# Who is likely to be in charge of Council?

As counting continues in the local council elections, a clearer picture is beginning to emerge of who will hold power in Byron and how this will affect the good folk of the Shire.

With preferences yet to be distributed in either the mayoral or councillor races, any prediction about the final make up of the Council is speculative.

But *The Echo*'s boffins have been crunching the numbers and we are ready to engage in some courageous conjecture.

With a lead of nearly five per cent at the time of writing, it appears that Independent Michael Lyon is likely to be elected mayor, continuing the role he was filling on an interim basis prior to the election.

Increasing the likelihood of this outcome is the fact that Cr Lyon seems likely to receive a significant number of second preference votes thanks to the alliance he forged with Labor and two other Independent candidates prior to the election – a group known as the United Front.

While Cr Lyon's closest rival in the mayoral race, Mark Swivel (Independent), will also receive some second preference votes as part of the same arrangement, it is unlikely to be enough to get him over the line given Lyon's lead.

#### Does the mayor matter?

Even though the mayor only has one vote during the normal course of events, the position is crucial.

For a start, they have significant power to make decisions on their own under delegated authority when an urgent decision is required. This power has been used on multiple occasions in the past two years owing to the chaos of COVID-19.

The mayor also has the casting vote in situations where a Council vote is deadlocked, a power that Cr Lyon used on multiple occasions as interim mayor.

But perhaps even more important in the context of this election is the fact that, should Cr Lyon be elected mayor, there will be flow-on effects for those further down his Byron Independents ticket.

Put simply, it is likely to mean that at least two of Cr Lyon's running mates – Sama Balson and Peter Westheimer – will also get seats on the Council.

That would create a block of three Council votes.

Obviously this will not constitute a majority on a nine-member Council.

However, it is likely to create a majority for the United Front, assuming that their alliance was more than just a front for political expediency.

Extrapolating dangerously from the current numbers, it looks like that alliance may have a majority on the Council, broken down as follows:

Byron Independents (led by Cr Lyon): three seats; Mark Swivel Team: one or two seats; Labor (led by Asren Pugh): one seat.

Total votes: 5 or 6.

The remaining Council spots look likely to be taken by The Greens (two seats) and independent Cr Cate Coorey (one seat).

Conservative Alan Hunter is still in with a chance of getting a seat, yet it is unlikely for Bruce Clarke.

# Local COVID-19 cases surge

Local health authorities have reported an increase in COVID-19 cases in the north coast, with Byron cases being most prevalent.

In the 24 hours to 8pm December 10, Northern NSW Local Health District (LHD) said 35 new cases of COVID-19 were detected.

Northern NSW LHD Chief Executive, Wayne Jones, said, 'We are seeing an increase in cases in the Byron Bay region, and the majority of them are associated with

venues including pubs, clubs and party settings'.

Woody's Surf Shack Night Club has been identified as a venue of concern on the nights of November 30, December 1, 2 and 3.

Forty-six COVID-19 cases have been confirmed from an event at Coorabell Hall on December 4 (4pm onwards).

Other venues considered a concern are the Kiosk Lennox Beach (Pacific Parade) on December 7,

between 7am and 3pm, and No Bones Byron Bay (11 Fletcher Street) on December 7, between 6 and 9pm (nine cases linked).

Another confirmed case of COVID-19 was identified at the Byron Bay campus of SAE Creative Media Institute on December 7.

NSW LHD say two COVIDpositive patients are in hospital in Northern NSW, and around 120 cases 'are being cared for by our Virtual COVID Care team'.



# Artists adapt around virus restrictions

The abandoned fover of an old cinema was not where the graduating class of Murwillumbah TAFE's Visual Arts Diploma course had intended to have their final exhibition.

Two weeks before their showcase was due to open in the TAFE's own building, new COVID safety regulations were introduced, which effectively meant that no one except students and staff would be able to attend.

So the search for an alternative venue began, led by TAFE's Head of Creative Design and Ideation for the Tweed, Sandra Guy.

What emerged was a collaboration between TAFE NSW and Murwillumbah's M Arts Precinct that resulted in a huge exhibition, called Blueprint, by students from 11 different courses spanning two campuses.

Much of their work found a home in the un-utilised foyer of Murwillumbah's

grand old Regent Cinema.

'I remember saying "We can do this!",' Ocean Shoresbased artist, Alexandra Diana, recalls of the moment she and her fellow students walked into the cavernous old foyer for the first time.

'It's amazing what you can do when you have to adapt.'

A few weeks and plenty of elbow grease later, the exhibition is in full swing and the space is filled with colourful creations from some of the region's finest creative folk.

It was just one of the challenges presented to the students by COVID-19 over the past 12 months.

Ms Diana and her colleagues have also had to navigate the lack of structure created by fewer face-to-face classes, financial challenges, and feelings of isolation.

'I think we all needed to be more resilient to hold the process gracefully,' Alexandra

ing alone allowed her internal processes to arise – bringing up both gifts and the gremlins.

'Because I didn't have to be painting, it enabled my fear to be very present,' she says.

'The time would come to paint, and I would be like "hmmm, I might just go for a walk in nature". At a certain point, I just said "okay, just do it". Somehow that unblocked the process'.

Among the works she created were an emotionally evocative series of drawings titled Back to Self, and a stunning triptych: Emotional Landscapes.

Blueprint runs until December 18 at the M|Arts precinct, Cnr of Brisbane and Wollumbin Streets, Murwillumbah.

