The hospital land is currently being rezoned by Council to suit the department's needs, and is located on Ewingsdale Road near the Country Energy substation. It also sits adjacent to residential blocks.

Byron Shire Council suggests about noise from turbines, impacts on birds and bats, and other effects on local environments. The new small turbines will soon be available in Byron, and

they are said to be almost silent and visible to birds.

They generate energy via the outer ring of the turbine housing using multiple small blades, rather than a central generator, and promoters say it can cope with the wind turbulence that occurs in residential areas.

James Sturch from Planet new turbines at the energy forum in Mullumbimby earlier this month, which resolved to set up a local renewable energy co-operative in the northern rivers.

High upfront costs of the turbine are said to be competitive with solar panels, potentially paying for themselves within a decade, according to Mr Sturch.

The costs of renewable energy were the subject of a report from Australia's Productivity Commission released this week, as the federal government edges closer to setting a price on carbon.

That report argues that subsidies to small-scale solar systems are an expensive way to reduce emissions, and while it found wind less expensive, emissions trading systems were seen as most efficient.

Assessing emission reduc-Energy Solar discussed the tion policies around the world, the Productivity Commission found the United Kingdom and Germany leading the race, though their populations were now paying more for their power.

Germany offers generous subsidies to its renewable energy industry, which employs almost 400,000 people, and the nation is also leading Europe in wind energy production.

Council's agenda-packed day was a gruelling schedule; it lasted from 10.38am to 6.28pm.

#### **South Golden Beach** Hall acquisition

A successful motion by Cr Richardson and Mayor Barham will see whether Section 94 funds can be used to acquire the land that the South Golden Beach (SGB) hall is built on.

Market valuation and consultation with the state government will also be sought.

Council will also seek clarification from the relevant state government body as to the possibility of securing a longterm lease.

Mayor Barham said it was about the control of assets. A foreshadowed motion by Crs Tucker and Morrisey called for SGB hall committee and Crown Lands Division consultation.

Cr Tucker said, 'The land is owned by the Crown, and there is no threat from it being taken away. It's whipped-up fear and poor politics.

Cr Tucker had a completely different take on the YAC building in Byron Bay from Mayor Barham. 'We didn't manage it well,' he said.

Only Cr Tucker voted against the motion.

Paid parking

Council have endorsed the expenditure of S94 funds to carry out a complete review of car parking rates. Council will also defer consideration of new on-street paid parking across the Shire for a period of 12 months to allow for an assessment of other options for revenue raising, traffic mitigation and tourism-created infrastructure cost mitigation.

On-street paid parking will also be studied as part of the detailed traffic analysis for the Bangalow and Brunswick Heads townships.

Council will defer consideration of on-street paid parking within Mullumbimby for a period of 12 months after the opening of the Woolworths supermarket.

#### **DCZMP** Withdrawal

Council's Draft Coastal Zone Management Plan (DCZMP) has been withdrawn.

Council will prepare a draft 'emergency action subplan' for the coastline between Tyagarah Nature Reserve and Cape Byron by November 30, 2011.

In other news, the toilet block outside the editor's Mullumbimby office has been repainted bright pink and the roof retiled. It is hoped similar renovations will happen for Byron Bay's amenities asap.

# Steve Foreman makes waves for the next gen

Steve Foreman is one of Byron Shire's longest-serving elite surfing coaches, having coached and mentored local surfers from grassroots to elite competition level.

He was also one of the pioneers of the first free community surf schools in Byron Bay, developed and ran the Sport & Rec Learn To Surf camps at Lake Ainsworth for ten years, and has tirelessly volunteered his time coaching and mentoring for no money.

#### How did you come to start coaching surfing?

My mother was a swimming coach and I first started coaching swimming alongside her when I was 16.

I moved up here in the 70s and was working as a swimming coach – mainly for single mums who couldn't afford to put their kids into professional in any sport will always rise to coaching – then as a soccer coach.

I liked surfing more than I liked swimming so I moved on to coaching that.



How did you become 'elite'?

I started at the elite end because that was the people I was around at the time. This was the very early 80s. I was part of the very first learn-to-surf community-based courses and we were putting these on for Surfing Far North Coast.

And we had some really good surfers come through the programs, like Danny Wills and Kieran Perrow. The cream the top! Then because there weren't many elite coaches back then it was like bees to honey – I was the closest one available. So I was coaching

talented kids. I coached young boys who went on to win world titles. You feel very proud and privileged. And from that, because I was doing well, that attracted a lot of people.

