

'Overwhelming majority' object to Dunoon Dam proposal

With public submissions on Rous Council's proposed Dunoon Dam expected to be released Wednesday December 16, Ballina councillor and Rous chair Keith Williams told *The Echo* that submissions he has seen so far indicate strong opposition.

Plans by bureaucrats to build an additional dam for the area sparked community concern, owing to it likley wiping out Aboriginal cultural heritage and destroying an endangered ecological community of lowland rainforest.

While Mr Williams says he is yet to see the written report, he says staff presented the community feedback at a recent Councillor briefing.

Around 1,300 submissions were received, he said, 'consisting of approximately 350 online surveys and 950 emails/letters'.

'The majority of these were from residents in the Lismore (Channon/ Dunoon) area, with a relatively small number of 100 from each of Byron Shire and Ballina Shire.

'An overwhelming majority of the written submissions oppose the Dunoon Dam, and requested that Council do more in water efficiency and purified recycled water. Councillors and staff have been focussed on these aspects'.

Mr Williams responded to claims by NSW Greens MP for Ballina, Tamara Smith, who said in her latest newsletter that she 'continues to be denied access to

Out-of-towners drive housing demand

Locals had expected the auction of the five-bedroom house in the hills outside Lennox Head to be a wellcontested affair.

But the events that unfolded raised eyebrows among even the most experienced real estate watcher

Straight out of the gate the

opening bid for 17 Fieldcrest Drive was a cool \$1.5 million – \$100,000 over the reserve.

That bid immediately knocked some of the 10 registered bidders out of the running.

But it didn't stop there.

When the hammer finally fell, the selling price was \$1.841 million – way over the reserve and far above the median price for that part of Lennox.

Dramatic though it may have been, the auction's outcome was far from an isolated event.

According to local real estate agents, and data from Regional Australia Insights, the Byron Shire and surrounds is experiencing an unprecedented spike in demand, sending prices soaring into the stratosphere and creating a desperate shortage of rental accommodation,

leaving a growing number of people without a home.

'I've been in this business for 30 years, and I've never seen anything like it', said semi-retired local real estate agent and developer Graham Dunn.

'COVID-19 has made people realise there's a lot more to life than making money in a big office and

Soaring real estate pushes locals out of market

► Continued from page 1 living in a flash apartment in the city'.

'And because everyone's realised they can work from Zoom now, that's what they're doing.'

While the new owner of 17 Fieldcrest Drive is a long-term local, The Echo has received numerous reports of cashed-up buyers from Sydney and Melbourne taking a 'whatever it takes' attitude to buying properties in the Shire.

This includes making offers on properties on the basis of a quick video tour conducted by an agent with an iPhone.

'I've heard of 14 properties being sold, site unseen, to buyers via video-link,' Mr Dunn said. 'Talking to agents in Lennox, Ballina, Byron, they're all doing the virtual tour.'

Others are offering way over the asking price to secure a Northern Rivers home, leaving first homebuyers in the dust.

Further evidence of the interest in local real estate is the incredible popularity of online listings in towns such as Bangalow.

Once barely a blip on the national real estate radar, Bangalow's soaring popularity saw it become the most

in-demand regional town in the country in 2020.

On average, Bangalow's listings averaged 11,451 views each on a multitude of real estate websites this year.

The spike in demand from outside buyers, along with the arrival of peak Airbnb season, has sucked yet more properties out of the longterm rental market.

Some in the real estate industry have described the situation as 'desperate', with up to 60 people showing up for rental inspections in the Byron Shire, and up to 30 queuing to see homes in Lennox and Ballina.


'People can't get rentals

anywhere - not in Ballina, not in Alstonville, and definitely not in Byron,' local Greens MP Tamara Smith said.

'People who've bought houses from a video - they're not planning to move here for four or five years.

'If the owner is rich enough, the house will probably stay empty until they're ready to move up, or they'll just put it on Airbnb.

'We need real incentives to encourage long-term rentals, and we need to have the 90-day cap on Airbnb in Byron that we were promised, but which the state government has now reneged on'.

Mr Williams said, 'Ms Smith wrote to me some weeks ago, seeking early release of this information at a time when the materials were still being collated, and had not been reported in any form'.

'I advised I was unable to meet her request at that time. Timelines for the delivery of services by consultants were impacted by the four week extension to the public exhibition period'.

He continued, 'I'd be curious to know why Ms Smith thinks it's appropriate to chastise Rous for conducting a transparent and open process over a 10 week submission period, but says nothing of a rushed and secretive process currently being conducted by the NSW state agency DPIE [Department of Planning and Environment]'.

'Why is it Rous County Council's responsibility to change its processes and timelines, rather than the MP requesting DPIE to extend its consultation period, just

as Rous did in response to public requests?

'This is the same department currently consulting the community on the regional water strategy, but withholding crucial data and modelling.

'While our overall rainfall will only fall slightly, we are at greatly increased risk of facing multiple year droughts as a direct result of climate change. I've been told about it, but denied access to any written material. Why is the department not telling the community about this?'

A different box this Christmas...

Most Northern Rivers locals were devastated to watch the decimation of native wildlife during the Black Summer bushfires late last

A local organisation, Brunswick Valley Landcare (BVL), felt the same, and have begun the fight for rebuilding habitat through the installation of nesting boxes, made by Mullumbimby local, David Brook from Wildbnb.

303 different species of native Australian animals rely on tree hollows for nesting, which, even prior to the Black Summer fires were a rarity, as they take a minimum of 75 years to form, and the bushfires of last summer destroyed a huge percentage of the remaining critical habitat that had already been decimated by land clearing.

BVL decided they were going to step in. So in 2014, they started their Nestbox Project, and have since installed over 40 boxes on both public and private land across the Northern Rivers, but they are after more.

BVL president, Peter Ryan, said 'We have lost so many habitat trees, and we need a lot of boxes to replace that loss. We are hoping for lots of donations, to fund upwards of a hundred nesting boxes to be installed on both public and private land, so that the boxes can have a positive impact on wildlife'.

The nesting boxes are not currently funded by the government, and so BVL is

layouts, see the finishes and have the chance to secure your very own.

calling on landowners and community members to help turn around habitat loss and save our native animals.

The community can help out by donating towards the purchase and installation of a nest box on your property, planting suitable native trees and plants on your land or building your own nest box (www.wires.org.au have free instructions).

'If habitat is not replaced,

we lose biodiversity in the region, and if we lose that, I think we lose our soul. The loss isn't just to the environment, but economic as well; native wildlife is the best pest control out there, and losing them will have quite an impact on the agricultural industry.'