#### Morrisey's book looks at colonial history

A new book by Patrick Morrisey argues colonial Ireland begat colonial Australia, '600 years before Captain Cook skewered a Union Jack into Aboriginal land'.

In *The Great Irish Famine*: One Clan's Story, the former Byron Shire councillor recalls the outrage of an election in County Kilkenny at the end of The Great Famine.

He says, 'Starvation and disease had wiped out around one million souls and forced another million-and-ahalf to emigrate'.

'Two of my ancestors left in 1848, finding work in Moreton Bay before heading to the Gold Fields.

'The rest of the family remained in Ireland, renting a quarter acre off a middleman to grow potatoes, in return for their labour, while some of the better off tenant farmers had been enfranchised with a vote for the first time.'

# Fingal Head reserve handed to Aboriginal Land Council

In a NSW first, the Tweed Byron Aboriginal Land Council (TBALC) has been handed the management of the culturally significant Fingal Head reserve, a 2.3 hectare parcel of land.

In a ceremony on December 10, local families gathered with community members and representatives to acknowledge the importance of this event.

'Thank you to the Land Council for inviting us to be here for this historic occasion of being handed over management of the headland,' said Nicole Rotumah-Weir, Chairperson of the Tweed Aboriginal Cooperative.

'It is a massive achievement for our land council.

'This decision could be the start of something really big for our community, and part of historic sites being asked to be handed back for management by our Aboriginal people'.

Following a ceremonial

dance, Leweena Williams, CEO of the Tweed Byron Aboriginal Land Council recognised the long fight that has been fought for recognition.

'That was pretty emotional,' she said when the dance completed.

'When we think about all our old fellas that have

fought for this place, our old fellas that are here today, it is an honour to be able to do this work for you, and teach our kids to do this once we've left this Earth'.

'So it's people who we watched as kids and they were part of this fight. The boys showed their emotions through their dance'.

Ms Williams recognised the work of Silas Southerland from Crown Lands, and local MP Geoff Provest (Nationals).

'Silas Southerland – he was the guy who orchestrated this, along with the land council. He's not just another bureaucrat making decisions on our behalf that affects us'.

'He actually came up and had a look at the projects, sat down and had a yarn at the Sheoak Shack, here on Country, and really got to understand what we do here, not just to do with the headland but the entire peninsula', she explained.

#### Battle won

'This is another battle that's been won at Fingal,' said Uncle Franc Krasna.

'From securing housing in the 1960s, to Ocean Blue, and now the government has recognised us today'.

Kay Bolton from Fingal Head Coastcare (FHC) added, 'This community has worked for decades and decades to protect what we think is really special. The reason we have been successful is because we have worked together.

'The most relevant project is our headland project. It was being destroyed. It was being loved to death.'

#### Foreign-owned water entitlements at 11 per cent

The Productivity Commission, an independent federal agency that reviews and advises on government policy, has released its latest report: Register of Foreignowned Water Entitlements.

It states, 'The level of foreign ownership of Australian water entitlements on issue is now about 11 per cent, with most investment coming from Canada, followed by China and the United States'.

While the authors claim there is support for foreign investment within the agricultural and mining industries, 'a sizeable share of the Australian community has some unease towards foreign investment, particularly foreign "direct"

investment that entails some control of Australian businesses and assets'.

'It is sometimes considered a threat to rural livelihoods, local communities and Australian food security concerns that carry over to water entitlements. Changes in water resource management and the pressures from prolonged periods of drought have exacerbated these concerns.

'In response to community concerns and a perception of rapidly rising foreign control of water assets, the Australian Government introduced the Register of Foreign Ownership of Water Entitlements (the Register) in 2017, to provide transparency about the level

of foreign ownership of water.

'Under the Register, foreign persons are required to notify the ATO if they acquire a specified water asset or if there are changes to their foreign status or water entitlement holdings'.

The threshold for foreign owned water entitlements are: 'if a foreign person, corporation or government has an interest in an entity of at least 20 per cent, or multiple foreign entities have an aggregate interest in an entity of at least 40 per cent'.

The report claims, 'There is no compelling case for major changes to the Register of Foreign Ownership of Water Entitlements' as it is fit for purpose

#### Govt eases regulations around food trucks and 'dark kitchens'

The permanent adoption of initiatives introduced during the COVID-19 pandemic will see a '\$3.1 billion productivity boost', says NSW Treasurer, Matt Kean (Liberal).

Kean says the decision followed 'consultation and evaluation'.

'From allowing greater use of food trucks and dark kitchens, to giving workers more flexibility in how they take long service leave – these measures have been providing the extra support many businesses needed during COVID-19', Mr Kean said.

Meanwhile, Minister for Planning and Public Spaces, Rob Stokes (Liberal), said 'The disruption of the pandemic allowed us to experiment with how the planning system can work better to drive productivity. We're now securing those benefits in perpetuity'.

#### Permanent changes

The temporary changes made permanent include: 'Allowing digital display of planning documents; Allowing lower-risk licensed venues, including restaurants and cafes, to sell takeaway and home delivery alcohol under the Liquor Act 2007, subject to limitations including purchase with a meal and restrictions on amount purchased'.

# Lismore predicted to grow by 14%

The population of the Lismore Local Government Area (LGA) is forecast to grow by 13.57 per cent to 51,023 over the next two decades, according to research commissioned by Lismore City Council.

