

## **Minister's office responds** to Part 3A concerns

State minister for Planning Tony Kelly's office has denied ministerial interference in planning approvals through the controversial Part 3A of planning legislation.

The media spokeman said it was not true that around 95 per cent of Part 3A DAs get approved from the departments that are involved in the process of approval.

'In 2009-10, only 50% of new Part 3A approvals and only 7% of modifications of existing approvals were by the Minister - the rest were by either the Department of Planning or Planning Assessment Commission (PAC)?

'The number of Part 3A approvals by the Department for newly-lodged projects increased from six in 2008-09 to 43 in 2009-10. This follows the issuing of delegations by the Minister to the Department to determine a wide number of projects in 2009, reported in last year's Major Development Monitor.

'Similarly, the number of determinations by the PAC increased operation to refer determinations to the PAC.

'The PAC had a particular role determining project applications where a reportable political donation was made. Of its 17 determinations, some 16 were due to the fact that a reportable political donation had been made by either the proponent or an objector. The minister's office claims that the 2009-10 refusal rate for original Part 3A projects is 1.6 per cent of projects, and was comparable with the overall refusal rate for councilassessed projects under the Part 4 of the EP&A Act in 2008-09 (3 per cent of projects).

Lelli says concept was to take a fresh approach to how we identify with Mullum.

'We decided not to use the 'biggest little town' moniker that has been used for a while now.

'Instead we used the reported meaning of Mullumbimby as 'small round hill'.

'I came up with the question "what secrets lie at the foot of the small round hill?" to which the only answer is "Find out in Mullumbimby".

Lelli says she did a fair bit of the leg work going around and explaining the concept to the local businesses and seeking involvement.

## Set the information free

All three tiers of Australian government have been reluctant to let the public know what's going on, which is strange when you think they're there to serve the public. Party politics and bureaucratic control and sometimes just petty bastardry intervene in the free flow of information. There are legitimate reasons to restrict information, such as individuals' privacy and national security, but too often these reasons are used as excuses to hide wrongdoing.

The recently formed NSW Office of the Information Commissioner (OIC) is meant to serve the public's need for access to information held by the government. Yet already councils are claiming open access under the Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009 (GIPA Act) is jeopardising the privacy of members of the public in relation to submissions on development applications. This is a legitimate concern but it must not be used as a means to restrict access to related DA files.

Information Commissioner Deirdre O'Donnell is so concerned she launched a consultation paper today at the recent Local Gov ernment Managers Australia (NSW) forum in Fairfield, Sydney.

The Commissioner said the consultation would enable the OIC to develop guidelines on how local councils should apply the public interest test to decisions about publishing open access information that contains personal or sensitive information, with specific relevance to DAs. Ms O'Donnell said she would also consult with Privacy NSW as part of this process.

Hmmm, the public interest test. I can see a bureaucrat saying, 'Does the public need to know about this? Nah.' Not that I'm dismissing the right of the individual to privacy, but it makes a good lever for officious types to be 'frugal' with the flow of information. 'Commercial in confidence' is another good excuse often used.

'Consultation paper 1: Development applications and personal information on websites - issues for local councils', as it is so fetchingly named, is being distributed to local councils throughout the state. You can download it at www.oic.nsw.gov.au. Submissions close on Friday January 14, 2011.

You can also contact the OIC on freecall 1800 463 626.

Whatever the proposed 'freedom of information' enshrined in laws, some politicians and seat-polishers will continue to seek to negate it for their own interests. That's why whistleblowers are important to the news media and the public and why their role needs to be protected. Thanks to independent MP Andrew Wilkie, legislation is making its way through the federal parliament to allow journalists to protect the confidentiality of their sources. Australian journalists currently risk being sent to prison for contempt of court if they refuse to name a source.

Without the exposure of information through legislation and the courage of whistleblowers, individual freedoms can be chipped away and bad laws erode the intentions of a democratic, secular society.

Once freedom of information is established, the daunting task for the citizen – and the journalist – is to find the gold among the chaff. In the internet age this has led to a new syndrome, 'information rage', which is understandable when faced with a barrage of spam and advertising offers. Yet, as that slave owner Thomas Jefferson once remarked, 'The price of freedom is eternal vigilance.

## **Court redefines a fair suck**

It also provides a better response to changing market demands. The use of contemporary higher density attached and detached housing forms (accessory dwellings, residential flats, terrace houses and houses on compact lots down to 150 square metres in area) should be considered.

Most local people still boycott Woolies but few bother any more to lobby our council or state government when new development projects are not up to scratch, like lacking effective sediment control devices, stormwater pollution traps or when public parkland is being seized for infrastructure works like roadworks without any substitute land being made available for the loss of public parkland.