#### You were coaching girls as well, at a time when they didn't have much of a voice in surfing...

Yes. In the early days the women were downtrodden there was a much worse attitude toward them then.

#### Surfing is now Big Business - what are your thoughts on how dramatically it has changed over the years?

It was inevitable it was going to go that way. Parents pushing the daylights out of their kids and companies sponsoring huge amounts.

There's good and bad – the good thing is people are earning a living out of surfing which they never did before. But now it's a user-pays system. You don't want it eventually to be a rich-kid's sport.

sponsored by say Quiksilver you'd need a big budget if you were a parent... but it's similar in most sports. And most surf coaches these days do get paid.

#### Any other significant changes in the industry?

Now there's no longer such personalised coaching - for example, Billabong and Quiksilver have their own coaches.

It became cool to coach but back then you used to be a dickhead if you did. Back then guys were a lot more hard-core - the attitude was, you can't coach surfing.

#### What are you up to now?

I've sort of done a shift – for the past three years I've been trying to put Koori surfing programs together that they don't have to pay for, so I've been applying for funding.

I've been retiring for the last five years but someone always comes along - I still do a bit with Adam Melling and James Wood but you're more just offering your opinion to them.

#### What are some of the highlights of your career?

Highlights of my coaching and mentoring have been the friendships I have made along the way, the World Titles like James Wood, Pauline Menczer and Layne Beachley.

The wonderful part is that these people still enrich my life today. I've been lucky and privileged to work with some of these people.



# **Rocking chairs rock**

While researching gadgets for a feature I came across the latest incarnation of the rocking chair – the prototype Empower, designed for public places.

Ryan Kilner's invention, made from recyclable materials, can be set up from a flatpack in, say, airports or council reception areas, and used as a recharger for portable devices such as mobile phones and iPods. The kinetic energy generated by rocking back and forth is stored in a lithium ion battery attached to the recharger. LED lights let you know when your device is charged.

What most gadget reports don't mention is the benefits of the gentle exercise and serenity achieved through rocking. It's perfectly acceptable public behaviour for the stressed who might otherwise curl up in a foetal position, especially in the council reception area while waiting for a development application to be assessed. It's also a sneaky way for parents to engage their gadget-obsessed children in physical activity; in a sense a rocking chair re-creates the comforting yet exciting sensation available from those electric ponies which once graced the fronts of supermarkets and shopping malls.

Whether a device for recharging gadgets or not, the rocking chair could be an essential tool in the transition from a highcarbon, high-pressure, high-bullshit society to a more earthfriendly one. It's an easy way to unwind and release stress without screaming or bashing pillows - an acceptable public therapy. It encourages friendly conversation, and possibly even cuddling, when rockers are in tandem.

Old folks - and I will be among them shortly when I get my longed-for Seniors Card - intuitively understood the value of kinetic energy on a slow scale, the rocker's yantra of mellow motion which soothes the savage breast.

The rocking chair revolution will not be televised. It will come upon us quietly in parks and gardens and reception areas.

Next week: the value of whittling and shouting obscenities from the front porch.





the staff that Byron Services Club be granted a five-year lease over its parking area which is currently owned by Council. The controversial bit, as pointed out by a concerned local businessman, was the further proposal that the club be given the option to buy the land after five years; such a sale would alienate, they said, the last remaining exit point for any future bypass.

Council voted to grant the club a lease with the express provision that with 12 months' notice such lease could be cancelled, it was a bit cheeky of staff to propose such a radical turnaround. Their reasoning was that since Council last year voted to withdraw from the bypass plans as then extant the *urday Sneer*, and that no-one land in question would not be needed. Mmmm.

The debate proceeded with amendments and questions from the councillors (the staff report, as ever, was silent on crucial points) until Cr Tucker, surprisingly, moved that Council retain ownership of Now given that only last year the land in perpetuity. In other

Add to this the observation that no-one from his side of politics has ever run against him without directing preferences his way, and you have a figure which incoming staff might well regard with some awe. So what went wrong this time? Maybe Ross simply saw the writing on the wall, realised that the sale wouldn't be supported, and feared too that he might ultimately be blamed for foiling a bypass. Certainly with Mullum Woolies soon to open he probably has enough controversy on his plate right now. If the community boycott succeeds even partially, he'll end up with a certain amount of egg on his face.



# Not the end of the world as we know it

The rising full moon can be a pretty spectacular site and always attracts regular observers. The next is on Wednesday June 15. However it's the setting full moon on Thursday June 16 that will be really worth an early call when a rare Total Lunar Eclipse occurs. and It will be visible from eastern Australia before sunrise.

