Byron Bay joined communities along the Australian coast to send a message to the state government opposing plans to expose marine parks to recreational fishing on Saturday.

Organisers say that overwhelming scientific advice and public opinion is against the move, yet the O'Farrell government looks set to allow recreational fishing in the coming days.

'Locally, people are concerned by the possible degradation of Byron's unique marine environment, one of the major tourist drawcards to the area, said founder of NGO Positive Change for Marine Life, Karl Goodsell.

'Only seven per cent of the NSW coastline is currently protected as sanctuary "no-take" zones, and these areas function much as national parks do on land, providing undisturbed habitat for species to breed and flourish.

Goodsell says pandering to hunt-

ing and fishing lobbyists would disregard a joint statement to O'Farrell by over 220 NSW marine scientists condemning the changes, a Galaxy survey showing 93 per cent public opposition, 'and even 91 per cent of recreational fishers surveyed who are opposed to weakening protection for marine sanctuaries.'

The pressure is on to explain why the NSW deputy premier would come all the way up from Sydney to spruik 'putting regional NSW back at the heart of government' yet at the same time syphon money away from it.

Andrew Stoner (also NSW Nationals leader) was in Tweed last Thursday, and travelled up with five other senior NSW MPs for 'party business' and to meet Tweed Council, 'local business owners and groups'.

But the specifics were vague when asked, no names of the business owners or groups were supplied by Mr Stoner's media spokesperson.

But it was an opportunity for The Echo to ask Mr Stoner directly whether he would return management of Brunswick Heads' public caravan parks and Crown reserves back to the Byron Shire Council.

Mr Stoner, who has the power to do so, said simply he 'hadn't ruled it out'.

In 2006 the parks were controversially taken over by the state and handed to the North Coast Holiday Parks (NCHP) by former disgraced Labor MP Tony Kelly, with a claim they had been mismanaged.

And ever since, major cost-shifting has occurred: The Echo previously reported that when council ran the parks in 2003-04, it made almost \$1 million (\$860,553) but under state control in 2011-12, NCHP paid \$196,818 from park income to Byron Council.

Byron Shire mayor Simon Richardson is calling for the return of management to Council, and it follows widespread community concern over future development of the parks and reserves by NCHP.

In 2012, former Byron general manager Graeme Faulkner lifted the veil of confidentiality over the report used by the state government to justify the Brunswick Heads parks takeover, and was damning of its claims.

The report was also discredited by most councillors at the time as deceptive and full of misinformation in order to justify stripping Council of its trusteeship of the parks.

# **Dispute erupts over West Byron figures**

A dispute over 'alarmingly incorrect information' on an online West Byron development petition has erupted and comes as the newly formed Byron Residents' Group held their first meeting Thursday night.

Stuart Murray of the West Byron Project said in statement that while he 'welcomed a rigorous debate', the change.org petition, spearheaded by the group's Catherine Coorey, 'contains more than ten inaccurate or incomplete statements.'

'For instance, she claims that we're applying for 108 hectares to be commercial and residential. That's untrue. We have applied for 37 per cent of the site to be zoned as environmental conservation and management. She also makes alarming claims about koala habitat that are simply untrue and the comments about acid sulphate soils dramatically over-simplify a complex issue,' said Mr Murray.

But Coorey has hit back, telling

The Echo the developers are inaccurate in their material, and she is calling for a meeting between the groups and the NSW Department of Planning. She did concede however that she made 'two changes' to the petition, 'and offered people the chance to retract their signature?

'I am seeking clarity on the remaining points as their information is unclear and at times inconsistent. Regarding the 108 hectares size

# **Conviction of Bruns** activist overturned

The conviction against an organiser of a protest group who removed barricades controversially erected on a public road in Brunswick Heads last year has been overturned.

The ruling has buoyed the spirits of campaigners fighting the proposed developments by North Coast Holiday Parks (NCHP) in Brunswick Heads.

NCHP, spearheaded by manager Jim Bolger, prosecuted Foreshore Protection Group (FPG) organiser Michele Grant in November 2012 after more than a dozen Brunswick Heads residents removed large barricades on Riverside Crescent at Ferry Reserve and then dropped them off at the Council Chambers in Mullumbimby.

The barricades had been erected on the public road a week before a new licence agreement for the caravan park in that location was adopted by Byron Shire Council, sparking local outrage. Ms Grant was the only

one charged over the action.

Ms Grant was fined \$750 by magistrate Michael Dakin in July last year after he found her guilty of a charge of disposing of stolen property.

The success on Friday of an appeal in the NSW District Court in Lismore comes in the final weeks of the public display of the contentious draft plans of management for the three Crown land holiday parks and foreshore reserves in the holiday town.

