Consciousness tour brings the big names

International psychonauts Graham Hancock, Dennis McKenna and Mitch Shultz will be landing in Byron Bay for the Origins of Consciousness event to be held at the Byron Community Centre on October 19

Graham Hancock is author of the bestseller Fingerprints of the Gods. Dennis McKenna is a world-renowned ethnobotanist and author of a forthcoming biography on equally famous brother Terence McKenna, and Mitch Shultz is director of the documentary DMT: The Spirit Molecule.

Origins of Consciousness: An Exploration of Spirituality, Psychedelics and Ancient Civilisations is part of an Australian tour by the three men.

'The tour will be a lively combination of keynote talks, panel discussions and Q&As,' says spokesperson Doron Francis. It will run from 2pm to 10pm.

In the afternoon Dennis McKenna and Mitch Schultz will talk on DMT Exposed: Nature and Consciousness to Arts and Media.

In the evening session McKenna will speak on his new memoir The Brotherhood of the Screaming Abyss: My Life with Terence McKenna.

More than a million rock engravings (petroglyphs) are reported to be in the Murujuga/Dampier archipelago rockart precinct, 1550 km north of Perth on Western Australia's Pilbara coast. It's the Ngarda Ngarli people's sacred site, and includes pre-ice age sacred art and engravings of the fat-tailed kangaroo (extinct for 40-45,000 years), and the Thylacine, or Tasmania Tiger (extinct on Australian mainland for 3–3,500 years). Residents gathered Sunday at Cape Byron as part of a global day of action for 'Stand up for the Burrup', which highlights the mining activities that threaten these ancient artefacts. Emma Tunbridge, organiser of the Byron Bay event, says, 'The problem is that the Murujuga is in remote NW Western Australia. Fire destroys OS house

Six Ocean Shores teenagers escaped with their lives but not much else after the house they were living in burned to the ground in the early hours of Saturday.

Brunswick Heads firefighters received a call at 2.47am alerting them to the blaze in Tathra Glen. By the time they reached the property, the fire was too advanced to save anything. It took 12 firefighters and three trucks, two from Brunswick Heads and one from Mullumbimby, and other emergency services about an hour and a half to bring the fire under control.

'Fortunately the house was on a large block, Brunswick Fire captain Graeme Wakely told The Echo.

'The fire was well advanced when we arrived but the size of the block meant that surrounding properties were not threatened'.

Mr Wakely said that the site was now a crime scene until the investigation was concluded.

environmental zone plans IPs scrap

Rural landowners are claiming victory over Byron Council's contentious plans to apply complex zonings on agriculture land after three state ministers intervened late last week.

NSW minister for planning and infrastructure Brad Hazzard announced, along with Ballina MP Don Page and Lismore MP Thomas George, that the government 'would not endorse the use of E2 and E3 environmental zones' on rural land that is earmarked for far north councils' local environmental plans (LEPs).

Instead, the ministers say areas proposed to be covered by these zones 'would be excised from the plans while the department of planning and infrastructure reviews the use of these controls in consultation with other government agencies and stakeholders.'

The move applies to Ballina, Byron, Lismore, Kyogle and Tweed councils. The Byron Shire Rural Landhold-

ers Action Group, who initiated a recent public meeting on the issue, welcomed the announcement.

'Since our last public meeting, hundreds of complaints have been received by local and state politicians on this

issue. It just goes to show what people can achieve if they come together and support their community, said the action group's Rex Harris, Alli Page and Louise Savrda. 'The fight is not over vet. We still have a lot of work to do and all landholders need to remain active and review and respond to the right direction for all of us?

In the announcement, Mr Page said, 'These proposed zones and overlays have the potential to limit existing agricultural and other rural uses withalso very strong concerns that these value of existing properties.

'The NSW government will act to ensure the rights of existing landowners are protected.

'The government will now review draft LEP. But this is one big step in the the suitability of these controls, whilst still providing appropriate protection for the environment.



businesses through overly restrictive environmental zones,' he added.

Developers win: Pugh

But the decision has been blasted by conservationist Dailan Pugh, who says, 'the loss of environmental protection zoning in local environmental plans is a sad day for native ecosystems, animals and streams. It is a win for the CSG miners, loggers and developers.

Mr Pugh claims that for the past 26 years, Byron Shire relied upon environmental protection zones (7A, 7B, 7F, 7J and 7K) and its tree preservation order (TPO) to protect native vegetation.

'The previous state gov-

Council's ability to use TPOs to protect native vegetation for properties over ten hectares.