The research by demographic forecaster .id (Informed Decisions) predicts the LGA will experience annual growth of 0.6 per cent to 2041, adding another 6,000 people to the population.

This reverses the recent trend of a declining population.

Lismore Council's Director of Partnerships, Planning and Engagement, Eber Butron, said 'One thing that stands out in this research is the importance of highquality facilities like the Lismore Base Hospital and Southern Cross University, as well as our unique environment, as population drivers for Lismore LGA'.

Predictions include another 3,105 dwellings to meet the population demand by 2041, however the research suggests the type of

housing is likely to change.

'Lone person households will continue to grow, increasing from 5218 in 2016 to over 6500 by 2041 which would be 30.4 per cent of all households. As the average household size declines and the number of people living alone increases, Lismore will need smaller, mediumdensity development close to town and health services', Mr Butron said.

Allan Yarrington, local of 33 years, passed away in the arms of his three children at Tweed Hospital.

Infamously known as the The Box King, Allan was an iconic character of Byron Shire.

He first started making a name for himself by selling old soft drink timber Cottees boxes at markets, which paved the way for a successful business employing over 35 staff for ten years manufacturing in the building behind Mitre10.

During that time, Allan contributed to many local fundraisers, hosted Sea Shepherd events at his Belongil property, and Africa Leaf fundraisers, among many other local charities.


Allan was passionate about community, human rights and health.

#### **Box King**

After the closure of The Box King, he went on to open up The Conscious Cafe with me, his daughter.

It was the first 100 per cent organic cafe in Australia.

The Conscious Cafe

quickly became the popular number one local gathering spot, hidden in the old Woolworths car park, draped in vines, plants, daybeds, crystals and the like.

It was said that locals of 40 year's residence would come down from the hills to eat at The Conscious Cafe, as it was reminiscent of the old hippie Byron days.

Devastatingly Allan lost

his younger daughter Bonny Yarrington, 26, in an accident at Billinudgel, leaving the family shattered.

Allan's entrepreneurial endeavours also included the big orange, which is still at the local markets 26 years later.

Then there's the Humble Pie van, and Uncle Tom's Pies, introducing its first gluten-free pies, JING shack cafe, The Whitehouse Byron Industrial Estate.

Al was never short of business ideas.

The entrepreneurial DNA has been passed down to his children; Adam, myself and Daniel.

Allan was a member of Byron Chamber of Commerce, and was very vocal on issues regarding over-development of Byron and social issues like coal seam gas (CSG) fracking and international human rights.

But he was not only known as a business man, he was the life of the party.

#### Iconic parties

Hosting the largest, most iconic parties Byron Shire has ever seen at his Belongil property those that attended left in awe. A few of those parties ended in large fines and court cases.

One thing is for sure, Allan knew how to throw a party.

A character larger than life, he will be greatly missed by family, friends and the community. Allan's legacy lives on through his children and in the hearts he touched.

A celebration of his life will be held for Allan on December 21.

#### ClubsNSW targets money launderers

## Treeloppers dump rubbish at Broken Head Hall

A spokesperson for the Broken Head Hall committee, Mr Bruce Blackford, says that last Thursday morning, a large pile of wood chips was found dumped in the hall's car park. This has occurred on several occasions in the past.

'Broken Head Hall is not

a Council-owned hall', he said. 'It is owned by the local community, and run by a small group of volunteers. It operates on a not-for-profit basis, and the car park space is essential for the use of the various groups that use the hall on a regular basis'.

'The hall committee is

now faced with a bill to clean up the mess, unless those who dumped it come back and pick it up. The committee has limited funds but is now looking at installing security cameras so that, if it occurs again, the culprits can be identified and reported to the authorities'.

The Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) have announced that the amount that NSW councils will be able to increase the revenue they can collect from rates will depend on each LGA's level of population growth.

Under the 2022-23 rate peg decision, IPART has set a rate peg for each council, ranging from 0.7 per cent to 5.0 per cent.

Tribunal Chair, Carmel Donnelly, said that in setting the rate peg for 2022-23, IPART has used a new methodology that recognises that some councils face higher costs from growing populations.

She says, 'We have developed a way of incorporating population growth into the rate peg that balances the need to ensure councils are

financially sustainable, while protecting ratepayers from excessive rate rises'.

'The methodology we have used will ensure councils maintain the average amount of money collected per person as their population grows.

'This will enable councils to provide services to their growing communities,' said Ms Donnelly.

IPART's rate peg also takes into account the annual change in the Local Government Cost Index (LGCI), which measures the average costs faced by NSW councils.

According to IPART, the rate peg represents the maximum percentage amount by which a council may increase its general income.

For almost all councils, general income consists entirely of revenue from rates.

'The rate peg applies to each council's general income in total, not to individual ratepayers' rates. Councils may increase categories of rates by more than, or less than, the rate peg, as long as the total increase in general income remains within the rate peg'

Individual ratepayers' rates are also impacted by land values set by the Valuer General NSW.

Byron Shire has a relatively low population for the region, yet high visitation numbers.

Meanwhile, IPART has released its Draft Report to seek feedback from stakeholders on its draft decisions on the regulation of domestic waste management charges.

# Seven Mile Beach Road traffic changes

Parking changes, including speed humps, will be introduced for Seven Mile Beach Road in the Broken Head Nature Reserve by Council.

Council staff say the measures will aim to reduce parking problems and keep the road clear, safe and passable for all traffic, especially emergency vehicles.