NSW District Court Judge Laura Wells threw out the conviction following a submission from Ms Grant's lawver John Weller. Ms Grant told *The Echo* that 'the police would have had more success charging NCHP with the illegal obstruction of Riverside Crescent, an allegation they didn't bother to follow up?

'Anyway it's a great outcome; it looks like adults are allowed to be responsibly proactive and participate in the democratic process,' she said.

In related news, the recent discovery of an Aboriginal stone artefact at the Ferry Re-

serve has led to calls by campaigners for an archeological assessment of the town's foreshore as a place of possible cultural significance.

Ocean Shores resident Duncan Merrell told The Echo he found the stone hand tool while fishing near the Ferry Reserve public boat ramp around six weeks ago.

Mr Merrell said the National Parks & Wildlife Service (NPWS) office was 'very happy' to receive the artefact, telling him it was 'a great specimen and would probably end up being displayed in a local exhibit at some stage'.

Resident Sean O'Meara told The Echo that he had often heard the little beach in the Terrace Reserve referred to as Midden Beach. 'If you look around the entrance on top of the bank there are still plenty of midden shells scattered around,' he said.

# Possible midden

Mr O'Meara said the 'real takeover point of this land' was around 2008, when over 50 power poles, taps and fire hoses were installed in the southern end of the Terrace.

'These structures that basically appeared overnight were never approved, did not meet "primitive camping" conditions and turned what was once just open parkland where people were allowed to pitch a tent for a few weeks of the year into a designated camping/caravan park as there was then infrastructure every 10 metres. All complaints were met with the reply that a plan of management was underway and all would be then rectified.




Opposition is already ramping up at the site of the well in Bentley, near Lismore.

# Aldi under pressure to label palm oil

The wide-scale destruction of rainforests in southeast Asia and the consequent wiping out of the endangered orangutan habitat is largely due to production of palm oil, says the Palm Oil Action Group.

And with around 50 per cent of an average shopping trolley containing palm oil, the group are calling on labbelling so shoppers can make informed choices.

'It can be in baking, detergents, ice cream, chocolate, cosmetics...' the group's Anasuya Claff told *The Echo*.

The message was part of an awareness campaign that was held outside Byron Bay's Aldi on Saturday, and protest postcards were also signed that will be sent to the company.

'Aldi was targeted because they have other good policies in place,' Ms Claff said, 'such as banning all unnatural food colourings and have signed

up to using sustainable paper and fish - plus they have the ability to change? And because Aldi are taking market share from both

usage and zoning, she said, 'Advertisements in the local papers have shown residential 44 per cent and environmental 46 per cent. Which are the figures?'

And as for koala habitat, Ms Coorey says, 'The proposal creates and increases koala habitat, though we cannot see where such an outcome is guaranteed in the DCP.

'Could Mr Murray please direct us to where this is specified and how it would be achieved?

'We are very concerned that there is transparency and accuracy and accountability

surrounding every aspect of the proposed West Byron development and look forward to Mr Murray clarifying these key points in a public meeting,' says Ms Coorey.

Ms Coorey added the group's petition is on its way to reach 2000 signatures by Monday. 'Of the 1,800 who signed, over 1,000 of them are from Byron and neighbouring postcodes. We will be sending it as a submission to the DPI and will give it to MP Don Page in the next couple of weeks?

# **Domestic violence: Australia's dirty secret**

This Friday is V-Day - One Billion Rising – a call to women and those who love them to walk out, dance, and rise up to demand an end to violence against women.

This is the story of Anne\* a domestic violence survivor.

Her first experience was in 2002 when she returned to the home she had once shared with her estranged husband to collect some personal belongings. Anne was taken hostage and was held at knifepoint by her ex-husband's flatmate, in response to the police attempting to arrest him for violating an AVO.

A later incident in 2007 saw Anne bashed by another partner. 'He punched me in the left side of my head which sent the right side of my head into the mantelpiece. I fell onto a concrete step, and then he stomped on me four times.

'He'd ruptured my spleen, broken two of my ribs and fractured my eye socket.

Anne managed to escape and run to the neighbours and was airlifted to Tamworth Hospital. Very often women who are the victims of domestic violence will seek

support and remorse from their perpetrator.

It is part of the cycle of violence.

# Cycle of violence

'They don't want to accept kindness and remorse,' says Anne. 'They think, you made me do this, it was your actions, your words that made me lash out. In the end you feel the shame and you start to blame yourself.

Anne continues to live with re-emerging bouts of PTSD

and high levels of anxiety.

'I have a part-time job now, I work closely with Michelle and Neroli from the Mullumbimby Neighbourhood Centre, and what gets me through is that I had a wonderful childhood and upbringing and a wonderful education and as shit as things have been, things are good now and I feel safe.'

