Jonson Street asbestos removal concern

The partial demolition of the units at the top of Jonson Street, Byron Bay, has raised the issue of asbestos removal in a busy retail area of town.

The units on the corner of Jonson St, across the road from the pub and the pool, are owned by the Van Haandel syndicate which owns the Beach Hotel.

According to Bill Lowrie of East Coast Asbestos Removals, the building is, 'riddled with asbestos; internal,

external, ceilings, roof, the lot,' and is in 'an exposed location.'

Work began last week when East Coast demolished a shed which Mr Lowrie believed was the biggest health hazard, backing directly onto the shops opposite the Beach Hotel.

Victor Gonzalez, owner of Tasa Jara at the top of Jonson Street, says he is extremely concerned about the possibility of asbestos fibres drifting into his shop and in fact all over town.

'They're taking asbestos off the

walls, the sheets are breaking up, and it's always windy up here,' he says.

Asbestos fibres, if lodged in the lungs, can cause lung cancer and mesothelioma.

Shopkeeper closes shop

Mr Gonzalez has closed his shop, saying, 'I can't send my wife or my staff there.'

However, Mr Lowrie says that he is doing everything in his power to

Stop grabbing public land!

Locals 'occupy' van park reserve in protest against state

Byron Shire mayor Jan Barham told a rally on Sunday she was 'shocked' to see the degradation of public riverfront land since the state government took over its running from council five years ago.

The mayor joined around 150 locals in a protest walk through the Terrace Reserve and Caravan Park in Brunswick Heads to see firsthand how much the van park, now run by North Coast Holiday Parks, had encroached on public access walkways and buffer areas along the riverfront.

The state government plans to redevelop the three former council-run caravan parks - the Terrace, Massey Greene and Ferry Reserve - but has been met by public anger with the parks' encroachment of riverfront land and access.

'It's a real shock to see how much further eroded the riverbank is and how much the public have been locked out since we ran the park,' says the mayor. 'We had a recognised management plan for the area but that's no longer there.'

'It's such a beautiful caravan park but they are creating a nightmare for the community in terms of amenity, privacy, traffic and access and for what? It's not for public purpose, not when they are commercialising public land,' said Ms Barham.

The mayor, recently elected as an MLC in state parliament, was joined on the rally and tour by several other councillors. She said she would continue lobbying MPs on the issue but urged locals also to write to government ministers about it.

'This is all about public land and we want to ensure it stays that way for public access.'

Lifelong local Darcy O'Meara told the crowd he was 'born across the road'

from the park 80 years ago and the Terrace reserve. He said it was his 'favourite schoolroom' because the teacher 'taught us all about nature' in the open, including a disturbed Aboriginal midden site with shellgrit still visible.

'We'll lose our only public access to the beach from here,' he said.

said a remnant, coastal cypress-pine community in the reserve and other trees had been cut down or branches lopped to make more room for caravans and permanent sites.

Kids forced on road

Ms Grant also said restricted access had affected local schoolchildren who used to ride through the reserve and park to get to school.

'The state would prefer to see kids riding, as they did before, to town, school and the beach safely through



Letting local business shine

Byron Bay businesses continue to sprout, thanks to projects like Byron Creative, an initiative launched by not-for-profit organisation Nortec Employment and Training.

Aimed at helping small businesses move from the home to a commercial space, Nortec provides incubators to business owners at a lower cost, while exposing them to a support network of other likeminded ventures. minimise the risks. 'This is bonded asbestos, which means its between 15 and 20 per cent of the total content of the material, and is bonded into the cement.'

He acknowledges that fibres escape when sheets are broken up but says that bonded asbestos is far less dangerous than the friable asbestos found in pipe lagging or in buildings after a fire, where fibres escape freely.

According to Mr Lowrie, both Byron Shire Council and Workcover have conducted an on-site inspection and are satisfied that he is following all relevant standards and procedures.

This includes providing dust masks and disposable body

suits to staff and installing a mesh perimeter fence.

'It's not a legislative requirement, but I've also installed an irrigation system - a set of misters all around the fence designed to wet down any dust before it leaves the site.'

Irrigation system installed

A second mesh-covered scaffold will be installed when work commences on the outside of the building. Mr Lowrie has also sought and obtained Council permission to work outside of normal hours.

'It's a difficult, unpleasant job, and we're trying to get it done as quickly and safely as

possible,' he says 'but we're going to wait for the wind to drop before we remove the roof'.

Mr Gonzalez says, however, 'If this job complies with the regulations, then they're not strict enough.'

'That entire site should be sealed off completely. Everyone keeps telling me it's okay but then I invite them to come sit on the bench in front of my shop for two hours and they say, "Oh no..."'

Mr Lowrie countered, 'I understand that people are worried about asbestos removal, but the fact is that all these buildings are slowly weathering, and as they do, asbestos fibres are released to the air.'


'Removal is the lesser of two

evils. Mr Gonzalez has every right to close his shop if he feels he is at risk while work is being conducted, but he should be thanking me because in a few weeks that asbestos hazard will be gone.'

It is believed that one in three buildings built before 1980 contain asbestos products.

The Asbestos Information and Support Service (www.aiss.org.au) urges homeowners to be extremely cautious, citing dramatic rises in cases of malignant mesothelioma amongst renovators.

In 2008, home renovations were responsible for 35 per cent of all non-commercially related incidences of the disease amongst women.

the park, but when the fence goes up none of that will happen, they will be forced onto the streets,' she said.

Additionally, she says locals living next to the Terrace have to be 'extremely tolerant' every holiday season as people camp within metres of their front gate and they have to bear the brunt of late-night drunken behaviour, due to the lack of proper buffers.

'When I lived there I could hear them snoring and their TVs on they were that close, yet a promised three-metre buffer was never completed.'

Safety issues

Scooter-bound Sheila Riley, who lives next to the park, told the crowd the redevelopment plans 'stink' and locals' driveways were usually blocked by campers' vehicles. 'I had to go to hospital last year and the ambulance couldn't get in because the cars were parked across the driveway,' she said.

Marie Stewart, a resident for more than 20 years, said the

redevelopment threatened to change the face of the 'family town, which makes extra money from tourists. The state's stolen our reserve,' she said.

During the tour, Ms Grant pointed out areas of riverfront access cut off by buildings or structures which encroached on foreshore and public access ways, as well as riverbank erosion and rubbish dumping on the river edge.

Colin Woodbury, the area manager for the North Coast Holiday Parks Trust, told *The Echo* that all the issues raised were 'being addressed as part of a plan of management' process, which had not yet been finalised. Mr Woodbury denied the public had been 'locked out', claiming a section of the riverbank access had been shut off to the public so erosion there could be fixed. He said that as soon as the plan was signed off, management would 'fix' the issues with help from relevant state agencies, including the concrete slabs on the foreshore which would be 'rectified' as well.

Marine parks plan a dud, say disenchanted conservationists

A marine reserves network proposal by the federal government has been met with major disappointment from conservationists.

The recently released proposal covers 1,470,000 sq km and stretches from north of Fraser Island down to near the Victorian border. Lord Howe and Norfolk Islands are also included.

Nicola Bowskill from The Wilderness Society said, 'We are calling for the establishment of a network of marine sanctuaries that meet international scientific benchmarks for protection. Unfortunately, this was not achieved in the current draft.'

Local conservationists are equally shocked that the federal government has failed to identify a Commonwealth marine park off the Byron and Tweed coasts. Byron-based conservationist and marine artist Dailan Pugh said that conservationists had expected a Commonwealth addition to the (state-based) Cape Byron

Marine Park that would have turned it into a truly world-class marine park, stating 'instead we got nothing.'

'The Commonwealth has not only let down this region, but all Australians, with its proposal that a measly 4.3 per cent of the Temperate East Marine Region be included in Marine National Park zones and excluded from fishing.'

