Splendour in the Grass returned to their home ground at Byron's Belongil Fields this past weekend for what will be their last Byron Splendour before relocating to their festival site at Yelgun.

Thousands of young people made their way to Byron for one of our sunniest winter weekends to date, except of course for Friday's freak downpour, which did nothing to dampen the spirits of festival revellers, or gumboot sales.

In fact it was all about the gum boot, with funky young things sportspots and of course the standard dairy farmer black. Teamed with designer jeans, cut off shorts, skimpy tops, car-

headdress, it was generation X in all their 'weekend hippy' glory.

The event, which features 90 acts from Australia and the international music scene, sold out in under 40 minutes and demand for camping saw organisers opening the North Byron Parklands for extra sites.

Festival goers enjoyed the cream of talent from the world stage, such as Jack White, Bloc Party and the Smashing Pumpkins, but it was Aussie hip hop/rap acts 360 and Hilltop Hoods that seemed to gain the most enthusiastic response.

Council may wipe out local surf school

The future of an established surf school is in doubt after its tender application was pipped by new competition.

It's put the entire tendering process under the spotlight, and mayor hopeful Cr Simon Richardson is calling for an internal investigation by the general manager, 'to check that the process was appropriate and above reproach.'

He says he will also move an urgency motion to 'increase the number of licences offered.'

Currently there are only four commercial licences and two personalised surf instructor spots available for operators to teach surfing in Byron Shire.

Cr Richardson also says the 'degree of faith and trust in the system I once had, though always guarded, has now been severely eroded and I am hellbent on ensuring all aspects of our tender policy are reviewed to ensure every aspect is as accountable, transparent and supportive of rewarding rejected by Ballina Council, he said. great local practitioners.'

Another mayoral candidate, Cr ated in the shire for seven years. Basil Cameron, told The Echo it is arm's length from the workings of the tender panel. I have contacted Mr Edwards to let him know that the tender process is to be reviewed and that he can also seek an external review if he is not satisfied. In the event that flaws are identified in the tender process, I will work to ensure that future tenders are fair and transparent.'

Additionally, long-time local and elite surfing instructor Steve Foreman also failed to renew his licence bid as a personalised surf instructor. He remained philosophical, however, about the outcome. 'Fortunately for me this decision will not affect me financially as I have other employment, he told **continued on page 2** | *The Echo.* 'But I support Jayme's cause'.

Mr Foreman's coaching has helped many surfers, including Layne Beachley, reach professional levels.

After 18 years in the business and ten years in the shire, Jayme Edwards from Byron Bay Surf School says he is outraged by what he says is 'stacking' against local knowledge and a flawless safety record.

Price 'stacking'

'I offered a fair market rate of \$4,000 pa, which is based on the medium of Ballina and Tweed Shires' market rates.'

In contrast, Mojosurf offered Council \$13,750, far above other winning tenderers. Ian Lennie from Mojosurf told *The Echo* he agreed the tender process needs addressing, and was surprised to learn that Mojosurf had tendered much more than the other schools.

Gag order

It has also been revealed that unsuccessful tenderers are subjected to a Byron Council-specific 'gag order,' which attempts to prevent them going to the media or even seeking advice as to why their tender was not successful.

In conrast, NSW government guidelines state that councils 'may' choose to debrief unsuccessful tenderers on request.

In the letter sent to Mr Edwards which rejects his tender bid, it reads continued on page 3

Vale Dr Suresh, our longest serving VMO

Mullumbimby Hospital's longest serving Visting Medical Officer (VMO), Dr Suresh Rananavare, died of a heart attack at the age of 71 on Sunday July 22.

Indian-born Dr Suresh arrived in Mullumbimby to take over the Burringbar Street practice in 1976, and continued to practise until the Monday before he passed.

He was also the town's only very seriously. solo practitioner.

The Echo, 'I really really appreciated him - he was gentle, kind, intelligent and humble, far from perfect but he had a lot of humility.

If you needed half an hour you would get half an hour, and he dealt with one patient

And whoever he had in that room had his total attention. He took his Hippocratic Oath

Dr Suresh was so dedicated

A patient of Dr Suresh's told to his role as a doctor that he often said, 'What will I do if I don't practise medicine?'

And practise he did.

For the past thirty-plus years, the Bombay-trained doctor from a family of nine doctors treated the residents of Mullumbimby.

His practice continued to grow and now numbers thousands of patients.

Young mothers that had babies that he delivered are now adults, and those adults came to the surgery and brought their children.

cations than most.





Thursdays are a day of community in Byron Bay.

Those with money head to the Farmers Markets and share a percolated coffee with friends. But there is also an alternative Thursday community that meets across Byron, and they are those doing it tough.

C3 Food Care is run out at the Byron Bay industrial estate and is bridging the divide on Thursdays by providing reduced priced food to those on Centrelink benefits.

It also provides free tea and coffee and Heather's homemade cakes to encourage a meeting place of support for those in similar financial circumstances.