To help take the project to the next level, BVL teamed up with local artist Sam Wortlehock to decorate

a nesting box which was kindly donated by David Brook from Wildbnb, which was built larger than most nesting boxes to comfortably accommodate owls.

Raise awareness

Mr Ryan said, 'The aim of the painted boxes is to raise some awareness of the different species of wildlife that use the nesting boxes through usable art'.

Ms Wortlehock from Breakaway Art painted the box with a beautiful scene of three species of native owls found in the Byron region in the night time; the Rufous, Sooty and Barn.

BVL will install the box properly on the buyer's property, free of charge, to ensure it is put in a place that will be useful to wildlife.


A resident told The Echo it was on the corner of Orana Road and Yengarie Way, and believed it was serious, as the rider lay unconscious for some time before help arrived.

How has COVID-19 affected market stallholders?

Estelle Schmitt had been selling crystalinfused botanical perfume oils at the Byron Community Market for four years when the pandemic hit.

The French-born local's love of botanical perfumes developed into a business, and a popular market stall -Estelle's Haven – that she set up each month, early on a Sunday, at Byron's Main Beach foreshore.

But in March, COVID-19 changed everything. The Byron Community Market, which had been held (almost) every first Sunday of the month for over 30 years, shut down.

Estelle's business revolved around the markets, and it was a vital part of her life.

'When you buy at the market, you buy from your neighbour,' she says.

'You help them support their families, their dreams, and develop their craft and innovative ideas. Markets are the birthplace of a lot of creative enterprises.'

Market closure

Estelle moved her business online but it was a struggle financially.

'Having to put the markets on hold was absolutely heartbreaking for us and devastating for our stallholders', says Byron Markets Manager Kate Hardman.

'Hundreds of families and households have been affected, some having to give up trading and find alternative income.'

Over the time of closure, Byron

Markets lost 35 per cent of its total annual revenue.

No staff were laid off, but Ms Hardman says that without JobKeeper, they wouldn't have survived.

'Markets staff worked really hard to keep everything going. We came up with creative ideas to support stallholders and provided constant communication. There was a sense that we were all in this together'.

In August, after four long months, the markets reopened.

'Being back was a joy for me,' says Ms Schmitt. 'I believe people were a bit confused when we first came back as to whether or not they could touch the products and how to approach the stalls'.

'But now, everybody has adapted to the changes and it has been going great'.

The markets are not only a space for local businesses to sell their products, but also a community of stallholders.

For many people in the Northern Rivers, markets are a way of life.

Despite the financial stress, for Estelle, the four-month break has enabled her to improve her business.

She used the time to create new market signs and displays and completed online courses in website design and marketing. She also created a new perfume.

'I was able to focus on finishing the formulation for my new fragrance. Even though sourcing the fragrant materials was complicated owing to the restrictions and delays with the post office.'

'So the break had a silver lining, but I'm so happy to be back. I think we all are.'

Mullum water restrictions edge closer

While there is an expected wet season this summer, Council staff are asking Mullumbimby residents to be vigilant with their water use, 'as the local water supply at Lavertys Gap Weir is close to triggering Level 1 water restrictions'.

Byron Shire Council's Director Infrastructure Services, Phil Holloway, said the stream flow from Wilsons Creek into Lavertys Gap Weir, which supplies Mullumbimby's water, has been steadily declining over the past month, and currently is close to zero flows.

'This time last year, Mullumbimby was already on Level 1 water restrictions and we saw restrictions escalate

quickly to Level 3 and 4'.

Meanwhile, a Wilsons Creek resident told *The Echo* they and their neighbours are alarmed, 'that no water is flowing downstream past the weir on Wilsons Creek'.

Environmental flow

'Our understanding is there should always be an "environmental flow" to maintain the health and viability of the local ecosystem.

'This isn't happening, and enquires to Council have not been acted on.

'We're concerned for the platypus, fish and other wildlife in the creek'.

The Echo asked Council

staff, 'Have Council staff been monitoring the environmental flows around this weir? Is there a risk of losing wildlife here owing to a lack of rain, and or water usage from increased human and agricultural usage?'

Council staff replied, 'Council's licence for the Lavertys Gap Weir and water supply does not have any requirements for environmental flows'.

'Naturally any drop in water levels in creeks and waterways, and the impact on the environment as a result of dry weather, is concerning, but Council cannot control the weather'.

Cr Ndiaye pushes for Tallowood Ridge Reserve to be in public hands

A precious slice of bushland adjoining Mullumbimby's Tallowood housing estate would be put in public hands under a motion to be voted on at next week's Byron Council meeting.

A group of ecologicallyminded residents living in and around the estate have long called for the Tallowood Ridge Reserve to be taken over by the Council to ensure the old growth trees and their many native

inhabitants are protected.

The move would also guarantee local access to the area, rather than the current plan, that risks seeing them being locked out.

In a notice of motion contained in the agenda to the December 17 meeting, Greens Councillor Sarah Ndiaye has proposed that Council formally become custodians of the five-acre site.

'Currently the land is scheduled to be allocated to seven [private] landholders that do not adjoin the land,'

Cr Ndiaye says in the motion. 'I, and many others believe

it will be best protected by having broader community support, and Council, as custodians of the area.

'Otherwise, in private ownership and so far away from the dwellings of the Community Title, we fear it will become overrun with weeds, as has occurred in neighbouring properties around Brushbox Drive [in the Tallowood estate].'

Adding to the argument for Council to take over the site is the fact that the developer of the Tallowood estate, Eric Freeman, has publicly stated that he is willing to hand it over free of charge.

There is also a group of around 30 locals, the Tallowood Ridge Landcare group, that has received a grant to maintain the site and indicated its willingness to continue doing so into the future.



'Our key concern is for the vegetation and wildlife of this precious site to be protected in perpetuity,' said

Nicolette Jackson, a member of the Landcare group.

'We've seen what can happen when areas like this are placed in private hands, even when they're subject to legal protections, and we don't want to see that happen again.'

However, a potential stumbling block facing the motion is that of apparent opposition

by Byron Council staff.

In a short report accompanying the notice of motion, **Development Planning** Officer, Christopher Soulsby, said that in the long-term the reserve was to be managed by a 'community association'.

This appears to be a small group of private landowners.


'Such an arrangement ensures the protection and management of the vegetation without the financial burden of bringing the land into public ownership,' Mr Soulsby said in his report.

'To date, Council has resisted effort by developers to dedicate land that has no development potential.

'This has occurred at the West Byron development and here at Tallowood.'