James Flockton, Infrastructure Planning Coordinator, said the popularity of the area is not only putting pressure on parking, but also on the natural environment, with the nature reserve home to three endangered plant communities including littoral and lowland rainforest as well as 240 plant species, 12 of which are threatened in NSW.

He says, 'Our long-term traffic counts estimate an average of 400 vehicles a day are using Seven Mile Beach Road, which is extraordinary when you consider that this is a narrow, single lane, dead-end, gravel road in a nature reserve'.

'Because parking is limited, drivers are tending to park wherever they like, often blocking access, which means that the area becomes gridlocked'.

He says permanent barriers are now being installed 'to try to stop people parking on the road and maintain access'.

#### **Bollards**

'We are using rocks and timber bollards that better suit the surrounding natural environment.

'We will also be installing a radar to remind people of how fast they are going because, unbelievably, some drivers treat the road, which is a crossing for wildlife and used by pedestrians, like it is a racetrack'.




It's part history lesson, part entrancing meditation upon what a city promises, and the failings of all large urban centres.

# Pure Melt Chocolate finds new digs

Three months after a rental spike forced Mullumbimby chocolateer, Sarah Wheeler, to close her local cafe, she has secured a new retail outlet and a new focus on bringing her wares to the world.

A fixture on Stuart Street for over five years, Ms Wheeler's Pure Melt cafe closed in September after her landlord asked her to pay 53 per cent more in rent.

Now, Pure Melt is back with a new kitchen in the Mullumbimby Industrial Estate, from which Ms Wheeler is focusing on the retail side of her business.

'It was a challenge, and it was horrible the way it happened,' Ms Wheeler said of the cafe's closure.

'But somehow, I knew there'd be a silver lining. I didn't realise quite how soon that would happen'.

She has now joined a number of other local artisan food producers at Byron Bay Catering – a growing food hub on Towers Drive, Mullumbimby.

'It was a real challenge to find new premises,' she said.

'This is not a great time to be a potential tenant in the Byron Shire, whether you're looking for a home or a new place of business.'


'I was really lucky that a space came up when it did'.

# Media shmedia

Do you pay close attention to who owns the news you consume, and what their agenda is?

The Echo is locally owned and operated and has been since its inception in 1986. The Echo's agenda has been constant throughout those years, and its motto is to 'afflict the comfortable and comfort the afflicted' (Finley Peter Dunne 1867-1936).

It appears a somewhat rare position to take for modern day media, but *The Echo* can do so because it is a small independent entity.

In the past decade or more, diversity in the media landscape has been contracting, and at a rapid rate.

There is a real danger when concentrated corporate media aligns itself with an extreme political agenda. History is littered with such examples, which don't end well.

A long essay that outlines this danger is the recently released federal Senate report into Media Diversity in Australia.

The 304 page document comprehensively examines how our media ended up where it is, and offers some useful suggestions to improve the sector through, (cough), diversity.

Notwithstanding the ABC and SBS public broadcasters, Australia has only three national-scale commercial media voices, according to the Centre for Advancing Journalism (page 81).

US-based News Corporation (Murdoch) controls 'about twothirds of metropolitan daily newspaper circulation, including monopolies in Brisbane, Adelaide, Hobart and Darwin; regional daily monopolies in a range of cities, including Cairns and Townsville; substantial chains of suburban and rural newspapers; [and] the only subscription television news service, Sky News - which also operates as a free-to-air channel in regional areas'.

Nine Entertainment owns the Nine television network, and the previous Fairfax mastheads *The Sydney Morning Herald*, *The Age* and The Financial Review. In Western Australia, Kerry Stokes seems to have a fairly strong hold on the state's news (print and TV) with Seven West Media Ltd.

According to IBISWorld, Newspaper publishing in Australia (August 2021, page 8), the percentage share of industry revenue puts Newscorp way ahead of the pack at 52.5 per cent, then Nine Entertainment (17.6 per cent), Australian Community Media, owned equally by Antony Catalano and Alex Waislitz (10.3 per cent), Seven West Media (6.5 per cent) and then other (13.1).

In short, Murdoch's News Corp has been allowed to expand its already considerable influence in Australia under Liberal-National governments. It's no secret they share similar ideologies and promote the same worldview: Punish the vulnerable, stifle public debate and exploit whatever you can for personal gain.

The Senate report admits that reform 'will be no easy task', and suggests a 'dedicated judicial inquiry with the powers of a royal

It continues, 'This kind of inquiry would have the power to compel witnesses to give evidence, and would have the capacity. resourcing and expertise to undertake a more thorough investigation than a Parliamentary committee is able to do'.

In a world where justice actually existed, and Julian Assange wasn't locked up for reporting government crimes, this would be a good place to start.

# The rise of emboldened neo-Nazis

ell respected anti-racism activist, supporter of First Nations rights and prominent trade unionist, Padraic (Paddy) Gibson, had three neo-Nazi types, with shaven heads and shirts emblazoned with the Eureka flag, turn up on his front doorstep on the night of Saturday December 4.

The unexpected and uninvited visitors banged on his front door, calling out that they wanted to speak to him.

The three men soon commenced bashing on the door of his Sydney home, ripping at security screens and even broke a window.

Gibson explained that he has been the subject of death threats in the past, and welcomed the support that his multicultural neighbourhood has shown since the incident.

As a member of socialist group Solidarity, Padraic is a key figure on the local social justice movement.

