ATO plan to slug GST on home park rentals are 'cruel' says Richmond MP

A campaign is picking up steam against a controversial plan by the tax office to apply the Goods and Services Tax (GST) to moveable home estates. It's a move which would affect thousands, mostly pensioners, across the north coast.

National Party MP for Page Kevin Hogan, has now joined Labor MP for Richmond Justine Elliot in lobbying to stop the move. Last week in parliament, Mrs Elliot asked prime minister Tony Abbott about the plan but said she was given an answer which 'insulted' the many people affected by the 'cruel' plan.'Before the election the prime minister said that there would be no change to the GST, she told *The Echo*. 'What the prime minister has now admitted is that he fully intends to slug mobile home residents with the GST on their site rentals. The prime minister has obviously lied to the people given he has now admitted that his Liberal-National Party government will be imposing GST on the site rental for those people who live in a mobile home.'

Mr Hogan said he has asked the ATO not to apply the GST to moveable home estates after many of his constituents contacted him expressing concern.

The ATO's final ruling, which does not apply to caravan parks, is expected to be released before May next year.

West Byron Project open for comment

Plans for the development of the 108-hectare West Byron Project are now with NSW Planning & Infrastructure at http://bit.ly/westbyronplans and public submissions can be made until January 31, 2014.

The proposal aims to rezone the West Byron site, located opposite the industrial estate, and allow for low/ medium density residential, industrial and a neighbourhood centre, as well as environmental zones.

Estimates have put the number of houses upwards of 800. There are also plans to establish planning controls including building heights, minimum lot sizes, flood planning requirements, coastal protection and management of acid sulphate soils.

While the aim to add more housing to west of Byron is contentious, the landowners argue, 'We believe that adding to the supply of residential land and housing will bring prices down and give more people the opportunity to live in Byron Bay rather than commute from out of town.'

So far only 15 public submissions have been received on the proposal – five of them objecting, seven in support and three offering comments only. One objector remarked, 'I am concerned of the impact on the Belongil Estuary and do not think developer "guarantees" of low/ nil impact should be regarded as acceptable safeguards.'

Byron Shire Council in November 2011 called on NSW Planning & Infrastructure to not proceed with rezoning the land until transport issues could be adequately addressed. Council's submission also advised that 'the residential density of 17 dwellings per hectare is well in excess of other subdivisions in the Shire' and called for no flood-liable lands to be filled.

The Echo asked a spokesperson for the West Byron landowners when they expected to have the project up and running, if it is approved. 'We've been in the approvals process for the West Byron Project since late 2008 and although it's difficult to put an exact timeframe on any construction, it probably wouldn't be much less than three to five years,' the spokesperson said. The business/commercial hub is proposed to be about one hectare in size, 'located at the centre of the site for ease of walking access from within the release area.' She added that the business centre would occupy 13ha at the western end of the site, 'conceptually in a style similar to the Arts and Industry Estate?

Dual carriageway recommended to address traffic

In regards to traffic issues, the West Byron Project website recommends a dual carriageway on Ewingsdale Road and bike paths that would lead into town from the estate.

A detailed traffic study completed two years ago forms part of the material on public exhibition, says the spokesperson. 'RMS agreed on the scope of that study before it was commenced and accepted the findings after it was completed and Council is in receipt of the computer simulation for traffic on Ewingsdale Road.'

So who are the developers?

They are long-term residents of the Byron area, according to the **continued on page 5** ►





Govt under fire over land management services

Sweeping changes which come into effect from January next year will see a combining of NSW government services for landowners.

And part of these changes, if adopted, would eventually see landowners with two hectares or more be liable to pay rates to the newly formed Local Land Services (LLS). Currently in the northeast NSW region, landowners with ten hectares or more pay rates to the Livestock Health and Pest Authorities (LHPA) for land management services.

A LHPA spokesperson told *The Echo* that they have recommended the change to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART), which is yet to determine its findings.

But what about landowners who don't have animals? He says that each LLS re-

gion would regulate what rate amount they would apply. Eleven regions throughout

NSW have been named, and sub-regions for the north coast region run from Tweed down to Port Macquarie-Hastings.

And while landowners are encouraged to enrol now to vote ahead of the 2014 LLS board elections, a class action commenced against LHPA last April has been brewing, spearheaded by Trevor Kirk, a landowner located near Yass.

Locally, Goonengerry resident and landowner Howard Ferner has joined the chorus of dissatisfaction and is accusing the LHPA of being bloated, over-bureaucratised and not representing landowners.