Fundraiser buys new equipment for Ballina Hospital

Funds raised from Ballina Rotary's recent John Huegill Memorial Charity Barefoot Bowls Day have resulted in new pain relief technology for Ballina Hospital's Emergency Department.

The new gadget is called an Entonox delivery system, which delivers a 50/50 mixture of nitrous oxide (laughing gas) and oxygen, on patient demand. Wayne Smith, Nursing Manager for the Ballina emergency department, said that the specialised equipment can be used by patients who are able to hold the device and self-administer the gas mixture for fast pain relief.

'It works really quickly and it wears off really quickly,' he explained.

He said the timing of the donation was perfect, as the device it replaced was on its last legs.

'The new machine has already been used with patients.

'For us in the emergency department, if you're doing stitching, or even finger dislocations and things like that, it gives you a quick, fast-acting anaesthetic/pain relief agent,' said Mr Smith.

'If you're doing something more significant you can give them some of this while you're putting the local in, because there's a lot of people who don't like the local more than the stitches, for example.

'This works really well, gives them the giggles.

'For kids it works a treat', he said.

Wayne Smith said the new machine had been on the hospital's wish list for a while – 'It's one we've always wanted, it's the latest model.'

Vinnies opens Mary's Place for homeless in Ballina

The doors are open at St Vincent de Paul Society's new drop-in centre in Ballina, servicing a population with one of the highest homelessness rates in regional NSW.

Named Mary's Place, in honour of Aileen Mary Delaney who made a generous bequest to Vinnies, the service is located on the corner of Treelands Crescent and Moon Street, Ballina.

Mary's Place is set up to provide light refreshments, showering facilities, outdoor space for socialising, computer access, medical and nursing care, Centrelink engagement service, legal and housing support, and psychological and counselling services.

Outreach service

The free service will be open on weekdays between 8.30am and 12.30pm, with outreach services also operating each afternoon to help those who drop by, providing more in-depth casework.

Adjacent to Mary's Place, but independently accessed, is Harmony House, a three-bedroom service providing accommodation for residents transitioning back into community living after facing

major challenges that may have included homelessness. Harmony House retains its original name but has been fully refurbished and upgraded.

Niamh Mannion, Executive Director Vinnies Services, said 'Research shows that Ballina experiences significant levels of disadvantage compared to NSW generally in terms of income, education and employment opportunities.

'The latest census revealed more than 500 people in the Ballina LGA were either homeless or at risk of experiencing homelessness.

'Mary's Place is the first and only such service in this fast growing and generally affluent coastal town, and we are proud to have the strong support of the community,' she said.

'Ballina Shire Council has been behind the project from the start, as has Ballina MP Tamara Smith, and local service clubs and businesses'.

Team Leader Bryan Jamison [not pictured] said Mary's Place has volunteering opportunities for suitable local people and invites anyone interested to contact him on 0457 896 407.

A closer peek at Council's Main Beach project

While Main and Clarkes Beach continue to erode, Council are exploring ways to protect the headland at Jonson Street.

Unsuprisingly, those groynes are also eroding with the passage of time.

Seven proposals for protection works are now before the public, with submissions ending December 9.

Council staff say that the 'Coastal protection structure [groyne] between the First Sun Holiday Park and the Byron Bay Surf Life Saving Club, was designed in the 1960s to protect the town centre from the threat of coastal erosion. The structure is degraded and needs improvement'.

The designs on exhibition would produce very different outcomes and trade-offs, from diminished or enhanced beaches.

As such, they would impact on surfing conditions and visitor and local amenity.

So - what are the implications of tinkering with Byron's shorelines?

The seven options are a combination of groyne removal and retention, a sloping rock seawall (berm rock revetment), an artificial headland with sand bypassing, and moving protective structures landward (retreat).

The more expensive options, according to the November 2020 report by consultant engineers Bluecoast, is an artificial headland (better for waves and surfing), while the cheapest is maintaining the current alignment.

The report says on page 31, 'The groynes are perceived to have a positive influence on the surf amenity value of the area. Removing the groynes was raised as a key concern by Despite seven foreshore designs presented to the community by consultants Bluecoast and Council staff, the report underpinning the designs give Council's Coastal Management Program and Byron Bay Town Centre Master Plan scant mention. the local surfing community following the completion of WorleyParsons (2014) recommended concept design'.

Best surfing option?

The report's authors believe that option four provides 'potentially enhanced surf amenity' (page 38).

This option replaces the central groyne with an artificial rounded headland, and would offer, 'more public space, protection, enhanced foreshore amenity'.

'This option would be combined with a small-scale sand by-pass system built into the headland to increase sand movement from east to west'.

Offshore structures, artificial submerged reefs, and beach nourishment programs are also explored, albeit not in great detail, within the report. The report authors say, 'Given the intent of providing terminal protection against beach erosion, seawalls or rock revetments are given primary consideration'.

Enhancing the beach

If enhancing the beach space is preferred, then option six suggests looking at the 'bigger picture of offering maximum protection to Byron Bay town centre, while achieving the best result in terms of maximising beach space'.

This would require removing all groynes, 'with full realignment of the structure landward and creates an uninterrupted shoreline and wider beach'.

The report reads, 'The removal of the spur groynes would be expected to increase the supply of littoral sand to downdrift areas'.

Option seven 'retains the existing structure and groynes repairing it to a contemporary standard. This approach is based on maintaining the status quo'.

Along with this project, Council is currently in the process of developing a Coastal Management Program (CMP).

There is little mention of how this large-scale infrastructure project, with its massive implication - aligns with this yet-to-be adopted Coastal Management Program.

Longtime Council watchers would recall that the plan has been ongoing for many years in different guises, and for various reasons, has failed to materialise.

Another consideration with this plan is a 2016 court settlement against Council's insurers, which was brought by very wealthy Belongil beachfront landowners.

Those landowners claimed their land had diminished in value, owing to historical Jonson Street protection works.

As part of that court resolution, Council agreed to allow the property owners to 'retain any existing protective [beach] works in their current form' but, if they want to 'maintain, upgrade or replace' them, they will have to seek Council approval.

As Council was represented by its insurers in court, the case never went to full trial and was settled in confidence. As such, the claims by the very wealthy Belongil beachfront landowners were never tested in an open court.

There is no mention of

the court case within these reports supplied by Council.

And under the previous Council (2012-2016), councillors agreed to a rockwall that very wealthy Belongil beachfront landowners would pay for.

At the time, *The Echo* reported, 'Both the NSW office of environment and heritage (OEH) and Council have yet to explain how the five rock wall DAs, which cover both public and private lands, will not result in beach [sand] loss'.