'Domestic violence is not simplistic,' says Anne. 'It's a complex web. It's not random. There is love involved.

'It is about power and control. And it's not just about physical or sexual violence. It's about financial abuse, psychological and emotional abuse. Domestic violence is Australia's dirty secret.'


Anne is currently heavily involved with White Ribbon Day, speaking in schools and in public about the need for behavioural change.

This extraordinary story is actually very ordinary. It happens to lots of women, many of whom either don't leave, or die. Nearly two women die in domestic violence every week, according to the Australian Domestic and Family Violence Clearinghouse and the University of NSW.

What is extraordinary is that this is a woman who has found the courage to tell her story, hoping to instigate a dialogue so we can work towards creating a society that no longer tolerates domestic violence against women and children. Women and men who love women are invited to attend A Billion Rising at Byron's Main Beach on Friday at 7am for a 7.30am start.

# Hemp foods strains under political inaction

In a rare peek between the political curtains, Hemp Foods Australia say they have resorted to a public relations company after employing a political lobbyist failed to convince politicians that hemp foods should be legal.

While there is often public confusion around hemp, certain strains of the seeds con-





tain no drug/THC content yet are very high in omega 3 and omega 6 essential fatty acids (EFAs).

Federal Labor MP Justine Elliot (Richmond electorate) visited the factory in Bangalow on Tuesday, and founder Paul Benhaim hopes that she will pursue the issue at a federal level.

Mr Benhaim says his business, which employs seven full-time workers and 30 contractors, is the largest hemp food wholesaler, retailer, manufacturer and exporter

in the southern hemisphere. 'But without hemp being approved for consumption, my factory can only sell overseas while the domestic market remains untapped.' Justine Elliot told The Echo, 'I'll be going to Canberra next week and asking questions as to what is prohibiting the sale of hemp foods in Australia. It has amazing ag-

ricultural benefits - the crop rotation is just 120 days. Local state MP Don Page (Nationals) has also been also supportive of Mr Benhaim's attempts to have hemp foods regulated. A current application to legalise hemp foods is with regulator Food Standards Australia New Zealand (FSANZ) and the petition is at www.hempfoods.com.au.

# **Bypass impasse?**

Debate over how to approach the West Byron Project development concluded with agreement to make a submission to the Department of Planning to establish its authority over the urban release area's draft Development Control Plan (DCP).

Council also asks that 'a sufficient proportion' of the Voluntary Planning Agreement (VPA) funds be forwarded to Council, so a 'timely construction of the bypass' can be made ahead of subdivision. Council will also seek the remaining amount from the state government, and noted that it has \$2.5m in Section 94 funds available.

Crs Ibrahim, Cubis, Woods and Cameron voted against the motion.

In other – and by no means only – resolutions, Tallowood Ridge Estate got the nod to start stage three of its Mullumbimby development. Thirty-one residential allotments will be released next, with a total of around 250 planned. Mayor Simon Richardson pushed for a

meeting with the developers over the sports fields component, and suggested that they may become recreational fields instead.

# Byron NYE, park and ride

The great Byron NYE park -and-ride experiment was also thrashed out, with Cr Di Woods claiming, 'It wasn't a success in any way, shape or form,' and was concerned about costs, which she estimated at around \$200,000.

Cr Chris Cubis also added some criticism. 'I don't recall the community asking for a park and ride. I remember the illegal camping and trashing the town.' But the mayor hit back, claiming his pet project wouldn't stack up economically the first time. 'It's worrying to hear the distrust with the figures. It's quite offensive?

'We learned a lot, and this has always been in a strategic plan.' Council agreed to stage a three-year trial and develop an operational plan and budget, which may include sponsorship to help offset expenditure.

It seems incomprehensible that a political party - one that claims grassroots origins - should say in its 'About Us' webpage that it believes in 'decentralisation of power to our local communities' when its practice is quite the opposite.

Parties often profess ideals at odds with their actual policies, but let's take a step back first. It's a party with Western Australian rural conservative roots that expanded after a few name changes to include all states in the 1920s. Its constituents were graziers and farmers who wanted - for obvious reasons - to limit union and workers' rights while also pushing for protectionism (that's government intervention to protect industry from overseas competition).

And sometime after inception, they aligned themselves with the Liberals at both a state and federal level and generally the pair have been known as 'the coalition' ever since.

Like a sucker fish to a shark, they are associated with hard-right policies (that's free trade, not protectionism).

So fast track to now. Last week the federal Nats were reported by Fairfax as having their political donations rise 'tenfold in four years' from coal seam gas companies.

It reflects nicely in their future energy blueprint, which proudly boasts: 'The coalition will introduce an Exploration Development Incentive that will allow investors to deduct the expense of mining exploration against their taxable income.