CHECK I Maleny lost too many significant battles over the years, and because of this sorry track record more and more people lose hope that there is any point in speaking out against inappropriate projects in incompatible areas. On the other hand those who were in favour of Woolies are proud of their arrogant attitude that their definition of progress has gained the upper hand and they are using their influence in getting their way with several other controversial projects around our region. If you dare to stand in their way then one becomes a target of all sorts of

But there is an understandment to the conventional delivery of higher density housing forms. This reluctance arises from valid concerns about the built form quality and residential amenity, particularly privacy and solar access. Unfortunately, text and numerically based codes designed to manage amenity impacts (the NSW Housing Code is an example) often restrain innovation and prevent best case outcomes. They have also meant that many councils require all the dwellings to be designed, documented and substantially commenced prior to subdivision approval and registration. This adds substantial development costs and does not contribute to affordability.

Detailed planning at the Masterplan stage, along with properly enforced urban design guidelines and controls for individual dwellings or streets, can allay the concerns that overshadowing, privacy, adequate car access, setbacks, building heights and other amenity considerations will be ignored by developers and their designers.

Personal attacks and discussions about what might have been will have little impact on the future of West Byron. Instead, let's debate the critical issues of housing affordability, mixing housing and employment land uses, density and appropriate development controls.

## Canines with character


The Wonderful World of Dogs by Candida Baker (Allen & Unwin RRP \$19.99)

## **Boycott Israel campaign launched**

Over 150 people from around Australia, including Byron Shire, attended the recent national launch of a Boycott, Divestment & Sanctions campaign in Melbourne against Israel's continued flouting of international law against Palestinians. A total of 197 Palestinian organisations have asked for international action and resistance against Israeli injustice

Bryan Dawe, political satirist on ABC's 7.30 Report and supporter of Palestine's struggle for self-determination, was the BDS conference MC who introduced international and Australian keynote speakers to address relevant Israeli/ Palestinian issues. Many Jewish organisations supporting Palestine contributed to the conference.

#### Life in Palestine

Anna Baltzer, a Jewish American Fulbright scholar who lived eight months in the West Bank and Israel, gave an illustrated talk 'Life in Occupied Palestine'.

She described living and working with Palestinian and Israeli activists and families of political prisoners; travelling extensively through countless checkpoints/roadblocks to reach hospitals, universities and farming areas; and environmental devastation caused by Israel's housing demolitions and building of illegal settlements (colonies).

Rafeef Ziadah, whose family was ousted from their homeland, now lives as a refugee in International Convention on UN Resolution 194.



Canada where she helped form the Suppression and Punishthe Coalition Against Israeli Apartheid. Rafeef described her earliest memory when in 1982 she endured 82 days of non-stop Israeli bombing in Lebanon, killing 20,000 inhabitants. People asked why US of persons and systematically technology was used against them and why the world was silent about the slaughter.

She said Israel is in violation of 65 UN General Assembly and Security Council resolutions. It is currently colonising Palestinian land, yet there are no sanctions against Israel for war crimes. She asks, 'Why is Australia, the strongest pillar of Israeli support in the southern hemisphere, supporting sanctions against Burma and Fiji but not against Israel?'

#### 'Apartheid'

The conference discussed the appropriateness of using the term 'apartheid' in regard to Israel. Although Israeli apartheid is not an exact match to South African apartheid, it does conform to the November 1973 UN

ment of the Crime of Apartheid definition: 'inhuman acts committed for the purpose of establishing and maintaining domination by one racial group or persons over any other group oppressing them?

The BDS campaign calls for worldwide pressure on governments to impose embargoes and sanctions against Israel - cutting ties economically, politically, militarily and culturally - until it meets international legal obligations in recognising Palestine's right to self-determination. It calls for an enduring, just and equitable solution for all:

1. ending occupation and colonisation of all Arab lands and dismantling the Wall;

2. recognising the fundamental rights of Arab-Palestinian citizens of Israel to full equality; and

3. respecting, protecting and promoting the rights of Palestinian refugees to return to their properties as stipulated in

## What does animation sound like?

Animation has delivered many memorable and widely recognised cinematic moments from the global expansiveness of Happy Feet to the wonder and creativity of Spirited Away - but what is it about this film genre that captures our imaginations so fully?

Dr Rebecca Coyle, head of School of Arts and Social Sciences at Southern Cross University, believes the role of sound and music in animation is at the same time a critical element for the success of an animated film and also an under-researched and underrepresented subject in animation literature.