Masterplan

How does the Byron Bay Town Centre Masterplan fit into all of this?

The Bluecoast report briefly mentions the town's Masterplan on page 3, 13, 25, 38, 44, 51 and 52.

The Masterplan is not mentioned in Council's accompanying fact sheet for the foreshore project.

Plans for the foreshorewithin the Masterplan (page 60) are for a 'Foreshore Community & Cultural Precinct', which indicates the removal of the car park.

On page 104 of the Masterplan, there is a detailed illustration of 'Long Term Priorities 2022 - 2035' (pictured above).

The Masterplan reads, 'The long-term potential for Main Beach is to establish a natural extension to the foreshore park, hybrid coast protection works and pedestrian boardwalk towards the North Coast Railway, securing a seamless east to west foreshore experience'.

Pocket forests for Byron High School

A group of year 10 students at Byron Bay High School have begun a Native Australian Planting project in response to the devastation that land clearing, habitat loss, and increasing temperatures are currently having on now depleted ecosystems globally.

The aim of this project is to create and nurture a native garden that will support the beautiful Australian wildlife that has recently been struggling owing to human caused extreme environmental changes.

There has been extensive research and planning into the species of native flora to be planted that will benefit the ecosystems in Byron Bay.

Inspired by David Attenborough

The project was inspired by Sir David Attenborrough's most recent environmental documentary, A Life on Our Planet, which is a witness statement, following the many journeys of his career.

His narration recounts his life travelling to untouched wilderness areas of the planet, highlighting the changes experienced within his lifetime.

This documentary has opened the eyes of students to the detrimental effects the human race has had on

the planet, the effects that Attenborough has dubbed; 'Mankind's greatest mistake'.

However, the students at BBHS are passionate and determined to change their lifestyles in order to reverse these mistakes.

David Attenborough has been an inspiration, and has shown that there is hope if the decision to act now is made.

Sustainable grant

The school applied for. and was awarded, 'The Sustainable Schools Grant', a \$10 million dollar program that gives schools the opportunity to develop innovative hands-on projects that help students learn about environmentally sustainable practices and take real steps to enhance the sustainability of the school environment.

The grant is going to be

used to create 'pocket forests' within the school grounds, to not only support the local species threatened by climate conditions, but also to reduce the carbon footprint of Byron Bay High School.

Creating this garden in the school will help to sequester carbon from the atmosphere, and will also contribute to creating a more holistic school environment by increasing biodiversity and restoring native bushland.

This planting will also help, albeit on a small scale, to restore some of the 5.3 million hectares lost in the 2019-2020 bushfires.

Indigenous land use management

A recent environmental talk by Arakwal representitives, Delta Kay and Nickolla Clark, provided students

with knowledge on the importance of Byron Bay's native flora and fauna.

Their sacred knowledge has given students a greater understanding of Indigenous land use management, and the species that will most benefit the school environment.

It is vital that the school community embraces the intergenerational knowledge that the local Arakwal people can share surrounding the species of flora and fauna native to the Northern Rivers.

David Attenborough stated that to restore the planet's biodiversity, 'We require more than intelligence, we require wisdom', something that local Indigenous custodians are happy to share.

Former Council staffer promotes holiday letting industry

A former Council staffer who worked on the Sustainable Visitation Strategy (SVS) is now employed by a shortterm rental company, A Perfect Stay, and is actively advocating against Council's policy on holiday letting.

Part of Council's holiday letting planning proposal to the NSW government identifies areas where short-term rentals would operate for 90 days per year, instead of the current 365.

The policy is partly based on the Sustainable Visitation Strategy (SVS), which is currently on public exhibition. Submissions close this Friday December 11, and is available to view at www.yoursaybyronshire.com.au/svs.

Emails obtained by The Echo show organised opposition from short term rental company A Perfect Stay.

Former tourism officer at Council, Sarah Workman, writes, 'Collectively, we aim to have an impact and maintain 365 days of short-term rental accommodation in Byron Shire. This will ensure all our businesses and our staff continue to thrive'.

A search for Byron Bay properties on www.aperfectstay.com.au yielded 163

Ms Workman told *The* Echo that while she had worked on the Sustainable Visitation Strategy, she had never worked on the planning proposal that Council would be submitting to the state government, and therefore had no privileged information on the topic.

When contacted, Council staff replied that they do not comment on former employees.

Bob Stewart imprisoned for killing neighbour's puppy

On Tuesday, Bob Stewart was sentenced in the Byron Bay Courthouse to nine months imprisonment, with a minimum non-parole period of five months, for the bow-shooting attack that led to the death of his neighbour's pet dog, Bucket.

Mr Stewart was found guilty of cruelty offences after a two-day trial in October, after the bowshooting attack on a young wolfhound-malamute cross at South Golden Beach in December 2019.

Magistrate Karen Stafford said she could have given the defendant two years, but took into account several late-arriving references, as well as the fact that Mr Stewart had got rid of his archery equipment, and was the

primary carer of his sister.

While emphasising the seriousness and cruelty of his offence, Magistrate Stafford noted Mr Stewart had been of good character over the last twelve months, and said his earlier offences were relatively minor and took place many years ago.

Multiple AVOs

The magistrate also noted that Mr Stewart had obeyed multiple AVOs, which had been taken out by his neighbours since the bowshooting incident.

Bucket's owner, Kris Thompson, asked for additional compensation of \$637.20 for vet bills relating to the death of his dog, which was also ordered.

Mr Stewart was escorted from the courthouse by four sheriffs of the court.





Community orgs benefit from philanthropy

partners, the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal (FRRR), who helped facilitate funding from private and public foundations'.

Diverse projects

'Nearly 60 community groups applied to this grants round. Of the 35 successful applicants, 22 of these organisations have never previously received funding from the NRCF. Each grant ranges in value from \$816 to \$10,000, with an average

grant amount of \$6,763.

'The areas of need are diverse. Projects span across Health & Wellbeing, Aged Services, Employment & Training, Arts and Culture, as well as Disaster Recovery, Preparedness & the Environment, with each project addressing a specific issue within each local community', he said.

Byron projects

Some of the Byron Shire organisations to benefit from grants include Byron

Bay Community Association, Renew Fest, Byron Youth Theatre, Creative Mullum, Resilient Byron and the Shara Community Gardens.

The gardens will benefit from a \$5,214 grant to future proof the gardens, 'along with our neighbours, against drought. Water storage [is] to build better drought and water efficiency resilience for the local community garden in North Ocean Shores'.

