Big weekend for SES crews

SES were kept busy in the Mullumbimby area last Sunday and Monday, after heavy storms ripped through the north coast.

New SES commander Mike Davison-Long, who heads the unit based on Coolamon Scenic Drive just outside Mullum, says his crews responded to 26 requests and worked tirelessly Sunday night and all through Monday.

'The call-outs were mostly for fallen trees and road blockages,' he said.

Volunteers needed

Additionally Mr Davison-Long says volunteers are needed to join the team, and those interested are encouraged to apply via the SES website at www.ses.nsw.gov.au.

And as of going to press, nearly 200 north coast Essential Energy customers were still without power 72 hours after the storm.

Those affected are in areas around Goonengerry and Federal, and an Essential Energy spokesperson said the main issue facing crews was trees that had fallen over power lines.

'We've had to bring in vegetation contractors to get access to some heavily treed areas,' she said.

Extra crews brought in

'Our crews were on the ground all Sunday night. They worked for 16 hours, which is the safe allowable maximum, and we've now brought in extra crews from Coffs Harbour, Grafton and Tweed Heads,' she said.

A total of 9,800 customers were taken off the grid by Sunday evening's storms, which wreaked havoc around the region and caused damage to Lismore Base Hospital.

Around eight hundred locals joined in Byron Bay Railway Park on Sunday morning to tell the Paris Climate Conference what they want: a planet fit for forests, marine creatures and children.

Millions all over the world came out over the weekend to raise their voices in a similar way.

Colourful marches were held in almost every city, demanding that

the negotiators produce binding targets for real emissions reduction.

Not carbon credits, which are another corporate centralised solution, but true reductions in fossil fuels and increased local short-haul economy support, organic agriculture and ceasing forest clearing.

In the Byron march, the stormy weather miraculously abated for a few hours, while attendees heard speakers and musicians. It was bright, loving and informative. Representatives of all the three major political parties spoke, and ecologist Mary Gardner spoke of the oceans. Helena Norberg-Hodge spoke of the need to build a movement to oppose corporate solutions to debt and climate change.

Spirit, a 10-year-old girl, enchanted the audience with her pure song. Kudra Falla-Ricketts, from the Australian Youth Climate Coalition, received great applause. Climate angels hovered, and capoeira girls

pounded out Brazilian tunes.

A heart-shaped human mandala was created in front of Beach Hotel, accompanied by song.

Aboriginal elders spoke.

Unfortunately, staging a rally now requires permits, plans and insurance, which makes free speech more convoluted. The Greens were very supportive in this regard. Overall it was wonderful expression of Byron's spirit and defence of our gorgeous environment!

Farmer fights to refuse mining on private land

Farmers and landholders in the northern rivers are calling on federal and state ministers attending Friday's Council of Australian Governments (COAG) meeting to give them the right to say 'no' to mining.

Current legislation does not permit landowners the legal right to refuse mining on their property, let alone on neighbouring lands.

Kyogle grazier Peter Stackhouse said it was vital for the meeting to give farmers, landholders and traditional owners the power to refuse mining companies access.

Mr Stackhouse is also calling for an inquiry by the ACCC, using powers it already has, to investigate whether the unconventional gas industry have engaged in 'unconscionable conduct' in their dealings with landholders.

Govt pushes to expand medium-density housing

The NSW government is seeking feedback on a proposal 'to make it easier to build dual occupancies, manor homes and townhouses or terraces if they meet set design and building standards.'

Fast-track

The NSW department of planning says the government is looking to 'fast-track'

approvals, which would 'cut more than 50 days out of the approval process and reduce costs to homeowners.'

The say that currently there is no consistent state-wide planning policy for medium-density housing.

Subs for Holiday Letting policy close Friday

A major shake-up to managing how residential houses are temporarily let for holiday-makers is on display by Byron Council, with public submissions closing December 4.

It's called the Short Term Rental Accommodation policy (STRA), and would be achieved by amending the Byron Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2014.

The policy would include signage for holiday lets, and define the number of visitors that can stay in rooms.


According to Council's website, the purpose of the proposal is to, 'introduce a special provision to define and then require development consent for short-term rental accommodation.

The annual statistics for Liberation Larder are out, and highlight the growing need from disadvantaged members of our community.

The volunteer charity provides delicious and nutritious meals from the Byron Bay Community Centre.

They aim to 'rescue good food that would otherwise end up in landfill and make sure this food reaches people who need it.'

Liberation Larder's Helen Hamilton says, 'In the last year, a total of 28,517 meals – or 548 meals per week – were provided.'

'This includes breakfast, lunch and emergency meals. This represents a ten per cent increase on the previous year.'

Ms Hamilton says it will be served from 5.30pm to 6pm at the Fletcher Street entrance to the Byron Bay Community Centre.

Works and load limit changes for James, Parkers and Booyong bridges - from Monday 7 December

James, Parkers, and Booyong bridges in Byron Shire will have essential repairs commencing on 7 December 2015. The works to the single lane bridges will cause **delays of up to one hour** and motorists are advised to find alternative routes to avoid potential inconvenience and interruptions when travelling. Emergency services and school buses will have priority access and minimal delays. Weather permitting, the works are planned for:

- Monday, 7 December James Bridge (Booyong Road)
- Tuesday, 8 December Parkers Bridge (Friday Hut Road)
- Wednesday, 8 December Booyong Bridge (Booyong Road).

Signage and traffic control will be in place prior to and during the repairs. The works are only interim measures and unfortunately Council will also have to lower the load limits for Parker and Booyong Bridges down to 3 tonnes. James Bridge will keep its 15 tonne load limit. The reduced bridge load limits will commence from Thursday, 17 December and monitoring will be in place. Waste and recycling collection will not be affected. • Almost a quarter of businesses are sole traders, and approximately 60 per cent of businesses operate with four or fewer staff.

• The number of small businesses has increased in the last three years, while the number with five to nine staff has dropped.

• A significant 46.4 per cent of businesses have been established in the last five years, with 10.1 per cent starting up in the last year alone.

 Brunswick Heads is a very tourism-dependent town, with 91.4 per cent of businesses relying on tourism to some extent, while 18.5 per cent receive 90 per cent or more of their income from tourism.

• Employment is up by 12.2 per cent since the 2012 survey.

• 142 businesses provide 845 jobs.

 Referrals and co-operative marketing are the preferred ways of working collaboratively

Schoolies for Schooling raises \$17k for Timor-Leste children

While some schoolies arrive by bus, others arrive by plane.

by bus, others arrive by plane And many arrive by car.

But recent school leavers Adam Hegedns and Alexi Provano arrived at Byron Bay by foot.

They left their school, Waverly College, and walked around 800km from Bondi to Byron to raise funds for Schoolies for Schooling, which aims to build a school for one of Australia's closest neighbours, Timor-Leste.

The 21-day Bondi to Byron walk raised \$17,050 of their \$18,000 target.

Adam said, 'We hope others will follow in our wake in subsequent years, not only to help bring the reality of education to Timor-Leste.

'We also wanted to show

The pair were inspired after a school visit to the Ralico Craic region, where they found young children desperate for an education.