'Now Don Page and his government have decided to remove all protection for native vegetation by excising environmental protection zones from north coast LEPs.

'They may later restore some token protection to some areas if they feel like it. Byron's new draft LEP proposed including high conservation value native vegetation in an E2 zone. This included rainforest, oldgrowth forest, endangered ecological communities, rare and inadequately reserved ecosystems, wetlands, riparian habitat and high-quality koala habitat. 'Having announced their in-

ernment decided to remove tention to take away the community's right to challenge any development allowed by LEPs, the National Party is now taking away the community's right to prohibit intensive development in our highest conservation value areas.'

MP Page defends

In resposne to Mr Pugh's claims, MP Page told The *Echo*, 'The decision to defer the E2 and E3 zones in five draft LEPs on the north coast is because they have in many cases been put on normal agricultral farming land.

'All the government is doing is saying these zoning need to be reconsidered so that nomal agricultural land can be zoned that way (RU 1 or RU2).

'E zones will still exist but not over normal agricultural land.

'The term *excise* is used by planners to indicate a plan can be gazetted but certain aspects (in this case E2, E3) need further work and consultation. It has no connection with CSG.'

The Landholders Action Group will hold a general public meeting on Wednesday September 26 from 6.30pm at the Bangalow Bowling Club.

The action group added, 'All Byron Shire landholders are invited to come and hear what they must do to ensure the state government continues to support changes to the draft LEP to meet the needs of our farmers and rural landholders.'

Minister investigates Bruns road closure

NSW roads minister Duncan Gay has told parliament he will investigate whether the recent controversial closure of Riverside Crescent at Brunswick Heads was approved.

Mr Gay, responding to a question from Byron-based MLC Jan Barham on Thursday, said he would also find out if approval has been given to the plans of management for the Crown's Brunswick Heads holiday parks (The Terrace, Massey Greene and Ferry Reserve).



CSG protesters target Don Page's office

Minister's party approves mining licences for state despite vocal public opposition

The NSW Liberal/National's decision to issue coal-seam gas (CSG) production licences in the northern rivers sparked a protest outside Nationals MP Don Page's office on Monday September 17.

The state's controversial announcement comes despite an overwhelming vote against CSG at Lismore's local election.

Mr Page has defended the state government's decision, however.

Speaking on ABC radio last week, he said, 'I can understand some people saying "we don't want coal-seam gas on any terms whatsoever," but the reality is that we are running out of gas in NSW.





How Green is that Paper?

Environmental worriers and warriors have been critical of the NSW government's Green Paper so far, which aims to overhaul town, rural and city planning.

But let's just pause and look at the state government's own propaganda. Its website's statements include 'promoting a "can do" culture' and 'reducing red tape and delay'... and so on.

Despite the motherhood claims of transparency and efficiency, it also claims to have 'community consultation at the forefront of planning decisions'.

And the 30-year-old planning document needs to be revised, according to www.planning.nsw.gov.au, as the 'legislation has been modified over 150 times'.

Okay, fair enough. But here's what the paper says about streamlining development: 'To depoliticise decision making, it is proposed that development applications be streamed to appropriate independent and expert decision makers. State and regional scale development will be assessed by the Planning Assessment Commission (PAC) and the Joint Regional Planning Panel (JRPP). One option being considered by the NSW government is for local level development applications to be considered by an independent expert panel... There will be targets set for timeframes for different types of assessment and the achievement of these targets will be monitored and reported, with implications for poor or inefficient decision making.

The state government is disingenuous to say that community consultation will be at the forefront of planning decisions.

Its stated aims are to take away a community's right to decide state and regional scale development.

Despite public feedback being now closed, NSW councils have their chance to have input until October 5. Hopefully councils across the state will apply what little wedge they can to resist innapropriate developments that the state plans to enforce in the name of economic rationalism.







Thyroid cancers



Mephedrone users risking memory loss: new study

'Mephedrone is highly addictive in the worst possible way. Users tend to binge on massive doses of the drug over short time spans,' said Craig Motbey, a PhD candidate in the University's School of Psychology and lead author of the research published in PLOS ONE, the Public Library of Science journal, today.

'Combined with the fact mephedrone is skyrocketing in popularity worldwide, with Australia following that trend, our finding that high doses can cause ongoing cognitive impairment spells a significant risk for users?

Also known as 'meow meow' and 'MCAT', mephedrone's immediate effect on the brain is similar to a combination of ecstasy and methamphetamine.

