

NSW Coalition unveils its plans to develop

Planning review on the table: public meeting June 12

The Environmental Defenders Office (EDO) has blasted the NSW government's White Paper as a 'significant step backwards for environmental and social considerations', but if you believe the government's hype, it will mean an easing of red tape to encourage as much economic growth as possible.

The glossy and somewhat repetitive 214 page document is the government's vision for a new planning system and is now up for public discussion at www.planning.nsw.gov.au.

It comes as Byron Council holds a public information session with staff on Wednesday June 12 from 5.30pm at the Mullumbimby Chambers.

As one of the few independent voices that has analysed the document, the EDO has published its critique at www.edo.org.au. Among its observations is that, 'the language throughout the White Paper consistently prioritises growth and economic considerations, instead of a truly integrated focus on the legally recognised principles of ecologically sustainable development.'

EDO's senior solicitor Ian Ratcliff told *The Echo* the government's claims of a simpler process is ridiculous. 'Instead of simplifying the process, it has added another level of complexity,' he said.

'The paper attempts to portray competing [zoning] uses as a positive thing,' says Ratcliff. 'It's counter-intuitive to have different land uses close to each other. It poses potential conflicts in land uses.'

Meanwhile, Caroline Joseph from the Bellingen Environment Centre told *The Echo* she staged a stunt at the public meetings after concerns about the lack of public participation in the process. She and a handful of others turned up to the public meetings with

tape around their mouths. 'We will lose 80 per cent of our right to appeal,' she said. 'After we went through the White Paper we realised there aren't many changes from the [previous] Green Paper. There are omissions for heritage protection, koala protections have been removed, and as for community participation? "Community" is defined as industry, business and residents.

'The minister will appoint four people from each local shire from the "community". They will set the ground rules for local evidence based strategic plans. We had an industry here wanting to put 2000 cows 80 metres from a river bank. After 1000 submissions to council it was stopped. If those industries fit into the codes, there will be no right to comment.'

The White Paper also proposes continuing with the Planning Assessment Commission (PAC) and expanding the number of Joint Regional Planning Panels (JRPP) to decide controversial developments. 'Regional planning will be led by the department of planning and infrastructure, partnering with relevant state agencies and local councils.' Submissions close June 28.

What's an EDO?

The Environmental Defenders Office (EDO) is a community legal centre specialising in 'public interest environmental law' and is one of the few independent voices in government policy. Its main source of funding is from the Public Purpose Fund of the Law Society of NSW (PPF), and after attacks from the state government and *The Australian* newspaper last year, the EDO says funding was reduced by 'about 27 per cent in 2013.'

Aquarius restaurant/bar shuts after OLGR sting

The restaurant and bar at the Aquarius backpackers hostel has voluntarily closed after they claim undercover officers from The Office of Liquor, Gaming and Racing (OLGR) entrapped the establishment in a licensing sting.

Twenty staff will lose their jobs and, 'another 15 to 20 jobs will be affected indirectly, including security, cleaners and suppliers,' says the director and secretary of Sixth Lafite Pty Ltd, who owns the Aquarius Restaurant Bar.

Dr Harry Chua released a statement on Sunday night insisting that the restaurant/bar had not broken any NSW licensing laws.

He says the licence allows them

to serve liquor when meals are provided. 'On the night of June 8, 2013, undercover officers from OLGR came into our premises, and purchased a light meal from the BBQ. They had their wrist stamped and proceeded to purchase alcohol.'

'Apparently we did the wrong thing as they had not eaten their meal. Besides the fact that this is entrapment, the legislation says that meals are to be "provided", It doesn't say "consumed".'

'In any case, to get our staff to monitor whether meals being purchased are actually eaten, whether food is spat out or swallowed is going beyond their job description.'

He says the pressure put on Aquarius staff and management to monitor food consumption is 'unfair, too onerous and creates substantial stress and is ultimately untenable.'

'Sixth Lafite Pty Ltd will shortly apply for a primary service of alcohol (PSA) license. While we wait for the approval, Aquarius Restaurant Bar will cease trading on June 17, 2013 indefinitely.'

'It is also unfortunate that with the closure of our bar/restaurant, we will not have the staff and security to monitor the alcohol consumption of the 160 backpackers (soon to be 304) who reside here.'

Ocean Shores declares – Mullum next

Despite the inclement weather about 150 residents of Ocean Shores and surrounds participated in the CSG declaration ceremony at the Ocean Shores Public School, declaring the area gasfield free.

Setting the mood for the event were Methane Mike and two local community choirs: The Peace Choir and The Raise The Roof Choir, who sung CSG free songs.

After passing the scrolled declaration for each of the villages of Ocean Shores, New Brighton, North Ocean Shores and South Golden Beach from back to front, members of three generations of each area presented their scroll to mayor Simon Richardson.

95.2 per cent CSG free

'2620 houses in 147 streets were surveyed by 125 volunteers,' said co-ordinator Shelley Breda. 'It was a mammoth task.'

Another co-ordinator, Vivien Royston, told *The Echo*, 'To the question, "Do you want your street to remain gasfield

free, a resounding 95.2 per cent replied "Yes".

'This is the largest residential area in the Byron Shire to be surveyed to date,' she added.

Mayor Richardson congratulated the volunteers, noting that they have 'enjoyed getting to know and engage with your neighbours.'

'It's important to look positively too, at what we want to

be... we should be an area and a nation which is filled with alternate energy, not dinosaur energy.' He also said that it was important to stay connected and vigilant as this is just the beginning.

