

infamous Bruns bar

Local yachtsman Bob Martin is advising all big boats to avoid the notorious Brunswick bar after a four million dollar yacht lost its rudder in shallow waters a few days before New Year's

Thankfully no-one was injured when the 48 tonne sloop, the Bel*latrix*, hit sand at the river's entrance, but it proved inconvenient for its captain, Dutch multi-millionaire Kommer Damen.

Mr Damen is heir to a worldwide shipbuilding empire based in Holland.

Mr Martin said Mr Damen and his family stayed at the harbour for two weeks, waiting for an opportunity to cross the bar to sail - with an improvised rudder – to the Gold Coast for repairs.

'We finally got him through the bar, and then watched them for an hour doing circles, he said.

'Kommer asked Pete, the owner of the local trawler, to tow him to Coomera. Pete agreed and was taking me and big Mal back in through the bar to get food and water when Pete snapped his rudder off!'

Mr Martin says that he then voluntow the vessel. 'Luckily my son Allan and his mate were at the boat when

this happened and they came and helped.'

After an exhaustive tow, he says both crews arrived through the Southport seaway at 10pm.

'Interestingly, Kommer says he has sailed all the world's oceans, twice over, and never got a scratch on his boat until he came here?

Dredging not cost effective: Cr Tabart

The incident - along with others in recent times - raises the issue of dredging; however, it would not be cost effective, according to councillor Tom Tabart.

Cr Tabart, who used to moor a 48-foot boat in the harbour, told The Echo that dredging 'was done around 20 years ago, and it went back to where it was within months.'

Dredging won't make a difference, he says, as there is a rock shelf at the mouth of the river and the angle of the walls are not ideally positioned. 'Securing state funding is also a difficulty, he says, and has been a 'merry-go-round issue' for years. 'It's not a safe bar under any circumstances, he added.

Owen Danvers from Brunswick teered his yacht, the Nord Sjarna, to Marine Rescue agrees with Cr Tabart on the bar's design.

Akubras flattened by CSG trucks at protest

Drilling rig trucks crushed Akubra hats into the dirt on Saturday morning in the Kerry Valley as Arrow Energy sought to end a ten-day standoff with angry landholders in the Scenic Rim, south-east Queensland.

The blockade of the site, organised by 'Keep the Scenic Rim Scenic', rapidly gained momentum as Arrow conducted exploratory drilling within a heavily policed enclosure.

Stirring address

Arrow announced that exploration is complete, but protesters suspect that it was terminated early to avoid mounting pressure.

With the rig ready to depart, Kerry Valley farmer Rod Anderson, Akubra hats in hand, gave a stirring address.

'I've been standing over by that strainer post for the last bloody ten days, quietly behavin' like all of us locals have. I've got a little place up the top there, it's only small, might

be insignificant to some, but it's my be seen. They were frightened. house and it's my home.

'And fancy, it's just absolutely mindboggling that good citizens and good farmers and good people with no criminal history - just blokes off the street who are trying to do the right more people that'll stand up. thig for this country - are forced to come down here and bark at cars like test, and all the other people's hats mongrel dogs.

'That's bullshit. It's not fair. The whole place here is built on generations of farmers, generations of business people at the rig, followed by fellow protestthat have done the best they can do for this community and are putting stuff back into the community.

'I can't believe that we have to justify ourselves to the government... Arrow should be down here justifying their existence to have the right to ruin our water. And the government's letting them do it.

'So I'm here to make a stand for all the people who were too afraid to come down here because of the standover tactics and they didn't want their emotion. to be involved and they didn't want to

'So I'm putting my hat down in prodown, people that I know that are me mates. I've had a gutful.'



Suffolk Park's bluegreen algae alert

The North Coast Regional Algal Co-ordinating Committee have issued a high alert for bluegreen algae in the stormwater pond at Baywood Chase residential estate in Suffolk Park.

The alert indicates that waters are unsuitable for recreational use or primary contact by water users and may also pose a threat to pets.

Warning signs have been positioned around the lake and will remain in place until the bloom subsides.

Blue-green algae can cause skin rashes, asthma and eye and ear irritations if contacted and diarrhoea and other health problems if ingested.

MP McClelland listens to local housing experts

Housing minister told 'working poor' are being forced into emergency housing by unaffordable rents

'It's the working poor that are now knocking on our doors, says Byron Emergency Accommodation Project (BEAP) cooordinator Damian Farrell.

Once upon a time if you came to the refuge there was a reason why you were likely homeless; be it alcohol or other drugs, mental health or a relationship breakdown. Now it is simply an affordable housing issue that is forcing these individuals and families to be homeless.

That was one of the many revelations made recently when federal minister for housing Robert McClelland sat down with community leaders within the emergency and affordable housing sector.