'For the past 15 years there have been increasing calls from scientists around the world to exclude fishing from 20 to 30 per cent of our seas and oceans.'

Public consultations have been proposed during the public consultation period in a number of areas; however, none are proposed for the Tweed-Byron region.



Where farming and the arts fuse

At this year's forthcoming Bangalow Show, an unusual, new creative initiative will be unveiled.

The project will showcase the combination of two community groups: farming and the arts, and is the culmination of a one-year project called 'Sculpture in the Paddock'.

Curator Dev Lengjel explains, 'Eight local sculptors spent time with eight local farmers, visiting the farm and chatting about the family and farming history.'

'This has resulted in eight sculptures that will be displayed at the Bangalow Show.'

He says the sculptures that the visitor will encounter are created in a variety of materials found on the farm or the artist's studio and are inspired by the history of the farm.

Participating artists are Daniel Clemmett, Suvira McDonald, Jim Blower, Samantha Collyer, Hayden Mathrick, Allen Horstmanshof, Mel Robin and Noel Hart.

Participating farmers are The Jarretts, the Garrets, the McKenzies, Jan Hulbert, Bob Guest, the Nobles and the O'Meara family.

Artist Noel Hart was 'assigned' to the McKenzies; Hec McKenzie is a breeder of

champion bantams and a judge of poultry, and life member of the Bangalow Poultry club while Glenda McKenzie is secretary of the Bangalow Poultry Club, and creator of prize pendants and medallions.

Mr Hart told *The Echo*, 'The sculpture I created for SITP focused on the idea of showbirds and the physical manner in which Hec McKenzie keeps his birds - pens

constructed from all forms of timber and wire mesh - and agricultural shows which I've been visiting since childhood'. Noel constructed the birds from similar materials to Hec's bird pens, and the chicks are painted with decorative patterning, graffiti, tattoos, slogans and quotes. The artworks will be at the Bangalow Showgrounds this weekend.

Our Generation doco: spotlight on Aboriginal atrocities

Byron Shire resident and filmmaker/director Sinem Saban says she witnessed first hand the third-world situation in the Northern Territory more than ten years ago when she first visited remote Aboriginal communities as a school teacher.

'After the 2007 Intervention was announced by the Howard government,' Ms Saban says, 'I was compelled to make the film.'

Shameful neglect

The film *Our Generation* presents a picture of shameful neglect by mainstream Australia, and claims that nothing has been done on the issue of child abuse, and instead used the intervention as a guise to compulsorily acquire land for resource exploitation.

'Nothing about the legislation talks about the children,' says Ms Saban. 'So what is the legislation really about? In its defence, the governments say

that they require long leases to provide medical facilities, schools and housing.

'However the locals say access to such services are a basic human right that all Australians enjoy.'

'Why should they have to give up their land for basic

citizenship rights?

'This is a bombshell journey into Australia that many Australians are aware of. Even the United Nations has stepped in to condemn the racist policies.'

Aboriginal elder Dr Djinyini Gondarra, a senior Yolngu law man, has travelled the

world raising awareness of the ongoing struggle of Aboriginal people in Australia and will also be at the screening.

He says the action required is to 'work with us, to put our heads together and fight the system.'

UN condemns policy

Since its launch in 2010, this will be the first time the film has been screened in the Shire.

A live performance by musician Xavier Rudd will also feature at a screening, along with a Q&A with the filmmakers and Dr Gondarra.

The documentary recently won 'Best Campaign Film' at the London International Documentary Festival, and will be at the Mullum Civic Hall on November 20.

Coal-seam gas opposed by all NSW councils

All councils from around NSW have unanimously supported a moratorium on coal-seam gas (CSG) mining and exploration, Ballina councillor Jeff Johnson said this week.

The news came from a recent local government conference in Nowra. 'Every CSG motion at the conference was passed without opposition, from all political viewpoints.'

A Coal-Seam Gas Moratorium Bill is currently being debated in state parliament and started last Friday.

If passed, it would place a 12-month moratorium on the coal-seam gas industry, while also determining the industry's

impact on water resources, the climate and agriculture and communities.

'We need to ask why both the NSW and Qld governments are refusing to listen to the people,' Cr Johnson said.

Govt sell-out

'I find it totally outrageous that any state government could sell mining rights for an exploitative business that may destroy some of our best farming land.'

'And don't they realise they are alienating rural people and destroying rural communities in the process?'

'The evidence is clear that

once aquifers and water supplies become contaminated there is no going back.

'Once a gas field is up and running, with the associated infrastructure, noise and pollution, there will be no prospect of restoring the status quo.'

'It seems that we Australians, and our collective future, may have already been sold out.'

'The future we should be planning for would have solar farms in the desert instead of gas fields covering the farming land where strong rural communities used to be.'

It's time to draw a line in the sand and Lock the Gate.'

Greens NSW mining

spokesperson Jeremy Buckingham says it is a 'sensible bill that applies the precautionary principle to a potentially dangerous industry.'

Greens push to halt

'Twenty-five per cent of NSW is currently under coal-seam gas exploration. We need to press pause on this industry and consider whether we, as a society, will grant it a social licence to operate.'

NSW Labor's new coal-seam gas policy mirrors this bill, and I look forward to their support.'

Mr Buckingham says the debate is likely to carry over until a vote on Friday November 25.

Geothermal could easily replace gas and coal, says geothermal company

In related energy news, a geothermal energy company have claimed this week that Australia contains enough enhanced, or engineered, geothermal systems (EGS) to replace carbon emissions-intensive coal and gas power 68 times over.

Australian geothermal energy consultancy HDR (www.hotdryrocks.com) says it is developing, along with Google, a global protocol to estimate and map the planet's EGS.

'This is clean, renewable

energy that is realistically accessible today with existing drilling and power conversion technologies,' HDR's managing director Graeme Beardsmore said in a press release.

'Not only that, EGS has the potential to provide baseload power; it is one of the most abundant sources of renewable energy available and is more than sufficient to replace current coal and gas power supply.'

'Essentially, EGS presents us with a compelling solution to

tackling climate change as well as addressing future energy supply issues.'

'Now that Australia has a carbon pricing mechanism, we have the means to work on making clean EGS power generation a reality.'

The company claims that rocks beneath Australia (within 5km) store enough heat to theoretically provide 85 million megawatts (MW), or all of Australia's current electricity demand for 50,000 years.

Lacking common sense

While scratching my head at all the absurd evils of the world, it occurred that we lack a charter of common sense.

The ideological dichotomy that western societies presents, ie the left and right, breeds a system where oppositions negatively campaign against common sense. Co-operation over basic ethical principles is rarely discussed, hence layers of choking bureaucracy are added.

But what about common sense? As it happens an Englishman proposed this during the American revolution.

Common Sense, a 48-page pamphlet written by Thomas Paine in 1776, challenged the authority of the British government and the monarchy.

Essentially it was a reasoned argument for the US to be independent from British rule.

It was an immensely popular document in its time, and not only examined how societies function and the need for self-governance, but refuted tyranny. Paine claims there are two tyrannies in the English constitution: monarchical and aristocratic, and they do not benefit a society. '[The] king and peers... rule by heredity and contribute nothing to the people,' he writes. *Common Sense* was a hit because its language was clear and easy to understand. Its broad appeal persuaded many undecided settlers to want independence and it is widely regarded as one of the catalysts for the American War of Independence.

The best commonsense document that democratic societies can produce is of course a constitution, which specifically sets out laws on governance. The difference between our constitution and the US is that ours doesn't include a Bill of Rights, which is separate from governance.

The US Bill of Rights, or amendments, are aimed to protect freedoms of religion, speech, a free press, free assembly, free association and the right to keep and bear arms.