Think humans are special? Like the animals we eat, we're meat, too

Helen Addison-Smith entered the red-blooded debate on The Conversation website http://theconversation.edu.au.

n recent advertisements for Meat and Livestock Australia, actor Sam Neill told us, in David Attenborough-inflected tones, that: 'when our early ancestors started to eat red meat, our brains began to grow'.

'Hunting,' Neill said, 'forced us to think', and consequently, 'red meat is a part of the diet of the most highly developed species on the planet'. Meat eating is an 'instinct'. We are 'meant to eat it'.

This is a very familiar origin story, one told to us from primary school days. It makes the consumption of meat central to our evolution as a species. In this story, to eat meat is to fulfil our duty to the food chain.

But the meat that we eat today is usually raised in factory farms and killed in abattoirs. It is then presented for our consumption, sliced, minced and parsley-sprigged in our butcher, cling-wrapped and barcoded in our supermarket, or slammed into buns and sauced in our fast-food joints. Today's meat has little to do with the animals that humans used to hunt, and the modern processes of transforming a live animal into a piece of meat are entirely different from what they once were.



once we die 'naturally' (whatever that may mean in these medically inflected times). Instead we are burnt, embalmed or at least buried in land which is definitively set apart from food production. In this way, humans are lost as a source of fertiliser, and our ties to the food chain are severed.

Perhaps this is why the modern human struggles for meaning, and against death. Posthumanist philosopher Donna Harraway's recent book When Species Meet attempts to accept and foreground our connection with other sentient beings, and works against the tendency of humans to think of our own lives as the only ones which are important and meaningful.

If we remember that we are part of nature, we remember that we will die. However, we should also remember that from our death inevitably comes new life. Although that life is not human, we would not have existed without it.

All the same, connotations of hunting, evolution and mastery over nature are still intrinsically linked in public discourse to the consumption of meat.







GETTING SICK OF HEALTH

The other day I answered the phone to someone after Mandy Nolan. After a brief conversation the caller asked if I could put her on to my wife. For the past few weeks I've been talking like a man. Sure, it's sexy if you are into women who sound I like John Laws, but personally I am finding the sound of my own voice a bit creepy.

For the first time in five years I've caught the flu. I'm not one of those people who ever get sick. I have the constitution of an ox. (I wonder if somewhere out in a paddock there are two oxen having a chat about the robustness of their health using a similar metaphor 'You know mate, I never get sick, I have the constitution of Mandy Nolan')

Disease has never found me desirable. I have, to date, managed to avoid most of the horribly achey, spewy, shitty stuff that circulates our unimmunised and ironically close-knit community. I don't do anything in particular to promote wellness. I mean who can any more? Used to be you'd have a dose of cod liver oil, maybe a Bex and a good lie-down and that would be your weekly program.

These days you need a degree to decipher what the hell you are supposed to be doing, then you ^I need to take out an extra mortgage to finance it. I know about anti-oxidants. We'll be needing plenty of them. Fortunately they are in red wine, so I think I'm covered. Although apparently you're not supposed to drink alcohol at all. Or coffee. Fish oil has been touted as a must-have for good health. Now I've heard krill oil is better. 

PLAYING TWO SHOWS THIS WEEK AT THE HOTEL GREAT NORTHERN, SINGER/ SONGWRITER MAT FROM THE BEAUTIFUL GIRLS REVEALED ALL ABOUT HIS MUSICAL INSPIRATION – THESE ARE HIS TOP FIVE.

1. BOB DYLAN: DON'T THINK TWICE IT'S ALL RIGHT I've always played guitar because my dad played and there was always one around. I don't remember ever thinking it was 'cool' until I heard this song on one of my dad's records. I remember being struck by how stark it sounded compared to most of the other albums in his collection. In some weird way I could relate. Even as a little kid I remember thinking that playing guitar and singing was all you really needed to say what you needed to.

2. JOHN COLTRANE: MY FAVOURITE THINGS Another one of my dad's records. I used to love to listen to his mellow ballads and thought the sound of his playing was the most beautiful thing I'd ever heard. I begged my dad to try to get me into the school band, on saxophone, when I was in first grade. It was a couple of years before I was 'technically' allowed to join. They let me in on the proviso that I had to play the shitty, beat-up saxophone they had in storage. I stuck with it and the school got me a brand-new shiny saxophone to

play about six months before my dad passed away. It's still almost the proudest I've ever been.

3. RUN DMC: SUCKER MCS When I was in my early teens, and my friends were all listening to rock music, I was listening to Run DMC on my cassette Walkman. I thought it sounded so tough and I had no idea how they got the drums and the music to sound like it did. Run DMC were kind of like my Beatles.

