Uranium protest links to Japan's nuclear fallout

BHP Billiton (BHPB) has told The the Roxby Downs uranium mine in South Australia when the planned Lizard's Revenge protest rolls into the small town in mid July.

Activists from all over Australia will converge to highlight the the dangers of uranium and the mine's expansion, and it will come just after last weekend's anti-nuclear demonstration in Japan.

The New York Times reported protesters numbered between 20,000 and 45,000 in Tokyo, who were against restarting the nation's nuclear power plants. The Japanese government approved restarting two reactors on the western side of the country in a bid to head off expected summer power shortages. It has been described as the largest protest in central Tokyo since

A Fairfax journalist at the Roxby Downs Sun newspaper told The Echo that BHP and the police are playing down the protest, but says they have heard residents say they are a bit worried about vandalism as it has happened in the past.

'BHP said to me that business will continue as usual, but I have heard otherwise,' she said, 'It's a bit frustrating because it's hearsay and you can't report hearsay.'

She said all BHP employees are required to sign confidentiality agreements. 'You can't even say to anyone outside the company that your coworker cut his finger.

'Kevin Buzzacott says his people's dreaming story speaks of a giant lizard, Kalta, who lies under the ground at the area around Roxby Downs and the story goes that this lizard should never have its head or back broken or the world as we know it will cease to exist. Kalta is angry because the Olympic Dam uranium mine is digging into his back; he wants revenge."

A Skype hook-up with antinuclear activists in Japan is planned, along with the screening of When The Dust Settles. Belongil's foreshore breached on high tide

Video footage of last weekend's high tide lapping over sandbags near Manfred Street in Belongil has been sent to Byron Shire councillors and staff.

Belongil resident and Byron Preservation Association (BPA) vice-president John Vaughan sent the footage via email, and is calling for a review and halt of the current interim works being carried out on the shoreline.

He claims the footage shows 'the orientation of the geobags is still contrary to the consent and is 90 degrees out of the correct alignment as approved in the DA in all locations.

Mr Vaughan also added, 'The compromised and damaged condition of the interim works since May 2009, particularly at the base levels, is com-

Metgasco may have misled inquiry

NSW Greens mining spokesperson Jeremy Buckingham has questioned whether Metgasco misled the upper house CSG inquiry regarding its wastewater disposal regime.

'The recent acknowledgement by the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) that Metgasco was illegally disposing of coal-seam gas water at the Casino Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) appears to contradict some of the evidence given by Metgasco at the inquiry, Mr Buckingham said last week.

He went on to quote Hansard over a conversation between himself and Metgasco's COO Michael O'Brien in evidence given to the inquiry last December.

During the conversation Mr Buckingham asked how Metgasco disposed of its wastewater and Mr O'Brien responded that the water was held in 'above-ground holding ponds'.

When Mr Buckingham queried whether they were evaporation ponds (which have been banned), Mr O'Brien replied, 'They are holding ponds. In the Casino area you get significant rainfall; you also get some evaporation. Over a 12-month

period you will get net evaporation out of those ponds.'

Mr Buckingham then pushed the point about disposal.

'The only way you deal with produced water and drilling fluids is to hold them in those ponds?' he asked.

To which Mr O'Brien responded, 'Currently, for our production pilots, that is the case.

But the Environmental Defenders Office has told The Echo that Casino STP admitted it had accepted and treated a total of 1.36 megalitres of wastewater from Metgasco between May 3 last year and March 9 this year. That information is confirmed in a letter to that office from the EPA dated June 7, 2012. The Echo has sighted a copy of the letter.

Mr Buckingham said he would write to the committee and ask it to look into the matter.

'It is extremely serious to mislead a parliamentary inquiry, he said. 'What is clear is that Metgasco is continuing to treat the Casino, Lismore and Kyogle communities with contempt and dishonesty in relation to their plans. To any fair-minded person the construction of their so-called 'temporary storage' pond at Casino is a clear breach of the government's no evaporation ponds policy?