'They reap \$34 million a year from 130,000 landowners as well as the state and federal government, but what do we get in return?' he says.

Mr Furner claims that after a serious wild dog problem around his property and area, he asked the LHPA for help.

Mr Furner said of a public meeting held a few years ago, 'We were told by LHPA reps that there was no funding available to address the wild dog problem. They offered 1080 bait – which I would never use – but they wanted us to pay them for a course to be able to use it.'

He says the issue came to a head when debt collectors were recently called into the northern NSW region for unpaid LHPA rates. 'They had 200 statements of claim for the north coast alone,' he says.'

And while the LHPA spokesperson conceded that some landowners in the northern region are refusing to pay their rates, he believes they are getting value for money. 'Biosecurity is a statewide concern, and the reason that we haven't experienced the same problems in the UK is that we manage the land well. For example, there is a response time of within six hours for hendra virus. It's insurance,' he said. 'We also offer advice and assistance.'

As for 1080 baits, he claims that it only targets wild dogs when used correctly, and that there's 'not enough staff to go around' to trap wild dogs.'

But Mr Furner is still unsatisfied with the services LHPA provide. He says that recent LHPA financial statements claim \$3.4 million was spent on consultants. 'For what?' he asks. Mayor breaks Green ranks over Last Drinks

A rift has emerged within the Byron Greens, with the local convenor telling a recent Last Drinks at 12 public meeting on Wednesday night that mayor Simon Richardson was 'trying to be all things to all people' rather than stick to Greens policy on the issue.

'I think that puts him in a difficult situation if he's going to be a Greens member,' said Tom Tabart, who is himself a former Byron Shire Greens councillor.

Mr Tabart has repeated his criticisms of Mayor Richardson's performance to Echonetdaily but denied he was putting out an ultimatum.

In October, Mr Tabart

'He thinks the concerns of the liquor industry need to get some consideration.

councillor appearing to back a number of other people away from the demands of the Last Drinks group.

Cr Paul Spooner, who earlier this year authored a council motion supporting the group, told the meeting on Wednesday night that he was 'disturbed' by the direction the group was taking.

managed to get New Years Eve in Byron Bay to a situation of no threat and a familyfriendly evening.

'This New Years Eve, with Falls Festival – which I think is going to logistically be a nightmare – is going to be a repeat of last year, where the floodgates will remain open.'

Mr Tabart said the mayor, who rarely consults him, could do with re-examining the Greens position on a range of issues.

'My general view of his activity as mayor is that he's being a little too conciliatory as a member of the Greens in his actions across the shire. I think he should be sticking to Greens principles more closely.

NSW energy MP quits after ICAC steps in

NSW Resources and Energy Minister Chris Hartcher's resignation has been welcomed by Greens mining spokesperson Jeremy Buckingham, who called on premier Barry O'Farrell to appoint a minister 'who respects the importance of agriculture and water resources, and who will actively promote renewable energy?

Mr Hartcher stepped down last week after his office was raided by the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC).

Mr Buckingham added that Chris Hartcher is the third resources minister to be investigated by ICAC after Eddie Obeid and Ian Macdonald. *Fairfax* reported last week that Mr Hartcher will face two separate corruption inquiries next year, including an investigation into a water infrastructure company linked to the family of corrupt former Labor MP Eddie Obeid.

Lucky escape after helicopter crashes

Three men have escaped injury after the helicopter they flew on Sunday afternoon crashed as it landed on a property at Coopers Shoot, near Byron Bay.

The pilot and his two passengers were a little shaken but otherwise unhurt from the accident, which is being investigated by the Australian Transport Safety Bureau.

The five-seater Eurocopter 120 helicopter is understood to be owned by Tom Misner and it is believed to be a write-off.


According to Council, development consent may be required to operate helicopters in the shire. Council's Corporate and Community Services manager Ralph James told The Echo that under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation, helicopter facilities that are located within one kilometre of a dwelling not associated with the facilities, or are located within 40 metres of an environmentally sensitive area, are prohibited from operating more than seven times a week (take-off and landing). Helicopter facilities exempt from the legislation are those used exclusively for emergency rescue.




Roundhouse works lack footpath: OSCA

The Roundhouse subdivision by Byron Council has come under fire from the Ocean Shores Community Association (OSCA) after claims the road's footpath has been encroached.

OSCA's Jan Mangleson said, 'Concrete block retaining walls for the Roundhouse subdivision have been constructed by Council on the Orana Road public road reserve. The walls extend out four to five metres into the road reserve. They are so close to the existing bitumen that only two metres are available for the footpath. Council had to build a footpath as part of the Roundhouse development consent. However, the footpath has no nature strip, or safety buffer for pedestrians, or kids riding bikes?

