

Watch out for land grab: Morrisey

agement Authority (LPMA) has gazetted a declaration that it has 'acquired by compulsory acquisition process for the public purpose of public recreation' a small parcel of land near Ferry Reserve Caravan Park owned by Rous Water.

'While the Gazettal was published back on April 1, 2010, this information may be quite relevant to residents of Brunswick Heads hoping to influence the way the LPMA plans to redevelop caravan parks in their town.

'If they don't get to swap the land with Byron Shire Council, they may choose other

'On October 7 Council unanimously rescinded a previous resolution to enter into a land swap with LPMA as a result of the concerns raised by residents of Brunswick Heads about the potential impact on the amenity of the town.



Fight on against new Optus tower

Residents of Ocean Shores are preparing to dig in their heels in the fight against the proposed Optus telecommunications facility at the Devines Hill lookout, which will include a 30 metre monopole and three panel antennas.

Two women who live directly below the site have prepared a detailed document for Byron Shire Council. Kerry Scanlon and Tina Beattie have worked tirelessly to assemble the submission which outlines the major issues with the construction.

Negative impacts

The pair have listed what they see as the negative impacts of the tower, the issues of vision and noise along with concerns for community health, the environment and property values are among the reasons put to Council for denying the Optus application.

'Residents do understand that this type of infrastructure may be required but we are adaleast 300m from residences and the facility grow in size and beschools, say the women, who come more imposing. both live on Scanlons Road.

Their submission states that not only will the tower have a dramatic effect on the scenic television transmission tower

crease this problem.

There is also a growing body of international research to suggest that continual exposure to electromagnetic and radio-frequency emissions can lead to long-term health risks, including cancer.

Away from schools

The document for submission says that the Australian Communications and Media Authority recognises this public concern and their code of practice for the installation of all new telecommunications infrastructure states that when selecting sites, community sensitivity must be taken into consideration and towers should not be located near homes or schools. 'Optus states in their DA that this is their preferred site, not their only option, say Kerry and Tina. 'Due to the greater coverage from this location, it is reasonable to assume that it would also be the cheapest option for them.

'By finding a more appropriate location for a telecommunications tower, other telecommunications companies will be obliged to co-locate. We ask Council to look at all the options and consider the best interests of all residents.'

It is expected that Council will look at the issue within the next few weeks.



A recent advertisement put forward some sensationalist claims regarding our proposal. We make the following comments in reply:

62% of our site is to be permanently set aside for eco system support purposes.

Approximately 110 hectares (264 acres) will be kept exclusively for habitat protection and enhancement, with a further 50 hectares (120 acres) used for low scale, low intensity agriculture. The 37% of the site that is proposed to be available for cultural events will have little to no activity for 280 days each year. The permanent structures proposed have a total floor area occupying a miniscule 0.07% of the site. Hardly "industrial scale".

North Byron Parklands is proud to be able to create 210 full time equivalent jobs plus thousands of external employment opportunities particularly in the creative industries and cultural tourism sectors. Jobs for locals, especially our young adults mean they can live (and own a home) in their own community.

We know that traffic is a serious consideration - that is why we took advice from Australia's leading traffic engineers. For a 70% capacity event we must ensure that car occupancy is 2.9 people or better and use of public transport is at least 39%. To run a 100% capacity event we need to achieve 3.2 people per car and 39% use of public transport.

Our ecological commitments meet and exceed Byron Council's Biodiversity Conservation Strategy desired outcomes for wildlife corridors and habitat protection - thus we are effectively increasing the size and function of the Billinudgel Nature Reserve. Adjoining the Nature Reserve, our land can act in an ecosystem support function. Biodiversity cannot be sustained in Nature Reserves alone and the contribution of well managed habitats on private lands is widely recognised to be vital to conserving native ecosystem functions, especially the ability for animals to travel from one place to another.

Social responsibility - We have committed to ongoing consultation and the Community Grants Fund, which will distribute funds to assist local community groups. The fund will provide the community over \$1 million each decade.