Breaking taboo on Israel and Palestine

Israeli-born Palestinian-rights and peace activist Avigail Abarbanel continues to feel the wrath of family and Jews everywhere after turning against everything she'd been taught about the state of Israel and how it came into being.


But she is no longer afraid to speak out against her own 'tribe' and urges Jews everywhere not to remain silent and to speak up for human rights and against injustice, especially in Palestine.

Ms Abarbanel is on a lecture tour of Australia promoting the book Beyond Tribal Loyalties: Personal Stories of Jewish Peace Activists, a collection of 25 essays by Jewish peace activists around the world, which she compiled and edited.

The 48-year-old phsychotherapist told an audience at Byron Bay Community Centre on Saturday June 23 that up until around 12 years ago, she had always believed in the 'Israel right or wrong' mantra, and like most Israelis did not question change as her academic career the actions of their government towards the Palestinians.

She says it's expected in Jewish communities around the world that all Jews embrace Zionism and give loyal and unquestioning support for Israel and those who criticise Israel are often excluded, vilified and threatened.

Ms Abarbanel, who lives and works near Inverness in she was living and studying in Australia years ago, she still accepted much of what she'd been taught about Israel and Palestine and had even writ-

response to the Kristalnacht, the 1938 attack of Jews in Nazi Germany.

'I, like many other young Israelis, believed everything we were taught about Israel; and it happens at an early age, we were made to feel proud that we made a country bloom out of the desert, a techonological wonder, she told the audience of around 40 people.

But that was all to suddenly grew, especially after reading books by historians on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict which greatly influenced her, including works by Avi Shlaim and Ilan Pappe.

'I was horrified and didn't realise how much brainwashing had gone on for years during my childhood, in school and the military service and how much fear was a part of that. I know Scotland, said that even when I was a Zionist till much later when I questioned the whole process and what had happened in 1948 (when the state of Israel was declared), she said.

'Reading all this upset and

could I be so naive?

'I had a strong sense of rightness and loyalty of us (Israel) being there and what's right and wrong, she said.

But she didn't mince her words on the issue, saying what's going on in Palestine is 'ethnic cleansing', a land-grabbing 'occupation' and 'coloni-

'Israel wants more land, they have no intention whatsoever of finding a peaceful solution to the conflict,' she said. 'I gave up my Israeli citizenship in protest after realising what was going on. I felt strongly that it was wrong to create a nation at the expense of another people; I drew the line at that.

Ms Abarbanel says many Jews like her who do speak out against Israel are vilified and branded traitors, but she believes if more Israelis and Jews around the world stopped be-

ing 'afraid' and spoke out against injustice, they would feel better about themselves.

During her Australian tour so far, the pro-Israeli lobby has tried to close down or disrupt three of her speaking events, including one at a recent Melbourne Jewish cultural festival.

The Australian Jewish News labelled her in a headline an 'Israel basher'.

Apartheid state

She says she believes in a onestate solution, a non-religious democratic state for Israelis and Palestinians alike, and supports the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) campaign against Israel, which she describes as an 'apartheid state'.

At one of her Melbourne talks, Ms Abarbanel said she was asked by a Jewish audience member 'why can't the Palestinians get over it, like the Aborigines have in Australia.

Brisbane man Ray Bergmann, a contributor in the book, said that when he attended a Jewish youth camp in Sydney as a youngster, he realised a Zionist songbook was wrong in historical fact and simply 'biased propaganda'.

'The songs we were taught to sing portrayed Arabs in a negative stereotype and I complained they were teaching us an obviously skewed history to justify what could be understood as an enormous war crime in perpetuating the exclusion of Palestinians from their own homeland since 1948, and justifying a Jewish exclusivity that seemed little different from antisemitism just a reversal of victim and oppressor!' Mr Bergmann wrote.

Racist legislation

It is a sad coincidence that the federal government's so-called 'Stronger Futures' legislation comes into law the same week as NAIDOC (National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee) celebrations. A sad coincidence or a sick joke.