At the state level, last week the NSW National Party faced internal squabbles with the dear Libs after a redistribution of NSW electoral boundaries. Turf wars aside, a freedom of information inquiry last week into communications between Metgasco and NSW Nationals Tweed MP Geoff Provest now no longer exist for public scrutiny. And having local Nationals MP Don Page in power should be beneficial to this community. But those 10,000 people seeking his support to make the region CSG free, or those wanting the return of the Bruns parks to Council could fairly claim he is the minister for Sydney, not his actual portfolio of the north coast.



# CSG tactics

To those readers given the impression by the front page story in last week's Echo ('Activists target Metgasco shareholders') that I had somehow threatened an anti-CSG campaigner, nothing could be further from the truth.

In this case I did both. In the subsequent telephone discussion, I made the very valid point to Mr Qualmann that those using such tactics have to be extremely careful not to seek to influence the stock market by unlawful means.

Mr Qualmann appears to be a man of means, a Lismore energy business owner and probably a property owner. I simply made the point to him

# Parks boss responds to Bruns concerns

I refer to incorrect statements made in The Echo on February 4 in relation to the draft plans of management for the Brunswick Heads Holiday Parks. Responses to some of the matters concerning the Trust are provided below. Additional information in response to issues raised in the media is available on the Trust's website.

The draft plans currently on exhibition do not remove any foreshore land from public use. The draft plans of management permanently preserve the existing public accesses along the foreshore at both Ferry Reserve and Massey Greene.

Public access through the Terrace Reserve Holiday Park will be maintained for those who want to continue to walk through the holiday park as they currently can, subject to normal responsi-

ble restrictions to ensure the safety, welfare and security of guests and other users of the reserve. Submissions received to date support access being provided for longer hours throughout the year and these requests, as with all submissions, will be given serious consideration.

The draft plan of management for Ferry Reserve specifically authorises the ongoing use of the boat ramp by members of the general public. As the boat ramp is on public land, normal responsible conditions of use will apply to ensure the safety, welfare and security of guests and other users of the reserves.

Regarding land under lease to the Fishermen's Coop, there is no development planned for the Co-op's land. There is a proposal to upgrade an intersection with

Queensland area; the recent state government REF approval is another step along the way.

# Muddy waters

Rather than respond to the substantive issues surrounding her electoral funding that I raised (specifically her large donation from a mystery Queenslander and her lavish campaign budget that dwarfed all other candidates), Cr Diane Woods chooses to obfuscate and accuse me of

Exemptions from certain regulations, such as setbacks, are available to all holiday parks in NSW that were in operation prior to 1986. These provisions operate in the same way that a house built prior to 1986 would not com-





Fact: Much of the hydrofluorosilicic acid used to fluoridate water in Australia has come directly from Geelong's Incitec Pivot superphosphate fertiliser plant where wet-scrubbers capture toxic fluoride waste products that would otherwise be released into the atmosphere. The resulting water slurry is sent directly to water treatment plants. The other major sources of fluoride that are added to Australian water are sodium fluoride and sodium silicofluoride sourced from Chinese industry's waste.

2. He fails to recognise NSW Health's inaccurate assumption that the results of controlled studies for topical fluorides such as toothpaste, varnish, and sealants are applicable to water fluoridation. Fact: This comparison of to-

What do you like to do in Paris when you're not working? I miss LA a lot. I miss driving around



scary health checks. Tune in next month when I share my colonoscopy.





saleyards for shows. Some of these works receive federal government funding and become more viable options. I'm inspired by the diversity of our region and NORPA aims to connect to as many people as we can. In my job I do get to see a lot of work - or I hear about the work. The good stuff rises to the top and some gets supported for national touring. Some of the works we make, and some I just really want to bring even if they are risky, because I know they will add something special to the program.

Are there quotas that you try to fill of different types of shows, eg dance, cabaret, circus? No, but I like to have a couple of big dramas or classic texts that balance the edgier contemporary works. But I have a circus background (from my uni days... yes, I'm another fire guy but I used to juggle it unlike the Byron mayor, who used to twirl it, as I

house? The Echo asks artistic director Julian Louis about the year ahead.

How do you go about programming a season? Mainly I think about the northern rivers and imagine audiences getting access to great works that reflect the diversity of our region.

# B luesfest F inds H ome with H art

# IT SEEMS BYRON'S BLUESFEST CAN'T STOP

WINNING AWARDS. Just last week they bagged another two, taking out Silver at the Australian Tourism Awards, and a *Rolling Stone* Award acknowledged the contribution of Bluesfest director Peter Noble to the music industry. In a time when festivals are folding by the tentful, the 24th annual Bluesfest is looking stronger than ever. And the secret to the success? Well part of it has to be Noble's relentless sourcing of international talent.

