Act (LGA) to make his case, but still repeatedly gets it wrong. 1. He misstates the test for a pecuniary interest. 2. He fails to distinguish between a pecuniary and a non-pecuniary interest. 3. A 'proprietary interest' on its own is not a pecuniary interest and cannot be the basis of a requirement to take no part in decision making.

For clarity, a pecuniary interest arises where there is a 'reasonable likelihood or expectation of appreciable financial gain or loss' (s 442, LGA).

Dailan missed a far more significant point. Eight of nine Councillors are landowners within the Shire. This raises significant questions about how we manage pecuniary interests during development of

our most important planning document.

These questions were discussed at a Strategic Planning Committee (23/9) in response to correspondence from the Department of Local Government advising Councillors to seek exemptions under s458 when considering the Draft LEP. There are practical reasons why this should occur. If pecuniary interests can be said to crystallise during the drafting process or when discussing technical issues, then it is not an unlikely scenario that eight of nine Councillors would have to absent themselves, completely frustrating attempts to move the draft forward. Residents can take heart from the wise decision of Council to defer further consideration of the Draft LEP until applications for exemptions have been determined.

It does not boast of our achievements: the slain children and the bodies rotting under the ruins, the wounded who bleed to death because our soldiers shoot at the ambulance crews, the little girls whose legs were amputated due to horrible wounds caused by various types of weaponry, the devastated fathers shedding bitter tears, the residential neighborhoods that have been obliterated, the terrible burns caused by white phosphorus, and the mini-transfer - the tens of thousands of people who have been expelled from their homes, and are still being

expelled at this very minute, ordered to cram into a built-up area that is constantly growing smaller and is also under sentence of incessant bombing and shelling ... In the 1990s, Israel had a chance to prove that 1948 is not its paradigm. But it missed this opportunity. Instead, it merely perfected its techniques for robbing land and expelling people from their houses, and forced the Palestinians into isolated enclaves. And now, during these dark days, Israel is proving that 1948 never ended.'

Byron College building revitalisation is finished!

Official opening Wednesday October 6, at 10am

The walls are up, the roof is on, the solar panels are in place and the staff at the revitalised Byron Region Community College are ready for their big opening on October 6 and they want everyone to come and enjoy this great new facility.

Director Richard Vinycomb is fit to burst he is so pleased with the project and so excited to see the building officially open.

One of the unique features of the college is that every conceivable energy saving option has been used in the make-up of the buildings, and wherever possible, the environmental footprint has been considered.

'We are not only solar active,' says Richard. 'We are solar passive. We have used natural light in any way we could to save using any power at all.'

Architect Mark Halford says that environmental options were in the forefront when designing the upgrade. Mark says that the process of creating the new space began with a briefing by BRCC requiring a creative and flexible development of the site incorporating environmentally sustainable elements where possible.

He also says that the biggest design challenge was breathing aesthetic life into the site – the existing two storey administration

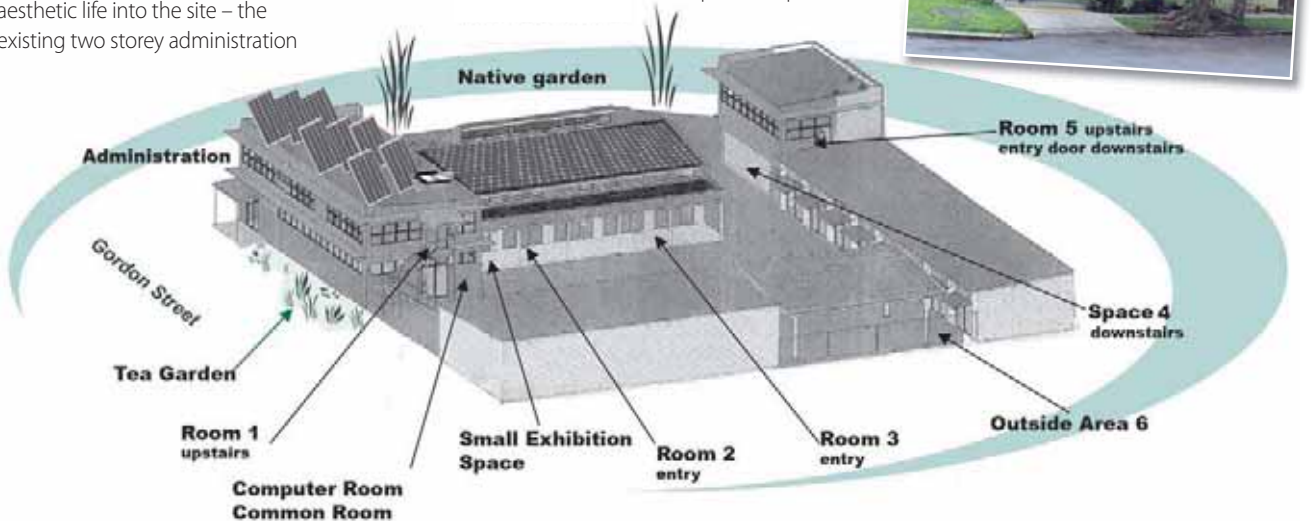

building and workshop was conceived on sterile State Electricity Commission drawing boards. 'The buildings were sound,' says Mark. 'They incorporated a steel portal frame construction combined with two metre high flood resistant lower floor concrete walls and timber framed asbestos clad upper walls and roofs.'

At a cost of 1.7 million dollars, the work included two new

structures, a two storey building in the vacant south east corner of the site including a large office upstairs and lock up parking below and a large alfresco, translucent roofed area in the vacant northern area of the site between the existing incubators' buildings. These structures complete the perimeter

building sequence encompassing what has become a large internal courtyard. 'I could see this courtyard providing a unique community space for future events as the common room kitchen and bathrooms open onto this area and the new exhibition spaces,' says Mark. 'The classrooms and verandah of the refurbished workshop also flow seamlessly into the courtyard area.'

The main building also has the luxury of the multifunctional large studio that can be used as an arena for live performance, multimedia and visual art productions, but is also has a flexible internal spatial division created by large articulated walls that can be folded away to turn one large harmonious space into smaller individual spaces.

Though the finished project is aesthetically pleasing, it is the application of environmentally

sustainable elements in the design that deserve the most applause.

The extensive use of photovoltaic cells – 30kW – on the roofs of the two large existing buildings is feeding power into the grid. Energy efficient LED and fluorescent lighting are used extensively and the use of natural lighting has been optimised.

A highlight of the facility is that natural ventilation – via awning hung windows, louvre windows, stacking doors and the unique 'Cardiff Air' extraction fan cooling system installed in the refurbished workshop building, requires minimal electricity consumption.

Visitors to the college will see many of these features signposted through the development. 'The community has benefited from the excellent local cooperation and

the work of all concerned,' says Mark. 'This cooperation has facilitated the creation of an excellent, high quality, high value community asset. This is a very positive outcome for the Byron Shire.'

The official opening is on Wednesday October 6 from 10am to 12pm and all are welcome. 'I want people to feel that the college is open to everyone,' says Richard. 'If people can't make it to the opening, we would love them to come and make another time to have a look around.'