Other places the less fortunate head to on Thursday include: Liberation Larder, St Vincent De Paul, the Community Centre for emergency relief or some drop into the Salvation Army.

The majority of the needy are trying to help themselves but unable to keep up with the rising costs of living.



Armaments, universal debt and planned obsolescence

This week I will be interviewing ex-Greens leader Bob Brown at the Writers' Festival.

While formulating questions to ask, I searched 'Andrew Bolt and Bob Brown, thinking I could learn something from an opposing point of view. But after reading Mr Bolt's views on Bob I almost choked on my double shot flat white in a mug.

Right-wing media pundits are so predictable. And boring. All you have to do is feign outrage and spew vitriolic vomit at anything that challenges a narrow world view. They rarely play the ball, always the man. It does make great theatre admittedly, but is this constructive to the evolution of our species?

I did a phoner (journo speak for phone interview) a few years ago with Mr Brown and asked about his hemp policy. At the time, all he said was that he supported hemp production and nothing more.

I have learned subsequently this week that The Greens still don't have a policy on hemp. The Echo has reported previously on the CSIRO's support of cotton and lack of hemp innovation.

This matters because hemp production represents progressive idealism just as renewable energy does. It has a long, rich history as a useful natural fibre and is far superior to others. Henry Ford even made his car bodies from hemp material at one point.

And it's an easy thing to overlook; hey, we get everything we need from plastics and cotton, right? Except that this plays well into the recurring 'light bulb' theory. Humans can produce a light bulb to last much longer than those commercially produced.

Mass consumption is predicated upon obsolescence. Author Aldous Huxley once said, 'Armaments, universal debt and planned obsolescence - those are the three pillars of western prosperity.

Our collective future depends on a fruitful and harmonious marriage between economics and environment.

The Echo hopes Bob's replacement in the senate, economist Peter Whish-Wilson, will provide a bridge to those political divides.

popular, but that doesn't make her silly – at least not so silly that she can't tell when she is being sold a dump.

So she was absolutely right to reject the plea by the premiers that she should fund the National Disability Insurance scheme by instituting a tax levy, in the manner of those imposed for Medicare or flood relief.

This apparently helpful suggestion was in fact the biggest hospital pass in recent political history and if she had fallen for it Gillard would have been monstered beyond mortal aid.

Of course the premiers thought a new federal tax was a good idea - or most of them, anyway. They weren't going to have to raise it. Queensland's Campbell Newman, who brought it up over dinner at The Lodge, was positively lyrical, describing it, improbably, as a possible Obama moment for the prime minister. South Australia's Labor premier, Jay Weatherill, was almost as enthusiastic; he had done the figures, he said, and a one per cent increase would cover the lot.

The Commonwealth Treasury, somewhat more down to earth, calculated the actual cost as an average jump in income tax of \$850 a year for every household - a bit more than three times the impact of the carbon tax. And the mere mention of that particular impost should have sobered everyone up.

It may have had an effect on at least two of them. Victoria's Ted Baillieu refused to join in the general excitement and Barry O'Farrell from New South Wales was heard to murmur that the idea would only work if everyone agreed to it. At which point Gillard opined that possibly, just possibly, Tony Abbott might have reservations.

Well, yes. Abbott has spent the last four years inveighing

So it took less than a nanosecond of consideration by Gillard to conclude that any attempt to pay for her plan through increasing revenue, whether by a tax, a levy, an impost, a tariff, a duty, a surcharge, a gabelle or just charging corkage, would lead to terrible consequences.

Abbott would bombard the media screaming 'Great big new tax... grey pig newt axe... griping nut aches... creeping nerve gas...' steam coming out of his ears and spittle and venom flying in all directions. So she just said no. Of course, she was lambasted for it by The Australian.

Even the normally sensible Peter van Onselen berated her for making a poor decision, for an opportunity squandered.

The stalemate was not the fault of the premiers, who were happy to grab the billion dollars that Gillard had put on the table, but were too mean to stump up a couple of hundred million between them as a contribution towards trial areas, a simple

the idea, there were a couple of things wrong with this analysis.

The first was that only two of the four conservatives were actually on the record in support of the brain bubble, Newman, the proposer, and Colin Barnett from Western Australia.

The best that could be said for Baillieu and O'Farrell was that they had not actually spoken out against it. Not quite the lieutenants you would want behind you in the mother of all battles. And even Campbell and Newman had to be a trifle suspect; their zeal seemed to have at least as much to do with their eagerness to avoid having to fork out anything from their own coffers as with a selfless concern for public policy.

But rather more importantly, if the NDIS is to develop as a serious attempt to tackle the problems of disability, the states will have to be involved at a great many levels in administration, service and delivery. Indeed, on past form, they will insist on it. That being the case, it is sensible to involve

the funding so that they will have some skin in the game right from the start. It has always been understood and accepted that the Commonwealth will do the vast bulk of the financial heavy lifting, but that does not absolve the states from all responsibility.

In fact, it took Baillieu and O'Farrell just twenty-four hours to come to the same conclusion, when both dropped their hardline opposition to Gillard's demands and started haggling. Baillieu eventually agreed to give the Commonwealth everything it had asked for - \$40 million over four years - while O'Farrell met Gillard halfway with an offer of \$35 million.