## How green is your shred POTOMAC Facebook?

Sometimes it's hard mentally to connect the world of the personal computer with the real world and its environmental issues. Sure, we use power when we use a computer, but so do all those sites we visit in cyberspace – think about how much energy is devoted to running the internet.

The social network is a large part of that energy use, and Greenpeace has set its sights on Facebook. While acknowledging Facebook's new 'Green' page – www.facebook. com/green – Greenpeace wants the company to take more action on its use of coal as a power source and to promote renewable energy sources.

Using Facebook itself for its campaign, Greenpeace has set up an Unfriend Coal page where you can send the message to the social network giant. On that page Greenpeace points out: 'Part of cloud computing, data centres and telecommunication networks will likely consume about 1,963 billion kilowatt-hours of electricity by 2020. That's more than the current electricity consumption of France, Germany, Canada and Brazil combined!'

As Greenpeace explains in its document 'Cloud Computing and its Contribution to Climate Change', 'cloud computing, used as a metaphor for the internet, is based on an infrastructure and business model whereby – rather than being stored on your own device – data, entertainment, news and other products and services are delivered to your device, in real time, from the internet.' It's the way of the future, and I'm sure most computer users would prefer the cloud to have a silver lining. Greenpeace says over 600,000

people, almost all of them members of Facebook, have joined its campaign.

'Facebook's new green page concludes "We only have one planet. Let's do all we can to protect it",' notes Greenpeace. 'Hopefully the page, and the energy-saving initiatives it describes, is a sign that the company is beginning to seriously consider its environmental impact...

'Other cloud-based companies face similar choices and challenges as Facebook does in building data centres, yet many are making smarter and cleaner investments. Google, for instance, entered into a long-term agreement with a large wind power producer this summer.' Facebook lists its recycling and computing initiatives on its Green page. The good thing is that Facebook users are joining in and leaving comments to either encourage or admonish the company.





#### Do you change your approach for the studio?

It's a lot more boring in the studio, which is why no-one besides musicians actually likes spending any more than half an hour in there. It's usually hot and sweaty, involves numerous arguments about inane things like how much compression should be on the snare drum or which guitar pedal is better, complaints about the lack of options nearby to get something to eat and complaints about not having money to buy food even if we could find any. Plus there is no-one there watching, so we don't jump around and break stuff.

#### What's your creative process? Do you jam, write songs and bring them to the band, impro?

Almost all of our songs have started as a recording of one of us singing something into our phones. Mine

are usually late at night when I'm lying in my bed and my wife is trying to get to sleep. Berkfinger's are normally when he's walking down the street and most of it is covered up by the noise of buses going past. From there, we play them to each other and try to decipher whether there is any musical merit to any of them and then start playing them. The best songs are the ones where they are fully written and recorded the same day that we start working on them.

#### How do you work up a song to performance level?

Once you've recorded the song, you can hear it back and remember what you did the first time around. If you've done it once, you shouldn't have any problems doing it again. The only trick is being able to do it while all the equipment is breaking and there are a thousand people staring at you.

#### How has Triple J's air play and support helped build your profile and fanbase? Is it noticable at gigs?

The most noticeable thing is that without fail at least 20 drunk fans will come up to us before the show and demand that we 'Play that 99 Reasons song that they played on the Js'. Plus, we can turn up to pretty much any town in Australia and actually have people there to see us.

#### What do you think it is about Philly Jay's live sound that is so resonant with audiences?

Because we bother to try. People like it when you try. They realise that you're not a jerk and that they're not chumps. A lot of bands don't bother because they might feel tired or didn't find something good for dinner or they are separating from their wives. That won't ever happen at one of our shows and people can feel that anytime we play.



### I PARK THEREFORE I AM

The handy thing about capitalism is that it

provides a measure. Using this model, increased profits prove that something is good, and economic loss of course means that something is bad. On reading Sonia Borenstein's article in last week's Echo titled 'Post Woolworths Maleny: Fast-Forward Mullumbimby' with the overriding thesis that the white toad that is Woolies probably won't gobble up all independent business, but will in fact bring more commerce to town and thus create a Golden Age of ample parking and cashed up shoppers, I was gobsmacked.

Woolies won't create new

commerce, it just funnels commerce that would have been directed to Tweed or Byron or Ocean Shores or even locally into its registers. Of course John Waterhouse (in partnership with Mallams who sold out to Woolies) reckons that the tactics of action groups have been scare tactics. He has a vested interest. He profited from it. The rest of us haven't. And many of us are quite prepared to cough up the extra bucks for our groceries if it means maintaining community integrity.