Residential proposal knocked back

The Land and Environment Court's decision to dismiss an appeal and uphold Byron Shire Council's refusal of a proposed community title subdivision at the Broken Head quarry site has been welcomed by Greens MP and local resident Jan Barham.

She said, 'The quarry site had never been included as a site for residential development in Council's planning instruments and strategic plans for the region over the past two decades.'

'[Additionally] the residential proposal was inconsistent with the zoning and character of the area.'

Precious biodiversity

'Because of the precious biodiversity of the Broken Head area and the significance of sites in the area to the traditional custodians of these lands, it is important that the area protected and that rehabilitation of the quarry site proceeds.

Ms Barham said that as a result of the court's decision, Council's refusal will stand.

'I congratulate and thank all of the campaigners and community members who made submissions on the proposal and provided evidence during the appeal.'


BTC co-founder Anouska Gammon says, 'We're overwhelmed by the support we've received from our community.



Northern rivers residents have donated more than 600 Christmas hampers for farmers out west struggling against drought.

Eltham resident Anne Thomspon, organiser of the North Coast Drought Appeal, has been organising the hampers over the last 21 years.

Ms Thompson said the Masonic Hall at Eltham was 'like Santa's Wonderland' with more than 400 hampers already packed, with another 200 to be filled during the next week.

'The response from the region has been overwhelming,

boxes of gift-wrapped toys and presents will also be sent to farming families.

Ms Thompson said packing will continue until December 4. 'A small and changing team of volunteers come each day to do what is needed - from unloading, sorting and packing, to gift wrapping and filling Christmas bags with toiletries and laundry products.'

On Saturday morning December 5, the Clunes RFS will be loading the boxes onto approximately 14 pallets.

She said Richmond Sand and Gravel had offered the use of a forklift, and the shrinkwrapped pallets would be loaded onto trucks supplied by Wizz Couriers as agents for Tamex, who will once again freight all the boxes out to areas around Bourke, Walgett, Lightning Ridge, North Coonamble, Pilliga Come-by-Chance and Mungindi.

A positive vision for Byron

Now is your last chance to have input on the West Byron development: public submissions close Friday for the development control plan (DCP)

With time running out to have your say on West Byron, The Echo profiles a proposal by retired town planner and longtime local John Sparks.

Despite very vocal public opposition, West Byron was hand-balled to the state government by Council's probig-development faction.

The result will see a large new suburb/commercial hub opposite the Arts and Industry Estate on Ewinsgdale Road that critics claim comes without adequate provisions.

Despite the unknowns, Mr Sparks provided his thoughts on how the development could become a 'sustainable, environmentally positive and economically viable.

He says he aimed for a 'positive vision', where retaining the existing natural environment are key features.


'There is an amazing wetland that stretches from Tallows to Tyagarah,' he says.

'From the sea to Saint Helena hill, [it all] contains a threatened ecological community: 48 threatened species, and 39 migratory species as well as giving us clean air, pure water, health, food and the simple enjoyment of being part of nature.

Exploited by govcorp

'Some government and corporate interests want to exploit us by using our energy, our water supply and drainage, our waste collection, our food, our retail, educational and community facilities so they can fill part of this wetland to build houses to increase their own wealth.

'You cannot draw a line on paper and say it is a sensitive wetland on one side, with roads, earthworks and buildings on the other – it is all eas along the boardwalks and interconnected and in many nature trails. cases mutually exclusive.



Within Mr Spark's proposal is wetland regeneration, as well as environmental educational and research centres, including koala and wetland centres. An eco resort is also proposed, along with community gardens and a reduction in expected housing from 800 plus to 200.

'The proposed fill will destroy more than 10ha of native vegetation, change the biodiversity and reduce our flood-storage capacity, causing increased flood levels in the town centre and low-lying residential areas.'

Increase habitat

Mr Sparks's plan is to widen the central drain into a series of ponds, which filter water through reed beds to increase habitat, allow canoe exploration, increase flood storage capacity and reduce flood levels in the existing town centre and residential areas.

He also proposes an environmental studies centre, which would create revenue to offset the expected 800plus housing lots the developers are expecting to sell. Instead, he proposes 200 residential lots, and says of the economic plan, 'it is all feasible if we have a wetland to show and research. Visitors won't come to look at houses.

'[Instead] we can learn about koalas and other endangered species, regenerate, research and discover new ar-

contained within a less sensitive area and are totally selfsufficient by generating their own energy, collecting and reusing their own water, treating their own sewage, recycling their own waste and growing their own food in a natural zero-carbon environment.'

Mayor urges response

Meanwhile, both the mayor Simon Richardson and deputy mayor Paul Spooner are urging residents to respond to the proposal's Friday deadline.

In a statement they said, 'The pro-overdevelopment majority on Council see this as their chance to rubberstamp approval for West Byron, ignoring the same issues that have always concerned the community, but which still have not been addressed.

[They include] koalas and threatened species, acid sulfate soils, traffic and flooding. Our concern is that the Draft DCP is treating the site as if it is just another greenfield development.

'It is not. West Byron is a drained wetland and a highly sensitive area. It is essential that advance planning considers the sensitivity of this site and incorporates protective measures upfront in the DCP rather than coming after what has already been planned.

Subs = pressure

Both councillors say if the council received a very large number of submissions, it would put immense pressure on councillors to amend the Draft West Byron DCP.

Travelling in China this year I was ready for anything.

Pollution, rubbish and people, people, people.

Yet I honestly didn't expect to see so much beauty.

Crystal blue waters off the Island of Hinan created the ideal tropical island experience. On land, however, it is a different story.

I fell in love with Wanning, Riyue Bay and the home of the World Surfing League's (WSL) Longboard championships.

With a teacher friend, part of our travel consisted of connecting with local organisations and learning about the education programs in schools and how China is using technology to bridge connection with other countries.

Landscape of filth

We spent time with the local surf school connecting with the kids and organised a beach clean-up activity, which they have to do on a regular basis. Sadly, their beaches are some of the most rubbishfilled beaches we had come across and the beach clean-up of about 15-strong locals and foreigners hardly put a dent in the landscape of filth.

This is where the story takes a disturbing twist. The beach landscape is one thing, but as you look towards the surf you can see in your peripheral vision a ghost-town surf contest site overlooking the point break. All the judg-

The rubbish always gets left for the local kids to clean up, and the world would like to see more responsibility from the surf companies and the Chinese government.

In an attempted to contact the WSL, I asked the questions: 'Will this be the sight I see next year when I return to visit my friends', and, 'Do you think this is acceptable way to leave your competition site?

I have had no response from the organisation.

On December 5 the next world longboard championships will be held, and the event is an amazing boost for the local economy.

All the hotels and restaurants will surely be very happy with the business.

But who suffers from this?

The Wanning surf club is struggling. Their infrastructure is hazardous and falling down. And the upkeep of community projects such as the Aboriginal children's surf school are suffering.

These are the same people who kindly look after the pro surfers' plethora of surf boards at their clubhouse in the off season.

Beside the token surfclothing that the staff are wearing, not much seems to go their way. Without support this club will become the next ghost town resort.

Good luck to Australian champions Harley Ingeby and Chelsea Williams as they defend their world titles. These guys knows how precious Riyue Bay is, and I hope they read this.