4. MINOR THREAT: LOOK BACK AND LAUGH These guys (and Bad Brains) were pretty much the only guitar bands I listened to in my teens. It just always felt like, until Nirvana came along, that guitar bands just sung about stupid stuff. It was all a bit too 'rock star' for me. I liked all the early hardcore stuff because I could relate to it. I could imagine my friends and I making songs like this.

5. THE CLASH: GUNS OF BRIXTON I came to the Clash kind of late. I knew about Rock the Casbah and songs like that but I actually thought they were sort of cheesy. Later on, as I dug into their records, I realised how important and influential they are. To me, as a person who likes to mix up genres, a band that mashes reggae, dub and punk rock and have something to say will always be a shining light. thereafter, when they were able to move back to the capital, Dili, Ego lost his three siblings to disease and malnutrition, and his father and grandfather to the confusion of war

Unlike so many young men his age, when East Timor gained its independence after a bloody referendum in 1999, he was lucky to be alive. His activities had brought him close to death many times. Foreign helpers flooded into the country, and one of these, a permaculture trainer from Australia, would become Ego's close friend and mentor. Having taught himself English from dictionaries, Ego became his mentor's translator, travelling the country with him to give workshops, train farmers and instigate projects

all over the country in home gardening, nurseries and the concepts of sustainable agriculture. Soon he outgrew his position as a simple translator, and Ego Lemos founded the country's first permaculture centre, Permatil, which he coordinated for five years. He also founded a highly successful sustainable agriculture network, HASATIL, both of which still flourish today.

It has been over ten years that his voice as a songwriter, permaculturalist, and community-development worker has been charming audiences around the world with his inspiring enthusiasm for environmental and social revitalisation in his home country, East Timor, and abroad. 





Cinema Reviews

Hotel Transylvania

One of the earliest shots in this rollicking animation is of the shadow that is cast on a wall by the bony bent fingers of Dracula (voiced by Adam Sandler). It is an unambiguous reference to the same iconic image in FW Murnau's 1922 classic, Nosferatu. Vampires, zombies, werewolves and other members of the undead have been with us on screen for as long as people have been making films, and may they flourish yet (the scene in which the monster in James Whale's 1931 Frankenstein is welcomed into the blind peasant's cottage is one for the ages. 'Friend, good.')The monster (erroneously called Frankenstein) is just one of many happily identified characters and much loved tropes called on by director Genndy Tartakovsky to celebrate the genre. The setting is Dracula's castle, where a who's

who of horror has gathered for the 118th birthday party of Mavis (Selena Gomez), his gorgeous 'young' daughter. Like all teenagers, Mavis is getting rebellious and wants to venture out into the world, but her widowed father forbids her to leave the sanctuary that he has created in the dark Transylvanian forest. Arriving unannounced is a back-packing ranga, Jonathan (Andy Samberg), and for him and Mavis it is love at first sight. Naturally, Dad won't have a bar of the budding romance and when we learn of Dracula's tragic back-story we can understand why. There is plenty of fab visual stimulation, frenetic action, witty dialogue (including a gratifying put-down of Twilight) and upbeat dance music, but what is most likeable about the movie is its morality. Youthful defiance of parental control is a theme that the tweens that this is aimed at will identify with immediately, but beyond that old

chestnut there is a more urgent message being promoted. Acceptance of the 'other' is a quality in desperately short (and diminishing) supply these days, so the rapprochement between Dracula and the starcrossed kids, and between the scary outcasts and the normal people of the town provides a priceless lesson for us all. ~ John Campbell

Ruby Sparks

Whenever I see the word 'quirky', which has been applied to this probing but mushy dramedy, I reach for my gun. In cinema, it usually hints at a movie that is original without being quite as smart as it thinks it is, though sometimes you can't actually put your finger on what's annoying you because the good bits wash over the irritant. Calvin (Paul Dano) is a novelist who's done nothing since his great success of ten years ago. Blocked, lonely and loveless except for his dog Scottie, his shrink (Elliott Gould) advises him to write about the girl of his dreams. Calvin commences doing so (on a typewriter an affectation that was too whimsical by half for mine) and one day he goes downstairs to find the flesh-and-blood girl, Ruby (Zoe Kazan), in his kitchen. This is the story's central conceit - that an imagined person can mysteriously manifest herself. How can this be explained? Calvin has no idea, and is further flummoxed when Ruby is very visible to his brother Harry (Chris Messina - the casting director could not possibly have found two actors who look less like siblings). The jump that the audience needs to take to rationalise it is straightforward enough, but you get the impression that you are not considered capable of making it. Metaphysical on one level, with an overly clichéd depiction of the tormented artist, it barely rises above the mundane on another, as we follow what is basically just a run-of-the mill romance, with its ups and downs. Written by Kazan, there are some acute insights into the male's