As a result both Geelong and the Hunter will host trials of the scheme, along with sites in Tasmania, South Australia and the ACT. In the deep north Newman continues to play Son of Hillbilly Dictator, while Barnett insists that the wild west must remain a law unto itself.

In the fullness of time, when something like sanity returns to the Australian political scene, a more permanent funding arrangement for the county-wide NDIS will have to be negotiated, and it probably will involve an increase in taxation, either direct or indirect. In the meantime, Gillard's stubbornness has, for once, paid off she has got her trials and the states - well, most of them are on board.

Even van Onselen has had to admit, grudgingly, (paragraph nine of another lecture) that her original 'poor decision' has been vindicated. Coming from *The Australian*, that's about the best she could hope for.





Everyone knows that feeling of panic - whatever to serve unexpected guests who are about to arrive at dinnertime? Worse, what if the household favourite is something that, for whatever reason, the guests won't eat? This social nightmare is also a significant question in Socio-Ecologics. If society is a fork and ecology a knife, what is being served on our plates?

These days, many of our children think food comes from a grocer. If their social circle includes farmer's markets, they may have some other ideas. If their school manages a vegetable garden, enriched with compost made of lunch scraps processed by worms, they might picture a production process. This cycle includes plants from all around the world. But if they are very lucky, they may learn about Australian foodstuff. Bush tucker.

Back in 1800, an international food crisis was underway. This was part of a major socio-ecologic change forced by the industrial revolution, land enclosures, the newly independent USA and international whaling. Britain was racing France to possess NSW by right of settlement. The ruling elite imagined that these new reform colonies, just and severe, could save their poor who were held personally liable for their wretchedness.

Meanwhile, the people already living here found their social fabric fraying. The ecology they knew was forced by newcomers in a different direction. Their society held its knowledge of foodstuff, the rules of its management and sharing, with its elders who had been trained over many years. That knowledge fragmented as disease and warfare killed so many for generations.

From looking at dead whales to seeking their wisdom

While staying with my mother by Morton Bay near Brisbane, fixing and preparing Migaloo 2 for the big sail north to Cairns, I discovered this picture by my father Ian Jefferys of me being held by my mother when I was one year and three months young, in Byron Bay, looking at a dead humpback whale being dragged along the wharf at Belongil in June 1959.

Wow... insane. More insane is, I remember that day. I can remember seeing blood being pumped off the end of the wharf and sharks swimming in what must have been the remains of the whales.

Seeing these photos stimulates more memories of that day and feelings that something was not quite right. The photo next to me with the whale is me showing my grandma how big the whale was.

So now, 53 years later, as I sail on my 3000km journey 'Sailing the Winds of Change 2012 and beyond' to raise awareness about whale freedom and



marine conservation issues, I ponder why do I care so much for whales' freedom and why do I have a deep desire to listen on that day?

I spent most of the 1990s deep in the Amazon filming and searching for wisdom from

the ancient shamans. Now I'm in Panama, and asked him if he felt optimistic. He reminded me that only 50 years ago people were killing whales at Byron Bay and now Byron is a whale watching capital. To think of the change in the way humans think and feel about whales and most animals in the last 50 years, it's massive.

and ponder how many whales, dolphins, sharks etc are still to die before we humans wake up as a species to not only what we are doing to fellow mammals but all of nature and this precious planet ocean.

Since I sailed from Byron two weeks ago, two humpback whales migrating up the east coast have been caught it in those ridiculous shark nets. One died, possibly slowly over a ten day period as it struggled to free itself from shark nets installed off beaches to satisfy people living in fear, inspired by a 30-year-old fictional film.

And the leaders of this process of change continue to be persecuted like the witch hunts of old. Both modern day freedom fighters, Julian Asange and Paul Watson, are fighting politically motivated extraditions to corrupt countries that profit from what they are exposing. 

Does having been an artistic director of the Melbourne Jazz Festival and chairman of the Australian Jazz Awards make you more self-conscious or at the least aware of how high the bar must be set for you when presenting your **own work?** The work for the Melbourne Jazz and Bell Awards is a philanthropic one where I give back to the community. I'm fortunate that my own music is international with the latest release through Enja records present in 40 countries... I have just returned from a European tour and am about to begin a new one in Japan and the USA. Having said Australia is my home and the way we go here is important to me.

COLLABORATION OF THE KIND RARELY HEARD LOCALLY.

What instigated your passion for jazz? Jazz is a wide terminology for a form of creative music that is virtually unlimited. Ours is inspired by Mediterranean sounds. I like deep grooves and sticky melodies... It's a language that we can easily communicate to the public. It is the communication with my fellow musicians that makes it very rewarding for us and for those who listen to us.

What do you think is the essence of great jazz? Humour.

What about bad jazz? (Is there such a thing?) Of course there is... It's up to you to find your own definition. Likes and dislikes are nearly always personal choices. My own is this: what's not communicated through the heart isn't worth listening to. You know when it's not from the heart.