Beth Hart is one of this year's Bluesfest's director's top picks. And for good reason: Hart not only has a powerhouse vocal; she has a powerhouse story and a powerhouse presence on stage.

Born with music in her blood, she recalls her first exposure at the tender age of four and the profound affect music has on her.

'I will never forget it and thanks be to god I still get to feel that all these years later. It's a feeling of finding home. As a very young girl I felt my family was so close and something happened later with my dad, but I remember being under a den table and this song kept coming on the TV; it was the *Moonlight Sonata* by Beethoven and I remember hearing the chords and the touch of the right hand and it brought me such a feeling. It was like finding out that in the dark you can still find home... in the night my parents got up and I was playing this little bit of the song, and for years I kept trying to play that!'

A national win on *Star Search*, a forerunner to *American Idol* and *The Voice*, gigging around LA and a lot of pounding the pavement by her manager, eventually led to Jason Flom and David Foster, who jointly signed her to Lava/143/Atlantic Records.

I think that overall my greatest confidence, and insecurity, comes from the writing because it is my first and greatest love. When it comes to the performing it's more of an addiction. I wouldn't have admitted to that when I was younger, and when I say it's an addiction I am not saying it's an ugly thing. I spend a lot of time on the road and my biggest fight with my road manager is understanding how you have to neon the road working your thang but also needing to be home so you stay connected. Home for me is a spiritual place.'



as there are for the kids... and there are a heap of surprises in it. *Wulamanayuwi and the Seven Pamanui* is also a family show that re-invents

Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs, Tiwi style – it's very entertaining and a wonderful insight into Indigenous culture. And also Circus Oz will be great fun for children and adults. What I like about these shows is they are actually for families – they're not just for kids.

What shows are you most excited about? I'm really excited about seeing our own show *My Radio Heart* on stage. It's been more than two years in the planning and making and I think it's unique. I'm also looking forward to *Lake* – just to see the stage flooded with water (on purpose this time!), and the show's beautiful projections and lighting design in our theatre. *Food* because I want to see what kind of experience they create in our theatre – at one point in the Sydney show they fed us and gave us wine. It's a beautiful show about siblings, family and dealing with the past – it's also funny. And I'm really excited about *Wulamanayuwi and the Seven Pamanui*. I think the writer, Jason De Santis from the Tiwi Islands, is a real talent. I'm looking forward to seeing that show with my kids.

I'd be interested in 1984 – how is that story retold? Is it still **contemporary?** The show is very faithful to the original novel and indeed the film. It's an extremely powerful production. Is it contemporary? It was written in 1949 and it's regarded as one of the great classics. But this production by Shake&Stir employs the full capabilities of the theatre and their use of video is very clever. It's a very contemporary production in its staging. Oh, and of course there is *Big Brother*, but no-one is voted off the stage. The story is a political science fiction and, amazingly, still has very pertinent warnings about the way our future could look, or what our society looks like now. I remember seeing the film and it was a haunting experience – this will be too. Not for the fainthearted. Tell me a little about the Generator Program and My Radio Heart? Generator is NORPA's new work program it's where we create original works inspired by the artists and culture of the northern rivers. Recent examples include: the play Engine, a site-specific circus show Open House with local acrobatic family The Pitts, Beautiful Bones, a dance theatre work, and Railway Wonderland performed on Lismore's disused railway **16** February 11, 2014 *The Byron Shire Echo* 

For Hart, staying in touch with that inner voice, and having spiritual refuge is of extreme importance.

Early in her career, pressure clipped her wings. A heady cocktail of drugs and Beth's unmedicated bipolar disorder ensured that her Atlantic deal went sour, and it took the intervention of road manager Scott Guetzkow to pull her back from the brink. 'I went into five different hospitals that year, not including rehabs,' she says. 'It was so bad that I remember talking to my psychologist and he said, "I don't think you can handle being in this business...""

Fortunately for her listening audience it turned out not to be true. Meeting blues star Joe Bonamassa in a hotel lobby changed her trajectory both in music and in life.

'I was around 36 or 37 and I had done a record called My California; musically to me it was ruined because it was too fucking polished – but musically and lyrically when it was in its raw form with just voice and acoustic guitar before the stuff was put on top and it was a very heavy lyric, it was still okay. I remember thinking: I am done in the spot and I have to get out of here – I have to get out of this box. It's not that I was going to stop playing music; it was that I felt like I had beat the shit out of that horse and it was dead, and the miracle for me was that Joe came into my life and says let's make a soul cover record: Don't Explain. It was four days in the studio, so here I go doing blues and jazz and soul - you know doing all the music I loved as a kid but wouldn't have had the balls to do alone because I was too scared - but by the fourth day I found how much joy I had doing these songs and I thought how interesting it would be to write in this genre. That was how I came to make Bang Bang Boom Boom. Kevin Shirley, who produced it for me, asked why I was hiding this. And I replied that I didn't want to show him because I didn't want anyone cutting down my babies! It was fantastic. And why is there more joy in my new work compared to my older stuff? I think it's as simple as I found a new genre to work in and tell my stories through."