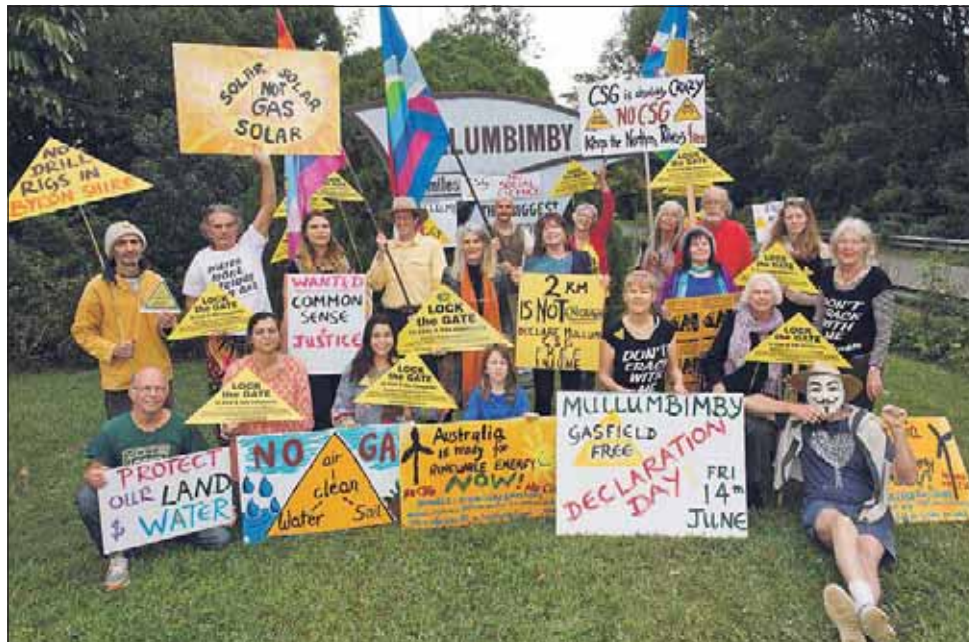
The Aboriginal Land Council and Dart Energy both hold licences over the northern rivers region. Dart Energy has suspended their operations

but has not withdrawn their licence. Despite the tight economic situation, local businesses and practitioners donated raffle prizes worth over \$1500.

Now the community is looking forward to erecting signs at the entrances to the areas surveyed declaring the area gasfield free. The day concluded with a wonderful concert by local musicians.

Surfer on life support

A man is on life support at Tweed Hospital after a surfing accident at Byron Bay Sunday afternoon.

The man, aged in his 30s, from the Gold Coast, was surfing at The Pass when he was dragged from the water unconscious.

Witnesses say he was hit by a surfboard but it is unknown whether it was his own or another surfer's.

The man's wife and three young children are believed to have watched as an off-duty paramedic at the scene conducted CPR on the man on the beach until other paramedics arrived.

Belongil rock wall cashed up by state

This week's announcement by the state government to provide \$300,000 for a rock wall at Belongil Beach has left some residents dumbfounded, Byron Shire Council in the dark, and the state Greens fuming that the coalition has 'burnt' the money on behalf of a handful of rich landowners.

Critics say this will permanently damage Byron Bay's popular beaches and further erode the foreshore.

The Greens are scathing of the funding, saying proper process has not been followed in the surprise decision by minister for the north coast Don Page and environment minister Robyn Parker announced during a visit to Byron Bay the previous weekend.

Minister Parker told *The Echo* that the funding came from the The NSW Coastal Management Program, which is administered by the Office of Environment and Heritage.

When asked why the rocks would be approved without consideration for environmental impacts, her office replied, 'Until [Byron] Council finalises its coastal zone management plan, approval for coastal protection works under the SEPP (state environmental planning policy) requires that for works carried out by or on behalf of a public authority, the public authority must notify the Coastal Panel before carrying out the development and take into consideration any response re-

ceived from the Coastal Panel within 21 days of the notification. Byron Council has not yet referred this proposal to the NSW Coastal Panel.

But Greens MP Cate Faehrmann says the decision not only overturns the 30-year policy of planned retreat which has survived numerous court challenges, but raises questions about the general issue of political donations by property developers and business people.

21 houses and public property at risk

She says the rock walls, 'promise to deplete the sand on Byron's beautiful beaches just to benefit a small number of property owners.'

And Byron Council's gen-

eral manager Ken Gainger says council doesn't know how the remaining cost of the protection works will be funded, nor a total cost, and the works will also need an environmental review under state policy before they even start.

In the announcement, Mr Page said Belongil Beach was a coastal erosion 'hotspot with 21 houses currently at risk from coastal erosion during severe storms'. *The Echo* understands there is also Council-owned property at risk.

Mr Page said the funding would 'enable the use of rocks as an alternative to the existing geobags' for the protection of the Manfred Street public access area on Belongil Spit. The geobags, currently in place at the three Belongil public beach accesses, were installed by council at the end of 2001 and repaired after wild storms in 2009.

No details yet

But in a press release Friday, Byron Shire Council said it had 'yet to receive details' on the funding announcement for the works at Manfred Street.

GM Mr Gainger said council applied for the funding in April this year 'in order to provide resilient interim protection from coastal erosion at the site, along with safe public access'. He said the grant application included

around 110 linear metres of rock/hard interim protection works, dune revegetation and beach access at Manfred Street and that a preliminary design options report was being prepared and expected for council deliberation later this month.

'Until a preferred design option is chosen, council does not have a total cost for the works or any information on how the remaining cost of the works will be funded,' Mr Gainger said.

He said the 'unknown element' at this stage was the conditions applying for the funding, and when that was known, a work plan would be finalised and submitted to the Office of Environment and Heritage for approval. Council is aiming to have the design and approvals process completed by the end of August 2013, but this is dependent on factors such as funding arrangements and obtaining feedback from agencies and stakeholders,' he said.

'The works will also require a Review of Environmental Factors (REF) once the final designs are completed.'