Ruby is too cute and kooky to be anything more than a cut-out. The really annoying segment comes when they visit the leafy bohemian haven of Ruby's parents (Antonio Banderas and Annette Bening), who turn out to be grating counter-culturists from the same mould as Mr and Mrs Focker – only not funny. Scottie is adorable, but the saccharine ending made me groan. ~ John Campbell

I Am Eleven

At the outset, I confess that I have never been a 'from the mouths of babes' type of guy. Children are just that immature, inexperienced and (quite naturally) self-absorbed. Fearing that I would be more irritated than entertained by a session of cloying cutesiness (and also worried by the production company's rallying moniker of Proud Mother Pictures), I was pleasantly surprised by Genevieve Bailey's uplifting doco. Aiming to travel the globe with her camera and candidly record the thoughts of a group of random eleven-yearolds, she has presented us with a little gem of humanism - I saw it straight after the new \$250 million Batman and it impacted on me as a reality check in the best possible way. The film lacks any unifying theme, but this tends to free it from ponderous polemic - these are merely kids talking off the cuff. Nor would one or two deletions have hurt - the student from Georgia (US) was least engaging, whereas the bug-eyed wannabe boxer in London was as interesting in his own humble way as the truly strange boy in the Tottenham shirt. What becomes most apparent is how all of them, without exception, show themselves to be products of their environment and upbringing. The son of alternative lifestylers in France expresses exactly the sentiments that he would have learnt from his parents, the peasant girl in

possessive, controlling urges, but Morocco prays five times a day, the Thai and Australian lads at the elephant farm near Bangkok classically see the world through different eyes and with different expectations. Bailey, who does it all, is instinctively drawn to characters that would appeal - I loved the Indian girls and the upbeat Jewess in New Jersey

and, as cinematographer, she has an unerring eye for a good image. The edit skips along to a light-hearted beat and the music only occasionally sounds like Michael Leunig tweeness. I just wish I could remember who said 'I want to be someone.' Go see it for yourself. It's a real fillip. ~ John Campbell

however, did not want me to salt my eggplant slices. Instead I was directed to soak them in water. Obediently I did - it seemed mad, but I was determined to follow the recipe religiously - then I patted them dry with paper towels, then I fried them. In shallow oil as requested, except - and this was one of the reasons the dish took me so long – I found I was constantly needed to replenish the oil in the frypan. I pressed on grimly, intent on each slice being golden and cooked through, however many litres of olive oil it might take.

Well. Was it the pre-soaking that caused the melting effect once the whole thing was assembled and baked? How could it be? I undertook a little research - sure enough, soaking in water, and often in salted water, is a not uncommon practice. Some people use milk for soaking, one online woman claiming it is 'so oil can't penetrate'. Online comments should always be taken with - pardon the pun - a grain of salt: another woman decreed that 'soaking rids the plant of its natural toxins that make the plant bitter.' Aha!

I suspect I will never solve the culinary mysteries of this vegetable, but in the process of my investigations I did learn a great trick from a Sicilian woman. She suggests that the most successful fried eggplant depends on the way you slice the vegetable; that instead of crosswise slices (which, she says, lets the eggplant fibres soak up the oil) you should always slice vertically. Then of course you salt, and rinse, and rub dry, and squeeze, and strain, and rinse again and dry again before submitting the vastly manipulated eggplant slices to a deep-fry of not olive oil but grapeseed.

If ever I have the time to make moussaka again I'll give this a go!





Islands look to zero emissions cargo network

There is talk around the docks of Suva that the real reason for the haphazard observation of shipping timetables may not always be because of some romantic notion of 'Pacific time' but something altogether more prosaic: the high cost of diesel.

The scuttlebutt suggests that some island services are so strapped for cash they cannot afford to buy their fuel until enough passengers have paid their fares so the boat's operators can run around the corner and put in an order.

that the rising price of diesel is crippling the economics of inner island ferry services and trade, and not just in Fiji. It is also crippling the entire economies of some Pacific nations. As a recent island conference concluded in Malta earlier this month, island governments are spending an average of more than 20 per cent of their GDP on fuel imports. For some smaller nations, they rely on aid to buy their fuel because the cost is greater than their GDP, and fuel for transport is often far greater a cost that fuel for stationary energy.