Sacred lands face the frack despite ancestral warnings

re we ignoring the teachings of Indigenous ancestors by drilling for gas in the state's largest inland forest?

It's a question that has divided the Gomeroi nation, the original custodians of the Pilliga (Billiga) State Forest in the north-central of NSW.

According to Gomeroi elders, their ancestors warned not to disturb a destructive ancestral being – called Gurrea – who lives in isolation in a lagoon in the Billiga State Forest.

But so far, the Narrabri Aboriginal Land Council and the Gomeroi National Aboriginal Corporation are ignoring these teachings and are pushing for a massive Santos mining operation.

Currently Santos mining have the approval to drill 36 exploratory wells in the forest, which includes privately owned land drilling both vertically and horizontally through underground aquifers.

'Exploratory'

Although exploratory drilling does impact the structure of the underground aquifers, the approval to drill went ahead without activating the Water Trigger Bill, which passed this year in federal parliament. That's because Santos activities are only 'exploratory' at this stage.

Of concern to locals however, is the plan by the local council and Santos to name this arm of the Narrabri Gas Project, 'The Pilliga gas fields'.

Predictably the CEO of Santos Mining, David Knox, and NSW premier Barry O'Farrell support the destruction, driven by claims that 'NSW is running out of gas'.

But this disingenuous argument has all but been debunked. It may be true that NSW produces only a small percentage of its gas; however,

the issue is actually whether the federal government will step in and protect our domestic supply against the planned expansion of the export market.

If they did – like they do in the US – these corporations would be providing cheap domestic prices and this destruction could be averted.

We are not running out of gas; we are running out of politicans with integrity.

Our politicians are too cosy with the corporate agenda. That agenda is to produce shareholder dividends and screw everyone else and the environment in the process.

It's a stark reminder that corporations are largely bereft of ethics and only comply to legislation.

Gomeroi elder Paul Spearim explains the stark divide of his people. 'Some of our own people are signing off on Country,' says Spearim.

'They are doing it under the guise of Native Title. They are using the tribal name Gomeroi disrespectfully, and they are called the Gomeroi Narrabri Aboriginal Corporation.

'Nine people are official voters, 19 in total. These 19 are traditional descendants of Gomeroi/Gomilaraay who are signing over our sacred

lands for the dollar, not for the culture.

'It's only benefiting a handful of people, yet the majority feel like they have no choice, or simply have no clue about CSG.'

Social impact

'Their actions are having a social impact on the health of our people. Some of these people have sons and daughters that are working in mines in other parts of the country who are coming back sick.

'Some of them are young, in their forties, and are dropping dead from heart attacks.'

He says his people's stories and teachings warn of death and destruction if traditional laws are not adhered to.

Spearim says that a 'Being' from Gomeroi dreaming stories threatens wide-scale destruction if he is disturbed from under the ground in the Billiga. This dreaming ancestor is called Gurrea, the crocodile. 'He is the one to watch out for,' says Spearim.

'Dangerous'

'Right now, Gurrea has been trapped by Waraba the Sword Shell Turtle, or Bells Turtle, who created our aquifers and our law. Gurrea was greedy and caused trouble.

'He was stopped and ban-

ished into an underground lagoon which has no tributaries, so he cannot escape. But if they keep digging up the earth and the underground water-ways, they risk releasing this dangerous energy which will cause indiscriminate harm to all.

It's a similar teaching to the Kokatha people of South Australia, who warned of wide scale destruction if their ancestral being, a massive sleeping lizard, was disturbed.

Uranium that was mined from Kokatha country was dug out of the back of their sleeping lizard.

It fuelled the Fukushima reactors and it is now poisoning the Pacific Ocean, threatening life on the planet.

Kokatha elders tried to warn BHP Billiton, but they did not listen.

Santos Mining is also being officially warned about what will happen to them and their families and the state of the nation if they continue their plans to drill for coal seam in the Billiga.

Even though it appears that sacred law has already been broken, all is not lost.

'Sacred law isn't dying,' says Spearim.

'It is coming back through

the land itself, through reactivation of our cultural connection to the trees; to the land, to the birds, to the water, through the story, songs and dances of our ancestors.

'Waraba laid out the law for us to follow in order to live in harmony with one another and Mother Nature for thousands of years to come. What we are doing here in the Billiga right now is vital for the survival of all people in this country.