Lunar eclipses can only occur on a full moon when the Earth is in between the sun and the moon. When the distances are just right the shadow of the earth passes in front of the full moon sometimes turning it or-

# **Contaminating the medical evidence**

Ray Moynihan reveals how exaggerated findings are poisoning medical science

In the world of medicine, if you're trying to weigh up the pros and cons of a treatment, the best evidence is said to come from a 'systematic review.' This is a summary of all the relevant research and generally more reliable than a single study. Systematic reviews freely available through groups like the international Cochrane Collaboration - have become something of a gold standard for medical evidence, and there are now thousands of reviews - covering everything from cholesterol-lowering drugs to acupuncture for low-back pain.

But while summarising the evidence is a good idea, what's too often ignored is the fact that a vast and growing proportion of the original studies being summarised were funded by manufacturers, which means they tend to exaggerate their product's benefits and play down its harms. Summarising that bias doesn't make it go away. Medicine's prized evidence base has become debased.

#### **Hidden bias**

An international team of researchers from across Europe and North America recently examined almost thirty of these reviews - also known as metaanalyses - which had summarised the results of over 500 original studies of top-selling drugs for conditions including cancer and heart disease. But conclusions' of medical studies. close look at those 500 original revealed where their funding came from, almost 70 per cent were funded in some way by pharmaceutical companies.



So how many of the systematic reviews made any mention of the role of drug companies? Only two of the almost thirty recent reviews reported on who had funded the original trials, which means in the vast majority of cases, the sponsors' influence over results was hidden. These alarming findings were published in the prestigious Journal of the American Medical Association, JAMA, earlier this year - with researchers concluding key information about potential bias was being left out of influential meta-analyses.

If anyone is in any doubt that study sponsorship is associated with more favourable outcomes, you needn't be. As the authors of the JAMA paper make clear, extensive research has shown 'conflicts of interest can influence the results and when the researchers took a A growing body of reliable data suggests commercial sponsors studies, among those which tend to get the outcomes they desire, raising serious questions about how we are supposed to trust the evidence our doctors are working with.

## Sponsors get the results they want

In the early 1990s, researchers examined over 50 trials comparing popular anti-arthritis drugs, and showed that not one of those trials found its sponsor's drug to be inferior to a comparator. By 2003, leading researchers demonstrated there was a 'systematic bias' across the medical literature, with company-funded studies far more likely to find favourable results for their products than more independentlyfunded trials. In 2005, longtime editor of the British Medical Journal Richard Smith wrote 'the evidence is strong that companies are getting the results they want'.

In 2007 a review of almost 200 studies comparing blockbuster cholesterol-lowering drugs found company funding greatly influenced a study's outcome. If a study found a positive result for a drug, ning a short workshop in that study was 20 times more likely to have been funded by the drug's maker than by the decisions. In 2008 research confirmed the world was being fundamentally misled about the benefits of widely prescribed anti-depressants, revealing that many studies with unfavourable results had simply not been published. And now, in 2011, the JAMA paper suggests the vast majority of meta-analyses fail to report the funding source for original studies.

#### **Disclosure not** enough

Making funding sources clearer is important - but simply disclosing bias doesn't make it go away either. Of particular concern are the many sponsored trials which recruit large numbers of people and find very small benefits where hidden bias could make a useless and potentially harmful pill appear to be an effective treatment.

Just as tobacco companies polluted the literature on smoking, and polluting industries try to distort climate change science, pharmaceutical giants and the doctors on their payrolls are poisoning too much medical science with overly positive findings. And it's likely such bias exists in the studies of many therapies - including complementary medicines.

Clearly what's needed are more rigorous and independent studies, and less marketing disguised as science.

# **Christchurch deals with aftershocks**

I have just returned from two weeks visiting my family who live near Christchurch and inevitably became immersed in the earthquake saga.

I went to the city twice not with the specific aim of wallowing in the wreckage, but to reconnect with friends. What ruins and eradication I did see made my stomach churn and my heart ache.

The aftermath of the disaster continues daily, in obvious and less obvious ways. As we know, once the media spotlight moves on to the next breaking story, past disasters slip into obscurity but are far from over. They are ongoing. The Christchurch nightmare began in September last year, when the first earthquake struck. It turned out to be a mere scene-


setter. While aftershocks continued, people coped, cracked hardy and willed their lives scientists are predicting a 23 and their city back to normal as quickly as possible.

of life and physical havoc.

#### **Cruel illusion**

The challenge is to provide some assurance that lessons can be learnt and the city will be made more quake-proof.