Cheaper groceries do not equal a happier town. Woolworths are not an organisation that established lower prices to assist the poor. It's to strangle competitors. Why does making money make things better? Is commerce the only measure we have any more? We pack halls to see David Suzuki and shudder in fear at his bleak call to arms for our tentative future, yet we can't move past the cash box when it comes to creating and protecting our own unique communities. God help us if parking ever becomes a measure of social wellbeing. In Bhutan instead of using Gross National Product to measure the wellbeing of their citizens they use a happiness index. Perhaps in Mullumbimby we could start using parking. We could take it national. Gross National Parking Index. The more parking there is, the happier the citizens. Every time we need to get our Prozac prescription filled we can be assured of a park right outside the chemist.

We have to stop using economic models to measure impacts and start finding ways to measure social impact. Social impacts of large inappropriate developments are much harder to measure. Perhaps we should come up with a GDI: Gross Depression Index where we can measure the number of alienated and isolated individuals who feel disconnected, and as that increases we'll know that profits must be up. When people are sad, someone's making bucks. In fact, the sadder the people the richer the country.

Ethiopians may be poor, but they're not depressed. They also don't shop at Woolies. Our small communities are being consumed by a sea of franchise outlets. Pretty soon (wind forward 10 years) our streets will become the streets of any town anywhere. Ironically, after the Botox, the collagen injections, the fake tans and the boob jobs we will look like franchise people. The same people in every town everywhere in the Western World.

It's sick. I have lived here for twenty years, and in that time I've watched us'lose' Byron Bay. I recently had a friend from overseas come stay with me. We'd lived together in Suffolk for six months only five years ago. She was on vacation from Switzerland and had brought her boyfriend Sven along for the ride. She'd told Sven about Byron, this incredible laidback place, this kooky utopian dream. 'A little seaside willage,' she cooed. She was shocked. 'It's like a city'. Sabrina spent three hours there and left. She hadn't come to shop – she'd come to Byron for an 'experience' of Byron which no longer exists. And before you get your BMWs ready to mow me down, I'm not bagging Byron. I love Byron. I still do. But we have all failed Byron. We sold her uniqueness to the highest bidder and then sat back and lamented that it just wasn't the same anymore.

We noticed that the tourists who were quite happy to pay top dollar in a low key seaside hippy town now leave complaining because it's overpriced and disappointing. We fucked it up. But don't worry, it's sustainable! I am tired of the word *sustainable*. As Paul Francis of Sea Shepherd said recently, 'sustainable' just means 'business as usual'. Nothing changes. Profits continue.

We need to become radical conservationists in every area of our lives. It's not just whales and koalas and orangutans that need our attention. The problem is in our backyard. The first thing we need to conserve is community. Social capital isn't easily measured, nor is community diversity and it's our diversity that's on the endangered list. So back to the metastasis that is Woolworths in Mullumbimby. And yes, maybe it won't be so bad. After all, you can learn to live with cancer. Until you die. All I'm saying is don't sell your soul for a parking space.



HARRY JAMES ANGUS has just returned from a three month tour of Europe and the UK with his band The Cat Empire. You'd think that one band would be enough, but when it comes to making the commitment, Mr Angus is polygamous, sometimes appearing with Jackson Jackson and sometimes, like at this year's **Mullum Music Festival**, doin' it solo! *Seven* caught up with Harry about what drives him.

## You have a unique voice, were you ever discouraged from singing? Is your voice your own personal trumpet...

My voice has changed a lot over the years. It's like your hair, you don't realise how long it's got until you see an old photograph of yourself. I haven't noticed it happening, but when I listen to old Cat Empire recordings they seem miles away from where I am now as a vocalist. I don't think my voice is my own personal trumpet though, I have a trumpet for that.

## How has the *Cat Empire* changed the way you approach making music?

The Cat Empire is a fantastic band to be a part of, particularly live. That particular group of musicians have taught me so much about the possibilities of live performance, the energy and the spontaneity.

#### What is the music that has most influenced you?

Early jazz – Billie Holliday, Louis, Count Basie and Duke Ellington. Lyrically, Talib Kweli and Randy Newman are two (very disparate) influences...

## If you were asked to cover three songs, what would they be and why?

Could be anything, depends on the mood on the day. There are a lot of good songs out there. Streets of London is one I've been singing to myself a lot recently...

#### How do you go about writing your own music? Do you jam....have ideas set, improvise? Is it different courses for different musical line ups eg Cat Empire, Jackson Jackson, solo...

