Tweed council named in corruption probe

Tweed Shire Council is once again under investigation and among 110 local and state authorities that have received kickbacks and bribes in a 'culture of corruption, the NSW corruption watchdog revealed this week.

The current probe by the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC) is the fourth investigation into Tweed council since the 1980s, and the first since the council was sacked in 2005

Tweed Council has not been named as one of the 15 so-called worst offenders, which have been summoned to give oral evidence.

But detail of the Tweed investigation is yet to be revealed. A council spokesperson told The Echo it would be 'inappropriate to comment while the investigation is still ongoing.

Public hearings into the allegations began this week with an opening address from counsel assisting, Steve Campbell SC.

Mr Campbell told the hearing the ICAC launched the biggest investigation in its 22-year history after an 'anonymous and disturbing' tip-off to Bathurst Council, in the state's central west, in November 2008.

He said the council was told via email that it had been ripped off to the tune of hundreds of thousands of dollars through false orders placed with suppliers by a former employee.

Two men, including the former council employee, are serving jail terms after pleading guilty to defrauding the council of more than \$700,000 each.

Mr Campbell said that in response to the scandal, the ICAC launched an investigation which has uncovered evidence implicating officials at 88 lo- councillors by surprise but at least cal councils and 22 other government

authorities.

Mr Campbell told the inquiry council staff have been detected receiving holidays, football tickets, Parker pens, Liquorland and Harvey Norman vouchers and electronics such as iPods in exchange for contracts with sup-

Mr Campbell estimated the value of the corrupt gifts uncovered by Operation Jarek exceeds \$1.5 million.

'Insidious, pervasive web'

'The evidence in this inquiry will show that the mere adoption of policies will not proof an organisation against the insidious, pervasive web of corruption by kickbacks of various kinds,' he said.

A worker from one supplier has told the inquiry a Byron Shire council worker asked him 'What's in it for me?' before doing business with him.

The three-week inquiry is expected to hear evidence from staff at the RTA and councils including Byron Shire.

Tweed Council has been subject to four investigations since the 1980s, starting with the first ever ICAC probe, which looked into North Coast land deals which led to the charging of former deputy mayor Tom Hogan over corruption.

Then followed the Bulford Inquiry in 2001 which looked at planning and development issues including the early days of the Kings Forest subdivision, and the Daly Inquiry in 2004 which recommended council's sacking after it was found the pro-development councillors in control of council were merely 'puppets' of developers.

Council 'bungled' on grants says MP

Federal MP Justine Elliot has blamed bungling by Tweed council's pen-pushers for the shire missing out on millions of dollars in federal grants.

She says the council has failed to submit 'correctly completed paperwork' in two applications for Regional Development Australia (RDA) funds.

The Richmond MP's accusations follow claims by some councillors that she's failing to MP Justine Elliot: accusing deliver for the Tweed after the government rejected a council application for \$4 million in funds for a sports complex at Arkinstall Park.

This follows the council's shock failure to secure a \$10.6 million grant to redevelop the Jack Evans Boat Harbour last year - although the government later gave \$1.8 million from a different fund to allow a scaled-down revamp.

Long-simmering disquiet over funding levels boiled over publicly when outgoing mayor, Kevin Skinner, voiced concerns in an Echo interview and Ms Elliot issued a media press release defending her role.

Cr Skinner said it seemed Ms Elliott's ALP colleague in the adjoining Page electorate, Janelle Saffin, had been 'much more successful in gaining funds for councils in her electorate?

Cabarita rally against caravan park

Vote should sink new dam: mayor

Tweed mayor Barry Longland is hopeful the contentious decision by his predecessor for the new dam. to push ahead with the plan to build a new dam at Byrrill Creek will be sunk by a vote of councillors later this month.

Cr Longland, expected to push instead for the staff and community recommended option to raise the existing Clarrie Hall Dam wall to double its capacity, said he was also confident that the government would not take away council's authority to determine the issue, and he's backed up by Tweed MP Geoff Provest.

The decision by the previous mayor Cr Kevin Skinner to use his casting vote twice in a narrow vote to overturn the recommended option and push ahead with a new dam sparked an outcry and protests. Late last year the government gazetted the Tweed Water Sharing Plan (TWSP) which bans any new dams for 10 years, a decision welcomed by opponents. But their relief was shortlived when the new coalition government lobbied

by National Party councillors viewing the decision-making and MPs, announced it would review the decision, and Tweed Council continued planning

Meanwhile, Kingscliff Ratepayers and Progress Association has added its voice to the call for council to abandon the Byrrill Creek dam option.

Association vice-president Scott Sledge said the huge costs involved in dam construction and ongoing maintenance concerned Tweed area ratepayers and 'a quick decision to ditch the scheme would save ratepayers a lot of money for useless planning and save the nearby residents a lot of angst'.

The meeting voted to call on council to rescind its decision on Byrrill Creek and to lobby both planning and primary industries ministers to shelve the contentious plan.

Planning laws under the spotlight

Planning reform is high on the agenda of Tweed locals, with the Murwillumbah leg of a statewide planning system review conducted by two former state government ministers attracting the highest number of people to date.