He added that in the six years since his company purchased and ran the business, they have never had any alcohol-related violence or problems due to the good work of management, staff and security.

'We all take our duty of care and responsible service of alcohol seriously. And on top of that we close before midnight.

'We now have no way to monitor the alcohol consumption of the backpackers, who may well go back to the old days of drinking in their rooms and the common areas of the hostel then proceed to party on in Jonson Street.'

OLGR could not be contacted for comment as it was a public holiday and Dr Chua's statement was released Sunday.

Medical cannabis 'hero' released

North coast man Tony Bower, hailed a hero around Australia for supplying free medicinal cannabis tincture to sufferers of terminal and other illnesses, will continue to seek government approval of his medication after an appeal judge last week ordered his release from jail where he was serving a 12-month sentence.

Mr Bower had been held in custody in a Kempsey correctional centre for six weeks after a magistrate in April jailed him for growing the cannabis for his tincture, despite his lodging an immediate appeal against the sentence, which carried a nine-month non-parole period.

Supporters of Mr Bower, 56, who were outraged at the jail term, yesterday welcomed the 'commonsense' decision by a

Port Macquarie District Court judge to suspend the 12-month jail sentence and place him on a 12-month good-behaviour bond. Ironically, while Mr Bower was held in custody, a NSW Upper House inquiry last month recommended the government legalise the medicinal use of cannabis.

Mr Bower was charged after a police raid on his Mullaway property last year, which netted around 200 hemp plants earmarked for production of the medical tincture to distribute free to cancer sufferers and others with medical certificates.

From Mullum to Miami: how a high school dropout took on the world

Adolescents are told that staying in school is the only way they'll achieve their goals. But that's not necessarily true, in fact there are many stories that contradict rigid educational compliance as the only recipe for success, and perhaps it's the aberrant thinker, the person who sits firmly outside the square, who has what it takes to do something extraordinary.



Let's take for example 15-year-old Amethyst Kelly, a Mullumbimby girl who dropped out of high school because she felt 'discouraged to stay'.

Seven years on she's known by her stage name Iggy Azalea, a model (signed as the new face of Levi jeans) and a hip hop artist signed to Island Def Jam and Mercury Records.

In her Youtube video *Work* - which has over 12 million hits btw - Iggy tells her gutsy story. 'No money, no family, sixteen in the middle of Miami'.

A very young and idealistic girl saved money cleaning hotel rooms to go to the US on a holiday with friends, and then once in the US she rings her parents to let them know she's not coming back.

That's not just crazy. That's terrifying. A lot of young people at this age can't even change a toilet roll.

This was the beginning of making what would have appeared to any school guidance counsellor as a ludicrous dream a reality.

For Iggy, hip hop was a passion that went to the core. 'I'm not sure exactly what it was,' she says. 'I think some things, especially the ones you have passion for are not always easily explained or even logical.'

'Rap music just called my name louder than other styles.'

Iggy discovered her passion for rap around 14. 'I would take the bus to Lismore or fly to Sydney to meet other kids that were into rap music too.'

'I didn't finish school. But I got my GED in America two years ago.'

A young woman hellbent on pushing the boundaries and redefining old ideals it's radical to see her front and centre in a genre that prefers men. Usually black men. Black American Men. Somehow a little (well not so little she's almost six foot) white girl from Mullumbimby has smashed her way into the arena.

Iggy is philosophical about how she went from being broke and illegal, to spearheading an impressive career.

'I'm addicted to my passion'

'It's having something that people are interested in hearing that is the difficult thing and why many people go unnoticed. I don't think race is a hindrance when it comes to being heard. Picking the right words is the hard part.'

So does she identify herself as a feminist? Usually 'hot' girls like her with great booties are in the background doing the back-up vocals.

'I suppose some may argue I am a feminist. For some reason the word feminist makes stupid people think I have hairy underarms and hate men so in an attempt to remain likeable to them, I just describe myself as someone sick of stereotypes and gender roles in the media.'

'I feel lack of variety in the characters we are force-fed results in more small minded thinking.'

She credits the internet and her passion as being the two forces that have been the most

influential in her meteoric rise to the lady rapper hall of fame.

'I'm addicted to my passion' she says, 'I couldn't help but keep going. It's all that makes me happy.'

A powerful role model for other kids who don't fit easily in the system, Iggy credits her father as influencing her mindset.

'My edge is a result of being influenced by my father's love of great creative thinkers. I was someone who always felt very alone. I had to make my way front and centre so I could find like-minded people and have companionship. In my search for these things, I realised how many other young people feel the way I felt - and so my drive has changed and I'm now motivated by them. I'm trying to inspire them and make them feel comfortable to be themselves.'

Wow. Now that's a girl who's got herself sorted. She's a role model for all those other girls feeling disconnected and looked over to find their passion, get a dream, and like Iggy, start working on your shit.

Yes we scan

It's now official but no surprise: your online activities are being watched, logged and your data is being mined by the Obama US government. Though it was always assumed, it's important to ask what this means since our personal lives (mostly/somewhat) revolve around technology.

Prism is program inherited from George W Bush after 9/11, and according to the *New York Times*, the big tech companies coordinate with the NSA (National Security Agency) and FBI.

Google which owns YouTube, Microsoft which owns Hotmail and Skype, Yahoo, Facebook, AOL and more recently Apple have been allowing the government to keep tabs on us. This includes emails, videos, online chats, photos and search queries. Micro-blog/social media site Twitter may be the lone ranger in not acquiescing to government demands so readily but its involvement is still unclear.

It comes after revelations by *The Guardian* that US telephone calls are being logged (not recorded). We are told by the US president that 'modest encroachments on privacy' are needed to combat terrorism, and just like in Orwell's dystopian *1984*, there is little information available as to why our privacy needs to be encroached upon. Or why government agencies need an open cheque book to fight terrorism. Or how to define terrorism when we cause it.