Evidence of deep trauma is percolating to the surface of this once stoic citizenry. Irate and anguished letters in the daily Press newspaper, reports about increasing domestic violence and alcohol abuse, and an exodus of 'quake refugees' indicate the gravity of the situation. There has also been looting, so a large police presence although welcome – adds to the sense of malaise.

How to fathom the fact that the quake has 'munted' up to 1,000 buildings in the city's heart? These will be demolished if they haven't been already. Many wonderful old stone heritage buildings, the pride of the city and symbol of our attachment to tradition, are irreparable. Their apparent solidity and permanence have proven a cruel illusion. Even the iconic Anglican Cathedral may go, as it is far more damaged than earlier thought.

Internationally renowned herbalist Ruth Trickey believes that menopause has been poorly managed by traditional medicine and that hormone replacement treatments (HRT), while hiding symptoms, do nothing to manage the varied health complaints that develop at the onset of menopause.

Ms Trickey is a guest of SCU for a series of Professional Development Seminars for natural and complementary medical clinicians with a 'More than Hot Flushes' talk scheduled that is also open to the public.

The major symptoms of menopause are insomnia, mood change and hot flushes. Ruth believes these can be very effectively managed with a more natural approach.

'Research indicates that if we get women to address their lifestyle before they are sympomatic, then menopause will be less severe. If you eat well, sleep well and exercise then the severity is a lot less. In reality what happens is women are floridly symptomatic when they arrive, they have often have a full-time job, adolescents, ageing parents, in short they have a complicated life.

According to Ruth there are herbs that can give relief to menopause. 'The main one for menopause, Black Cohosh, is a very effective herb for hot flushes, although it does interact with a lot of drugs and can carla.robinson@scu.edu.au.

be a problem for the liver. It's not something we want people to self-prescribe; it's always significantly better if someone is under the guidance of a professional who knows what is going on.

'The other herb is for mood change - St John's Wort. It's interesting the two herbs both interact with a lot of drugs. For women who are very well and not on a lot of drugs they are easy to slot in, but we don't advise putting in two reactive herbs without management.

Ruth notes that thin women will often experience more extreme menopausal symptoms.

'We have a saying in practice: beware of the thin, anxious menopausal woman. Women put on a bit of weight around menopause, you convert androgens to estrogen in fatty tissue and muscle. It's ideal that you have good muscle bulk. If you are slight and skinny and anxious you tend to get worse menopausal symptoms.

At her public forum Ruth will be addressing bone density, how to manage mood change, the recommended Mediterranean diet and cardiovascular disease.

'Cardiovascular illness kills more women than men and has done since 1985 and noone really talks about it.



# **Smarter by** default – Employer **Default Super**

#### **For Staff**

Years ago, you had to accept the super fund your boss selected for nine per cent super contributions. Put up or shut up, basically! Laws came into effect in 2005 which gave you the power to tell your boss where they could invest your super: it's called super choice. There's an exception for some working under industrial awards that force your boss to use certain super funds. NO CHOICE FOR YOU! We can't all be free!

When you begin work, your new employer should give you a choice - (1) use your own super fund (usually from a previous employer), or (2) use their default super fund.

It's a good idea to look into your employer's default super fund before making a decision. The default fund may have a few nice surprises like ethical investment options that might give you good returns and good karma or perhaps a no-questionsasked insurance policy!

The no-questions policy goes like this. As a new employee, if you choose the boss's default super fund it may come with a life insurance policy for \$50,000 for example - no applications or medicals! There may be an income protection policy thrown in as well, again, no questions asked! Insurers call it 'Automatic Acceptance' because there is no probing of your medical history. That may be something to consider carefully when looking for some affordable insurance that is easy to get. The cost of the insurance is deducted via monthly premiums from your super balance instead of your take-home pay. This can make insurance achievable for many who would like some cover, but don't have the available cash or time to spare.

So next time you start a new job, ask the boss about the default fund and the noquestions-asked insurance and make an informed super choice.

#### For the Boss

For some employers, super choice legislation was seen as an admin nightmare! What if every employee chooses a different fund? Instead of writing one cheque and payment be adhered to. If the staff member wants to is a fair go and an opportunity to prove basic three-step process - Audit, Plan, Acuse the default fund, but cancel the insur- themselves. ance, that is fine; the staff member signs off on the cancellation of the insurance policy, not you.

If you make sure that the default choice is a good one, your role as an employer themselves and their families with very little effort. Happy staff = happy business.