Almost 60 people, including farmers, developers, environmentalists, ratepayer groups and several Tweed councillors, attended the two sessions at the Murwillumbah Bowling Club, which organisers said exceeded attendance at other forums held in north coast centres last month.

The review involves a two-month listening tour involving over 150 meetings across NSW and is headed by former Liberal state environment minister Tim Moore and former Labor state public works minister Ron Dver.

The controvesial part 3A legislation of the planning act, which gives the planning minister power to determine state-significant projects, was abolished as part of an election pledge of the coalition government. The review, the first in over 30 years, will recommend issues to be addressed by legislation set to replace it.

A range of planning and development issues of concern to locals were canvassed at the forums, including protection of prime agricultural land at Cudgen and Terranora, flood-level controls for south Murwillumbah, sizes of rural subdivisions, protection of local Indigenous culture and urban/rural buffer zones.

Locals vented their frustration at planning policies which they claimed lacked adequate environmental protections or hindered development or subdivision.

South Murwillumbah businessman Mi-

chael Price claimed building restrictions in flood-prone areas were governed by a statewide height level of 6.4 metres set by the SES in Wollongong and the 'one size fits all' policy was unworkable and too restrictive.

'Blanket flood-height levels for the whole of the town is ridiculous, they should be set by local councils; it appears the SES has the final say in our area, and we can't develop there because the SES will not approve a flood plan for the area,' said Mr Price.

Terranora resident and hobby farmer Andrew Meeves said he was concerned about food security and that prime agricultural land at Cudgen and Terranora was being built over. 'In Murwillumbah and surrounds, we have some of the best soils in the country and good rainfall yet in Terranora, which is as good as any farming land going, it's going under houses,' Mr Meeves said.

He also criticised compliance provisions of the laws, saying a developer at Pottsville had 'bulldozed through fairly sensitive environment and wiped out the native vegetation, rolling round a sacred Aboriginal scar tree and put a match to it' but was not prosecuted.

'It' not uncommon to burn land to clear any evidence [of cultural heritage or environmental significance].'

Murwillumbah ratepayers group member Robyn Lemaire said she was concerned about buffer zones between rural and urban areas not being enforced under planning laws which sparked conflict as a result, with new homeowners complaining about farming activities such as noise, smell and pollution levels impacting on them.

Mr Moore, a senior commissioner of the NSW Land and Environment Court, said there was a 'clear need for different processes for someone proposing a coal mine and someone wanting to build a new barbecue in their house'.

Councils given more power

Tweed and other NSW councils are now able to determine major residential, retail and commercial developments after laws took effect this week which curb state government powers to declare projects of state significance.

Under the now scrapped part 3A provisions of the planning act the planning

minister could approve large projects, overriding objections from local government. The provisions were widely discredited when it was found developers with such projects had donated generously to the Labor Party. Now development applications up to a value of \$20 million will be returned to local councils for assessment. Projects worth more than \$20 million will go to joint regional planning panels.

Invisible Wall Street

After weeks of pretending it wasn't happening, the American media are finally starting to notice that there has been a giant peaceful sit-in taking place in Wall Street. The reason of course is that the police have started treating protesters with excessive violence, and the arrest of 700 people on nearby Brooklyn Bridge last Sunday can hardly be ignored.

The silence of the press in the USA has been questioned in some quarters. Keith Olberman, one of the few American journalists to comment on the event from the beginning, pointed out that an item about even 200 Tea Party protesters would be a lead news item in the belligerently right-wing media. Yet for the first two weeks of the sit-in only foreign news services and the organisers of the protest themselves were covering a story about thousands of people occupying the financial centre of America. Even now events that would be trumpeted by the US media if they were occurring in North Africa or the Middle East are given very little news space.

The ostensible organisers of the 'Occupy Wall Street' movement have mixed profiles, ranging from the whimsical Ad-Busters magazine to the hard-core cyber activists Anonymous. The basis for bringing the protesters together is the same use of social media that powered the uprisings in Egypt and Libya. Those who are enduring pepper sprays and beatings from the New York Police Department call themselves the 'Ninety Nine Per Cent' - the vast majority of the American people suffering from the unbridled greed and arrogance of the one per cent who operate the system.

As our politicians prepare to examine the media in Australia, the news blackout in the USA offers a salutary example of the perils of monolithic culture in the fourth estate. The news media owned by corporate America refused to report on a protest essentially aimed at corporate America: who could have foreseen

Now it appears an Australian group plans to occupy City Square in Swanston Street, Melbourne, from October 15, with similar sit-ins proposed for Sydney, Adelaide and Brisbane.

Whatever happens locally, are we seeing the beginning of extensive social unrest in the USA, leading to genuine reform? The banking system that almost failed in 2008 remains in place, owned and administered by the same self-centred parasites. An opportunity was missed then; there are signs that the next crash is imminent, when drastic reform or total collapse will be the only options.



what i would do if i were you

mandy nolan

DISPATCHES FROM THE FRONTLINES OF FAMILY LIFE

Comedian Mandy Nolan has written her first book and to celebrate she's touring the country performing her hour-long one-woman show What I Would Do If

I Were You. This is also her book title released through Finch Publishing this October. Her one-woman show invites you to share the slightly wacky world of this standup comedian, self-confessed provocateur, artist and mother of five children ranging from toddler to teenager.