Perhaps the legislation could be called 'Stranger Futures'. Strange that many of the very people it is meant to help have strong objections to it. This is surely not an appropriate consensus over sensitive issues when the federal government imposes its will from

Undoubtedly politicians from all philosophical persuasions were justifiably shocked by the levels of poverty, disease and abuse in some remote Aboriginal communities revealed in the Little Children Are Sacred report of 2007 and Janet Stanley's earlier report, Child Sexual Abuse in Indigenous Communities, in 2003.

However, in the rush to provide 'strong leadership' on these issues, government seems to have forgotten the need to include the communities themselves in the leadership role. The approach could be described as paternalistic at best. If we looked honestly at the levels of domestic violence and child sexual abuse in the Australian community as a whole, then 'emergency' legislation could be applied across the board, without singling out Indigenous communities.

Human rights groups and Indigenous organisations have condemned the passing of the latest bill through the Senate last Friday. Northern Land Council chief executive Kim Hill told ABC news: 'Meeting with Aboriginal peoples and then doing all the talking is not consultation. We feel there needed to be a lot more listening.

Even the fairly conservative Uniting Church has spoken out: 'Stronger Futures employs punitive, top-down measures that have done little to improve the lives or outcomes for Indigenous groups. Indigenous communities have experienced few perceivable benefits from the governmental policies of the last five years.'

Alarmingly, the Uniting Church reports that suicide rates, particularly among young people, have dramatically increased since the Intervention. In NSW, which has the largest Indigenous population, the youth suicide rate is one young person in every 100,000. In the Northern Territory, however, it is now more than 30 in 100,000.

A stronger future needs to be renegotiated - no amount of bluster by 'well-meaning' lawmakers will set it right.



Labor left lined up to recant: they had been wrong to resist off-shore processing, but now they saw the error of their ways ago had been utter anathema. The remnants of the Liberal moderates, those who had stood up against John Howard's original Pacific solution, actually contemplated voting with Labor to put in place a regime potentially tougher and nastier than anything Howard had proposed.

head of the Department of Immigration, Andrew Metcalfe. Nor will turning the boats around work as a threat, as was occasionally done in the Howard years and remains a plank of Abbott's platform.

Indonesia simply won't wear it any more and even to try it would bring on a diplomatic meltdown.

In Metcalfe's view, the Malaysian solution is the only real card on the table; it would at least go some way to devaluing the people smugglers' product, the avowed aim of all parties.

But Abbott will never, ever subject the little kiddies to such trauma. He was happy to allow them to be locked away behind razor wire at Woomera until some quite literally went insane, but Malaysia is simply barbaric.

And he is not interested in anything anyone else has to say, and especially not what Gillard's desperate panel of experts might come up with.

He has his policy, and he's sticking to it. And just to show he's fair as well as firm, he'll increase the refugee intake from 13,500 to 20,000 a year over three years – when he becomes prime minister.

But until then, of course, he'll oppose any such reckless move. After all, you have to stick to your principles, whatever they may be at the time.

It's certainly worked a treat on asylum seekers. And just look at the polls.

Also with the change left out of \$1 billion after all that, the light rail from Casino could go onto Tugun, as a cross-border rail-link.



There are ways for our local communities in Byron Shire to renew our economies. We can align them with the core values we hold in these places which sustain us. As a biologist, I get a lot of my news from reading the tide line on the beach and listening to birds and bats as well as people. Here's the latest.

The future looks grim for many species as well as for our children and grandchildren. So let's flex our clout as both citizens and consumers. Let's look ahead and redirect the finance, effort and goodwill that swirls around here into a program that improves our legacy. Let's begin a process which keeps going year after year, improving the way we do things here.

How? My proposal is very simple and has three parts. It's based on models and projects The first part is to set up a way that anyone and everyone can participate: visitors, residents, businesses, creatives and farmers. Custom-tailored memberships will have fees that match varying levels of cash flow and socio-ecologic impacts.