While we are at it, if you run an environmentally conscious business, you might as well check to see if your money (and the staff's money) in the default fund is being used to invest in and grow other environmentally conscious businesses. # **ARE GOING GREENER**



The Greener Gadgets 2010 Conference, produced by the Consumer Electronics Association and held in New York City, highlighted the latest green designs and innovations in consumer technology. Featuring green innovators, thoughtleaders and environmental stewards, key themes at the Greener Gadgets Conference included sustainable product design, green technology in the home and environmental issues affecting the industry.

Yves Behar, founder of the integrated design agency fuse project, kicked off Greener Gadgets with a challenge to designers to 'put the sexy back into green'. Behar said this is the most exciting challenge that designers have had in the last 20-30 years and will lead to innovative products. Behar demonstrated design possibilities with examples of his own work for clients such as One Laptop Per Child, Jawbone, and Mission Motors.

In one 'Gadget Talk', Leo Bonnani, founder of Sourcemap, described Sourcemap.org as a collective online tool for life cycle assessment and supply chain transparency to help consumers know where the elements within their devices come from and what they are made of. Sourcemap, an open source project of the MIT Media Lab, calculates the carbon footprint of laptops and other CE devices and allows users to build lifecycle maps of different products.

The third annual Greener Gadgets Design Competition concluded the day with the audience vote crowning the Living Goods Program, a mobile app created by John Healy that provides consumers with pertinent food information from local growers, as the winning product. Empower from founder Ryan Klinger, a rocking chair for public places that enables people to charge their devices by the motion created, won second prize.



# Rainforest Rescue Protects Critical Cassowary Habitat Forever

Another piece of the World Heritage value Daintree rainforest has been protected forever with a 14th property purchased by Mullumbimby-based, not-forprofit organisation, Rainforest Rescue. 'Purchasing and protecting Lot 7 Milky Pine Road is a significant outcome for conservation and for the endangered Cassowary,' said Kelvin Davies, Rainforest Rescue CEO.



The high conservation value of Lot 7 Milky Pine Road has been confirmed by an extensive list of plants

recorded in a survey of the property undertaken by Rainforest Rescue

volunteers, Allen Sheather and Barbara Maslen. Several rare plants and the fruit of several species known to be Cassowary food plants were found growing there, including the Black Palm – a significant food for the endangered bird during the food-scarce wet season. Mr Sheather and Ms Maslen came across three reasonably fresh Cassowary droppings and several older droppings with germinating seeds during the survey.

Rainforest Rescue purchased the diagonally adjacent block, Lot 10 Milky Pine Road, in May 2010, and this latest acquisition extends its protection of critical Cassowary habitat in the Daintree. The property and the surrounding area have been classified as essential habitat for the endangered Cassowary by the Queensland Government.

Rainforest Rescue has now commenced fundraising for the purchase of its 15th Daintree property, Lot 83 Rosewood Road. This pristine rainforest property is situated in the Cow Bay area of the Daintree, and the purchase will not only save this precious rainforest, it will also do away with one further



development in the Daintree. Human settlement brings with it a host of threats – clearing and fragmentation of the rainforest, introduction of domestic dogs that harass and kill wildlife, increased traffic and road kills and the introduction of weed species – all of which contribute to the degradation of the Daintree's rainforest ecosystems.



'When we buy Lot 83, we'll be adding a sixth property to our Baralba Corridor Nature Refuge, which is made up of our first five protected properties,' said Mr Davies. 'The area around our Nature Refuge has one of the highest densities of Cassowaries in the country. The rainforest is very important to these endangered birds. They need intact areas of rainforest

to survive and thrive. In return, they play an important role to help the rainforest regenerate naturally. Cassowaries eat the fruits and seeds of the rainforests and then disperse the seeds through their digestive process,' he added.

a concert which proves the whole is always greater than the sum of its parts. Featuring the aforementioned artists alongside Jordie Lang, Jen Cloher, Emily Lubitz, Harry James Angus and Liz Martin. This is what Husky and Jesse had to say...

#### What was the creative impetus for Storm in a Teacup?

HG: The only thing better than going to see your favourite singer/musician play is seeing your five favourite singers/musicians play together. Five for the price of one is a pretty good deal.

J: A couple of years ago Glenn (of Vitamin Records fame) put together a showcase of artists on his label and we performed shows in Melbourne and Sydney. The shows were really great, but they felt a little bit clunky with bands coming on stage for three or four songs and then moving off again. Since then we've spoken to Glenn about organising a collaborative show - this time it's not exclusively Vitamin Records artists - and taking it to the next level where we would perform as one band, all learning each other's songs. Storm in a Teacup will showcase six different songwriters with one slick band...