Arguably America was founded by educated atheist intellectuals whereas we were a dumped colony of uneducated convicts. How else can we possibly excuse our appalling treatment of Aboriginals and those who seek refuge from wars we are involved with? A Bill of Rights would address these issues and more – it would also negate never-ending inquiries into our human rights abuses and would have addressed the current media inquiry.

When sucking up to America gets dangerous

The political transformation, or at least tergiversation, of Julia Gillard is now complete.

From being an avowed lefty, the chair of the Socialist Forum at Melbourne University, she has morphed into the most pro-American Australian prime minister since... well, since the last one. And he, of course, was the most pro-American Australian prime minister since... well, since the one before.

In fact it is hard to think of any Australian prime minister who has had serious doubts about the relationship with our great and powerful friend.

A couple, notably Gough Whitlam and Paul Keating, have made tentative noises about taking a more independent line, but in general our national leaders have approached their counterparts in Washington on their knees, dutifully accepting whatever role POTUS (the President of the United States) sees fit to assign them.

Harold Holt boasted that he was 'All the way with LBJ' while John Gorton assured his host that 'We'll go a-waltzing Matilda with you'. And of course John Howard embraced his appointment as deputy sheriff.

Even opposition leaders succumb; Mark Latham, having derided his Liberal opponents as 'a conga line of suckholes' while on the back bench, recanted by holding a press conference in front of an American flag when he thought he had a chance at election.

Most of the time such sycophancy is embarrassing but relatively harmless; since World War II Australia has received few if any tangible benefits from the arrangement (precisely what value our 'information sharing' with Washington has been remains undefined) but has suffered little actual damage.

We have been willing, even enthusiastic participants in

America's military adventures, most notably in Vietnam and Iraq, but have escaped the obloquy and censure directed at America itself; basically we have been forgiven on the grounds of that even if we were wrong (and we were), we erred through a misguided sense of loyalty rather than evil intent.

Gillard has not questioned that loyalty; indeed, she is signing up to an increased American military presence in Australia.

when our ability to straddle the barbed-wire fence was severely tested. We have been, and still are, shut out of some of the innermost councils of our neighbours simply because we are not seen as a fully committed partner in the region.

And now, as the rivalry between the United States and China is set to become the determining geopolitical influence of our time, the necessity for choice is becoming more

In any circumstances it would be hard for Australia to stay neutral. But as an ally – Gillard's word – with the ability to deploy American troops from Australian bases, neutrality would not be an available option. Like it or not, we would be part of the action. And one of the first things we would be required to do is to stop trading with China, at least in strategic materials such as iron ore, coal and gas.

So phut goes the trade balance and probably the entire economy with it. This is the downside of Gillard's position.

The upside? Well, perhaps more security for Australia, but security from whom?

From China, presumably. So we are not really treating China as a friend after all, but as a potential enemy. This is the only sensible interpretation of allowing Australia to be used as a forward base for a contingency operation aimed at China.

And it is one that Beijing is unlikely to miss. Thus Australia, however keen it portrays itself to continue the trading relationship, will be seen as potentially unreliable, subject always to the larger context in which it has involved itself.

There is a Kikuyu proverb: when elephants fight, it is the grass that suffers. True enough, and if the grass just happens to be in the way, there's not a lot the grass can do to help itself.

But it at least has the sense not to ask one of the elephants to make it part of the battleground. Perhaps the time will come when we really do have to make the big choice, and when we do both history and self-interest suggest that, for the next decade at least, it will probably be for America.

But to pre-empt it as Gillard has done looks less like statesmanship than subservience.

Given that we already host what are euphemistically called 'joint facilities' run by the Americans and for the Americans as key elements in their intelligence-gathering and communication networks, this may appear no more than a natural extension of policies which have been in place for many years. But there is a qualitative difference.

The purpose of the earlier installations was a general one: the enhancement of American military power, certainly, but with no specific target in mind.

The new buildup of forces in the Pacific has a single and clearly defined purpose: to counter and contain what is seen as the threat of Chinese dominance in the area.

John Howard used to say that we did not have to choose between our history and our geography, by which he meant that we could maintain our European identity while developing as a middle-sized Asian economic power. This was pretty naive even in the last century; there were times

urgent. Gillard, in what sounds depressingly like a reprise of the Howard position, says that there is nothing to stop us being both an ally of America and a friend of China. Well, actually there are two things that may stop us: America and China.

Fortunately both countries are currently controlled by relatively benign administrations, but this need not always be the case. A seriously belligerent regime in either Beijing or Washington could raise the temperature considerably.

The prospect of any direct military conflict between the two is, of course, remote; but this does not mean that there will not be misunderstandings, tensions and even the occasional skirmish.

Taiwan remains a potential flashpoint; North Korea is a serious worry; India and China have never really settled their border differences.

Any of them, or something completely unexpected, could trigger a standoff between the two great powers.

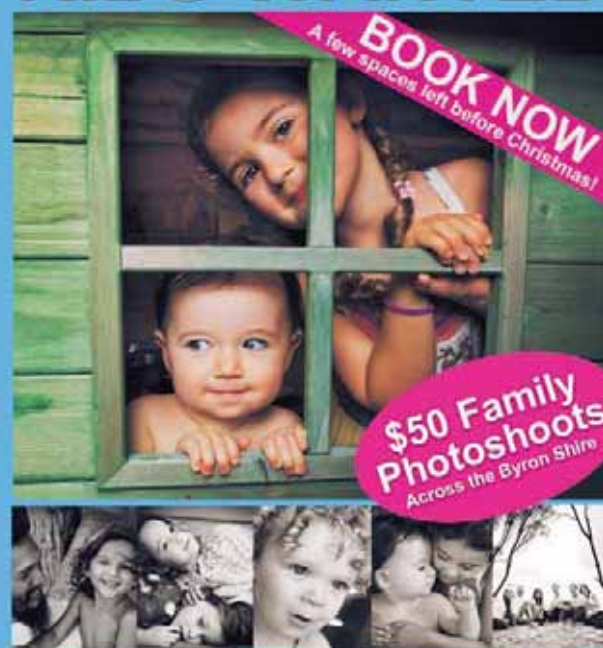

Peculiar policy

It was so disheartening to learn that the Byron Bay Surf Club had refused permission to hold an 11am funeral service

there the other week, citing a new no-funeral policy that was ostensibly to mitigate against the building being trashed. Apparently the funeral of a young person earlier in the year had resulted in damage.

Similarly, a couple of years ago my 16-year-old daughter and her friends were refused permission by the Ewingsdale Hall committee to hold an alcohol-free party there, also citing fear of damage as the reason (even though there were to be parents and security present). So here we are trying to keep young people off the streets at night, supervised and sober, but then we thwart their own efforts to organise a clean social gig in a public hall. And at the funeral of Julian Sherab, even the offer of a bond to the Surf Club did not change their adherence to 'policy'.

But what kind of 'policies' are they, that our scarce community facilities are deemed too precious for use by some people? How peculiar that weddings of people from beyond this Shire are given the OK, yet the funeral service of a beautiful man so widely loved, who has helped so many young people in this town over two decades, is refused.

This is lazy policy, not sensible problem solving. I would like to see some collaborative discussion between Council, as managers of these facilities on behalf of the community, and the committees that determine

such things, aiming towards a better alignment of facility management and community service obligations.

I appeal to the Surf Club to review their policy and consider that as a rule, funerals are far from rowdy events. In fact, we often do funerals so beautifully here. They are such extraordinary expressions of ourselves as a community and the beach, as part of the culture and spirit of this area, provides a resonant backdrop. Julian would have loved to have had his funeral there. I feel this Shire has shamefully lowered its benchmark by saying no.

Cloud gazing

Like Nicole McKee (Letters, November 1), I too am watching strange clouds and increasing air traffic pass over the Shire hills. My scientist friends say 'chemtrails' are either water vapour formed from the heat of aeroplane exhaust in certain atmospheric conditions or excess fuel dumped in deceleration for landing. Although occasional drizzles of spent avgas aren't good for us, there are far more efficient and cheaper ways to deliberately poison us than random aerial spraying.