Wallabies continue to be lost to dogs, cars

Last Saturday, a wallaby had to be put down after being hit by a vehicle on Seven Mile Beach. Unfortunately, this is not an isolated incident, with WIRES Northern Rivers secretary Susan Ulyatt telling The Echo that this is the second incident in the last month where a wallaby has been hit by a car and had to be euthanised.

'With the increase in the traffic and dogs on the beach, the wildlife are losing the battle', explained Ms Ulyatt.

The wildlife in the area are in trouble – when you have a lot of people, and wildlife, the two don't mix particularly well. Especially at this time of the year, when new visitors aren't familiar with the area and they don't know to reduce their speed and be wildlife aware, both on beaches and on the roads'.

The impact of dogs, both local and visiting, is also a major threat to local wildlife, as they often chase wallabies. And even if they don't catch them, the wallabies often die.

'The problems for macropods (wallabies, pademelons, and kangaroos) is that they just don't handle stress', said Ms Ulyatt.

Killed by stress

'High levels of stress, particularly from being chased or attacked by dogs, causes myopathy, which is the disintegration of the muscle fibres of the animal.

'From within 24 hours, up to a few weeks after the incident, the wallaby will show stiffness and paralysis, mainly in the hindquarters, progressing to complete paralysis, it will also salivate excessively. Death will occur within two to fourteen days after the stressful incident'.

WIRES NR are currently caring for a young joey (called Mille), following its mother' death last month.

'This little swamp wallaby joey was just five months old, and should have been safely contained within mum's pouch. She came into care in early November, after being found by a local resident on the pedestrian track at Seven Mile Beach', Ms Ulyatt told The Echo.

Mille will remain in WIRES care until June 2021, when she will be released back to the wild.


'If all dogs could be on a

leash when on the beach or in [bush] areas, that would be a good start', said Ms Ulyatt.



Allowing for the occasional holiday and rare indisposition, that's still well over 1,500 articles. It's probably a record that will never be surpassed, and last week, Mungo decided that his precarious health would not permit further extension of this phenomenal journalistic effort.

But of course it's not just the length of Mungo's tenure of the op-ed space that's been amazing: it's the quality of his writing and political judgement that has informed and entertained readers week after week since 1989.

Our general manager, Simon Haslam, has been at the paper over 25 years and says, 'In that time, hardly a week has gone by without a reader mentioning Mungo's column to me. It's become emblematic of the paper, especially for those people who haven't read The Echo before, or who aren't familiar with local issues, it has provided a very engaging point of entry. It was one of the first things I noticed about the paper when I came to the area. Even those who don't agree with the content generally admire his writing, and of course he's very funny.

However, Mungo has not yet departed our pages for good. The crossword remains, and he has currently built up a reserve of 200 puzzles, which, he says, will give four more years of aggravation for Echo readers!

2020 politics heading to the finish line

Many years ago, he did work experience in Parliament House with Mungo MacCallum. David has lived off-grid in the Northern Rivers since 2008.

he would undoubtedly bring to the job, it seems he needs a personal jet costing \$4,300 an hour, plus eight full-time staff, to make the right impression; all of them flying round the world to help talk up his case. No Zoom meetings for Mathias, despite the claim in his job application that 'undertaking global action on climate change is a must, and we must get to zero net emissions as soon as possible'.

The ALP is right behind Cormann's candidacy, apparently convinced that this man with a record of deep climate skepticism is a perfect fit for the OECD.

Speaking of the environmentally unsustainable, Adani, or whatever they're called this week, received a \$26,000 slap on the wrist for forgetting to do any surveys before destroying more of the fast-dwindling bushland of central Queensland.

Photographer Dean Sewell captured the moment two gutsy activists interrupted the cricket test between India and Australia to urge the State Bank of India not to approve a \$1 billion loan to Adani for their Australian mine. This action was viewed by millions of people around the world, including on the sub-continent.

In other environmental news, the Great Forest Case was heard this week in the Federal Court, brought on by the Bob Brown Foundation to challenge the 'rush to extinction' caused by destruction of Australia's forests and woodlands. If this case is successful, it will have major repercussions in Tasmania and nationally.

Victoria's first Indigenous representative to the Senate, Lydia Thorpe, used her maiden speech in the national parliament to discuss the destruction of sacred trees in Djab Wurrung country and Rio Tinto's demolition of 46,000 year old heritage in Western Australia. 'We have watched in real time the full horror

of the climate crisis and what happens when you stop caring for country,' she said. 'We can't separate climate justice from First Nations justice.'

Unfortunately the chamber was mostly empty, apart from her supporters.

In a week when Rupert Murdoch's editors got nastier in response to former Prime Ministers Rudd and Turnbull's attempts to hold their overlord to account, it was revealed that taxpayers shelled out \$5,000 for the current PM and his treasurer to attend Lachlan Murdoch's Christmas Party last year, in the midst of the bushfire crisis.

Sadly, this pales in comparison to the many millions spent incarcerating the Murugappan family on Christmas Island, who this week notched up 1,000 days of being incarcerated after being taken, in a dawn raid, from their home in Biloela.

Justice fans did have one reason to celebrate this week, with victory for the National Justice Project at the High Court. This comes after twelve months of expensive obstruction from the Minister for Home Affairs and Giving Potatoes a Bad Name, Peter Dutton. The way is now open for fifty people seeking asylum to take legal action against the federal government.

Finally, after the New Zealand government officially declared a climate emergency a few days ago, an attempt by the Australian Greens to do something similar in our federal parliament failed, with the ALP, Nationals and Liberals finding themselves unable to acknowledge scientific reality in the Senate, even though Labor supported the idea initially in the House of Reps. Perhaps they thought it might hurt the prospects of Joel Fitzgibbon's new gig at the Daily Telegraph.

Meanwhile, fires have engulfed half of Fraser Island. Welcome to summer.





CHESS by lan Rogers

Though the oldest preserved chess puzzles date back a thousand years, it is often assumed that truly sophisticated chess ideas are recent.

When Dutch IM Gerard Welling defeated Ukrainian GM Vereslav Eingorn in 2006, the complex endgame trick he used went around the world.

In the position given in diagram 1, Eingorn, playing Black, believed he was close to winning and played 45...g5, only to be shocked by the reply 44.g4!! After thinking for 10 minutes, Eingorn extended his hand in resignation.

Welling later admitted that he had seen the winning theme on one of the most fascinating chess sites of the time: Chess Curiosities, run by back by almost a century.

famed Dutch author Tim Krabbé (The Vanishing, Delayed).

Krabbé had traced the first game with the theme back to 1975 and there the matter stood until last month, when Welling found diagram 2 in a 19th century chess magazine Nordisk Skaktidende. It was from a game Knoff - Bjornwall.