'So all people are invited to come here to learn, listen

and thrive.

Most importantly we must come together now as a matter of urgency, all people from all backgrounds who care about the earth and the future for our kids, and stop Santos from digging up the Billiga and Whitehaven Coal from mining the Leard Forest.'

Chance to get affordable housing right: Barham

The establishment of a broadranging inquiry into affordable and social housing is an opportunity to address the affordable housing crisis facing NSW, says Greens MP and housing spokesperson, Jan Barham, who proposed the inquiry to the Legislative Council.

'I welcome the cooperation of Labor and the crossbench parties to establish a Select Committee to inquire into affordable, social and public housing,' Ms Barham said. 'Housing affordability pressures in this state are driving many people further into social and economic disadvantage.

'The social and public housing systems are unable to meet the needs of people who can't find shelter in the private market.'

The inquiry, to be chaired by Christian Democratic Party MP Paul Green and with representation from the Government, Opposition and the Greens, has been given broad terms of reference that

include supply and demand issues, design approaches and social service integration, and possible recommendations on policy initiatives, planning reforms and other mechanisms to improve the capacity of affordable, social and public housing.

The inquiry will report to Parliament by September 9, 2014.

Will Milne's deal lose green votes?

he Abbott government has no shame. This is hardly news but it is good to see it confirmed, yet again, by the deal with the Greens to abolish the debt ceiling in exchange for some largely meaningless and easily avoided undertakings about transparency.

This time last year dealing with the Greens in any form was akin to selling your political soul. Julia Gillard's alliance, first with Bob Brown and then, less comfortably, with his successor Christine Milne, was excoriated, anathematised by Abbott and his colleagues; no sane or decent person could associate with these fanatical destroyers of Australia's wealth and freedom.

Even after Milne formally dissolved the alliance the attacks continued: the Greens had invaded the Gillard government like a malign, alien parasite and were still controlling their hapless and gullible hosts. The Greens were the enemy of all the Australian way of life; it was as simple as that. Any contact, however fleeting and superficial, risked contamination.

And dealing with them was invariably and irrevocably lethal. But only, apparently, for a Labor government. The hardy conservatives are immune. And anyway, it is all about outcomes, the end justifies the means. So our dauntless Treasurer Joe Hockey had no real hesitation in following the Faustian example.

And the pact he made was almost entirely one-sided; it did not even require his signature in blood. The debt ceiling was no more; never again would he have to go begging to parliament for a rise, or endure the taunting and posturing of an understandably cynical opposition which had endured three vears of thundering about the horrors of debt and deficit.

The economic crisis was offi-

cially over, and so was the political one which had accompanied it. It was the first real win for the government since its election, and Hockey and Abbott had every right to feel smug about it. Hypocrisy, shmypocrisy. Whatever it takes. There will be no sleepless nights on the government benches.

But for the Greens, and for their leader in particular, it may not be quite so simple. Debt in itself has never been a real issue for them; the concept is fine, even desirable if it is used for long term projects, worthwhile purposes like improving infrastructure - sustainable

infrastructure that is, and the

were furious; some were opposed to the tax in any form and others felt Lees should have fought harder for items such as books to be exempted.

The parliamentary party split: two of the nine Democrat senators, Natasha Stott-Despoja and Andrew Bartlett, crossed the floor to vote against the GST. Among the rank and file the reaction was wider and more vehement. They called a leadership spill, as the Democrats constitution allowed, and although Lees survived the first attempt, as second in 2001 saw her replaced by Stott-Despoja. A year later she resigned from the party altogether.

The dispute was the beginning of the end. In the 2001 election the Democrats only lost one senator, but in 2004, after more leadership turmoil and grass roots disillusionment, they lost three. Of the remaining four, two did not contest the 2007 election and the other two lost their seats. As a viable force the Democrats were finished.

In hindsight, it was clear that the trigger for their decline was Lees's agreement with Howard. He wooed her with the promise that it would make her party relevant, part of the processes of government. But that was precisely what rank and file Democrats did not want. They gloried in the fact that they were outsiders, unsullied by compromise.

Their role was, in the words of their old slogan, to keep the (other) bastards honest. Lees should have been frustrating Howard, holding him to his 1996 promise that he would never, ever, introduce a GST.

They felt betrayed and although many hoped that Stott-Despoja could restore the party's political virginity, when she failed, they threw in the towel.