Your membership declares you'll participate as a proactive guardian of our paradise. Holding this 'ecopassport' offers certain privileges: access to a network of information ter, as the climate changes and and skills, use of a logo, discounts, etc. Membership also brings challenges and responsibilities. Some could be 'best practice' projects. A few weeks keeping a log book about your use of consumables, such as water, power, plastics, petrol.

Watching your production of fees are collected and held by an independent entity. The most progressive model is a hybrid trust, a blended community group and commercial enterprise. Unlike a levy caught in political winds, this exciting voluntary fund will be a stable, public way to enact the third part of my proposal. We finance our projects, employment and initiatives in the community-minded ways we value. In a neat twist, the fund can include pro rata mechanisms to contribute to council funds about infrastructure and

Economic jargon says we'll finally be accounting for negative externalities and tracking opportunity costs. In plain words, this process addresses negative costs that our places bear because of the way we and our visitors live. The process also continues supporting what we avoid doing: keeping trees

instead of building parking lots, planning for long-term viability instead of cashing in on speedy money spinners.

This proposal isn't a 'bed tax' and doesn't single out visitors or residents, big or small business. With tourism down 11 per cent, we need to develop our own creative industries and services. These exports - art, film, texts, music, research, products - also allow wouldbe tourists to visit using their imagination. What if we set up a nature discovery centre? They can visit online and dream to visit someday.

Every proposal needs discussion. Meanwhile, the daily headline from our beaches is that the natural flotsam is full of our plastic wastes. How much longer can we ignore our impacts in this precious tangle of life? Read more at the website Tangle of Life www. tangleoflife.org.



You can take your own shopping bags and watch as sparkling fresh fruit and vegetables are poured in and talk to the people who

picked them the day before. You can take your own bottle or container and have it filled with fresh local olive oil for \$10 a litre or with low-cost local

It would be a genuine help to the environment if we were to try to buy locally produced food and drink without packaging and without barcodes. This has been sustainable for hundreds of years after all.




More than just a funny woman

Review by Libby O'Loughlin

Me of the Never Never is a rich tapestry of anecdotes woven by Fiona O'Loughlin, tracing her life growing up as one of seven children in a small town, to her rise to comedic fame on the world stage. Being part of a large family – which she describes as six other people 'soaked in the same marinade' -was no doubt instrumental in her having five children and fostering others with her husband Chris.

In chronicling her successes and failures, she largely focuses on the people and experiences that have shaped her life and nurtured her ability to laugh, together with her wonderful sense of humour. Although she admits she has a tendency to say a lot – all true, but not always accurate - yet conversely reveal very little, Fiona O'Loughlin is at times brutally honest.

I loved her book not just for its obvious comedy but more so for its frankness,



readability. She refers to her unusual abilinnumerable pearls of wisdom and sheer ity to take a picture mentally and 'make a

memory'; indeed, her subsequent descriptions of images from the album in her head are far more poignant than the inclusion of actual photographs in her book.

Her time in Alice Springs causes her to address the social disparity between white and black and the inevitable issue of racism.

Fiona is, for example, acutely aware that the way we explain to children why Aborigines are sitting in a river can either nurture prejudice against them as drunks, bludgers or no-hopers, or can change perception by saying that they are simply waiting for better days.

Her analogy of life being 'just a series of good days and bad days' is balanced and refreshing in a world where the increasing expectation is to be unconditionally 100 per cent happy. Likewise she contrasts hilarious anecdotes with heart wrenchingly sad ones in a highly enjoyable reading experience akin to an emotional roller

Imagine a book which teams a passion for cooking with a penchant for reminiscing. Charlotte Wood's Love and *Hunger* achieves just that.

In Love and Hunger, Wood writes eloquently about why she has included specific recipes that are synonymous with family and friends, and teamed this with beautifully captured experiences from her own life. This collection of 25 essays equates to an interesting social commentary that not only traces the evolution of food throughout the ages but also explores its importance as a tonic for physical and mental health and wellbeing. For example, a meal given as a gift of love to someone in crisis offers comfort, the gathering of friends to share food symbolises unity, and a 'mercy meal', otherwise known as a wake, celebrates the life of a loved one lost.