Unfortunately this news will likely lead to further government secrecy and 'terrorists' will adopt more elaborate ways of remaining untraceable.

Presently it's not hard to figure out how to be untraceable – online anonymity can be achieved by using TOR (The Onion Ring). It's a free browser enabling users to communicate anonymously on the internet.

Unlike a browser (software), it may be more difficult to remain anonymous with hardware manufacturers like Apple and Samsung. Anyway you can get TOR at www.torproject.org, but you may have to be quick – the Australian government wants it shut down according to *Crikey*. Bernard Keane wrote just two weeks ago, 'The attorney-general's department... has systematically and aggressively expanded the powers of intelligence and law enforcement agencies.'

Here's another tip before fascism is officially declared: it's well known within cyber-security circles that the general public's phone calls are almost impossible to record at present; however text messages can be retrieved easily.

Just saying.

The US was founded on the belief that government can't ever be trusted. It's about time Australia woke up too – our government operates in just about the same way.

Labor backbenchers go freaky and feral

It's time to trot out, yet again, that much-used quotation from W B Yeats:

Things fall apart, the centre cannot hold;

Mere anarchy is loosed upon the world...

Well, if not upon the world, at least upon the ALP. And perhaps it's about time, because the idea of tightly held controls centred on Julia Gillard's office has demonstrably failed. And belatedly some back benchers – at least those who still believe they have a hope of surviving the impending tsunami – have decided that they might as well ignore them and try doing their own thing. After all, what have they got to lose?

In fact the process started some time ago as the members began designing their local campaigns and more particularly the material they will distribute to their constituents. And much of it was conspicuous by an absence of any reference to the ALP and more particularly to Gillard. As with the government's attempt to solve the asylum seeker problem by excising Australia from itself as a migration zone, the canny polities are excising themselves from their party and its leader.

Many have gone so far as to attempt to remove any trace of Labor taint by altering the colour scheme of their handouts. Admittedly it's a while since the people's flag was deepest red; over the years the ALP's colours have morphed into the patriotic red, white and blue. But this year even the remnant red is frequently being discarded in favour of an all-over conservative blue.

Head office is obviously unhappy at the trend, but has refrained from intervening, partly because it is effectively powerless to do so, but more importantly because it obviously does not want to make

the mild rebellion a public controversy. But there is less insouciance about the sudden outbreak of independence in the hothouse of Canberra, as parliament enters its last weeks of sitting before the start of what is now called the campaign proper – which will still stretch for a mind-numbing 12 weeks instead of the normal three or four.

The trouble started in the

referring to the daily talking points sheet issued by the prime minister's office (PMO). This was originally intended as an aid for members in case they were confronted by voters or media about the principal issues in the news: it provided a bit of background and made a few suggestions about lines they might use. It was basically a good idea, but like so many good ideas it

The cost of rocking the coastline

■ The announcement of a grant of \$300K by Don Page and the accident-prone Robyn Parker for rock works on Belongil beach leaves quite a few questions to be answered.

Is this unusual largesse merely a means to get Parker's otherwise-untargeted visit some publicity?

Is it some form of repayment for the intense lobbying by the Belongil property owners, of whom some may also be political donors?

Or more sinisterly, is it an indication that the state government is about to waive the statutory and environmental requirements for such projects and 'just do it'?

As the phone-booth-full of informed council watchers and even some councillors will know, the GM has been tasked

with examining the feasibility and advisability of such works.

His brief includes finding the money, which should include subsequent removal of the 'temporary' rocks, getting approvals from a myriad of government agencies and bringing it back to council if the Coastal Panel does not give its support.

As someone very familiar with the costs of council projects I know that the \$300K will go nowhere near the amount required (for instance there is unlikely to be any change from \$50K for the consultant's report alone) and that still leaves the GM with the other difficult tasks – unless someone overrides the law and the council resolution.

Interestingly, Cr Woods has put up two notices of motion

on this subject; the first is a 'motherhood' plea to revisit the urgency of coastal erosion – to which she should have known the answers. The second is to expedite the Belongil rock works. As she voted for the current resolution and presumably understands what she has agreed to, does it indicate prior knowledge of the \$300K and a desire to give a helping hand to the Belongil lobby?

Draft LEP

I'm told that at the late June meeting of council Ray Darney will be presenting his report concerning rural issues in the

Draft LEP. Mr Darney says that only two submissions were received specifically on the subject of the Rural Strategy and its translation into the LEP. This confirms my suspicion that the E-zone controversy distracted rural landowners from future land-release issues such as multiple occupancy and community title – in other words affordable housing.

Certainly I myself became aware of Mr Darney's proposed changes after it was too late to make a public submission. This could be partly the result of Council specifically voting in April 2009 not to inform me of any proposed changes (as recommended to Council by Mr Darney), but let's face it: we're all too busy to notice everything that goes on.

Anyway, while the formal submission period is over, there is nothing to prevent councillors from taking into account information received at a later date. Councillors will be voting on June 28 as to whether to make changes to the Draft LEP or whether to ratify what

Mr Darney has already put forward, so people who have something to say about Mr Darney's proposals still have the opportunity to get off their arses and write to council or to specific councillors.

When David Kanaley drew up the Rural Strategy in 1997–8 he widely consulted with community groups before he formulated the draft version, which then went out for further public comment. In other words he talked to a lot of people. Mr Darney, by contrast, appears to have talked only to himself. I wonder whether any elected councillor will have the cojones to say 'This is not good enough', demand some answers from Mr Darney and throw the whole thing open again.