Byron families help protect wildlife

Indonesia's animals and plants are fast approaching extinction. Byron Bay families are helping protect tigers and elephants in Sumatra, orangutans in Kalimantan, hatching turtle eggs on the coast, and protecting endangered bird habitats.

Indonesia has the most spectacular wildlife and plantlife, most of which exist in scattered National Parks and protected reserves. The plight of orangutans, elephants, rhinoceros, gibbon, turtles, wildcats, tigers, birds and all the other animals has motivated a group of conservationists from Byron Bay to help protect them.

The conservation group includes vets, environmentalists, teachers, doctors, engineers and students. They have established a foundation for the huge task, Save Indonesian Endangered Species fund (SIES), and they also now part-own five ecolodges: Rimba Orangutan Ecolodge, Satwa Elephant Ecolodge, Bajo Komodo Ecolodge, Kelimutu Crater Lakes Ecolodge, and Udayana Kingfisher Ecolodge.



Newrybar veterinarian Claire Oelrichs is the conservation project coordinator. Claire also guides ecotours introducing guests to the conservation projects and manages the Foundation.

Local environmental engineer and SIES treasurer Richard Hagley explains, 'SIES seeks out local Indonesian conservationists and supports and empowers their ideas and efforts through education, project support and ecotourism. It has been a highly

successful formula, with easy cross-cultural relationships and faithful financial management. It seems there are many Indonesian conservationists who flourish with ideas, commitment and energy if they are noticed and supported.'

Twice a year Claire guides ecotours and visits every project to discuss progress and manage funds. Ecotour safaris are very private with four to 12 guests benefitting from inclusion in conservation discussions. Every day the tour group goes on safari in the parks for wild animal viewing and visits project sites. Children and older people are welcome and encouraged.

After working as a vet for 25 years, Claire changed direction in 2002, when she went on safari to Indonesia to see the orangutans. It diverted Claire's professional career and she became committed to assisting Indonesian wildlife.

'The experience of seeing the wild orangutans was extraordinary and I felt there was much that I could do,' she says. 'The friendly locals and people in authority are open to conservation and ecotourism projects.'

Richard agrees. 'The wild places could be lost altogether without international attention

and forest-friendly income for villagers. Everyone loves a safari yet tourism to Indonesian national parks is relatively unknown in Australia.'

The foundation started with Sakura, the baby elephant who was dramatically rescued from a well in which she had been entombed for two weeks or more. The park rangers asked for help to close the wells. The story, 'Pits of despair', ran in *The Sydney Morning Herald* in 2008, bringing support and dollars, and the fund was born. The fund has employed local villagers for the last two and a half years and more than 2,000 wells have been filled.

'Elephants, tigers and rhinoceroses have been dying in these wells since the park was created in the 1980s. We have brought an end to it. It is so satisfying to have this successful outcome,' said Claire.

According to Ross Krippner, fireman and property investor, whose young family has enjoyed the safaris, 'Our new focus is to help the Kerinci-Seblat tiger corridor, which is frequented by 12 to 16 tigers – a significant number for such an endangered species. The corridor is under threat of deforestation and is being overrun by human habitation. We are committed to building safari ecotourism to the area to help protect the tigers, while also assisting the community.'

'Ecotourism safaris are a win-win for everyone,' said Claire. 'The guests have an opportunity to see an amazing range of rare, wild animals and meet the most committed local people. Most guests respond by saying "I was amazed to see so much wildlife and also fell in love with the people!'

A library is more than the sum of small devices

■ I am of the opinion that the letter penned by Michael Hayman (*Echo*, September 21) is intended to incite support for a new Byron Bay library. However, I will 'bite the bait' in support of a real library – as opposed to a library on a 'small device'.

Dare I state the obvious – I dare. How fortunate for Michael Hayman that he knows exactly what he desires to read, how to obtain the books he desires from the internet and can afford, not only the

expensive 'small device', but also the cost of the thousands of downloaded books – more than 'our local library could possibly house'.

According to Michael Hayman a modern library needs only a 'couple of chairs and tables with screens'.

Obviously Michael has never visited the new Surry Hills library which accommodates more than 'a couple' but has found the dozens of tables, chairs and screens to be inadequate to meet the need.

Of course, a modern library should have computers and internet access. However, no 'small device' can replace a real library that lures the library user into learning.

No 'small device' can replace wandering down corridors of books to, by chance encounter, discover a book of previously unknown subject. Viewing a 'small device' cannot be compared with, or replace, the pleasure of sitting comfortably in a chair and losing oneself in a 'hard copy' book. Reading

the printed word is far more relaxing than reading a glaring screen; especially on a 'small device'.

Tell me, Michael, how impressive is a copy of the Lindisfarne Gospels on your 'small device'? Does it inspire you to take a trip to Holy Island?

If the letter by Michael Hayman is not meant to be a witty support for a new Byron Bay library, then the thousands of books on his 'small device' must be comic books. Accord-

ing to the view expressed by Michael Hayman, the citizens of Byron Bay do not need a library because he has a 'small device' that caters to all his library needs. If Michael Hayman is serious – which I doubt – the opinion he expressed indicates a rather self-centred attitude that is not Byronian.

books, replaced by various e-devices. He can join hands in a big circle with all the other duffers who predicted in the 1980s that the paperless office was soon to be with us; that credit cards would soon lead to the cashless society; that the efficiencies of the computer in industry would soon lead to a 25-30 hour working week as the norm.

And I am still waiting for my Roger Ramjet backpack to turn up and replace my car, bike and legs. There have been many transformational inventions, especially in the past 300 years of the Industrial and Post-Industrial revolutions, but only the foolishly brave try to define consequences before they emerge. And usually, the more extreme predictions turn out to be way off.

Michael simply fails to grasp the purposes of a good library; for many library users it is not wholly, or even primarily, about books, papers, magazines, discs etc. A library is a social hub for readers in all fields at all levels, a hub where information is sought, offered and exchanged; where readers can discuss what they've read and pick up tips about what they might like to read next; where students can study and be assisted by professional librarians.

Reading might generally be a solitary activity, but for many of us it has a vital social side to it which expands our reading choices, our knowledge and – dare I say it – may help impart such wisdom as we end up with.

I am in Byron Library almost every weekday, sometimes for half an hour, sometimes a couple of hours. Contact with librarians (great people: they read books themselves and talk to readers about many, many others, and I tap into that knowledge) is always a part of my day's business. For me and lots of others our local library and its staff are a vital community asset.

The paper-printed word will be with us for a long, long time, I hope and suspect, and so with the libraries that have evolved to make them available in communities all over this planet over centuries.

I shall follow Michael's example and be foolishly brave: e-books simply won't cut the mustard as a universal replacement for paper books, but will be a useful mode of some of the reading of some of the people for some of the time.

So let's have our new, enlarged and better equipped library as soon as possible, equipped for both the paper-printed word and the electronic version. It will be well utilised in this community.