Recent weird cloudscapes more likely result from 'certain atmospheric conditions'. Firstly, the current La Nina weather cycle is marked by rapid shifts in atmospheric pressure which create strange clouds, thunderstorms, hail and downpours. We are also building up for the next eleven-year solar maximum due to peak in 2013 (see www.noaa.gov for the astrophysics).

X-ray bursts, coronal mass ejections and solar flares affect our ionosphere and cause auroras in our stratosphere. Severe solar storms interfere with radio and satellite transmissions and even medium-



intensity solar emissions make me feel grumpy and scattered, much more than air pressure shifts do.

Scientific research has proved that solar storms reduce our melatonin levels (causing grumpiness etc). A sky full of protons, electrons and x-rays also increases stormy weather. The August full moon coincided with an x-ray spike and ionospheric proton surge, resulting in a moonbow in a very weird sky that seemed almost empty of stars, due to visible auroral electrojets. There were no planes or chemtrails that night.

Moderate solar events also occurred in September (9-10) and October (22-24) with a small x-ray spike on 1 November 1. So enjoy the wild cloudscape, moonbows, earthglows and auroral lightshows! Targeting gaps in the food supply chain to enhance security

Agricultural production is only the first step in moving the world's food from farm to fork, according to Nourishing the Planet, a project of the Worldwatch Institute.

The other links in the food chain - harvesting, packaging, storing, transporting, marketing, and selling - ensure that food actually reaches consumers. Inefficiencies in these activities, rather than just low yields or poor farming tech-

niques, are often to blame for food shortages and low prices for growers.

'Many of the farms and organisations we visited in Africa seemed to have the most success reducing hunger and poverty through efforts that had little to do with producing more crops,' said Nourishing the Planet director Danielle Nierenberg, who spent two years travelling across sub-Saharan Africa researching food

chains in over 25 countries.

With the United Nations projecting a global population of more than nine billion by 2050, increasing food-chain efficiency will become ever more essential.

Producers and consumers must be part of a food chain that feeds the world, provides fair prices to farmers, and works in harmony with the environment.

'When groups of small farm-

ers better organise their means of production they become more resilient to fluctuations in global food prices while also better serving local communities,' said Robert Engelman, executive director of Worldwatch.

Nourishing the Planet (www.NourishingthePlanet.org) is a two-year evaluation of environmentally sustainable agricultural innovations to alleviate hunger and poverty.

Councillors bamboozled by secret report

Last week I revealed that through legal action I had gained access to details of a 'confidential' session which Council held on August 11 regarding my property.

The ostensible reason for confidentiality was that there was legal advice involved. What rubbish; many's the time I was involved in debate where the legal advice was kept confidential but the debate itself was open. Furthermore legal advice is confidential only if it relates to a specific case, not if it is general in nature. I don't know what kind of advice was involved in this instance because in the copy of the staff report given to me the questions asked of the lawyers were blacked out; ie Council claims not only that the legal advice itself is secret but that even the questions asked are secret! I will challenge that, of course.

Your elected twats seem to be unaware that under the Local Government Act there is only one justifiable ground for confidentiality: that public disclosure might prejudice the maintenance of law and order (whatever that might mean). There may well be other grounds for confidentiality under other legislation, I don't

know. And neither do your elected councillors. They continue to just make it up as they go along, as though there aren't any rules. Meanwhile they're down on me for breaking the rules! I mean why would you give them any respect or credence?

After reading the 18-page staff report the real reason for keeping it confidential is crystal clear to me: the staff didn't want me to have the opportunity to rebut its contents. It contains the same selective, distorted and prejudicial material that the staff presented to the Local Court Registrar in order to justify the search warrant, giving a picture of me as the world's worst prick.

Having identified the real reason for secrecy let us now ask the next question: why was it necessary to have that debate at all? At the end of it your councillors voted to give the GM the power and authority to close me down. That's funny; they seem to have forgotten that they already gave him that power in another secret vote in July last year.

Ah, now for the real reason for the whole charade: I suspect that the staff wanted to conduct another raid on my

property but they needed to make sure that the elected councillors took the rap. So, while the vote itself made no explicit mention of any raid, it is clearly referred to in the staff report leading up to that vote:

'Council will incur costs in staff time and resources in continuing the present investigation including again applying for a court-approved search warrant/s and carrying out the inspection/s.'

This gives the GM a basis for saying that the raid was authorised by Council, when in fact the average councillor wouldn't have had the faintest realisation that that's what he/she was signing up to.

The staff report goes on to estimate the costs involved in the proposed raid:

'1. Registered land surveyor with specialist equipment - \$8500.

'2. Level 1 accredited builder surveyor with bushfire planning and development assessment expertise - \$1500/day x 2 days.

'3. Environmental consultant with expertise in OSMS and environmental risk management - estimate \$4000-\$5000.'

The GM can also claim that having alerted councillors to

the potential costs, he was fully authorised to spend over \$15,000 on the raid, on top of legal advice, search warrant application, staff time etc.

So what did the ratepayers get in return for Council's roughly \$25,000 harassment of me to date? My estimation is this: one giant PR disaster. In my opinion the raid was invalid. Furthermore the resolution coming out of the secret debate doesn't actually mention anyone or any particular property and therefore has no legal effect - duh.

Environmental trends threaten progress on poor

Development progress in the world's poorest countries could be halted or even reversed by mid-century unless bold steps are taken now to slow climate change, prevent further environmental damage, and reduce deep inequalities within and among nations, according to projections in the 2011 Human Development Report, launched by the United Nations Development Program (UNDP).

The 2011 report *Sustainability and Equity: A Better Future for All* argues that environmental sustainability can be most fairly and effectively achieved by addressing health, education, income, and gender disparities together with the need for global action on ener-

gy production and ecosystem protection. The Report was launched in Copenhagen by UNDP Administrator Helen Clark with Danish Prime Minister Helle Thorning-Schmidt, whose new government has pledged to reduce Denmark's CO₂ emissions by 40 per cent over the next ten years.

As the world community prepares for the landmark UN Conference on Sustainable Development in June 2012 in Rio de Janeiro, the report argues that sustainability must be approached as a matter of basic social justice, for current and future generations alike.

'Sustainability is not exclusively or even primarily an environmental issue, as this report so persuasively argues,

Helen Clark says in the foreword. 'It is fundamentally about how we choose to live our lives, with an awareness that everything we do has consequences for the seven billions of us here today, as well as for the billions more who will follow, for centuries to come.'

Despite the human development progress of recent years, income distribution has worsened, grave gender imbalances still persist, and accelerating environmental destruction puts a 'double burden of deprivation' on the poorest households and communities, the Report says. Half of all malnutrition worldwide is attributable to environmental factors, such as water pollution and drought-driven scarcity.

