ARTICLE Why siblings matter

David Lowe

Are only children 'spoiled', unlucky, or both? The situation can be hard to imagine if you have a lot of siblings. For those of us with sisters and/or brothers, love them or hate them, they're likely to be the people we know longest in our lives.

We share half of our genes with our siblings, which means there's a delicate balance – in evolutionary terms – between wanting them to live long enough to make cute little nieces and nephews, and hoping they'll meet a sticky end.

When I was small, one of my big brothers once sent me riding down a gully into a big tree, and another dangled me from the top floor of a shopping centre while a security guard looked up in horror, but I never doubted they had my best interests at heart.

Despite the shared DNA, siblings are often very different. This can be explained by considering the family as a miniature ecosystem. As the low-hanging fruit is taken by the first children to arrive, the later ones must take riskier and more unconventional options if they want to survive, or at least be noticed. This applies to everything from musical taste to political preferences.

He ain't heavy

When one sibling in the family has a disability, or the parents are absent, others can step into the breach and get some practice of the adult world.

Younger siblings can be extremely annoying, but they also provide an egoboosting fan club close to home, and tend to believe whatever you tell them.

Older siblings are like seals who jump into shark infested water while the others look on, demonstrating the risks and rewards of different life paths.

In many First Nations cultures, cousins and siblings are one and



the same. This seems to magnify both the benefits and costs of these relationships.

Whatever your family's culture, research shows that sibling influence is lasting, and real. Things like first pregnancy timing and addiction issues tend to be shared among siblings. A 2013 study of more than a million people showed that your risk of dying of a heart attack spikes after a sibling dies of a heart attack. Destructive parental favouritism also has lifelong, disastrous effects on brothers and sisters who grow up together.

On the other hand, strong sibling relationships have unbeatable survival value, which is probably why they exist in all primates, not just humans.

Let them change

The wonderful (and terrible) thing is that for most of us, our brothers and sisters knew us when we were growing up, and were at our most embarrassing.

Sometimes those old relationships and personalities can get stuck, especially if our parents are still around. How well do you know your siblings now? Do they know you?

Unfortunately, brothers and sisters have been culturally devalued by mainstream culture since Cain and Abel, which has lead many of us to devote more time and energy to other life relationships.

Siblings really deserve more of a spotlight.

Great Northern Rivers family walks

Cape Byron Walking Track

Of moderate difficulty with stairs, it is a Grade 3 track, but should be good for walkers of just about every ability level. Tackle smaller sections of it with the kids, especially if you want to stop off at the beach. Cape Byron Lighthouse is at the top of the walk,

Three Sisters Walking Track

A 20 minute drive south of Byron Bay is the Broken Head Nature Reserve. The Three Sisters Walking Track is an easy track through the rainforest and coastline. A great way to explore the Broken Head Nature Reserve. Difficulty is easy and distance is 1.6km.

Lennox Head Boardwalk

A short walk up to the headland of Lennox Head, from town. Approximately 30 minutes one way and easy for the whole family.

Minyon Falls

Approximately 45 minutes west of Byron Bay in the hinterland. It's a walk that leads to stunning views of the falls. There is a lookout and grassy area easily accessed from the car park. Along with a 13km loop, which is moderate in difficulty.

Pinnacle Walk, Border Ranges National Park

In 2015 the Bundjalung People asked visitors to respect this sacred native place and refrain from climbing Wollumbin (Mt Warning). The Pinnacle Walk is the perfect alternative, allowing you to respect their wishes while still getting a fantastic look across Border Ranges National Park. Just 600m return, the Pinnacle Walk to the Pinnacle Lookout will treat you to amazing views of the aforementioned Wollumbin while you gaze out over dense rainforest and the Tweed Valley. There's a car park at the start of the walk, making access simple.

Jerusalem Creek Walk

This trail is located in Bunjalung National Park. A 10.3km loop that takes you through bushland, before finishing where the creek meets the ocean. You can choose to walk back through the bush or along the beach in different sections. Difficulty is moderate.

Victoria Park Boardwalk

Victoria Park offers a great walk for the family and is suitable for all ages. Near Lismore, it is a 400 metre loop through the beautiful nature reserve.

Screens, screens, screens – the bane of a parent's existence

Kids and screens – it is a never ending conversation between parents and children, between parents and parents, between parents and schools. And sometimes there is the not so helpful voice of some grandparent, stranger or friend who thinks you just might need that extra comment in the middle of trying to deal with your temper tantruming child...

As a child that grew up without a TV I learned early that I just had to tune out when my friends were talking about anything to do with what was on the box. but I have to admit that it left me out of a lot of conversations. For kids today who don't get access to computers, the internet and games online, it can be isolating and leave them dangling in the background of conversations; they just won't have the experience to be part of those peer connections without access to modern technology. And this is coming from a parent that wouldn't let their eldest watch Astro Boy until they were five because I thought it might be 'too violent'. By number three I had seriously relaxed my position.

How a child reacts to screens can be moulded by so many elements. What's your screentime/behaviour like as a parent? Do you spend half your life looking at your phone? Just popping onto the computer to finish off something for work, saying 'It will only take a minute'? While we need to encourage our kids to get off their devices, to move their bodies and manage themselves and their time on screens, it is not all bad.

It can also depend on the personality of the child – I have quite a few and they are all different. Some are impossible to get off a screen (at one point I nicknamed the response to beeing asked to get off as 'the baby berserker'), while others have worked out how to manage me, and quietly get all the time they seem to want online.