Time to take notice of the snails' alarm signals

Who always has a soft body covered with a mantle and often, but not always, a hard exterior? With a single flat foot and a mouth full of chainsaw teeth? Who has green blood full of copper? A net of nerve cells with a row of some knotted together into clumps? Optional extras are either lungs or gills or being of one sex or another or both. Size? From microscopic to thirteen metres.

Preposterous as it seems, for 570 million years, in the sea, in fresh water and on land, these are mollusks. Their many forms are all variations of the basic body plan. As limpets, they have a single shell like a china-man's hat. As clams, oysters, mussels and such, they have two. Being chitons, they live under a set of plates hooked together like chain mail. The squid and cuttlefish forms have a remnant of a shell shaped like a supporting rod which they carry it inside themselves. As octopuses, they have no shells or remnants at all.

Shells and us

Finally, with bodies twisted 180 degrees and tapered to fit into their single coiled shell, they are snails. Surely at some moment in your life, you paid special attention to a snail? Or perhaps it was a snail's shell?

Snail shells always mean something to humans. Cowry snail shells, threaded together into belts or woven into baskets, speak of wealth. They were used as trade goods from as long ago as 3000 BC, sourced from the Maldives. The shells became the standard currency for Africa, India and

China. They were legal tender throughout the Middle East and in Europe. In parts of the world, they were used right into the mid 20th century.

Sex changes

For centuries, science workers and teachers have dissected marine snails, counted them on shores throughout the world and observed their lifestyles. Although all snails on land are hermaphrodites, many marine snails have separate sexes. So in 1970-71, when researchers on both sides of the Atlantic Ocean reported an alarming change in females, everyone looked again to their snails.

Suddenly, adult female snails grew penises. This blocked the passageway used for the release of eggs. But the females did not become functional males. With their females sterilised, these snail populations died out.

By 1975, the entire southern coast of the UK reported a rapid decline of its dog whelk snails. This was directly related to imposex, as the deformity was called. In Arcachon Bay, France, imposex wiped out the

snails that drilled into commercial oysters. But the shells of the oysters themselves became deformed, their flat shape changing into very thick balls. In 1976, the oyster larvae did not survive. By 1980, the oyster fishery collapsed.

Not till 1986 was the cause traced to the use of organotins in antifouling paint on boats and fish cages. The persistence of tributyltin (TBT) in the sediments was finally understood in the 1990s. France, Japan, the US and several other countries limited the use of the biocide, but this did not halt contamination. The pollutant recognized no boundaries.

Toxic input

By 1998, the International Maritime Organisation legislated a mandatory global ban on the use of TBT on any craft after 2008. In 2009, a Japanese research team found female flounder larvae were becoming masculinised. This was the first report of a proven effect of TBT on a vertebrate animal.

From first alarm to global ban, 38 long years passed. All

the while, the seas and their sediments continued to receive this toxic pollutant. Like an ocean liner at full steam changing direction, our global response was slow. The full repercussions of our ignorance and delay are not yet upon us.

Though they make no sound, marine snails now raise a new alarm. The small snails known as pteropods have flaps on both sides of their single foot. They use these to swim through their home, the open seas of the cold Southern Ocean. Under certain conditions, they replace krill as the major food for many other species from small fish to great whales. But their delicate living shells are falling apart at the edges.

This prompted Australian science workers to comb through Antarctic data assembled over the past ten years. In 2008, they announced the collective weight of shells of one pteropod species has indeed declined. Another species simply does not appear as often anymore.

CO₂ impact

This time, the cause is already known. The increase of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere continues to be absorbed by oceans around the world but not without consequences. The chemistry of the sea is being changed. As it becomes more acidic, it also holds less dissolved carbonate ions in solution. It is these carbonate particles that snails use to build their shells.

The edge of its mantle, filled with nerves, matches the growing edge of its shell. The nerves 'read' the pattern of the shell created to date, both the white

carbonate part and the colours which are proteins. They then instruct the cells in the mantle to secrete the next row of carbonate and proteins as required by the pattern unique to its species. If the carbonate is missing, what can be built? Living in acidic waters, how to keep whatever's made from dissolving?

The last time we 'heard' snails, we took forty years to respond. Facing climate change, we humans have choices: energy savings, renewable energy, alternative lifestyles and more. Now, how quickly will we act?

Ten tips for sustainable housing

Whether you are building, buying or renovating, here are ten tips to consider with creating a more sustainable home.

- 1. Water conservation.** Use water efficient appliances and fittings, such as 3-star (or more) showerheads and water pressure-limiting devices, and include a rainwater tank to supply water for use with gardens, toilets and laundry.
- 2. Natural heating and cooling (passive solar design).** Good passive solar design allows your home to respond to its local climate through natural heating in winter and cooling in summer eg. good orientation and room zoning, capturing breezes for cross-ventilation, appropriate insulation, shading (eg. sufficient eaves), building materials (lightweight construction/thermal mass), and fixtures and finishes (eg. skylights and window treatment). Incorporation of passive design reduces the need to rely on air conditioners/heaters. It can also indirectly promote natural daylighting and improve indoor air quality with circulating breezes providing fresh air inside the home.
- 3. Energy and greenhouse efficient water heating.** Install a solar, natural gas or electric heat pump hot water system to lower energy bills and reduce the single largest source of greenhouse emissions in the household.
- 4. Future-proof.** The living area and at least one bedroom and toilet on the entry level should be readily accessible from the front boundary or car space to accommodate your changing housing needs as you get older.

- 5. Safe floors.** Design floors and showers to be step-free (hobless). Use floor surfaces that are slip resistant to guard against injuries.
- 6. Address the street.** An easy-to-read house number at the front of your property makes it easy to find. Good external lighting and separated driveway and pedestrian entries also make it safer.
- 7. Casual surveillance.** Design your home to have easy surveillance to play areas and the street from the main living area and kitchen for better security.
- 8. Long-term maintenance.** Reduce the repair and ongoing maintenance costs of your home by using low maintenance materials.
- 9. Indoor air quality.** Avoid materials that contain volatile organic compounds (VOC's), such as paints/finishes and adhesives, which can cause irritation and allergies, and impact poorly on your health.
- 10. Outdoor living.** Include permanently covered outdoor play and entertainment areas with a good relationship to indoor spaces to maximise your home's access to your region's favourable lifestyle and climate.

Remember to check with the council for any specific design requirement regulations, such as setbacks and plumbing standards for rainwater tanks.

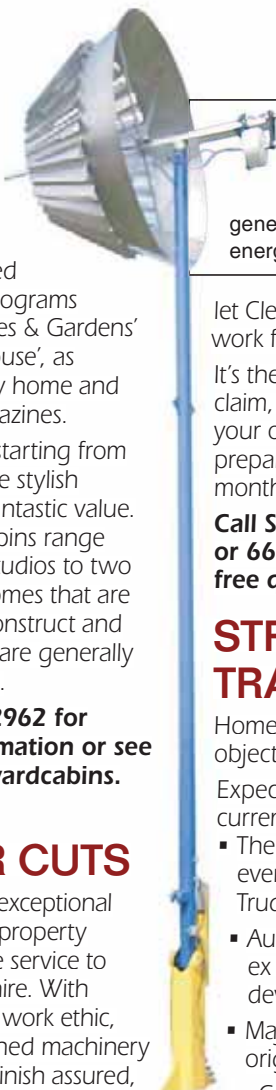

Blues and Roots Man ASH GRUNWALD plays the Hotel Great Northern this Friday; he's also a featured artist at Bellingen Global Carnival this long weekend.