It takes great courage for an artist who has established a voice in the market to take a sudden turn in another direction. And that is how Hart continually challenges herself. 'It's terrifying to wear those old worn-out shoes and let them go. We naturally are creatures of habit and we get scared to try new things – there is something scary about that, and between you and me I am going through that again with

producers, trying them out. I am so afraid of working and fucking it up, or their taking it away, and then going it's okay and I will be fine, sure, whatever. For me it's about being able to have the right working relationship. It comes down to being able to look at the truth and decide well, I can work with this.'

Singing from the heart, don't miss Beth Hart at this year's Bluesfest for her first-ever Australian performance.

station. We're about to stage and tour *My Radio Heart* and we're working on *The Gathering* that is being developed with local Bundjalung stories and artists. We're also developing a dance theatre work called *Cock Fight* with Animal Farm Collective, who gave audiences a thrilling taste of what they can do at our launch last week. We've also just done a series of artist-in-residencies with the community at the Winsome Hotel and the Lismore Soup Kitchen as part of the *Home Project* exploring homelessness in our region. Our shows aim to be performance events; they often take place outside the theatre or reflect local stories in playful and surprising ways.

What dance treats are in store? Lake will be mesmerising because the set is a flooded stage and the choreography is very emotive. Food also has a physical theatre element but it's a play – it's a beautifully conceived work by one of Australia's best choreographers, Kate Champion. I love this production and I'm sure audiences here will too.

What about *Henry V* – are audiences still enthralled with adaptations or new interpretations of Shakespeare? In short, yes! I know I don't enjoy Shakespeare in pantaloons. If you've seen Bell Shakespeare's productions in the last few years, you'll know they are among the best worldwide. *Julius Caesar* two years ago was the best Shakespeare I've ever seen and I have seen Shakespeare at The Globe in London and at international festivals. Bell strips it back to the concept and lets the language do the work. Their productions let the audience hear the ideas in Shakespeare but also help them keep up! The concept is often just a hint of setting and context – the rest is the words and the language, which is still so rich and vivid. In a world of tweets and media grabs it's such a pleasure to sit and listen to Shakespeare... I think I love it more as I get older.

# If you had to pick five shows to see all year, what would they be?

If I had to choose it would be *My Radio Heart, Food, Henry V, Walamanayuwi and the Seven Pamanui,* Circus Oz – and can I have another?... TaikOz, because it will just be so good to hear those drums resonate out into Lismore!







Not many actresses can look quite so alluring as Kate Winslet with no makeup, disheveled hair and corseted in a dowdy brown sleeveless dress. Frank (Josh Brolin) obviously thinks so too, when he arrives at her doorstep, along with her young son Henry (Gattlin Griffith), after abducting them from the local supermarket. Frank, bleeding from an appendix scar, is on the lam, a convicted murderer who has just escaped from prison. Adele (Winslet) is a single mum battling to cope with social alienation and depression.

Every work of fiction demands a suspension of disbelief and Jason Reitman's compassionate film of how our need to love and be loved, above all else, goes perilously close to failing this mandatory test. Told by Henry at different stages of his life (the last brief narration, by Toby Maguire, poses the question, 'why the earlier voice?'), the events unfold over the Labor Day long-weekend – five days that Reitman manages to make seem like weeks. Apart from Adele's phlegmatic acceptance of Frank's presence, I found it verging

#### on the implausible that a hunted killer could be holedup in a suburban house. playing baseball in the yard and working outside on the family car, without somebody noticing. But I was prepared to go with it because of the brooding sexuality that grows between Adele and Frank - even if Reitman, averting explicit carnality, tends to overdo the juicy erotica of a peach-pie-making scene. Meanwhile the pair's backstories are dealt out in short, sharp flashbacks. Adele's state of mind is explained by an unbearable loss and

Frank's crime is revealed as a cruel blow of fate. Winslet's sensibilities are unerring and Brolin, if a little too stoic, is good as a man wronged. Reitman might have thought twice about his cheesy coda, but all of the pieces of his cryptic jigsaw puzzle eventually come together to complete the unpredictable but satisfying big picture. What is apparent to the outside world is only ever the tip of the iceberg – which is how it is for all of us, isn't it? ~ John Campbell

# **Wine Review: Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc**

A BOTTLE OF MARLBOROUGH SAUVIGNON BLANC is a popular choice for Friday night drinks at The Echo, and indeed throughout the country. Darren Pearson, general manager of The Cellar, tells us a little more about this NZ wine that has become so popular in Australia.