Push for merging Councils flawed

A leading academic specialising in local government claims a flawed methodology is being used to force NSW councils into amalgamations by the state government.

The state government recently pushed the 'Fit For The Future' regime upon councils. Byron Council was deemed 'fit.'

The Independent Pricing

and Regulatory Tribunal (IP-ART) came under scrutiny owing to its methodology used for assessing councils.

Dr Joseph Drew, from the University of New England's Centre for Local Government, said such moves are unlikely to benefit local communities and questioned what outcomes would result from flawed assumptions.



The free event will run from 7 till 10pm and is sponsored by Stone & Wood.




Pay Parking Byron Bay



Starts mid December 2015

Byron Shire Council has adopted a 'pay by plate' system for parking in the Byron Bay town centre. When in place from mid December, if you have a Pay Parking Exemption all you need to do is park, enter your vehicle licence plate and choose the duration of your stay - no more to pay. Staying beyond the time limit can result in a penalty. For Exemption holders, it's a paperless system and there is no need to print a ticket and display in your car. Current Byron Shire Resident Parking Coupon holders can also upgrade to an Exemption. If you don't have an Exemption, each time you park you will need to enter your licence plate number into the meter, choose the duration of your stay, pay the amount displayed and place the ticket on your dashboard. Motorcycles (as with any registered vehicle) will also need to purchase an Exemption or pay at the meter.

Can locals purchase an Exemption?

Yes you can. Exemptions will apply to the licence plate of registered vehicles (including motorcycles) - regardless of which state/territory the vehicle is registered. If you are a local, ratepayer, Byron Shire business or work in the Pay Parking Area, you can **REGISTER NOW** for an Exemption. Exemptions are non-refundable and fraudulent applications will have the Exemption revoked. Proof of local residency, rate notice or place of employment will be required. Exemptions will be available per vehicle for the following categories:

Byron Shire Residents and Ratepayers

- \$50 per year per vehicle.
- FREE if you are a Byron Shire resident and hold a valid Centrelink issued pensioner (Blue) card. FREE if you have a Mobility Parking Permit.

Byron Shire Businesses

Available to an organisational entity located at a fixed address e.g. commercial/business operation or volunteer organisation (i.e. not private individuals). The account system allows multiple vehicles to be entered and offers the benefit of 'sharing' an Exemption (conditions apply).

Workers

\$100 per year per vehicle. Only available to people who work at a fixed address within the pay parking area, but live outside of Byron Shire (subject to proof).

Small biz v big biz

The dominating market power that Coles and Woolies hold was recently highlighted by the Council of Small Business Australia (COSBOA).

Not to be confused with Business Council of Australia, COSBOA is 'Australia's peak body exclusively representing the interests of small businesses'.

The other mob lobby for the big end of town.

Anyway COSBOA took particular aim at WesFarmers, who own Coles, and the nation's largest retail union, the Shop Distributive and Allied Employees' Association (SDA).

Even the Business Council of Australia got a spray. COSBOA CEO Peter Strong accused them all of inhibiting business and innovation after the federal government decided to delay the implementation of changes to Section 46 (Misuse of Market Power) within the Competition and Consumer Act 2010.

A review is pending, he says.

'When two major companies have such far reaching influence on producers and manufacturers, innovation is stifled,' he said. He went on to say that 'changes in Section 46 are vital to ensure we do not develop similar damaging domination in other areas, such as aged care.'

As for any outcomes to address the obscene inequality that exists with corporate dominance, it appears next March is the best to hope for, when roundtable discussions will be held over Section 46 and market power.

Mr Strong said, 'We have been assured by the government that all discussions will be open and the decisions will be made with competition, innovation and choice in mind...'

It's often been said that small business is the backbone of any economy. According to a report last year by the Office of the NSW Small Business Commissioner (OSBC), NSW small businesses comprise approximately 96 per cent of all businesses. And that includes almost 60 per cent who are either sole traders or partnerships!

Business that employ 20 to 199 employees make up just 2.3 per cent, while businesses with more than 200 employees total just 0.2 per cent of all businesses in NSW.

As for paypacket spend, a statistic contained in Malcolm Knox's 2015 book Supermarket Monsters claims that on average, every man, woman and child in this country spends \$100 a week with either a Coles or Woolies outlet.

Now that's a lot of money that doesn't recycle effectively within the community.

Mullum's Shop Local campaign is now underway, and finishes at Christmas. There is no better way to ensure that our economy remains strong than to shop locally. Go local!

Brave steps for climate talkfest

as has not exactly been a riotous success; in fact he has been marked down at just 15 per cent.

But the never-give-up opposition leader ploughs on regardless, and last week came up with another three wizard wheezes. The first was just silly - making the cost of cigarettes even more unaffordable than it already is. For heaven's sake, if you're serious, just ban the bloody things - make the poisonous products of the merchants of death illegal, as they should be. Stop fiddle-farting around.

The second was a suggestion of parental leave for victims of domestic violence, which was a timely and topical proposal that even Malcolm Turnbull thought was worth talking about.

And then came the big one: cutting emission reductions by 45 per cent by 2030. This was indeed a courageous decision - indeed, Turnbull called it heroic, if, of course, uncosted and far too expensive even if it had been. Christopher Pyne, unleashing his inner revolutionary, described it simply as mad.

Of course, if it had been Turnbull's own idea – which, in happier circumstances, it easily might have been - it would have been spun as agile and nimble, an innovative response to the challenges of the most exciting time in human history, looking forward to jobs that have not even been invented yet. But Shorten, somewhat less lyrical, cut straight to the chase: it was really all about Turnbull himself, who was going to the Paris climate change conference carrying the baggage of the Abbott years, forced by the sceptics, denialists and log-rollers of the conservative faction that reluctantly allowed

ill Shorten's year of idehim to become prime minister.

It was not inspirational stuff, but it was a fair cop: Turnbull has been struggling - manfully, but still struggling - to explain his spectacular tergiversation over the policies he once espoused so enthusiastically, and, more importantly, over the devastating put-downs of Abbott's Direct Action agenda.

To be fair, the new leader has done his best; he has managed to avoid the obvious accusation

especially the green edges of it, continue to rate climate change as a genuine and pressing issue, perhaps even a game changer. But a large majority of coalition voters have put it aside, which means that it is no longer the urgent topic it was nearly a decade ago - remember, it was so fraught that the Libs changed their leader because of it.

Shorten's first task will be to return it front and centre; if climate change is to be an election issue, perhaps the overriding election issue, people have to start talking about it again. The science, of course, is on his side; but then it always has been. And Turnbull, for all his hedging about policy, is a true

believer, which will help.

But most important of all will be the empirical evidence that the world is changing, and not for the better. We are told that the last five years have been the hottest on record, and that this year will be the hottest of them all. And we can see it happening: more extreme weather events and now an early bushfire season, with catastrophic consequences likely. Already there have been several deaths, multiple injuries and enormous losses in property, livestock and the environment.

No-one will rejoice in the natural - or at least partially man-made - disasters, certainly not Shorten. But he would not be human if he did not see that they will focus public attention on the need for what Turnbull might call a calm, clinical, clear-eyed and professional response. And, he might add, one that makes sense.