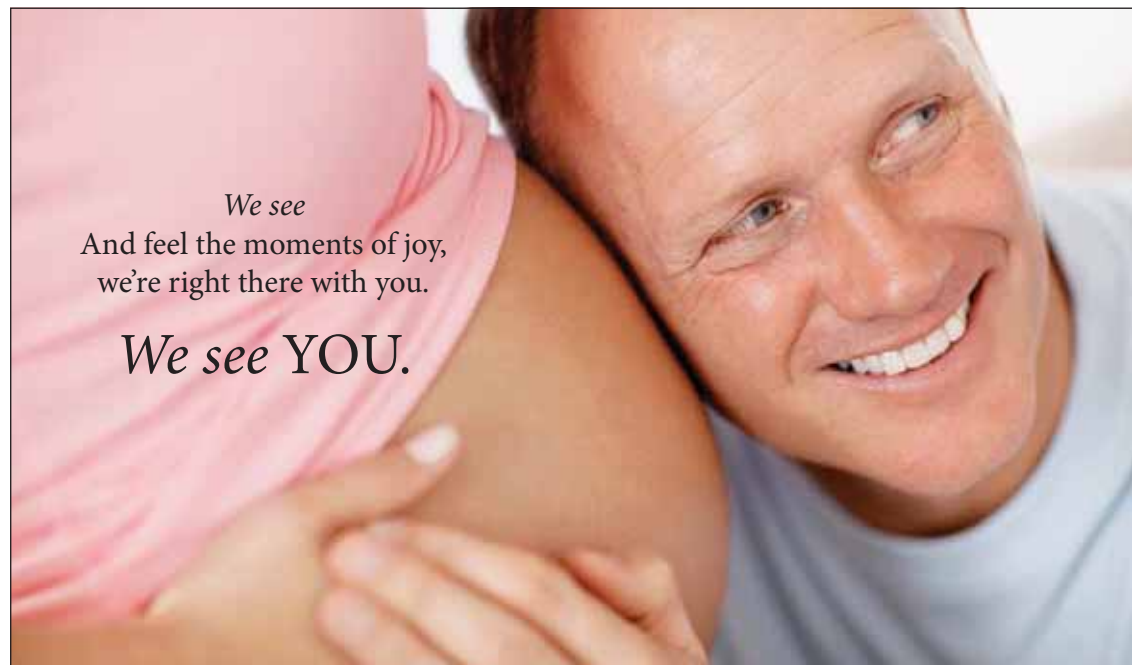

The Minister and the MP: a Q&A on

Greens MLC and Byron Shire mayor Jan Barham asked minister for the north coast and Ballina MP Don Page a series of questions at a recent estimates committee held in Sydney.

about. As I recall, we allocated in the last budget additional money for tourism, but I do not think that is the issue with which you are concerned.

JB: That was marketing.

DP: You are concerned about more marketing infrastructure to help councils cope with extra population resulting from tourism.

JB: Yes.

DP: Again, the infrastructure fund could be a source of funding for councils into the future. But I recognise that issue and you and I have been talking about it for a long time.

Tourism funding

Jan Barham: In your dual role will you be looking at any reform for the North Coast regarding how small councils can deal with tourism, and whether there are any opportunities for additional funds for councils struggling under the pressures of tourism?

Don Page: I understand the issue. One of the issues we have been discussing regarding Destination 2036 is that one size does not fit all councils. I do not know whether you have read the discussion paper, but we identified that coastal councils, for example, have a particular set of issues, including infrastructure needs, tourism and so on; western Sydney councils have a similar set of infrastructure issues but a different demographic; and inner city councils again have a different range of issues. One of the outcomes of Destination 2036 was to develop financial models for local government that are more related to their particular issues. We are mindful of what you are talking

Policing/ alcohol/ youth liaison officer

JB: Yes. I appreciate that it is being considered. In light of that, are there any comments about policing requirements? I appreciate that you have made submissions, and hopefully will continue to do so, about the unique needs for north coast areas, in particular the huge pressures in Byron Bay, which has the highest levels of police stress leave in the State. One position needed in Byron Bay is a dedicated youth liaison officer to meet north coast needs. Was that included in your submission for policing roles?

DP: I indicated a raft of is-

sues. It is a while ago since I wrote the submission but, from memory, I talked about some issues dealing with youth and youth crime. We need extra police, full stop. On the basis of my submission, we appear to have one police officer for every 700 people compared with the state average of one police officer for every 500 people. Prima facie, we had a strong case for additional police officers.

Whether that will be reflected in the review that assistant commissioner Parsons puts to Cabinet is yet to be seen, but I am confident that the north coast will see a significant increase in police numbers not least because of the high number of officers not available for operational duty. As you know, we have one of the highest levels of non-operational police officers; around 20 per cent of the total authorised strength is not available to go to work on any particular day. The government is keen to make sure that we reduce that as far as possible and, hopefully, reach some sort of acceptable minimum standard.


JB: A lot of that has to do with the unique qualities of a tourism town, particularly with some late-night-closing venues and related alcohol-fuelled issues. Is your govern-

ment or are you willing to take on board the need for the alcohol industry to pull in the reins because of the impact socially and on policing?

DP: I think the government sent a pretty strong message to the alcohol industry with the 'three strikes and you are out' legislation. The government will not tolerate hotels that allow people to get drunk, behave badly and go out into the community to create havoc. I am familiar with the Byron Bay situation. I must declare an interest as I live in Byron Bay and I know exactly what you are talking about. From my experience, the people involved with the Liquor Accord in Byron have generally been fairly responsible in relation to the service of alcohol and the provision of food. That is not to say there are not issues. There have been issues with youth crime - in particular, with people coming from outside the town and challenging the local people to fights and so on. There are some issues there.

West Byron Project

JB: Can you explain why a large development like [the West Byron Project] was not returned to local government when the government has made such a big deal about

issues relevant to Byron Shire

returning planning powers to local government?

DP: I understand about 50 per cent of projects in the Department of Planning were returned to local government. I understand that one was reasonably advanced, in terms of the rezoning proposals, but I could take advice on that. That would have been a matter for the Department of Planning as to why it kept it and did not return it to Council. Normally the reason it has kept certain projects is that the project had gone down the track a certain way and therefore it would have been inappropriate to stop the process.

As far as I am concerned in relation to that potentially significant development in west Byron Bay, as the minister for the north coast, that will not go ahead until and unless the traffic issues in Byron Bay are sorted out. I have told the people that. As far as I am concerned, the traffic issues, which are already bad, cannot sustain an additional 800-odd blocks to the west of Byron Bay until we sort out the traffic issues, including the significant bypass and the mini-bypass that you and I already know about.

JB: The site was never included in the upgrade for the sewerage treatment plant because it was deemed not to be

suitable for additional development.

Crown lands – caravan parks

JB: The other concern on the north coast in a number of areas is regarding Crown land and this and the previous Government's move on caravan parks for the redevelopment of those areas, taking away much-needed affordable holiday places as well as affordable housing. Do you have any update on whether you are willing to make representations or have a concern about the commercialisation of Crown land?

DP: What the previous government did, and so far we are doing, is to try and ensure that the taxpayer gets a reasonable return on Crown lands. The land is not owned by the people who happen to live next door; it is owned by all the people of New South Wales. Part of that redevelopment is to ensure that the facilities offered to those who come to camp are nice – they have decent amenity blocks and so on. My understanding is that is what is happening: they are looking to upgrade the facility, not to turn it into a five-star resort. Basically, the redevelopment will be to improve the footpaths and the amenities so they probably

can get slightly higher rents. In terms of reducing public access, obviously as somebody involved in developing the coastal policy all those years ago I am very keen to make sure that we do not lose public access to beaches. Are you talking about the one at Brunswick Heads?

JB: It is one of a number.

DP: The council and lands department were involved in a long negotiation in relation to a possible land swap.

JB: The staff were, and that went against the community's position. It resulted from the fact that the previous government would not approve plans of management developed in 2000 to allow the council to bring the park back into compliance.

Then we saw the outcome: the takeover of the parks and redevelopment against the interests of the local tourism industry, which does not want to see that competition on Crown land. It is complex, but it is not just in my area – I just know that area well.

It is happening in the Tweed and further down around the Clarence area. This is a takeover of Crown land for commercialisation and I do not think most people will support that. Perhaps you could follow up on that issue.

Creative industries

JB: Do you have initiatives to support the creative sector and funding for job creation in response to the regional creative industries strategy?

DP: The government and I understand the importance of the creative industries to places like Byron Bay and the north coast. You will be aware that in the past the state government has provided support for things like the Byron Bay Writers' Festival and other creative arts activities. I know of no plan to reduce anything, and personally I would be keen to see an increase in the amount of funding going to those sorts of activities.