Mr McClelland told the gathering on Tuesday he had heard good things about BEAP and other local services and it was recommended to him to pay a visit to see how they operate.

The wide-ranging open discussion at the Scott Street emergency accommodation beds for families fleeing domesexplored the current services available to those with dire housing needs and ways of streamlining the state, federal and local governments' coordination to the issue.

In attendance was also Byron Shire mayor and state MP Jan Barham, federal MP Justine Elliot, Paul Spooner, Tony Davies and Trish Evans, among others.

Stretched and under-resourced

It was also revealed that emergency housing is stretched and under-resourced.

'BEAP is the only generalist refuge - males, females and families - between the Queensland border and south of Grafton,'

Mr Farrell told *The Echo*.

'There is no proclaimed place to safely house those homeless persons who are intoxicated or substance affected. This places great stress on our hospitals, health and police services. There are limited amounts of refuge tic violence. Homeless persons with a mental illness often have a sad plight between living in parks and psychiatric facilities and major difficulties in accessing any accommodation.

Market rent unaffordable

Mr Farrell explained affordable housing and its effects.

'If you pay more than 30 per cent of your income on rent then you will be living in poverty. Most homeless people trying to break their cycle of homelessness around the Northern Rivers are looking at likely paying 50 to 70 per cent of their income to get a room.

For example, lots of people at the refuge are on Newstart

and get approx \$525 to \$575 a fortnight; to get a room in a very basic share accom around the Byron Shire you are looking at \$150 to \$180 a week or \$300 to \$360 per fortnight.

Maximum efficency

'Thus leaving about \$100 to \$140 a week to cover food; electricity; can they afford a phone? dental? car? health checks?

'What about our youth on youth allowance of about \$350 per fortnight? These members of our community are living in very compromised housing situations.

At the meeting, Trish Evans from the Northern Rivers Social Development Council (NRSDC) suggested an affordable housing co-ordinator to liaise between all three tiers of government. This was roundly applauded as a worthy and practical solution to potentially bringing in more funding, housing stock and models of housing and choices to the area.

with Tony Davies, also from the NRSDC, told Mr McClelland that the capable organisations in the area are already stretched to maximum efficency and it is unfair and unrealistic to expect these organisations to take on significant partnerships with the government departments and developers to bring further housing stock to the area.

Mr Farrell added that submitting development applications and understanding legislation around housing compliance issues 'is not the forte of us community support workers.

'It is encouraging that the Minister in his first few weeks of his new portfolio is out there fact finding and coming to small regional areas with significant homeless issues to hear what is lacking and what is needed. 



Library construction delayed

In response to Council closing the Bangalow weir due to being unsafe, three organisations are holding a forum to ask the community what they would like to see done about it.

Byron Council has now fenced off the pool and commissioned a study into the options for Bangalow weir.

Neither alternative looks rosy: spend \$1 million on repairing or replacing the fractured structure, complete with a functional 'fishway'; or demolish it and leave the aquatic fauna and Bangalow swimmers to fend for themselves.

The forum, to be held at the Anglican church hall in Ashton Street, Bangalow, on Tuesday February 7, will be conducted like a hypothetical and facilitated by local journalist Mick O'Regan. Outside *The Echo* chamber

As editor, it's important to spend time outside The Echo chamber.

Validating your own opinions, while a human trait, must be resisted at all costs.

So this week I asked myself, who are the top conservative intellectuals that have influenced the West? Unsurprisingly, Australia hasn't produced any real heavyweights; much of our cues come from the US and the UK.

It's fair to say that the pronouncements of Australian pundits such as Bolt, Laws, Jones and Akerman are like car accidents that the police and ambulance are attending. You slow down, look in pity, then drive on.

No, an intellectual – by definition – must excel in topics such as philosophy, not just politics and economics. Art too... and music... and comedy... wait a minute! Are there any renaissance Liberals? Is Malcom Turnbull our only hope?

One popular conservative 'thinker' that comes to mind is the late author Ayn Rand.

Despite being atheist and very much anti-fascist, she spurred the iGeneration in the 6os – way before Steve Jobs – with books such as the The Virtue of Selfishness. Her best known work is of course Atlas Shrugged – the neo-con bible for selfish individual rights activists.

What is most impressive about her brain was her theories on objectivism and critical thought on philosophical matters. She didn't toe any political party line either and challenged the more conservative conservatives.

William F Buckley is another, and is famous for his verbal sparring. Spats with Noam Chomsky, Gore Vidal and Carl Sagan are legendary. As a journalist he founded the political magazine National Review and went on to host political TV talkshows and write spy novels.