#### Do musicians get enough chance to collaborate, do you think?

HG: I think musos are always up for collaborating and playing together. There's nothing better. It's just with

busy touring and recording schedules it's hard to organise and coordinate. Thanks to Glenn from Vitamin, and to Jesse from Tinpan Orange and Jen Cloher, who have been doing a lot of the day-to-day organising, we get to do this awesome tour!

J: We (Tinpan Orange) have been fortunate enough to play a bunch of festivals over the past few years and we do a lot of touring; it's through this travel that we often get to meet other musos. We get to hear their songs and get to know each other. It means that we often do have the opportunity to collaborate. With the exception on Liz Martin, who is from Sydney, all the other acts are based in Melbourne and we have toured or performed with each of them at one time or another. This tour is as much 'hanging out with mates and playing some songs' as it is 'collaboration'.

#### What are some of the positive things that come out of a collaboration?

**HG:** There are lots but I think seeing how other writers/singer/musos operate is really interesting, and collaborating with people who are as talented as the ones I'm on this tour with stretches you. You've gotta keep up to survive. Sink or swim. No, that's a bit dramatic. I think it will just be great fun!

J: Collaboration is at the heart of music – it can give a whole new angle to a song you've played a million times. Hopefully we can build a show that is greater than the sum of its parts...

#### Tell me a little about what to expect on the night?

HG: I'm not sure really. That's what makes it so damn exciting. I don't like expectations anyway, I try not to have them.

J: We'll all be playing each other's songs, adding new sounds to some old favourites and there might even be some all-in jam action. There are some remarkable instrumentalists – Harry Angus, Alex Burkoy, Gideon Preiss and some amazing songwriters - Jen Cloher, Jordie Lane, Emily Lubitz, Liz Martin and Husky Gawenda...

#### Who drives the ship so to speak, or is this a cooperative arrangement?

HG: Jesse Lubitz from Tinpan Orange and Jen Cloher steer the ship together. Very experienced sailors they are too. Navigating through the storm (in a teacup). This little tour would be lost at sea without them.

#### You're performing Melbourne, Sydney and Mullum? Is there something different about a regional show? Or couldn't you be f-d going to Brisbane?

HG: I'm not sure why it was Mullum instead of Brisbane. I love playing in Brisbane; the people are always really sweet. But Mullumbimby is just about the most beautiful place on earth, so pretty happy to be going there!

J: Brisbane? Where's Brisbane? No, I kid. The whole Mullumbimby area has a fantastically strong music culture and we've always enjoyed playing there. It's the home of Vitamin Records and the Mullumbimby Music Festival and it's great to play somewhere outside a capital city.

**MY FAMILY** 

When it comes to how we live our lives in comparison to our parents, most of us pride ourselves on being chain breakers. We've done therapy, we've looked deep within and we've challenged a lot of the status quos that our folks, and our folks' folks used to guide their lives. For the most part, most of us think we are living our lives more consciously and more self-actualised than the generations that have come before. We make choices based on our individual yearnings, not social expectations. Nowhere is this more evident then in our relationships. Used to be you met a boy or a girl and you tied the knot. Forever. The thought of being with a boy I fell in love with at 18 or 19 fills me with fear. God, I could barely choose a decent haircut back then, let alone a life partner! Marriage is no longer a life sentence. If it doesn't work then it's perfectly acceptable to jump ship. Although there's still a sense of personal failure, the community no longer stigmatises divorce as a kind of social cancer. We're used to it. So while we pioneer new frontiers for our romantic partnerships and family structures, its time we started to break up with people consciously as well. It's time we stopped making enemies of ex-partners who happen to be the mothers or fathers of our children, and started to work together. If we could move on from getting 'stuck' in the petty struggle for financial dominance and the need to have emotional retribution through settlements, then perhaps we could

Even though I split with the father of my two daughters 12 years ago, I remained close to his mother. She was often stuck trying to find a word to describe our relationship. She called me her daughter-in-law, because we were family but there was no words or labels that we could accurately use to connect us. New family structures need new words. They also need more paper. When my daughter drew her family tree recently for a school project she needed to upgrade from A4 to A1. It wasn't a tree, it was more of a forest of step-siblings, stepparents and a trillion grandparents. For instance, her paternal grandmother married five times. My mother married twice. I have an adopted stepsister. She has had a child and married twice. One in five families are step-families. Navigating the lines that connect us is going to give this generation of genealogists a brain tumour. Our families are no longer linear. They are organisms. So take that definition of 'MY FAMILY' and stick it on the back of your Landcruiser. (PS: Do they make black My Family stickers or are all families white?)

