Rally to reinforce rail as poll issue

The long-running campaign to restore rail services to the north coast has picked up steam again with a public rally to be held at the disused Murwillumbah railway station this Sunday set to make it a major state-election issue for Tweed voters.

The state government closed the Casino to Murwillumbah rail service in early 2004 with the issue since becoming a political football between the state Labor and coalition parties, also involving local federal MPs.

A community campaign which sprang up as a result has long pushed for a light rail commuter service in the area linking it to the Gold Coast to replace the old heavy-gauge branch line closed by the Labor government as a cost-cutting measure.

The track sits in disrepair, an eyesore and visual reminder of the lack of a public transport system for north coast communities.

In past election campaigns, both the National Party, which has three state MPs set to be part of a new coalition government, and even federal Labor, have promised millions of dollars to either restore the rail service or feasibility studies for rebuilding the old line.

Look north, says MP

Revamping the lost rail service has once again found an enthusiastic champion in one of the three MPs, Geoff Provest in Tweed.

But the focus is on connections with Queensland, not the south.

'Let's face it, we're joined at the hip with Queensland. The rest of NSW is out our back door.'

Mr Provest said it was critical a regional transport plan was ham-

mered out with Queensland.

'We've got 15,000 homes coming on stream in developments like the Cobaki and Seabreeze estates. And all they've got is an inadequate bus service and a struggling road system.

'An integrated rail network is essential.'

Mr Provest said Coolangatta airport was going to be the regional transport hub for people both north and south of the border.

'That's why the NSW Nats have committed \$1 omillion for a preliminary study on the region's rail needs.

'We haven't even determined a route from Murwillumbah to Tweed, and we're going to need that.'

Airport rail link

Mr Provest said Queensland had already made provision for rail connections on the airport's southern approaches.

'They've reserved a 30 metre wide corridor along the Tweed bypass for a rail line and the southern end of the runway has been strengthened to allow a rail tunnel underneath to pop up at the airport terminal.'

He said provision must be made to link with the heavy rail network to Brisbane and the light rail tram connection with Southport.

He said it was critical the cross-border sniping that bedevilled the building of the Tugun bypass had to end.

The fraternal feuding that simmered between the NSW and Queensland Labor administrations turned into broad farce when NSW presented Queensland with a \$210,000 land tax bill – a bill symbolically torn up by Anna Bligh at the opening of the bypass.

Mr Provest said while the Bligh continued on page 5

The three-year program is one of only a handful in Australia and covers all clinical aspects of maternity health and birth, with a key focus on improving maternity care for women and their families both locally and further afield.

'The course has a women's centredness and is about preparing and educating students in looking after women across all aspects of their lives,' Ms Crepinsek said.

As part of the program, students will follow 30 women throughout the birthing experience and will also re-

ceive training in a variety of settings, including rural hospitals.

Qualified midwives are in short supply across Australia and remain in high demand. 'It's been identified as a need in

'It's been identified as a need in women's health,' she said, adding that the perinatal and birthing role is increasingly shouldered by midwives.

International Women's Day is celebrated annually on March 8 to highlight the economic, political and social achievements of women around the world, with 2011 marking the event's centenary.

As part of celebrations on the Tweed, the Bundjalung Cultural Centre in South Tweed hosted women's cultural workshops, while awards for this year's Wonder of Women were presented yesterday at a function hosted by the Tweed Shire Women's Service at the Murwillumbah RSL.

MPs play down Byrrill Ck dam issue

The hotly debated Byrrill Creek dam proposal is barely rating a blip on the political radar in this month's state elections despite strong agitation from Greens and Labor Party candidates.

Tweed MP Geoff Provest said it would not scrape into the top 20 issues facing his electorate. And Lismore MP Thomas George said he had nothing to say about it at all.

Mr Provest said while the issue was far from being uppermost in his mind he had already made his position clear.

'I've agreed with council staff who recommended increasing the capacity of the Clarrie Hall Dam by raising the dam wall. The Byrrill Creek area should be left alone?

In the seat of Lismore, which covers the dam site, Murwillumbah and outlying Tweed villages, Mr Provest's fellow National Party MP Mr George refused to be drawn on the issue at all.

'I'm not making any comment, he said.

'I've been ridiculed enough in the press, including your paper. I'll make comment at the appropriate time.'

Greens inspect site

Late last week Greens MLC John Kaye met with local Greens candidates Sue Stock (Lismore) and Andrea Vickers (Tweed) and anti-dam campaigners at Byrrill Creek.

The dam, with walls which would be 40 metres high, would inundate a vital wildlife corridor between national parks that is home to 71 threatened species, said Dr Kaye.

'With a likely coalition victory on March 26, the fate of Byrrill Creek lies in the hands of the National and Liberal parties,' said Dr Kaye.