Any wine aficionado will tell you that the standout grape variety of the last 10 years on the basis of sales growth in Australia has been NZ Sauvignon Blanc. The main reason seen for this growth is the high level of consistency across the primary grapegrowing region of Marlborough.

This consistency has given consumers the confidence to pick up a bottle of Marlborough Sauv Blanc knowing that they will be getting the zesty, pleasantly pungent, grapefruit-like zing that makes these wines extraordinarily popular, and that means they match well with a wide variety of foods, from simple dishes to the most complex nouvelle

Many wine aficionados lampoon Sauvignon Blanc for all tasting the same. This is one of the major misconceptions that NZ producers must battle if they wish to continue their success, as there is considerable flavour variation even across the Marlborough region if you care to look for it. Wines blended from grapes from the different subregions within Marlborough display different

Grapes grown within the Awatere Valley, with its layered river terraces, its free-draining soils, subtle altitude temperature variations and good airflow share characteristics, but of course even within the Valley each vineyard site is not homogeneous. Most display the distinct minerality of Awatere Sauvignon Blanc that has led to inevitable comparisons with the famous wines of Sancerre.

Upper Wairau, which was the first area to be planted and which catapulted Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc onto the world stage, delivers plumper, riper wines. Wairau Valley's deeper alluvial soils are prized because they deliver riper grapes and hence, richer wines. With a little experimentation you can

uncover some distinct gems.

#### **KOHA NUI RESERVE** MARLBOROUGH SAUVIGNON **BLANC (\$16.99)**

Eight parcels of Sauvignon Blanc were selected for this wine from vineyards in the Awatere Valley, and four from the Wairau Valley. Tasting this wine you may notice notes of stone fruit and guava, underpinned with notes of fresh herbs. The palate is brimming with vivacious fruit that is balanced with quite a long, crisp mineral finish.

#### **CAPE VIEW SOUNDS** MARLBOROUGH **SAUVIGNON BLANC** (\$14.99)

Comprised mostly of Wairau Valley fruit, this wine has a nose that is lifted and fresh with notes of passionfruit and grapefruit. The sweet fruit characters on the palate and fresh acidity combine to create an expressive, classy Sauvignon Blanc.



If you are after a singlevineyard purely Awatere Valley Sauvignon Blanc try this one. It is selected from two parcels of fruit from Yealand's Seaview Vineyard. This aromatic wine shows lifted flavours of blackcurrant with underlying notes of wet stone and thyme. The palate is elegant yet full with sufficient weight and texture, balanced by a flinty



minerality. This wine is a fantastic match with foods such as cheese salad, poultry dishes and a wide range of seafood dishes including freshly shucked natural oysters, prawns, green lip mussels and creamy scallops.





# Budget should be based on needs, not wants: ACOSS

The Australian Council of So- waste in the budget lies on the cial Service(ACOSS) has urged tax side of the ledger. For inthe federal government to deliver on its promise to put the nation's Budget on a sustainable long-term footing in a fair way that doesn't leave anyone behind, adding that future government entitlements and subsidies should be based on needs, not wants.

Speaking at the release of the peak body's federal budget submission, ACOSS CEO Dr Cassandra Goldie said, 'We agree with the treasurer that it's our duty to help people who are most vulnerable in our community. People are entitled to expect governments to provide income support and essential services such as age pensions, health services, and tax breaks for superannuation, but those entitlements can only be sustained and improved if they are based on need.

'Now is the right time for government action to clamp down on wasteful and inefficient expenditure to allow us to close the worst gaps in our economic and social infrastructure.

# Opportunity

'The government's first budget is a real opportunity to better direct spending and tax breaks to areas of greatest need, such as adequate income support and employment assistance for people who are unemployed. There's also great need in the areas of affordable housing and child care for low- and middleincome families, and for maintaining the critical support provided by community services helping the most vulnerable members of our community.

'The budget should take urgent action to meet the needs of those who are excluded from the benefits of a wealthy society - a job, affordable housing, a decent income, and basic community services such as disability services and dental and mental health care.

'These priorities are all the more important at a time when employment growth is stagnating. Already we see that more than 60 per cent of people receiving the unemployment allowance Newstart are left to survive for a year or more on \$36 a day without access to the training, work experience and job counselling they need to inflation in costs to consumers help them secure a job. More and governments at the same

stance, super tax breaks cost around \$40 billion each year, about the same as the age pension. Almost a third of the tax breaks for super contributions go to the top ten per cent of workers.

'The current set of retirement and age-based tax concessions are both unfair and inefficient. As the population ages, governments will face increasing and legitimate demands on health and agedcare services, yet less than 20 per cent of individuals over the age of 64 pay any income tax.