Knoff played 31.b4!! and the game concluded 31...axb4 32.a5 c5 33.a6! c4+ 34.Kc2 Kc6 35.d5+! and Black resigned. The magazine also noted the key variation 32...Kd6 33.Kc2 Kc7 34.Kb3 Kb7 35.Kxb4 Ka6 36.Kc5! Kxa5 37.Kxc6 b4 38.d5 b3 39.d6 b2 40.d7 b1(Q) 41.b8(Q) - with check! - after which White exchanges queens and wins.

As Krabbé says, this moves the first practical example of the trick

Concerns raised over site of new mobile Byron Wildlife Hospital

The new mobile Byron Bay Wildlife Hospital was launched at The Farm on Thursday, 26 November. Following the launch the purpose-equipped trailer headed to a site on Ewingsdale Road, Byron Bay to start operations the following day. The mobile hospital aims to support local wildlife groups in treating injured wildlife, as well as heading out to areas where wildlife need on-theground treatment following natural and human-made disasters that impact wildlife, like the Black Summer fires. Both important and much needed roles in the area and around Australia.

DA to be submitted

However, like any project in Byron it's not without its objectors. The project has been two years in the making, according to Byron Wildlife Hospital CEO Dr Stephen Van Mil, who operates as a vet from Lennox Head.

Council has confirmed that they don't currently have approved access or a development application (DA) approved for the site.

Dr Van Mil has assured The Echo that they have permission to use the site even though its current zoning is environmentally protected 7(b) Coastal Habitat under Byron LEP 1988 which prohibits development without consent

Following a meeting with Byron Shire Council staff on Friday, 27 November, the day the facility started operation, Dr Van Mil supplied *The Echo* with a copy of a letter from Council in which Council staff state that, 'A pad was constructed as exempt

development for the vehicle to park upon'.

The Echo sought clarification from Council regarding under which specific legislation the pad was exempt. A Council spokesperson responded saying, 'There are provisions that exempt hard stand spaces in the Code's SEPP which will be considered as part of the application assessment process. The vehicle is legally parked so no permission is required to park a vehicle in that location.'

A Council spokesperson said that while the site is 'Currently 7(b) Coastal Habitat under Byron LEP 1988 [the] subject area adjacent to the Island Quarry is to be rezoned to RU2 as part of the Stage 2 E Zoning review.'

Site access

During the launch of the Wildlife Hospital the project's founders spoke to their vision that this is only the beginning for the wildlife hospital. The founders said that they see a future space as serving a dual role as a hospital, as well as an educational facility where locals and tourists can go to learn more about wildlife and their conservation.

Access to the site where the mobile unit is located is via the already congested Ewingsdale Road, and the impact of potential future development of this site for education and tourism has been questioned.

'Access to the land from Ewingsdale Road is dependent on the section 138 application, now lodged, being approved – this includes both Council and RMS/TfNSW approvals,' said a Byron Shire Council spokesperson.

'A development application is to follow for the use of part of the land as a mobile Wildlife Hospital. A DA has been lodged in the NSW Planning Portal but [is] yet to be registered by Council.

'Council's understanding is that the mobile Wildlife Hospital will be parked on the land in between its travels to areas of need. When parked, local wildlife carers will be the primary users for wildlife drop off for emergency and or specialist care. It will not be accessed by the general public.

'When registered, the DA will be exhibited. With Christmas approaching this is likely to be in January.'

Vegetation removal

Additional concerns raised over the removal of some vegetation at the site have also been investigated by Council who told *The Echo* that, 'Staff inspected the site yesterday (25 November) and confirmed they had not removed any more trees/ vegetation from [those] that were felled previously and were putting the trees through the wood chipper.

'These trees/vegetation were on land under the remit of Local Land Services (LLS) who have visited the site and provided separate advice.'

According to a LLS spokesperson, 'Under the Local Land Services Act 2013, landowners on rural land have access to certain allowable activities that permit them to undertake routine agricultural maintenance such as vegetation management for fencelines.'

The maximum clearing area along fencelines has recently been increased to 25m under bushfire regulations.

'It is understood that regeneration/replanting of this area is to follow,' said Byron Council's spokesperson.

'Staff will discuss the status of the above section 138, timing for DA and any unresolved complaints lodged by community.

'All complaints logged with Council and substantiated with appropriate evidence will be dealt with as per Council's Enforcement Policy.'

The NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment said they are unable to comment on the activity at the site as it 'is currently an active investigation'.

Don't touch flying foxes, call WIRES for help

North Coast residents have been reminded of the dangers of touching injured and dead flying foxes as the summer season approaches.

The Byron Shire is home to multiple colonies of endangered Grey-headed Flying Foxes, but caring for the bats should be left to professionals. Bats can carry a large number of viruses including Australian Bat Lyssavirus, which can be extremely dangerous to humans if bitten or scratched by a flying fox carrying it.

North Coast Public Health Unit Director Paul Corben urged residents to not handle the animals, even if they find them injured and distressed.

'You may put yourself at risk, and also cause more harm to the bat. So, call your local authorised wildlife rehabilitation group or a local veterinarian,' he said.

Vital pollinators

The abundance of flowering trees in urban areas may provide an explanation into their recent move to urban areas explains Peter Boyde, Biodiversity Officer, at Byron Shire Council.

'We think the bats may be migrating to these urban areas because of how quick and easy they're able to get food from all of the garden fruit and flower trees.'

Council is attempting to reduce the conflict between humans and bat colonies by creating areas of better vegetation nearby that may attract the bats away from the food in urban areas.

'Bats are a vital part of our ecosystem here, they act as our primary pollinators for trees that act as food for koalas.' Mr Boyd said.

Clarkes Beach and the impact of climate change and rising sea levels

■ Oliver Dunne (Letters, 2 December) writes a lengthy letter attacking local environmental expert Dailan Pugh and claiming, 'The Clarkes Beach dune blowout was most definitely not caused by climate change or long-term sea level rise'.

Dunne cites an article that appeared in The Conversation (https://bit.ly/33vvV32) to support his statement. But The Conversation article doesn't argue this at all. In fact, it says the opposite, making several references to 'climate drivers' and other potential climate impacts on the scale of the Headline Effect.

Either Dunne did not read The Conversation article, or did not understand it. Or perhaps his letter to the editor was a deliberate attempt to mislead.

As editor of RenewEconomy for the past nine years, I witness the actions of climate deniers on a daily basis. This is one of their favourite ruses - cite an article, claim it says something different, and hope that everyone is too lazy or too busy to check.