Our site is no more at risk of bushfire or flood than Council's new Ewingsdale sports centre or some of the residentially zoned areas of Fern Beach, Ocean Shores, Mullumbimby, Byron Bay and Suffolk Park. A photo used showed site flooding on 30th June 2005. What this ad did not disclose was that the flood was officially recorded as a 1 in 100 year event which caused widespread flooding throughout residential and commercial areas in the region.



A world class sustainable event venue for the Byron Shire

The proposal for a permanent sustainable cultural event venue on North Byron Parklands' 660 acre site at Yelgun is now on public exhibition with the NSW Department of Planning.

Your supportive submission will make all the difference to the success of the proposal

- The event usage proposed is in grazed pasturelands covering less than 50% of the site, leaving the majority for habitat use and bush regeneration.
- Approval has been sought for up to 20 days of events each year:
 - Minor events less than 300 patrons no daily limits proposed
 - Small events 300 to 3,000 patrons no more than 4 event days per year



Conference looks at mental health issues

Recently there's been an increase in local suicides. Mental illness can lead to suicidal intention or suicide attempts impacting gravely on many people and the community at large. How well does the current health system care for people suffering from mental health problems?

'Primary prevention of mental health issues should start in the community with support from the health care professions, says Dr Anthony Solomon, Co-director of the Byron Integrative Medicine Conference. 'Psychiatry is often practised as secondary care which people receive when they are already in crisis.

'It's so much harder to help when people are already in the

New project aims to inspire local youth

Clare Hopkins wants to get kids thinking in a different way. The local woman and parent of a 16-year-old has initiated a project designed to inspire young people in Year 10 through involvement with members of the community.

Project Inspire, supported by new principal Peter king, will be run at Byron Bay High School from November 15 to 19. It will consist of two and a half hour practical workshops conducted by local adults who are prepared to pass on a particular skill or passion, thereby equipping the students with practical examples of, and advice on, everything from ways to fill the holidays to choosing

Clare told The Echo that around 50 local adults are needed to conduct the workshops. No teaching or training experience is required, just passion, inspiration and enthusiasm for their contribution.

'I wanted it driven by the children themselves,' Clare said, 'so I initially surveyed five of my daughter's friends.'





Dividing the pie

Just when you thought it safe to forget about the word 'consultation', Byron Shire Council is back begging for your 'input'.

The state government, moving the deckchairs around until the Titanic goes under in March next year, now wants councils to produce a Community Strategic Plan (CSP) for 2011-2021 to identify your priorities and aspirations. Basically it's the old school management plan and budget but haul your aspirations out of the sock drawer and have a go, starting with the 36 page discussion paper – which will cut into the television viewing a fair bit – and the online survey at www.byron.nsw.gov.au. You also have to admire (or not) the staffers for putting their heads above the parapet and staging a series of 'Futures Expos' and especially the 'listening posts' at farmers markets, in the near vicinity of eggs and tomatoes. Zeus help us, there's also going to be a focus

But don't get your hopes too high. As Mayor Jan Barham points out in her intro to the discussion paper, Council is facing some 'challenging times ahead', which is code for 'not much money'. After the velvet glove of the preamble comes the iron fist within it, the charts and graphs which show there will need to be a spot of belt-tightening, rate-slugging and begging from our bigger government cousins.



You'll notice from this pie chart (gotta love a pie chart, makes a man want to learn Microsoft Excel) contained in the Council discussion paper that council traditionalists get a large slice of the pie towards rubbish and roads, those bits of bitumen between the potholes seeking to rival the popular mining cavities of Chile. 'Ecology', the bit of the pie which keeps us all breathing, gets only seven per cent, which is a bit of a worry, though you could argue that waste, water and recycling services also help keep the ecology together. The bureaucratosystem is obviously in healthy shape, though, with 'Corporate Management' devouring 22 per

The pie is pretty much humble pie – made originally from the 'umbles' or offal of animals – which the state government requires all councils to eat, and why the expression 'I hate their guts' is both etymologically and politically correct. Our part in this feast is to remind Council and NSW Labor that we'd rather not have this part of the State pillaged too much, thanks very much. Good luck.