In Fiji, the cost is high enough to make many of the routes uneconomic and to force the government to subsidise nearly half the cost of fuel for these – a considerable bill for a nation of 300 islands and where ferry and boat links are crucial. Fiji reportedly has a fuel import bill of \$1 billion a year, and the Fiji government has announced it is looking for ways to cut that by at least \$100 million.

And that's got some people thinking about alternatives. While solar, wind, biofuels and batteries are often deployed to provide stationary energy see Tokelau to become world's first 100 per cent solar powered nation - that plan does not address transport fuels, which is even more challenging. The shipping industry at a global level is trying to work out the best means of reducing fuel costs, and emissions, and all sort of ideas have been presented - from kites, to sails, and even to solar-powered engines

Maersk recently unveiled what it dubbed as the 'Prius of the sea. It's not so much an electric solution as a roundbottomed one, with a new design that focuses on fuel economy rather than speed. These new vessels, able to handle 18,000 containers, will reduce fuel consumption by 30 per cent and emissions by 50 per cent, the company estimates. Such ideas may have an impact on the global seaborne trade, but are unlikely to make much difference to nations like Fiji. Some suggest its best option may be to delve into its own maritime traditions. It's often remembered that the Pacific nations were initially populated by intrepid ocean

voyagers, but rarely is the ex-

tent of their skills recognised. Take, for instance, these craft – known in Fiji as 'Drua' or 'Vaqa', but which had similar versions from other nations. Their performance was so outstanding that voyagers from Captain Cook through to the to connect all Pacific islands in end of the 19th century marveled at what they conceded were the 'fastest sailing boat' in existence.

Not only were they capable of sailing nearer the wind than any European vessel, and could also carry large numbers of people and freight - doing 15-20 knots with up to 300 hundred people on board. They were about the same length as Cook's *Endeavour*, could carry more people and loads, and were three times faster. They community. Sadly, the knowledge built up over generations was nearly lost in just the last two. But a recent rennaisance of naval pride and knowledge, encompassed by the recently completed trek across the Pacific by seven such craft, has led many to believe that these ancient technologies could be adapted, and offer the opportunity for Fiji and other Pacific island nations to develop the first alternative shipping network in in Australia. Subsequent ships the world.

This, at least, is the vision of a group called Sailing for Sustainability. Its spokesman, Peter Nuttall, is working with the Fiji Island Voyaging Society to bring these designs back to life and apply them in a way that could act as inter-island traders.

He has begun discussions with the designers and promoters of a vessel such as the shipping network has been at-Tokyo-based Greenheart or- tempted. In 1984, a 300-tonne ganisation, which has developed a 220-tonne prototype freighter with virtually unlimited range based around sails, but with solar PV for battery boosting and auxiliary power. Its shallow draft makes it suitable for beach landings, and its mast doubles as a crane. Sailing for Sustainability and FIVS have teamed up with WWF and IUCN to seek funding for a project that could see these ships trialled in Fiji. 'In a sense it will come back to innovative designs,' said Nuttall. His broader vision is a sustainable, carbon-neutral way that would deliver energy independence, better infrastructure, and more economic opportunities for remote island communities.

Greenheart projects campaigns co-ordinator Jennifer Teeter said the 'Sail-Powered Village Vessels' pilot program, and the creation of the first zero-emissions cargo network in the world, would be transformative for the Pacific and servicing such communities has long been a major development barrier for Pacific governments. Emerging technologies such as being spearheaded by Greenheart and B9 Shipping mean that Pacific communities now have a sustainable option to consider.'

The first Greenheart vessel is currently seeking crowd-funding and will be completed next year, before beginning a global voyage that will include stops will be community-owned and crewed, micro-financed, opensource design and zero-fuel/ low environmental impact. It has been designed with assistance from Professor Takeshi Kinoshita of Tokyo and Peter Schenzle, of the Hamburg Institute for Experimental Shipbuilding.

This is not the first time the 'de-fueling' of the Pacific cargo vessel, the Na Mataisau, was retrofitted with a sailing rig that delivered nearly 25 per cent in fuel savings. In 1985, it foundered after being caught in a cyclone. The engines failed, but the sails took the boat to an island where the crew, including the prime minister and his party, could be rescued. But the boat was lost. Biofuels are also an option. The US Navy has been boasting of its 'green fleet' that is

agricultural residues.