The matters before us at Byron, and elsewhere in the

world, are too important for such reckless claims. This is no time to deny the science, we must respect the experts.

So Mr Dunne, please enjoy your privileged views, but try and open your eyes next time.

■ Oliver Dunne's insistence that the current erosion at Clarkes Beach has nothing to do with rising sea levels is both right and wrong. In the short-term, it is a result of a lack of sand supply around Cape Byron – variations in this supply cause Clarkes and Main beaches to build up and erode on a timescale of months.

Similarly, major storms such as those in the late '60s and early '70s caused erosion that may be followed by recovery of the beach on a timescale of years.

Underlying these variations are the long-term sand supply deficit and rising sea levels, working on a timescale of centuries and causing a slow but steady loss of beach sand, a loss which is hard to see in the short term as it is much less than the short-term variations.

The beaches may have

of the '60s/'70s, but they haven't recovered to former pre-storm condition, just as the northern end of the Belongil spit has never recovered from the storms of the late nineteenth century.

One way to address this long-term trend, and help manage the short-term variations, would be to get sand from the sand lobe off Cape Byron; but this was costed at \$38 million in 2006 – I suspect it would cost twice that to do it now.

Oliver suggests that there are other cheaper options, but doesn't detail these, other than perhaps pumping sand from Cosy Corner. Dailan Pugh says we need a plan, but doesn't suggest what that plan might be.

I don't know what the answer is, but I do know that addressing the short-term variations in sand supply but ignoring the long-term erosion trend and rising sea levels will not produce an effective solution. Of course, we could take the advice of another letter writer and put our trust in Trumpian fairy tales and conspiracy theories.

■ I have been contributing to the discussion over the issue of Byron beach erosion to encourage consideration of the long-term impacts of rising sea-levels owing to global heating, though for my efforts I have been attacked by Oliver Dunne, Matt Hartley, Jim Mangelson and others.

After years of research and observation I think I have a good knowledge of the studies, reports, and history of this issue, as well as the coastal processes involved.

I represented BEACON on Council's Coastline **Management Committee** from 2002–07 and Byron Residents' Group on the Coastal Zone Management Byron Bay Embayment Plan Project Reference Group in 2015-16.

I am fully aware that there are numerous short-term processes affecting the volume and location of sand on our beaches at any point in time as sand comes and goes, though the overall trend is that over the past 70 years there has been an average sand loss of some 50,000m³ per annum from the Byron embayment.

Oliver Dunne's claims that

I am advocating that Byron Bay residents pack their bags and move to Casino, or trying to stop toddlers being pushed in prams to the lighthouse, or stopping surfing are all ludicrous hyperbole.

Byron Council clearly identified those zones vulnerable to coastal erosion over the next 100 years back in 1986 when they adopted planned retreat, and required new buildings in those zones to be demountable so they can be moved back from the coast as it erodes.

I don't see what the problem is with moving holiday cabins in Reflections Holiday Park, or the Byron Bay Beach Cafe, back from the brink to leave room for the beach.

When I moved to Byron Bay I intentionally bought a property outside the coastal erosion zones, and just considering coastal recession my house will be okay for the next 100 years, as will the mothers pushing prams up to the lighthouse, and surfers (provided engineers don't mess with their breaks).

It is those people who bought in the mapped coastal erosion zones who

may have problems with coastal recession. Though anything they built since then had to be capable of being moved out of harm's

When it comes to a choice between building a rock wall to protect movable buildings or retaining a public beach by allowing it to move inland, my preference is for the beach.

While Jim Mangelson apparently agrees with Dr Derrick's claims that climate change and sea-level rise are a hoax, sadly, they aren't.

Like it or not, sea-levels are rising in response to global heating and this is already contributing to Byron's erosion problems and will greatly exacerbate them into the future, which will become most apparent when we get our next period of cyclonic erosion.

Byron needs a plan to adapt to the climate changes already locked in, while our State and Federal governments need to take urgent action to curb and sequester our carbon emissions to limit the magnitude of future sealevel rises.

pinch of a salt in every cake.' Hunna says an example of her popular salty sweetness is her pecan pie - sweetened with maple syrup and coconut sugar 'When it comes out of the oven I sprinkle it with Maldon Sea Salt flakes. For me the sweet and salty contrast is sublime. I add orange zest and a capfull of brandy also to diversify the flavour profile.'

Hunna loves the alchemy of cooking – she pours love and care into each and every cake or dish she makes. 'I have a strong vision for nourishing people and for offering an experience that touches their heart through their taste buds.'

Hunna says she is currently nurturing the sweet side of her business, adding new cakes to her website regularly. 'I'm also developing a gallery of images for my special event cakes. My decoration is fun, elegant, simple, earthy and honest. Edible flowers are a favourite, as well as fruit and nuts.' Hunna says one of her favourite cakes is a black sesame cake, topped with chocolate ganache. 'It embodies my wholefood approach, complete with lashings of decadence. My joy is in catering for retreats where I have an intuitive sense of how best to nourish participant's to match their retreat process. Specialty three course dinners and degustation events are the way I see my cooking career going forward.' Coming up, Hunna will be serving dinner as part of the River of Peace tea ceremony and sound meditation event at the Temple Garden Teahouse in Mullum. Eating and breathing sourdough

Jon and Gina live, eat and breathe sourdough. The couple behind Crabbes Creek Woodfired single handedly supply over 1,000 loaves of specialty freshly baked bread to the New Brighton and Mullum markets each week.

Crabbes Creek Woodfired started nearly 10 years ago from very humble beginnings. Jon made his own oven from scratch, and what started as a few loaves for friends developed into stocking the local general store. Out of sheer popularity they began a stall at the markets and are now home to 15 varieties of specialty flavours from ancient grains to traditional white. 'The most popular loaves at the moment seem to be pumpkin, olive and rosemary and the pepper sourdough,' says Jon.

Jon and Gina are parents to three teenagers and are assiduously hands on – no-one else is involved in the bread making process. Out on their farm, the day before Mullum Markets, they work a 17 hour day, managing around 7–8 bakes to supply the markets with around 700–800 of the freshest loaves. Jon starts mixing and Gina takes over once the kids have gone to school. 'Jon and I do the whole baking process ourselves, from the daily feeding of the leavens, to lighting of the woodfired oven the day before, to



cakes.

all the mixing, proving, shaping and baking.' The couple are rightfully proud of their product, and support from locals makes the strenuous hours worthwhile. 'The markets are so much fun,' says Gina. 'The stallholders, and also the customers – it's a vibrant community and they're all really supportive of us – we've been really lucky.'