It's his *Hot Mama Vibes* Album tour, and if the live gig is anywhere near as good as this album, then Ash is going to be cooking.

Ash *Hot Mama Vibes* is a wonderful album. I don't know - it's kind of Sly & the Family Stonish funkier than I expected; how do you describe it? Yep well it does seem to be a bit funkier in places than my past stuff. It's more just me exploring different elements of whats going round in my head. A lot of what I write these days comes from the beat first. Singing and guitar usually spill out pretty naturally in the studio so I just tend to go where the beat takes me. I really relaxed with this album and let it happen.

Why did you mix electronica with blues...weren't you worried that it all could have gone horribly wrong, like mixing chocolate with bananas...hang on, that works... Well that's probably why I took it slowly. My first album was straight blues and it took another four to get where I am now. I love electronic instruments just as I love my old National steel guitar. I've always gotten a kick out of combining the really old with the really new. Like in *Raw*; it's got chain gang sounds on top of a hip hop beat with an attempted sinister guitar riff. I hate the thought that if you're playing bluesy stuff you can't draw from now and mix it up.

So tell me about *Hot Mama*? It's just a little comedy song really. Bit of fun. It all came from that chorus. That's one I've been kicking around for a long time.

Do you think you're more comfortable with yourself as a person and as a musician now than when you first started? I think so. I feel like I can do

what I want musically because I've reached my goal of finding my own sound. As a person I probably feel less sure of myself the older I get for some reason. I'm hoping that's a good thing.

What are you prepared to do now creatively that frightened you a decade ago? What I'm doing now. Violating Genre boundaries.

Tell me a little about the recording process... where, how long, what did you go in there wanting to achieve? It was recorded over a period of six months. Most of the intital jams were done over email. Actually that was for the half of the album with the hip hop producers. The other half came from two days' jamming with the band in Brizzy and another two weeks turning those jams into real songs. With the band stuff I just wanted to have fun and see if we could lay down some building blocks. I knew the tough bit was going to be turning something from a fun jam with potential into a real song, but I love that process too.

GETTING YOUR DUCKLINGS ACROSS THE ROAD

Being a parent is terrifying. The moment my cervix dilated 10cm and a brand new human being emerged, I opened the door to a world of anxiety that I never knew existed.

Where before I'd looked around and seen a cosy room, I suddenly saw sharp corners, poisonous chemicals, gaping doors and finger mashing cupboards.

The world is not a safe place. I am reminded of this driving to Ballina the other day. On the horizon I see three tiny shapes moving onto the bitumen. A mother duck has decided that 11am on a rainy Saturday is a great time to cross the Pacific Highway. A little brown mother waddles in the wake of two fluffy little ducklings. In the middle of this 100 kilometre per hour death trap this story book scene unfolds. I hit the brake. If I ran over a mother duck and her ducklings I didn't think I'd ever come out of counselling. Jesus, is there a DOCS for ducks? What the hell was she thinking? You don't take your babies across a road. Surely whatever is on the other side is not worth being mowed down by an approaching vehicle! She makes it across. This time.

I am so moved by the fragility of life that I start to cry. My daughter looks at me like I'm nuts. I probably am. If I run over the ducks I cry. If I don't run over the ducks I cry. I think that I am that mother duck, and every day I must send my most precious beings into a world which may not return them. When I send my kids down the street to get a bottle of milk I warn them about creepy paedophiles with fluffy puppies, to be careful crossing the road, and don't use the Mullumbimby pedestrian crossing because it is more dangerous than jay walking. I tell them not to lick the receivers of public telephones because they're covered in hepatitis, that you don't sit on a public toilet seat because someone else's wee could touch your bum or you could get their bum germs and get herpes or festering bum sores.

Don't drink water in plastic bottles that have been in the sun because you'll get cancer, don't eat margarine because you'll go blind, don't eat sugar because you'll get diabetes, or fat, or cancer or both, don't make friends with weirdos on Facebook in case they stalk you then meet you at a train station and murder you.

Don't put buttons or foreign objects in your mouth because you'll choke. Teenage girls take note, that also goes for penises. Don't get immunised, you could end up with a disability. Get immunised, because you could end up with a disability or a nasty case of Byron Shire Whooping Cough, or dead from diphtheria or tetanus or polio. Bang on the backsteps before you walk down because brown snakes live under the house.

Don't eat unwashed lettuce because you'll get botulism. Don't talk on the mobile for too long because you'll get a brain tumour. Don't lick leaking batteries. Don't ride your bike. Don't swim in estuaries, there's some weird flesh-eating bacteria. Don't hit your brother with a cricket bat. Don't get in the car with stoners. Don't hitch hike, you could get picked up by some out of control psychopath. If you are driving don't pick up hitch hikers, they could be out-of-control psychopaths.

Don't take drugs like I did. Don't drink. Don't smoke. And you know what, don't drive, there's nowhere really worth going anyway. Just stay at home. With me. Until you're forty. And no one wants you. It will be just you and your Mum. There's nothing creepy about that. I can't get the ducklings out of my head. I'm worrying about them every day. I can't sleep for thinking of all the mothers who don't get their ducklings across the road. It's the absolute powerlessness of it that frightens me. It's 3am. I'm in an insomniac stupor. I get in the car. I drive to Ballina. I wait. Mother Duck emerges from the grass with her babies. I bag them. Chuck them in the boot and drive them home. I lock them in the bathroom. They're safe. I fall asleep. I wake to a scream of a child wandering to the loo for a morning pee: 'Mum I've been attacked... by a duck!'

Was the outcome what you expected? Well I didn't really have very firm expectations. I just finished the songs and tried to make them sound as good as they can be. Sometimes it's like the song already exist and you're just bringing it to the surface. That was a key difference for me in this album. It didn't need to fit together as one coherent work. I was actually thinking if there's a lot of variation, all the better.

It's all about choices isn't it, so many different ways you can go with an album ...How does the technology you choose create the path that you need to follow? Well maybe one or two songs on the album could have happened in the analog days but the most part they were done using a lot of loops. Especially for the tracks I did with the Trials, Countbounc and Chasm, it was also a case of emailing to and fro. The fact that you can jam over email and have the track almost finished before you've even talked on the phone is amazing. That's pretty much how it was with Trials. I was in Canada and then later in Byron while I was working on a collab with the Funkoars and I still hadn't even heard his voice. What I found really interesting is that the impression I had of him through the typed word was pretty much exactly how he is in person.

Do you think that each new album needs to contain footprints of what has come before, or is it always a brand new process? Usually that's what I try to do. I've never liked it when my favourite musos have gone on massive departures so I try to take the audience with me as well. Having said that. I'm not sure if fans of 'Introducing' would love 'Hot Mama Vibes'.