The Echo caught up with Mandy and her dog Elvis just before they left for the tour.

Tell me a little about your book?

What I Would Do If I Were You is published through Finch Publishing and it's a 22-chapter rollick through my dysfunctional and slightly chaotic family life. The book navigates that area that exists between the fantasy of how we thought things were going to be and how they actually are. I tell the truth in my stories, and the truth doesn't always flatter me! I really believe that we need to be more honest about our experiences, our struggles to get the kids to school, to do their homework and for parents with teenagers, to keep them out of parks skulling goonsacks!

What are the biggest challenges for you as a parent?

Staying awake. Really. And making sure I allocate time for simple tasks like washing my hair and shaving my legs. There's only so long you can wear long pants and a beanie before people start to notice. Especially when it's the middle of summer.

It's a book about kids and family, do you think other people without kids and family would enjoy it?

I hope so. I have had a few childless people read it already and they found it very funny. I think it reminded them that they had made the right choice!

You tell a lot about yourself? Why?

It's all I have. I like to think I disclose enough for people to connect with my experience as a shared experience, rather than enter in that really uncomfortable zone of what I like to call the Overshare! I really do believe that people, particularly women, are honest enough about their feelings of incompetence when it comes to parenting. We compete with our kids, and we experience a profound sense of failure when our kids fail to thrive. We need to stop boasting about our winnings and start becoming more competitive with our failures. It's much more fun.

What's your opinion on advice books?

I hate them. This one is satirical. I really don't have any advice, I just share my mistakes. Advice books are written by people who like telling other people what to do. I am oppositional by nature. If you show me a rule, I will set out to break it. It makes me a shitty role model for my kids!

Why do you write about failures rather than triumphs?

Because failures make us human and banging on about all your triumphs just makes you a big-headed wanker. I'm Australian, I don't just believe in cutting down the odd tall poppy, I like to mow them into a nice bouncy lawn!

Do you think we are failing as parents?

Yes and no. I think on the whole everyone gives it their best shot. I think, though, that we are up against a popular culture that is bigger and more powerful than any other generation of parents had to face before and we are clueless about what to do about it. Social media like Facebook is the new predator in the home. Your children have been stolen, even though they appear to still be there. Their hearts, souls and minds are in cyberworld.

How do your kids feel about being the subject of so many of your stories?

They don't really care. They never listen to me. They just think I'm embarrassing so they pay no attention. I don't think they've ever read a single thing I've written. They couldn't be more unsinterested. Later in life, when they look for ammo when

they are in counselling trying to find ways to blame their inadequacies on their mother, I am sure my book will prove a valuable resource for them in locking down real instances of my poor parenting.

How does a woman manage so many exhusbands?

It's definitely a talent. Compassion, empathy, and you must never dwell in the past. I get on with all my ex-husbands; it's something I chose to do for the sake of the kids because I didn't want them growing up in a war zone. What started out as a challenge (I mean who doesn't want to hate their ex – it's like a sport!) ended up being the best path to choose. I can end a relationship, but still love someone as a person. It's not funny, but it's one less issue for my kids to deal with. I think I provide enough! My husband is amazing. He is very open and accepting of my muddied past. That certainly helps.

What's it like in a big blended family, and why have you written about that?

Because there are so many of us and you never hear our stories. How we manage Christmas with five sets of grandparents all vying for lunch at their house. Or school assignments left 50 kilometres away at another home. All over the country micromanaging parents try their very best to give their kids a sense of family in their allocated percentage of care time. We have five kids, three full time and two half time. We are the Brady Bunch but our exes didn't die, they just moved to Alstonville.

Is the book funny?

Of course. Otherwise I wouldn't have written it!

Mandy launches her book with a full feature comedy set at Currumbin RSL on Thursday October 13 at 7.30pm with Melbourne Comedian Dave O'Neill.





Another thing with flatties is they have such a big mouth they don't miss when they have a go. Pete's been catching so many lizards lately he is starting to look like one.

So what's the difference be-God Benfrey as some people tween flathead and bream? For starters bream have a tiny mouth so a much smaller hook is required,;they have such personality these fish!

They spook easily, fight well, fight dirty; the big ones are like miniature snapper and if you hang around any structure early in the morning you can hear them smashing oysters. They have massive predator eyes, big teeth and will snap your lure off quicker than you can blink.

Full moon

Why do I chase bream? Because they are so hard to catch on lures-legal ones that is.

I don't know if I've mentioned this before but it took me a long time to land a legal bream on a plasti. It was in my first ABT tournament on the Clarence River and I was so excited when I landed this 26cm bream I grabbed my boater 'Darren Love' in a bear hug and we danced around the boat yelling and screaming. Funny stuff I know, but it was a milestone for me. But check this out: Pete next door caught one in the first week using softs, so