Shorten has offered the germ of an idea to provide one. Whether he has the talent and ability to bring it to fruition is yet to be seen. But it is, at least,

that Direct Action is ridiculously expensive and economically absurd, and instead has gone back to a slogan: well, at least it works. Well, up to a point, and at least in the short term.

Turnbull knows as well as anyone else that shovelling out taxpayers' money to tweak the marginal efficiencies that technology will deliver in any case is, in the end, unsustainable: what will be needed is improvements on an industry-wide basis to stop carbon pollution, and this will mean some form of cap-and-trade system, what Abbott and his followers continue to insist is actually a carbon tax.

Direct Action was never meant to be more than a stopgap, something to buy Abbott a bit of time to placate the activists until a more pressing distraction came along. And as far as Turnbull is concerned, it still is; he has already begun hinting that, when the time comes, he will start working towards a real solution.

But in the meanwhile he

In October this year, the NSW Sciupgraded koalas in NSW from being 'vulnerable' to 'endangered' and has made a preliminary determination that koalas on the far north coast are facing a very high risk of extinction in the near future.

Dogs and cats are the biggest killers of our wildlife and with more and more habitat being taking away by housing developments we can at least help by reducing the impact of domestic animals. I believe we could have up to 1,000 new homes at West Byron. If half of those homes had dogs that would mean 500 more dogs in the Bay! We already have trouble policing the beaches north of Belongil, so many disrespectful dog owners walking their dogs in protected habitat zones, startling birds we have been trying to protect for years.

Visitors come to Byron Bay for its natural beauty and wildlife. We must protect this valuable asset and do all we can to reduce the environmental damage that West Byron will cause. If you care about keeping Byron beautiful, please make a submission to Council - one paragraph will do. Let them know what you want protected. You've got until 4/12/15 - submissions@byron.nsw.gov.au.

■ I consider that the planning process for West Byron has been totally bastardised. It is a war of attrition, eroding the site's values at each step. This community's chance to safeguard the environmental values of West Byron has been squandered. Council's DCP is part of the problem, not part of the solution.

At the zoning stage the Department of Planning decided to ignore the identified core koala habitat on the site, zoning some core koala habitat for housing and locating the most intense development on and around the best habitat.

They said the DCP would take care of koalas and include measures to reduce impacts, such as protecting core habitat, making swimming pools and fences koalafriendly, reducing car speeds and controlling dogs.

Now Council's DCP is proposing roads and tracks through core habitat, allowing intense development around it, not including any mitigation measures, and has identified a koala corridor that avoids koala habitat. They say koalas can be dealt with later by the developers.

The developers' fauna study identified core habitat for the nationally vulnerable Wallum Sedge Frog and said it would be totally protected, not in the rezoning but in the DCP. So it was zoned for housing. Now Council's DCP is putting roads through the frog's wetland and required buffers, saying the frogs can be considered later by the developer.

The DoP approved a massive drain through the site which will drain identified acid sulfate soils, generating a flow of sulfuric acid and heavy metals into the Belongil estuary. Rather than establishing controls to limit the drain's impacts, Council's DCP rubber-stamps it, saying that the developers can consider the impacts on acid runoff and the estuary later.

Similarly the developer's traffic study identified a whole variety of road upgrades as required to cope with West Byron, with the roundabouts, the bypass and four-laning Ewingsdale Road just the start. Yet Council fails to link the traffic increases associated with each development stage to the required road upgrades first being in place.

DCPs should provide detailed planning and design guidelines to support the planning controls in the LEP. Council should be setting parameters for a development that avoids impacts on koalas, Wallum Sedge Frogs and Wallum Froglets. One that is not dependent on draining acid sulfate soils and using a quarter of a million tonnes of fill. Instead Council has decided to rubber-stamp the developers' plans and leave it up to them to work out the details later.

Given that the planning system has been so debased this is likely to be the only chance this community will have to shape the future of West Byron. You need to tell Council and Councillors that this is not good enough.

The new biodiversity officer will be an expert in their field without a supervisory role.

I am saddened our current biodiversity team leader is leaving us. He is a terrific guy and an exemplary, professional and proficient staff member. As chair of Council's biodiversity and sustainability committee and someone who has long witnesses great biodiversity enhancement work, I know just how many highly skilled local biodiversity specialists we have in the Shire.

I look forward to working alongside the next biodiversity officer who will be highly skilled, passionate and effective - just what we expect in Byron Shire.

The NSW Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 provides a detailed definition for offensive noise.



emitted from a premises which disturbs the comfort or repose (rest or sleep) of someone who is outside the premises. This is designed for police, dedicated EPA and local council officers as a guide and is in operation 24/7.

There is a problem in interpretation of offensive noise as the measurement by

definition is a qualitative assessment. In the NSW EPA booklet 'Dealing with Neighbourhood Noise' it says 'what is music to one person is noise to another'.

This qualitative assessment is likely to lead to dispute between holiday-let owners/managers and affected neighbours about whether noise is offensive. Neighbours

are often disturbed by loud music, yelling, screaming and shouting that comes from holiday let tenants.

The NSW DPE-endorsed Holiday Rental Code of Conduct will become mandatory with the implementation of Byron Council's holiday letting policy. A meaning for noise is provided in this Code: 'noise means any sound that

is offensive to occupiers of neighbouring properties.' Therefore, by definition it will be the neighbours that will judge whether noise from holiday lets is offensive.

In this age of technology accurate handheld noise meters are widely available and should be used. Justifiably and correctly, Byron Shire Council's holiday letting pol-

icy has classified all holiday lets as commercial premises. Therefore, noise limits set for suburban areas as determined by the NSW EPA Industrial Noise Policy apply.

For a residence in a suburban area during the day (7am to 6pm Monday to Saturday and 8am to 6pm Sunday and public holidays) the maximum noise level is 55 to 60 decibels (dB). For evening (6pm to 10pm) the maximum noise level is 45 to 50 dB and for night (remaining time periods) the range is 40 to 45dB. Measurements are taken at the boundary interface. A normal conversation is equivalent to 6odB.

Therefore, Council should apply noise limits as determined by the NSW EPA Industrial Noise Policy for all holiday lets. Council's holiday letting policy is on public exhibition until December 4.





The fate of the Bay can be changed

The secret business of Byron Bay is sea-change. Only some is physical. The Wollongbar wrecked here in 1921 and settled into life as a surf break. Nearby, the submerged wreck of Tassie lll from 1944 became an artificial reef for marine wildlife and human snorkelers. Beyond her hull are a few broken wharf pilings, crusted with sponges and coral. Everything else from the two enormous jetties, each about 400 metres in length, is gone. The 1885 jetty was removed in 1945. The 1928 jetty was blown up in 1974. Now, the settlers' ambition itself is changing.

Busy port

Once in 1897, Henry Lawson wrote that 'the hearts of rovers hunger for the Ports of the Open Sea.' Byron Bay was one such port and many came aboard ships such as the Wollongbar and its replacement Wollongbar ll. Such adventure came at a price in blood. Red of Aboriginal Australians and others. Gold sap of cedars. Gold and later rutile from inside the heart of the beach sands itself.