Interesting fact? This Catholic son of a New York City lawyer and oil baron famously made the distinction between the lowercase c and the capital C for conservatives. The latter 'C' being what he believed to be 'true' conservatives: fiscally conservative and socially conservative/libertarian or libertarian

Like Ayn Rand, he was also a free thinker and didn't fit political moulds.

Finally, Christopher Hitchens is on this list, and is again a political outsider. He plays nicely into this Winston Churchill quote: 'If you're not a liberal [ie socialist] at twenty you have no heart; if you're not a conservative at forty you have no brain.'

Despite a life devoted to ridiculing God-botherers for sadistic sport, Hitch eventually warmed to the idea that the West is best.

The Hitch switched from Socialism and later in life believed that invading and colonising other countries is a just cause. His interview on death's door with UK journalist Jeremy Paxman explains it all.

Gillard lacks smarts on pokie reform

ber, the Earl of Rochester, a notable wit, once pinned a note. It read:

'Here lies our sovereign lord, the Kina

Whose word no man relies

He never says a foolish thing Nor ever does a wise one.'

Unfortunately the noble earl expired in 1680, or we could ask him to pen a similar missive for Julia Gillard.

Like the merry monarch, she can tell a good story, but the implementation of it is frankly lamentable.

Keeping her promise to Andrew Wilkie to legislate for precommitment for poker machine players was always going to be a problem, but it could have been handled much better, starting much earlier. Instead, she left her backdown so late that there was no time to produce genuine alternative reforms which would have proved to Wilkie, and much more importantly to the mass of voters, that she was serious about the issue. Now she is left looking, once again, tricky and deceitful.

The headlines from last week said it all. Where the Sydney Morning Herald announced: 'Gillard retreats on pokie reforms, implying a forced withdrawal from a course of action to which she was committed, The Australian ran: 'Gillard prevails in pokies stand-off'. The insinuation was that Gillard had never intended to fulfil her promise; now she had called Wilkie's bluff and won.

But in any case she hadn't; Wilkie went ahead and withdrew his support, and while he is unlikely to be in a rush to install Tony Abbott as prime minister, Gillard can no longer rely on his vote to pass her legislation. He has already signalled that he is reconsidering his support for the government's bill to means

n the door of King test the health insurance rebate, Charles II's bedcham- which the government considers vital for both fiscal and social reasons, and more payback is likely.

> And it needn't have been thus. Gillard's excuse for ditching her commitment was that the numbers in the House of Representatives simply weren't there; the bill would not have been passed, so there was no point in introducing it. But Wilkie avers that he could still get the numbers; presumably he was relying on bringing over

Fighting the good fight, even with the enthusiastic aid of community organisations such as GetUp, the moral authority of Tim Costello and most of the churches and the pro bono skills of major advertising and marketing guns such as Neil Lawrence and Sue Cato was just too hard.

And even widespread public support did not beat the club money. The polls, even in the New South Wales and Queensland marginals most keenly targeted by Clubs Australia, still showed a majority of voters in favour of reform, and even of Wilkie's proposed measures. And anyway, the experts, led by the Nielsen pollster John Stirton, do not regard the issue as a vote changer. So why is Gillard running away?

At the very least, it is to be hoped that the SMH was right; that it is a retreat, not a complete rout. Because the signal it sends is that from now on, any well-heeled pressure group can call the shots. At the first whiff of grapeshot, the government will capitulate. And the electorate will not, and should not, put up with such cowardice from the captain and the crew.

The carbon tax showed that Gillard could play tough when she wanted to, but her behaviour over the last week has been that of a leader who lacks guts or integrity or both. She deperately needs to stop sounding smart and start acting wise.

Too expensive, said Gillard; too expensive for whom? Surely not for the clubs?

And how about a spot of simple de-glamourising? The government has legislated for plain packaging of cigarettes. Value of iodine

Iodine deficiency would not be apparent to most of us as an issue of public health.



■ Many letters have appeared in The Echo deploring the treatment of Palestinians by the Israeli state. These letters are invariably countered in the next issue, usually by Vic Alhadeff of the NSW Jewish Board of Deputies or the Executive Council of Australian Jewry (ECAJ), the principle Israeli lobby groups in Australia.

Although Mr Alhadeff has maintained that such an entity as an organised Israeli lobby organisation does not exist, anyone who says or does anything remotally critical of Israel, worldwide, soon experiences the wrath and influence of this powerful, well-funded group.

The version of history promoted by the lobby has been extensively sanitised and is the version taught in Israeli schools, a bit like the Japanese history of WWII. They get away with it because of political expediency and cowardice

ignorance and apathy of the community.