What was it that you set out to achieve? I think the main thing was to make something that I could be proud of and hope that it was well received.

What song or songs are you proudest of? Witching Hour I think is my favourite song. It's a kind of a country rock ballad that just keeps building. Also *Green Machine* is great; it was so much fun working with Lisa Hunt on this one.

What songs did you struggle with? It's funny because you think you have everything worked out in the production, but sometimes you can over-produce things. *Face The Music* was an example of this. It was always just a vocal acoustic guitar kind of song. In the end I think we did it justice and maintained the integrity of the song even though we put a lot into it.

How much does an artist have to let go of their need to control outcomes and just let it happen? I'll let you know on the next project because I don't think I let go of this one at all. Co-producing with Geoff Wright meant that I was always involved in the decision-making process.

I think sometimes it's a slower process when the artist becomes involved in the production because it's harder to step away and look at the song as a song and not listen to it as intro, verse, chorus, bridge and solo etc.

How has the music of Guy Kachel evolved and developed since you first became an artist? Being a musician or an artist comes with the same tag as everything else. The more you put in the more you get back.

Sometimes it's hard to see the development when you are caught up in the process but I think I've come a long way since the early songs I wrote. In the early days I tried to write songs like the people I really admired. That was so frustrating because I always thought they weren't good enough compared to those artists.

These days I write about life and the truth and it just seems to flow.

How do you work up a song? I would say 70 per cent of the time I start with the lyrics. They have always come pretty easily to me for as long as I can remember.

These days with my laptop and Logic Pro I just keep recording everything and then piece together the best lyric, melody and arrangement I can come up with.


Sometimes the whole thing just comes in one hit. I really like the craft of songwriting and getting things to sound as far away from cliche as I can.

Do you have an intuition for what is going to work, or do you run it by someone? Being able to record stuff and listen back is a great guide. Sometimes you can work on a song for a whole day and record it and then come back in the morning and it sounds like shit.

Now and then I will play the incomplete song to anybody that happens to be around. You can usually get a feel, depending on their reaction.

Is it easy to take feedback? I really like constructive criticism from people I admire and trust. However feedback from anybody is always welcome. At least they listened to your music and felt strongly enough to comment.

The thing I try to remember is I'm not trying to win a popularity contest; I want to write



music with integrity and everybody has a different point of view. That's what makes music so great.

Describe your journey as a musician. I was actually a pretty late starter in the music business even though I grew up in the Country Music Capital of Australia. However once I got the bug I couldn't stop.

Guitar playing was more on my agenda in the early days and I spent most of them trying to be Stevie Ray Vaughan. It wasn't until some years down the track I became more interested in songwriting.

I was really influenced by some good friends who showed me how powerful a songwritten story could be. These days I venture back to the electric guitar but now it's about the fun and tone more than anything.

What should we expect for your launch? I have put together a great band for the night. Actually most of the people that are on the album will be there. These include Geoff Wright, Thierry Fossemalle, Pete Wilkins, Dave Sandford, James Cox, Allan Park and some of the finest singers around in Lydia Storey, Rebecca Ireland and Kathryn Jones doing harmonies for me.

We will be playing all the tracks on the album; as well, Matt Hanley and I are doing some new songs I have recently written. In support I have The Soulshakers and an old friend of mine Ted Tilbrook

BLESSED ARE THE BEARDED

The full beard has made a comeback. Living in Mullumbimby it's hard to tell, because basically the beard has never left, even for some of us girls. But I gather, from checking out the fuzzed chins of inner-city groovers to musical shakers and movers, that the full man beard is back with a vengeance. I'm not talking the manicured and carefully contrived yuppie goatee, or the stubble smudge under the lip; I am talking the Grizzly Adams.

This is the expression of unabandoned masculinity through the unruly explosion of hair in frizzed tufts on a man's neck and chin. This is part animal, part man, part leprechaun. This is a face that refuses to be dominated by a razor. Brothers and sisters, we are on the doorstep of a furry renaissance. The return of the big beard.