The next payments were in cows, first boiled down for tallow, later milked for cream for butter, butter and more butter. The skim milk fed pigs later turned into bacon. pire. Such wealth was literally

Some were reinvested in banana crops. Others were put into the buildings of town and ironically, the draining of the very wetlands which nursed baby fish. Still more was paid with the enormous bodies of whales themselves. In the 19th century, their oil became fuel for lamps. In the 20th century, it became margarine made in Germany. The carcasses became chicken feed and fertilisers for crops.

Wealth lost

By 1962, no more was extracted from the whales, their numbers greatly diminished. By the 1980s, no more was taken from the beach sand, the dunes all flattened. Dairy farming was over. The wealth of primary production all paid out. What's a port to do?

So far, Byron Bay has taken up tourism and real estate. These bubbles distract us from coastal problems and marine opportunities. The mega-development proposed for West Byron is suggested in Ewingsdale and Sunrise

too. Making real estate of the coastal strip will close out an even more important opportunity which would make us wealthy again in primary production with a twist.

The Belongil and Tallow waterways, with their tendrils through West Byron, Ewingsdale and Suffolk Park are an interconnected fertile zone. Where is the tally for the blood price paid here: coastal emu, wallaby, possum, goanna, birds, snakes, sugar gliders and more?

Hotspots

The remnants here make one of Australia's wildlife 'hotspots'. With the help of Arakwal people, parts are protected in the Arakwal Park and the reserves of Cumbebin, Broken Head and Tyagarah. To successfully build this wealth, more of the fertile zones plus their openings to the sea must be managed with this kind of capital in mind.

Gary Nabhan is a US leader of the international movement in 'place based foods' supporting indigenous and cultural food traditions. (http://garynabhan.com/i/) He helps people identify their unique regional foods

and organise the conservation and rehabilitation needed to rebuild fish, shellfish, crops, orchards, birds and other animals. One pathway is from 'rarity to community restoration to market value, creating local livelihoods and food security as well as renewing productive ecosystems. This planned retreat, from beachfront living and marginal farming, will return to the community an enduring wealth.

Some tell me it's impossible here in Byron. That people here only look to the short-term gain to be got from inappropriate development and large-scale tourism, to hell with the consequences. That there is no halting mega-development or changing tack towards sustainability. Is that us - Aboriginals and newcomers, investors and council, project managers and employees? Haven't they heard of the sea-change?

Stay steady

The collective imagination of Byron is no longer dreaming of ports or the British Empire. The spell of this place is making of us 'something rich and strange'. We can invest our wealth, private and public, physical and mental, away from the nightmare of drowning with our feet locked into the concrete blocks of mega-development. With every letter, submission, concept plan and investment, we can keep our feet steady in the rich coastal mud. Residents of the future will find that, unlike so many other places, the wealth here is edible, drinkable and breathable.



Dodgy trade, dosh and Daesh

A few weeks ago in The Echo I described the 'trade deal' called the Trans-Pacific Partnership as government of global corporations, by global corporations, for global corporations.

Since then the 6,000 page deal has been published and PM Turnbull assures us that the TPP says our governments will still be allowed to pass laws on our environment, labor conditions, and such - so what's to worry about?

This: corporations will have the right to sue all governments in their own corporate court if they believe any law will cost them money, even suing for payment of 'lost profits' if, for example, some government was to ban

These lawsuits will be judged by corporate lawvers, and they will cost governments huge fortunes to defend.

The Labor Party says it's still reading the previously secret text (they could have read it at WikiLeaks months ago). Greens trade spokesperson Peter Whish-Wilson



said the whole thing is a done deal and gives multinationals 'carte blanche'.

Malcolm's money

Last month I noted that Malcolm Turnbull put all his \$180 million stash in Wall Street funds, meaning he believes these banksters make fine investments in upstanding companies - which gives us serious reason to worry about what he'll do with our nation's economy.

Now we've learned that some of his Wall Street funds are invested in ExxonMobil, which has just been accused of knowing for 30 years that global warming was a disaster in the making - and responding by burying the evidence and paying academics to run a global denial campaign.

So, New York State is suing them for financial fraud, which is what the American tobacco industry was convicted of at a cost to them

of over \$9 billion in fines. ExxonMobil will defend itself in part by pointing out they shifted away from coal to 'cleaner' gas. Like switching to menthol cigs?

The Greens and climate advocacy group 350.org have demanded the Turnbulls divest their ExxonMobil stock, as they did with their Philip Morris shares recently.

Daesh it all

Finally, last week I wrote about Syria and the militants who are beheading, raping and marauding through Iraq and Syria and referred to them as ISIL, which stands for the Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant. Aka the Islamic State, or IS - or the Islamic State in Iraq and al-Sham, or ISIS. Now the trend is to call them 'Daesh', which is the Arabic acronym of ISIS, but also happens to be an Arabic word meaning 'bigots who impose their views on others'. In case there's any doubt about that characterisation, they've promised to cut your tongue out if you call them that.

Enova deadline extended

■ The team behind Enova Community Energy seems to be working treble overtime to reach their capital raise minimum of \$3million. They certainly seem willing and able, with experience of the wider world. Their credentials are impressive (see the website).

They had wanted to resolve the capital raise before the festive season. But they have had to put back the share-offer closure date twice. The offer will now close at 5pm (AEST) on December 17, 2015. Given that there is a great deal of talk about the ideals of renewable energy and acting locally in this community, I'm wondering why the money's not matching the mouth.

Maybe \$1,000 per share is a bit of stretch for most of us? If so, maybe those folks haven't heard that they can share a share. Quite a few are doing this, including me. There are guidelines on Enova's website at enovaenergy. com.au.

- 1. The highest price you can get for sending your own solar electricity back into the grid (feed in tariff) - about 10 cents per kWh for most

electricity dollars will stay in our region instead of being zapped off to big city or foreign fat cats.

- 3. Enova's local staff will answer your phone calls; and tell you how to cut your energy bills; and help you plan, install, and maintain solar generators and battery storage.

Push is on for cheaper treatments for hep C

Hepatitis C is a debilitating virus and it's difficult for the average punter to treat the symptoms when meds can cost \$1,000 a tablet in Australia. So it's no wonder a private supply route, similar to the one for HIV/AIDS treatment portrayed in the movie Dallas Buyers Club, has formed to bring down costs at http://fixhepc.com, known as the Fix HepC Buyers Club.

Basically the Club teaches you how to import drugs from overseas to save money. The founder, Greg Jefferys, told ABC's 7.30, 'The only difference between me and the guy in Dallas Buyers Club is I'm not running it as a business and I'm not making any money out of it, as much as I like to see him with his big wads of dollar bills.

He said the drugs provided in Australia by US pharma giant Gilead cost \$100,000 for an 84-tablet treatment.

'If you haven't got the money, for a lot of people it's a death sentence — you die, Mr Jefferys said.

'I was right on the edge of cirrhosis of the liver; once you get cirrhosis of the liver you then open up to tumours and cancer.'

Mr Jefferys's desperate need to find cheaper meds took him to the Indian city of Chennai, where he found the same medication on sale for less than \$1,000.

Mr Jefferys's website is very detailed and includes the ABC interview. It also offers advice on the regulatory hurdles to jump over when importing drugs.

What is Hep C?