Jazz is a musical form that thrives on collaboration – what are the collaborations that have been the most amazing for you? Indeed. Two of the musicians I present in the show in Byron are Evripides Evripidou with whom I have collaborated for 20 years and Phil Turcio who started with me 22 years ago when he was 18. The current collaboration with Hendrik Meurkens the virtuoso harmonica player is an inspiring one. My previous album was a collaboration with Joe Chindamo on accordion, etc... The list is long and fruitful.

What happens when you are playing... in your head I mean... where do you go? I'm completely present... I just listen to the rhythm section and let go. All the thinking is done when I practise, compose, rehearse... On stage it's too late for thinking, your sub-conscious guides you.



What do you bring to the table as a composer and guitarist? Each one of us has a diverse background and the sum of our experiences and choices in life makes us who we are... The main thing is to keep a sense of humour and let the heart talk.

Do you ever go back to a live improvisation and use that as the core for a **composition?** Are you kidding? How do you know this? Yes, that's often how it happens.

How responsive are you to your surroundings when you play? I'm privileged to only be playing to audiences that want to listen. So the conditions are quite good and conducive to creativity.

Tell me a little about the band. We are travelling with Hendrik Meurkens as I said earlier, a virtuoso harmonica player. I chose Hendrik because he has a similar sense of melody to mine, the chromatic harp is my favourite instrument after the guitar. The guy's awesome, he is German born, grew up in Brazil and lives now in New York. Evripides Evripidou from Cyprus is a truly inspiring force in our band, he is Mr Groove, there's not another bass player like him. Phil Turcio on piano, you think you don't know him but you do. Everyone knows Phil without knowing they know him... Phil wrote the song of the closing ceremony of the Sydney Olympics – remember the little girl?... Tony Floyd on drums, he is also a member of the Black Sorrows.

What should we expect for your Byron Show? Wherever we go we get the same great reaction, whether in Melbourne, Sydney, Paris or Amsterdam. Byron Bay, we will let you in on something magical and wonderful!

The children are small and sleepy eyed, they are in their pyjamas, shuffling into the bedroom with the handmade Mother's Day card and a large badly wrapped gift. I'm sitting up in the pillows sipping my lukewarm tea lovingly made by eldest daughter as part of the morning ordeal. I am suddenly optimistic. Perhaps the kids have actually got me something good. But no, it's a giant pig money box.

The joke is that is says 'Swear Jar'. The kids say I swear too much. This is their idea of a joke. I'm slightly insulted. Frankly I was hoping for slippers. I declare 'it's amazing'. Then I start to panic. Where do I put it? It's grotesque. You never see pictures from Home Living where spaces are cluttered with shit like this. So I put it on my bedside table. It lives here for months. Then piggy made his way to the top of a wardrobe where he has spent the good part of the last decade. Now piggy is outside on the lawn in the company of all the other items of my life that I have decided must go. Perhaps some tastechallenged stranger will take him home and give the piggy money box to his foul-mouthed mother.

I'm self-conscious at a garage sale. People come in and shuffle around, they start looking through your stuff. I can hear them thinking, 'Wow, I thought Mandy Nolan would have better stuff than this. It's a bit disappointing.' At a previous garage sale, a bloke came in and told me his daughter said, 'Is that really Mandy Nolan's house? I thought she'd live in a rich house.' I'm a standup comedian, not a coke dealer.

Then people start asking me questions like 'how much for this ceramic angel?'. I don't know. I hate it. I'd pay you to take it away. Then I say \$10. And they look unconvinced and say 'I'll give you \$5'. I think to myself, wow, you really want it. I would have given it to you. But I'm locked in a garage sale power struggle. Clearly you don't want the stuff, but as soon as someone shows some interest, suddenly you're thinking, maybe this isn't such a piece of shit after all. Maybe I like it. Maybe I shouldn't sell it. I've found it's easier to sell things for two bucks than it is to give them away. Every garage sale I have a box of CDs that I giveaway free. They're sent to me at The Echo, and as a good many aren't really my personal taste, I put out a box that says 'FREE MUSIC'. People are suspicious. Some demand to pay me. Like \$2 will make it sound better. Some people even say 'is it any good?' I don't know. It's FREE – does it matter if it's any good? If it's not your scene, give it to someone you don't like. One chap came and took the whole box. I thought, wow, a music lover. But turns out he was an entrepreneur. He was up the road selling them at \$5 a pop.