# **Sunshine**

Like father like son. Director Jim Loach, following in his dad Ken's estimable footsteps, has made a characte-driven film that avowedly steers clear of any mawkish sentimentality that its subject might so easily have succumbed to in less scrupulous hands (ironically, expecting a more lachrymose treatment, I thought it emotionally rather dry). Set in 1986, it follows English social worker Margaret Humphrey (Emily Watson) in her tireless efforts to right the wrongs suffered by thousands of children who were deported by sea to Australia in the 1950s and until the early 1970s. It's one of those peculiar movies whose audience is made up almost exclusively of those who wish primarily (one suspects) for their own sense

of justifiable outrage to be acknowledged and shared (it's a sort of communion). Which is to say, it's a story that 'needs to be told', but is told to those already familiar with it. Heartfelt though it is, because there is not much plot, the film is nobbled by having said what it wants to say midway through, after which it is inclined to labour the point, focusing on the inhumane treatment meted out to many of the boys by the Christian Brothers (as a counter, it must be offered that, as with the 'stolen generations', those who benefited from their relocations - and there must have been some - are never mentioned). As Len, an unbowed survivor of the regime whom Margaret helps in reuniting with his mother, David Wenham gives a typically idiosyncratic performance that is especially welcome in juxtaposition to Watson's steady monochrome - the pair singing along with Cat Stevens's Wild World on the car radio is, oddly, one of the most touching scenes. Putting it all into shocking context (it now reads like a perverted joke) is our spineless government's intention to wash their hands of any responsibility towards the needy and ship unescorted children seeking

sanctuary in the Land of the Fair Go [sic] to the sunshine of Malaysia. Shame on us. ~ John Campbell



#### Chess has been a rare visitor to Australian television screens since the halcyon days of nightly programs as Bobby Fischer beat Boris Spassky for the world title in 1972.

The exception came in the early 1980s, when the BBC series The Master Game was shown on the ABC.

The Master Game was the best chess program ever made, featuring a competition where the key games were covered by peering into the minds of top players as they considered each move.

Even viewers with only a minimal knowledge of chess could appreciate the commentary and the ratings were comparable to the other surprise hit of the era, Pot Black, a snooker program.

The series came to a halt in 1983 when the filming of the series - which featured local hope Tony Miles beating World Champion Anatoly Karpov in the final - was conducted during a BBC strike.

in Britain - though it was a success when shown, dubbed, in Germany. When time came to record a new series in 1984, the BBC said that it would not make a new series until the old one had been shown, something the ABS refused to allow.

The Master Game died and was never seen again - until now.

Thanks to the wonders of YouTube, a special channel has been opened, on www.youtube. com/user/Sirb0b1#g/u, with games from the first three Master Game series available online.

Now it is possible for modern chess fans to watch the greats of that era - Korchnoi, Larsen, Miles - competing and explaining their thoughts. The unique voice of Czech legend Vlastimil Hort - soon to defect to the West is also a highlight.

Sadly the 1983 series seems to be lost forever, so there is no The ABS union refused to chance to see World Champion Karpov as well.

Chess aficionados have always been proud that chess notation enabled them to replay games from any era, almost as good as a video replay of the game. However Master Game shows that a real video replay beats chess notation any day.

**Baby Bears and Blue Ballet**

When I met half of the new ownership of Bangalow's Satiate it coincided with the extraction from the oven of a cake. Katrina Kanetani, priestess of sweet things, asked me if I would like to accompany coffee with a slice of her Pumpkin and Prune Cake - a question that barely required a response.

And it was wonderful - wonderful in the way that a cake whipped freshly out of the oven always is, wonderful because of the lush moistness the barely detectable pumpkin had endowed.

Pumpkins are, after all, technically a fruit, and their use in sweet dishes more logical than in savoury. In both the Middle East and India that's where they usually end up. Lately on our Sunday drives along curvy hinterland roads we have been passing displays of pumpkins at little roadside stalls alongside their honesty tins for the few dollars they ask of you. According to Frank and Tania Walker of Walker Farms - whose organic pumpkins spoil you forever, rendering you incapable of ever eating a supermarket one again – these are pumpkins grown through the summer months. The Walkers themselves can grow pumpkins all year around because their Upper Burringbar property rarely experiences the frost to which most of the rest of the region is exposed. Even the excessively wet spells which ruined so many crops this past season left the Walkers relatively unscathed: they are so hilly the rain just runs off the land. While they lost some of their pumpkin crop over summer it was not substantial enough to matter.