Interestingly, I sat on a public works committee that looked at the benefits of the creative arts industries to the economy, and the economic benefits are significant.

Certainly overseas a lot of business people are funding creative opportunities in their shops that are closing around the central business district... because they recognise the economic benefits that flow from that.

I do not need to be convinced or converted in relation to the benefits that come with an expansion of the creative arts and cultural activities.

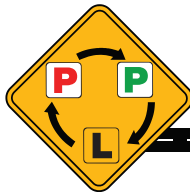

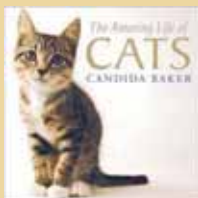

The weekend's Iron Man event at the Bangalow Show will see competitors battle it out for the crown.

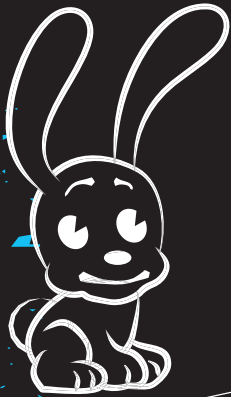

Some people shut up the kids who start to tell stories. Kids dance in their cribs, but someone will insist they sit still. By the time the creative people are ten or twelve, they want to be like everyone else.'

last year, some from as far as Bonalbo, some from Caboolture; one of the winners was from Casino; we had lots of high school entries.'

So what were the judges looking for when they awarded winners?

'Judges were looking for performers who had quite a bit of experience. You could tell this by what they submitted in their bio. They were at a level of professionalism and it was clear the opportunity would help them get to the next level. There were some artists where you thought they would benefit because they could use the opportunity to build their profile and they were in line with their mentor and what they could give them.'

Which entries stood out the most ?

'The band entries were fantastic. Bands have a sense of humour that solo singer-songwriters don't have. The bands are quirky and sometimes people had cameras strapped to basses at live performances.'

THE ETHICAL DILEMMA FESTIVAL

Right now the good folk at Woodford Festival are in a major ethical dilemma.

According to the *Sunshine Coast Daily*, it was the Queensland Folk Federation on behalf of The Dreaming, a celebration of indigenous performance, art and culture, who accepted \$225,000 necessary for the Dreaming event to continue. Without the funding this important Australian cultural event won't happen. Problem is, the board have accepted the bucks from Santos, and I'm not talking about our local purveyors of nori rolls and ear candles; I'm talking about the mining giant, Santos. And, incidentally, considering that in August this year they posted a net profit on their website of \$504 million, for a half year, indicating a cool profit of potentially around a billion for this financial year, their Dreaming festival donation is like Dick Smith giving \$1.

It is no doubt that those in the know at Woodford have watched the growing public outcry around CSG with nervous disbelief. The wave of public support for this issue is unprecedented. It's not often that Alan Jones and the Farmers Federation share the same side of the fence as left-wing militant hippies. This speaks to the underlying ethos of the anti-coal-seam gas Lock The Gate movement. This is not

a radical group. This is mainstream Australia. Not even hippy-haters want their water sources made toxic for generations to come.

A spokesperson for the Jinibara Nation, the traditional custodians of the Woodfordia site, said it was his view that major corporations should be contributing to Aboriginal communities. And rightly so. It seems only fair that mining companies should dig deep into those dusty, uranium-filled pockets and contribute towards projects and infrastructure for Indigenous communities.

But here's the rub: Woodford is a festival that has long been associated with environmental values where the broader community gets to experience a week-long, utopian-like village of inclusive, amazing and vibrant counterculture. Why, it was here that the coal-seam gas lobby first started. It's hard to sit back and enjoy the 80 or more environmentally focused speakers in the Greenhouse program knowing that the same board that probably once voted for the inclusion of such a forward thinking program also voted to accept the donation from Santos.

Corporations don't just give money because they are benevolent capitalists who have suddenly woken one day having a crisis of conscience. Corporations use their money to buy association with values and brands that will benefit them in the marketplace. Clearly, having their cash accepted by Australia's most publicly environmentally focused festival is a win for Santos. While hippies and straighties may unite in their bid to Lock the Gate on CSG, come Woodford Fest, if they are enjoying The Dreaming Festival (once separate but now incorporated in the Woodford program) then they owe a debt of gratitude to the corporation that has previously been demonised as Dr Evil.

You don't have to be an ethics professor to realise that Woodford are up to their necks in some very stinky shit. And aren't we all? Remind yourself of our daily moral transgressions: we drive petrol guzzling cars emblazoned with the manufacturer's logos, we enjoy bargain clothes made by third-world children in sweatshops, and it's hard

to fine someone who's not addicted to technologies like the iPhone which, created in a fair workplace, would end up costing something like \$12,000 per unit. We are all guilty.

The Woodford situation puts us in an ethical dilemma as well. You see, we all love Woodford. People plan their year around going there. Now we all have to check in with our own personal moral compass about whether attending a festival that has accepted buckeroons from a company involved with CSG exploration and extraction is personally right or wrong. I am torn between my passionate politics and my loyalty to a beloved event.

You see, Woodford Festival, you overlooked something about your incredibly diverse demographic of mothers and fathers and children and grandparents: these people from so many different cultures share one commonality - they are all highly ethical people. I don't think they'll go. Which is sad, because something like that could kill Woodford. It's ironic, isn't it, that in the pursuit of coal-seam gas it's not just our water supply that is poisoned, but possibly the country's most well-loved festival? Collateral damage. So here is the dilemma that faced Woodford Festival and the Queensland Folk Federation in a nutshell: To Lock the Gate on Santos meant to close the doors on The Dreaming Festival. So what, my energy-sucking friends, should we do now?

By all means lock the gate, but let's make sure that Woodford's gate stays open.

There is an element of performance that is about fun; for the young fellas it's almost like kicking the footy around.'

Tom reflected on last year's singer-songwriter category winner Jordan Mylrea to explain how a mentorship can enhance a young person's performance skills.

'Nano Stern mentored Jordan last year. Jordan was a very good singer-songwriter and incorporated some interesting music ideas, but he was very quiet and shy about his songs. Although he had a lot of material he said his show improved so much from the mentorship because Nano gave him buckets of mojo about getting up and performing. His mum and dad were there at his performance and the change was remarkable; there were definitely tears!'

'This is the thing they get from the mentors, it's that stage craft element giving the kids ideas about how to play their songs how they would play it and the mentor will give tips on their set list or the song and help them accentuate things that they hadn't thought of before.'

Winners were delighted. Brother and sister songwriting duo Gabriel and Cecilia commented:

'We would like to thank the Mullumbimby music festival for giving us such a wondrous opportunity to play alongside such talented and renown musicians. We are both ecstatic with excitement, dying to get on stage and perform the songs we have spent countless hours composing and practising. We are both highly motivated musicians who have been playing instruments since before we were talking and walking and we

can't wait to see all you lovely people at the festival!'

And the boys from Potato Potato were equally grateful and excited about what lies in store for them over the next few weeks.

'We are really stoked and really looking forward to the opportunity to talk and learn from Husky; they are such a great band and we can't wait to meet them and get some tips. Being 14 we greatly appreciate the chance to improve our sound, stage performance and musicality; we can't wait to see you all at the festival.'

Mullum Music Festival, Thursday 24 till Sunday 27 November. Four days, eight venues and more than 100 performances, some of them by our new up-and-coming young music stars. Make sure you catch their shows and be part of the Mullum Music Festival movement to nurture emerging talent.

It's not every day that young people get a chance to share the bill with international and national talent.