The course of the music depends on who I'm working with... I try not to plan things too much until I'm in the right environment, with the right musicians. Then you just trust your instincts, and make some music happen. Occasionally I won't be able to get to sleep because I've got some idea buzzing around in my head but usually it's a collaborative process. My solo stuff, however, is just me (obviously). It's more about the lyrics, and the mood, and it comes gently in the afternoon.

#### Could you ever see yourself as a producer?

I've produced a few things here and there, including a record for my wife's band (Tinpan Orange) who are also appearing

at the festival. A producer is really just anyone who has a few good ideas to contribute to the recording process. I don't really like the word 'producer' though, it makes me think of a factory churning out dog food (which actually isn't that far from what most producers are doing).

## What is the journey of being a musician about for Harry James Angus?

Trusting your instincts, embracing the spontaneous nature of the art form. Keeping your ego in the right place. Trying to find your voice.

## What should people be expecting for your show at Mullum Music Festival?

The music I'm playing is very much in the folk idiom, just me and a guitar. No trumpets. The songs are stories, if you sit back and listen, I hope they will take you away to a strange and beautiful place. 








#### **Brilliant Moon**


This Monday at the Dendy Buddhist Educator Jakob **Leschly** presents *Brilliant* Moon, a documentary film about his teacher Dilgo Khyenstse Rinpoche.




The animation is simple

and beautiful, and archival footage powerful. It's only 57 minutes. Also Tenzin Choegyal, an amazing Tibetan musician, will play and sing on the night. It's 100 years since Dilgo's birth at the Shechen monastery.

The money raised from the screening of the film will go towards a building fund for sleeping quarters for the 90 or so young monks as they currently sleep in their classrooms.





#### What brings you to Byron Bay?

My teacher Dzongsar Khyentse Rinpoche has some students in Australia, a group called Siddhartha's Intent Australia, and as the headquarters is here in Brunswick Heads, he asked me to come here and lead the group's study and practice.

#### You had a relationship with Dilgo Khyentse Rinpoche...how did this affect your spiritual development?


Meeting Dilgo Khyentse Rinpoche made the spiritual path very real. He made the logic and brilliance of Buddhist wisdom come alive... he was the consummate human - warm, magnanimous, humorous, sharp, caring. But more than all that, he continually invited others to shed confusion. I felt he was saying "hey you, come on up!" There was never a sense that he was different, and yet there was no doubt that he embodied human perfection.

#### What were the lessons that have stayed with you?

Rinpoche's love and tireless work for others, his vast learning and accomplishment, his trust in his students and his commitment to them. And how he achieved this so effortlessly. Also he never established barriers between himself and others.

#### Why do you think there is such a resonance in Rinpoche's teachings even now? And why do you think that we in the West are so profoundly moved by the teachings?

I think what many persons in our time like about Buddhism, or Dharma, is that there are no mysteries, supernatural entities, or metaphysical absolutes. You're allowed to enquire, yet you're not stuck with merely the cerebral or academic. It is a living tradition with persons who have gotten it, been liberated, been willing to immerse themselves with the world, and share their



can yank us out of complacency. Like our body displaying imbalance and becoming ill is a sign that it is basically healthy. And then you do something about it - remove the cause of the illness and suffering.

#### Ironically, people crave enlightenment but fear suffering... can enlightenment be reached without pain?

'Nirvana' means going beyond pain, and the path to enlightenment is conventionally defined as the gradual discovery of how to embrace what brings happiness and avoid what brings suffering. Then again, less conventionally, the path also allows the freeing of the insight that sees through the insecurity that craves pleasure and fears pain.

#### Why do you think it is important that Rinpoche's story is being told?

Because modernity is depressed. After deconstructing all the fairy tales of Western pre-modernity and its value systems, it sometimes seems as if the only thing left for the inhabitants of modernity is to be entertained and gratified. There is a pervasive nihilism in our culture. The story of Rinpoche is a statement about the Buddha's middle way – Khyentse Rinpoche worked on himself and shed confusion. It is important that it be known that this can be done. Life is too valuable... we have greater things to do than fixate on some perceived void.

#### A lot of people around here call themselves Buddhists... I sometimes wonder if that's because they got a statue at Bunnings and popped it in the garden... does it ever worry you that the images of Buddhism have become part of our garden design?

Sometimes it's as if all we in our culture can do when we encounter the sacred is to objectify it. Photograph it, frame it, put it in the yard. Then again...whatever turns you on... maybe the Buddha statues in your yard will be some way of connecting to the Dharma. You might place some flowers and lights in front of it, and then you are already engaging with the sacred, and in some paradoxical way eliminating alienation and objectification.