Currently the ECAJ is endevouring to halt the Australian sale and promption of a recent series shown on SBS. Titled *The* Promise, this British-made series depicts events in Palestine/ Israel during the post-war British mandate period juxtaposed against a story of the present treatment of the Palestinians. It shows the bloody resistance of the Israeli terrorist groups such as The Irgun and Stern Gang against the British Army and the ethnic cleansing and destruction of Palestinian villages which commenced even before the British departed in 1947. It contrasts this with the contemporary situation of the Palestinians still being robbed of land and freedom by the Israeli state, mainly through the Settler Movement actively backed by the Israeli Army and passively condoned by the US and Australian governments.

It is no wonder that the Israeli lobby wants this series banned. They failed when they tried it in the UK and hopefully they will fail here.

Gladstone's marine catastrophe – havoc in the harbour

Gladstone is probably a write-

A sacrifice on the altar of Australia's destiny as a gigantic quarry. It's heart breaking to witness the devastation wreaked on the magnificent harbour, wetlands and surrounding islands.

In 26 years of environmental activism, I haven't seen such a monumental environmental and social tragedy. The Gladstone saga qualifies as an international environmental emergency because it threatens the World Heritage status of the Great Barrier Reef marine park and demonstrates a terrifying template of future mining developments along the east and west coasts of Australia as well as the top end.

Acid barges

The once beautiful harbour is now a sea of industrial machinery, cranes, smokestacks, wharves and a scarred, scraped-clean waterfront. Dredges go back and forth digging up the seagrass beds, turning the waters of the harbour into pea soup. Huge barges full of acid sulfate soil dotted around the foreshore, dredging, recreational and fishing vessels on the water.

Commercial fishermen are still catching sick fish covered in lesions. On the day I visited Ted Whittingham, head of the beleaguered Gladstone Fish Market, some fishers had brought in a shark, its flesh now bright pink, bleeding from its back passage. I was shown a live crab with half

the shell erosion and extensive pink flesh found on many marine creatures looks like burned flesh. Ted explained, 'They're dredging up acid sulfate soil and loading it into barges. If the soil isn't disposed of within 24 hours, it becomes sulphuric acid. We've seen barges left for days before dumping their loads into the harbour.'

Although a recent desktop study undertaken at the request of the Queensland minister for fisheries gave dredging the all-clear in terms of damage to fish, the terms of reference did not include any impact from dredging. Nor was any cause found for the reddened skin seen on many fish, sharks, stingrays, turtles and other species.

Savage blow

Commercial fishing in Gladstone has been dealt a savage blow. Gladstone Fish Market once provided 50 per cent of all mud crabs in Queensland; the catch is now down by between 50 and 70 per cent. A lucrative export and domestic scallop fishery is on its knees with the catch reduced from around 1300 tonnes down to 300. Fishers are suffering from appalling stress as they watch their industry in its death throes.

Ted Whittingham describes the harbour as a 'dead sea'. He says there's zero recruitment. To date, 2,856,000 cubic metres of dredging has occurred. Just a smidgin of the 46 million cubic metres to be removed over the next 20 years. misses the fact that dredging is damaging Gladstone Harbour, insisting that seagrass beds are coming back and that the diseased fish is a result of the 2011 flooding over the Awonga Dam which washed some 30,000 Barramundi into the Harbour system.

Dredging impact

This assertion ignores the evidence from overseas and within Australia that dredging damages the marine environment. Many scientists liken dredging to strip mining. Ironically, on the day of day of my meeting with Leo Zussino, the Department of the Environment and Resource Management (DERM) halted dredging because of turbidity. However, only the big dredge stopped, smaller ones continuing their destructive path.

Along with other Gladstone supporters of the massive industrial development, Leo believes the Gladstone Fish Health Scientific Advisory Panel Report released on January 5 gives dredging a clean bill of health. In fact, dredging is only mentioned once in the 47page report and is ignored as a stressor. But one sentence in the report says it all.

'The Panel noted the current parameters measured may not provide an appropriate trigger for ecosystem health problems that may be responsible for the observed fish health issues in Gladstone Harbour.'

Research reveals complexity of Noisy Miner vocal behaviour

Research at the University of New England is giving scientists new insights into the complex society of Australia's Noisy Miner.

In a paper to be published online last week in the Royal Society journal Biology Letters, UNE's Dr Paul McDonald reports that Noisy Miners (Manorina melanocephala) can discriminate among the calls of individuals – even individuals from a distant colony. This is the first publication to demonstrate such an ability in a cooperative avian species, according to UNE.

'The research reported in the paper shows that miners attend to information encoded in their calls – an ability that could contribute to the complexity of their social organisation, Dr McDonald said. 'Given that Noisy Miners call to solicit aid from others, the ability to differentiate callers may underpin the many social interactions in this species.