As it is, it appears that while more Australians than not oppose the war in Afghanistan, they are prepared to trust the government: the anti-war movement is yet take to the streets.

Splendour were asked about their economic assessment which claims a benefit to the region of 192.6 million dollars. The bottom line is that there will be some permanent jobs created and some economic benefit locally with the bulk of the money heading straight out figures claimed.

What is completely ignored here is that this is the precise argument and type of economic modelling which has resulted in the Gold Coast being what it is today and yet they still have unemployment, crime rates and a vastly inferior lifestyle from what we have here. So why did we choose to live here instead?

If you're a working parent expecting a child after January 1st, there's something else you can expect

From 1 January 2011, Australia's first national Paid Parental Leave scheme will start. It's a new entitlement for working parents, funded by the Australian Government.

Taking time away from work for a new baby is a common part of working life. Paid Parental Leave will help parents spend time with a new baby, and help employers retain skilled staff.

What is Paid Parental Leave?

Eligible working parents of children born or adopted on or after 1 January 2011 may get 18 weeks Governmentfunded pay at the National Minimum Wage, currently \$570 a week before tax, to help them care for a new baby.

Am I eligible?

Full-time, part-time, casual, seasonal, contract and self-employed workers may be eligible. You must have worked at least 330 hours (just over one day a week) for 10 of the 13 months before your new baby arrives. You can have up to an 8 week unpaid break between two working days and still be eligible.

You can earn up to \$150,000 a year (individual salary) and still be eligible.

Is it for both parents?

Yes, usually the mother must apply for Paid Parental Leave. If you are eligible, you can transfer some or all of the pay to your partner (they need to be eligible too). The scheme gives families more options to balance work and family.

When can I take it?

You can claim up to three months in advance, and your pay can start at any time you choose from when your child is born or adopted. It will be paid in one continuous period from the start date and must all be taken within the first year after the birth or adoption You are encouraged to apply early.

What about employer-provided entitlements?

Eligible parents can receive Parental Leave pay at the same time, before or after other employer-provided paid leave or entitlements. The existing minimum entitlement to 12 months unpaid parental leave for long-term employees is unchanged.

What does it mean for employers?

From 1 July 2011, employers must provide Government-funded Parental Leave pay through their usual pay cycle to eligible employees who have been with their business for at least 12 months. Other eligible parents will be paid through the Family Assistance Office.


Morales calls this the 'commodification of nature' as capitalism rapaciously exploits more and more of the planet's natural resources.

'A few weeks ago I walked past an amplified busker out the front of the Northern and it was most uncomfortable to the ears. There was no crowd for him either.

'I have nothing against busking - it adds ambience to Byron and is a great incubator for talent. I find it quite acceptable if it is not amplified.

Another close neighbour is Bayside Court holiday apartments next to the petrol station on the roundabout, opposite the police station. Property manager Mia's experience is vastly different than that of the owner of Byron Motor Lodge. 'I haven't heard a complaint,' she said. 'We always ask guests how their stay was, and they have never complained about the noise.

Busking on the streets can be profitable, indeed tourist crowds are generous and are eager to have a good time. I have heard anecdotally that it is one of the best spots in Australia to earn money as a busker.

Remembering the deaths of animals, and our loss

For several months now, as the swamp wallaby decayed, I waited for this moment. Its flesh was eaten by the earth. The skin facing the sky dried in the sun. An ear and some skin remains attached to the skull. I swallow hard and sweep aside the last small beetles crawling about. Then I look into its eyes.

Or rather, into the space for its eyes. Seven different bones, each made for other purposes, create eye sockets. The larger ones house the brain, frame the cheeks and hold the teeth edge which together makes is 40 per cent more. the orbit, the housing for eyeballs. In there, I can see mal deaths due to land clearmemory.