How do budding Buddhists begin to practise? Can you meditate alone? Do you need a guide? Budding Buddhists should definitely study with someone otherwise they'll just be stuck with their own ideas. Buddhism proposes some very provocative perspectives. Which of course is very irritating - the teacher might challenge your ideas, and you might want to listen... re-evaluate some ideas and assumptions. Without a teacher, a teaching, and companions, one's dreams of Buddhism will just remain a fantasy.



#### How does a teaching become a way of life?

When you see there is no separation between the teaching and what you experience in life, and you appreciate the fact that the teaching pushes you to go beyond habitual narrowness.

#### Are great teachers born, or do they become great teachers through the commitment to their practice and their life path?

Great teachers become great through their commitment to being truthful and fearless. You could say that is the practice of their life path. The very point of this movie is that Khyentse Rinpoche was freed through his practice. Buddhism does not believe in destiny - you are the sum of what you do.

A famous Tibetan saying goes 'To know what you were in your past, look at who you are now. To know what you will be in the future look at your present actions.'

#### Why has the film come to Byron Bay? And how has it made it here?

It has a lot to do with my friends Mishaela Simpkins and Dominic Russell who wanted to share some of the wealth they found in Buddhism. We looked for a film that could be shown, and it happened that this movie had just been completed and never premiered in Australia. I'm delighted about this. It is in fact the centenary for Dilgo Khyentse Rinpoche's birth, and it is an unusually beautiful movie... very true to the culture and the spirit it documents.



#### Grandmasters often impress the general public with their ability to play a series of games simultaneously. A normal simultaneous exhibition might have 20 or 30 amateurs taking on the GM but much higher numbers have been attempted.

The Guinness Book of Records has attempted to maintain standards for simultaneous records, mandating all games starting at the same time, a minimum score of 80 per cent by the exhibitor and a minimum opponent rating of 1200 Elo points. The latter condition has been observed mostly in the breach, although only Susan Polgar's 326 player

shopping centre exhibition in 300 were school children, but 2005 was ruled out by Guinness. In February 2009 I witnessed

Bulgarian Kiril Georgiev play 360 opponents simultaneously in Sofia, an achievement which took 14 hours. Perhaps 100 of the opponents were very weak players but the achievement was nonetheless awesome.

Then, in August 2009, Iranian GM Morteeza Mahjoob played an almost unbelievable 500 opponents in 18 hours. Like Georgiev, Mahjoob trained for months on

the physical demands of the challenge - comparable to walking a marathon - but the strength of his opponents was hard to determine.

Last month there was much unseemly gloating in the Israeli press when Alik Gershon broke Mahjoob's record by playing 523 opponents simultaneously.

Of Gershon's opponents

with all of them holding the required 1200 rating the record was duly recognised by Guinness. However, this week a Tel Aviv newspaper exposed the fact that many of the school children were beginners, some having learned to play chess only the day before Gershon's record-breaking effort. A 1200 rating had been given to all children who competed, no matter what their true strength.

Gershon, like all GMs who attempt massive simultaneous exhibitions, knows the truth; unless plenty of opponents are wiped out quickly these exhibitions would last for 24 hours or more and the amateur players would simply abandon their boards and go home.

For a 500 board exhibition, a player using just four seconds per move will take more than half an hour per circuit, with normal games lasting 30 to 60 moves.

Such an average time is feasible early in the exhibition - even two seconds per move, including travel time between boards, is possible in the opening stages - but is very hard to maintain as the positions become complicated. So a few beginners sprinkled around the field are more or less obligatory for a large-scale exhibition to succeed.

Things were different in June 1975 when Australia's top player, IM Robert Jamieson, set the Australian record of 145, a record which still stands. Virtually all Jamieson's opponents were tournament players and one particularly tough stretch saw him face down future International Masters and Grandmasters Iohansen, West, Hjorth and Rogers sitting in a row. The exhibition took around 15 hours.

I tip my hat to Gershon, Mahjoob and Georgiev - they took on a massive physical and mental challenge - but if quality is worth half as much as quantity, Jamieson should also be recognised as a true chess iron man.

### **Country cook's new book** 'The Country Cookbook' by Belinda Jeffery (Penguin RRP \$59.95)

For years Mullumbimby-based author Belinda Jeffery has been contributing to Delicious magazine a monthly segment entitled Country Cook. It is a role into which she has, in a sense, unwittingly evolved, having moved from Sydney in 2003 with husband Clive in order to embrace a slower simpler life in the small country town. And her latest creation, The Country Cookbook, is the logical outcome of all those magazine articles.