Horror and country music? How can it be possible? Like peas and carrots, I think. Most of us hated peas and carrots right? But when you're force fed, face rubbed in it till you puke, then I guess that's when you turn around and go, 'yeah, those two kinda work'

What was the inspiration for forming an old-timey band? Well I'm pretty sure anyone that's heard us in the past couple of years would easily say we're not an old-timey band. But in terms of instrumentation it certainly started out that way. I as a banjo/dobro player for the band use to play in various bluegrass bands and Nick the lead singer always wanted to play in a country band. So after we teamed up with the other members we had a goal to try to make a band that incorporated the sweeter sounds of old-timey and contemporary country artists. Well obviously there was nothing sweet about our attempt and the racket you hear now is just evidence of some pretty bad drinking habits.

What are your major musical influences? As much as we rag on ourselves, the band still is a collection of some pretty talented guys. Guys who've played in completely different bands prior to graveyard train and brought their own brand, their preferred genre and their own ideas. It's usually an asset... key word there being usually. But in terms of direct influences from other famous musicians we all at one stage in our lives were employed and fired from a record bar in North Melbourne. Go figure. The boss said I played too much Hank Williams, Nick too much Tom Waits, Adam too much RL Burnside and Matt too much Elmo Does The Alphabet.

Have you ever thought about scoring a silent movie? Every night I go to sleep. You have so much confidence before dreamworld, it seems like it would be really easy, and that I would do the best job. Neil Young made it sound easy in *Deadman*. But I

know, it's probably not, probably really really tough.

Why do you think audiences have developed such a love of your type of music? Firstly we're very lucky to have the support wherever we go. It's the only reason we get to do what we love. I guess when people get to watch the band there's no level of seriousness to the performance. It's something you can watch and just let go. Country or any roots are fantastic genres. The storytelling is usually so strong and can always hit home to someone in the audience.

Tell me a little about your tour o/s? Amazing. In 2010 we went to Europe. Who would have thought an outback town in the middle of Belgium would be throwing world-class beer at us on stage as a sign of respect. Well, they told us it was a sign of respect. We played some festivals in Canada last year and now our chain and hammer player is recognised as 'the best chain and hammer player in the world.' At least one of us will have some form of a career after this.

What is it about a Graveyard Train live show that sets it apart? Ahh, the technical difficulties, the 'schemozzles' so to speak. The band's always finding new ways to change the set so it keeps it interesting for both parties involved. There are certainly some Graveyard Train trademarks like the wall of men sound during our bigger choruses and the blatant screaming at each other on and off stage.

What should people be expecting for the Byron Show? I love Byron. I lived there for a short time. It's a longer set than usual so we're gunna pull out the whole catalogue. We're currently recording our new album for release in may so we wanna road test the new stuff, whilst still playing old favourites that somehow got us to where we are today. I guess there's that to expect, and seven bad cloudy Melbourne tans

THE HOMECOMING

There's something strange about going back somewhere that you once knew as a child. Everything seems so much smaller, or stiller, and it's always much less impressive. Places that seemed magical in childhood have their mundanity revealed in adulthood. That is perhaps the beauty of childhood, as infantile perception and lack of experience allows us to construct much more elaborate stories then the ones that actually exist.

A few weeks ago I took my kids back to the country town where I grew up to visit my dying grandmother. Although I had visited the town intermittently over the last few decades, it was on this trip that it was finally revealed that the place of my birth is in fact a shithole.

I had previously romanticised it as a busy country town bustling with people. Turns out it's a dry and desolate ghost town. For those of you who haven't made the trek, Wondai is nestled between Murgon and Kingaroy in the South Burnett about 240 kilometres north-west of Brisbane, it would appear that Wondai, like my poor grandmother, is on the way out.

Driving through the country towns that dot the area I noted that while neighbouring villages are flourishing, Wondai seems to have withered. In Murgon and Kingaroy there was clear evidence of demographic growth, with expanded shopping areas, increased housing and the proliferation of actual humans on the street going about their daily business. I even noted roadsigns that indicated I had entered a wine-growing area! What the! These are strictly beer-drinking people!

Turns out that the region is now an important wine growing-area. Seemed ironic when the only bottle of white I could find at the local bottleshop last time I stayed was a 1994 Blue Nun. And it hadn't been set down to age; it noted the date my mother left town, leaving the rest of their stock undrunk.

of sadness that descends when you enter a palliative care unit. I found myself whispering so as not to disturb anyone. While the town is not dead yet, it was evident that it had been buffered from the economic boom that had fertilised the rest of the region. Many of the shops were boarded shut. There was only one meanlooking old cowboy in the street. It was clear his horse had been repossessed, because when he mounted his ute, I thought, you just don't see people drive like that anywhere else.