Which track are you proudest of? There's a bit in 'Change'. Just this ascending little riff that I played on the guitar, but it sounds sort of like demonic heavy bass in a really up happy song and I'm really happy with that bit. But for the most part I need to take a few years before I can see it with any objectivity, and even then, it will be coloured by my views at the time. It's probably good not to get too attached in a way because it's all just a matter of opinion. I love the beats on a few of them too.

What should we be expecting for the Byron show? I've got the four piece who played on a lot of the album. Fingers Malone is on kit drum, Synth and Mpc, Kanchana is playing African percussion and Djing plus playing MPC, and Benny Owen is playing the car door, Djembe and a Sink. I'm still doing the one-man-band thing in the middle of the cacophony, so there's a fair bit of percussion up there!

Sunbeach full of Cowgirls

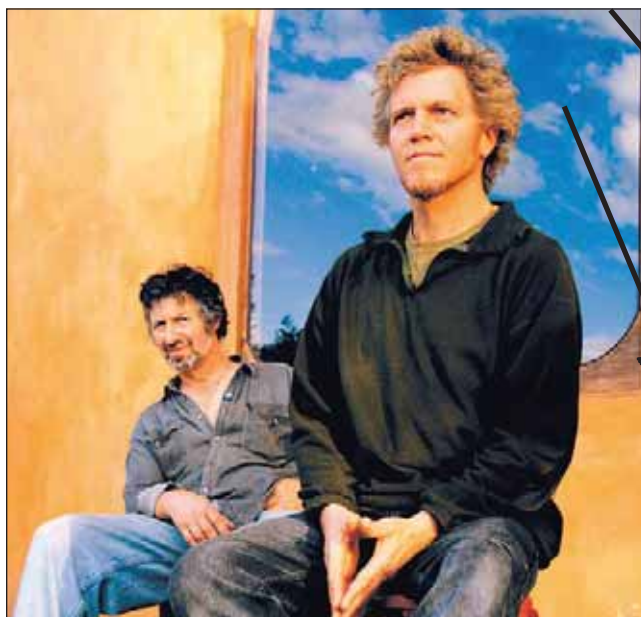

Was to be expected really hahaha.

What does gospel mean to you... Do you feel that intensity on stage when you are singing and performing... It's my roots, it how I learned to sing and where my passion and devotion to music was born.

Can gospel music be transformative? Of course... all music is.

You are working with Mohini Cox - tell me about the collaboration? We're bringing our individual styles together and are working on some tunes together. I've sat in on some of Mohini's shows and look forward to seeing how this collaboration develops.

They say you never really know a person until you sing gospel together.

And the band? Tell me about the players. Geoff Wright is MCing, got some dudes from my soul band (Dave Sanders, Max Stowers and Connor Fitzgerald) and another keyboard player who's name escapes me... sorry).

I remember seeing a Clarence Fountain and the Blind Boys from Alabama gig when I was in my early twenties and it made me weep but feel ecstatic at the same time. Why do you think Gospel touches people so profoundly? Because it's devotional in nature and emotional and so harmonically beautiful it's difficult to not be moved. I get shivers, my stomach aches (with tenderness) and I am often in tears. I will try and keep it together for these shows.

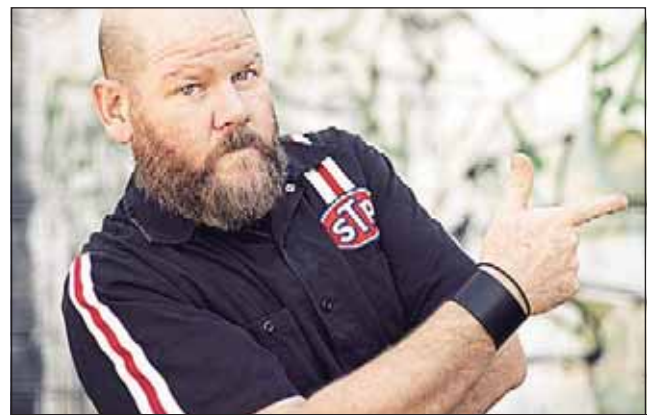

After the gig I said 'Meet me in the carpark. You can follow me back to Byron.' I go back to the carpark. There's three cars. Akmal is gone. I drive around looking for him. I give up and go home. At about 1 in the morning I get a call from Akmal who's out in Federal somewhere: 'I think I followed the wrong person home! He'd followed some dude back to his farm. I can't imagine what the bloke thought when he was confronted by an Arabic Australian comedian in his driveway after midnight.'

I've known Akmal for years so it when the rest of the world discovered him, all us comics went, yep, he's a fricking funny man. Akmal's popularity as a comedian has increased considerably over the last 10 years due to his regular appearances on national television shows such as *Rove*, *Good News Week*, *The Glass House* and "Thank God You're Here." 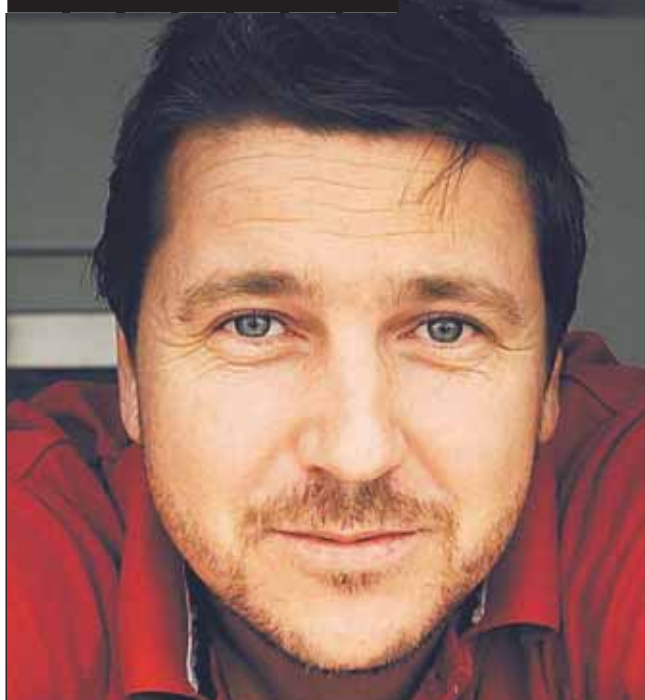