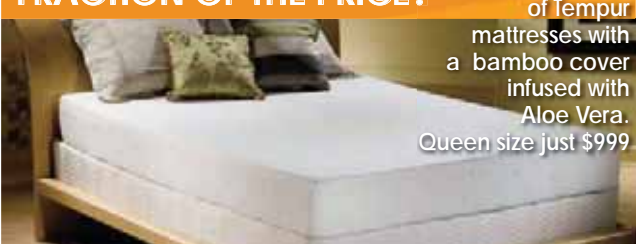

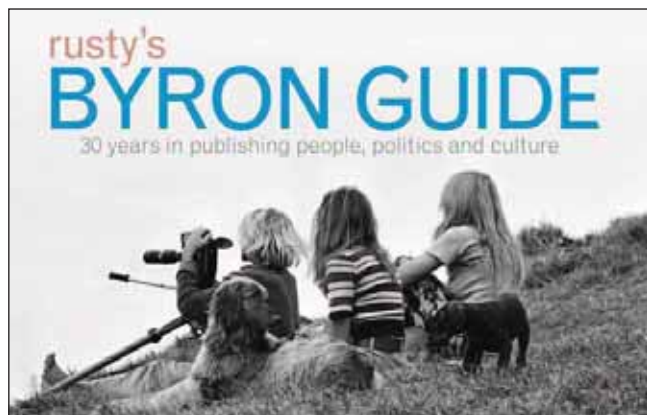

Developing capacity

awareness and creativity. Sure, these skills can be nurtured by reading texts, but they also need to be put into creative practice, not just used for critical analysis.

Why? Because the public is more likely to respond to an artwork or a novel or a piece of music informed by ecological thinking than to a theoretical essay about art, novels or music. And the artwork might then inspire them to read the essay. In line with David Orr's assertion that 'all education is environmental education', Timothy Morton argues that all art is essentially ecological. So if we want to be ecological, we should be more like teachers and artists.

Flawed study

The rail study into the Casino to Murwillumbah rail line recently released by the O'Farrell

government raises some very important questions and the community deserves answers.

Why does the 'study' not mention the transport needs of the population of almost 8,000 people north of the Brunswick River, who have little access to public transport, but are close to the Billinudgel train station? Or the 1.5 million tourists?

Why does the 'study' give costings for a heavy rail service when the north coast community has been asking for, and promised, a light commuter service on the line for almost a decade?

Does the state government really expect us to believe the cost to repair the Casino to Murwillumbah line for a commuter service (50 per cent of which is in reasonable condition despite criminal lack of maintenance) has increased from \$30m in 2004 to over \$900m, which is more than the \$1.1 billion it cost to build the completely new 155km of

heavy freight line between Sydney and Newcastle?

Queensland has a population almost half that of NSW, so how are they able to electrify their main line all the way to Rockhampton, rebuild the Brisbane to Gold Coast line, which they ripped up in the 1960s, and build a new light rail service (with \$365m of federal government money) from Surfers to Coolangatta, but NSW politicians can't get trains running on the line we have? Why haven't they been able to get the \$150m of federal funding promised in 2004 for this much-needed service?

Why does the 'study' recommend major roads be upgraded to try and alleviate traffic congestion (no costings given but experts claim will cost billions) rather than recommending a few million be spent on a commuter train service?

Why are small towns in the Hunter Valley, similar distances from Sydney as we are from Brisbane, serviced by regular commuter train services to the city, but the north coast isn't connected to our closest city?

Why does the 'study' not mention the rising cost of oil and petrol Or even hint that we should be planning for a world where oil is a rare commodity and too expensive to put in our cars?

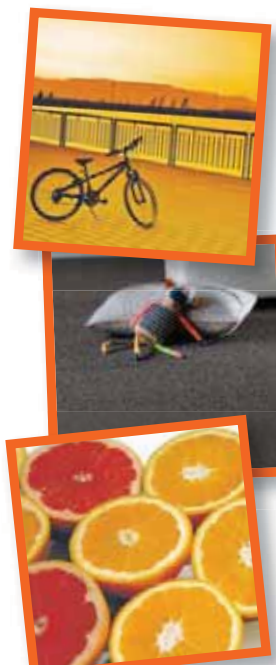

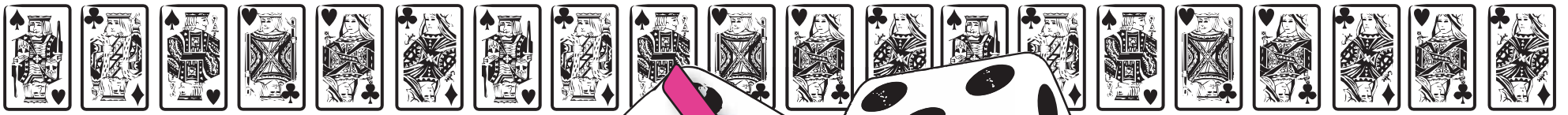

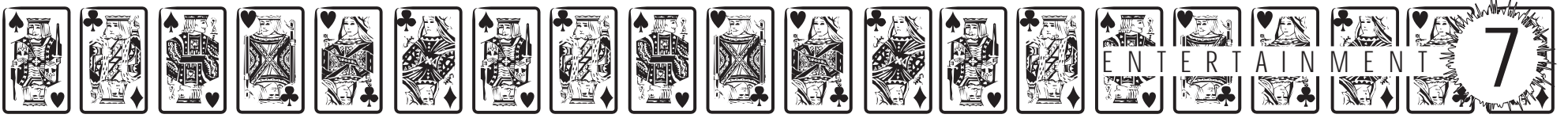

When I see my neighbour's washing on the line in the sprinkling rain, I really should get it off. That guy on the side of the road that looks like he hasn't had a bath in three weeks, well I should give him a lift and a few bucks. I should ask him home for a shower. I should let him move in.