According to Hepatitisact http://hepatitisact.com. au/, which offers good background on all forms of the hep virus, 'Hepatitis C is a blood-borne virus contracted when the blood of an infected person enters the blood

stream of another person. It was first identified as "non-A, non-B hepatitis" around 1973 (although more recent analysis of blood from as early as 1948 shows the presence of hepatitis C).

'It was not until the late 1980s that genetic testing allowed for a full analysis, identifying the individual properties of hepatitis C which had kept medical and scientific staff baffled for decades.

'Chronic hepatitis C infec-

tion can result in progressive liver inflammation (viral hepatitis), which may progress to scarring (fibrosis and cirrhosis). If left untreated, inflammation can lead to mild, moderate, or serious liver disease and in some cases, liver cancer and liver failure. Hepatitis C is the leading cause of liver transplants and liver cancer in Australia.

'Out of 100 people that contract hepatitis C, 75-85 people will develop chronic

infection, 60-70 people will develop chronic liver disease, five to 20 people will develop cirrhosis over the course of their chronic infection and one to five people will die of complications including hepatocellular carcinoma (liver cancer).'

Prevention

Injecting drugs can be a risky business and the chief way of acquiring hep C. It's best not to do it at all, but if you can't kick the habit then at least check the safe-injecting guidelines at aivl.org.au.

A small number of people have also been infected by unsterile tattooing or body piercing procedures, so don't deal with a backyard operator. Ask your tattooist about sterilisation practices and single-use needles if you're unsure.

In regard to blood transfusions, the Australian Red Cross Blood Bank has screened for hep C since 1990.

Health

Dealing with a major disease is about diet as well as medication. The Hepatitisact site recommends stopping smoking (including marijuana), reducing or stopping alcohol consumption, adopting a low-fat diet, exercising, and drinking plenty of fresh water, among other tips.

As of Tuesday last week the site republished a plea from Hepatitis Australia CEO Helen Tyrell for the federal health minister to fast-track price negotiations so that medication can be listed on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS) in early 2016.

According to Hepatitis Australia, 'More than 700 Australians will lose their lives to hepatitis C-related disease this year, with experts predicting a 230 per cent increase in deaths by 2030.

When I grow up I want to be a chef

John Hamilton is all grown-up and wants to be a chef, happy to leave behind a 16-year career in engineering to follow his dream of cooking.

With 72 jobs for chefs in the northern rivers region advertised on a job-search website, John shouldn't find it too difficult. The trouble is John has no training and no experience.

Most restaurants and cafes are advertising for someone with substantial experience.

So John took the unorthodox route of posting his cooking desires on a Facebook page called Jobs for the Tribe Northern

Here's what he wrote:

I'm a 45-year-old male (last time I checked) looking for a career change this late in my life. If anyone can, or knows someone who can, give a 45-year-old lover of food and cooking an apprenticeship. Yes, it's a long shot but I'm keen as hot English mustard.

At the Happy Dolphin Cafe in Brunswick Heads, head chef Katherine Bette's advertisement in The Echo is one of the few seeking a first- or second-year apprentice. They have already had a no-show and another interviewee unable to speak fluent English.

'Ideally we'd like someone working in the industry,' Katherine says. 'Age doesn't matter. They must have a willingness to learn, respect for food and imagination.

'It doesn't matter if they haven't studied commercial cook-

Rachelle Ramsey-Orr says that the cookery course at Ballina TAFE gave her the opportunity to learn about different methods of cooking that would have been difficult to explore in the workplace.

As a second-year apprentice Rachelle won the Worldskills Cookery Competition in Wollongbar in September and next year will compete in a national trade competition in Perth.

'I want to be the best chef I can,' Rachelle says.

TAFE head teacher of Hospitality David Forster says young people don't need to leave the area to pursue a career in commercial cooking and hospitality. On a training course like Rachelle's, students learn about food safety, customer service and gain insight into the industry.

'We put students in work placements or internships, as businesses are crying out for staff, David says.

Mentoring is important, he says, as well as the student's

'It is a great career but a tough industry,' he says.

'When students do an apprenticeship, they come to TAFE as well. They learn the skills and knowledge required of the industry and they network with other students.'

Byron Bay's Di Wilson runs a market stall selling Pickle Chicks and Not Just A Tart products. Self-taught, she has chosen a different direction for her food passion.

Her advice for anyone wanting to establish a food stall is to think carefully.

'Be prepared to spend a few years making no money at all,'

Her passion for food is as much a career as a lifestyle choice. 'I love the vibe of the markets,' she says.

She knows nearly every customer, and coos at their babies as she slices a vanilla bean tart.

Di has help with the prep work before each market but mostly she works in isolation.







WHO IS MAE WILDE? WHERE

I caught up with her briefly as she high-tailed it out of Casino.

'I went out to Casino because I thought it was Casino Beefcake Week; there I met a lovely circus performer. We tumbled around for a bit and then he suggested that my talents could be put to good use at the Falls Festival.

Self-described as a 'fallen angel', Wilde shares a little of her difficult and astonishing parentage.

'I am the love child of Oscar Wilde and Mae West.'

Hang on, didn't they live on different continents? Wasn't Wilde notoriously gay? And if she really were the daughter of such a bizarre and unlikely coupling then wouldn't she be almost 100?

Ms Wilde explains herself. I get the feeling she's had to do this a few times before.

'My mother had been sent to England to boarding school for transgression and she escaped and went over to Paris where she met the illustrious Oscar Wilde. She is the only woman to have seduced him. Of course she fell pregnant. She had the baby and left me in an orphanage, which was the Sacred Heart Home for Wayward Children in Hell's Kitchen.'

Okay, that explains that. But how can a girl pushing three figures look so young?

'I started performing at an early age. The nuns couldn't control me and eventually I left for Europe where the Nazis captured me and cryogenically froze me. I became the only victim of the Y2K bug. That's what Falls Festival is all about.'

So who is Mae Wilde most looking forward to seeing, or rubbing shoulders with back stage?

'I love the Wombats – the wombat is my totem spirit guide; like them, I like to bury down in deep holes...'

key. It's the Achilles heel of annoyance. That one peculiar habit or nuance that brings you to your knees. It's our little operational secret. The part of us we hope no-one finds.

I don't like the sound of cutlery being thrown into a drawer. When I say I don't like it I don't mean a little bit. I mean the sound goes through my bones and into my teeth and makes me feel violent. Unhinged. I lose control. I can think of nothing else. I want to scream.

I could never work as a kitchen hand. The sound of ten kilos of cutlery being tipped into a dish of water once sent me screaming from a restaurant. Once everyone I worked with knew my secret they made sure they did it as often as they could. To them it was funny. To me it was torture.

Knowing what drives people nuts gives you this incredible power, and regardless of the public education campaign to counteract bullying, none of us can resist that tiny taunt that sends a friend or lover over the edge. You see, bullying people we love just a little bit, is soo soo much fun!

My husband John hates emery boards. Ever since we got together I haven't been able to file my nails. He doesn't even let me say 'emery board'. He doesn't even like the idea of them being in the

house. They immobilise him. It's like superman's Kryptonite – he shrivels into foetal position and goes 'ooh stop stop'.