I think it has a rather pleasing effect. Even the weediest bloke starts to look like a timbergetter. I've always fancied my heavily bearded man returning to me at the end of his work day with the sleeves of his white cotton shirt rolled up, an axe on his shoulder and a giant

The big beard makes men look like bushrangers. It's sexy, in a sort of non-sexy way. Beards look dangerous. They make men look like first settlers, or at the very least, men without iPhones. Beards and iPhones don't mix, unless of course you have the beard app.

Beardy men are living life on their terms. I guess they have to because no woman will go near them. 'What, am I supposed to go out with you like that? Go shave, monkey boy!'What I like about the beard is that it's an intentional lady repellant. A recently single male friend of mine remarked that he was so overwhelmed by interest once he hit the market, he was forced to grow a giant beard to weed out the wide-eyed women. Any woman who was prepared to look past the giant orange fur of his beard was clearly his true love. He is still single. But his beard is magnificent.

I'll be honest. Women find beards repulsive. No-one wants to kiss a man with a head like an armpit. Sure it's soft, and sometimes, in those intimate embraces of head and thigh, they can be gloriously ticklish. But they're creepy. They catch food. They get damp and sticky. There's nothing more heartwrenching than watching a bearded bloke eat soup. In fact, watching a bearded bloke eat, full stop, is a bit of a stomach churner.

The beard has this way of reminding you that the mouth, like other body openings, is merely another unattractive orifice surrounded by hair. Big beards are for photographs. For bush poets. For outlaws. For bikies. For Jesus. For homeless men. For Derryn Hinch. For Henry Lawson. For Mawson. For creepy uncles. For Santa. For Osama.

We fear the beard. The beard is the unknown. It is primal. It's a reminder that before the wax, before the razors, we were furry little cave bears caught up in a simple life cycle of eating and rooting and clubbing. (Some of us still live like this.) There is a name for beard fear - it's called *pognophobia* - and basically this quite common phobia can cause the sufferer such distress they may experience: shortness of breath, rapid breathing, irregular heartbeat, sweating, nausea, and overall feelings of dread. There is no cure.

We have to change our beard belief systems. I believe the beard is a positive step forward for men in their journey to reclaiming their lost manhood. Beard growing for men is like feminism for women – their heads are like our armpits. The hair says 'you can't tell us how to live'. While I struggle with a beard in the bed, I am willing to overcome my prejudice and accept men for who they really are: dirty little hairy bastards.

I hope, in my most militant heart, that the return of the full facial beard for men heralds the return of the downstairs lady beard. And as Jesus said in the Beatitudes, Blessed are the Bearded for theirs is the seat on the bus.





Brave

The imprimatur of 'Disney' is the kiss of death for any serious filmgoer who associates cinematic worthiness only with dysfunction, dystopia, disadvantage or whatever misery is flavour of the month. More's the pity, for this is a wonderful movie. Remembering, too, that it is an entertainment designed for impressionable young minds, the story is fast moving and sensibly plotted, the morality inspiring and free of stifling cynicism, the characterisations consistent and the animation out of this world (quite literally, for 3D is spectacularly effective when applied to cartoons). Set in the Scottish highlands of the

tribal, kilted, caber-throwing past, Merida, as daughter of the dominant Chief Fergus, is at an age where her father, and mother, Elinor, have arranged for suitors from other clans to vie for her hand. But Merida, a headstrong lassie, has different ideas. Rebelling against the ways of yesteryear, she strikes a blow for girl power by demanding that she alone will determine her fate. After fleeing the castle and accepting the cryptic advice of a witch, Merida inadvertently turns her mum into a bear and then must find a way to reverse the spell so that Elinor might be restored to her normal self. I loved Merida from the minute she opened her mouth and I heard Kelly Macdonald speaking

the part - although, with her shock of curly red hair, I was from time to time disconcerted by her resemblance to the less-than-appealing Rebekah Brooks. As Fergus, Billy Connolly lays on his usual shtick with relish, and Emma Thompson, reprising her Nanny McPhee persona, conjures equal parts warmth and maternal angst as Elinor. Most encouraging is the absence of a prince who will save the day and win stout little Merida's heart - she don't need no man! And something else, too, something intangible but which is all engulfing when it is present. At the well-attended session that I was part of, the audience (myself included) was entirely 'inside' the story and on tenterhooks as its dramatic and emotional climax loomed. ~