But it is the Drua, or a modern variation, that Nuttall thinks will not just capture the imagination, but also offer the most practical solutions. They were, in fact, multifunctional vessels. Their primary purpose was as the naval attack weapon of choice, and they saw service as blockade runners and enforcers, landing craft, fleet battleships, troop and supply transporters and deadly effective rammers.

There are graphic descriptions of the massive naval battles fought between island kingdoms. In times of peace they performed as diplomatic missions and passenger/cargo traders. One passage from the time noted that a pig could be roasted whole in the open cooking place, and one canoe carried 12 head of cattle in its holds.

The sad paradox now is that sea-borne trade from Fiji to Tonga now comes via Australia a detour that makes it nearly 10 times the distance.

'When you talk to Fijians about the Drua, you get the faraway look in their eye,' Nuttall says. 'It's an icon: you see the image on nearly every piece of correspondence and on nearly ever logo. It's everywhere you look - except out on the water where they should

Enthusiasm was heightened in the recent voyage of seven such vessels, representing the various pacific island nations raised the whole profile of the sailing. The Te Mana o te Moana - 'Spirit of the Ocean' - voyage organised by the FIVS and others raised the profile of sailing and was specifically designed to 'revive the skills and lessons of our ancestors to apply to a sustained future for the youth of tomorrow'.

Byron Shire Buyers Agent Q&A by Hans Lovejoy

Auctioneer Dave Eller

Freelance real estate auctioneer, trainer and author Dave Eller has just moved to the area with his wife and baby son, having conducted auctions in Byron Shire for the past three years. Having worked in the entertainment industry for 20 years including TV, radio and stage, Dave says he brings that 'extra special something to every auction and every training session.'

His website claims he was an anchorman of a breakfast radio program in WA and also lived in Las Vegas while hosting a show on the famous glitter strip. Now he can be seen entertaining the crowds every weekend at real estate auctions, as well as at many of the major boxing, kickboxing and MMA (mixed martial arts) events in south-east QLD as the ring announcer for FoxSports. Entertainment runs through his veins.

Studying martial arts for over 25 years and with black belts in three different styles, Dave says he commits the same kind of dedication to real estate. 'I am fully licensed in both QLD and NSW as a real estate agent and auctioneer, as well as a Certificate IV nationally qualified Industry Trainer.' He also claims to have conducted thousands of auctions in south-east Queensland and northern NSW. Dave says, 'It inspires me when I get to work with enthusiastic agents and teams. I like to focus on positivity, about being part of the solution and not part of the pollution... It's a simple philosophy. And it works!'

Please explain the advantages of auctioneering - especially to the vendor. My understanding is that auctions are more suited to 'motivated sellers'

In a private treaty sale, the buyer will dictate the offer, terms, subject to finance, subject to sale, subject to building inspection, and has a cooling-off period. The buyer will negotiate from a position of strength. Auction is most often the only method of sale in which the vendor will negotiate from a position of strength; vendors control their reserve price and settlement date and accept or reject varied terms but get cash contracts, which usually settle in 30 days. Additionally, there is no cooling-off period. With an

auction program, the price is not disclosed, which forces buyers to judge the property based on its features and means that they are more likely to look at the property without the asking price scaring them off. The deadline of the auction date brings negotiations to a head and assists in reducing the overall selling time. One particular agent I work with in Byron sells 84 per cent of the property we auction either before, on auction day, or within two weeks post auction day. This is a fantastic result and of great benefit to a vendor, as the longer a property is on the market, the less likely it will attract the premium price.

Is there anything unique you provide in your auctions?

I provide a complete auction service to both the agent and the vendor. I consult with the agent throughout the entire process if required, providing advice and assistance. I also make myself available to the vendor to answer any questions about the process and to address any concerns. On auction day I play a role in the negotiations to help the vendor achieve a sale. At the end of the day, it's the auctioneer's skills, enthusiasm and techniques that can maximise the price for the vendor. *How did you become an auctioneer?*


Did you have previous realtor experience and, if so, where? I have been in real estate for the

better part of a decade. I have Unfortunately the answer to that worked as an agent as well as a training and development manager on the Gold Coast. I still run training and mentoring sessions for agents in a quest to help them to become what I call a Real

Estate Athlete - a top performer. But I started off as an auctioneer, which is quite uncommon; most auctioneers start as agents. As you mentioned, I have worked in the entertainment industry. One day, prior to my working in real estate, I attended a very boring auction. The auctioneer was extremely monotone and displayed no enthusiasm. I thought to myself 'I can do that better. I can make it exciting.' So that's what I set out to do. And I became an auctioneer.