JAZZ STATESMAN AT THE STAR COURT

Bernie McGann is widely recognised as one of the most important artists Australia has produced in the 20th century. McGann first came to prominence as part of a loose alliance of modern jazz musicians who performed at the famous El Rocco Jazz Cellar in Kings Cross, Sydney in the 1960s wave of energetic modern jazz. McGann's daring playing marked him as a serious soloist and together with his striking compositions, he became a leading, accomplished jazz figure over the following decades.

given the right to vote, three young Aboriginal sisters from a remote mission are trying to find success as country-and-western singers. They meet happy-go-lucky Irish muso Dave, who hates country music but can see that the girls have potential - they're just singing the wrong songs. Dave's a soul man through and through, and agrees to help the girls audition for a gig if they'll switch to singing the only music that counts - soul. They get the gig and are soon on their way to Vietnam with Dave to perform for the American Marines during the dark last months of the war. For these country girls it's an exciting, dangerous, inspiring and sobering time, as they tour Saigon and the jungles of South Vietnam. For all of them it's a life -changing experience, sharpening the girls' sense of who they are and where they belong in the world. They witness the tragedy of war and the politics of race and revolution. But more than anything else the Sapphires find their soul, and with it an optimistic sense of what the future may hold for them as powerful Aboriginal women. Their story inspired a 2005 play written by Tony Briggs about his own family; the play has now been turned into new Australian film The Sapphires, written by Tony with Keith Thompson, and directed by Wayne Blair. The film is a combination of comedy, heart and romance with an unbeatable soul music soundtrack. It stars Deborah Mailman, who also acted in the play, as well as Jessica Mauboy, Shari Stebbens, Miranda Tapsell and Chris O'Dowd in a tour de force performance as Dave.







Hollywood has belatedly discovered that women can be as undiscerning and, let's call it 'basic', as men when it comes to sitting in the dark and being seduced by the big screen's endless lure of fantasy. The puzzling thing in this beefcake movie is that, while aiming squarely at the gals' dollar, it at no point presents a female character that is more than a squealing drunken fool in a bar or, in the case of Brooke (Cody Horn), an ineffectual sweetie with long blonde hair who, other than wanly looking

upon the world of the blokes. Having the Steven Soderbergh brand will automatically provide it with gravitas among cinephiles (for mine, he is all gloss) but, as a standard story of redemption, it is a peculiar combination of vigorous performances enlivening a limp script. Brooke's brother Adam (Alex Pettyfer), a shiftless self-pitier, meets Magic Mike (Channing Tatum) when hired at a building site in Tampa, Florida. Mike turns out to be a male stripper at the Xquisite club, run by Dallas (Matthew McConaughey) and, in a scenario that takes writing pretty, does nothing to impose to its rudimentary base (ie, it is



is cajoled into going on stage one night and getting his gear off. From then on it is a case of his diving deeper into a drugged-out, trash-talking demi-monde, while, slowly but predictably, Mike starts to see that life has more to offer than shaking his booty and dry-humping nameless skirts. If only there was more content than the progression of incidents that lead to where we knew we were going the minute that Mike met Brooke. Local authors up on stage

There must be something in the water of the Byron Shire. Every year the festival introduces a new crop of local authors writing outstanding books and being published by the industry's leading houses.

This year, the five debut local writers are novelists Jessie Cole, Lisa Walker, Shamus Sillar, Jim Hearn and Amanda Webster.

Jessie Cole, who grew up on the north coast, says the idea for Darkness on the Edge of Town came to her in a rush, virtually fully formed. It's a jewel of a novel about a man who collects broken things and broken people, and his adolescent daughter. It carries the reader along effortlessly, full of surprises and suspense. Jessie won the VarunaHarperCollins Manuscript Development Award in 2009.

Lisa Walker won the 2010 VarunaHarperCollins Manuscript Development Award with the manuscript Liar Bird and went on to sign a two-book deal with HarperCollins. Set in the northern rivers, Liar Bird is a romantic comedy featuring a feral pig. Its bolshy leading lady loses a PR war with a potoroo and finds herself making an unwanted sea change to the land of feral animals and only slightly less feral blokes. Lisa's second novel, Sex, Lies and Bonsais, about a timid erotic writer, is coming out next January.

Jim Hearn worked as head chef at Byron's popular oceanside restaurant Rae's on Wategos. His memoir The High Season offers two narrative threads one telling the story of his childhood growing up in rural Queensland and the story of his heroin addiction and his mother's path into prostitution – and the other tale provides the view over one day from the Rae's kitchen as he prepares a meal for celebrity Paris Hilton and her high maintenance entourage.

Extracts from Amanda

Webster's gripping memoir The Boy Who Loved Apples have appeared in The Sydney Morning Herald's Good Weekend and The Courier Mail's, Life Magazine recently. It's a sorrowful, yet wry story about a mother's battle with her son's anorexia and its impacts on their family. Amanda's son is now an adult and fully recovered, and the intervening years have given Amanda the chance to reflect on what happened. Don't think it's a grim read - it's anything but, thanks to Amanda's considerable literary skills.

Within a short time of moving to Sicily, **Shamus** Sillar and his wife Gill lost their romantic visions of restoring a villa or stamping in vats of grapes. Sicily, it's not quite Tuscany relates how their apartment in Catania was located in a grim neighbourhood opposite a triple-X cinema and a coffin shop, nearby Mount Etna erupted soon after their arrival, a mystery ailment left Shamus in a neck brace, they crashed a Vespa and had regular dealings with the Mafioso. Shamus pitched this book to publishers as part of the festival's 'Perfect Pitch' program and it was snapped up.