'Building a dam at Byrrill Creek would have devastating consequences for an area with international significance.

'Thomas George, who has been suspiciously quiet on the issue, is likely to be the local member in a coalition government that will be under pressure to approve the Byrrill Creek dam.

'Tweed Council is clearly looking to the next government to overturn the Water Sharing Plan that currently has the Byrrill Creek dam on hold.

'Mr George and the Nationals must declare publicly to the voters of the North Coast exactly what their intentions are in relation to this unnecessary and damaging dam.

'In December 2010 the Water Minister Phil Costa released the new Tweed Water Sharing Plan which upheld the prohibition on a dam at Byrrill Creek.

'Concerned residents have well-founded fears that a coalition government would overthrow that decision after March 26.

'There is a real possibility that the proponents of the dam are waiting until after the state

election so they have a more sympathetic ear with the Liberals and Nationals.'

Sue Stock said if Mr George had ever visited the Byrrill Creek area 'he could not support such a gross act of vandalism'.

High-risk, high-cost

Long-time critic of the dam Andrea Vickers said the Tweed council had ignored both the advice of expert staff and the views of the community to pursue this high-risk, highcost engineering project.

'Tweed Council's continued pursuit of the proposed dam is now well beyond any reason or justification. It is an abuse local authorities and 'defies of process and an affront to the environmental and economic ratepayers of Tweed.

Ms Vickers said that although the National's Tweed MP Mr Provest did not support the dam proposal, if highly desirable tourist destia junior member of a minor party, and he would have to toe the party line.



Pensions increase

The Richmond electorate's 28,000 pensioners will soon receive an increase in their pensions to help meet increases in the cost of living.

As of March 20, age, disability and carer pensioners, and veterans' income support recipients will receive an extra \$13.20 a fortnight for singles on the maximum rate and \$19.80 a fortnight for couples combined on the maximum

Richmond MP Justine Elliot said total pension payments for people on the maximum rate, including the base rate and pension supplement, will be \$729.30 a fortnight for singles, and \$1,099.40 a fortnight for couples combined.

'Local pensioners will start to benefit from the increased pension rates on their first payment date after March 20,3 she said.



Outspoken council critic Terry Sharples used new privacy laws to appeal a refusal by council staff to part with documents relating to the contract signed by outgoing mayor Warren Polglase 10 months before the current contract was due to expire

The three are set to be part of the next state coalition government but a campaigner for trains and a candidate in the upcoming poll has questioned the National Party MPs"commitment' to funding the Casino-Murwillumbah rail line and a link to Queensland.

Karin Kolbe, Independent candidate for Ballina, said she was moved to organise yet another public rally and make the challenge after Nationals' MP for Ballina Don Page 'failed' to provide details on the issue in his recent statements to media.

'It's not good enough. The

MPs all puffed up

Former NSW Treasurer Michael Costa kicked north coast communities in the teeth six years ago when he axed the Casino-Murwillumbah rail service in a cost-cutting drive, without any plan for future public transport in the region.

Then for over six long years, the National Party both state and federal hammered the Labor government over the issue, promising to restore the services if re-elected in the state. Well, that is now likely to happen at the end of the month and communities across the Northern Rivers have every right to demand what sitting National Party MPs are going to do about it once they're in power. Will they be true to their word? Many Labor supporters at the time said the Nats when in government would not reverse the decision and we suspect this may be the case.

Both Lismore MP Thomas George and Ballina MP Don Page, when pressed by rail campaigners last month, reaffirmed the coalition's 'commitment' to a rail service on the Northern Rivers, promising to undertake a comprehensive study on restoring the rail service if it wins the election. The study is necessary, Mr Page says, because the line has been closed since 2004. Well, that would have to be done anyway, with all those timber bridges that need replacing, even two years after the closure, so this and all the previous promises on getting trains back now ring hollow.

This policy on the run is made to look even sillier when you have Tweed MP Geoff Provest quoting a \$1 million price tag for the study and only pushing for a rail link to go north from the Tweed, to link up with the light rail expected to be built down the Gold Coast to Coolangatta airport. The link to the airport hub is obviously a sensible plan, but why leave communities neighbouring the Tweed with no link either? Why are the three MPs not singing from the same page? Sure, hospitals always need more funding, but we have a new federal plan in place for that, and public transport is the single biggest issue facing the north coast as population grows. A decent commuter rail service is surely what's needed to cater for increasing numbers of commuters, students and tourists. Where is their vision? A north coast light rail service would be a huge boost to tourism and would no doubt pay for itself as population grows.

At this event, Nathan Sharp (Under 17) blew the competition away to claim Gold in the Under 17 and Open Beach Sprint and the Under 17 Flags.


Cudgen also dominated many of the team events, including the Taplin Relay.