Is it unusual for an auctioneer to have previous entertainment experience? How has it been an advantage?

question is 'yes'. I think most auctioneers take themselves too seriously. They can come across a bit robotic. I see some young auctioneers talk as if they are scripted and they don't allow their

own personalities to shine. They don't connect with the crowd. I have been fortunate enough to have worked with crowds from all walks of life; from 5000 people at a kickboxing event to 50 people in a nightclub. Twenty years of working with different types of crowds has given me the advantage of being able to connect better. I believe connection is the key. And because auction day is show day, the auctioneer needs to be a good showman. An auction should be professional yet fun at the same time. Buyers do not bid when they are stressed. So my job is to make them feel comfortable and relaxed in order to make that bid.

I understand you moved from the Gold Coast. What drew you to this area?

I have been visiting Byron for the past 12 years or so. I love the energy, the more relaxed approach to life, the concern for the environment, and the way people are more open and accepting; it's grounding. My wife lived here for a while and moved to the Gold Coast to live with me when we decided to move in together before we married. Having our son has made us look at our lives differently. We wanted the best possible environment for him to grow. Byron Bay was the answer. I've brought my longboard, my skateboard and my cruiser; I intend to soak up the atmosphere and take my son for rides everywhere. I have also just finished my first book and am in the process of writing the next, with another few planned. What better place to get the creative juices flowing than Byron! Also one of my best friends for the past 20 years is the minister at one of the local churches here. I have moved into the same street where he lives. Everything is just falling into place.

Do you agree there is a very different ethos here than from the Gold Coast, and if so, what is it?

The culture of Byron is definitely different from that of the Gold Coast. It's the energy, the mindset of the people, in fact all the things that drew me to this area in the first place. There is a vibrancy here that is infectious. As far as real estate goes I find that the selling process is basically the same, but the difference is in the people.

The NSW planning & infrastructure minister Brad Hazzard has listened to the outrage expressed by farmers across the north coast regarding the Draft Local Environmental Plan (LEP). 'Since our last public meeting, hundreds of complaints have been received by local and state politicians on this issue. It just goes to show what people can achieve if they come together and support their community', said Rex Harris, Alli Page and Louise Savrda. 'The fight is not over yet. We still have a lot of work to do and all landholders need to remain active and review and respond to the Draft LEP. But this is one big step in the right direction for all of us'.

The NSW Government has said 'more consultation is needed' and Byron Shire Mayor Simon Richardson has said that the 'LEP is a draft document and changes can be expected'. Change will not happen unless the council and the government are convinced that it is warranted.

A general public meeting will be held on Wednesday 26 September, 6.30pm at the Bangalow Bowling Club. All Byron Shire rural landholders are invited to come and hear what they must do to ensure the state government continues to support changes to the Draft LEP to meet the needs of our farmers and rural landholders.

ENVIRONMENTAL E2 AND E3 ZONES TO BE REVIEWED IN NORTH COAST LEPs

Minister for Planning and Infrastructure Brad Hazzard yesterday met with Ballina MP and Minister for North Coast Don Page and Lismore MP Thomas George to discuss their concerns about environmental zonings being applied to agricultural land.

Today Minister Hazzard announced the Government would not endorse the use of E2 and E3 environmental zones on land that is clearly rural in council local environmental plans (LEPs) on the Far North Coast.

Instead, areas proposed to be covered by these zones would be excised from the plans while the Department of Planning and Infrastructure reviews the use of these controls in consultation with other government agencies and stakeholders.

Minister Page said this approach would apply to LEPs in the Ballina and Byron council areas in his electorate. Mr George said he was happy the same would apply for the LEPs in Lismore, Kyogle and Tweed.

"These proposed zones and overlays have the potential to limit existing agricultural and other rural uses without a valid evidence base," Mr Page said.

"There are also very strong concerns that these restrictive controls could reduce the value of existing properties.

"The NSW Government will act to ensure the rights of existing landowners are protected.

"The Government will now review the suitability of these controls, whilst still providing appropriate protection for the environment."

A number of LEPs in the region have been exhibited for public comment and are expected to come to the State Government shortly for approval.

Minister Hazzard said that any E2 or E3 zoned land in these draft plans would be excised when the LEPs are finalised. Similarly, any proposed environmental overlays on land that is clearly rural would be removed.

"Local environmental plans establish good land use planning principles for the entire council area and it's important that planning for other uses such new housing and employment generation can go ahead while this issue is being resolved," Mr Hazzard said.

"However, this Government is not going to stop farmers and other existing landowners from carrying on their businesses through overly restrictive environmental zones."