Okay, the parallels are not exact: the Greens have a much more solid base than the Democrats and rather more resilience. And they are no longer pristine; by aligning with Gillard in 2010 they well and truly lost their innocence. But Abbott is not Gillard; he is, unequivocally the enemy. If Milne is to offer him and solace at all (and there will be many on the party who think that she should refuse to piss on him if he was on fire) then the price should be a steep one; after all, look at what Brown extracted from Gillard.

At the very least, Milne's deal will be the cause of a certain amount of dissension in the party, and she is not without rivals who will welcome the chance to undermine her.

If she is again to sup with Abbott, she would be wise to take a longer spoon in future.

CO-PRODUCER CHRIS DEKKER HAS BEEN ENGAGED IN THE ORGANISATION OF THIS UNIQUE EVENT, WHICH IS SURE TO BECOME AN INTERNATIONAL AND NATIONAL PHENOMENON.

'We already have 150 per cent more ticket sales than this time last year. And 90 per cent of those are from outside the shire. We have people flying from America, Germany and Japan.

The international appeal of the festival is clearly rooted in the program, which boasts evolutionary leaders, scientists, visionary activists, indigenous elders, musicians and the like with international bestselling author Anita Moorjani, neurosurgeon Dr Eben Alexander, environmental activist Vandana Shiva, Dr Patch Adams, peace activist Satish Kumar and musician Xavier Rudd.

Dekker, who has been in events productions for 30 years touring the world as a musician with Medicine Drum and founder of Earthdance (the global dance link-up which is now in its 17th year), is passionate about the festival and what it means to be an event producer.

'Uplift is another octave of where my work has been,' he says. 'I have always seen event culture as another vehicle to present transformational change to people. But it is a labour of love and you have to love the job, you have to love people coming together.'

The event is now in its sophomore year and kicked off last year quite by accident when Bharat Mitra and Bhavani Lev contracted Dekker to organise Bharat's birthday party on 12/12/12.

'He knew Bruce Lipton and a few others so I said why don't we do something public as well - so I rang some of my contacts and Uplift was born. This year we are refining it.

'Last year was an amazing year for us. The festival was a great success energetically. But what was probably key to the great experience was the profound connection between the visionaries who came together before the event in residence for 10 days. They gave their best presentations because they were super charged.

In this, our second year in, we are feeling a lot more ease with the event; the public know about it; it's smooth; the presenters are in session and that is going really well. The



vision this year is to ground Uplift as an annual event. We have expanded the village outside - we have a big tent on the field as the second breakout tent. We have the Gyuto monks coming, and a gompa tent for them while they create a sand mandala, a big 26-foot tipi as the elders' lodge, the grandmother council, and we have a lot more indigenous elders coming this year.'

Other highlights according to Dekker will be the youth initiative Earth Guardians.

'The Australian chapter of the Earth Guardians kicked off last year when local youth were inspired by EG founder Xiuhtezcatl Martinez. Xiuhtezcatl returns this year with youth leaders from different countries - India, Africa and he's brought a few kids from the US as well. There will be a lot of empowered youth at Uplift this year; we have created a dedicated youth tent where they are in residence and there's lots of programming for the tweens into the twenties.

Dekker believes that Uplift is very much a 'Byron' event, although there has been some talk about moving to somewhere like Sydney.

'People say why don't you take it to Sydney? You would triple the sales, but I think Byron is a good place as an international home, not just an Australian home. The shire resonates with what we are presenting – Byron holds the energy.

This year also sees organisers grow Uplift in the same model as TED talks

'This year we partnered with a company in the states: Fora TV – they are the world leaders of conference online streaming; they provide all the software and streaming and we are doing a live DVD stream and charging a really small fee. People can come onboard and watch it and it's archived, so we can create this online community. That's been a great new environment; it's not just about bums on seats, you can be anywhere in the world, the power of the internet and everyone can connect - it's our vision to make it like a visionary TED celebratory conference."

There is much to do in the lead-up to Uplift. Woodcarver and colleague Tonu Shane has been preparing a totem pole, carved especially for the event.

'This pole magically appeared from Mt Jerusalem – a 150-year-old Tallowood tree that fell in a storm – but the way the guy described it was amazing: a little cyclonic whirlwind dropped it in the valley! We went up there in old growth and found this amazing tree, and we got it down to where Tonu is carving it. I met with the Arakwal mob here and said we'd like to honour some of the Indigenous totems. There is kabul (carpet snake) - it is the most significant totem for the Arakwal and it means the community coming together - imagine this 16-metre pole wrapping around it! At Uplift everyone has the opportunity to put their hand on it and it should represent the diversity of our shire. It has the goanna, the sea eagle, all carved in - it will be lying on the ground. One of the key features is a time capsule: prayers, messages from the Arakwal, message from Byron Shire, the 13-grandmother bundle, poems from children... Tonu reckons in 150 years it will come out, and it should represent our vision for a positive future.'