He's also a researcher at the UTS Jumbunna Institute, where he works under esteemed Professor Larissa Behrendt. And his work at the uni directly deals with Aboriginal deaths in custody.

NSW police are currently investigating the matter.

It's been lost on no one that this incident has occurred at a time when far-right groups have been emboldened, owing to their prominent mobilising as part of the 'Freedom' movement.

Of course, not all participants in the recent anti-lockdown and vaccine mandate rallies have been people who align themselves with right wing politics.

**Sydney Criminal Lawyers** spoke to Paddy Gibson:

You've said that you received death threats last year around the time of the Black Lives Matter rallies. Why do you think you've been targeted now?

'I've got no particular indication as to why, except that I am a prominent anti-racist activist, and in the sights of these people. As I said, I've received quite a lot of threats previously, including threats to the house.

'I would say I am known to the far-right, and they've probably got wind in their sails, as they've been welcomed with open arms at these 'Freedom' rallies and demonstrations against lockdowns and vaccine mandates. There's been a prominent far-right presence within that movement.

'I've had more experienced trade unionists and anti-racist activists contact me, telling me that these kinds of tactics were a lot more common in the late '80s.

'There was a group, National Action, who used to do "home visits". But people haven't heard about this particular tactic for quite some time'.

There have been numerous visible displays of a far-right presence around the country. Would you say the attack on your house reflects a failure on the part of the political leadership in addressing this?

'Absolutely. It certainly reflects a failure of political leadership on a range of fronts. Firstly, the racism that we see in such a concentrated and violent form with fascist and openly far-right groupings, is really something that's encouraged by government policy.

'We live in a country where there's absolute systematic racism against Aboriginal people, people of colour and migrants. Aboriginal people are demonised and abused by police and government agencies every day of the week.

'The response to the Black Lives Matter movement was disgraceful. We had the police commissioner Mick Fuller demonising BLM protesters as being violent and responsible for the spread of the coronavirus last year. We had police attacking our attempts to organise these rallies.

'We have ongoing police killings of Aboriginal people in police custody. That includes the shooting just a few weeks ago in Sydney. And it's sanctioned, really, by the government refusal to prosecute killers.

'The racist political system in Australia, and the racist policy settings, are what allow the far-right to get an audience for their ideas and confidence in them to grow.

'That's absolutely the case. Nationalism and xenophobia have been encouraged

through the coronavirus pandemic. We have seen border closures. It is the go-to measure for governments when they try to appear as though they're acting to contain the virus.

'This is a kneejerk, xenophobic response that's designed to show people they're being tough and protective. But all of it encourages racism and nationalism. That's what you get if you have racism at the top: people on the ground are empowered to carry that out in a violent way.

'Then there's the failure of the response to the coronavirus. The group that I am part of, Solidarity, has been very critical of lockdowns.

'We're very critical of vaccine mandates. The government's coronavirus response has been very punitive, and it's done an enormous amount of social damage.

'We have a very polarised society, where a lot of people have lost work and their livelihoods, and that sort of environment is a breeding ground for the far-right to grow.

'I'm incredibly provaccine. I've been campaigning for the vaccination since it became available. And I've been heavily critical of the government's vaccine rollout. The government is using vaccine mandates and scapegoating unvaccinated people as an excuse for the failure to properly invest in the health system and the social security system, and actually provide the security and care that we need to get through this pandemic. It's all of those things: a rise in racism and the social and economic pain that has come out of the coronavirus crisis'.

'This is a perfect storm'.



# Perspective after four years away

Four years is the longest I've been absent from Australian shores - plenty seems to have happened since I last set foot here. Juanita presents the news from Gadigal Country, and there are all sorts of new accents on TV, people 'check in' as religiously as they saved water during the decade of drought. There was a new drought – so severe my home town of Tenterfield ran out of drinking water – there were crazy fires, and then the best season any farmer has seen in their lifetime.

Road crews seem to now be half female, and Marrickville has become trendy. Byron has gone beyond trendy and entered some kind of stratospheric zone where no normal human dares to tread!

Some things of course remain resolutely the same: Sydneysiders discuss house prices, secretly pleased their homes are worth so much, wondering in the next sentence how their children (let alone their cleaners) will ever afford to live there.

I forget, and am reminded every time I come home how great Jatz are, and how great Aussie coffee, is while organic food remains hard to find for any reasonable price.

#### **Aussiness**

Eighteen years living in Europe has accustomed me to absences from all that Aussiness, but this was the longest stretch. I've never been one for homesickness but it was starting to weigh on me. A slight sense that the thread connecting me wasn't just stretching, but perhaps fraying, definitely fragile in a way I hadn't previously felt.

I searched out Australianmade series on Netflix (limited when your IP address is in France). I monopolised a client when I realised he had no accent (ie, he had an Aussie one) – so desperate was I to hear a voice that sounded like home. In March I delivered my 18 year old to Frankfurt airport – how comforting it was to put him on a Qantas repatriation flight full of people sounding like us.

#### Changing country

When my turn to return came in late September, instead of the usual full immersion experience once you land we were instead ferried through an empty terminal, onto a socially distanced bus, and into a hotel

for two weeks of recycled air with not even a hint of Sydney breeze.

It gave me time to notice the multitude of Australian accents on ABC news reporting, and the recognition of Aboriginal countries. Sydney as Gadigal Country has now entered my brain. What a joyful thing that this seems to have permeated Australian life.