The places I remembered with affection were gone. Boisons was dead and buried. This store should have been heritage listed. With the same shopfront they had in 1950, and many of the same mannequins and stock, the store was legendary. Wondai's infamous haberdashery cum rural department store was a family business run by brother and sister Mick and Beryl until their recent death. It was still possible to find alligator skin shoes for seven pounds, or bolts of fabric that my mother had her wedding frock cut from.

You didn't need money to shop at Boisons, you simply went in, bought your buttons, new undies, bra, shirts, sheets, blankets and the rest of your supplies and you said 'book it up on the account please, Beryl'. And she would neatly write your name against your purchases, and once every quarter you'd settle the bill. This was a business that responded to the cash flow of a country community, knowing that when the crops come in or the cattle are slaughtered that money is plenty, and that during the long months in between the bank account is often a dry and dusty place. No-one would operate a business like that any more.

There have been a few notable people emerge from my home town: Test cricketer Carl Rackeman and the toothless yodelling sheik from scrubby Creek, Chad Morgan. I dread the day my name is ever added to that terrible list. Oh, and of course a horse called Wondai's Mate – a trotter. Even fast animals get good at moving slowly in Wondai.

We drove quietly around the town looking for the nursing home. We were the only car on the wide streets that would have once held bullock drays. Wondai means dingo, although we didn't actually see any of them, but we did notice an emu walking the streets. The emu

When we drove into Wondai I was struck with the kind walked beside our moving vehicle and then casually came up to my passenger window and stared at me with a strange prehistoric curiosity.

> The kids got chased by bees. Sophia got bitten on the bum and they all had to run screaming back to the car. The car was full of bees. It was 40 degrees. We were being attacked by the wildlife. We thought about taking the kids for a quick dip to cool off but the swimming pool was shut for lunch. Why would you shut a public swimming pool at the hottest time of the day?

> For the first time I saw my home town as a hard place. A brutalising place. Hot and dry and uncompromising, this was a town with no soft edges. I realised how soft I'd become as a coastal dweller, soaking up all that water. This was a place without moisture.

> entered the nursing home noting a sign declaring that an enormous brown snake had been seen in the grounds. Bees, snakes, emus - it appeared that the country was taking over. I walked into the nursing home to see my Nanna. It was such a shock to see the woman remember as such a fierce matriarch so small and sad. She was sitting in the corner of her room. Deaf, blind and now confused, she had very little idea of who I was. I held her hand and shouted. She told me that she just wanted to die, and that every time she went to sleep she prayed that God would take her.

'The days are so long,' she whispered from dry lips. It was only my little Ivy, who I named after her, that she connected with. She clutched my daughter's tiny hand in her old tired one. When we left, she offered her cheek, and my little girl picked up on the sign and kissed her. She didn't offer it to me or any of the other children, just my baby girl, her namesake. It was so simple, such a sweet connection that I found myself starting to cry.

Driving out of Wondai I was struck by the dual sadness of seeing my Nanna and my hometown in such a sorry state. Here was an old woman and a town who continued on relentlessly, when deep down, all they both wanted was to be returned to dust.

Tell me about Animals Rock? What kind of kids' show is it? Animals Rock is a band of animals who play instruments and educate the little people about individual animal groupings and their habitats, food habits etc... the Ewingsdale show is all about wild animals (predominately African animals).

There is a polar bear on drums, a buffalo on bass guitar, a Tasmanian devil on a tambourine and a giraffe and a lion singing a vast amount of animal songs. The band are half human half animal and as far as I am aware the only group worldwide of this makeup. Our catchcry is 'Animals Rock making little feet dance'!

Why did you start making music for children? In 2007 an old school friend asked me to write a theme song for their wooden toy company.

I had never thought of writing music for little people. I ran the song past my niece and nephew; the response was amazing and from there I just started writing anima songs. Animals, animals, animals. And now five years later there are too many animal songs to speak of.

Is it just as satisfying as performing for big people? I have to be brutally honest here but kids are so much more open to being themselves

Actually the band of animals have learnt a lot of our moves and actions from the little people themselves

There is no guard with kids, no perceptions in their minds; they are just into it, but if their not they'll let you know.

They have no hesitation in whipping their tails like stegosaurus in a crazy dance or doing a mighty bull stomp stampede... or

even standing on their tippy toes like long neck giraffe swaying from side to side.

What kind of songs and stories do you think kids respond best to? Kids like subliminal education and a whole lot of fun. My plan is to have kids singing the songs and not even realising they are understanding a multitude of animal facts.

What are the messages and stories you tell in your show? My message is to get across the importance of animals in the modern day and age.