For Tonu, carving a pole is about being responsive to the spirit.

'It's definitely something that evolves; every tree is different and I believe there are living spirits in the trees.

When they come down you can free them up, you have to feel them - there is a lot of magic in it; it all depends on how you look at it - most people will see differently. On its completion Uplift plan on donating the pole to Byron Council so it can be erected in a significant

community position. 'Totem poles represent acupuncture needles - once they go up they are very sacred. Drawing the energy from the Earth, the totem represents the human pole and it's a conduit to the spiritual realm - coming from the Earth.'

IS SUFFERING THE NEW SALVATION?

Trauma makes things taste better. That's what the lady at the markets told me the other day when I asked her the difference between her nuts. The purveyor of \$16 macadamia paste (which turns out to be both delicious and more expensive than the equivalent quantity of cocaine) explained the difference between roasted and raw nuts. 'The roasted nut paste tastes better because it's been traumatised.'

How interesting. Food tastes better with a little trauma. But not too much. I have often thought the very same thing about people. People who have suffered are generally more interesting than those who haven't. Like the macadamias that were unwillingly submitted to the oven, people who've felt the heat turned up in their own lives are forced to develop a more distinctive flavour.

Have you ever met someone who hasn't experienced heartbreak? And I'm not talking about missing out on the unicycle when it breezed through Aldi last week, or jumping on the scales and realising you've acquired another kilo. I'm talking about having your heart smashed in with an emotional mallet. I'm talking about someone doing a drive by and shooting your poor little heart into a thousand ugly pieces. I'm talking about being savaged by grief to the point where you can't get off the floor. The carpet sob.

These are not the pictures of ourselves that we put on Facebook. These are our lowest most brutal

moments but very often these are the experiences that have helped shape who we are, either by our sheer bloody-mindedness, our victimhood or our resilience.

It seems almost unthinkable that there should be someone out there who hasn't suffered. They are rare, but they do exist. These are privileged yet emotionally retarded souls. They haven't developed the flavour of a human that has been roasted on life's rotisserie of misery. Of course no-one lines up for suffering. No-one is eager for life's mallet to fall just so they can hit some emotional milestones.

But have you ever met someone who's never been hurt? Someone who has never suffered? It's like listening to Nicki Minaj. Or Justin Bieber. To be meaningful you have to know how to navigate the landscape of angst, to abseil blindly into the pain abyss. Unbroken-ness would seem like the perfect human condition, but as they say it's only when you break something that you let a little light in.

I have a friend who didn't have her heart broken until well into her forties. Previously she'd thought her complaining, morose, overly dramatic girlfriends who couldn't stop thrashing their stories of emotional degradation and misery were a little over the top. Sure, she'd ended relationships but she'd never suffered.

You only suffer deeply when you love deeply and when that happened I remember her lovely face looking at me aghast 'is this what women talk about?' I nodded and poured her a glass of red. This was going to be a long night.

I'll admit it, we all know a woman who just won't let go of the rejection bone, the one that keeps hauling over the same territory, telling the story of her broken relationship like a miserable mantra. After twelve months of going 'yeah he's a bastard. How could he have done that' or 'you deserve



better', 'what an arsehole' you start thinking 'fuck I think I would have dumped her too. She's so bloody intense. Move on, bitch'. But we don't say that to our friends' faces because that would be a betrayal of the sisterhood, and we have all been that stupid bitch yowling about the injustice of our once-perfect life lying smashed on the floor.

Some of the people who have impressed me most in life are those who have suffered terrible loss, and somehow have managed to live life without fear or bitterness. People who have managed to move on in spite of themselves. People with stories to tell. Holocaust survivors, refugees, orphans, widows, people who have lost children, bushfire survivors, the bankrupt, the divorced, alcoholics, gamblers, the anxious and depressed and those who have developed mental health issues, the car accident survivors who end up in wheelchairs, the disabled, the disfigured, the lonely... the list goes on.

These are the people, the anonymous survivors of life's slings and arrows who should be our heroes. Not thuggish football players on six-figure incomes. So next time you suffer, as you draw breath between sobs, remember, as long as you can avoid complete incineration in life's oven, you are on the way to becoming delicious. This is the speech I'll be giving the kids this year when I don't get them any Christmas presents.