There are also issues around addiction and how to manage their behaviour as they get older. It is a never-ending quagmire of learning for everyone, and it constantly changes for both parents and children as relationships, ages and temperaments change. While we need to encourage our kids to get off their devices, to move their bodies and manage themselves and their time on screens, it is not all bad. Rather than hours chatting on a phone attached by a wire to a wall, my kids chat online as they play games, send Snapchat messages (I am not allowed to join Snapchat!), and have group chats, where the older ones even discussed the recent elections.

What I have discovered is that the lines of communication need to remain open, whether it is books, TV or screens. I need to not only lead by example and remember to be present in my children's lives but I need to give them the skills to manage themselves and their interactions with the world, and that includes the world of screens. That does not mean I haven't lost my temper when they have takeen too long to get off the screen and get to the dinner table. But it does remind me that a good relationship with them is the key, whether it is a conversation about screens, sex, bullying, supporting their friend, or just remembering to have a laugh together - talking, trusting and supporting each other will give them the skills they need to negotiate their lives successfully.

> Also, seek professional help when you need it, I certainly have!

The gentle art of 'divorcing well'

The best advice I ever had when I got married was 'choose someone you can divorce well'. It's not romantic, and it doesn't fit the fairytale narrative of forever, but as someone who has divorced, and done it well, that pearl of wisdom has stayed with me. Nobody really wants to hear it, but it speaks to the deeper quality of the person you have committed to. If you know the object of your love is not someone who would be amendable to a good split, then why the F are you with them?

Separation and divorce don't have to be war. As long as the person you are leaving isn't an abuser, isn't gas lighting you or isn't using the demise of your relationship for personal gain, then you have an opportunity to break the pattern of adversarial un-partnering. Gweny and Chris called it 'conscious uncoupling'. The media made fun of them because they chose to separate in a healthy way. They were ridiculed for not having a toxic divorce. That shows how normalised 'violence' is in our relationships. And when I say violence, I don't mean physical assault, I mean fighting, ugly scenes, vengeful law suits and financial battles destined to benefit one party at the expense of another. We shouldn't be using the disappointment of a failed relationship to punish someone else for our pain.

Just because a relationship is over you don't have to destroy the other person.

Here are some top tips for a loving divorce:

- Talk about how you would separate with your partner. Make a pact that if it happens you would be fair and equitable. There will be property that is yours, some that is theirs, and other property you purchased together. That collection of vinyl your partner bought into the relationship doesn't become half yours. It's part of their history – let it go. Same with the antique chair your grandmother gave you. That's yours.
- 2. Don't talk shit about your ex. And hopefully this is reciprocated. Save those downloads for a professional or a very close and confidential friend. Bitching incessantly about your ex to anyone who will listen is a sure sign things are toxic. Try not to make your friends choose sides.
- **3.** Try not to obsess about what you got and what you lost. It's just stuff. Your mental health is worth more. Really focus on being fair. And that this will pass. If the divorce wasn't mutual – if it was

- **5.** Be kind. To yourself, and to your ex. Value the life you made. Divorce and separation isn't failure. It's a normal part of relationships. So make it beautiful. Get over yourself. The worst thing you can do is sulk. Create a powerful relationship with yourself, get financial advice, look to the future.
- 6. Avoid lawyers. They're expensive and in the end they are the only ones who win. If you can follow the spirit of the previous five steps you are on the way. You can make parenting agreements and amicably divvy up your possessions without going to court.
- 7. Let go. Move on.
- 8. Find someone new to divorce.



Family animals

Some reptiles give birth to live young and then never see them again – once the bubbas are ejected from the womb, that's that. Some reptiles lay eggs then crawl or swim away the moment they are laid, and some reptiles create a snaky thermo-regulated shield for their eggs – they wrap around them and shiver to keep them cozy when the day is cold and move away on the warm days. They will even go and lay in the sun to get their bodies hot and then wrap themselves around the eggs, but again, once the young are hatched, they are on their own. Not really 'family' behaviour.

But are there any animals who have families?

There are, but maybe not in the sense that humans understand it

Lions are very particular about who is family and who isn't. In fact, if a lion takes over a pride it is nothing for him to 'dispose' of all the current children, often in a very grisly manner, before starting to sew his own garden. He has no care what the lioness may think about this, he just wants to make sure that it's his seeds that are spread. He is arrogant enough to believe that any new cubs are his. Luckily lions don't understand the concept of gestation and a cub born up to three-and-a-half-months after he is king, may not be his.

There are many animals like this. They make sure that any living progeny are their own, but that's more of a trick of survival than an expression of familial love.



Many animal families show signs of having teenagers that need to be asked to leave the comfort of the nest, in fact, in magpie families that's literally what happens. When it's time for the couple to create a new clutch of eggs, they kindly, or not so kindly, ask the teenagers to move along. Typical family-type behaviour.

It is widely known that many cetacean species live in family groups in a similar way to humans, for their entire lives. It is also a widely held belief that many species can not only recognise their partners and their offspring but can also recognise their litter mates, uncles and aunts and cousins!

There are plenty of apparent instances in other mammals of how important family is. One only has to see a herd of cows and watch and listen as the group gather around to mourn a calf or an adult that has died. They can sit there for days and grieve their loss. YouTube is full of videos of elephant, ape and bear family groups protecting their young from predators. Closer to home, cats and dogs and other domestic friends are also bonded to their human families.

We've all got that friend who claims that their canine is a one-person

dog, and that's probably actually true. The dog has claimed that human as a family member and only has eyes for them – which brings us to the doorstep of the idea that family relationships can cross the species divide. There is anecdotal evidence of pooches who have put their own safety aside to save those who they see as a family member, and I personally have two of the most beautiful granddoggos - and they know it too! They know how to get my attention, how to wheedle out of me the treats their 'parents' won't give them, and how to snuggle up in the best place in the bed and know that nana will let them get away with it.