And the reward for their huge week? Woodfired pizza – baked in their own handmade oven every Friday night!

HOW TO GET THE FULL MANDY

filters through the trash to find a little treasure that hasn't been touched. Some weeks I am fired up by the broader conversations. Other weeks I've had people contact me worried about an 87 year old being turfed out of her home. Some weeks I've taken my kid to a Xmas Carnival and been appalled by an outdated sexist mural. Other weeks I've had to dwell on the sad quiet things in my life, like my kids leaving home. I only have one rule, which is to be open to what the universe offers me when I sit in this chair. To dig into what I have strong feelings about so that I can share them with you. I don't always hit the mark, but most weeks I think I manage to add a fresh take on an issue that's not covered in the dominant narrative. Some weeks I think I touch a nerve. I make you feel something. I speak to the discomfort. I see that as my role, to say things that haven't been said, or tend to get swept under the carpet.

Oh and some weeks I make you laugh. Not every week though. Writing a humorous column felt a bit inane week in and week out. Over the years of writing what now amounts to over 1000 pieces I have broadened the palette. Of course, as it started as a humour column, whenever anyone finds my politics a bit full on, it does open it up for the oft-repeated patronising refrain 'stick to comedy'. It's the equivalent of 'go back to the kitchen'. That's one of my favourite themes too; Feminism. Or more appropriately – what it's like to be a woman in a world framed by men. What gives me enormous joy is the number of men who, over the years, write back that they feel exactly the same way as me. While the hideous men get more hideous, it seems there are fewer of them, and a growing voice of reason.

It's not always easy. Sometimes I know I am going to write about stuff that is going to piss people off and get me some nasty kick back – like 5G or vaccination. I could avoid it, but I think it's disingenuous to write a column for years and not be transparent about your ideology. By the way, I'm not sponsored by Big Pharma. I'm not in the employ of anyone, except The Echo. There are people who believe things in this town that I don't believe. Some of them are my friends. We have to learn to live together don't we? I have had to learn to not take things personally. Even though there might be disagreement, I've started what I intended – a robust conversation. I have never been comfortable with confrontation, so writing a column like this in a small town has taught me a lot about not 'taking stuff on'. Learning to accept people's dislike of you is as humbling as it is to accept the love and admiration of others.

This year marks 20 years of me writing Soapbox – this column. I have never missed a week. I'm quite obsessive, and having never missed a week, I kind of never intend to. It feels like I've been in conversation with my community for two decades. It's an enormous privilege to have a newspaper publish my thoughts and to have gathered a community of readers around me. Even the readers who hate me still read me every week. You know

People in the supermarket often approach me, or when I'm coming out of a toilet, or sitting in a coffee shop. They'll say'You must get sick of people coming up and telling you they love what you write'. No. I don't. No one ever gets sick of gratitude. It's really lovely. I love to know what has hit home for some people.

Every week I sit exactly here and wonder what I am going to write. Sometimes I'll be crossing the road and someone will wind down I don't always know. It's a constant mild anxiety where my brain a window and tell me something that expands on what I wrote that week. I love that. I love the little gifts. The poems. The funny

> So in putting my book together – The Full Mandy – that came into being through the generosity of my supporters on Go Fund Me - I had to go through years and years of my writing. I could see how my tentative self-consciousness gave way to a much broader pitch, something I really credit to my readers. It gave me a sense of enormous gratitude for a community that, whether they love me or loathe me, created a space for a loud-mouthed woman to find her voice. So thank you.

> And that lady I wrote about - the 87 year old who was facing homelessness? She got a house. That's the best feedback of all. When people who read your work feel compelled to make change. It's only tiny ripples that we make by having these conversations, but they can reach out across the pond. And I should warn you, I have a lot more rocks in my bucket!

Lisa has modelled Summerstage on what has been happening elsewhere – with the outdoor setting offering an alternative to indoor venues, thus enhancing the ability to embrace COVID Safe practices. Kicking off on Friday 18 December and rolling through every Friday, Saturday and Sunday until 14 February – this gives artists in the region a chance to work their home town, and visiting artists also get to drop in on the closest thing they will get to a festival gig this summer!

Hunt's first foray into event management came from a necessity to perform again – facing the harsh reality of a declining live music industry, she began to dream of getting a boutique festival up and running. Operating out of Red Devil Park, the venue is able to host a crowd of up to 500 whilst adhering to a COVID Safe plan.

This has been a labour of love for Lisa who has worked tirelessly to ensure Council and community are on board and safety protocols are met.

'I have been working with the festival director for the Caloundra festival – Richie Eyeles – to create the program and the architecture of how it will work, says Lisa.

Don't miss Lisa's grand return to gigging after ten months in the shade. 'I will be there on the Sunday with Sharny Russell, opening up with her tribute to Ella Fitzgerald.

After Sequin Sessions wrapped up Burger took some time out to regroup and digest the impact of what had happened – and contemplate what was next. A scenario many will relate to. The ever-resourceful Burger was fortunate enough to be getting the odd gig – delivered in a whole new way. She performed a live streamed show of her original music from Geelong Arts Centre and presented her highly esteemed stage show, Exposing Edith at Hammer Hall for Melbourne Arts Centre in front of 2500 empty seats, live streamed to their patrons.

Add to this a role in a new TV series that was being filmed in Adelaide, which required a midnight dash across the SA border from her home in Melbourne. Followed by a two week quarantine upstairs in her parents' house – receiving Italian and Greek home cooked meal deliveries left at the bottom of the stairs. And then, when her parents spontaneously up and bought a new house, she had a five month extension of her stay; cleaning and packing up her family home of 31 years... all this time separated from her husband in Melbourne.

So when Brett from the Picture House rang to ask if she would come back to Bruns to perform, she was neck deep in packing boxes and said 'YES!' before he could finish his sentence.

'I've missed the excitement and thrill of preparing for a show, finding music to perform and pulling a show together,' Burger said. And based on her year, she is certainly going to have a lot to say and very different to her two previous sold out Picture House shows, Exposing Edith and A Migrant's Son.

'I decided to create a new, fresh, intimate show for the Brunswick Picture House. Something I haven't done before, and probably won't do again. Despite looking complete, Council's Byron Bay Butler Street bypass project remains in limbo until noise abatement works are completed by the end of February, 2021. Construction will also cease over Christmas, say Council staff. Director of Infrastructure Services Phil Holloway said, 'It must be acknowledged that Byron's traffic woes are complex in nature, and the goal of the bypass project has never been to provide a silver bullet to alleviate traffic congestion on Ewingsdale Road'.