'Clearly, this is not sustainable. To begin the process of reining in these subsidies, ACOSS proposes restoring the \$25,000 annual cap on concessionally-taxed super contributions. We also want to see the curbing of income tax avoidance by the "churning" of wages through superannuation accounts that pay an equivalent pension; and progressively extending the 15 per cent tax on super fund earnings to accounts in the "pensions phase".

# Housing

'Another key area of reform is housing tax concessions, and in particular negative gearing which encourages excessive borrowing to invest in existing rental properties with a view to making capital gains rather than rental returns. This contributes to house price inflation and excessive levels of household debt during investment booms.

'Our proposal is to quarantine deductions for expenses relating to passive investment in housing, shares, collectables and similar assets purchased after January 1, 2015, to offset income received from those assets, including capital gains realised on their subsequent sale.

'We propose that half the revenue savings from this measure be earmarked to help alleviate Australia's worsening housing affordability crisis through an Affordable Housing Growth Fund and future expansion of the National Rental Affordability Scheme (NRAS).

'On the spending side, there is scope to redirect health and childcare programs towards those in most need and to stem

**Double parking** Minimum fine is \$304 and 2 demerit points

**Obstructing traffic** Minimum fine is \$169

# Budget 2014/15: housing can fill growth gap

The federal government has the opportunity to leverage off the expanding housing sector in order to restore growth in Budget 2014/15, according to the Housing Industry Association (HIA).

The home building industry generates around \$70 billion each year for the Australian economy and is recognised as a key driver of employment and economic activity as the investment phase of the mining boom winds down.

HIA chief executive industry policy and media, Graham Wolfe, highlighted the imperative for May's Budget to contain measures that promote growth in new home building.

'It is important that the Commonwealth removes impediments to growth in the sector, invests in training for the future workforce and ensures that it improves the return that it is currently getting from investments in affordable housing programs,' said Mr Wolfe.

Key measures being proposed by the industry for the 2014/15 Budget include:

 A Productivity Commission Inquiry into the cost of housing, including taxation and its impact on affordability, productivity and economic activity.

• Increasing incentives for employers of apprentices, and improved commencement and completion incentives for apprentices.

• Continued funding for the National Rental Affordability Scheme, with greater accountability measures and tying Commonwealth housing programs to performance incentive benchmarks targeting improvements in the supply of new housing.

In its foreword to its submission, the HIA notes: 'Housing is a vital tenet of economic infrastructure, as it plays a key role enhancing competitiveness

and driving improvements in the standard of living. Accordingly, it is vital that policy settings allow the industry to provide adequate supply of new housing stock.

'Higher residential construction activity has the potential to fill the gap in economic activity that is currently emerging. The domestically oriented nature of residential building means that growth in housing activity provides greater than proportionate returns to economic activity and public finances. Our proposals for Budget 2014/15 thus represent a roadmap for a stronger industry, healthier government finances and a more prosperous Australia. # Making homes with a 3D printer

The University of Southern California's Behrokh Khoshnevis has outlined how a novel extruder mechanism combined with robotic machines could efficiently print habitats.

Through a great deal of trial and error, Prof Khoshnevis was able to make a printhead that can extrude wet cement which, thanks to a trowel fixed to the head and a special hardener, can keep its form as each successive layer is printed.

Using this method, the professor has created walls that are six feet high, with layers that are six inches high and four inches thick. He believes that it can be

expanded to whole buildings.


The 3D printer, mounted onto a gantry frame and weighing about 500lbs, could be brought to a construction site, where it would contour craft the house either like a giant RepRap, with the ground as the build platform or, possibly, climbing up the house, one layer at a time, and returning back to the ground upon completion of a job.

He also suggested placing the printer arms on rails so that they could print one house and slide on down the line to construct another, making it possible to print whole

neighbourhoods quickly.

This technique, and others that the Khoshnevis research team is working on, would present a number of solutions to problems facing the modern world. The professor believes



his technology would make the construction of efficient buildings so cheap and efficient that we could print low-income housing for people in impoverished areas the world over.

3D printing homes would save time, as well as reduce waste and human error. The process

could also save lives. In the 3D printing

process, steelreinforced cement can be used, but, as the professor points out, specific printed geometries will yield more stability than the traditional cubes we often find ourselves in in the

western world. Flat walls lack the stability of the curves made possible with contour crafting.

With the ability to print, quickly and affordably, architecturally sound buildings, Prof Khoshnevis believes that we could have prevented the loss of life brought about by natural disasters, such as the 40,000 people lost in an earthquake in his native Iran.

The team is already focused on creating complex extruders and robotic arms that give the impression of a hybrid manufacturing process, with arms that can eject and shape concrete at the same that other arms insert plumbing, wiring, insulation and the like.