There is the immediate memory of the animal who grew from tiny egg to an adult of maybe some fifteen kilograms. Part of his material life was a process that filled connective tissue with minerals and created these hard bones. In his role with other animals, he was a marsupial mate, parent, ally or prey.



It's been a hell of a ride since The Audreys first took their trademark roots/alt/country sound out of the studio and onto stages in 2006.

Their albums Between Last Night and Us

Their albums Between Last Night and Us and When the Flood Comes both took out the ARIA for Best Blues and Roots album giving them an enviable strike rate. They've just released Sometimes the Stars and are making their way around the country with a stop off at the Bangalow A&I Hall on Friday. Seven caught up with them for a quick chat.

You guys blitzed it back in 2006 with Between Last Night and Us and When the Flood Comes in 2008, does it raise the bar too much for the third album? Na, we're over that whole pressure thing. It's just really nice making a record and knowing people will hear it. We honestly expected to do a small run of our first record and still have a box of them under the bed, and instead we have a gold record hanging on our wall. It's crazy, we really can't believe it sometimes.

Does your studio sound change that much by the time it hits the stage?

Absolutely, it has to, recording and playing live are very different things. We recorded this third record with lots of guest musicians and it's been a blast creating new arrangements with our touring band.

What was the inspiration for this album? We soak up as much as we can from the people around us and create characters and stories for our songs. Some of the songs are quite personal too, but I'm not telling you which ones...

How did you guys manage to refocus yourself in the two years between this and the last album? We wrote the album over the last year or so in between touring, then took a little time off at the start of the year before we hit the studio. I went backpacking in India and Tristan chilled out for a while in the Adelaide Hills. When it came time to record we were really refreshed and up for knuckling down.

What makes it through when recording...are you able to pare back or is it impossible to weed through the songs that should or should not make it to album? On our previous album we had twice the number of tracks we needed when we went into the studio and found the culling down process quite difficult, so we tried a different approach to this record.

We went in with 9 tracks we felt really confident about, then wrote another one toward the end of the process when we realised the album was going to be a little on the short side. Actually the last track we wrote, *Falling Down*, was incomplete when we started recording it but we didn't want to confess that to our producer so I made up a verse on the spot. Oops, hope he doesn't read this...

What's your writing process? Tristan and I have developed a great partnership with writing over the last five years. Late nights and whiskey are essential ingredients.

Which is the part that you feel you shine, in the creative process, the recording, the on stage...does any one of these have more resonance? I love recording and watching the songs evolve, but if I'm honest I'd have to say that my favourite part of what I do is being on stage. It's such an adrenalin rush.

Is touring a necessary evil, or do you enjoy it? If you're not up for touring, get out of the business. Seriously. I absolutely love it. There's a freedom in the constant movement that you can't get from anything else. But sure, it can be exhausting, and I've missed almost all of my friends' weddings.

How do you prepare yourself for touring? Vodka, cranberry, dry ginger and lime.

Do you think you have more freedoms as an independent artist? I think so, although I don't have a comparison. It's important to us to structure our own career and set our own timelines. There's also no pressure from above for us as songwriters which is really important. No one's told us we have to write a top 40 hit – which is a relief. I look terrible in


Is the album you end up making the album you set out to make? How do you reconcile that bit in the middle?

Very much so. We're very proud of this record. We worked closer than ever with our producer Shane O'Mara this time around and gave each song a real chance. We loved letting the songs develop individually as our different guests added their unique touches.

What should we expect for the Byron shows? Our Byron shows may contain some coarse language, adult themes and pudity.

It took me until I was in my forties to sleep without fear.

Growing up with a single mum with no man in the house it was part of my feminine conditioning: be on alert because at any time some random bloke could climb through the window and force himself on you. There are times now where I'd jokingly say, fuck it, leave the window open.

But it's no joke. Those long summer nights with all the windows locked tight and the moths buzzing the toilet light was where I first learnt what it's like to live with fear. As I sweated in my bed in the nauseating Queensland heat, my mother and I lay waiting for footsteps that never came. Although we did find a pair of Neville Wesling's size 11 thongs in the front yard one morning after he'd got lost on the way home from the pub.