The diversity of pumpkins is extraordinary. Consider some of these names - many are heirloom, or rare, or only found in certain parts of the world. Black Forest, Amish Pie, Pink Banana, Aladdin Mini Turban, Sunshine, Jack-be-Quick, Baby Bear, Hooligan, Charisma, Baby Boo, Cotton Candy and Blue Ballet. And that is only a token gesture of all the varieties that abound. I have always loved Butternut for its - well, buttery nuttiness, or nutty butteriness - but also Jap, often called Kent out of political correctness. Tania tells me her favourite is the Ironbark – grown out west and often difficult to come by - because it is hard and dry. In fact the ironbark is an heirloom variety with a reputation for its excellent

keeping gualities and its sweet taste.

Of course I have to ask Tania how she likes best to cook pumpkin. Her answer is baked, with the barest touch of oil: pumpkin, then, at its most intense. And before I can say how, when making a classic lasagna, I like to add layers of sliced roast pumpkin to the ragu/bechamel/pasta/cheese ones, here she is telling me about her Pumpkin Lasagna, sans meat: just those other elements but pumpkin the starring role. Then she tells me about a woman she knows who bakes a small pumpkin in its entirety until it is completely cooked through - 'she cooks and cooks and cooks it' - until the centre has become caramelised, all those natural sugars - and then she serves it with ice cream

So there it is again, pumpkin as a sweet, and a method definitely worth trying out sometime. Here is another lovely thing to do with pumpkin, a Jane Grigson recipe for Turkish Candied Pumpkin you can make with your roadside fruit, or a Walker wonder-pumpkin.

#### **TURKISH CANDIED PUMPKIN**

Peel and seed 1 kg slice of pumpkin cut into chunks 3 cm long. Bring 250 g sugar and 150 ml water to the boil, stirring, then add the pumpkin and over a very low heat cook at least an hour. Cover pan at first, then remove toward the end so the juices evaporate to a syrup. Chill if desired then serve with toasted walnuts and thick cream.



# Keep in touch with market changes

The most important step when putting your property on the market is to establish a realistic value. A comparative market analysis is how real change as the market changes. It is very important that you stay aware of these market changes which are caused by economic and political and social factors as well as media and public opinion.

In any market, in order to achieve the best possible price as easily and as quickly as possible, an accurate price indication is imperative. Whether you are determining your listing price for an auction, it is most important that you look at what has sold most similarly and most recently. What is on the market which is comparable

inside:

is of interest and important to buyers but what has sold is fact and evidence. Although real estate is not an exact science, this fact and evidence is what prices property.

Position is always important when estate is valued and of course values pricing properties and proximity to beach or town or acreages offering total privacy in strong performing areas are much more likely to sell faster and achieve a higher price. Attractive homes with unique features will attract more buyers and higher prices than properties lacking visual appeal. Renovated properties or those with good renovation potential will do better than those without.

First impressions are important for a private treaty or the reserve price and the front of a house and the gardens make a big difference to values, especially in the eyes of the buyer. think it's a good time to invest in property - and more than any other state or territory in Australia, they are most prepared to carry out renovations when purchasing a property, according to the latest poll released by mortgage provider Homeloans Ltd.

The Homeloans Home Buyer Barometer Q2 2011, which surveyed 2,000 Australian first home buyers, homeowners and investors, found that 47 per cent in NSW believe the market is right to invest in property, one in three (35 per cent) were unable to give an opin-

Despite cost of living and interest rate con- ion, while almost a fifth (18 per cent) were cerns, almost half of NSW home buyers adamant that now definitely isn't the right

time to be buying. And although the research shows brand new properties or properties requiring no renovation are the most in demand in NSW, with 59 per cent of respondents saying this is what they would prefer, a huge 26 per cent of those surveyed are looking to buy property that requires renovation. This compares to only 12 per cent in Western Australia, 19 per cent in South Australia and Victoria and 20 per cent in Queensland. Just 18 per cent in NSW would prefer to build their own.

Australia-wide, interest rate concerns have taken a backseat to

the rising cost of living, which is the top financial concern for homeowners and home buyers. In NSW, the key financial concerns were increasing cost of everyday living (33 per cent), followed by interest

rates (24 per cent). On a state by state basis, home buyers in New South Wales were the most worried about costs associated with raising a family (11 per cent).

The Homeloans Home Buyer Barometer also showed the greatest barriers to home ownership in NSW were high property prices (49 per cent), saving for a deposit (27 per cent), and fear of not being able to meet interest repayments (22 per cent).