It's not only debut local authors featuring – the local lineup includes established authors too.

John Bailey from
Mullumbimby has written
six books, the latest being
Into the Unknown, the
Tormented Life and
Expeditions of Ludwig
Leichhardt, and in 2003 was
awarded the Centenary
Medal for services to
literature.

Tim Baker, hailing from Currumbin, leads the enviable lifestyle of a full-time surf writer and has written numerous books including the bestselling *Occy*.

Renowned restaurateur and cook **Gay Bilson** now lives in Bangalow. Her most recent book is *On* Digestion, which questions assumptions about agriculture, produce and dining in Australia.

Jesse Blackadder lives in Myocum and really was born with that surname. Her first novel After the Party was a tribute to Byron Shire. She's completing Chasing the Light, a novel about the first woman to reach Antarctica.

Ed Chatterton from Lennox Head, was born in Liverpool, England and, working as 'Martin Chatterton', has been successfully writing children's books and young adult fiction for over twenty years. He will be launching his debut crime novel A Dark Place To Die at the Festival.





Australia's 'greatest living author' hails Byron Bay as true literary hub.

It has been a big 12 months for one of Byron Bay Writers' Festival headline acts, the two-times Miles Franklin award-winner **Alex Miller**. He's been hailed as 'Australia's greatest living author', launched his novel *Autumn Laing* to international acclaim, and following on from an academic symposium dedicated to his fiction, has a collection of academic essays published that contemplate his work in *The novels of Alex Miller*.

Miller is a seasoned participant upon the stage of the Byron Bay Writers' Festival, having graced the white marquees in 2010 and 2004 and Miller himself, busy on the festival circuit, believes there is something unique about the August festival in the northern rivers region. Miller says, "The attraction of Byron Bay that sets it apart from other major writers' festivals in Australia is that it's not located in or associated with a dominant urban literary culture - as are Melbourne and Sydney and Adelaide in particular. Perth too of course and Brisbane to a lesser extent. All writers coming to Byron do so as writers, and not as local identities or out-of-towners. It is a true gathering of writers without borders – and as you probably know from reading me, I firmly believe that truth is always in exile.

Miller has long been recognised as an original thinker, and he comes to this year's festival with a clear vision for the ideas he'd like to share with the audience and with other writers. 'What I'd like to explore if possible at Byron this year, is Truth in Fiction. The mask of fiction, just as exile, permits the writer to escape from the pressure – both conscious and unconscious – to conform to the perceived truths – of history, morality, politics, and so on – of a particular cultural milieu and to examine the inner life of his or her characters – or indeed the self – in a medium

that is inevitably transgressive if it is to be vigorous."


The festival stage will come alive with Miller's ideas this week, as he discusses the way in which his fiction appears as a 'conversation with my unconscious'. He describes fiction as something that is: '[drawn] out of the landscape of your imagination, which is based on the landscape of memory and the unconscious. And you don't have them from nowhere. You have them from a life's experience.'

It is Miller's beautifully articulated ideas and his vast range of life experience that makes him such an exciting

performer on the stage, once again, at this year's Byron Bay Writers' Festival.



International authors fly in for Writers' Festival

Byron Bay Writers' Festival is flying in some big names from the international literary world to speak at this year's annual festival.

Visiting from the US, Katherine Boo, in her first visit to Australia, is a staff writer for The New Yorker and has spent the last 20 years reporting on how societies distribute opportunity and how individuals get out of poverty. Her reporting has been honoured by a MacArthur Fellowship and the Pulitzer Prize for Public Service. She has recently published her first book Behind the Beautiful Forevers, a landmark work of narrative nonfiction that tells the dramatic story of families striving toward a better life in one of the world's most lively but treacherous cities - Mumbai.

From Hong Kong, Chinese-Indonesian Xu Xi has long inhabited the flight path connecting New York, Hong Kong and New Zealand. Xu Xi started writing stories in English as a child and is the author of nine books of fiction and essays, and editor of three anthologies of Hong Kong literature in English. She's the writer-in-residence at City University of Hong Kong where she runs the low-residency Master of Fine Arts specialising in Asian writing in English.

From India, 'one of world literature's great cult writers', Kiran Nagarkar. His first novel, Saat Sakkam Trechalis (translated into English as Seven Sixes are Forty Three) was a critical sensation when it was published in 1974, quickly becoming recognised as one of the most important novels written in Marathi. His next novel, Ravan and Eddie, begun in Marathi but completed in English, was not published till 1994. His third novel, Cuckold (1997) won the Sahitya Akademi award. It has been translated into a number of languages and has become one of the most beloved contemporary Indian novels, both in India and in Europe.