Brevity is the soul of wit. It's also a lifesaver when a film consistently misses the funny bone, as this one does. At the end of its inoffensive but entirely predictable 84 minutes, you are at least able to regard it fondly for not running two hours (so many movies are needlessly long these days). Tying in a little too calculatedly with the current obsession with food and cooking (having never seen Master Chef or My Kitchen Rules, I am blissfully unaware of the genre's appeal), the story concerns an old-school chef, Alexandre Lagarde (Jean Reno), who is being challenged by the ugly reality of the voguish 'molecular cuisine'. The son of the owner of the legendary restaurant where Lagarde has been ensconced for vonks, a Young Turk on the managerial scene, sees him as a relic and wants him gone. For foodies, this is undoubtedly a fascinating insight into the bizarre direction in which gastronomy might be headed. 

Those who love cooking, or even just cook regularly, have their repertoire of tried-and-true

favourites, those dishes wheeled out when the desire to experiment or try something new has been superseded by the need for reliability and the sweet ease of familiarity. In the grim middle months of the year it is minestrone for me. A meal in a soup – especially my particular version, an accidental adaptation of Marcella

VICTORIA COSFORD

The first time I made it out of her wonderful book Essentials of Classic Italian Cooking, I misread the quantity of cannellini beans - so instead of adding toward the end a 400-gram tin of them I toppled in the same weight in dried beans, which I had soaked overnight then simmered to done-ness. (How I could I have got this instruction so spectacularly wrong completely escapes me.) The funny thing is that despite my minestrone now bearing about four times the volume of beans, it was undeniably superb - so much so that this version became my blueprint.

At the time in Sydney it was not possible to source the cavolo nero - kale - that I had remembered from minestrones I had eaten in Italy; Marcella herself proposes Savoy cabbage but I blithely exchanged this for silverbeet. This was a robust soup to which I quickly became addicted on cold winter evenings, often eating it night after night after night, accompanied only by some warmed bread. A quite perfect meal, composed as it is of such a variety of vegetables.

And yet the secret to its beauty lies not in my extra beans nor in my silverbeet substitution but in the layering which is called for in the recipe. Marcella is quite clear in the amount of time she allots to each added vegetable so that every one you add is allowed several minutes to imbue the previous ones with its

own particular character, right through to the

Minestrone means 'big soup' in Italian and it is

a classic example of 'cucina povera', or peasant

MINESTRONE

In your biggest pot heat olive oil and soften three thinly sliced onions to a pale gold. Add four diced carrots and cook for several minutes, stirring periodically. Add two sticks diced celery, cooking and stirring for several minutes. Ditto two medium potatoes, diced. Next – always separated by several minutes - drop in a large handful of topped-and-tailed green beans, also diced. Several minutes later add 450 grams diced zucchini. Then a bunch of silverbeet leaves coarsely shredded. Now let all these vegetables cosy along together for about six more minutes. Next comes 11/2 litres of stock - beef, chicken or vegetable, depending on your inclination - one 400 gram tin of peeled tomatoes with their juice, and the rind, if you happen to have one lurking, of a piece of (real) parmigiano-reggiano. (Another secret, I reckon.) Stir well, cover pan, bring to the boil then lower heat to a steady but gentle simmer for 21/2 hours. After that topple in your 400 grams of soaked, cooked, drained cannellini beans (or just a tin if you prefer it less beany!), stir well, season and simmer for another half hour. Check for seasoning and serve with crusty bread.

Like curries and casseroles it is even better the next day, and the next, and the next...