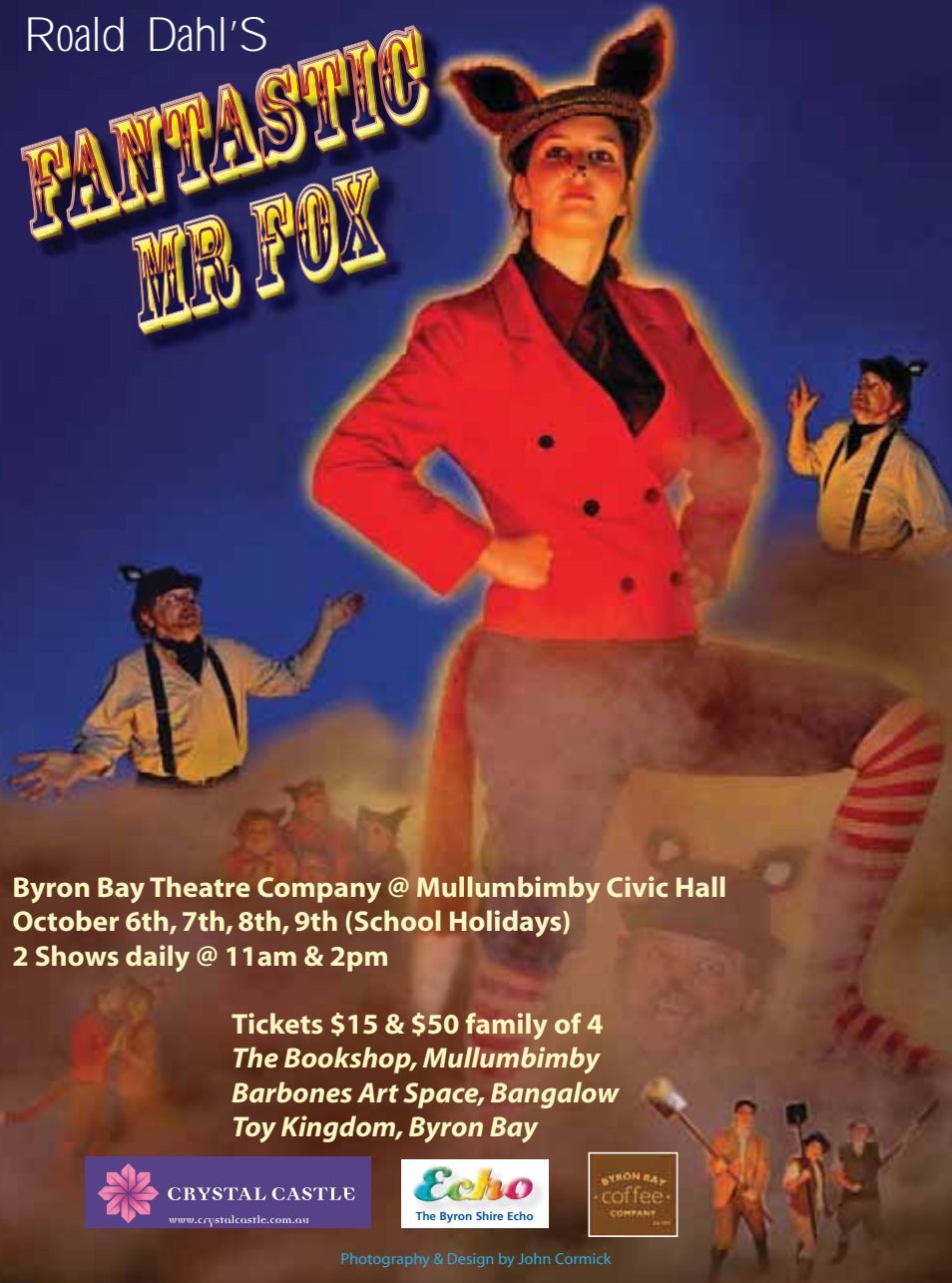

The Byron Theatre Company are getting ready to stage their latest production for the school holidays: their own adaptation of Roald Dahl's **Fantastic Mr Fox**. *The Echo* caught up with **Sandesh Gibney**, the Director and actor **Ruby Walters**.

Ruby what has drawn you to acting? I see the process of acting as an exchange and I think it is great that we give something to the community and as a teenager it is great to be able to get something back... like a focus... something to get me through school!

What do you think you bring to the stage as a story teller? Enthusiasm.

How did you enjoy your role in Engine?

The thing I loved about it most was working with Norpa, and seeing the two main actors transform between characters was like witnessing a miracle.

Kids are so turned onto DVD's and films, do you think they still get theatre? Can it give them something extra? Yeah! Contemporary theatre is something else. It is metamorphed into something t.v and movies just cannot produce... realism. Having someone give something like that, in the flesh, is amazing.

Tell me about the character you play in Mr & Mrs Fox? I read the book when I was younger... and thought Mrs Fox is a bit cowardly and pathetic, but this theatre production is portraying a more real mother who is strong and protective of her children and very supportive of her husband as he is supportive of her! Although it revolves around the children they share as new romantic love!

Why do you think theatre is so important?

Theatre is all about a live experience and goes back to the dawn of man, shamans performing

ritual for favourable hunting outcomes. Today, it is the only place where people of all ages can come together in one room... including actors, and if the show works properly, everyone will bond in an emotional response that is powerful beyond intellect. I could write a dissertation about it!

Why have you started directing children's theatre? I started because I have children and I love the theatre so much that I wanted them to experience it as well. It is also good for kids to experience live performance, something different from TV, movies, ipod screens etc.

What have been your challenges for this show? Working with children! You've heard the saying 'kids and animals'; we've got kids as animals, so it's doubly challenging!

What do you think is the strength of Fantastic Mr Fox as a show? So much audience participation in the show. With call and response, booing hissing and cheering and song. The audience are as much a part of the show as the actors. Another strength is that this show is introducing a number of kids into performance for the first time as the cast are mostly children. Having chorus within this how gives kids an easier entry level, rather asking them to stand up individually and perform.

What staging decisions have you made? It is a difficult show as far as half the story is in valleys, hills and woods of England, and half is where the animals in the story have their homes underground. So the challenge was to make it understandable for children in the audience where the action is taking place; either above ground or underground, and connecting the two.

CINEMA REVIEWS

The Girl Who Played With Fire

I believe that the Americans are in the process of making their own version of this Swedish serial (subtitles don't draw an audience in Bumcrack, Ohio), but the lasting impression I came away with was that I'd just sat through an over-extended version of one of those US cop shows in which they only use letters for titles, e.g. CSI, NCIS – the closing wrap you've seen a million times on TV. So apart from the language, and the graphic and, to be quite honest, rather gratuitous girl-on-girl sex scene, which is unlikely to survive the cut in the Land of the Free, I wonder how different it could be? You need not necessarily have seen 'The Girl With The Dragon Tattoo' (nor to have read the late Stieg Larsson's best-selling trilogy – I haven't)



to follow what's going on here, but you do have to concentrate hard, for an unfocused, unbalanced narrative at times verges on the incoherent. A new director (Daniel Alfredson) and screenwriter (Jonas Frykberg) go perilously close to losing the plot and if, halfway through, you ask yourself that very basic question, 'what's this movie about?', you might struggle to come up with an answer. Fortunately, Noomi Rapace is back playing the anti-heroine and potential saviour of the cigarette industry, Lisbeth Salander. She is simply sensational, but even for me her axe-wielding grand finale was a

bit much to swallow. And as for her having any regard for the wooden Michael Nykvist, whom she'd shagged in 'Tattoo' – give me a break! Cinematography is polished if tending to be on the bleak side and Stockholm makes a novel change from NYC and LA, but, at 129 minutes it is a bit of a test. I'd been reasonably absorbed by it until about the ninety-minute mark, at which point I fell out of its spell and just wanted it to be over. The first one was terrific, but its successor is nowhere near as good ... and, in the wash up, I still wasn't entirely sure who killed Bjurman. ~John Campbell

had become before Pixar caught up, this is a delightful, inventive children's movie with an uplifting positivity and refreshing sense of fun. It's screening next Wednesday as part of Kids Classic Movies at the Byron Community Centre.