'I know it hurts now but in a few years you'll be amazing. That's the best gift of all.'

BRENDAN MACLEAN IS THE SPARKLING GLITTERING AND TOTALLY FABULOUS SONGWRITER THAT AUSTRALIA HAS BEEN WAITING FOR. 'Before I met Paul I had never worked with a producer before. I had done all my recording into a laptop strumming my uke into a \$50 microphone. Paul and I met through Twitter. I tweeted some snarky thing on Twitter about loving Silverchair since they were Nirvana pyjamas to when they were Paul Mac and friends. He got wind of it and tracked me down. I gave him a CD and he

have a lot of phrases that you would say that aren't overly poetic. I like that people say that I wouldn't say that. I am a big fan of Twitter.

It's wordplay: you have 140 characters to make people laugh, or make a political point or say something meaningful. I won't lie - tweets have ended up in my songs... like 'if you weren't so stupid I could have loved you'; that was a sub-tweet directed at someone...

So how did Maclean, who claims Billy Elliot was his favourite film as a kid, find his feet as a musician. It was an unlikely zigzag path to his passion.

'I started doing karate and saw some sparkly things across the hall, so I joined ballet. Then they got me to do a scene in a holiday camp and I loved acting so I started acting. And then when I was acting we did some music and I sang for the first time in year ten. I hated the music of musicals! I can't stand musicals so I had to start writing my own songs!

'I love that nonlinear line of my career. It's been hard to let my voice be louder in Australia - I think, being gay, and not knowing if I need to make political commentary on everything people come to the show knowing what you think about things.

'It used to be scary where I grew up. Singing in key isn't exactly cool; people are into mumbling on stage. Megan Washington and I have this joke that people get onstage and they look surprised! 'Oh! I am a wilting flower!' That's why I adore Kate (Miller Heidke) or Megan because they sing from their heart. It's fashionable to be Angus and Julia Stone about everything. It's funny with boys at the moment; this growly voice is popular. Matt Corby started it with his big broad voice; now I see boys try and do this growly I have been smoking and drinking my whole life! My heroes are lota, and Paul Capsis, the people who take pop and cabaret to the edge. Cabaret is a dirty word in Australia - but isn't Katy Perry just a million-dollar show that is really a cabaret?'

said I think I get what you are trying to do, and I think I can get that close to the sound in your head.







lunch and dinner seven days a week, and has a park kiosk adjoining the cafe for takeaway food and drinks. The philosophy is to offer cafe simplicity during the day, turning into

> a destination restaurant by night. As an indication of the menu, breakfast runs from the healthy end such as house goji berry granola with saffron poached pear and natural yoghurt (\$16) to the indulgent end. Yes, you can order a glass of Louis Roederer champagne with your salmon gravlax, avocado, sweet corn fritters with roast tomato, rocket and horseradish cream (\$22) for breakfast.

GOOD TASTE

The lunch and dinner menu (\$19-\$36) includes

some excellent vegetarian dishes along with a range of seafood such as oysters, beerbattered flathead, seafood bouillabaisse or crispy-skinned snapper, sauté calamari with chili flowerets of cauliflower, pine nuts, wasabi greens and sweet corn puree. You can even get a steak (grass-fed scotch fillet, roast beetroot, fennel and mushroom duxelle with paris butter, jus), or chicken and mushroom pie.

Children have their own menu with spinach ricotta ravioli or wagyu beef cheeseburger with french fries for a reasonable \$15. I don't know any children who actually like chicken nuggets, and they are not on the menu.

There's an extensive wine list, and if you liked your Louis Roederer for breakfast you can return to quaff more on the deck as the sun goes down over the Bay with Mount Warning in the distance. This is not an experience that is available in other towns, even tourist towns, and the Byron Beach Café's awards suggest that they have made the most of their opportunity to give locals and visitors something special to come back for.

Sports clubs urged to apply for water saving grants

Just two weeks remain for schools, sports clubs and community organisations in the northern rivers region to apply for a cash grants scheme designed to suit smaller-scale projects that have the potential to save water and benefit the environment in regional Australia.

The Philmac Project provides cash grants of up to \$5,000 to organisations undertaking water-related projects, such as installing systems to irrigate community gardens or replumbing clubhouses to use rainwater.

The deadline for applications is December 20. Applications are filled in online, via Facebook. Importantly, applicants then have to generate votes from their members and supporters to make the shortlist for each of the five voting regions (SA, WA, QLD/NT, NSW, VIC/TAS).