From Singapore, environmental children's author and crime writer Shamini Flint. Shamini began her career in law in Malaysia and also worked at an international law firm in Singapore. She travelled extensively around Asia for her work, before resigning to be a stay-at-home mum, writer, part-time lecturer and environmental activist, all in an effort to make up for her 'evil' past as a corporate

From Indonesia, Andrea Hirata. Born in Gantong, Belitong, East Sumatra, Andrea received a scholarship to study at Sheffield Hallam University in the UK, majoring in Economic Theory. After finishing his studies, he returned to Indonesia and in 2004, he volunteered for tsunami disaster relief in Aceh. In so doing, he saw ruined schools that reminded him of his old promise to his elementary school teacher, to one day write a book for his teacher. The novel is called Laskar Pelangi: The Rainbow Troops and it became the biggest selling Indonesian novel ever written.

From Pakistan, the 'rambunctious, vulgar, funny and moving' Mohammed Hanif, whose A Case of Exploding Mangoes won the Commonweath Writers' Prize for Best Short Novel, was shortlisted for the Guardian First Book Award and longlisted for the 2008 Man Booker Prize.

Mohammed Hanif's first novel, A Case of Exploding Mangoes, a black, utterly anarchic, laugh-aloud comedy of Pakistani politics,

corruption and violence, is a hard act to follow. It's the kind of book one reads with glee, recommends to friends and finds that an entire currency of Mohammed Hanif fans has been created.

Outrageous

storytelling

In Alice Bhatti, junior nurse grade 4 at the Sacred Heart Hospital for All Ailments, Hanif has created a saint out of a poor Choohra (a derogatory term for Christians) from a slum in Karachi. In a central chapter, he details the ruses constructed by Alice to get through her damaged, punished life without suffering what she has seen other women suffer in Pakistan. 'She knows that getting hacked at the hands of a father, lover, brother is definitely a fate worse than being run over, accidentally, by a truck driven by your own offspring.' Alice is stick-thin but has breasts that men ogle at. An old nun once told her that she 'looks like a cross with tits.' But Alice is, give or take a comic description or two, a third-world sister to Germaine Greer.

Teddy Butt is a tag-on member of the Gentlemen's Squad, an unofficial police group of 'reformed rapists, torturers, sharpshooters.' He is, among other things, 'a crime-scene cleaner, replacement court witness,' and 'a companion to people who have been caught but not yet killed.' Teddy, Mauser in hand, falls in love with Alice and Alice succumbs.

Then there is Noor, who at 17 seems to run the Sacred Heart while caring for his blind mother Zainab while she dies of cancer. And Nurse Alvi Hini who turns out to have a heart of gold after telling Alice to 'stop with the miracles and stick to your day job."

Hanif sometimes brings to mind Evelyn Waugh at his sharpest (Vile Bodies, Scoop) but his insistent, brilliant, profoundly funny story-telling gives him the means to express outrage while avoiding any consequences from the Gentlemen's Squad.

Mungo cooks up meaty anecdotes and more

Eat My Words by Mungo MacCallum Review by David Lovejoy

Mungo MacCallum's new book *Eat My Words* is not a cookbook. We have his word for that, based on its non-resemblance to a coffee-table tome. It is, according to the subtitle, A Memoir of Politics, Pig-outs & Pickles. But in fact, although all aspects of food are celebrated in its pages, this is rather more a cookbook than it is anything else.

Part personal reminiscence, part travelogue, part history, part dogmatic opinion, *Eat My Words* is surprisingly easy to consume. This is because the personal memoir is fascinating (Mungo once shared a Greek Island with Leonard Cohen), the travel and historical anecdotes are informative (who knew there was a Ham Museum in Buenos Aires?) and the opinion – well, *Echo* readers are familiar with Mungo's witty and trenchant style. Let's just say, for example, that the snivelling excuses put forward by amateur hunters for their cruel pastime get thoroughly demolished.

So arrive for the entertainment – enhanced by Stephen Axelsen's whimsical illustrations – but stay for the true gist of the book: the author's favourite recipes. These are not presented separately, cookbook style, but run through the text so that the reader finds herself in one paragraph chatting with Bill Hayden and in the next pickling spiced grapes. It's less confusing than it sounds, for there is an excellent index that allows you to find which of Mungo's food adventures you'd like to emulate. So far this reviewer has tried the devilled eggs (a picnic favourite) and the puttanesca sauce (so-called, we are told, because it's easy enough for a prostitute to whip up between clients).


There is, however, no denying that the recipes heavily favour the animal end of the food spectrum. The author relishes his meat, whether it formerly crawled, burrowed, ran, swam, flew or attached itself to the bottom of a boat, and the attentive reader will here learn how to cook not only chooks, cows, sheep, fish and pigs, but also goat

and rabbit flesh, as well as a variety of offal delights. Nevertheless, this is Byron Shire and so there is a generous helping of vegetarian dishes which Mungo has learned, under protest, to make for his friends. The one exception to this indulgence is tofu. What terrifying bean curd trauma afflicted the infant Mungo is unknown, but the effects are tragically displayed throughout the text.

Eat My Words by Mungo MacCallum (ABC Books) will be launched by Tom Keneally at 4pm on Friday, August 3, at the Byron Bay Writers' Festival.