For those of you not in the entertainment world, a bio is our form of a Curriculum Vitae - but rather than an objective document listing dates, employers and on the job duties, a bio is a one-page narrative which embellishes both your ability and your credibility.

Bios are nauseating. According to my bio I'm fricking amazing. Honestly, a girl with my kind of talent could milk the moon and have it churned for butter by morning, just in time for the lunchbox duties. I'm just that good. That's why I'm living in a rented house in Mullumbimby with a chicken-wire fence.

I detest writing these accolades about myself. Not only does it seem frightfully insincere, personally I wouldn't be caught dead in the vicinity of such a right royal wanker like the dickhead I describe in my bio. For a start she has the habit of speaking of herself in the third

'Mandy Nolan is a Renaissance woman.' Yes actually, she is. She's as fat as one. And then there's the incessant, obligatory namedropping that is customary in all artist bios. It's based on the theory that if someone more famous than you allows you within their viciniity, or if you warm the stage for them, then basically you must be pretty awesome.

The rule is to choose the most impressive names out of your name-dropping bag. I always use the 'In her early career she worked alongside internationally acclaimed celebrities such as Whoopi Goldberg and Eartha Kit.' Now this is completely true. When I say 'worked alongside' I don't mean that I joined Ertha for a rousing duet of My Heart Belongs to Daddy. What it means is that I did the warmup act. That's the twenty-minute act that you've never heard of before you get to see the act you actually came to see.

It's easy for me to name-drop, because on a national level I've always been that act. When interviewers read my bio they always pick up on the Whoopi Goldberg line. And it's true. I did support Whoopi Goldberg at her Canberra


Centre was packed – probably 5,000 or more punters. At the time equity laws dictated that all overseas acts needed to be supported by Australian talent. Ms Goldberg stipulated that no act was to perform on the stage before her. Big talent has big egos. All that on-stage humility, is very much an act. The truth is, no one wants some pissy little unknown getting more laughs then them. (Although at that stage of my career Ms Goldberg was facing a risk-free situation.)

But that night I had to perform in the foyer. For half an hour. People didn't think I was funny, they thought I had a mental health issue. I just randomly went up to people while they were mingling and tried to break in on their conversation with some lame gag. I was what is known in the entertainment industry as a 'sad loser'. That performance would be one of the low points of my career. It was completely humiliating. But I keep it in my bio.

Why? Because I get to drop a Whoopi. I'm a comedian. Wouldn't it make sense to just drop the whole hard sell on myself and tell the truth? 'Mandy Nolan reached her peak about five years ago. But basically she's bred herself into the corner, so she stays in the Byron Shire where she keeps torturing locals with the same ten gags. High levels of pot consumption have ensured a general shortterm memory loss in most of her audiences, who seem to think she's saying something

Or what about, 'Mandy is a bit of a stupid bitch. Opinionated, self-interested and intolerant of fit people, Mandy is fast becoming one of those women who resent other women who haven't let themselves go.'

In the meantime, before you judge me, I just want to remind you that I have 'worked alongside' Bono (I was next to him at an internet café in Sydney last year) and I once had sex with someone who had sex with Stevie Nicks. Oh, I am so putting that in my



'We're encouraging all of our regional artists to take a look at their own areas and submit an expression or their interpretation of their own unique landscape, said Essential Energy's regional general manager Far North Coast, Richard Wake.

The Art Prize is expected to attract hundreds of entries as the reputation of Countryscapes continues to grow in stature across the State. 'Each year the competition gets stronger as more and more regional artists look to explore and share their landscapes, Richard said.' In 2010 Grafton's Emma Noakes won the \$5000 Youth Encouragement Award, with Wendy Teakel of Murrumbateman winning the overall prize.

'Over the years the Far North Coast has produce many finalists and many highly commended works, but we are yet to produce a Countryscapes winner. Perhaps 2011 will be the year.' Celebrated Sydney painter and academic, Ian Grant, will be the overall judge for the 2011 Prize, selecting the winning painting from the shortlist of finalists' artworks nominated by a judging panel which includes: artists Victoria Lobregat and Trevor Weekes; cultural director of Maitland Regional Gallery, Joe Eisenberg, OAM; and director of this year's host gallery, Richard Perram of Bathurst Regional Gallery.

More than 3400 artists have entered the \$35,000 Essential Energy Art Prize since it was established. Being non-acquisitive, the winning artist can keep or sell their work and still receive the significant monetary prize. The Art Prize is open to anyone who lives within Essential Energy's network area and artists are encouraged to enter all artistic styles, media and contexts - ranging from the figurative to abstract, charcoal to traditional oil paint. Entries close on Friday July 29 with the winner announced on Thursday, November 24 followed by an exhibition of the finalists' artworks at the **Bathurst Regional Art Gallery** from November 25. 