Wall Street: Money Never Sleeps

Oliver Stone is a slam-dunk filmmaker who, throughout his impressive career, has been primarily concerned with 'the big picture' and the values and mores of contemporary US society. It is now twenty-three years (!) since his first scathing look at Wall Street and I for one couldn't wait to see the result of his return to the spiritual [sic] home of capital. I wasn't exactly bored out of my skull by the time I left – Stone is far too good at what he does to produce anything less than diverting – but let's just say I was glad to get back out into grubby old Jonson Street. Having never owned shares on the stock exchange, and because I am one of those plebs whose eyes glaze over when the business report comes on between the news and the sports, I was behind the eight-ball from the start. What are these people talking about? I kept asking myself, for the dialogue is mired in the jargon used by financial tycoons and merchant wankers. But I stuck with it ... the Armani wheelers and dealers have their story and are as entitled to have it told as anyone else. Relating to it is another matter, especially as events hardly ever leave the rarefied air of mahogany boardrooms and Manhattan high-rise. This undoubtedly is by design – Stone surely is making the point of how detached from Main Street's reality his subjects are, but it seems remiss of him to not venture, at least for a smell, into the world of "the hoi polloi" where the brunt of the Global Financial Crisis was most painfully felt – and is still being felt. In its most simple terms, it's about an idealistic good guy (Shia LaBoeuf), a Satanically greedy, unscrupulous bad guy (Josh Brolin) and the other guy, legendary Gordon Gekko (Michael Douglas), whose 'journey' (yawn), after he has been released from prison and re-entered the money market, will be charted. The written-by-numbers love interest (Carey Mulligan – sadly mis-cast after her beautiful performance in 'An Education'), is Gekko's estranged

daughter and LaBoeuf's girlfriend, but her part is of little significance compared with the macho posturings of the three men. Breathtaking aerial shots of New York's gleaming glass and steel provide relief from a repetitive and dense script, but the saccharine ending would make even Disney gag. As a Stone fan, I was extremely underwhelmed.

Me and Orson Welles

A wonderful coming of age story, intricately set in the world of theatre. This is a seductive film about dreams and betrayal; it faithfully recreates the world of 1937 as Orson Welles prepared to stage his controversial production of Shakespeare's *Julius Caesar* (in modern clothes) at the famous Mercury Theatre. The film's great strength lies in authentically recreating the reality of the era, the music and the personalities. The film is driven by an obvious love of Shakespeare and theatrical effects. Most of it takes place

in, on, under and around the stage. Lights, ropes, trap doors feature prominently, along with superstition, backbiting, bitching and a fair deal of spontaneous sex. We see what goes on – in front of and behind the curtains. Christian McKay (as Orson Welles) grabs our attention as the celebrated 20th century film director, actor, writer and producer with the distinctive voice and imposing personality. Not only does McKay give a great performance in this role of a lifetime, but he actually looks like the great Welles, himself. The other character (based on real events) is high school student Richard (Zac Efron) who happens on the audition crowd in the street outside Welles' Mercury Theatre. Welles takes a shine to the kid and casts him as Lucius, the lute player. Orson instructs the beautiful front-of-house manager Sonja (Claire Danes) to teach him the part. Pretty soon, Richard is love-struck, stage-struck and rehearsing beside one of the great artists of the 20th century. ~ Lounge Cinema

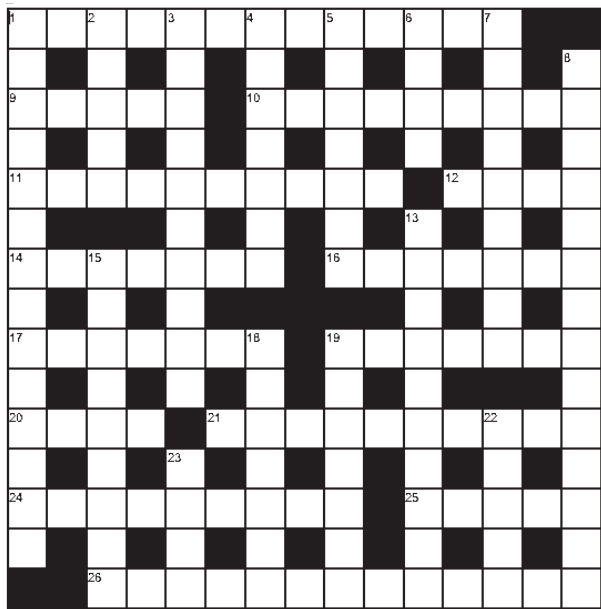

The early rounds of the 2010 Chess Olympiad have provided only modest encouragement for Australian fans.

After the long journey to the isolated Russian mining town of Khanty-Mansiysk, the Australians were pleasantly surprised to find that two of the feared downsides of a Siberian Olympiad - accommodation and food - were of a more than acceptable level.

Representatives from 138 other countries also made the journey to K-M, a turnout supplemented by the Russians ignoring the rules and including five home teams into the Open Olympiad and three more into the Women's Olympiad.

The first round saw the Australian Open team cruise through against weak opposition - Bahrain (4-0) - but they came back down to earth the following day by becoming victims of Armenia, the defending Olympic Champions (0.5-3.5). Australian Champion Zhao Zong Yuan was checkmated by world number four Levon Aronian and George Xie was crushed by multiple gold

medallist Gabriel Sargissian. However, David Smerdon gave some small respectability to the scoreline with a draw against former FIDE KO World Championship runner-up Vladimir Akopian in the game given below.

A third round win over Puerto Rico (4-0) was smooth enough, and also served to show that Smerdon - on 2.5/3 - and Johansen (2/2) were the Australians in the best form.

The Australian women's team has been having a much harder time, a far from simple 4-0 win over lowly Nigeria being followed by bad losses to Slovakia (0-4) and Peru (1-3). The Peru defeat was particularly demoralising, Australia's only point being scored on forfeit when the Peruvian second board player turned up just after the start of the round. (Yes, the crazy 'zero forfeit' rule, which ruined more than 40 games at the previous

Olympiad, is in operation again in K-M.)

To date only Nguyen and junior Emma Guo (on her Olympic debut) have managed 50 per cent scores for our women's team in K-M.

At the top end of the table, the strongest teams have yet to miss a beat. Russia remains favourite for gold in the Open Olympiad - despite missing out on the medals in the previous two Olympiads - while the Women's Olympiad is up for grabs, with any of China, Russia, the Ukraine and Georgia capable of repeating previous gold medal efforts.