Today humans are completely engaged by television and human endeavours outside

Animals Rock is all about kids and animals. Kids love animals for so many reasons and to educate them as well as all the animal facts to truly have them understanding the animal kingdom's beauty and frailty and the need for human support no matter your age

What age group is best suited to the show and what style of music? Ages 0–6 would be the age bracket for an Animals Rock gig, though I have friends who are parents who listen to the tunes in the car when their kids aren't even around; so if you live the inner child come to Ewingsdale and be part of the show. Folk rock is our style with a country/surf influence (our lead singer Leonius Funk the friendly lion is a surfer!)

It certainly isn't similar to the Wiggles or High 5 but we have no doubt our band of animals will get those little feet dancing! Ewingsdale Hall on Saturday with two shows – one at 10.30am and another at at the Byron Theatre at the Community Centre on Friday 3 February. Featured acts are artist Daniel Mirante, a man who has been wandering the wilderness of the imagination for 34 years. 





Hugo

Martin Scorcese has made a great movie, even if it is a little bit prosaic in the stretches that aren't breathtaking. The setting is Paris, 1931, and Hugo Cabret (Asa Butterfield) is living with his drunken father at one of the city's vast central railway stations, where they tend to the clocks. He is fascinated by the nuts and bolts, the levers and pulleys, the coils and springs of all the contraptions around him. Reconstructing a discarded automaton, Hugo is befriended by Isabelle (Chloë Grace Moretz), the granddaughter of an elderly shopkeeper at the station who turns out to be the once-prolific and groundbreaking filmmaker Georges Méliès (Ben Kingsley). His constant adversary is the

lame Station Inspector (Sacha Baron Cohen), whose mission is to be rid of the gamin. This is Scorcese's humble homage to cinema's largely forgotten giants of the past, his most endearing achievement being to highlight the genius of Méliès by contrasting it with today's state-of-the-art 3D technology. Scorsese steps back and leaves centre stage to the French pioneer's handtinted masterpiece, Le Voyage Dans La Lune (1902). Shown in full, it is a beautiful and moving segment. Many directors, obsessed with branding a movie with their own imprimatur,

would be incapable of such reverence and genuine modesty. Other moments from the silent era are relived, as the action frequently echoes classic scenes – a spectacular dream sequence involving a train (referring to the Lumiere brothers), and Hugo hanging high above Paris, clinging to the hand of a clock, are unforgettable. The story itself, though, does not have the emotional weight that might have truly brought Scorcese's golden, magical past to life - the boy-girl relationship is cloying and the set pieces with the Station Inspector either chasing Hugo or courting the flower seller are repetitive and overtly functional. It's as though the mechanics of moviemaking, of which Scorcese is so enthusiastically in awe, have not been separated from the more elastic requirements of scriptwriting – but that's a carping criticism of a joyous

was exposed later) while employing Rudyard Kipling's 'great game' as a metaphor for the conflict between the West and Russia. One of his most memorable characters, George Smiley (as unlike Bond as you could imagine), was sublimely portrayed by Alec Guinness (on BBCTV) and he is now back on screen in this tense, engrossing and agreeably retro spy flick. We learn immediately that there is a mole in the Service, meaning that as complex as the story may get there is never any confusion over what it's about - Smiley (Gary Oldman), brought out of retirement, is charged with finding that double agent. **Director Thomas Alfredson** (also responsible for 2008's similarly frosty and unhurried *Let The Right One In* constructs a meticulously pieced together mystery of subtle clues, red herrings and crucial flashbacks. The catalyst for the investigation comes when Jim Prideaux (Mark Strong) is gunned down in Istanbul after he has been sent there to retrieve information that will reveal the mole's identity. Back at headquarters, the 'Circus', there is a core group under the mistrusting eye of Control (John Hurt) who all might, or might not, know more than they are letting on. As cleverly Byzantine as the plot is, there is a conventionality in the casting of the suspects – David Dencik, Colin Firth, Toby Jones



Ask your butcher

There was a duck in my freezer, and it was time to bring it out. One of AJ's beautiful birds, it would do wonderfully, I was thinking, for Gwyneth Paltrow's Duck Ragu which I planned to serve to friends. Out of the freezer it came and I peered closely at the fine print. From frozen state, I read, use within six months of purchase. That had been April; now it was January, which meant that it was two months beyond its usability. Did this matter? Suddenly I was panicking, visions of my guests ending up in hospital attached to drips after I had inadvertently poisoned them with old duck.

And so I rang John at Wholly Smoked Butchery in Byron Bay – John who immediately allayed my fears. No, I would not be posing any health risks to my friends – in fact, he reassured me, the only possible danger lay in the fact that the duck might have suffered a little freezer burn, evidenced by small white dots (easily washed away) which may have very slightly dried up the precious, flavourful juices and rendered it slightly less succulent. But apart from that, he said, all I needed to do once it was thawed was to soak it for about an hour in slightly salted water to restore its moisture then proceed with the recipe. Which I duly did: the resultant sauce, bathed in eggy strands of pappardelle, was a great hit.