On emerging from the hotel I visited the *Unsettled* exhibition at the Australian Museum, which was confronting and thought provoking. Often we feel frustrated and despairing at the slow pace of change, but this feels like the start of something big and new.

Is it just lip service? Tagging along with *The Echo* last week to a ceremony celebrating the Tweed Byron Aboriginal Land Council taking over management of Fingal Head, it felt real and grounded. The speakers stressed the strength of the cooperation between Coastcare groups, the local Tweed Council and the Aboriginal Land Council. It was heartening and I hope they are, as the first in the State to make such a transition, a model for others to follow.

#### **COVID** life

Moving around NSW I've been struck by the extraordinary level of compliance with COVID regulations and general cautiousness. I felt out of sync. Australia has been protected and 'living with COVID' remains an idea rather than the reality it is in France. Everyone signs in; something the French wholeheartedly

rejected! Perhaps because there were so many cases in France no-one had confidence the contact tracing system could keep up (they were right – it didn't), whereas in Australia it has.

Vaccination rates in
France and Australia are
now roughly the same, so,
however it happened, people
have responded to the call.
I suspect the long summer
coming up (generally a low
risk period), and the booster
shots, will loosen everyone
up and living with COVID will
become a reality.

#### **Building futures**

The elephant in this article is the submarines! I wonder if Australia has missed a trick in so roundly humiliating France. Our relationship feels like it is summed up by tensions over atomic testing in the Pacific and now the submarines.

With a large presence in the Pacific (French Polynesia, New Caledonia, Wallis and Futuna), France is surely a useful partner. More relevant than the British in any case, but language and cultural barriers make it all seem difficult. Maybe we could try harder?

Last but not least, why do Sydneysiders spend so much money on their houses and fail to put in double glazing? Winters are short but very cold and houses are open plan and poorly heated. Inner Sydney is noisy, and it sometimes feels like you are literally living on the street. The only homes with double glazing I've encountered belonged to two sciency buddies. Invest, and you won't be disappointed!

# Electric Boogaloo on the Northern Rivers

After several years of consideration, 2021 was the year that we got an electric car (EV). Six months later and with rising fuel prices we have no regrets. But what's it like to own an electric car in Byron Shire?

Firstly, there are the things you expect: the quiet ride; the guilt free travel, but there are also some surprises. Our maiden journey, for example, was a trip to Tweed and we were so excited that we didn't fully charge the car. On the way home we managed to limp back as far as Brunswick Heads where we made a surprise visit to a friend and enjoyed a bottle of wine while the car charged at the end of a chain of extension cords coming from the front of her house.

We left Bruns after dinner feeling that our battery charging incompetence had only served to make a mundane trip into something that was much more fun.

It did take us a little while to move beyond charging the car at home to using the chargers that can be



found 'in the wild'. Charging locations can be found fairly simply by using either the Chargefox app or the Plugshare app. For us the closest option is in the car park of the offices of Byron Council but this comes at the cost of getting the car covered in pigeon shit while it is charging.

#### Range anxiety

The phenomenon of 'range anxiety' is the fear your EV will run out of charge before you get to your destination. Sometimes the world conspires against you. On a recent trip to Kingscliff I was planning to charge the car while my eldest son played soccer, but the charging station in Kingscliff was not working. Through the Chargefox app I was able to call customer support for the

charging station and after they rebooted the charging station the problem was not sreolved.

I collected my lad and headed to Tropical Fruit World where there is another a charging station... and this one wasn't working either. The customer support people were, again, lovely but in the end all they could suggest was that I get as close to home as I could, then call the NRMA to tow me the rest of the way.

Luckily we made it to Ocean Shores where - déjà vu – we enjoyed a glass of scotch on the verandah with friends. The experience was a reminder that infrastructure can let you down.

It would be a shame if EV owners had to resort to carrying portable generators with them, so it is good to

hear that the State government has pledged to spend \$171m on more charging stations across the State.

Owning an EV means you need to be mindful of the vehicle's battery life, but for us that does not detract from the joy of having it. When you put your foot down it really moves (don't forget to dodge the potholes) but as time has gone by the joy of going fast has been replaced with the pursuit of energy efficiency.

It is fun to make full use of the regenerative braking and I find myself driving below the speed limit (very unlike me) to try and find the most efficient speed and feeling happier for it. Maybe the thing I don't enjoy is seeing the projected range drop when I turn on the air conditioning, however, most of the time this is not a worry.

I really think that one day petrol will be something that is only found in museums of the 20th century where school children will wrinkle their noses when they get a foul whiff of authentic 20th century hydrocarbons.

#### What Greenland's record-breaking rain means for the planet

**¬** or three days in August, seven billion tonnes of rain fell across Greenland – the largest amount since records began in 1950. It's also the first time since then that rain, not snow, fell on Greenland's highest peak.

This is alarming. Greenland's ice sheet is the second largest on the planet (after Antarctica) and any rain falling on its surface accelerates melting. By 15 August, the amount of ice lost was seven times greater than is normal for mid-August.

This is just the latest extreme climate event on the island, which sits in the North Atlantic Ocean. In a single day in July this year, the amount of ice that melted in Greenland would have covered the US state of Florida with five centimetres of water. And last October, research showed ice in Greenland is melting faster than at any other time in the past 12,000 years.

Melting ice in Greenland threatens to significantly hamper humanity's efforts to mitigate climate change. That's because, after a certain point, it may create catastrophic 'feedback loops'.