That deep insecurity about my safety has remained with me for years. When I walk to my car after a gig I hold the keys between my fingers so that if I'm grabbed suddenly I can jab someone in the eye. (I must apologise to the lady who ran after me to return the phone I'd left on the bar last weekend, but apparently she's got most of her sight back now). For years I dreamt of being pursued by predators. It was always a faceless male who'd chase me, try to break into my house, hide under my bed, in the backseat of my car. The dreams only stopped when one night I turned on my knife wielding attacker, wrestled him for his knife and decapitated him. It was horrific, but in the landscape of dream symbology I had faced my own darkness and taken control. I had stopped being a victim.

When it comes to this fear of sexual or physical violation I am not alone. Most women have always accepted that this is the curse of being born penis impaired. I was raped twice as a young woman. Once by a 'boyfriend' and

once by the friend of a friend. At 14 I was picked up on the way to a bus stop by a group of men who offered me a lift to the depot, then drove me to a park and tried to get me to perform oral sex. I screamed so loudly they drove me back to the bus. I think. The rest of that day is a complete blank.

In my twenties I experienced domestic violence. On numerous occasions I sported a black eye, a busted lip and bruised arms. And that's just me. One woman. And I'm a little more confident and self assured than most. So what are the rest of our stories? As a mother of four daughters it frightens me we hand our girls a legacy of sexual assault and violence. Just recently when with family in Sydney in Vaucluse, my 15 year old daughter was confronted in broad daylight by a man who asked to touch her breasts. Just a few weeks ago she and her girlfriend were swimming at Belongil when they noticed an 'old man' (must have been about 35 or so) masturbating in the sand dunes. They reported him to the police but were told that it happens all the time and there wasn't anything they could do about it. So apparently in Byron Bay it's completely fine to jerk off in public around kids. It's easier to spot an ejaculating penis in the dunes then it is to catch the sight of a breaching

whale. We should just put up

None of this is unusual. Most women have felt threatened or intimidated at some time in their life. We are scared to walk alone. We won't sleep with our doors open. We know that some footballers don't just play team sport on the field. We expect to be sexually harassed occasionally. Young women know that it's quite likely that they may have their drink spiked and end up in a sexual situation that they weren't quite prepared for. They know that there could be photos'] circulating on some social

Any what probably frightens us most of all is that any one of us could have been Diane Brimble. One night a year women are asked to come together, young and old, black and white, fat and thin, rich and poor to walk in solidarity and demand the right to live without fear and reality of rape and violence. When we march for Reclaim the Night, we as women demand the right to use public space without fear. This is not just a civil liberty, it is a basic human right. I ask you all, my sweet lovely sisters, to join us this year in Byron Bay at the Peace Pole at 4.30pm. The blokes can show their solidarity by cheering on from the side or at the back of the march.






Painting the Language of Death



I've found over the past year that I've had to really fight for it as I didn't want "it" (stand up) to have to shoulder the blame for my disease. I shudder to think who I'd be without this career.

How do you balance it with your role as a mother and caregiver? With my geographical circumstance, living in a remote town gives me a distinct line between work and home. When I'm home I chuck my mobile phone in the back of the wardrobe and I am really REALLY home.

Do you feel that if you were a father of five children that people wouldn't ask those questions? Is it different for male comedians at your level? Whatever obstacles to being the lesser represented sex in this game are always outweighed with advantages. There's less girls in this paddock but we bleat differently and don't get lost in the herd.

How do you approach preparing for new shows? Quietly! Seriously anyone would swear I'm sitting on my fat arse doing nothing when I prepare for a show. But there's a lot of internal handwringing and gnashing of teeth going on.

Is there a huge pressure to come up with a brand new comedy show every year for MCF? The Australian market tends to require about an hour of new material a year. Some years that is harder than others. Last year bloody-near wrote itself so I am toying with some new ideas for 2011... Shoplifting maybe?