Starseed: keeping Utopia within reach

When Dan Schreiber came to Byron Bay from London in the early nineties he found that it was precisely the spot he was looking for. Its alternative culture and open-minded community were elements he had sought in Mexico, Bali and Hawaii in his quest for 'the right place' - which none of these places were.

Dan and I are sitting in the nearly-completed tea-house at Starseed Gardens, just out of Byron Bay. He has poured us oolong tea - the Beaujolais of green teas, he tells me - which we sip from tiny cups as he describes his plan.

South African-born, he is a self-taught herbal healer and horticulturist, creative director of Starseed - and 'I've also been called a visionary', he says. With a background in the life sciences - oceanography, botany, zoology - he would prefer to describe himself as 'just into nature', or perhaps Dr Seuss's character Lorax, 'a friend of the trees'. When he arrived he was looking for somewhere to build some botanical gardens here, with the notion of gradually introducing cultural elements into it. For a while he was 'living quite happily up in the hills' at Upper Wilsons Creek, but then he started to realise that 'the very thing I'd moved to Byron for was becoming eroded, marginalised - like the buskers in the street'. And so he devised a 25-50-year plan.

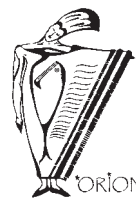
'Instead of trying to change the whole area I wanted to create a pocket set in gardens and not in the CBD, so people could come and visit and see what Byron is for. Town is not a true representation of the culture that exists in the hills.' He wanted to 'design a forum for our incredible artists and healers, thinkers and musicians', a microcosm or a model, perhaps, of a utopian vision. In fact Starseed's website features the words 'attainable utopia'. 'I think that communities have to find a way of finding out what's of value and keeping it there - like the Barossa, for example, which has a strong traditional culture of growing food', Dan

says, 'Where's our whale and dolphin festival, for example? - given whaling was one of our early industries... people who come here are drawn by the cultural dynamic that is alternative and it's vital we nurture it. We have the highest incidence of creative people per capita in Australia.'

Dan found Jagers Piggery, off Skinners Shoot Road, which up until 1995 was the most hi-tech piggery around. It is 80 acres of pasture, spring-fed dams and the old piggery buildings themselves - the tea-room, for example, all recycled bamboo floors, spiral deck, old wooden chests and fuschia cushions on the floor, was the pig-loading building. Starseed itself is 'a loose co-operative' of about 15 members. Wwoofers help out and there is a core group of six 'who are directing the energy'. That energy is being poured into the garden nursery itself, which will ultimately specialise in culturally significant ethno-botanical plants traditionally used for food and medicine; workshops on a host of topics such as organic gardening, biodiversity and solar economies; building wood-fired ovens and Polynesian earth ovens; bamboo-building festivals and mushroom cultivation. It sounds so ambitious, and yet Dan is in no hurry, one of the most relaxed and gentle people I have met. All of this started about ten years ago, close enough to Byron so that it was accessible for people to come out for day sessions but far enough away.

'We're going to organically grow these botanical gardens,' he tells me, 'but we're growing everything from seed... What I'm doing is drawing from so many traditional cultures - there's very little that is actually new. A lot of these things aren't really complex. The elegance of their solution may be found in the bass notes of culture - food, music.'

Starseed Garden nursery 'is the home of plant-human culture and relationships'. Its regularly updated website, which features future events, is www.starseed.co.

Of course one man's pleasure is another man's trapped-in-a-stalled-lift-with-a-deodorant-salesman. There are those who don't want the inexpensive deal – they want to be seen in the cool new thing, their presence radiating their wealth and hipness. ('Cool' and 'hipness' are words which used to be cool and hip in the 1950s. It may be 'sick' and 'awesomeness' now for all I know.) Part of that is to do with prestige, much of it is about seduction. Restaurants are foreplay. Restaurants are also a night away from the blue light of the TV and the washing-up. You can pitch your eatery as a pair of comfy slippers rather than a slinky negligee in that case. And restaurants are

also about the tribe. Catching up with friends or, in some cases, joining another tribe – pretending to be part of a boisterous Mediterranean family in a trattoria, for instance.

Tribal concerns are also a big part of pitching food in the wider market. The junk food pushers are all over it, but now the real food growers are taking them on at their own game. If you were lucky enough to watch *The Gruen Transfer* on ABC TV last Wednesday – this program is a fabulous insight into how our minds are forked with – you would have had a taste of the new paradigm in vegetable marketing. Ad agency Crispin, Porter and Bogusky has created a brilliant campaign for baby carrot giant Bolthouse Farms. It positions baby carrots as extreme junk food for teens and offers the pimply consumer an iPhone game and hilarious promotional videos which take the piss out of themselves.

According to Omid Farhang, VP and creative director at CPB, 'Carrots are crunchy, orange, disposable, munchable and portable. They basically share all the exact same qualities as some of the more insidious junk foods. The only thing that was missing is the marketing.' You can see it all, complete with heavy guitar riffs, at www.babycarrots.com. You still get the junk packaging but at least the kids are eating something with actual nutrition in it.

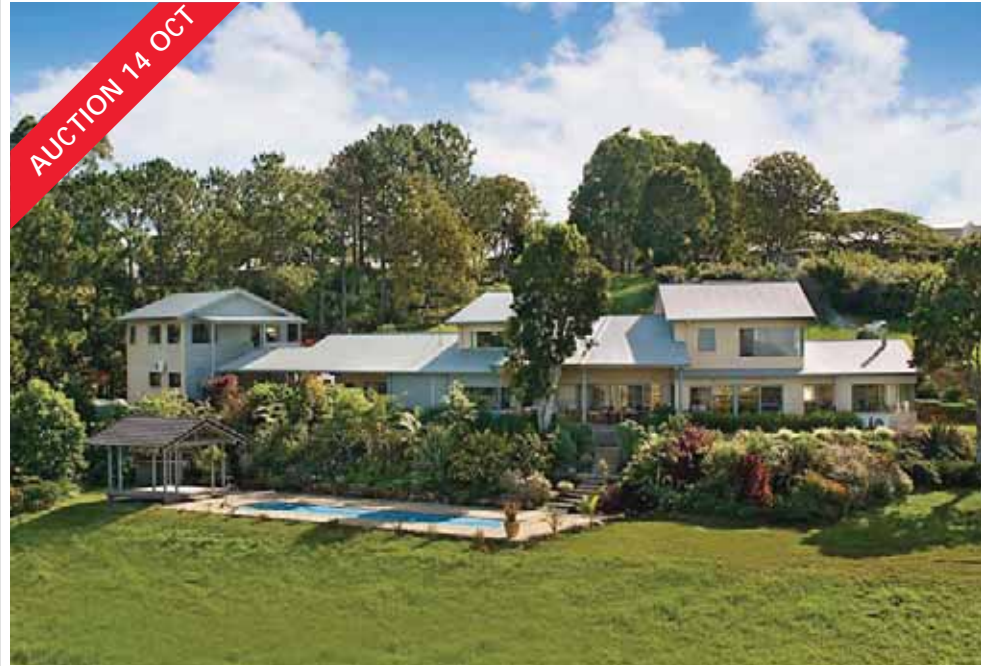