Let's look at the issue in more detail.

#### Rising temperatures in the Arctic

Greenland's vast ice sheet comprises almost 1.7 million square kilometres of glacial land ice. It covers most of the territory and contains enough ice to raise sea levels by more than seven metres if

all of it melted.

The Greenland and Antarctic ice sheets lost a combined 6.4 trillion tonnes of ice between 1992 and 2017. Melting in Greenland has contributed to 60 per cent (17.8 millimetres) of the Earth's overall sea-level rise owing to melting ice sheets, even though Greenland is much smaller than Antarctica.

This may be, in part. because half of Greenland's melting is the result of rising air temperatures, which cause surface melting. In Antarctica, most ice loss is from ocean water melting glaciers that spill from land into the sea. And the rate of ice loss in both Greenland and Antarctica is accelerating – increasing sixfold since the 1990s.

Rain falling on ice exacerbates this process. So what's behind the recent unprecedented weather?

Temperatures in the Arctic are rising twice as quickly as the rest of the planet for a number of reasons, including; changes in cloud cover and water vapour, the reflectivity of the surface, and how weather systems transport energy from the tropics to the polar regions. This has made extreme weather events more common.

In recent years, in Greenland, rain has fallen further north, and more rain has fallen in winter. This is not normal for these regions, which usually get snow, not rain, in below-freezing temperatures.

This month's rain is the result of warm, moist air flowing up from south-west of Greenland and remaining for several days. In the morning of 14 August, temperatures at the 3,216m summit of Greenland's ice sheet surpassed freezing point, peaking at 0.48°C. Rain fell on the summit for several hours that morning, and on 15 August.

shocking given the above-freezing temperatures occurred so late in

Greenland's normally short summer. At this time of year, large areas of bare ice are exposed from a lack of snow, which leads to greater runoff of rainwater and meltwater into the oceans.

#### When melting is self-reinforcing

Rainfall makes the ice sheet more prone to surface melt since it exacerbates the so-called 'ice-albedo positive feedback'. In other words. the melting reinforces itself; When rain falls, its warmth can melt snow, exposing the underlying darker ice, which absorbs more sunlight. This increases temperatures at the surface, leading to more melting.

Unfortunately, this isn't the only positive feedback loop destabilising the Greenland ice sheet.

The 'positive melt-elevation feedback' is another, where the lower height of the ice sheet leads to faster melting because higher temperatures occur at lower altitudes.

Also worrying is when higher temperatures cause coastal glaciers to thin, allowing more ice to slip into the sea. This both speeds up the rate of glacier flow towards the sea and lowers the ice surface, exposing it to warmer air temperatures and, in turn, increases melting.

#### What does this mean for the planet?

These positive feedbacks can lead to tipping points - abrupt and irreversible changes in the climate system after a certain threshold is reached. We are more likely to reach these tipping points as emissions increase and global temperatures rise.

While the science on tipping points is still emerging, the most recent report from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPPC) said they cannot be ruled out. The report identified likely tipping points, such

as widespread Arctic sea-ice melting, and the thawing of methane-rich permafrost.

Recent studies show what humanity may be up against. A study from May this year showed a substantial part of the Greenland ice sheet is either at, or about to reach, a tipping point where melting will accelerate, even if global warming is stopped. Scientists are concerned reaching this point may trigger a cascade effect, leading to other tipping points being reached.

Melted ice from both the Arctic Ocean and Greenland have caused an influx of freshwater into the North Atlantic Ocean. This has contributed to the slowing of a system of crucial ocean currents, which carry warm water from the tropics into the colder North Atlantic. This current, called the Atlantic Meridional Overturning Circulation (AMOC), has slowed by 15 per cent since the 1950s.

If the AMOC slows down any further, the consequences for the planet could be profound. It could destabilise the West African monsoon, cause more frequent drought in the Amazon rainforest and accelerate ice loss in Antarctica.

#### Existential threat

The rising likelihood of tipping points being reached beyond 1.5°C of warming represents a potential, looming existential threat to human civilisation. However, even if we've already crossed some tipping points, as some scientists suggest, how fast the impacts unfold is still within our control.

If we limit global warming to 1.5°Cthis century, we give ourselves longer to adapt to heating already locked into the Earth's system. But the window is rapidly closing; estimates indicate we may reach the crucial 1.5°C threshold as soon as the mid-2030s.

The message for humanity is urgent: hard science, not cloying political spin, needs to dictate climate action in the coming years. As with COVID-19, listening to the scientists gives us the best hope of saving the planet.

# MANDY NOLAN'S SOAPBOX FAILING OUR MOTH

Once, when I was on stage, a large moth flew up my skirt. Everyone in the front row saw it. It was very funny. And embarrassing. I quipped, 'At least it's not flying out. Then I tagged it with '- of course it's a bogong'. Everyone laughed because it sounds like 'bogan'. I kind of always thought of the moth as a bogan; loud, out on the street, bumping into things. They're nothing fancy. They're a plain old moth. If a bogong wore a shirt it would be a flannie. It would be smoking a ciggie and drinking VB. It would tell you to 'get fucked' but more as a greeting than an insult.

Bogong moths were common when I was growing up. They were everywhere. When I was a kid, every summer there would be about a hundred hitting the porch light. Big clumps of them would pile up around the street lamps like a brown powdery winged sea. I was always pulling them out of my hair, or capturing them in one of those plastic bug catchers so I could frighten my friends who had moth phobia; Mottephobia to be exact. You know, back in the times when it was acceptable to taunt friends with insect anxiety...