Oh, if I had the time I could be so much nicer. I'd volunteer for canteen. Every day. I'd make cupcakes for the homeless. I'd force my way into aged care facilities and demand to be let paint the old ladies' toenails. I'd plant trees. I'd volunteer to collect money for Amnesty. I'd travel to

detention centres and teach the kids to read and write, and how to swear like a real Aussie. I'd let people take my spot in the bank queue. I'd give up my parking spot.

Which brings me to what I didn't do the other day. I was having a shit morning. We were out of food, so I didn't have any lunch stuff for the kids. The heel on my shoe broke. The cheque that was supposed to be in my bank wasn't. The Optus account that was overdue was supposed to be paid with the cheque that wasn't in the bank. My son hid behind the couch and jumped out and scared me. I started crying, clutching my chest going 'Charlie if you scare someone with a heart condition it's murder!' My heart condition isn't that serious, it just sounded intense.

We were late for school. I'm driving into Mullum, with Charlie already an hour late for school. I haven't washed my hair. I am informed I have a photo shoot that afternoon. Great. I look like a bag woman. I have put on another kilo. I doubt I'll get a park. I don't believe it. There in front of the IGA is a woman pulling out. Not just a woman, but my friend Leisa who is as crazy, as time poor and at times as perplexed with the nice challenge as I am (although she always manages to make food for soup kitchen or drop off a lasagne if you're feeling poorly) so she has the 'nice person' advantage. She also does a lot of volunteer work. Actually she's a lot nicer than me.

Anyway she doesn't see me so I pull into the car space relieved that for the first time this morning something has gone right. Twenty metres down the road is an angry woman in a little white car having some

sort of mute arm flailing conniption. She's pointing in my direction. Her blinker is on. Oh I get it. I've taken her park. Although I don't think backing into oncoming traffic is entirely legal. Once you've gone past the park, technically it's a forfeit.

I reverse. Then I think 'Fuck you Lady. I'm having a fucked day.' Then I give her the finger and drive back in. 'Go to Woolies if you want a park,' I yell at her as she gives me a fiery look and storms off. I feel good and bad at the same time. Sure I was assertive but I was also an arsehole. What does she expect, time poor people are arseholes. It's easy for the Dalai Lama to be such a fricking saint, he has nothing to do. He doesn't have a mortgage. Or kids. Or Optus giving him shit.

Actually today I am not a nice person. I reckon I would have mowed down a disabled person if I thought they were taking too long on the crossing. I don't want to be a prick. But I guess I don't have a choice. I drive to school. I get out and there she is. The woman who I gave the finger to only minutes before. 'I think that's my relief teacher,' groans Charlie. 'Don't worry,' I say. 'Just tell her your mum's a bitch. She'll be nice to you. She's obviously not as busy as me.' Then I drive off and realise I've left the lunchbox on the roof of the car. Too bad. I'll be nice tomorrow.

CHESS by Ian Rogers

Play at Byron Services Club, Mon 7pm

Cheating in chess won't go away.

The story so far: Boris Ivanov, for many years a modestly rated amateur, suddenly starts beating Grandmasters at tournament after tournament. Analysis of his games shows an abnormally high match with computer moves, yet close observation and partial strip searches reveal nothing. Even a CAT scan and x-rays, which he voluntarily underwent, found no evidence of computers planted in Ivanov's head or body.

When opponents refused to compete against Ivanov or withdrew from events where he was on the playing list, he responded with 'Grandmasters do not want to recognise me as a good player. Most of them are washed-up arseholes.'

Having no smoking gun evidence, the Bulgarian chess federation has banned Ivanov for his bad language (!), a ban which is under appeal in the courts.

Given the incontrovertible nature of the statistical evidence, it seems that Ivanov has developed an undetectable method of cheating at tournament chess, and the

consequences are massive.

Firstly, Ivanov may choose to give or sell his method to any player he chooses – and indeed speculation is rife that Ivanov's public media outbursts are designed as much to publicise his achievement as to protest his innocence.

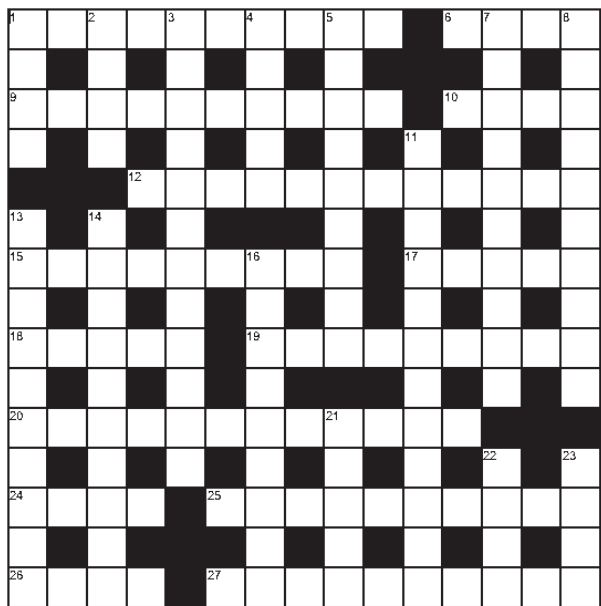
Secondly, a stronger player would be able to pick and choose which computer suggestions he or she followed, with the result that the only method currently available of assessing whether or not a player is getting computer assistance would no longer be of use.

Thirdly, and most perniciously, every unexpected outstanding performance will now be viewed with scepticism – just as every world record shattered by an athlete may generate suspicions of better drugs rather than superior athletic talent.

One may expect that the court will clear Ivanov to play, given that recent cases in Europe have all gone on favour of the players caught cheating.