Is comedy for you just joke teling, or is it something more? It's storytelling and it's no more special than baking or building or bean counting for that matter but it is no less special either. Some people have a knack for it and others don't so much. I have been fascinated with the rhythm of the spoken word since I was little. It's hard to explain but writing a routine is like writing a song in many ways.

Where do you see yourself in the next decade? I'd like to start telling other peoples' stories as well, by way of acting maybe. I mean Noni Hazlehurst can't do every role can she?

How do you stay funny? When you've had a shit day, how do you drag yourself on stage and give it your all? Dr Footlights is a powerful man! You can be feeling so morbid and heavy but the adrenalin from Stand Up (thanks to the audience) is almost miraculous at times.

What's your worst personal failing? I'm a bit gutless sometimes, you know? A bit of a fence sitter which can be attributed to the "please like me" gene in comedians. I'm also very physically lazy and a sneaky liar when it suits me... Hmmmm, charming personality traits all round when you see it written down.

What's your greatest strength? Probably my empathy when I use it properly. I've never been able to help it. I think I actually channel other people's emotional pain. Kooky I know, but that's what It feels like and the people who repel me the most are the people in very short supply of empathy. I hate them! See what I've done now? I've used my good for bad! I'm horrible.

The last book that you read that profoundly affected you? Christina Stead's *The Man who loved children*. Feminists aren't feminists just to be annoying. Feminists fought and fight because a woman's life will be turgid if it has no equity.

The last thing that made you have a deep carpet sob? I actually cry easily once or twice a day. My last carpet sob was two days ago when our mud brick fence in Alice Springs was taken away. It was like losing the canvas to our family memories. The seven of us have been cocooned behind that beautiful rambling wall for so long.

What makes Fiona O'Loughlin really really laugh? Sharing the funny with my peers outside of performance. It must be what Musicians feel like when they jam. And the funniest things on the planet are Humans! and I'm really not being flippant when I say that. Humans are a truly hilarious species. My favourite thing in the world is hanging out with other people who understand that. I could sit around with my favourite humans and laugh at other humans all day!

What kind of grandmother are you going to be? I want to be a haven as a grandmother. No rules... Food! Books! Laughs! Lollies! Movies! Puppies! Kittens! Sleepovers! Comics! What a lovely question? Thank you.

Let Me In

I'm the only person I know who prefers The Magnificent Seven to Seven Samurai (or who will at least own up to it). A movie re-make, almost by definition, is doomed to be dismissed by loyalists as 'not as good as the original, and history has generally supported that line. Having rated the Swedish Let The Right One In as one of my favourite films of last year, I went along to see the American director Matt Reeves's take on it with a 'how dare he' chip in my shoulder but I was more than pleasantly surprised. Comparing and contrasting is usually best avoided, but when the new version comes so hard on the heels of its precursor it is unavoidable, so the point must

be made unequivocally: Reeves, if not surpassing Tomas Alfredson's vampire masterpiece, has captured the intimate mood of it down to a tee. The story has been relocated to Los Alamos, New Mexico, 1983 (why the specificity of the date I could not figure - to suggest veracity?) but the setting is identical – a utilitarian block of flats and a junior co-ed high school at which twelve-year-old Owen (played by Australian Kodi Smit-McPhee) is being relentlessly bullied. When he meets his new neighbour Abby (Chloe Grace Mortez) in their apartments' frozen courtyard, the two youngsters form a shy, outsiders' bond. Reeves sticks to the important plot points - indeed, he all but replicates them - but there is a slightly



stronger focus on Owen and a tendency to make a Jekyll and Hyde monster of Abby. This is most evident when, in vampire mode, her eyes turn opaque and she screams and grunts like something out of a B-grade horror flick. It's an unnecessary and gratuitous concession to the thrill seeking, mainstream audience for whom 'less is more' is, literally, a foreign concept. The immolation scene, one of Alfredson's most startling, likewise loses its surreal ferocity when Reeves needlessly adds to it the near comical sight of the blood-splattered victim gorging on herself. Such excesses were anticipated and, though annoying, they did not detract from the eerie atmospherics. My problem, and it was only a piffling one, was with the children themselves. Their performances cannot be faulted, but they somehow seem a bit more mature than their Swedish counterparts - the girl in particular is nowhere near as fragile, strangely captivating, or different looking as Lina Leandersson (who, unfortunately for Mortez, remains too fresh in the mind). Otherwise this is a faithful reproduction of a work that remains unique. ~John Campbell