But now they've been added to the global red list of threatened species! Bogong numbers have declined by 99.5 per cent making them one of 123 new entries of Australian wildlife on the endangered species list. While the Mottephobes are probably breathing a sigh of relief, the rest of us should be very worried. Bogongs are the canary in the coalmine, the moth in the methane.

Thanks to drought and land clearing their numbers have dropped from four billion to maybe a couple of million. Climate change has claimed the Bogong. I would have thought that tough old moth would have hung in there. I guess it shows how vulnerable our ecosystems are to human impacts and how connected everything on this living planet is. You can't have years of drought followed by fire followed by clearing of what habitat remains, without devastating affects on many other species. Oh, and then add some persistent harmful farming practices like using pesticides and we really are the cane toad of this country.

You don't take out a species like the bogong without impacting the food chain. The moth is an important food source for many birds and for the pygmy possum. They have been found starving, many dead with young in their pouch. Another result of our failure to act, our failure to recognise the real impacts of climate change. It's still a concept that we argue about, with some convinced it's a

conspiracy, and governments convinced it's something we can negotiate our way around without the need for any proper action. But the bogong is well on the way to gone and I doubt a 30 per cent or 43 per cent emission target by 2030 will do much to save this species. It's sad. They're really an extraordinary creature. A food source too for Aboriginal communities in South East Australia, who would roast moths or make moth-meat cakes. Apparently they taste a bit like walnuts. But walnuts with wings.

The bogong moth can travel up to 965 kilometres on their migration journey. They do it nocturnally and somehow manage to arrive at their destination without GPS. It's thought they may use a combination of an internal magnetic compass aligned with the Earth's magnetic field, and recognisable landmarks, to navigate their route. Pretty extraordinary for something that was only recently a pupae.

The bogong is at risk. We need to stop using insecticides, stop land clearing, stop pumping out emissions. You don't need to do the maths to know we need our moths. Another huge climate fail.

I want to see people get passionate about climate. Maybe we could become the champions for particular species? Bring on bogans for bogongs.



# **NORPA 2022**

NORPA has revealed some of the worldclass theatre shows it will be bringing to the region in 2022, with more to be announced in the new year. NORPA Artistic Director and CEO, Julian Louis, sat down with Seven Editor, Eve Jeffery, to take us through what's in store for us at NORPA next year.

## Is there a theme that links the shows together in the 2022 season?

We always aim for diversity when putting a season of shows together and there's a bit everything on offer in 2022 – comedy and political satire from The Wharf Revue, classic theatre from Bell Shakespeare, powerful drama with Sunshine Super Girl, The Boy Who Talked to Dogs and King of Pigs, joyous cabaret from Sprung!! with French Café and magnificent physical theatre from Gravity and Other Myths.

A theme that has emerged is the power of theatre to transport you to different worlds. For *Sunshine Super Girl* the stage becomes a tennis court with seating all around, for *The Boy Who Talked to Dogs*, we enter an Irish pub and the work is performed on five stages.

## Do you think audiences are becoming more sophisticated as time goes by?

The audiences that come to NORPA are sophisticated and diverse. There's a trust

that has built up where people know that the shows in our season will be high quality. There's also a willingness to take risks in that they will come and see a show at NORPA, even if it isn't what they might usually go for. Touring companies that perform here always remark on how engaged and responsive the NORPA audiences are – so they always want to come back.

## You say this announcement is like Act I of the 2022 Season, what is Act II?

NORPA is unique in that we are one of the few theatre companies in regional Australia that creates original work. Creating theatre is at the heart of what we do. Act I of our 2022 Season is all the shows being performed by other companies, Act II is all about the work we are creating here, inspired by our stories and the country around us.

We're planning a big welcome back event in February to announce some very exciting additions to our 2022 Season as well as our First Nations program, developed by Rhoda Roberts, our NORPA Youth Program and new, ambitious NORPA works in development. There's plenty more to come in 2022!

#### **AUSTEN TAYSHUS -DANGEROUSLY FUNNY**

Every January, Austen Tayshus, the legendary white pointer of Australian comedy makes his way to Byron Bay. It's his favourite show of the year. 'It's a smart crowd' he says. And he's right. Not everyone is going to 'get' a Tayshus show. But Byron, he reckons, and the towns that fringe her, do.

Austen likes to make people think - to push them to the brink of their comfort zones. And sometimes way over the edge.

It's why he's such a fierce figure in the Aussie comedy scene, a scene where many comics and promoters are terrified of him. Austen, aka Sandy Gutman doesn't play safe. He doesn't suck up to venue owners. And he certainly doesn't stroke the ego of other performers or promoters. He is a lone wolf. At times smarter, funnier, and more experienced than anyone else in Aussie comedy. But be warned. He's also a lot more dangerous. There are few comics with the tenacity and killer instinct of Austen Tayshus.

The comedy superstar who first came into being in 1981 has the ability to take a room hostage, just with his tongue. Every Austen show is unique. He has the ability to weave together current politics, what's happening in the room, philosophy, anthropology, religion and of course sport, and let's not forget the Pope, all into one gag.

There is no subject he won't dissect. Uncomfortable, confronting, but always illuminating, an Austen Tayshus show is both comic and cleansing. He doesn't need you to like him. In fact he'd probably prefer it if you don't.