Recipients will be chosen from the shortlist by a special panel that includes Irrigation Australia chief executive Duane Findley and AgChatOz co-founder Sam Livingstone, with the winners due to be announced in February 2014.

'The panel's focus will be on making sure the money goes to a project that will make a genuine difference to the local community, and has the potential to reduce water use, improve water quality or benefit the environment in some way,' Mr Nykiel said.



HOUSING MORE AFFORDABLE BUT FIRST HOME BUYERS DISAPPEARING, SAYS REIA

The Real Estate Institute of Australia (REIA) says that in the September quarter of 2013 the ACT remained the most affordable state or territory in which to buy a home, NSW remained the least affordable and first home buyers are disappearing.

REIA president Peter Bushby says, 'The latest Adelaide Bank/REIA Housing Affordability Report shows an improvement in housing affordability with the proportion of income required to meet loan repayments decreasing 1.2 percentage points to 29.8 per cent. All states and territories recorded improvements in affordability over the quarter - the largest in Tasmania, where the proportion dropped by 1.6 percentage points to 24.6 per cent.'

First home buyers made up just 13.6 per cent of the owneroccupier market compared to 14.6 per cent in the June quarter and this figure is one of the lowest since the Australian Bureau of Statistics started to collect data on the activity of first home buyers.

'As we expected, because of to the changes in the First Home Owner Grant introduced by the Victorian government, the number of loans to first home buyers in the state had the biggest quarterly drop across the country' said Mr Bushby.

'The consequences of the availability of the grant to those purchasing only new dwellings are abundantly clear in NSW and Queensland – the number of loans to first home buyers in these states is 46.7 per cent and 34.5 per cent lower than it was a year ago. South Australia and

Western Australia both saw a strong increase in the number of loans (excluding refinancing) over the past year.

'For renters, it became slightly more affordable to rent in Tasmania, but in the Northern Territory rental affordability fell further with renters paying well above the national average.

'For this and future editions of the Adelaide Bank/REIA Housing Affordability Report, REIA commissioned a review into the methodology of estimating the median weekly family income data. New methodology now in use brings that data in line with the Census.'

Australian PCI®: construction continues to expand in November

The Australian Industry Group/Housing Industry Association *Australian Performance of Construction Index* (Australian PCI®) for November expanded for the second consecutive month with an increase of 0.8 points to 55.2 (readings above 50 indicate an expansion in activity).

A boost in new orders (58.5) and deliveries (57.9) as well as continuing strength in overall activity (54.6) was behind the improved November reading. While house building and apartments lost some ground in the month, all of the major sub-sectors remained in growth territory.

Australian industry group director, Public Policy, Peter Burn, said: 'The construction sector extended its expansion in November, adding further to the accumulation of momentum evident in recent months. The fact that growth was reported in each of the four sub-sectors is particularly

encouraging and adds to the signs that the long-awaited re-balancing of the domestic economy may be getting underway on the back of low interest rates and a lift in business and household confidence.

'However, given the extent of the slump in residential and commercial construction over more than three years, the expansions recorded in October and November are from a low base and we are still some months from a convincing recovery.

Housing Industry Association chief economist Harley Dale said: 'Following the charge

into expansionary territory in October it was important to see a further 50+ result in November – it's great to see that outcome.

'There appears to be little else in the way of upward momentum in private domestic demand at present, but the Australian PCI* results for house building and apartments signal further short-term growth in the dwelling construction recovery. To sustain that recovery and return new home building to strong levels requires closer attention to policy reform than is currently evident.

'Consistent reference in the Australian PCI* survey to tight credit conditions is one example of an avoidable roadblock to a constructionled recovery in the Australian economy', Dr Dale said.

Australian PCI[®] Key Findings for November:

• The Australian Industry Group/Housing Industry Association Australian Performance of Construction Index (Australian PCI*) for November recorded expansion for a second consecutive month – up 0.8 points to 55.2 (readings above 50 indicate an expansion in activity).

• The November Australian

PCI[®] was the highest reading since April 2010.

- A strengthening in new orders (58.5) – which increased at their highest rate in almost eight years – and an upturn in deliveries from suppliers (57.9) boosted the overall reading.
- Construction activity was strong at 54.6.
- Across the sub-sectors: House building (62.0), apartments (57.9), commercial construction (52.9) and engineering construction (52.5) all recorded expansions.
- Input prices remain high at 71.3 while selling prices remained low in November.
- Businesses generally noted that market conditions were strengthening in response to higher levels of demand. This was being reflected in increased tender opportunities with respondents also indicating further success in the securing of contracts.