He can't speak. He's incoherent. Nothing has made me want to file my nails more. The fact that I don't is a profound act of love and shows a self-control I didn't even know I had. Of course every now and then I just can't help myself. I once put a nail file under his favourite pillow. It was like he'd found a giant spider. He got so freaked out and screamed like a girl. I actually think I wet myself. His response was entirely immature. He went and put the cutlery away.

I have secretly fantasised about making some sort of box made entirely of emery boards. Or maybe record myself filing my nails and then make that the ring

Her husband doesn't like paddle-pop sticks touching his teeth. Some people don't like the sound of chewing, chalk squeaking on a blackboard, the sound of gulping, two stryofoam eskies rubbing together. Snoring fits into this category.

I can understand sound. Especially high-frequency sounds. Sound seems to enter the cell wall and create an instant 'cringe' reaction. But nail files? Paddlepop sticks? Phlegm? Ah, the wondrous mystery of human idiosyncrasy. I will ponder it some more. But first I must stick these emery boards inside John's shoe.



THE WOMAN WHO LEARNT TO THRIVE - MEET JANIVA

THERE ARE SOME PEOPLE WHOSE ABILITY NOT JUST TO SURVIVE, BUT TO THRIVE IN THE FACE OF TRAUMA IS TOTALLY INSPIRATIONAL.

American Blues and soul singer Janiva Magness is one such woman.

By her mid-teens Janiva had lost both her parents to suicide. She went into foster care – dozens of homes – and ended up pregnant at 17, having to give her daughter up for adoption. Janiva is the second woman to be honoured by the Blues Foundation as the BB King Entertainer of the year. She is truly a blues star. So how does a person become so successful after such a hard start?

'As a girl I didn't have the worst story,' she says simply, 'but I had enough. It has become part of what informs my craft today. It informs how I see the world and the people in it. I learnt critical lessons very young. It was the story I was got. The story I was given. There is not going back and fixing that.'

Janiva does not feel sorry for herself; the poster girl for resilience, she realised early on that she had a strength and deposits in her experience bank that set her apart.

'It is absolutely a gift. I believe I have a PhD in Lemonade making. I use my lemons to make lemonade all the time. I take some gnarly-arsed shit and make it into the best stuff I can. I could be a bitter angry woman, but I'm not. I am very strong. The job I have as an artist is about connection. The music is the vehicle and I have to be able to bring myself and my truth to the music. If I can do that, a connection happens – a sinapse happens – when it happens it's holy! We live in this world together!'

In the US, Janiva has been named Contemporary Blues Female Artist of the Year three times. Since 2006 she has had 22 similar nominations.

For her it's never about winning. 'I have had absolutely more rejections than wins in the business itself... I had to learn to be a person who knows how to lose gracefully. You need to know how to go to the back of the class. Not just in music, but in life too. I think that is very very important. I am not a greedy person. I am happy and surprised to be proclaimed a winner anywhere. The first time I ever won anything I was seven and I won a funny face Cool Aid contest and they sent me a drink stand in the mail and I got to set up the stand at the end of my yard right

near where a construction crew were working – I got to sell them my Cool Aid! I was so proud! I didn't win anything again until 1991!

I am very happy to be considered someone who is good enough at their craft to be nominated for anything. I don't have entitlement issues and I never get pissed off if I don't win. I am very grateful in life that sometimes I get to sing!'

Singing has always been Janiva's safe place, although she didn't step into the spotlight until her late teens.

'When I was a little kid I knew all the songs to all the television commercials and the theme songs to the shows and I knew the songs on the radio that my brothers were listening to and I could mimic my parents' records like a mynah bird. I loved the music and wanted to be near it. What appeared as a young girl as an obnoxious obsession as a kid that turned into a more obnoxious obsession as a teenager – to the possibility of a career path that turned into a gift.

Janiva is currently finishing her memoir. 'It's been extremely empowering – and liberating and challenging and very hard internally – on my internal landscape. It has woken up some parts of me that are not my friend, but I have been graced with a tremendous amount of healing inside so I am grateful to have those tools and the structure so I don't have to buy into the crap.'

As a songwriter she takes her insight from the page to the stage. When referring to her life experience and her powerful ability to re-frame hardship she says, 'It helps a lot, it gives purpose to having a much deeper level of meaning of survival. I used to be a fear-based person. But it doesn't stop me any more. It used to stop me in my tracks. It presents itself as anxiety and illogical thought process. I no longer make my decisions based on fear.'

Catch the extraordinary talents and wisdom of Janiva at Bluesfest. There is nothing quite like blues and soul from a woman who's been to the abyss, fallen in and, thanks to her love of music, found her way out.



THE COMEDY GENIUS OF JONATHAN ATHERTON

There is nothing quite like the **Jonathan Atherton** experience. Wild, passionate, lateral thinking

- like the bastard love-child of Bill Hicks and Robin Williams. All darkness and light, Atherton is now a full-time resident of Kuala Lumpur, where he runs The Crackhouse Comedy Club, the first-ever dedicated comedy club on the Malaysian comedy scene, where he provides what he calls 'stress relief and legal highs!' Originally Brisbane based, Atherton has always had a love affair with the northern rivers, with his legendary Corndale Hall shows – and his numerous warm friendships forged over decades of performing here. Sadly, since SE Asia has claimed the multilingual Atherton as their own, we see him rarely. But he's back, telling the tales and spinning his web of wit, insight and insanity. So for those who don't know Ahterton, let me tell you a little about him: A love of culture and adventure drew him away from the staid corridors of academia and into the heart of the Third World. He spent most of the 8os travelling through Asia and Africa, where he worked as tour guide, salvage diver, teacher, set builder, photographer, restaurateur and actor. In Thailand in 1991 he was run over by a truck and evacuated to Australia where he spent over a year in traction, fighting gangrene, antibiotic-resistant infection and the devastating effects of 17 compound fractures to his legs, arms and spine. He underwent a dozen major operations. But he never lost his sense of humour. In fact the stories he brought back from his prolific travels formed the nucleus of his initial comedy performances. While still in plaster he was coaxed onstage by a cabaret singer who maintained that his poignantly hilarious anecdotes were funnier than the diatribe of the professional comedians who worked at the club where she performed. After just one appearance in 1993 at the Sit Down Comedy Club in Brisbane, he was hooked on the art of standup comedy... despite a temporary inability to actually stand up without the aid of crutches! With a bag of stories and a keen insight into the human condition, he honed his comedy skills touring the vast continent, dispensing laughter wherever he went. He speaks a multitude of languages - Indonesian, Malay, Thai, Japanese, Swahili, Luganda, and German... and has a passing knowledge of

Burmese Tagalog, Lao, Hindi, Batak, Urdu, Arabic, Hokkien and Mandarin. More important than language, says Atherton, is an ability to comprehend discourse strategies and social boundaries. LOVE THE COOPERS