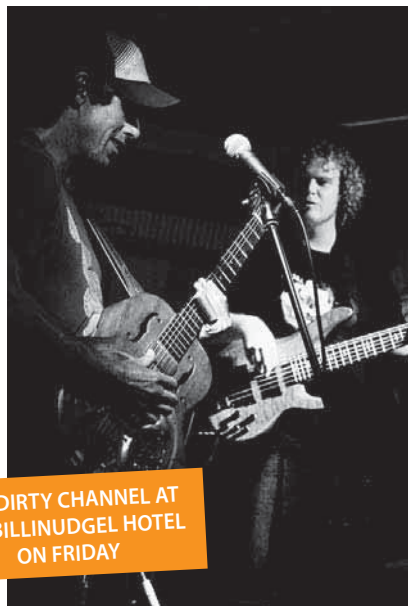

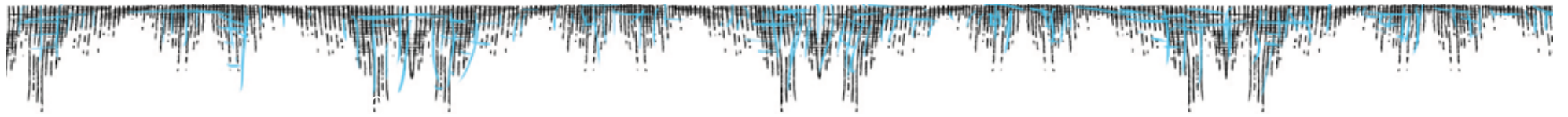

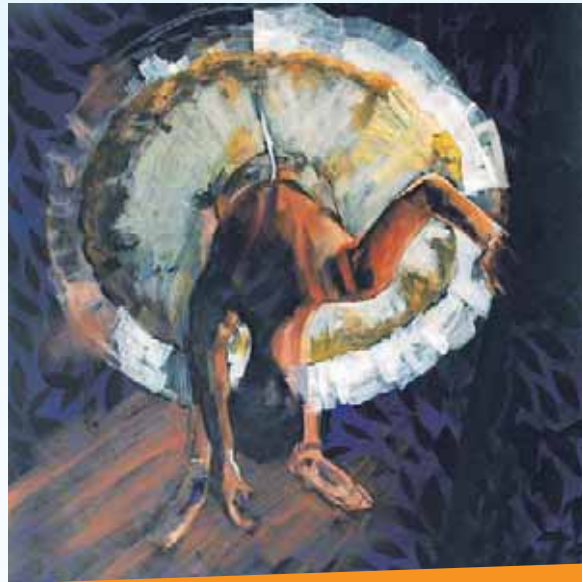

The worries in Athens seemed remote as many top grandmasters contested the European Teams Championship in the Greek beach resort of Porto Carras, on the Halkidiki peninsula.

In the main hotel's Olympic-size hall, a world away from the boarded-up shops of Athens, the local Greek team provided much needed cheer for their compatriots by challenging for the top places for much of the event.

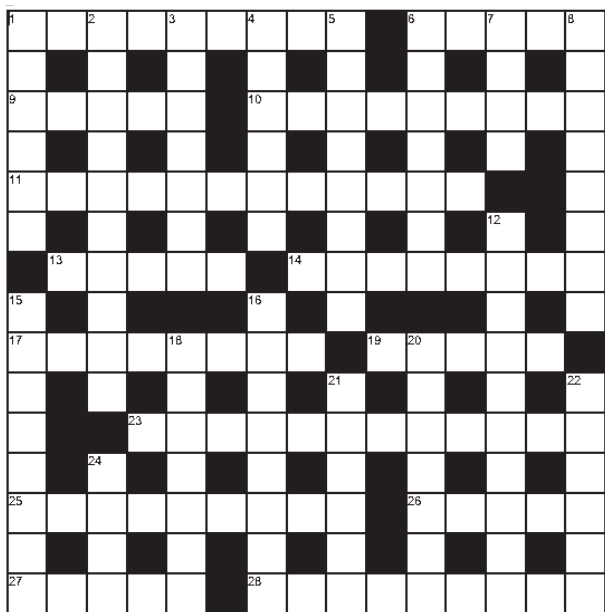
Surf Movie

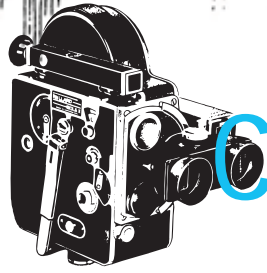

Moneyball

Modern literature and cinema champion the individual above all else. He wins the girl, gets the money, catches the crook, finds personal fulfillment etc. Belief that the group should be of primary concern in any morality tale has long since fallen by the wayside, but its remnant DNA survives in our abiding attraction to the tribalism of team sport – and movies about team sport. Bennet Miller's account of the Oakland Athletics' historic 2002 baseball season makes no attempt to subvert the prevailing paradigm – it's all about the ambition of one of man, General Manager Billy Beane (Brad Pitt) – but it's underpinned throughout by the primitivism of what needs to be done for the collective to prosper. Typically, the story develops into an underdog's

struggle, with Beane, a failed baseball prodigy, and his nerdy offside, the short and pudgy Peter Brand (Jonah Hill), as Don Quixote and Sancho Panza, fighting the good fight of the cash-strapped outfit, its best players poached, up against likes of the New York Yankees. They introduce a regime based on statistics and the recruitment of unfashionable has-beens and rejects, an approach that results in bitter conflict with the traditionalists within their own organisation. The always-watchable Pitt exudes a diamond-hard charm mixed with the fanaticism of the driven (he reprises edgy elements of his 2007 Jesse James), and if Hill's character is underdone, the pungent performance of Philip Seymour Hoffman (whom I at first did not recognise) as Art Howe, the coach in the dug-out who will not have a bar of the

new philosophy, is loaded with resentment and stubbornness. Knowing what the 'bottom of the ninth' means comes in handy, but a broad knowledge of baseball's rules and patois is not essential – you'll get the drift quick-smart – while an astute use of archival footage provides the raw, heart-thumping atmospherics that allows for a proper appreciation of the team's achievement. As a sports fan, I loved it without reservation, but it is terrific in every other way too.

The Whistleblower

There is a category of film that we might call 'essential viewing'. It's made up of those movies that somebody's got to make about the goddamn awfulness that festers in the world, about the soul-destroying stories that most of us would rather pretend aren't there. Latest figures from the UN conservatively estimate that there are now over two and a half million victims of people trafficking – ie, slavery – and the number is growing. A large percentage of them are teenage girls, every day being raped, beaten and stood over by thugs, bent coppers and increasingly (if this is anything to go by) foreign soldiers and mercenaries deployed in 'peacekeeping' activities. The subject of first-time director Larissa Kondraki's uncompromising and exhausting exposé is Kathryn Bolkovac, a divorced Nebraska policewoman who accepts a posting to Bosnia as a means of easing her pressing financial problems. In that war-ravaged country ('these people specialise in fucked-up' one outsider observes), she learns of a bar frequented by US and European troops where young women are being brutally exploited. Outraged, she investigates, taking a particular interest in Raya, a stateless girl from Ukraine. Rachel Weisz, not needing to bank on her natural beauty, is superb in what must have been an emotionally draining part, but Kondraki doesn't do her, or the viewer, any favours by pursuing a course that is almost unbearably grim.

The matter at hand hardly calls for levity, but a bit of light and shade and an occasional change in pace or emphasis would not go astray – indeed, she might also have attempted to shine a light on the 'why' instead of a relentless focus on the 'what' is happening and to whom. The question of how otherwise ordinary blokes can be so criminally corrupted is not asked. A demoralising postscript does nothing to assuage the despair provoked by the sight of suffering humanity – but that's alright, as long as our government keeps us safe from those women and children in their leaky boats.