the money as we are dragged into the contemporary cool world of Messer (Josh Duhamel), your typical nouveau cretinous leading man (a 'himbo'). There is a reversal of the domesticity v career question when Messer, not Holly, is offered a better job in Phoenix, and a diverting contribution from Chanta Rivers as a social worker keeps things simmering without ever coming to the boil. On the way out I passed a couple of ladies who had that contented sconesand-jam aura that old biddies are wont to exhibit when safely hidden away from the vulgarity of teenagers and the inadequacies of no-hoper sons-in-law, 'That was good, wasn't it.' 'Yairs.' I don't know if I'd go so far as to say that, but, despite myself, I enjoyed it too. It's nice. ~John Campbell

Easy A

Is a comedy of morals and manners: it stars Emma Stone, who delivers one of the best female

performances this year, an act of such incandescent comic genius as to very likely foreshadow a career among Hollywood's greatest comediennes. The hilarious, rapid fire, laugh-a-minute script is built around the sassy, husky-voiced redhead in a way few films are; one just cannot imagine anyone but the superbly sardonic Stone in the role. Easy A updates the theme of Nathaniel Hawthorne's classic novel The Scarlet Letter, about a woman who is publicly shamed into wearing a mark to denote her sexual transgressions. However, while the heroine of the original story is forced to submit to the hypocritical whims of a colonial patriarchy, Olive (Emma Stone) not only stokes the fire of her humiliation, but to increase her standing at school, actually starts the rumour which fires controversy in the first place. This is one of the wittiest, most provocative, smartest high school comedies in years; it addresses the age old question of socially acceptable behavior with unrepentant pizazz and rare comic insight.

CHESS by Ian Rogers

Play at Byron Services Club, Mon 7-10pm

The Pearl Spring tournament features the three biggest drawcards in world chess - world number one Magnus Carlsen, World Champion Viswanathan Anand and losing world title challenger Veselin Topalov competing together in a serious tournament for the first time in more than two years.

One of the most anticipated tour-

naments of the year began in

Nanjing, China, this week.

Three other top class Grandmasters - Vugar Ĝashimov, Etienne Bacrot and home favourite Wang Yue - will take part but are not expected to be more than fall guys as the big three fight for top honours.

For the second time this month, chess fans in Australia have found themselves in a favourable time zone; after the Olympiad in Siberia, the Nanjing Grand Slam tournament can also be viewed live on the net each

The main chess web sites -ChessVibes.com, ChessBase.com and Internet Chess Club (chess-

club.com) - are offering excellent and varied coverage but for local fans the big news is that Grandmaster David Smerdon has been picked up as a live commentator by ICC.

Smerdon, despite remaining happily at home in Canberra, will make his super-tournament commentary debut on Wednesday alongside Garry Kasparov's confidante, Mig, based in New York.

The tournament pairings gave a bonus to Smerdon, as he will be asked to unravel the complexities of a Carlsen-Anand game, with the world number one ranking likely the prize for the winner.

Smerdon has long been an advocate for chess on television and in terms of attracting new fans to any sport television is still hard to beat - but after his ICC gig he may realise that there are already better ways to reach chess fans worldwide

As far back as 1997, when

internet access was far more restricted, the official site of the Kasparov-Deep Blue match was attracting more than five million hits. Now the audience tends to be spread around multiple web sites – sometimes to the chagrin of the official tournament site - but the numbers continue to grow.

Smerdon will not become a celebrity overnight thanks to his commentary but next time he wanders into a chess club in Buenos Aires or Delhi or Gaborone, he may find a chess fan happy to buy him a drink.