The world body FIDE has set up an anti-cheating committee, but it has a big job ahead; at the moment, the bad guys are winning.

Drawing into Wet Paint by artist Michael Chapus is about process particularly in relation to experience and memory - literally drawing into wet paint (using sticks, brushes, fingernails etc) to record his experiences while walking.

Homage by Bronwyn Russell-Collins is a collection of assembled collaged inspired by Rosalie Gascoigne subtle patterns in nature. *Inter-connected* is an exhibition exploring life and a connection to the natural environment by Jacqueline King and Leah Thiessen. The exhibitions continue until 23 June.

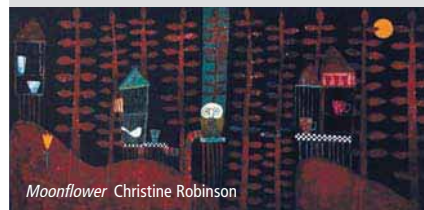

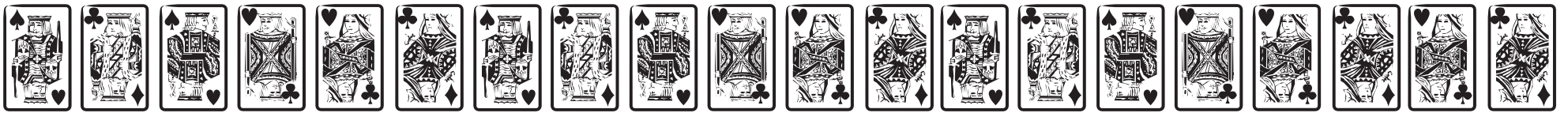

Cinema review

Drift



We're forever being told by art doyens that Australians (like any other people) love seeing their own stories on the screen. So how come when a cracking good local movie like this comes along, one that uniquely belongs to 'us', it sinks without trace? Compare its dismal box-office fate with the runaway success of the dreadfully unfunny *A Few Best Men*, which was no more than a crass copycat rom-com cast from an imported template, with an overseas star thrown in to give it legs. Weep for the

Oz film industry. This opens in Sydney, 1960, as Kat Kelly (Robyn Malcolm) flees her abusive husband. Taking her two sons, she heads west to settle in a coastal town in the Margaret River region. The action then jumps to 1972, by which time the boys, Andy (Myles Pollard) and Jimmy (Xavier Samuel), have grown up to be surf-rats. The shot in which the kid Jimmy is engulfed by a wave only to re-emerge, still on his board, as the flamboyant teenager takes us from the past to the present,

from B&W into colour – and it's spine-tingling. The siblings' relationship is at the film's core, with Andy ambitious and responsible, and the younger, headstrong Jimmy always likely to run off the rails. When the hippy JB (Sam Worthington) turns up in his merry prangster bus, with the Hawaiian beauty Lani (Lesley-Ann Brandt) under his wing, stuff starts to happen. Directors Ben Nott and Morgan O'Neill sensibly don't shy away from the drug culture that so permeated their subjects' lifestyle, as prejudice and crime

force idealism to come to terms with pragmatism. There is a tendency – it's rampant these days – to over-use pop songs to create mood, and sometimes the words get in the way as dialogue gets clunky and needlessly declamatory, but the performances are ingrained with a true understanding of the characters, the period is recreated with affection rather than condescension and Geoffrey Hall's camera is always exhilarating in a surf movie that rises above its genre. ~ **John Campbell**

Fast And Furious 6

It occurred to me that, having now seen all six of this godawful franchise, half a day of the time allotted me in this vale of tears has been squandered in watching mind-bludgeoning stupidity. And there is a seventh coming, for we are told as much in the final scene when new tough guy on the block, Jason Statham,

kills one of the gang of good-guy hoons (all of whom, I'll wager, would go to water if thrown into the fray of State of Origin). Vin Diesel, lured out of a retirement that entails shagging curvaceous blondes in a palm-shaded seaside casa, is back to counter the threat to world peace posed by the villain Shaw. If not an actor in the Shakespearean mould, Diesel is commendable at doing smouldering anger and delivering lines of up to nearly nine words, if not very quickly. The plot is only there to enable yet another car pile-up, fist-fight or shoot-out, while Vin's bullet-proof crew are as cool as all get-out. But the star of the show is Dwayne Johnson. I can't put my finger on why I like him, but, as Hobbs, the Interpol cop, he displays the attractive quality of a bloke who simply cannot believe that he's going to get a squillion bucks for pretending to be a boys' own hero. In an array of spray-on T-shirts that expose arms so massive that he can get them no closer than 45 degrees to



his similarly pumped torso, a smirk never seems far from his face and it is this hint of levity that makes him so much more tolerable than the dangerously deluded Diesel – the thought that Johnson might actually believe the tripe does not bear consideration. The cinematography and stunts are sensational, as they should be for \$160 million, with not one but two screeching chases that beat hands down the effort of Bruce 'the Bruiser' Willis in a semi on a turnpike in *Die Hard 4*. I left with a drumming pain behind my right eye. ~ **John Campbell**

Echo TV guide to go

For 27 years we've been publishing a free TV guide in *The Echo*, and more recently online at echonetdaily.net.au. This shire has never been in love with commercial TV and radio. Some people do not own a TV, and many only watch the ABC or listen to Bay FM and the ABC.

Over that period, like it or not, there have been many changes. The number of channels in our guide has increased from two to fifteen, and with the advent of digital TV everyone who feels like watching TV can now see what's on and what's coming up, by clicking their remote. Those who wish to scour the TV landscape ahead of time can access that information online, even on their mobile phone. Our guide, typeset over a week in advance, cannot keep up with daily changes to schedules over fifteen stations.