It is that and so much more. With several titles to her credit already - the latest being a mouth-watering compendium of largely sweet baking recipes entitled Mix & Bake - she has with her new book taken the genre to a level which is simultaneously more personal and more professional. What she describes as 'seasonal jottings' constitute musings in a diary format as she takes the reader through each month of the year, with astute observations on the

natural environment which surrounds her. These, and the glorious recipes, are studded throughout by the positively lyrical, almost three-dimensional photography of longtime collaborator Rodney Weidland - a longevity measurable by the extraordinary degree of sympathy with which his images match Belinda's words.

Anyone who has had the privilege of meeting the author will attest to her sweetness and generosity and guite unjustified modesty. Here is a woman who was cooking on television screens decades before the era of celebrity chefs; who worked in a high-profile Sydney restaurant and ran her own cafe; who reviews and judges restaurants regularly; who is always working on her next book. Those best aware we had such a person in our midst are the regulars at farmers markets, which Belinda champions and where she possibly has her highest public profile. A true proponent of

Slow Food philosophies, she may be found there every week, burdened with calico bags and a trolley, stocking up on raw materials she will transform into the sort of beautiful dishes offered in The Country Cookbook.

If some of the recipes appear lengthy it is largely due to Belinda's emphatically helpful guiding you through each step of the way. She will tell you things to look out for, possible failures and potential disasters, and reassure you soothingly with solutions. Should you lack a certain ingredient she will provide substitutes. 'For those of you who don't like marzipan, please don't be put off by its inclusion in this recipe - it really provides more of a background note and gives a lovely, delicate almond flavour to this quick and simple cake,' is her introduction to almond and lemon syrup cake. Regarding the custard required as a preliminary to



her honey and pecan ice-cream, she urges you to 'stay focused and be a bit brave'; for her herb-crusted racks of lamb she comforts you with the fact that 'if you haven't cooked rack of lamb before the idea might seem a bit intimidating, but if you just think of it as a whole lot of lamb cutlets joined together it becomes much less worrisome!'

From cosy, anti-

gourmet items like blueberry pikelets, split pea and ham soup with sippets and Cooee's famous smoked fish and mash pie to fancier entries such as warm squid, celery and chilli salad, sauteed cavolo nero with crisp polenta and spiced coconut and cardamon chicken with glazed pumpkin ('it is sooo delicious,' she swoons) - The Country Cookbook is bursting with food you will want to eat and photography you will want to eat, all packed into a hefty, heavy,





#### Wild Target

Anybody who has ever attempted it will tell you that writing comedy can be the very devil of a task. But if that is your thing, you must not allow yourself to be discouraged by minor setbacks, for this movie is proof positive that any pathetic script might make it to the screen. The naff title should be indication enough of its dearth of wit and imagination, with only a valiant cast of luminaries providing some hope of laughs - but alas, like the band on the *Titanic*, they go down with the ship. Bill Nighy – yes, I know, we all like him, so it must be good - plays Victor, a stitched-up, reclusive, third-generation assassin who has been hired to do

a free and easy, swinging sixties type thief after she has foolishly ripped off Ferguson (the wonderfully haute Rupert Everett), an unscrupulous operator with a couple of dunderheaded hit-men in his employ (which is, in itself, the most asinine of clichés). Victor is unable to fulfil his contract because Rose looks at him with her big brown eyes and, in a shambolic, embarrassingly tryhard zany car-park scene, one of Ferguson's bad guys is killed and Victor flees from the other with Rose and Tony (Rupert Grint), an innocent bystander, in tow. Tony's status is never clarified, but it is the least annoying aspect of a gauche and senseless screenplay. The gang hide up in Victor's lordly gaf, somewhere in the

decides to surprise Victor by digging holes in his lawn so that she might plant magnolias in it – an episode of such incomprehensible, humourless and irrelevant stupidity that it beggars belief, even by this plot's flabby standards. Convention demanding that the three bond, they all get plastered one night. This drudgingly unoriginal event is done with the usual jump-cuts of the characters laughing and doing whacky things (oh my gosh, they throw their glasses into the fireplace!) and, uncomfortably forced though their behaviour is, its awfulness is compounded by an accompaniment of the worst cover of Canned Heat's 'Goin' Up The Country' that you are likely hear (is it meant to be 'raunchy'?). Jonathan Lynne's direction is leaden and, for such an old hand, his timing is clumsy, though the hopeless material with which he had to work would have made his job an unenviable one. A nice little earner for those involved, this is no more than a bunch of pros desperately in search of a decent line. ~John Campbell