And yet the experience fascinated me because it made me think that surely I was not alone in periodically needing a culinary problem solved or question answered, despite mostly feeling both confident and competent in the kitchen. Especially with regard to freezer-related issues, thawing meat, handling poultry, the lives of protein from frozen to cooked state.

And so I visited John, who confirmed that indeed I was not alone: every single day someone will ring with a question.

John Garrett has been a butcher in the Byron Shire for around 20 years. His blissfully cool all-organic shop tucked right down the end of Jonson Street near the ex-Services Club has been operating for

the last ten; before that he had premises in the Woolies Plaza and before that at Suffolk Park.

Many of the questions he is asked relate to freezing and temperature. 'I always say there are two indicators - especially with chicken and pork and they are sight and smell. If something smells, discard it immediately.' A lot of meat these days, he told me, has been gassed in order to extend its life, especially items like mincemeat. 'All meat today is about long life', he said, 'but it should get back to how it used to be. Gassing meat to give it that extra week takes away that sensory thing we were talking about. If you take the eye and smell sensors out of the equation you've got no criterion by which to judge the freshness of meats. Gassing is now a standard thing – but it goes against what butcher shops are all about - that freshness!'

Gassing, of course, is the last thing John and his team would do. Their freshly made sausages are snap-frozen and, in the same way just-caught prawns will be frozen on the trawler; you can't get fresher than that. John laments the fact that butcher shops are 'a bit of a mystery to a lot of people - it's the communication thing; people don't seem to know how it works'. He is referring to the old-fashioned dialogue between butcher and customer, the reticence many people seem to feel. 'People have a lesser understanding these days of different cuts of meat and how to use them, than ever before. It's the fault of the supermarkets, people losing that knowledge. There's a lot of ignorance out there. I've had people buy fillets for stewing - really soft fillets! That's not uncommon!'

He is encouraged, however, by the fact that these days people are increasingly interested in 'the story behind things', the provenance of food, the notion of eating locally and sustainably. 'And fat's coming back!' he said. 'There's a resurgence of interest, and people aren't so scared of it as they used to be.'

'Communicate your concerns' might be John Garrett's message. Do not be too shy to ask.

Internet gambling on the rise: study



Researcher Dr Sally Gainsbury

The rate of internet gambling is on the rise in Australia, according to new research from Southern Cross University and the University of Sydney, with factors like convenience and ease of access contributing to its popularity.

An investigation of internet gambling in Australia was led by Dr Sally Gainsbury from Southern Cross University's Centre for Gambling Education and Research (CGER), with the assistance of CGER director Professor Nerilee Hing, Professor Alex Blaszczynski from the School of Psychology at the University of Sydney and the University of Lethbridge's Dr Robert Wood.

'Internet gamblers had significantly more positive attitudes towards gambling,' said availability and the convenience. It can be accessed anytime, anywhere. But for people with existing gambling problems, internet gambling may create additional risks.'

Carbon tax, rising electricity and water prices put hip-pocket focus on housing design

The introduction of the carbon tax combined with rising energy and water prices will put a hip-pocket focus on new housing design and renovation, according to Archicentre, the building advisory service of the Australian Institute of Architects.

These issues will see home owners facing household running cost increases in the next few months that will continue to rise and to generate demand by consumers for 'green' issues to be addressed through innovative design and construction.

Archicentre South Australian State Manager Edward Lukac said, 'People buying new homes and those undertaking renovations have a major opportunity to cut their future energy and water costs by running the "green ruler of sustainability" across their future home or renovation.

'An accurate assessment of the sustainability of an existing home also provides the purchaser with an indication of future energy and water costs and an opportunity to get an understanding of what it would cost to improve its sustainability. Buying a lemon these days

not only refers to purchasing a property with structural faults but also one with poor environmental credentials

'Green design features are also recognised as building value into the property at its time of sale and real estate agents are already promoting the green aspects of property. A better use of materials in construction, orientation of buildings to maximise solar energy gain, lessening the use of air conditioners and heaters in homes and offices are all issues which can have

a major impact on household bills.

'Smart home buyers and renovators recognise the major savings are to be gained at the front end of home purchasing through pre-purchase property inspections and due diligence on the cost of renovating. With renovations it is planning the design before committing to major expenditure of detailed designs and construction.

'In both these areas green sustainability issues will hold increasing importance with the introduction of the carbon tax in July.

Apart from sustainability one of the bigger issues, however, is changing people's attitudes to how they manage resources in their homes and workplaces.