Surveys of the area show that those who do watch commercial TV don't watch it for very many hours per week. As a result of all these factors, our TV guide provides a lot of information that people just don't want or need anymore. It takes time to craft it, and it

takes up a lot of space in the paper.

At the same time, while big media companies are producing content that is increasingly generic and banal, the overwhelming preference of *Echo* readers is to see more quality, local, independent news. You are disappointed when we don't report on your community event in sufficient depth, or you would like to see us raise the standard of our investigative journalism. You kindly encourage us to 'get the facts right for once, you morons', and would probably prefer to see our time and effort go into reporting actual news and community events rather than producing TV guides.

We understand that this change won't suit everyone. Some people will be disappointed and inconvenienced when, next week, we remove the TV guide as part of a general revamp of our 'look'. Sugar sugar

I can remain silent no longer. If I come across the words Sugar Is Poison one more time I may even scream: this whole business has gone too far. Recently I read that, out of the top sellers in non-fiction books, 12 out of 15 were related to food (which is fine by me, having long shared the universal fascination); 9 were related to diets (not fine) and those in positions 3 and 4 were, respectively, *I Quit Sugar* by Sarah Wilson and *The Sweet Poison Quit Plan Cookbook* by David Gillespie.

These anti-sugar crusaders are militant and fanatical and extreme, and while I do not for one moment deny the national epidemic of obesity nor the truly serious subject of diabetes, I find this attitude both repellent and offensive.

And especially sad! Imagining briefly that you are a human being of relatively robust health, what is the function of this dietary hysteria and scaremongering other than spoiling a small pleasure? Is it not just another form of manipulation, preying on the great human (especially female) talent for bodily insecurity? One more diet to sell a million books? Yes I am cynical, but this is because of the element in it all I find so sad and where I feel the offence lies.

What about those whose livelihoods depend upon the extraordinary range of uses to which sugar is put? The pastry chefs and the chocolatiers and the ice cream specialists are just a few. There is the perfume of a cake baking in a domestic oven, its fragrance floating out promises of pleasure, or memories of happiness. There is fairy floss, the loveliest words, concept and spun-sugar creation: sugar shape-shifted. There is its yin to the yang of sour or salt. There are sugar crystals melting

over heat and turning into molten golden toffee, or whisked with egg whites into a cloud of meringue, or transforming ordinary old water into a syrup, a glaze.

There are its permutations: honey and maple syrup and molasses, brown sugar and demerara and muscavado. For all the varying degrees of processing and refinement, sugar – extracted from either sugar cane or sugar beets – is a natural thing.

Belinda Jeffery is a prolific cookbook writer, among other talents, she told me recently that out of all the comments her website attracts, it is those relating to her divine Mix & Bake book which abound. This is a book which celebrates the art of baking, and while there are savoury recipes to be found in it,

most of them are for sweet things, for cakes and slices and biscuits and tarts and pies and muffins. She, too, is exasperated by this notion that sugar is somehow evil (and she, as I do, believes that the problem of obesity is much more involved than a mere tendency to eat vast quantities of sugar). It's not, she argues, as if most people will eat a lot of cake every single day. We laugh about the fact nobody, apparently, eats milk chocolate, only two squares of dark and even then preferably organic, ideally Fair Trade...

My unwitting revenge on the Sydney café which made me redundant a long time ago was the last cake I baked there. It was the most popular one, a carrot cake, and as I gazed at my miserable reflection in the window of the bus which conveyed me home, I suddenly remembered that I had left out the sugar.







Renovators must plan for asbestos removal

The recent publicity surrounding the dangers of exposure to asbestos during the National Broadband Network rollout has once again highlighted the dangers of asbestos during home renovations, according to Archicentre, the building design, inspection and advice service of the Australian Institute of Architects.

Ian Agnew from Archicentre said that provided asbestos-cement products used in the construction of homes are not disturbed the health of the occupants of the home is not at risk.

'If the asbestos sheeting is in good condition, it can be painted so as to limit the breakdown of the surface and the release of fibres. Care should be taken and sanding during preparation should be avoided.'

'The real risk of exposure to asbestos fibres occurs with the demolition of walls or roofs during the renovation of a property, and the breaking, drilling or cutting of products containing asbestos.'

Mr Agnew said the real concern is that with the nationwide increase in home demolitions and DIY renovations, fuelled in part by renovation reality TV programs, people may not recognise the

extreme health risks involved for home owners and their families of the diseases which can be caused by asbestos fibres.

Archicentre's pre-purchase property inspectors report the widespread presence of asbestos cement sheets in the eaves of many older houses, as a wall cladding or lining material and in the form of roofing. Older outbuildings such as garden sheds, carports and garages are often clad entirely of asbestos cement sheeting. Asbestos can also be present in older sheet flooring material and in pipe insulation.

Asbestos was used in flat sheet fibro-cement building products until 1982 and in corrugated fibro-cement roofing material until 1986 because of its cheapness and ease of installation.

Mr Agnew said, 'It is vital for everyone to understand that once you disturb asbestos there are extreme health risks involved for home owners and their families in relation to the diseases which can be caused by asbestos fibres.'

'These include asbestosis, lung cancer and mesothelioma.'

'These diseases can occur many years after the exposure to asbestos



dust has ceased, but the likelihood of a person contracting an asbestos-related disease increases as the intensity and duration of the exposure increases.'

Mr Agnew also warned home owners not to walk on corrugated asbestos cement roofs. These are ex-

tremely brittle with age and are likely to shatter under foot, releasing asbestos fibres and possibly resulting in the home owner falling through the roof.

'Asbestos sheeting or other materials containing asbestos should only ever be removed by a specialist

licensed contractor who will also arrange for its disposal in a landfill registered to take hazardous materials,' Mr Agnew said.