You're like Clarence sent down to save my wonderful life.'The line is spoken by Eleanor (Olivia Wilde) to Joe (Jake Lacy), a Gl whom she has met while snowed-in at an airport, and it is an intentionally obvious homage to Frank Capra's revered Christmas movie (notwithstanding the 1946 classic's alarming racism). Eleanor is trying to get home to spend Christmas Day with her fashionably dysfunctional family. Mom and Dad (Diane Keaton and John Goodman) are on the verge of breaking up, brother Hank (Ed Helms) is out of work and at war with his ex, sister Emma (Marisa Tomei) has been nabbed for shoplifting and the cantankerous Pop (Alan Arkin doing his 'Little Miss Sunshine' shtick) has an old man's crush on a waitress at the diner (Amanda Seyfried). With a voice-over from Steve Martin, as whimsical as only he can be, and a script that often feels like it is being written on the run, the ingredients of Jessie Nelson's erstwhile festive season feelgood flick aren't promising. But cinema has a remarkable capacity for rising above the shortcomings of its parts and, by about the halfway mark, I had been completely won over. Family potpourri stories designed to arrive at a happy ending generally spread the narrative's load evenly among its participants. That principle is adhered to here, but it is what happens between Eleanor and Joe that steals the show. He is a Republican and a creationist, she a playwright liberal boozer who is having an affair with a married man. The dialogue is smart without needing to mock Joe (thankfully) and the connection between the pair is true. Their scenes are by far the best in a movie that is not laugh out loud but big on heart and gently funny – although Hank's son Charlie's first kiss at the mall is hilarious. A little pop psychology goes a long way, but an outstanding cast (with James Stewart's George Bailey ever present) manages to make a silk purse out of what might have been a sow's ear. Highly commended.

that? Steve Buscemi provides some half-laughs speaking the lines of Frankenstein (I know, Frankenstein was the doctor, not the monster), but the story's high-minded goal is undone by its contradictory finale. Worth it only if you want to get out of the heat and into the aircon.





Communities 'sold out' to liquor and gambling, claims Greens MP

Fred Nile's Christian Demo- bers who live more than 100 crats joined with the Liberals, Nationals and Shooters Party MPs to push legislation through the NSW Upper House that will weaken the watchdog that enforces the state's liquor and gaming regulations, according to Greens NSW MP John Kaye.

Dr Kaye said the Gaming and Liquor Administration Amendment Bill 2015 strips the Independent Liquor and Gaming Authority of its own expert staff and leaves the regulatory body at the mercy of public servants who are effectively under the control of the minister Troy Grant.

'The Bill also creates double jeopardy for communities who have persuaded the Authority to reject an application, Dr Kaye said. 'It allows pubs and clubs to appeal to a non-expert tribunal where they can outspend residents on expensive lawyers.

'The right to appeal against an approval by the Authority is denied to community memmetres from the site, despite the impacts that liquor and gaming licences can have on them.

'The NSW Liberals and Nationals have persuaded the Christians and Shooters to serve up local communities on a platter to the alcohol and gambling industries.

'Without any evidence that there was something wrong with the regulator, deputy premier Troy Grant has stripped it of its expert staff and wrapped around it an unfair and biased appeals process. It is a measure of the power of the gaming and alcohol industries that they are able to get not just the government to do their bidding, but also Fred Nile and his Christian Democrats.

'The Greens' attempt to send the Bill to a committee where it could be critiqued by experts was defeated by the same parties that then rammed it through the Upper House, Dr Kave said.

Surfing to celebrate International Day of People with Disability

International Day of People with Disability (IDPwD) is a United Nations-sanctioned day that is celebrated internationally on 3 December. The aim of the day is to increase public awareness, understanding and acceptance of people with disability and celebrate the achievements and contributions of people with disability.

The Australian Government has been supporting IDPwD since 1996 and provides funds to promote and raise awareness of the day around Australia.

This year's IDPwD theme is - Inclusion matters: access and empowerment for people of all abilities. There are also three sub-themes this year: Making cities inclusive and accessible for all; Improving disability data and statistics; and Including persons



with invisible disabilities in society and development.

The annual theme provides a frame for considering how people with disability are excluded from society by

promoting the removal of all types of barriers - including those relating to the physical environment, information and communications technology (ICT), or attitudinal barriers. This has been occurring since 1992 when the General Assembly proclaimed 3 December as the International Day of Disabled Persons.

PwD locally in Byron. The DSA was established in 1986 by Gary Blaschke after a motorcycle accident in which he lost his kneecap and underwent extensive rehabilitation.

Gary saw a void that needed to be filled as, over the years, many surfers with disabilities have unfortunately been loners with no-one to help them get back into the water.

Many suffer from conditions that the general public would not consider a disability.

From asthmatics to joint injuries to paraplegia, many members have found friendship, support and have renewed their interest in surfing.

Gary's vision quickly extended to all classes of disabilities, as it is today, a totally voluntary organisation, which sets world's best practice for disabled surfers.

As part of this year's International Day of People with Disability, the Disabled Surfers Association will celebrate with a paddle-out at Byron this Saturday.

Bring your friends to come surfing or volunteer - in and out of the water - they can always use more hands on boards. All volunteers need is a big heart and willingness to put smiles on dials. You don't need to be a ripper surfer to help out. We also need some talented barbecuers and just some people to help out on the beach and in the shallows.

The evens is on Saturday at Clarkes Beach. Sign in from 9am for volunteers, sign in participants 10am and the barbecue is after the surf and it's all free, so come along for a great morning in Byron's surf.

Schoolies urged to be beach safe

As NSW Schoolies celebrations are well under way, Surf Life Saving NSW is urging partying teens to make their visit to the beach a safe one.

With school leavers descending on NSW's popular coastal towns from this weekend, teenagers are being reminded to play it safe while enjoying the ocean.

Lifeguards and life savers will be out reinforcing the Don't Drink and Swim safety message in key NSW holiday hotspots including Byron Bay, Coffs Harbour and Port Macquarie.

'Schoolies is a busy time for our life savers, especially with many taking major risks by swimming outside patrolled areas, under the influence of alcohol and drugs or at night,' said NSW Life Saving Manager, Andy Kent.

'Life savers are worried about the possibility of a preventable tragedy if these risks are taken, especially at night-time. As always our volunteer callout teams are

ready to respond to afterhours incidents.'

However, many schoolies groups are broadening their scope beyond these traditional haunts and will be escaping to smaller seaside towns along the coast such as Forster, South West Rocks and Batemans Bay. Many of these beaches are unpatrolled during the week and teenagers are urged to take care.

The Australian Lifeguard Service has boosted numbers from last weekend to deal with the influx of beachgoers at Schoolies' hot spot, Main Beach in Byron Bay.

'Our lifeguards at Main Beach have seen an increase in beach-goers over the last few weeks and they're expecting many more to visit this popular spot from now on,' said ALS NSW manager Brent Manieri.

'Young people need to make smart decisions about where and when they swim. Choosing a patrolled beach and swimming between the flags is the smartest decision they can make, he said.

Schoolies are also encouraged to keep hydrated and be sun smart, both of which will help reduce the risk of fatigue at the beach, particularly if swimmers have consumed alcohol the previous evening.

To help ensure Schoolies remains incident free, there are some simple preventive actions school leavers can take to make sure their stay is safe and enjoyable.

Schoolies safety checklist: only swim at a patrolled beach, between the red and yellow flags

- don't swim under the influence of alcohol/drugs
- never swim at night
- · ask a surf life saver or lifeguard for advice
 - look after your mates
- call 'ooo Police' to report an in-water emergency.