There is an earlier episode, too, when a Vespa is fanged through the cobbled laneways, with bullets whizzing through the air and pinging off the ancient mortar, but nobody so much as turns on a light to see what's going on. Jack (George Clooney), a killer for hire, has arrived at a moral impasse in his life. He's had enough of the gig, but some faceless Swedes are on his tail with the intention of eliminating him (it's one of those films that does not deign to let the viewer in on the who, what or why of its subterfuges, thus making it 'intelligent'). In hiding while he constructs a custom-made rifle for a mysterious female client, Jack, with a history of being a pantsman, falls for the luscious charms of Clara (Violante Placido), a local prostitute – and it is worth noting, too, that for such a quiet town there is a flourishing cat-house supporting a bevy of alluring working girls. Meanwhile, the sinister Pavel (Johan Leysen), keeps Jack on a tight rein via constant telephone

contact. The façade of Jack's

personality is never dented, his psychology never probed, even with the many close-ups of Clooney to show us how tense, troubled, suspicious and spiritually wrung out he is (life as a professional assassin is no laughing matter – just ask Bill Nighy). On the other hand, for the guys in the audience, there are plenty of full frontals of Placido's lovely breasts, tastefully done of course, to allay any encroaching lack of interest. Director Anton Corbijn's long and impressive CV of music videos led to his outstanding 'Control' (2007), but this latest offering defers too much to style over content, making it impossible for Corbijn to elicit sympathy for a flawed character whose initial action can never be forgiven.

# NEAFL set to enhance and build locally

Last week the AFL announced that a North East Australian Football League (NEAFL) will be introduced in 2011, bringing together teams from NSW, Queensland, ACT and NT into one competition.

The new league will build upon the successful existing competitions of AFL Canberra and AFL Queensland.

In 2011, Team GWS will ioin current AFL Canberra teams to form the Eastern Conference, comprising seven clubs. The Gold Coast Suns' feeder team will combine with existing QAFL teams to form the Northern Conference, comprising 10 teams, including NT Thunder.

AFL General Manager National and International Development, David Matthews, said the creation of the NEAFL followed a review of second tier competitions across Australia over the past two years. He said the NEAFL will engage all 17 clubs in a new, additional competition which will significantly enhance the pathway for players and the opportunities for clubs in the ACT, NSW, QLD and NT.

## Story by Anthony Hoy

One of Byron Bay's oldest and last under-developed CBD properties is set to be auctioned. Number 2 Jonson Street, also affectionately known by locals as La Vie, has a long and colourful history dating back 70 years and provides a fascinating glimpse of the town's past.

Since the 1940s, when it was constructed to serve as the de facto reception point for Byron Bay's 1320-foot jetty, La Vie has been an important meeting place at the very nerve centre of the coastal township.

The jetty was a rickety wooden structure that for the better part of a century served as the town's tenuous maritime lifeline. Steam trams connected La Vie and the

jetty to Byron Bay's railway station, a kilometre or so to the west. Until the construction of the first motels in Byron in the 1960s, La Vie also provided comfortable short-term accommodation for visiting family, friends and co-workers of the area. At the time the bustling shipping port serviced thriving industries such as timber, meat, dairy, whaling and sand mining.

The economic and social changes of the 20th century created a wealth and luxury of time, money and travel, giving rise to a greater appreciation of the sheer beauty of the area. Byron Bay was to become an independent travel grapevine phenomenon. It still has a reputation as a 'best kept secret' destination for millions of international

and domestic backpackers and travellers. It also has a well-earned reputation as one of Australia's creative hubs, and a centre for healing, health and wellbeing.

The impetus for the dawn of Byron Bay's new tourism role was the 1973 Aquarius Festival at nearby Nimbin. Students and hippies flocked to the area, and many just never left. Two decades of new settlers and alternative lifestylers began to repopulate the area. Byron Bay emerged as one of the nation's best known coastal and surfing playgrounds and tourist destinations, fringed by a beautiful pastoral hinterland. And with it, La Vie too took on a new role as a popular beachside holiday venue. In the 1990s La Vie assumed a

more specific hospitality role, as the accommodation overflow point for Byron Bay's Beach Hotel. In 2007 La Vie changed hands when the Beach Hotel complex was acquired by Melbourne restaurateur John Van Haandel. In recent years it has been used for Beach Hotel offices and has accommodated visiting bands booked for the popular Beach Hotel live music programs.

And in 2010/11 the commercial beachfront property chameleon La Vie – the last significant parcel of commercial beachfront land in Byron Bay, and certainly one of the highest profile undeveloped commercial beachfront parcels on the East Coast – will again take on a new role.