So, you have made another ample pot of glorious soup - possibly even frozen some for future reference. What is soup, however, without a carbohydrate accompaniment? Most of us reach unthinkingly for a crusty loaf of bread, sourdough or baguette or Turkish, even delightfully daggy old toast.

Except that sometimes it is worth extending yourself. Over the years I have honed a small repertoire of lovely things to go with soups, not one of them technically challenging, and all of them, while being variations on bread, devoid of the rigmarole of working with yeast. One is an absolute favourite, the four-ingredientsonly Beer Bread, which, yes, utilises a can of beer that provides the raising agent and the perfume so close to the real thing that your guests may well presume you had been kneading and proving all afternoon.

There is a Potato Scone shaped as a large round and studded with black olives and chopped red capsicum – especially admirable alongside pumpkin soup. Of savoury muffins I generally have a low opinion, except that my Cheddar Cheese and Mustard ones are irresistible – even to children if you bake them in mini muffin tins. Finally there is my friend Kate's fabulous Soda Bread whose wholemeal flour almost persuades you into the belief it is good for you, until, that is, the butter is slathered on!

BEER BREAD

In a large bowl combine 3 cups self raising

flour, 1 dessertspoon sugar, 1 teaspoon of salt and 1 can beer. Line a loaf tin with baking paper, spoon in the dough and cook one hour in a preheated 175°C oven. The end. (Although you can let fly with your imagination, adding fresh herbs, grated cheese, pitted olives, sun-dried tomatoes and bake individual ones in muffin tins, adjusting the cooking time accordingly.)

POTATO SCONE

First, cook and mash 400 grams potato and set aside. Roast then peel 1 small red capsicum.

In a large bowl mix together 2 cups self raising flour and 2 teaspoons salt then rub in 32 grams butter, cut into small cubes, until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Pour in 1 cup milk and 2 egg yolks and stir until well incorporated. Add cooled potato, 3 tablespoons finely chopped fresh sage, 10 black olives pitted and chopped, the chopped red capsicum and freshly ground black pepper. Turn out on to floured board and shape into a circle then place on greased 23cm pie dish. Brush top with one beaten egg and bake for about 35 mins or cooked through. Serve in wedges.

CHEDDAR CHEESE AND MUSTARD MUFFINS

Soften 2 tablespoons green onion and 2 tablespoons red pepper, both finely chopped, in 4 tablespoons butter then set aside. In a medium bowl combine 1 cup plain flour, 1 cup wholemeal plain flour, 21/2 teaspoons baking powder and a pinch of salt. In a large bowl whisk together 2 eggs, 1 cup milk, 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard and 1 tablespoon sugar until foamy. Stir in 1 cup grated Cheddar cheese and the onion mixture together with its butter, then stir dry ingredients into wet ones until mixture is just moistened. Spoon into greased muffin moulds and bake in a preheated 180°C oven for 20-25 mins, or until skewer comes out clean.

KATE'S SODA BREAD

Combine 600g wholemeal plain flour, 10g bicarbonate of soda, 10g salt and 600ml buttermilk until well blended and smooth. Grease a baking tray and pat the dough into a cake about 5cm high. Using a wet knife cut a deep cross almost through to the bottom then bake for 35-40 mins in a 200°C oven.





Ballina moves to protect koalas

Ballina Shire Council voted recently to prepare a koala plan of management for the shire, joining a growing number of north coast councils adopting such plans.

The federal government recently declared the koala as a threatened species, with koala populations in NSW, Queensland, and the Australian Capital Territory listed as vulnerable under national environment law.

Lismore and Tweed councils have recently adopted koala management plans while Byron Shire Council has appointed a project reference group to prepare one.

Yesterday's decision means Ballina Council will spend up to \$50,000 for surveys of the koala populations and habitat mapping in this year's budget, boosted next year with an extra \$30,000 for further work on the plan.

Staff in their report said there was not much information available about koala populations in the Ballina area. They said analyses of mapping and population could take up

A total of 85 NSW Institute of Sport (NSWIS) scholarship holders will compete at the 2012 London Olympic Games, which began on Saturday morning.

A total of 86 NSWIS athletes were selected on the Australian Olympic Team; however, only 85 will compete following Shane Rose's withdrawal earlier this week. The Institute's contribution equates to nearly 21 per cent of the Australian Olympic Team.

NSWIS athletes brought home three gold, four silver and five bronze medals from the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games. Interestingly, 85 NSWIS athletes also competed at the Beijing Games, and this year there are several chances to match or improve upon the results of four years ago.

James Magnussen will spearhead the NSWIS contingent as he targets a potential four gold medals, while other contenders include Matthew Mitcham, Melissa Wu (diving), Kaarle McCulloch (cycling), Edwina Alexander (equestrian), Tom Slingsby, Malcolm Page, Nathan Outteridge and Iain Jensen (sailing). The NSWIS is also strongly represented in rowing (12 athletes), track and field (11 athletes), water polo (10 athletes) and hockey (nine

NSWIS chief executive Charles Turner, a three-time water polo Olympian, is confident that all NSWIS athletes will continue the Institute's actual sport!