Midnight In Paris

If only Owen Wilson could have taken Woody Allen's part in all of his movies. Even in *Annie Hall* and *Manhattan*, both gems, the whining, self-absorbed Allen manages to get up this viewer's nose. How could anybody possibly care what happens to him? Wilson, however, usually wasted in rom-com schlock, is an immediately likeable actor, with just the right mix of vulnerability, resilience and gaucheness. And, unlike Allen, he can be genuinely self-deprecating and funny in a way that doesn't demand that you laugh at his lines. Here he is Gil, a jobbing screenwriter who wants to be a serious novelist. In Paris with his fiancée Inez (Rachel McAdams), he bails out of an invitation to go dancing with the overbearing Paul (Michael Sheen) and his partner, preferring instead to wander aimlessly around the City of Light. At the stroke of midnight he is picked up in a vintage car and transported in time and place to a glittering 1920s party where he meets F Scott Fitzgerald and his notorious wife Zelda, who in turn usher him into their circle of famous artists and writers – Picasso, Dali, Man Ray, Gertrude Stein, death-obsessed Hemingway (Corey Stoll is fabulous) – a dream come true for Gil the escapist. It's a corny device, and hardly new, but the fantasy is



beautifully constructed, and the giants of the era drawn affectionately but without fawning (Allen expects you to recognise their idiosyncrasies in his pen-portraits). Gil's nostalgia for a period that he never knew and, conversely, his alienation from his current circumstances, inevitably lead him into emotional strife when he falls for Picasso's muse, Adriana (Marion Cotillard). It's life imitating art, it's coming to terms with one's true self, it's

about how we are so governed by the whims of the heart. Paris is shot with unabashed adoration – the film opens with a long, seductive tour of the sights – and the music is note perfect (the sweet melancholy of *Parlez moi d'amour* is a recurring theme). Forget the dreary Vicky Cristina Barcelona; at seventy-six, Allen has returned to top form with this elegant, charming and irresistibly romantic story.

Dining in a queenly manner

The first time I did it felt decadent, self-indulgent, absurdly extravagant. A one-hundred gram packet of smoked salmon slit open and the slices (at least I went to the trouble) fanned out decoratively on my dinner plate. Lemon wedges and a little mound of those tiny capers, the salt rinsed away. Translucent moons of finely sliced red onion. A bulge of cream cheese sprigged with shrill green dill. Bread basket filled with slim diagonals of sourdough breadstick I had crisped and faintly coloured in the oven. An evening meal for a night I had no wish nor energy to cook, to merely compose – and a wonderful feast it was.

Since then I will periodically dine in this queenly manner on smoked salmon, but the guilt has long since departed. That entire meal costs me less than \$10; fresh grilled fish and salad would come to more. The fact is that smoked salmon, historically a luxury and to this day still deemed one, is completely affordable and not an absurd extravagance at all. (Something about this makes me sad in the same way that items like laughably cheap sound systems make me sad: remembering the months and months I paid off my very first stereo in my teens, how special it was, how grand that final payment made me feel.)

Smoked salmon these days could – nay should – be a kitchen staple, a pack or two as part of the standard contents of a refrigerator. Especially now as we enter the stressful festive season with its concomitant rounds of celebratory events, all involving eating and drinking, it must rank as one of the easiest options around. Even devoid of all the accoutrements – even simply as a draping of smoked salmon on a wooden board alongside a bread knife and a breadstick and a couple of lemons. There aren't many people who will resist it. Supermarkets offer a series of choices from as

low as \$5 but my favourite way of purchasing this so-called delicacy is from a fishmonger's where the slices, eased off an entire side of the fish, are of superior quality and taste (if it can be said of something smoked) somehow fresher.

You can of course go to the sort of lengths I am often in the mood for – like whipping up a batch of yeasty buckwheat blini. At various stages of my life I have been found plopping teaspoonfuls of batter mixture, with infinite patience, into a frypan for well over an hour, removing each perfectly formed baby pikelet to an ever-growing tower of the things. And that's only phase one before the individual smearing with creme fraiche of each, the delicate curling of smoked salmon on top, the careful grating of lemon zest and tiny tuft of dill. Other times I have made miniature dill scones as vehicles for the smoked salmon. Potato pancakes and zucchini pancakes work beautifully as well, although the simplicity of a moist and fruity rye or pumpnickel bread – and you can buy these in little rounds as well as squares – should not be overlooked.

Having a packet of smoked salmon there in your refrigerator, lasting pretty well forever, also means you have the essence of surely one of the easiest pasta dishes around. As long as you are careful about not actually cooking the strips of smoked salmon – which ruins it, toughens it up, robs it of flavour – but merely warming them through in some foaming butter, you can have the dish on the table within the time it takes to cook the pasta. I find a fresh egg strand pasta works best – fettuccine, tagliatelle. As it bubbles away you are quickly tossing the fish in the butter, splashing in a slug of brandy (igniting it if you are using gas and feeling theatrical), pouring in some cream and a handful of capers and reducing it till it's thick. Hurl in the pasta, coat with the sauce – and there you are.

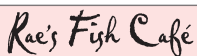

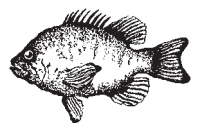

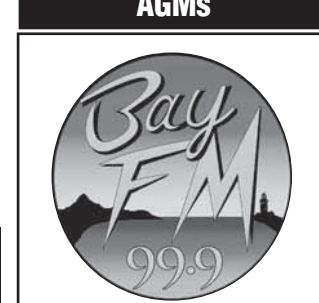

Carbon pricing puts focus on green & affordable housing challenge

The passing of the carbon pricing legislation through federal parliament will see the future cost of energy become an accelerating market force driving a new generation of green homes and renovations throughout Australia, according to architecture advice group Archicentre.

Archicentre general manager David Hallett said the need for home owners to reduce the energy consumption of their homes is also likely to see an increase in architect

designed homes and renovations to maximise savings and improve lifestyle environments. 'Good environmental design that starts at the planning stage is the foundation of creating a home which is comfortable to live in and protects home owners against increasing energy and water costs. 'Good housing design can also create a valuable asset when the home is sold with sustainable homes likely to become increasingly attractive to the market.'

Mr Hallett said that at an early stage planning for better use of materials in construction, improved orientation of buildings to maximise solar energy and lessening the use of air conditioners and heaters in homes can make a major impact on energy costs and property value. 'We also expect to see an increasing return to the use of the traditional eave in future housing design.'

'Historically the eave or verandah was a fundamental part of Australian homes; however, in the last decade its removal for the sake of fashion and cost has seen the building of thousands of homes poorly equipped to cope with climate-change demands such as increasing temperatures and storms. 'The use of eaves in homes has a major impact on a property's sustainability by increasing water harvesting potential, providing valuable shade over windows and walls, keeping homes cooler in summer and conserving power.'

'Eaves also offer the added protection to the interior of the home from flooding that can result from concealed gutters.'

'The best advice for home owners and home buyers is to run the green ruler over the property to ensure that it can be improved in



a cost-effective way to deliver an optimal environmental outcome.

'One of the biggest issues is changing people's behaviour and attitudes to how they manage resources in their homes and workplaces.'

The simple task of placing a desk near a window in the home office could see natural light being used rather than full-time lighting being required.

'Just wearing cooler clothes in summer in the home could see the air-conditioner used less to save money on energy bills. Closing curtains or internal blinds over windows on predicted hot days can also keep the home cool.'

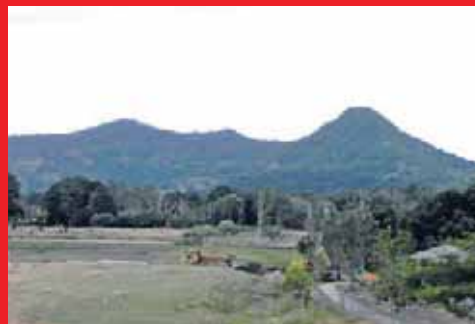


